Duke shoots past Gardner-Webb

Rhoden, Seton Hall rally to shock No. 4 Michigan

ANN ARBOR, Michigan, Nov. 17, (AP) — Jared Rhoden scored 16 points, helping Seton Hall rally to beat No. 4 Michigan 67-65.

The Wolverines (2-1) had a chance to extend the game with 0.8 seconds left, but Terrance Williams missed the first of two free throws.

The Pirates (3-0) trailed by 11 points early in the second half and took the lead with 1:15 left for the first time since late in the first half.

Bryce Aiken and Tray Jackson each had 13 points for the Pirates.

Michigan's Hunter Dickinson had 18 points and nine rebounds, Eli Brooks scored 17 and DeVante Jones added 11 points and 12 rebounds.

Duke 92, Gardner-Webb 52

In Durham, N.C., Paolo Banchemo started for Duke two days after he was cited for aiding and abetting impaired driving, finishing with 10 points and eight rebounds as the Blue Devils beat Gardner-Webb.

Banchemo was stopped by police early Sunday morning along with

teammate Michael Savarino - coach Mike Krzyzewski's grandson.

Savarino was driving Banchemo's white Jeep, according to court records, and was arrested for driving while impaired. Banchemo, who was in the back seat, was cited at the scene and released.

Savarino did not play against Gardner-Webb (0-3), while Banchemo was on the court for 26 minutes.

Trevor Keels led Duke (4-0) with 18 points, seven rebounds and four assists.

Lance Terry scored 15 points to lead Gardner-Webb.

Villanova 100, Howard 81

In Villanova, Pa., Brandon Slater hit all four 3-pointers and scored 23 points, Collin Gillespie scored 21, Justin Moore had 16 and Villanova knocked off Howard.

The Wildcats (2-1) were pushed for 30 minutes by a hot-shooting Bison team aiming for an upset. Villanova made 14 3s and all 26 free throws.

Kyle Foster led Howard (3-1) with 19 points.

Purdue 96, Wright State 52

In West Lafayette, Ind., Trevion Williams had 20 points and 13 rebounds and Zach Edey added 18 points and 12 rebounds to help Purdue rout Wright State.

The Boilermakers are off to their first 3-0 start in three years. They topped the 90-point mark in a third consecutive game, their longest streak since December 2000.

Wright State (1-2) was led by Trey Calvin with 21 points and Tanner Holden with 17.

Memphis 90, Saint Louis 74

In Memphis, Tenn., Tyler Harris had 18 points and Emoni Bates scored 16 as Memphis topped Saint Louis.

Jalen Duren added 13 points and Josh Minott finished with 12. Both were perfect from the field for the Tigers (3-0).

Terrence Hargrove Jr. led Saint Louis (3-1) with 20 points and 11 rebounds.

BYU 81, Oregon 49

In Portland, Ore., Alex Barcello had a season-high 25 points, including four 3-pointers, and BYU thumped Oregon in the Phil Knight Invitational.

Te'Jon Lucas added 12 points for the Cougars (3-0), who led by as many as 33 points.

Eric Williams Jr. led Oregon (2-1) with 12 points. The Ducks shot 32% from the floor and made three of 14 3-point attempts.

Kentucky 80, Mount St. Mary's 55

In Lexington, Ky., Oscar Tshiebewe had a career-high 24 points with 16 rebounds, TyTy Washington scored 16 points and Kentucky ran away from Mount St. Mary's.

Sahvir Wheeler added 12 points and eight assists as the Wildcats (2-1) made 34 of 64 from the field (53%).

Alabama 73, S. Alabama 68

In Tuscaloosa, Ala., Keon Ellis scored 18 points, Jahvon Quinerly made a go-ahead layup with under three minutes to go and Alabama got past South Alabama.

Charles Manning Jr., who had 23 points for Jaguars (1-2), hit a 3 that made it 62-all with 3:09 remaining. Quinerly's basket put Alabama ahead for good.

Houston 67, Virginia 47

In Houston, Marcus Sasser scored 19 points, Kyler Edwards added 18 and Houston used a suffocating defense to beat Virginia.

