

Mavericks too strong for Pelicans

Knicks lose to Pacers in interim coach's debut

NEW YORK, Dec 8, (RTRS): Julius Randle missed a game-tying free-throw attempt with one-tenth of a second remaining, and Indiana handed hosts New York their ninth straight loss in the debut of Knicks' interim coach Mike Miller.

A day after David Fizdale was fired, the Knicks had numerous chances to get their first win, but they went cold down the stretch, missing 13 of their final 14 shots. The Pacers went scoreless for the final 5:17 and missed their final seven shots.

The Knicks' last miss was when Myles Turner blocked Mitchell Robinson at the rim with two seconds left. Randle grabbed the rebound and was fouled by Aaron Holiday.

Randle made the first free throw, but his second free-throw attempt was long, and the game ended with New York dropping to 4-19.

T.J. Warren scored 25 points for the Pacers, who won for the eighth time in 10 games. Domantas Sab-

Russell Westbrook contributed 24 points, a game-high 14 rebounds and 11 assists for the Rockets, while Clint Capela added 12 points and 10 rebounds. Ricky Rubio (10 points, game-high 13 assists) and Dario Saric (13 points, 12 rebounds) registered double-doubles for the Suns.

Mavericks 130, Pelicans 84

Luka Doncic scored 26 points as Dallas stayed hot while New Orleans remained cold in the Mavericks' 130-84 victory.

Boban Marjanovic added 15 points and 16 rebounds, Tim Hardaway Jr and Jalen Brunson scored 14 points each, Kristaps Porzingis had 13 and Seth Curry 11 as Dallas won for the 10th time in 11 games and New Orleans lost their eighth consecutive game.

Doncic had nine assists and six rebounds and played just 26 minutes in the lopsided game. J.J.

Redick led the reeling Pelicans with 15 points, Jrue Holiday and Brandon Ingram scored 14 each and rookie Jaxson Hayes had 11.

76ers 141, Cavaliers 94

Ben Simmons scored 26 of his career-high 34 points in the first half as Philadelphia remained undefeated at home in 11 games by trouncing Cleveland, who lost for the sixth straight time and the 12th in 13 games.

Simmons made 12 of 14 shots from the floor, and Trey Burke and Mike Scott each chipped in 21 points for the 76ers, who beat the Cavaliers for the third time this season. Scott scored 16 of his points in the first half while playing in place of All-Star center Joel Embiid, who reported discomfort in his hip following Philadelphia's 119-113 loss to the Washington Wizards on Thursday.

Darius Garland finished with a team-high 17 points, Tristan Thompson added 12, and Kevin Love returned from a one-game absence due to illness to finish with six points for Cleveland.

Jazz 126, Grizzlies 112

Donovan Mitchell scored 22 points, and Utah notched a season-best 32 assists en route to victory over Memphis in Salt Lake City. Bojan Bogdanovic, Rudy Gobert and Jeff Green scored 19 points apiece as the Jazz won for just the second time in the past seven games.

Royce O'Neale scored 14 points, Joe Ingles had 12 points, 10 assists and four steals, and Emmanuel Mudiay added 11 points and seven assists for the Jazz. Gobert was 8-of-9 shooting and contributed 11 rebounds and five assists for Utah, which shot 56.2 percent from the field, including 19 of 34 from 3-point range.

No. 2 Kansas hands No. 20 Colorado first loss

LAWRENCE, Kansas, Dec 8, (AP): Ochai Agbaji scored 20 points and Devon Dotson added 18 points to lead No. 2 Kansas to a 72-58 victory over No. 20 Colorado on Saturday, snapping the Buffaloes' season-opening seven-game winning streak.

Ten days after claiming the Maui Invitational title, the Jayhawks (7-1) built an early 6-0 lead over their former conference foes. David McCormack fueled the hot start, contributing six of the Jayhawks' opening eight points.

Holding leading scorer Tyler Bey scoreless from the field through the first half, Kansas used a 9-0 run to build a 19-9 lead. Colorado (7-1) shot 26.9% from the field in the first half and that allowed the Jayhawks to take a 34-22 lead at halftime.

Maryland 59, Illinois 58

In College Park, Md, Anthony Cowan Jr made a free throw with 2.1

seconds left and Maryland erased a 15-point deficit in the second half to rally past Illinois in the Big Ten opener for both teams.

The Terrapins (10-0, 1-0 Big Ten) didn't lead after halftime until Cowan's free throw but still matched their best start since winning 10 straight to open the 1998-99 season.

