Foreign remittance tax seen as Kuwait's revenue booster

'Taxation essential for funding infrastructure, curbing counterfeit goods'

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 19: An economic and legal expert Adhbi Al-Tahnoon urged the government to diversify its sources of income to prevent deficits in the upcoming budgets.

He indicated that the current 2024/2025 fiscal year is projected to experience a deficit of KD 5.6 billion, with deficits likely to persist in future fiscal years due to ongoing increases in expenditures exceeding revenues.

Expressing his concern over the decline of the Kuwaiti economy in recent decades compared to other countries in the region, Al-Tahnoon affirmed the importance of working on boosting non-oil revenues.

He suggested expanding into various sectors, such as heavy industries, pharmaceuticals, food products, agriculture, and tourism.

Implementing Taxes

In a press statement, Al-Tahnoon proposed the introduction of a tax system, but under specific criteria. The most crucial among them is enhancing state services for

citizens in all sectors, improving health and education services, building new roads, and fixing any existing flaws. He highlighted that the poor condition of the roads has nega-

tively impacted the vehicles of both citizens and foreigners.

Al-Tahnoon explained that taxes can benefit the state in several ways, primarily by protecting local industries from foreign competition, especially regarding imported goods. Implementing a tax system would also diversify the state's revenues and prevent the national economy from continuing as a single-income system indefinitely. This diversification would ultimately lead to an increase in Kuwaiti products.

Joint session to sign accords

Kuwait backs Palestinians via diplomatic, political channels Kuwait, Bahrain set for high-level talks

NEW YORK, Oct 19, (Agencies): The State of Kuwait has consistently supported the Palestinian cause and rights through political, diplomatic, and humanitarian efforts, à Kuwaiti official has said.

Speaking before the UN's Second Committee on Economic Affairs concerning Palestine, Abdullah Bu Abbas, Kuwait's diplomatic attaché, emphasized, "Kuwait stands firmly with Palestine, recognizing it in the international community and participating in global political efforts to achieve a just and lasting solution to the Palestinian cause and end Israeli occupation."

Bu Abbas affirmed that Kuwait has spared no effort in pursuing this goal through all available channels, urging the international community to support Palestinians who have long endured Israeli aggression.

He also stressed the severe economic challenges facing Palestine, which hinder its stability and development. Bu Abbas pointed to the ongoing conflict, political instability, and the Israeli blockade that has severely impacted key sectors such as agriculture, indus-

try, and trade.

Citing a UN report from last May, he noted that over 80 percent of Gaza's population lives below the poverty line. He also highlighted that approximately

5.8 percent of agricultural and food industries in the West Bank have nearly ceased operations.

The situation in Gaza remains dire, with little improvement in access to

humanitarian aid or healthcare in recent weeks, he warned. Bu Abbas further underscored the importance of UN Security Council resolutions regarding the protection of civilians in Palestine.

Kuwait Permanent Representative to UN: UNRWA lifeline to millions of Palestinians

Meanwhile, Kuwait's Permanent Representative to the UN in New York, Ambassador Tareq Al-Banai, emphasized that UNRWA is a lifeline for millions of Palestinian refugees in the region and occupied Palestine. His statement followed a press conference at the UN headquarters on Thursday, where 123 nations reaffirmed their support for the agency. This show of backing stemmed from an initiative launched by Kuwait, Jordan, and Slovenia in May to express solidarity with UNRWA.

Ambassador Al-Banai reiterated the global commitment to UNRWA, cautioning against the severe consequences of halting the agency's operations and responsibilities toward Palestinians.

AI-Muzain inspects military camps

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 19: On Friday morning, Chief of General Staff Lieutenant General Pilot Salem Al-Muzain conducted an inspection of several military camps and sites, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

During his visit, he received briefings from commanders and duty crews about their assigned duties, workflow mechanisms, and overall readiness.

The Chief of Staff stressed the importance of maintaining the highest levels of vigilance and combat preparedness, wishing the teams continued success in safeguarding the security and safety of the nation.

Meanwhile, the Kuwaiti Army announced on Friday that the naval forces will conduct a maritime training explosion starting this Sunday until next Thursday, from 7 am to 6 pm

The Directorate of Moral Guidance and Public Relations stated in a press release today that the training explosion will take place in the designated firing range, located 16.5 nautical miles east of Ras Al-Jlaiah, extending toward Failaka Island, and six nautical miles east of Ras Al-Zour, extending to Umm Al-Maradim Island.

New regulations for charities announced

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 19: The Ministry of Social Affairs has issued a circular introducing new controls for the internal disbursement mechanisms of charitable associations and foundations, aimed at enhancing transparency and streamlining financial procedures, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

The controls include the following: Financial aid must be transferred exclusively through banks.

