Avs top Kraken

VANCOUVER, British Columbia, Nov. 20, (AP): Oliver Ekman-Larsson and Conor Garland scored power-play goals for the Vancouver Canucks to snap a five-game winless streak with a 3-2 victory over the Winnipeg Jets.

Defenseman Kyle Burroughs, with his first NHL goal, also scored for the Canucks who were 0-4-1 in their previous five games. Thatcher Demko stopped 36 shots.

ICE HOCKEY

Nikolaj Ehlers and Pierre-Luc Dubois scored for the Jets (9-4-4) who lost their second consecutive game. Eric Comrie had 26 saves.

The win was just the third in 12 games for Vancouver but may cool the temperature of disgruntled fans who have been calling for general manager Jim Benning and coach Travis Green to be fired.

Ekman-Larsson took a pass from Elias Pettersson in the high slot for a shot that traveled through traffic and past Comrie with about six minutes left in the first period.

Burroughs made it 2-0 at 3:12 of the second on another shot through traffic that hit the left post and into the net. Ehlers cut the lead in half just a minute later.

Garland notched Vancouver's second power-play goal at 6:54 of the second after Blake Wheeler was called for high-sticking. Dubois made it interesting with his tenth goal of the season with 2:28 remaining.

Avalanche 7, Kraken 3 In Seattle, Cale Makar had two goals and an assist, Andre Burakovsky scored two power-play goals and Colorado topped Seattle.

Darcy Kuemper had 25 saves and the Avalanche's Nazem Kadri extended his points streak to eight games with two assists. Colorado won its fourth straight game, has outscored their opponents 24-7 during that streak and are 6-1-1 in their last eight.

Houston extends win streak with win over Memphis

HOUSTON, Nov. 20, (AP): Clayton Tune threw for 264 yards and a touchdown and ran for another score as No. 17 Houston extended its winning streak to 10 games with a 31-13 victory over Memphis.

Tune tossed a 19-yard touchdown pass to Nathaniel Dell in the second quarter but was picked off twice, the first snapping a streak of 192 attempts without an interception. The QB also rushed for 59 yards, including a 20-yard touchdown as the Cougars (10-1, 8-0 American Athletic Conference) built a 21-3 lead at halftime.

FOOTBALL

Ta'Zawn Henry rushed for 73 yards and a touchdown and Alton McCaskill rushed for 58 yards and a touchdown. Dell caught seven passes for 100 yards and Jeremy Singleton finished with five catches for 80 yards.

Seth Henigan threw for 208 yards and a touchdown for Memphis (5-6, 2-5). Calvin Austin III had five catches for 103 yards.

San Diego St 28, UNLV 20 In Las Vegas, Lucas Johnson completed 18 of 24 pass attempts for 192 yards and threw three touchdowns, and No. 23 San Diego State survived a scare to beat UNLV.

The Aztecs (10-1) led by just 21-20 before Johnson

found Jesse Matthews for a 7-yard strike with 3:33 left in the game.

Wash State 44, Arizona 18

In Pullman, Wash., Max Borghi rushed for a career-high 139 yards and two touchdowns in the last

home game of his career, Travell Harris and Calvin Jackson Jr. each had two touchdown receptions, and Washington State became bowl eligible with a 44-18 win over Arizona.

A season filled with drama at Washington State (6-5, 5-3 Pac-12) surrounding former head coach Nick Rolovich - fired last month for refusing to receive a COVID-19 vaccine - will likely end with a bowl trip for the Cougars.

Air Force 41, Nevada 39, 3OT

In Reno, Nev., DeAndre Hughes rushed for a school-record 279 yards - scoring two touchdowns and adding a successful 2-point conversion run in the third overtime - to lift Air Force to a 41-39 victory over Nevada in Mountain West Conference play.

Hughes ran for 122 yards and a score - a 10-yard TD run in a 17-point second quarter - as the Falcons (8-3, 5-2) took a 17-3 lead into halftime. Carson Strong came out firing for the Wolf Pack (7-4, 4-3) in the second half.

S. Miss 35, La. Tech 19

In Ruston, La., Frank Gore Jr. threw two touchdowns on four completions and Southern Mississippi beat Louisiana Tech 35-19.

Gore was one of three players at quarterback that totaled 110 passing yards as the Golden Eagles (2-9, 1-6 Conference USA) dumped Louisiana Tech (3-8, 2-5) in its last home game of the year.

Arizona outclasses Marist

No. 5 NC State women contain Lee, defeat Kansas State 90-69

RALEIGH, N.C., Nov 20, (AP): Elissa Cunane had 18 points and six rebounds as No. 5 North Carolina State pulled away from Kansas State for a 90-69 win.

Diamond Johnson had 13 points, seven rebounds and four assists for the Wolfpack (4-1), and Raina Perez and Kayla Jones each scored 12 points.

BASKETBALL

Kansas State center Ayoka Lee, who entered the game as the nation's second-leading scorer, finished with 19 points and 11 rebounds. She had been averaging 29.3 points per game, but the Wolfpack often denied her the ball.

Arizona 78, Marist 36

In Tuscon, Ariz., Sam Thomas scored 14 points, Bendu Yeanyey added

11 and Arizona beat Marist. Koi Love had nine points, nine rebounds and four steals, and Lauren Ware also scored nine points with four blocks for Arizona (4-0).

Kendall Krick led the Red Foxes (2-2) with 8 points on 4-of-7 shooting, while the rest of the Marist team shot just 10 of 48 (21%) from the field.

W. Virginia 78, Kennesaw St 58 In Morgantown, W. Va., Jasmine Carson came off the bench to score 14 points - including four 3-pointers - and Esmyer Martinez posted her 16th career double-double in West Virginia's win over Kennesaw State.

Martinez scored 13 points with 12 rebounds and KK Deans had 12 points for the Mountaineers (2-0).

Kennesaw State (2-2) shot 73% in the first quarter to take a 23-21 lead but West Virginia outscored the Owls 21-7 in the second quarter to take control.

Maryland 69, Hofstra 67 In College Park, Md., Ian Martinez made two free throws with 4.2 seconds remaining, allowing Maryland to edge Hofstra and avoid another loss this week.

Eric Ayala led Maryland (4-1) with 14 points but went just 5 of 17 from the field.

Jalen Ray scored 18 points for Hofstra (1-3).

Auburn 58, S. Florida 52

In Tampa, Fla., K.D. Johnson scored 15 points, Zep Jasper added 13 and Auburn rallied to beat South Florida.

Jabari Smith hit a 3-pointer 10 minutes into the second half during a 15-0 stretch that gave Auburn (3-0) its first lead at 42-40. It was the third made 3-pointer by Auburn in 21 tries to that point.

Caleb Murphy scored 19 points and Javon Greene added 12 for South Florida (2-2).

St. Bonaventure 68, Clemson 65

In Charleston, S.C., Kyle Lofton scored 22 points, Jaren Holmes added 19 and St. Bonaventure rallied from a 16-point deficit to beat Clemson in the semifinals of the Charleston Classic.

The Bonnies (4-0) went on a 21-2 second-half run that included five 3-pointers in taking their first lead since it was 2-0.
