No. 1 Baylor tops Texas for 21st straight Big 12 victory

Jones, Goldwire help No. 7 Duke beat No. 8 FSU 70-65

AUSTIN, Texas, Feb 11, (AP): MaCio Teague scored 11 points, Devonte Bandoo added 10 and No. 1 Baylor defeated Texas 52-45 for its 21st straight victory - one short of the Big 12 record set by Kansas in 1997.

Baylor (22-1, 11-0 Big 12) wrested control with a 13-0 push that put the Bears ahead 42-27 with 9:28 remaining. Five players scored for Baylor during that stretch. Texas helped out with three turnovers and failed to score

for a period of 5:06. Texas (14-10, 4-7) trailed by 16 with less than seven minutes left. Then Coleman and Jones hit consecutive 3-pointers, and Jones made a three-point play and suddenly the Longhorns found themselves down by seven.

But Jared Butler responded by mak-

ing an open 3-pointer with 4:49 left after Baylor navigated through Texas' defensive press. Baylor led 22-16 after a first half of inept offense.

Matt Coleman led Texas with 11 points, and Andrew Jones scored 10. Texas shot a season low 30.5% from the

Trent Forrest finished with 18 points. nine rebounds and eight steals to lead the Seminoles (20-4, 10-3), who shot

Texas Tech 88, TCU 42

In Lubbock, Texas, Davide Moretti and Jahmi'us Ramsey each had 17 points and Texas Tech made a season-high 13 3-pointers while leading throughout in an 88-42 win over turnover-plagued TCU on Monday night.

Moretti made a 3 on the first shot of the game, after TCU's first turnover, to put the Red Raiders (16-8, 7-4 Big 12) ahead to stay. Kyler Edwards also had four 3s while scoring 14 points.

Kevin McCullar and T.J. Holyfield each had 10 points for the Red Raiders, who moved back into the Top 25 following a two-week absence. They have won three in a row since three losses in their previous four games, and this was their largest margin of victory ever in a Big 12 game.

Jaire Grayer had 10 points and was

the player in double figures for the Frogs (13-11, 4-7).

Mozone hit 4 of 6 3-pointers to help USC Upstate get its second victory in the 10-game series.

COLUMBIA, South Carolina, Feb 11, (AP): South Carolina's Tyasha Harris really thought coming in she wasn't bothered by her losing his-

tory against UConn.

Then Harris and the top-ranked Gamecocks won – and her attitude

and emotions changed quickly.

"Yes, this feels pretty good," she said with a grin. "My mind kind of changed.'

Harris had 19 points, Aliyah Boston dominated underneath and South Carolina held UConn to a record-low two points in the opening quarter on the way to a 70-52 win its first-ever win over the fifthranked Huskies.

Harris, a senior who was a freshman starter on South Carolina's national championship team in 2017, was 0-4 in her career against the Huskies (20-3). When the game ended, she thought about all the former Gamecocks who'd never celebrated a win in eight previous games over UConn.

"I see all the people who started before us, people who hadn't beat UConn and I see how happy they are," Harris said.

Things could get even happier before this season is over. It was South Carolina's 17th straight win

and their ninth victory in 10 games against ranked opponents.

So are the Gamecocks the clear-cut favorite for another national crown? "I feel like we're up there," Harris said.

The Gamecocks (23-1) came in 0-8 all-time against UConn, seven of those defeats with national championship coach Dawn Staley in charge.

But South Carolina took control immediately with its suffocating defense, limiting the Huskies to 1-of-16 shooting to lead 11-2 at the end of the first period.

Since women's basketball changed to quarters in 2015-16, UConn's fewest points in a first quarter was 8 against Tulane in February 2016. The Huskies fewest in any quarter was 6 in a loss to Baylor

earlier this year. Boston, the 6-foot-5 freshman, finished with 13 points and 12 rebounds, her 10th double-double this season. She also had three of South Carolina's eight steals and made her first 3-pointer this season.

She had nine rebounds and two blocks the first 10 minutes as she continually altered shots whenever

the Huskies tried to come inside. That early blitz was enough to energize the sold-out crowd of 18,000plus and push the Gamecocks to their 17th straight victory – and their ninth win in 10 games this season against ranked opponents.

UConn coach Geno Auriemma said his team's awful first quarter put them on their heels. He thought the Gamecocks sped up his young team, changing shots, defending hard on the perimeter and taking them out of rhythm.