Checks will only be issued in necessary cases.

Financial transactions will be facilitated through electronic linking between the Ministry and banks.

Prior approvals will not be required for certain routine banking operations to ease the work of charitable organizations.

This circular follows a meeting held yesterday, led by Acting Undersecretary Dr. Khaled Al-Ajmi, who praised the collaboration between local banks and the Ministry's departments responsible for charitable societies.

The Ministry also announced plans to update its automation system for managing charitable associations, ensuring greater transparency and efficiency in financial operations.

Meanwhile, Dr. Amthal Al-Huwailah, Minister of Social Affairs, Family, and Childhood Affairs, urged the senior officials and employees of the Public Authority for the Disabled Affairs to collaborate diligently as a unified team to drive the development forward, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

PACI removes **408 addresses**

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 19: The Public Authority for Civil Information (PACI) announced in the official gazette "Kuwait Alyoum" that the residential addresses of 408 individuals have been canceled, either based on the declaration of the property owner or due to the demolition of the building. According to PACI, these indi-

viduals must visit PACI office to register their new address within 30 days of the announcement, and provide the necessary supporting documents. Failure to do so will result in penalties as stipulated in Article 33 of Law No. 32/1982, which imposes a fine not exceeding KD 100, multiplied by the number of individuals affected.

KUWAIT CITY: The Ministry of Electricity has announced that maintenance work on secondary transformer stations across the six governorates will beginning October 19 and will continue until October 26. As a result, some areas will experience temporary power outages during this period, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

NEW YORK, Oct 19, (KUNA): The State of Kuwait has emphasized that international partnerships are key to promoting global security, peace and justice. BRUSSELS, Oct 19, (KUNA): Kuwaiti Minister of Foreign Affairs Abdullah Al-Yahya has praised the "tangible" results of the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) and the European Union (EU) Summit for foreign ministers held in Brussels, Belgium.

In a statement, Al-Yahya described the summit as a historic event in line of the strategic relations between GCC and EU countries

He pointed out that the summit laid the foundation for a new phase of fruitful cooperation between the two sides in a way that enhances their position on the international level. He stressed that the summit was not only a chance to ex-

change views, but also a practical step towards deepening political, security and economic cooperation between the two sides in light of the regional and international developments and radical transformations the world is witnessing at various levels.

He added that this summit comes in a sensitive time, requiring the discussion of vital matters, most notably issues of security and stability in the Middle East, which require both sides to work in more comprehensive coordination to ensure calming the situation and avoid escalation.

Over the situation in Palestine and Lebanon, Al-Yahya men-tioned that European side showed interest especially over the ceasefire in Palestinian and Lebanese lands which reflects their commitment towards the stability and security of the region.

He stressed that the continuation of violence without a fair political solution will keep the region in a state of constant instability, indicating that solutions cannot be unilateral, but must rely on a strong partnership and coordinated strategies to address the roots of crises and prevent their escalation.

Daman health insurance system to create 6,000 jobs for Kuwaitis

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 19: Some officials at the Health Insurance Hospitals Company (Daman) visited the Daman Hospital in Ahmadi and Daman Fahaheel Center to check the readiness of the health insurance system in the presence of a group of doctors with various medical specializations.

Director of Medical Services at Daman Dr. Anwar Al-Rashed disclosed that Daman was established in 2014 as per the Amiri directive to include it in the National Development Plan (New Kuwait 2035), as a partner and supporter of the health system in all related fields.

He affirmed that the system contributes to providing integrated healthcare services by managing a comprehensive system of primary healthcare centers and hospitals with high capacity; in addition to a wide range of support medical services, such as medical laboratories, radiology centers, pharmaceutical services, ambulance and medical training facilities.

He said Daman is the first healthcare facility in the Middle East founded through public-private partnership (PPP), in addition to the first public subscription for a healthcare facility in Kuwait. He revealed it is the first in the region that offers medical services through the integrated health maintenance system (HMO). "Once the Daman health system is fully operational, it will generate more than 6,000 jobs for Kuwaitis and others in the new healthcare industry," he stressed.

Member of the Board of Directors of Daman and Advisor to the CEO Khaled Al-Abdulghani stated that "Daman Hospital in Ahmadi is considered a great edifice and a national project that makes us proud as Kuwaitis. It competes with international hospitals in terms of building, area, medical equipment, and professional and administrative technical staff.'

Al-Abdulghani disclosed that the company owns Ahmadi Hospital, a hospital in Jahra and a number of centers in different parts of the country to cater to the largest number of people benefiting from its services, not to mention being a distinguished medical architectural edifice.

