

Mosques photos, maps found on cams as 2 Indians arrested

Kuwaiti involved in major human trafficking

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 5: The State Security men have detained for interrogation two Indians, identified only as A.L. and A.A., both believed to be 36 and 48 years respectively, reports Al-Shahed daily.

The daily added, the Indians were picked inside their car which was parked in the courtyard of the Bilal bin Rabah mosque in South Surrah.

According to security sources, the men had stored on their cell phones pictures of several mosques in Kuwait and maps of a number of important sites.

The same sources said the arrest came after the State Security men received a tip from an unidentified source that terrorist organizations are now planning to use unsuspecting individuals to carry errands for them.

Check on parcels: The General Administration of Customs has intensified inspection measures particularly for parcels following confidential reports that some people may attempt to smuggle into the country forbidden items and materials for manufacturing explosives, reports Al-Shahed daily.

The sources said special devices and sniffer dogs will be used by the inspectors before carrying out manual checks. These measures have been adopted following a request from the Interior Ministry.

Human trafficking: Personnel from the Residence Affairs Security Department have arrested a Kuwaiti for sponsoring 86 workers on forged government contracts, reports Al-Rai daily.

Without going into details the daily said the citizen has been referred to the

The Ministry of Interior always strives to cooperate with International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) to promote awareness in nuclear security safety to limit smuggling of nuclear materials that could be used in terrorist operations, the Ministry's Assistant Undersecretary Major General Jamal Hatim Al-Sayigh announced on Monday. This remark was made at the opening ceremony of a meeting on the exchange of information of nuclear and radioactive material. The meeting was co-hosted by Kuwait Institute for Scientific Research (KISR). It was attended by representatives from the GCC ministries of interior. Al-Sayigh pointed out the three-day meeting aims at promoting international cooperation and the exchange of information in the field of nuclear security and safety of radioactive waste management. However, earlier it was reported a Kuwaiti owner of a general trading and contracting company was involved in forgery and had sponsored 86 workers for the Ministry of Education.

When the ministries of Interior and Social Affairs and Labor learned about the suspicious contract, securitymen conducted investigations and coordinated with Ministry of Education to discover the truth.

It was also reported the authorities are checking a list of companies

owned by the suspect and number of people sponsored by him. Sources said persons 'sponsored' by the runaway suspect will be arrested and referred to the Public Prosecution.

Top notch face probe: Some senior employees working in the oil sector are expected to be referred to the concerned authorities for interrogation following disagreements with the 'in-house' auditors, reports Al-Shahed daily.

Reliable oil sources familiar with the issue said 275 violations have been

recorded against the senior employees who plan to review the report of the auditors and consult their advisers from outside the sector either to find a solution or find a way out of the 'stalemate'.

10 expats held: The General Department of Residency Affairs Investigations recently organized an intense campaign in the Ardhiya Industrial Area and arrested 10 expatriates for violating residence law and referred them to the authorities, reports Al-Kuwaitiah daily.

Court Cases

Scribe hearing Nov 16

Blast trial date this week

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 5: The Appeals Court has received the file of Imam Al-Sadiq Mosque explosion and will set a date for the trial this week, said sources.

It is noteworthy the Court of First Instance had sentenced the first to the seventh defendants to death for the role they played in the deadly explosion and judgment was delivered in the presence of two defendants Ali Abdurrahman Sabah and Fahad Faraj, while the second defendant Bader Al-Harbi, the fifth defendant Shabb Salem Al-Enezi and the sixth defendant Falah Namer were served in absentia, in addition to the defaulters Abdullah Al-Zaharani and Majed Al-Zaharani.

The court acquitted 14 defendants in the case, including Jarrah Namer-the owner of the vehicle who dropped the suicide bomber to the mosque premises, Ali Sabah Eidan, Mohammad Khuleif, Salem Sabah Eidan and Yasmine Mohammad Mohammad Abdul Kareem, and passed sentences ranging from 2 to 15 years imprisonment against eight others followed by the deportation of non-Kuwaiti defendants after serving their term.

In a related issue, the Appeals Court set Oct 28 to begin the hearing on the storming of National Assembly case in which 70 citizens, including 9 MPs are standing trial. Earlier, the Court of First Instance acquitted all defendants of the accusations leveled against them.

Hearing Nov 16: The Misdemeanor Court has fixed November 16 for the appearance of the prosecution officer in the hearing of a lawsuit filed by the State Security Department against Dr Salah Al-Fadhli over some statements he issued, through which he allegedly offended Saudi Arabia and criticized the military assaults in Yemen.