"If things don't go right early on, it's hard to right the ship," Auriem-

South Carolina eventually increased the lead to 52-31 early in the second half. UConn cut it to 11 points when Crystal Dangerfield who led the Huskies with a careerhigh 28 points - made a jumper to start the fourth quarter. But Boston hit a basket and Mikiah Herbert Harrigan made a three-pointer to build back South Carolina's lead.

Harris had a double-double, too, with a game-high 11 assists. Zia Cooke, another freshman, had 15 points for the Gamecocks.

The Huskies have been a thorn in Staley's side as she's built the Gamecocks into a championship program the past 12 years.

It was UConn who ended South Carolina's last run at No. 1 with an 87-62 victory in 2015. And despite Staley's success – she's led the team to four Southeastern Conference crowns and the 2017 national championship - she acknowledged it "absolutely" bothered her not to beat the

signature program in women's hoops. "I'm happy our team won, for a lot of reasons," Staley said.

Northwestern 85, Michigan St 55

In Evanston, Ill, Lindsey Pulliam scored 31 points and No. 19 Northwestern beat Michigan State 85-55 for its third straight win.

Pulliam, a junior guard, also scored her 1,500th career point to become the first player in program history to reach that mark the fastest.

Veronica Burton scored nine of her 23 points in the first quarter, including a go-ahead pull-up jumper amid a 17-0 run that put the Wildcats up for good, 10-9. Northwestern (20-3, 10-2 Big Ten Conference) made 4 of 5 3-pointers (80%) and led 24-14 at the end of the first quarter.

Pulliam scored seven straight points to open the second quarter and Northwestern led by as many as 24 before taking a 47-28 halftime lead. Pulliam scored 14 points in the sec-

ond quarter. Northwestern outscored the Spartans 19-8 in the third quarter and led by as many as 32 points with 1:32 left in the fourth.

Burton had 11 rebounds and Northwestern dominated down low, outscoring the Spartans 40-18 in the paint and scoring 24 points off of 16 Michigan State turnovers. Sydney Wood

had four steals and made five assists. Nia Clouden scored 12 points with seven rebounds for Michigan State (11-12, 4-8), which has lost five straight. Kayla Belles scored 12 points and Taryn McCutcheon had nine with eight rebounds.

South Carolina remains No. 1

NC State jumps UConn to No. 4 in women's 'Top 25'

NEW YORK, Feb 11, (AP): North have been a top-five team for a re-Carolina State jumped to No. 4 in The Associated Press women's college basketball poll, its best ranking

in 20 years. The Wolfpack, who moved up three places on Monday, have their highest spot in the AP Top 25 since Jan 10, 2000, when they were third. NC State has a huge game against No. 9 Louisville on Thursday night, when a win would give the Wolfpack a two-game lead in the Atlantic

Coast Conference. "It's great and I'm happy for the players. They've worked extremely hard and made a lot of sacrifices

so it's great for them to garner that recognition," NC State coach Wes Moore said. "But they don't give out trophies in February. We've got to stay focused in the process, one game at a time.'

South Carolina remained No. 1, receiving 27 first-place votes from a 30-person media panel. Baylor stayed No. 2, getting the other three first-place votes. Oregon was a solid

UConn, despite suffering its worst home loss in 15 years in a game against the Ducks a week ago, extended its streak of top-five appearances, coming in fifth. The Huskies

cord 253 consecutive weeks dating to February 2007. UConn was able to hang on to

its top-five ranking because the two teams directly behind it in the poll -Louisville and Stanford - also lost this week. UConn faces South Carolina on Monday night. Mississippi State, UCLA, Stan-

ford, Louisville and Maryland rounded out the top 10 teams in the poll. Oregon State dropped two spots

to No. 11 after edging Arizona State on a last-second shot on Friday night and then losing to Arizona on Sun-

No. 17 Iowa will visit 10th-ranked Maryland on Thursday night for a chance to take control of the Big Ten. The two teams are tied atop the conference with two losses each. Maryland has been playing extremely well lately, with nine consecutive wins. The last loss came at Iowa on Jan 9 – a 66-61 defeat. No. 19 Northwestern also has only two conference losses, with those coming against Iowa and Maryland.

Gonzaga saw its 21-game winning streak snapped by Saint Mary's on Saturday. The Zags fell four spots in the poll to 15th. While the team still has a comfortable lead in the West Coast Conference, the loss could hurt its chances of hosting the first two rounds of the NCAA Tournament.