Sasser and Edwards combined to shoot 11 of 24 from the field and 9 of 13 on 3-pointers. The Cougars (3-0) shot 49% from the field and 11 of 20 on 3s.

N. Carolina 94, Charleston 83

In Charleston, S.C., Armando Bacot scored a career-high 24 points, tied his career best with six blocks and added 12 rebounds as North Carolina rallied in the second half to beat Charleston.

It was the first road game of the season for the Tar Heels and new coach Hubert Davis, and the Cougars (3-1) had them on their heels for the opening half.

S. California 78, FGCU 61

In Fort Myers, Fla., Chevez Goodwin scored 20 points, Boogie Ellis added 18 and Southern California defeated Florida Gulf Coast in the return of Trojans coach Andy Enfield to the school he led to the "Dunk City" moniker in the 2013 NCAA tournament.

Isaiah Mobley scored 13 points for USC (3-0), which got 10 from Max Agbonkpolo.

Stanford rebounds

Maryland women romp over Mount

COLLEGE PARK, Md., Nov. 17, (AP) — In their first four games, the No. 3 Maryland Terrapins have won by an average of 31 points. After their latest win, a 98-57 romp over Mount St. Mary's coach Brenda Frese said that the team's biggest victory of the season wasn't good enough for her.

Angel Reese scored 18 points and had a career-high 15 rebounds, Mimi Collins scored 18 points and grabbed nine rebounds, and Ashley Owusu had 16 as Maryland rolled to a 98-57 win over Mount St. Mary's.

Katie Benzan had 14 points and eight assists. Chloe Bibby added 13 points and nine rebounds, Shyanne Sellers had 12 points and 11 rebounds.

Stanford 77, Portland 55

In Stanford, Calif., Haley Jones had a triple double to help No. 7 Stanford rebound from a rare home loss with a 77-55 win over Portland.

Jones, the Most Outstanding Player of last season's Final Four, finished with 17 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists as Stanford got back on track after being upset by Texas on Sunday.

That defeat snapped a 21-game winning streak for the defending national champion Cardinal and also marked the first non-conference loss at home since December 2017.

Louisville 82, Bellarmine 25

In Louisville, Ky., Emily Engstler scored 12 points and grabbed 14 rebounds for No. 10 Louisville, which earned its first victory of the season in an 82-25 rout over Bellarmine.

The Cardinals (1-1) never trailed in the contest and put the game away early thanks to a 13-0 run midway through the first quarter that let them build a 24-7 lead with 2:21 left in the period.

The lead would grow throughout the first half to a 48-14 halftime lead. By then, Engstler, a Syracuse transfer, already had her first double-double (12 points and 10 rebounds).

Michigan 73, UMass Lowell 54

In Ann Arbor, Mich., Naz Hillmon scored 19 points, Emily Kiser had 13 points and 11 rebounds, and No. 13 Michigan beat UMass Lowell 73-54.

Hillmon scored seven straight Michigan points in the second quarter, Kiser scored their next seven, and the Wolverines led 39-26 at the break.

Hillmon scored the first four points of the third quarter to start Michigan's 20-2 run. Six different Michigan players scored during the run.

Maddie Nolan added 18 points, making a career-high 6 of 7 3-pointers for Michigan (3-0). Danielle Rauch had 10 points, six rebounds and six assists.

W. Virginia 86, St. Francis 33

In Morgantown, W.Va., Esmery Martinez had 19 points and seven rebounds, Kirsten Deans added 18 points and seven steals, and No. 22 West Virginia beat St. Francis (Pa.) 86-33.

West Virginia scored the first 14 points of the game to start a 20-1 run through the opening seven minutes. Martinez had seven points and five rebounds in the first quarter, and West Virginia led 27-8.

West Virginia held St. Francis to just two made field goals in the third quarter, and closed on a 14-0 run to extend its lead to 47 points.

Yemiyah Morris scored 12 points, and Ja'Naiya Quinerly and Kari Niblack added 10 apiece for West Virginia (1-0).