According to the case file, the Public Prosecution accused the columnist of post-

ing on his account in a social networking website offensive statements about Saudi Arabia and defaming His Highness the Amir of Kuwait Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah. However, the defendant denied all allegations against him, insisting that they are untrue.

'Nullify verdict': The Administrative Court adjourned the appeal filed by the spouse of journalist Saad Al-Ajmi against the ruling of the Court of First Instance for lacking jurisdiction to look into the case involving her husband, and demanded nullification of the decision by which the man was deported to Saudi Arabia.

The court in Sept 2014 issued a decision withdrawing the citizenship of 17 Kuwaitis, including Saad Al-Ajmi, who has since been deported.

Contempt of court: The Criminal Court presided over Judge Met'eb Al-Ardhi referred a Kuwaiti woman in her forties to the Public Prosecution for insulting the court at the hearing on political activist Saleh Al-Mullah's case.

The suspect entered the court during the session and rained insults on the judges. Subsequently, head of women police at the Justice Palace arrested and referred the suspect to detention.

Sources said the suspect had earlier submitted a complaint against a member of the ruling family and the case was shelved by Public Prosecution.

Suspects denied bail: The Criminal Court presided over by Judge Met'eb Al-Ardhi adjourned to Oct 18, 2015, the state security case involving seven citizens who are accused of joining the terrorist organization DAESH.

The officer in charge of the case will be summoned in the next hearing. All suspects have been denied bail.

Two citizens held with illegal arms

Two Kuwaiti citizens were arrested in possession of a large number of unlicensed weapons and ammunition, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

According to security sources, when the General Department for Weapons Investigations received information about a Kuwaiti citizen possessing unlicensed weapons, they obtained a warrant and searched his apartment to find an automatic weapon, two grenades, eight pistols and large quantity of ammunition.

They also arrested another Kuwaiti citizen after raiding his apartment and finding

a number of unlicensed weapons and ammunition including one pistol, 11 Kalashnikovs, four air rifles and five telescopes.

Both suspects confessed that they owned the weapons and did not have the license for possessing them. They were referred to the concerned authorities for necessary legal action against them.

The General Department for Weapons Investigations affirmed that it will continue to hold such campaigns in all areas round the clock.

News in Brief

Fighting home fires: The Kuwait Fire Services Directorate, in cooperation with Bubiyan Bank, is preparing to organize its annual 2015 campaign under the slogan "We want to reach every house" to make people aware of the dangers of fire and how to prevent them, according to a press release issued by the directorate.

Director of Public Relations and Media Department Colonel Khalil Al-Amir said in a press statement the department is trying to convince people through this campaign on the importance of fire extinguishers and smoke detectors in their homes and how to use them.

He mentioned the department will organize a campaign in cooperation with some commercial malls, government and private educational institutions to reach the biggest number of people and respond to their questions starting from Thursday at the 360 Mall.

Indian dies in mishap: An Indian bus driver perished in a tragic road accident on the Fifth Ring Road, reports Al-Anba daily.

According to eyewitness reports the driver was involved in a two-vehicle collision and he was flung out of the bus window upon impact.

The bus then overturned and fell on him crushing him to death.

Meanwhile, a Nepali working for an unidentified company was electrocuted to death while on duty, reports Al-Shahed daily.

The victim was rushed to the Jahra Hospital, but doctors failed to rescue him.

And, a 40-year-old Kuwaiti died and the other was injured following a two-vehicle

collision in front of Ali Sabah Al-Salem, reports Al-Rai daily.

The remains of the victim have been referred to Forensics.

The other motorist has been referred to a hospital. The accident is being investigated.

Forged IDs seized: Acting on a tip-off personnel from the Criminal Investigation Department recently raided the home of a 25-year-old Kuwaiti in the Mubarak Al-Kabir governorate and seized from him a number of forged IDs which he reportedly used to commit crimes, reports Al-Anba daily.

A reliable security source said the suspect was wanted by law in connection with 20 crimes and failure to pay debts worth KD 200,000.


Many held in raids: In cooperation with Kuwait Municipality, security operatives launched surprise raids in Ahmadi governorate and arrested 52 individuals for violating residency law and 76 others without personal identification papers and 84 people for hawking. All suspects were referred to concerned authorities for necessary action.

Mandoub robbed: Police are looking for 4 people for attacking and assaulting an Egyptian representative or a company and robbing him of KD 8,000, reports Al-Rai daily.

In his complaint to the Fintas police the victim said he withdrew the money from a local bank branch to pay for the foodstuffs which his company had bought.



He also said he suspects the men may have been following him from the moment he left the bank branch in Fintas.




He added, he was attacked near his home in the area.
