Bairstow leads England to 5-wicket win over SA

CAPE TOWN, South Africa, Nov 28, (AP): Jonny Bairstow brought England home with an unbeaten 86 from 48 balls against South Africa to win the first Twenty20 by five wickets.

Bairstow won it with back-to-back boundaries, a four and then a big six over wide long-on, to take England to 183-5 and past South Africa's 179-6 with four balls to spare.

England were behind the game through most of their chase despite Bairstow's boundary hitting until the 17th over, when Bairstow and captain Eoin Morgan plundered 28 off left-arm

seamer Beuran Hendricks.

Hendricks bowled three wickets in that over to contribute to South Africa's demise, including one so far down the leg-side that it flew away for four.

The over changed the complexion completely at a fan-free Newlands, with England needing 51 runs from 24 balls before the over and just 23 from 18 after it.

Morgan fell for 12 in the next over to a catch at mid-wicket off Lungi Ngidi but England kept their heads, and Bairstow kept smashing boundaries, after being given the opening.

Bairstow hit nine fours and four sixes and was England's match-winner after being shifted from opener to No. 4 to give Jos Buttler a chance at the top of the order. Sam Curran took 3-28 for England and helped out with the bat with a six of his own right at the end, and was 7 not out.

South Africa posted a competitive total with 30 at the top of the order

Kagiyama and Sakamoto clinch NHK Trophy titles

OSAKA, Japan, Nov 28, (AP): With two-time Olympic champion Yuzuru Hanyu sitting it out, 17-year-old Yuma Kagiyama displayed plenty of flair on Saturday to win the men's title at the NHK Trophy, the final event of the figure skating Grand Prix series. Skating to music from the film "Avatar", Kagiyama landed a quad salchow at the start of his routine

from captain Quinton de Kock, 58 from former captain Faf du Plessis and 37 from Rassie van der Dussen.

Left-arm spinner George Linde kept South Africa on top with two early wickets on his T20 debut, including Ja-

son Roy caught behind for 0 off the second ball of England's chase. Bairstow and Ben Stokes rekindled their love of Newlands, where they combined for a world-record sixth-wicket partnership of 399 in a Test back in 2016.

and added two quad toe loops en route to 188.61 points in the free skate for a total of 275.87.

Kazuki Tomono was second with 226.62 points followed by Lucas Tsuyoshi Honda with 217.56.

Hanyu, who has asthma, elected not to participate in the NHK Trophy but has said he intends to compete in the Japanese national championships next month.

Kagiyama is the world junior silver medalist and the Japanese junior national champion. He is the son of two-time Olympic figure skater Masakazu Kagiyama. In the women's event, Kaori Sakamoto produced a near-flawless free skate to win the women's NHK title.

Skating to music from the film "The Matrix", Sakamoto, who was

first after the short program, landed a double axel and followed with a triple flip, triple toe loop combination en route to a score of 153.91 for a total of 229.51. Sakamoto also landed a triple lutz, a triple salchow and a triple loop as well as two more combination jumps.

Wakaba Higuchi, the 2018 world silver medalist who was second after Friday's short program, landed a triple axel at the start of her free skate and was second overall with 200.98 points. Rino Matsuike was third with 198.97 points.

FORT MYERS, Florida, Nov 28, (AP): Drew Timme had 28 points and 10 rebounds, Corey Kispert scored 25 points and top-ranked Gonzaga routed Auburn 90-67 in the Rocket Mortgage Fort Myers Tip-Off.

Timme, who left the game with about eight minutes remaining, went 11 of 16 from the field. Kispert made four 3-pointers. Jalen Suggs, Gonzaga's highest-rated recruit, added 12 points and six assists.

Allen Flanigan scored 20 points to lead Auburn (1-1).

A day after beating No. 6 Kansas 102-90, the Bulldogs (2-0) started strong in a game that tipped off at 11 am.

An 11-0 run gave Gonzaga a 16-6 lead. The sequence featured a three-point play by Timme, a 3-pointer by Jay Ayayi, a steal and slam by Suggs and a 3-pointer by Kispert.

Iowa 103, Southern 76

In Iowa City, Iowa, Luka Garza scored 41 points, missing just one shot, and Iowa beat Southern.

Garza was 14 of 15 from the field, making all three of his 3-point attempts, and was 10 of 12 on free throws for the Hawkeyes (2-0). He also had nine rebounds and three blocked shots in 29 minutes.