Curry, Warriors rout Nets

George scores 34 as Clippers school young Spurs 106-92

NEW YORK, Nov 17, (AP): Stephen Curry had 37 points, easily winning matchup of the NBA's top two scorers when Kevin Durant had his worst night of the season, and the Golden State Warriors beat the Brooklyn Nets 117-99.

Durant came in leading the league with 29.6 points per game, but he managed only 19, the first time all season he didn't hit 20. He shot 0 for 8 in the decisive third quarter and finished 6 for 19 after sitting the fourth.

Curry almost caught his former teammate for the NBA scoring lead, making nine 3-pointers and raising his average to 28.7 per game. Durant dropped to 28.9.

Curry was 12 for 19 overall, with fans loudly cheering his long shots and giving him "MVP! MVP!" chants while Durant and the home team misfired.

Andrew Wiggins added 19 points for the Warriors, who bounced back from a loss in Charlotte that stopped a seven-game winning streak and improved their NBA-best record to 12-2.

Clippers 106, Spurs 92

In Los Angeles, Paul George scored 34 points, hitting 12 of 13 free throws, and the Clippers defeated the Spurs.

Reggie Jackson overcame a poor start and finished with 21 points to help the Clippers bounce back after their seven-game winning streak ended on Sunday.

Dejunte Murray narrowly missed

his second triple-double since Sunday, leading the Spurs with 26 points, 12 rebounds and nine assists.

Derrick White added 19 points and Drew Eubanks had 10 rebounds in the

Spurs' third straight loss.

Jazz 120, 76ers 85

In Salt Lake City, Bojan Bogdanovic scored a season-high 27, including five 3-pointers, to power the Jazz to a rout of the depleted 76ers.

Jordan Clarkson had 20 points and Rudy Gobert contributed 15 points, 17 rebounds and four blocks.

The Jazz had lost four of five games and needed their traditionally tough defense to return. Against this version of the 76ers, it wasn't clear how much of it had to do with Utah's guarding prowess or Philadelphia's ineptitude.

The 76ers shot 37% and only grabbed six offensive rebounds off all those misses. That allowed the Jazz to get into their sets early and produce easy looks.

Shake Milton scored 18 and Tyrese Maxey added 16 for the 76ers, who have lost five straight games for the first time since December 2017.

