

**Kuwaiti, Palestinian held with drugs**

**Indian parents accused of murder**

KUWAIT CITY, May 14: Medical Emergency Men suspected foul play when the parents of an Indian child requested ambulance for their sick child and found the child dead inside the family's apartment in Abu Halifa area with traces of blood on his clothes.

The parents were taken to the area police station for investigation, and a murder case was reg-

istered.

**2 held with drugs:** A Palestinian national and a Kuwaiti were apprehended in Fintas area by Ahmadi security operatives for the possession of illicit pills Larika after trying in vain to escape.

Apparently, the officers were on a round of the aforementioned location when the duo aroused their suspicion. They were surprised when the two suspects

**Three doctors get jail for causing death of woman**

Saudi man not our dad: Kuwaiti sons

**KUWAIT CITY, May 14: The Criminal Court presided over by Judge Ahmad Al-Yassin acquitted an expatriate who was accused of peddling drugs and illegal brain stimulants.**

According to the case files, the Public Prosecution charged the defendant with possessing methamphetamine with commercial intent, after he was arrested in possession of 31 packets of the pills.

Representing the expatriate during the court session was Lawyer Khaled Al-Ajmi who insisted on the disqualification of the case filed against his client as the arrest warrant was issued based on a flimsy investigation report, and his client was arrested before the warrant was issued.

He described the arrest and the charges against his client as maliciously executed, adding that his client has been adamantly rejecting the accusations since his arrest.

**Jail for doctors:** The Misdemeanors Court has sentenced three Egyptian doctors to jail terms ranging from six months to one year and ordered each of them to pay the plaintiff KD 5,001 temporary compensation for their mistake which resulted in the death of a female patient, reports Al-Rai daily.

Attorney Mishari Al-Rawi, lawyer for the plaintiff said the victim was rushed to the Sabah Hospital after she felt severe pain in her stomach.

The doctors saw the patient screaming out of pain and realized she had taken medicine for diabetes.

The doctors told the husband the health condition of the wife is normal and left her to attend to an 'important' personality.

**Kuwaitis fight over parking**

**Gang of 4 beat up Syrian**

KUWAIT CITY, May 14: A Syrian man filed a complaint at Abu Halifa Police Station against four Egyptians who allegedly beat him.

According to the complainant who arrived in the station with a bleeding right ear, the suspects called him while he was going out of a building in the area. When he approached them, they started beating him and left only after he asked for help from passersby.

He told police he does not know any of the suspects and he has no idea why they beat him. He provided police with a detailed description of the suspects and investigations are ongoing to arrest them.

Meanwhile, four Kuwaitis fought over a parking spot in Ali Sabah

Cooperative Society resulting in injuries to two of them. The injured were referred to Adan Hospital.

Also, four Kuwaitis and one Bedoun were involved in a public brawl in Mahboula. One of them was injured as he was stabbed with a sharp object during the fight. The injured was taken to a nearby hospital.

**'Drifters' nabbed:** Officers from Public Security Sector continued their campaign in Jaber Al-Ali, Mahboula and Sabahiya areas, and arrested 5 motorists for reckless driving. One of them had changed the front registration plate to avoid being detected by traffic camera. The officers impounded their vehicles to the ministry garage, a security source said.

**Sons deny relationship:** The Criminal Court presided by Judge Mohammad Al-Otaibi postponed its session until May 27 to hear a Saudi man whose two sons obtained Kuwaiti citizenship deny their relationship, reports Al-Rai daily.

The two sons claim they do not even know the Saudi man. They told the court that their father is missing for a long time, and they're still searching for him — although they did not file a missing person's report.

The defense lawyer argued that the man would attend the court session if search and arrest warrant issued against him is lifted, however the court refuses.

**Obscene videos sent:** The Misdemeanor Court presided over by Judge Bassam Al-Ghuwainam acquitted an individual who was accused of sending obscene videos to his ex-wife.

The Public Prosecution had leveled phone-misuse charges against the suspect for deliberately sending the offensive videos to his former wife.

The defense counsel Lawyer Mohammad Al-Qattan affirmed lack of incriminating evidences to prove his client had sent those videos.

He said the Prosecution took into consideration the complaints of the plaintiff and the investigations of the investigating officer which were inconclusive.