Kansas 94, Saint Joseph's 72

Braun made 10 of 13 shots, hit five 3-pointers and added nine rebounds.

Ochai Agbaji, whose foul trouble proved costly in an opening 102-90 loss to No. 1 Gonzaga, added 18 points. Jalen Wilson had 14 for the Jayhawks (1-1).

Wisconsin 92, Arkansas-Pine 58

In Madison, Wisconsin, Micah Potter scored 19 points, D'Mitrik Trice added 15 and Wisconsin overwhelmed Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

Wisconsin (2-0) scored the first 25 points, hitting 10 of their first 13 shots, before Kshun Stokes scored on a floater from the lane for the Golden Lions with 10:05 left in the first half.

Illinois 77, Ohio 75

In Champaign, Illinois, Ayo Dosunmu scored 24 points, Kofi Cockburn had 13 points and 11 rebounds and Illinois rallied to beat Ohio to improve to 3-0.

Jason Preston scored 31 points for Ohio (2-1). Ben Vander Plas added 20 points.

Ohio took a 71-67 lead on Preston's free throw with 1:56 remaining. Dosunmu tied it at 71 with a 3-pointer and Da'Monte Williams put Illinois ahead 74-73 on a 3 with 35 seconds left.

Texas Tech 84, Sam Houston State 52

In Lubbock, Texas, Mac McClung scored 18 points and Texas Tech beat Sam Houston State.

Georgetown's leading scorer last season, McClung has 38 points in his

LOS ANGELES, Nov 28, (AP): Charisma Osborne scored 31 points and No. 9 UCLA took control in a dominant first quarter, going on to beat Cal State Fullerton 98-49 in the teams' season opener that was delayed two days.

The teams were supposed to meet Wednesday, but the game was called off after an 80-minute delay because the Titans' COVID-19 test results hadn't come back.

Michaela Onyenwere, a preseason AP All-America selection, added 22 points and Natalie Chou had 16 for the Bruins.

Amiee Book scored 20 points to lead the Titans. They were held to 34% field-goal shooting and had 25

turnovers that led to 44 points by the Bruins.

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Maryland 94, Davidson 72

In Fort Myers, Florida, Angel Reese and Diamond Miller each scored 20 points and Maryland opened the season with a victory over Davidson in the Gulf Coast Challenge.

Miller had a career high. Katie Benzan added 13 points while Ashley Owusu and Faith Masonius scored 10 each. Chloe Welch led Davidson with a career-high 23 points.

Ohio 86, Notre Dame 85

In Athens, Ohio, Cece Hooks scored 32 points, Erica Johnson added 24 and Ohio rallied to upset Notre Dame, spoiling Irish coach Niele Ivey's debut.

Ivey played on two Notre Dame Final Four teams and was an assistant coach for the other seven trips the Irish made to the Final Four. She was an assistant with the NBA's Memphis Grizzlies last season when a young Irish team went 13-18 in Hall of Famer Muffet McGraw's 33rd and final season.

Michigan 95, Oakland 62

In Rochester, Michigan, Naz Hillmon scored 25 of her career-high 35 points in the first half and Michigan drove past Oakland.

Hillmon finished 16 of 24 from the field. She was 12 of 18 in the first half to help the Wolverines (2-0) take a 52-26 lead.

Houston 68, Boise State 58

In Houston, Quentin Grimes had 25 points and eight rebounds, Caleb Mills added 12 points and Houston beat Boise State in the Southwest Showcase.

Grimes was 9 of 15 from the floor after scoring eight points on 3-of-15 shooting in an opening victory over

Lamar on Wednesday. The Cougars out-rebounded Boise State 49-26, and had a 15-2 advantage in second-chance points.

UCLA 107, Pepperdine 98, 3OT

In San Diego, Tyger Campbell and Jules Bernard hit 3-pointers early in the third overtime, and Chris Smith added a three-point play to finish with 26 points and help UCLA outlast Pepperdine.

Senior guard Colbey Ross had 33 points to become Pepperdine's career scoring leader, but it wasn't enough to keep Pepperdine (1-1) from losing their sixth straight to UCLA (1-1) and their 38th straight to a ranked opponent.

Rutgers 96, Fairleigh Dickinson 75

In Piscataway, NJ, Ron Harper Jr had a career-high 30 points on 11-of-16 shooting, including 5-of-9 from beyond the arc, and Jacob Young had 24 points and seven assists for Rutgers.

Montez Mathis added 15 points for Rutgers (2-0).

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
