Will we wait another ten years to see the authority printing a Quran copy?

Note that the applications of the Qur'an are available on the Internet for free, and there is no need to float a tender at all. Can there be a bigger scandal than this?

Some praised the young Minister of Information, and I heard good words about him from trustworthy sources. I regret hearing the news that the Ministry has banned the circulation of the book of the Emirati professor 'Jamal Al-Suwaidi' on the history of the Muslim Brotherhood!

After finding out more about it, the news turned out to be incorrect. Thanks to His Excellency the Minister, and we hope that he will activate the activities of art, culture and literature.

Small-time businessman wins comp

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 12: The Court of Appeals ordered a government company to pay \$89,000 to a small business owner for advertising work.

The Court of First Instance rejected the case on the grounds that the plaintiff did not present evidence, but his defense counsel Lawyer Sultan Al-Tawala appealed and submitted new documents. He also requested that the chairman of the board of directors of the defendant company take an oath before the court that there is no contract

between him and his client. The court set a session for the chairman of the company's board of directors to take the oath, but the legal representative of the company was the one who attended. The court insisted that the oath must be taken by the chairman of the company's board of directors and not the legal representative.

Based on the chairman's failure to take the oath, the appeal judgment was issued to cancel the ruling of the Court of First Instance, and to judge again for the plaintiff with the amount

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 12: The Ministry of Health said Kuwaiti and expatriate doctors working in the intensive care units, anesthesia and emergency departments will get a 500 dinars raise in their salaries retrospectively as of July 1, 2021, reports Al-Anba daily.

Informed sources told the daily more than 1,000 doctors are expected to benefit from the decision.

The sources indicated this came after the Civil Service Commission approved a 'special' monthly increase of 500 diexpatriate doctors working in vital departments of the government hospitals.

Sackings approved: Minister of Education Dr Ali Al-Mudhaf has approved the list of workers who will be referred for retirement, including administrators and teachers with 34 years

the educational sector. Sources revealed the retirement referral decision covers those who completed 34 years in service as of Aug 31. Sources said the decision will take effect on the first of January, indicating the last working day for those included in the decision

in service, reports Al-Anba daily quoting reliable sources from

Sources added most of those referred for retirement are school principals, pointing out the decision does not include central administration directors for the first time as the specified number of years in service (34 years) is not yet applicable to them.

Face print devices: The Ministry of Electricity, Water and

Renewable Energy has started the experimental usage of face print devices for 150 employees to ensure their effectiveness in recording attendance at work, reports Al-Rai daily quoting sources from the ministry. According to the sources, the new device can identify the

employee by simply standing in front of it to record the time of his arrival and departure. Sources added this project aims to tighten control and moni-

toring on the attendance of employees - more than 25,000 employees assigned in and outside the ministry. Sources explained the project is still in its experimental

stage. If proven successful, it will be implemented in all work sites affiliated to the ministry, sources stated.

Sources affirmed "the face print attendance system prevents manipulation and forgery that are possible in finger or hand print devices. The ministry previously discovered cases of forgery and these cases were referred to the competent authorities for investigation.'

Kuwaitis prefer houses: Kuwaitis who are accustomed to living in spacious houses still prefer to wait for their turn in the housing queue than to own an apartment in an investment area that does not exceed 200 square meters area, reports Al-Anba daily.

The ownership apartments sector in Kuwait remains a preferred and even the main option for many citizens, as it is a safe investment for many small investors with capitals ranging between 60 and 80,000 dinars, especially in terms of good

The sources added that the experience of owning apartments began after 2000, when ownership buildings began to pop up in Mahboula and Hawalli, which subsequently spread to the rest of the area such as the Capital, Bneid Al-Qar, Khaitan, Farwaniya and other investment areas. The sources pointed the Kuwaiti citizen prefers to wait for his turn in the government housing queue, even if it means waiting a long time instead of going for apartments in already crowded areas which suffer from lack of parking and medical and social services in general.