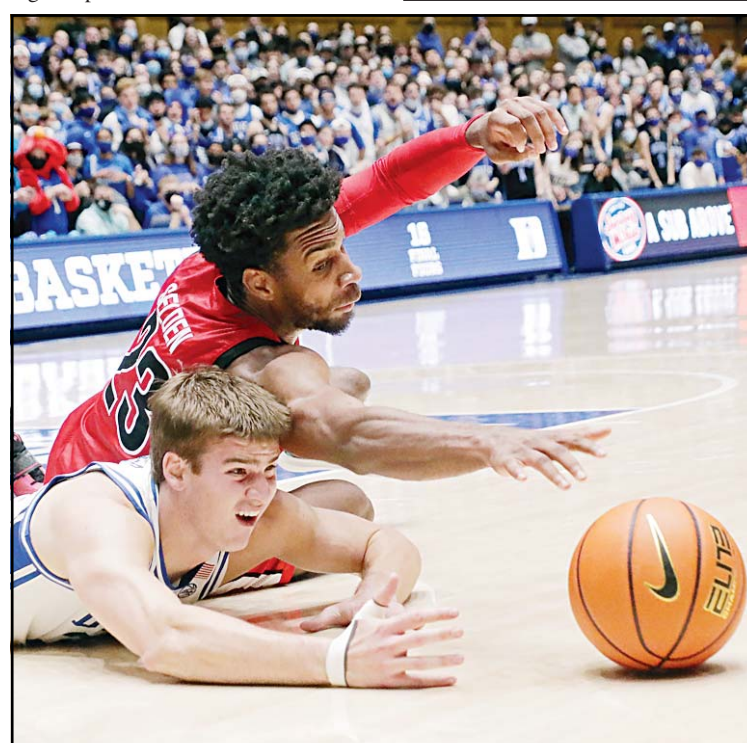

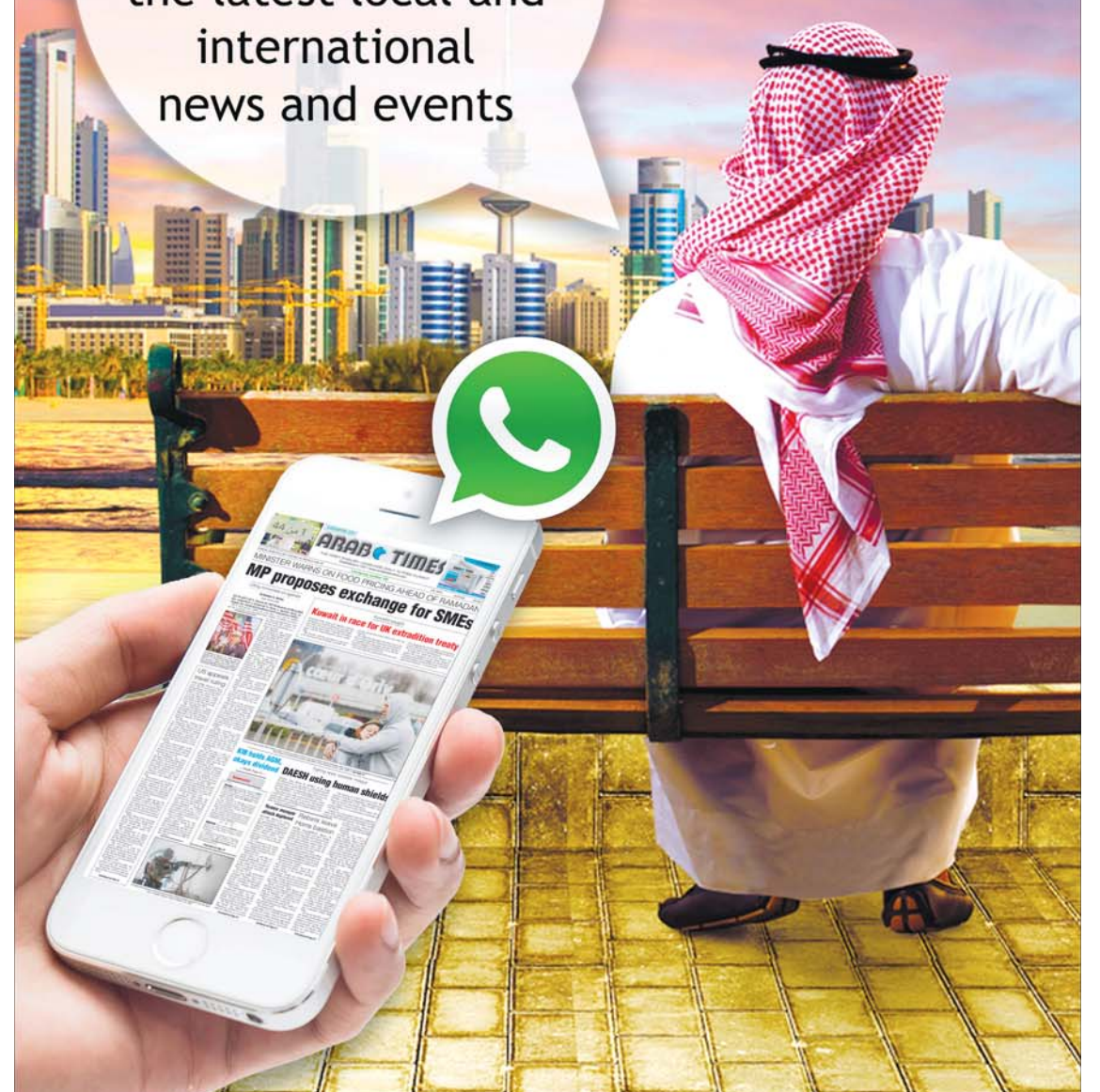
