### Fuel tanker ablaze after mishap

Five Kuwaiti fire-fighting squads have quenched a large fire that broke out in a fuel truck after it overturned on Jahra Road, the country's fire agency said. The fire of the truck, which carried 36,000 liters of diesel fuel, was put under

control in a record time, the Kuwait Fire Service Directorate said in a press release on Sunday.

However, the truck driver was injured in the accident and was immediately taken to hospital, it added. (KUNA)

### Two drug peddlers arrested

Personnel from the General Department for Drugs Control (GDCC) have arrested an unidentified bedoun for trafficking in narcotic substances, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

The man was arrested in Salmiya after police received a tip-off from security agent about the activity of the suspect.

After getting permission from the Public Prosecution, police put man under surveillance and seized from him 'chem-

ical', 5 grams of hashish, 5 grams of alum, two Captagon tablets, two Tramadol tablets, a firearm, and 1,200 dinars in cash.

On the other hand, another bedoun was arrested and police have seized from him one kilo of chemical, narcotic substance, and a sensitive scale and nylon bags ready to be filled with narcotics.

Both men have been referred to the concerned authority.

### 930 vacancies for teachers, researchers

## 'MoE will hire expats with rare specializations only'

KUWAIT CITY, Aug 10: The Ministry of Education needs educational, psychological and social service workers – around 930 job degrees (670 teachers and 260 researchers), while the number of researchers who have applied so far does not exceed 40 psychological and social researchers, reports Al-Rai daily quoting a responsible

educational source.

While the source confirmed that the Public Education Sector in the ministry is in the process of determining the specializations needed for the next academic year in preparation for the announcement of vacancies in the educational field, he warned about the looming crisis in terms of the shortage of teachers in

some scientific specializations.

The source stressed that "there are no jobs for expatriates in the ministry, except in the educational sector and those with rare specializations only."

The source indicated that the ministry is one of the "most committed in implementing the annual replacement policy of the Civil

Service Commission (CSC), as the percentage of Kuwaitis in most of the jobs has reached 95 percent." The source added the only remaining posts for expatriates include the service workers, cleaners and a limited number of jurists, accountants and engineers who are gradually terminated annually.

## Kuwaiti woman survives after nephew stabs her eight times over family row

Police hunt man for robbing two Kuwaitis at gun-point

KUWAIT CITY, Aug 10: A Kuwaiti woman escaped death after her nephew stabbed her several times in her sleep, with the intention to kill her, due to family disputes, reports Al-Rai daily.

The daily added, the woman was taken to the Adan Hospital in a critical condition while the suspect has been arrested and detained at a local police station.

According to a security source when the Operations room of the Ministry of Interior received a report about the incident, a security force with paramedics rushed to the place and found the woman in a pool of blood.

The incident happened in Al-Dhaheer area and the woman was allegedly stabbed eight times.

The suspect is believed to be in his 30s. Police have seized the tool with which he stabbed the woman. A case of attempted murder has been registered against him.

### Al-Afasi visits new headquarters

Minister of Justice and Minister of Awqaf and Islamic Affairs Counselor Dr Fahad Al-Afasi visited the new building of the General Administration of Experts in Al-Riqqai area, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

He was accompanied by the Undersecretary of the Ministry of Justice Omar Al-Sharqawi and a number of administration officials.

During the visit Al-Afasi met with the head and members of

the General Administration of Experts and discussed with them many issues of interest to the administration's work, in addition to the possibility of opening administration branches in all governorates.

**Robbed at gun-point:** The Ahmadi police are looking for an unknown gunman who is said to have robbed two Kuwaitis after threatening to shoot them with a Kalashnikov rifle, reports Al-Anba daily.

The daily added, the suspect robbed money from the men and their cell phones.

Both men said they had never seen the suspect before and gave police the description of the suspect and his vehicle.

According to a security source, the suspects said this happened when they were driving along the Atrtal Road a few meters away from the Kabd Roundabout.

The suspect pretended he needed to make a phone call because his cell phone battery was dead and one of them obliged.

They added they were shocked when the man pulled out a Kalashnikov rifle and pointed at them and ordered them to empty their pockets and fired two shots in the air to frighten them and escaped.

**Hunt for thief launched:** Police are looking for a well-built, unidentified man for breaking into several shops and stealing cash and whatever he could lay hands on, reports Al-Anba daily.

This happened when an unidentified Syrian who works as a market manager complained to the Fahheel Police Station that an unidentified person had broken into the market and stole goods and KD 3,600 from the cash machine.

He added, the theft was discovered by the employees when they reported for work in the morning and saw someone had ransacked the place.

Police then checked the CCTV camera installed in the shop and came to the conclusion that it was the same man who had broken into a popular market, a juice shop, another ready-made garments shop less than a week ago.

The daily said the suspect was wearing gloves to ensure no finger

### 5-weeks study via distance learning

## 38,000 12th grade students complete school year

KUWAIT CITY, Aug 10: About 38,000 students in the twelfth grade of secondary school completed their five-weeks study to end their academic year 2019/2020 based on distance learning, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

This is in addition to Kuwait witnessing for the first time the announcement of high school results without exams and being satisfied with the system that has been introduced under the title

'My assessment of student participation in the Kuwait Education Portal.'

Schools implemented the evaluation mechanism for students of the twelfth grade in its scientific and literary sections for the second semester of the current year 2019/2020, according to the modified curriculum – 25% for attendance and absence, 25% for participation and interaction, and 25% for assignments, and 25% for reports.

The principals and directors of the secondary schools set the appropriate schedule according to the number of classes for the subjects and the timings of the classes from 8 am to 11:45 am, at 45 minutes per class and inform the teachers.

The education channel on Kuwait TV (Kuwait Children Channel) presented the twelfth grade curriculum at 1:30 in the afternoon, and repeated at eight in the evening.

## Charity societies and organizations registered with MoSA can give aid

KUWAIT CITY, Aug 10: The Undersecretary of the Ministry of Social Affairs, Abdulaziz Al-Shuaib, said within the framework of directives issued by the High Command on the need to provide urgent assistance to Lebanon to overcome the current crisis, the ministry represented by the charity societies and departments are keen to coordinate charity and relief work separately through each association, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

Shuaib said in a press statement, the ministry will supervise the relief projects, as is usual in such cases, in which only the associations licensed and registered with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs will participate.

He pointed out the fundraising campaigns will be subject to conditions laid down by the Ministry of Social Affairs regulating charity work, whereby the

charities societies are prohibited from collecting cash donations in all their forms as stipulated in the Ministerial Resolution (28/A) of 2016 that says cash donations can be done only through K-net, online, bank deductions, electronic applications on smart phones, electronic collection devices, and text messages via communication companies.

**Illegal construction:** The supervisory team affiliated to the Hawalli Municipality branch has stopped construction work on one of properties for violating building regulations and building additional room without a license, reports Al-Seyassah daily.
