Foreign liquor bottles, KD 3,000 seized from Bedoun

Anti-narcotics personnel arrested a Bedoun for peddling in alcohol and confiscated 135 bottles of imported liquor and KD 3,000 cash in his possession. Security sources said the department

received report about the suspect and sealed a deal with a secret agent to purchase 24 bottles of liquor for KD 1,900. He was arrested upon delivery of the contraband in Bayan area. Security officers confiscated KD 3,000 cash believed to be proceeds from liquor trade along with 135 bottles of alcohol. He was referred to Drug Prosecution.

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 17: Director General of General Department for Border Security Eyad Al-Haddad says the department has approved a plan that aims to hinder any attempt to infiltrate or manipulate with the entrance and exit procedures, reports Al-Shahed daily.

According to this plan, a new mechanism will be applied which includes changing shift timings, employing excellent security offi-

cial, better supervision of the officers 24/7, etc.

Officials of the department held a number of meetings to discuss this new plan from all angles in order to curb smuggling operations and exit of wanted individuals and those banned from traveling.

The plan was also approved by Ministry of Interior. New and unique security procedures are expected to be applied soon at the

borders.

Meanwhile, Jahra Security Directorate intensified the security measures in all mosques of the area prior to the Friday prayers to ensure the application of the Ministry of Interior's security plan under the supervision of the ministry's under-secretary Lieutenant General Suleiman Al-Fahad, reports Al-Shahed daily quoting informed sources.

They revealed that the plan has been successful in maintaining the security and stability of the country.

The sources explained that security teams were sent to the mosques on Friday morning and they placed barriers to allow people to enter from one side only after inspection. The worshippers praised these security procedures, as they understood that the current circumstances of the region necessitate extra caution.

Woman returning from medical treatment in NY dies at Kuwait airport

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 17: Security sources disclosed that departments and agencies in the Ministry of Interior have deported about 20,000 expatriates from different nationalities for violating labor law since the beginning of 2015 until the current month.

The sources added about 7,000 expatriates are currently in custody at various police stations and the deportation center is waiting for their sponsors to pay their traveling expenses, while others are waiting for their dues to be cleared.

Among those awaiting deportation are hawkers, beggars, absconders, and others involved in illegal activities such as brothels and sale of alcohol.

**Woman dies at airport:** A Kuwaiti woman died at Kuwait International Airport on her return from New York where she had gone for medical treatment, reports Al-Shahed daily.

Security sources said the doctor in charge of Quarantine Unit at the airport went to the rescue of the patient after receiving report about her condition, and tried in vain to revive her. She had been accompanied on the medical trip by her relatives. The body was referred to Forensics, and a case was registered.

**KD 45K debts not paid:** Farwaniya securitymen arrested an unidentified young man who was wanted by law for owing debts totaling KD 45,000 to a number of companies.

He was referred to the concerned authorities for necessary legal action against him.

**Expat run over, dies:** An Egyptian expatriate died when he was run over by a vehicle on Sixth Ring Road, reports Al-Anba daily. According to security sources, the corpse was referred to the Forensics Department and a case has been registered.

Meanwhile, a young man sustained injuries when his vehicle collided with another near a commercial mall in Jahra area. In a separate incident, an unidentified individual sustained injuries when his vehicle toppled near the Cooperative Society in Al-Zour area. Both victims were referred to Jahra Hospital for treatment.

**Graffiti on 'extremism':** A citizen made a distress call to the Operations Room of the Interior Ministry and reported that an unknown person had written on the concrete barrier of a bridge along Subiya Road graffiti full of extremist expressions, reports Al-Anba daily.

Acting on information, officers from the State Security Department went to the scene and took photos of the inscription for investigation.

**'34,999 hurt in accidents':** In the last 11 years, 34,999 individuals sustained injuries due to traffic accidents, and 7,000 among these individuals were in serious condition, reports Al-Qabas daily.