He added the health insurance hospitals constitute a health system equipped with the most advanced medical devices, but it is not the

end of the company's aspirations. "We are continuing towards more development and progress. In the future, citizens will be jealous of expatriates, because of the medical equipment prepared for them in the health insurance hospitals. The operation of health insurance hospitals will reduce pressure and congestion in government hospitals," he asserted.

Director of the Medical Engineering Department Eng. Hussein Al-Sayegh confirmed that all the facilities and devices of the insurance hospitals have been inspected and approved by the concerned authorities, through 15 committees that reviewed and audited everything related to the operational capabilities of the insurance hospitals to obtain the necessary licenses.

Al-Sayegh pointed out that the added value of the Daman system includes many modern medical equipment and devices according to international standards and in line with the number of targeted beneficiaries of expatriates in the State of Kuwait to support the national health system through distinguished services at Daman centers and hospitals as part of the economic reform plan and the New Kuwait 2035 vision.

They are in leadership positions that often involve continuous meetings, making it challenging to engage with them quickly. Therefore, it is essential for official spokespersons to be fully dedicated to their role of ensuring effective and timely communication with the public and the media.

One of the biggest challenges facing official spokespeople is keeping pace with rapid developments amid technological advancements and the prevalence of social media platforms.

The time required to prepare an official statement can often result in delays, as it necessitates approval from various sectors within the ministry. This delay can lead to a loss of control over the media narrative. especially compared to the quick dissemination of news on social media.

In many cases, spokespeople may find themselves in difficult situations when they do not have sufficient information to address rumors or circulating news. Journalists contacting them may encounter a lack of clear and accurate information, which further complicates the communication process.

Communicate

This lack of information may stem from several factors, including the slow flow of information from government departments. In such situations, the official spokesperson faces a challenging choice - either remain silent, which may be interpreted as a confirmation of rumors, or issue a statement that lacks comprehensive facts.

While some sensitive issues do require a careful response, excessive delays in releasing official statements can heighten doubts and weaken citizens' confidence in the ability of government agencies to communicate effectively with the public.

In this context, a Professor of Media and Public Relations at Kuwait University Dr. Hussein Ibrahim affirmed that there are specific criteria and qualities to look out for when selecting an official spokesperson, which include a solid understanding of the agency's work and the ability to effectively engage with the public.

He explained that an official spokesperson must possess the ability to analyze problems and make quick decisions, tact, strong communication skills, and the ability to convey information accurately with the support of their deep knowledge of relevant topics.

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 19: Jahra detectives have started inves-tigations to identify and arrest three thieves who claimed to be securitymen and then robbed an expatriate of his wallet and mobile phone in Mutla'a Housing City, reports Al-Anba daily.

The expatriate filed a robbery case, stating that he was walking in Mutla'a when a car stopped with three people inside who claimed to be detectives and asked for his civil identification card. When he took his wallet to show them his identification card, they attacked him and robbed him of the wallet, which contained an undisclosed amount and bank cards, in addition to his mobile phone, then they fled from the scene.

Accordingly, a robbery by force case was registered and referred to the detectives for investigation in order to arrest the culprits.

'Need for transparency in government institutions'

"IN many government ministries, departments, agencies, and institutions, a troubling pattern has emerged: officials are increasingly exchanging blame rather than taking responsibility," columnist Mohammed Al-Duwaihees wrote for Al-Jarida daily.

"This troubling behavior signals that the pillars of transparency, integrity, justice, equality, accountability

and efficiency are crumbling leaving behind turbulent environment marked by a confused strategic vision. "Such an at-

mosphere not breeds only dysfunction but

Al-Duwaihees also leads to a decline in the

quality of services provided to citizens, as it undermines trust among employees and erodes the effectiveness of decision-making processes.

"The absence of a clear strategic vision hampers efforts to achieve desired goals in a timely manner. When vision becomes muddled, results tend to be random and ineffective.

"The loss of transparency fosters a culture where officials feel no compulsion to be accountable for their actions, resulting in a profound mistrust between individuals and institutions.

"Transparency, therefore, is not merely a best practice; it is essential for building trust and ensuring a functional relationship between the public and the entities designed to serve them.

"As the values of transparency, integrity, justice, and equality erode, they create fertile ground for corruption and favoritism, negatively im-pacting all dimensions of political, economic, and social life. In this chaotic environment, the ability to make sound, informed decisions diminishes, leading to ineffective strategies and mismanaged resources.

"It is imperative to hold individuals accountable, particularly those in leadership roles, to reinforce their responsibilities and enhance overall performance and efficiency. This requires cultivating a work environment where information related to current conditions, decisions, and actions is readily available, understandable, and transparent.

"The policies that affect society must be communicated clearly to relevant parties to foster collective understanding and engagement.