Cowan collected a steal in the closing seconds of a tie game and was fouled in a scramble by guard Andres Feliz. Cowan made the first free throw and missed the second. Illinois (6-3, 0-1) failed to get a shot off in the remaining time.

Ohio State 106, Penn State 74

In Columbus, Ohio, Kaleb Wesson scored 28 points and had 10 rebounds for his ninth career double-double, and Ohio State scored 100 points against a Big Ten rival for the first time since 1991.

Four players hit double figures for the Buckeyes (9-0, 1-0 Big Ten), who shot 57.4 percent from the field. Andre Wesson scored 15, and sophomores Duane Washington Jr and Luther Muhammad each had 14.

Izaiah Brockington scored 19 points and Seth Lundy added 10 for the Nittany Lions (7-2, 0-1), who lost for the second time in four games and gave up 100 points for the first time since 2017. Penn State managed just 25 rebounds, far below its average of 44.

Kentucky 83, Fairleigh Dickinson 52

In Lexington, Ky, E.J. Montgomery scored a career-high 25 points, Keion Brooks added 15 off the bench and Kentucky dominated Fairleigh Dickinson for its 600th victory at Rupp Arena.

Forward Nick Richards, at 6-11, had 12 points and 10 rebounds for the Wildcats (7-1), whose 19-2 run over 6:11 in the first half built a 43-23 halftime lead. Kentucky shot 52% and held the Knights (2-6) to 33% shooting, out-rebounded them 42-33 and owned nearly

Baylor 63, Arizona 58

In Waco, Texas, MaCio Teague scored 19 points, Freddie Gillespie had 17 points and 13 rebounds, and Baylor defeated Arizona for the Wildcats' first loss.

Admission was free at Baylor's campus arena because the Bears were playing Oklahoma in the Big 12 football championship game, which started about the same time 100 miles north of Waco at the home of the Dallas Cowboys.

It was supposed to be the first true road game for the Wildcats (9-1), but their fans might have outnumbered the Baylor (7-1) contingent. They loudly chanted "U of A" before the Baylor introductions but had a hard time getting into the game early, with Arizona giving up a 15-0 run and shooting 33 percent in the first half.

Oregon 89, Hawaii 64

In Eugene, Ore, Payton Pritchard had 20 points and a season-high 11 assists, and Oregon snapped a two-game losing streak.

The teams were tied at 34 at the break, but Oregon (7-2) opened the second half with a 20-1 run. The Ducks led by 27 points down the stretch.

Eddie Stansberry led Hawaii (6-3)

with 24 points, including a career-high seven 3-pointers. The loss snapped a three-game winning streak for the Rainbow Warriors.

Memphis 65, UAB 57

In Birmingham, Ala, Precious Achiuwa scored eight of his 14 points in the final 4 minutes to rally Memphis.

Memphis (8-1) trailed 40-26 at halftime. The Tigers needed a 19-4 run over the final 8 minutes to overcome the Blazers (4-4), who didn't relinquish the lead until freshman Achiuwa's tip shot with 2:56 left put Memphis up 56-55.

UAB's own sensational freshman, Jalen Benjamin, scored 17 points, but the Blazers lost their third straight.

Villanova 78, Saint Joseph's 66

In Philadelphia, Sadiq Bey scored 22 points, Collin Gillespie had 20 and Villanova held off a second-half comeback from Saint Joseph's.

Villanova (7-2) led 41-25 at halftime, but Saint Joseph's Ryan Daly scored 22 of his 32 points after halftime to get the Hawks within 65-62 with 4:03 left. The Wildcats responded with a 13-4 run to end it.

Justin Moore added 14 points and Jermaine Samuels had 12 for Villanova. The Wildcats have won 28 of 29 against Big 5 opponents since 2012.

Butler 76, Florida 62

In Indianapolis, Sean McDermott and Aaron Thompson each scored 16 points to lead Butler over Florida.

Jordan Tucker added 13 points off the bench for the Bulldogs (9-0). Kamar Baldwin, who was averaging a team-high 17.5 points for Butler, scored 12.

Kerry Blackshear Jr led Florida (6-3) with 17 points. Andrew Nembhard and Noah Locke each scored 11.

Utah State 77, Fresno State 70, OT

In Logan, Utah, Sam Merrill had 24 points and eight rebounds, and Abel Porter scored seven of his 13 points in overtime to propel Utah State.

Justin Bean added 14 points and Neemias Queta chipped in six in 10 minutes in his first action of the season for Utah State (9-1, 2-0 Mountain West).

New Williams scored 26 points and hit the basket that forced overtime for Fresno State (2-6, 0-2).