According to official statistics, 773,806 accidents occurred during the period from 2004 to 2015. Out of them, 762,837 were collisions, 5,476 overturning of vehicles and 3,973 run-over accidents.

The number of accidents in the last five years increased drastically compared to the previous years. In 2014, a total of 99,047 accidents occurred while a total of 89,527 accidents occurred in 2013.

85 illegals held in crackdown on Jleeb markets

General Department for Criminal Investigations, in cooperation with Kuwait Municipality, launched a crackdown on a number of markets in Jleeb Al-Shuyoukh from where the officials arrested 85 violators of residency law.

In a press statement issued by Ministry of Interior, the Public Relations and Security Media Department explained that the campaign is among a series of campaigns that the ministry has been launching in all six

governorates to arrest violators of residency law. More of such sudden inspection campaigns can be expected in the coming days.

The department affirmed that a number of mechanisms and regulations are being applied to control violators and violations, indicating that the Public Security Sector and Criminal Security Sector have implemented effective procedures which enable the security systems to arrest the violators from all areas.

Woman acquitted of swindling man of KD 30,000

Appeals Court to look into petition Sunday regarding Bargash kin's citizenship case

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 17: The Court of Appeals Sunday will look into a petition that challenges the decision to revoke the citizenship of Bargash family. In the previous session, the lower court chaired by Judge Ahmad Al-Dehan nullified the decision of withdrawing Bargash family's citizenship, and ordered KD 5,001 compensation in favor of the family.

Defense team of Bargash family pleaded to the court that the rumor leading to the withdrawal of their citizenship was baseless and untrue, adding before the cancellation of Article 3/1959 of citizenship law in 1981, the children of Kuwaiti women from a Bedoun spouse were consid-

ered as Kuwaiti citizens, thus the Bargash's family was naturalized based on Article 3/1959 of citizenship law, indicating the citizenship was not granted by Interior Ministry. However, the government side insists the Administrative Court has no jurisdiction to handle the case. Meanwhile, the Criminal Court acquitted a Kuwaiti woman who was accused of swindling KD 30,000 from a male compatriot after luring him to invest in a car rental project.

According to the case file, the defendant tricked the plaintiff into believing that the car rental project was real and lucrative and then collected KD 30,000 from him. One hour after handing over the money to her, the man called her to get back the money as he lost interest, but she

refused to return the money. The defense counsel Attorney Zaid Al-Khabbaz insisted that his client did not defraud the plaintiff, adding that the documents backing the deal did not indicate any fraud or trick, contrary to the statement made by the plaintiff.

In the meantime, the Misdemeanor Court of Appeals upheld the verdict issued by the Court of First Instance, which acquitted a Kuwaiti citizen in his 20s who was accused of breaching trust and swindling from a friend.

The defense counsel Attorney Mohammad Al-Majidi stressed that the court is not in charge of dealing with the case as it is related to civil conflict, adding that there are no evidences to prove the accusations launched against his client.

Public Prosecution decides to release one of defendants

Case regarding misuse of public funds by MoD referred to 'court'

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 17: Public Prosecution has referred a case related to embezzlement of public funds by Ministry of Defense and selling of spoiled food to the Criminal Court. It decided to release one of the defendants who is an expatriate, as he did not have any link with the case, and it decided to extend detention of the

other defendants, reports Al-Qabas daily.

According to sources, when Kuwait Municipality received information from a Kuwaiti citizen about some individuals selling suspicious meat and foodstuff in a lot, a team was dispatched for investigations. It was discovered that the meat of 100 sacrificed

sheep of Ministry of Defense was being sold at a cheap price to people.

Public Prosecution considered the act as an embezzlement of the public funds and arrested the individuals responsible for it.

However, the fifth defendant's counsel Lawyer Sultan Al-Tawala explained that it is impossible to

defend people who are accused of selling rotten food if there are evidences to prove their involvement.

However, there are no evidences to prove that his client was involved in the case. Even though he works as a butcher, he was not aware of the fact that the sheep belonged to the ministry.