Mol officers course: Saad Al-Abdullah College for Security Sciences at the Ministry of Interior has started the orientation meetings for high school certificate holders with the rank of sergeant major in preparation for their officer course, reports Al-Rai daily quoting sources from the security sector.

Sources said the fifth and sixth batch of sergeants major -- the first high school certificate holder cadets (350 soldiers) -- will undergo a three-month military course; including scientific lectures, tests and sports. Sources added the course lasted for a year in the past, but the period was reduced to three months due to the Corona pandemic, indicating the required attendance is four hours per day (evening period).

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 12: Kuwait stocks chalked a modest rebound Tuesday partly recouping last session's losses. The All Shares Index, after a wobbly start, climbed 25.29 points to 6,854.97 pts paced mostly by heavyweights even as the overall mood

turned cautiously positive.

The Premier Market rallied 31.9 points to 7,442.73 pts paring the month's losses to 54 points while Main Market paced 12.40 pts. The BK Main 50 was up 11.08 points at 5,948.53 pts. The volume turnover meanwhile receded following Monday's moderate bounce. Over 336 million shares moderate bounce. Over 336 million shares changed hands – down 10.5 pct from the day before.

The sectors closed mostly in green. Technology outshone the rest with 4.57 pct gain whereas Telecommunications fell 0.11 percent, the worst performer of the day Volume wise, Financial Services topped with 125.4 million shares while Banking sector was ahead in value with KD 19.76

Among the prime movers, sector bell-wether National Bank of Kuwait rallied 9 fils to 948 fils on back of 2.7 million shares taking the year-to-date gains to 108 fils while Boubyan Bank paced 4 fils before ending at 765 fils. KIPCO and Al Imtiaz Investment dialed up 2 fils each while Noor Financial Investment Co sprinted 10 fils to

Zain fell 2 fils to 598 fils after pushing over 2 million shares was up 5 fils at 655 fils. stc inched 1 fil higher to 861 fils and logistics major Agility scaled 11 fils to close at 980 fils and is up 304 fils year-to-date. Boubyan Petrochemical Co soared 22 fils to 899 fils and YIACO jumped 22 fils with thin trading.

Automated Systems Co climbed 4.5 fils to 103 fils whereas KCPC erased 4 fils with thin trading. Burgan Company For Well Drilling took in 1 fil and IFA Hotels and Resorts added 1.2 fils. OSOS Holding Group paced 4 fils whereas United Projects Co and Soor Fuel Marketing Co stalled at 245 fils and164 fils respectively. Oula Fuel Marketing clipped 1 fil.

'Souq Hareem, Waqif on agenda'

Plan to revive traditional markets

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 12: Kuwait Municipality seeks to revive the old markets and develop them in a new way while preserving their heritage and historic value, reports Aljarida daily.

Director-General of Kuwait Municipality Eng. Ahmad Al-Manfouhi revealed that this plan aims to revive a number of Mubarakiya markets, starting with the Waqif Market, which is one of the traditional markets of historical value and is known as "The Hareem Market" (Women market).

He highlighted an amendment to the list of heritage and historical markets, and the revival of the Hareem Market through a series of amendments to the regulation.

Eng. Al-Manfouhi explained that the Hareem Market was abandoned due to the current market regulation, which stipulates that women with the right to engage in activity in this market must not have been employed and not be registered in the social security scheme.

Consideration was given to removing

this clause through the amendments to the new market regulation, allowing retired Kuwaiti women to engage in activity in this market.

The list of new markets also included market activities limited to women only, taking into account the preservation of the essence of the past in the heritage and historical markets in parallel with the revival of its luster again in line with the urban and social changes.

Eng. Al-Manfouhi stressed that the amendments followed an extensive study on the reasons for the lack of demand for the market in recent years and the importance of addressing the obstacles that caused the fall of this importance while providing the site's needs without violating the heritage nature of the market, in addition to increasing the activities practiced in the market.

He affirmed that the new amendments were referred by the executive body to the Municipal Council for review and ap-
