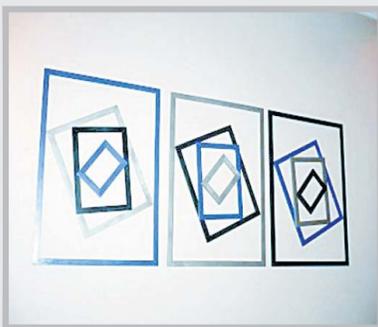

pellionia daveauana

Pellionia daveauana is also called the "rain-bow vine" or "trailing watermelon begonia". It originates in Vietnam and Malaysia but is widely grown as a houseplant. The Pellionia daveauana develops like a perennial herb. This plant in the winter assumes a purple coloring; it is small in size and can reach about 10 inches high.  
**Site:** Pellionia has variegated leaves and does well in a hanging pot. Provide medium light exposure and a moderately moist soil.  
**Temperature:** Do not expose the plant to temperatures below 55°. The ideal range is between 60 and 85°.  
**Water:** Average water needs; water regularly but do not over water.

hair dyeing care

To make hair dye last longer, rinse your hair in vinegar immediately after dyeing. This raises the PH level of the hair color.  
Another trick is to add two tablespoons of hair dye color to your regular conditioner after each shampoo. Leave it on three to five minutes and rinse it with warm water. This replenishes the color that was washed out.  
Condition after every shampoo! Use a conditioner for damaged or color-treated hair.

**Ingredients:** 1-oz chocolate; 1/2 cup sugar; 2 cups hot water; 2 qt milk; 1-1/2 tsp vanilla; 1qt vanilla ice cream; 1qt club soda; 1/2 pt cream, whipped; ground cinnamon  
**Method:** In a saucepan combine chocolate and sugar with hot water. Bring to a boil, stirring for 2 mins. Add milk, and continue heating. When hot, beat in vanilla with a rotary egg beater or whisk. Remove from heat. Chill, then pour into a punch bowl over ice cream. For sparkle, add club soda. Top with whipped cream and dust with cinnamon.