"Creating a positive administrative environment necessitates complete clarity in decision-making processes, well-defined plans and policies, and consistent follow-up and performance nonitoring Admin strat practices and policies should be subjected to regular accountability checks to ensure they align with the overarching goals of the institution and the needs of the public.

"By promoting a culture of openness and frankness in addressing work-related issues, government institutions can cultivate values of justice, equality, and integrity.

These elements are crucial for achieving sustainable, effective outcomes in the ongoing processes of development, reform, and positive

change. "The path to a more efficient and trustworthy government lies in transparency and accountability. By reinstating these principles, we can create a robust framework for sustainable development that benefits all members of society.'

Also:

"Bullying is a troubling phenomenon characterized by aggressive behavior, whether enacted by individuals or groups against others," columnist Prof. Dr. Bahija Behbehani wrote for Al-Qabas daily.

'This distressing behavior is particularly prevalent among school-aged children. Both the perpetrators and victims of bullying risk developing significant and lasting psychological issues.

"Research indicates that bullying is more common in private schools compared to public institutions. This disparity may stem from the diverse cultural, religious, and social backgrounds present in private schools, where differences can lead to mockery and verbal abuse, often manifested through derogatory names or nicknames intended to amuse classmates.

"Studies reveal that children and adolescents targeted for bullying often differ in appearance, religious or cultural background, social status, or may have health issues or disabilities.

"Additionally, gifted students who receive heightened attention and socially withdrawn individuals tend to be more susceptible to bullying. Newcomers, whether to the school or the country, are especially vulnerable to ridicule and bullying.

"One particularly insidious form of bullying is religious discrimination, where students are treated unfairly based on their religious beliefs or sects.

"This type of bullying is among the most harmful, affecting individuals, communities, and even the nation as a whole.

"Religious bullying is often learned behavior, ingrained in young minds during childhood, leading to the notion that those who differ in faith are viewed as "infidels."

"This attitude can be exacerbated by certain opinions and ideas proliferated on social media, which are echoed among many students in private schools.

"The racist and religious bullying

Ambassador Talal Al-Fassam, the State of Kuwait permanent Representative at the UN in Vienna, said in remarks to KUNA, on Saturday, that such crimes threaten communities' stability and security worldwide that warrant coordination at the regional and international levels.

Ambassador Al-Fassam, who headed the Kuwait delegation at the session, said the State of Kuwait is keen on boosting the regional cooperation through information swap, coordination with international agencies such as the UN agency for combating drugs and crime and the Interpol.

He has affirmed that Kuwait has continued to update its legislation to bolster the facing of the organized crimes. The session was held earlier this week.

"This overhaul will enhance the performance of government institutions and agencies. Achieving this transformation requires not just political will but also a cultural shift to confront and overcome these challenges, rebuilding public trust in the institutions that serve them.

"Furthermore, engaging employees in decision-making processes fosters a sense of ownership and accountability.

On the measures that will be taken to develop the project site, the Municipality said it will coordinate with the Ministry of Finance to discuss development of the project site after receiving it from the investor.

Meanwhile, council member Fahad Al-Abdul Jader said the Municipality's announcement about the adoption of a new system for impounding abandoned cars is the first fruit of cooperation between the Municipality and the council. He said the first step is to send a message to the car owner through the Sahel application; indicating the deadline for removal of the vehicle and its location, followed by a message to withdraw.

He added this cooperation is also considered the real implementation of the council members' suggestions.

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 19: The State Audit Bureau (SAB) confirmed that it has no objection to extending its approval for the Supreme Council for Privatization to evaluate the assets of Shuaiba North Power Generation and Distillation Station at a cost of KD 170,000 and carry out the procedures for privatizing the station at a cost of KD 1.2 million.

The newspaper obtained a copy of SAB's letter to the council, emphasizing the need to take into account the commitment to Clause Eight of its circular no. 6/2018 on the rules and regulations that entities under its supervision must follow when submitting to prior oversight and adhering to the guide for preparing tender documents, draft contracts, commitments and agreements subject to prior oversight.

Sources point out this is an important step towards privatizing a vital station affiliated with the Ministry of Electricity in line with its development policies; which include involving the private sector in the development plan, increasing the electrical energy production capacity, and preparing the business environment.

Sources revealed the station has a production capacity of 875.5 megawatts through three gas turbine units, each of which has a capacity of 220 megawatts; in addition to a steam turbine with a capacity of 215.5 megawatts. Sources affirmed all of the station's units are ready for operation according to the requirements of the electricity grid.

Sources added the council is adopting the privatization of two projects -- first is the North Shuaiba Station and second is a strategic study on the privatization of the main workshops of the ministry

Sources explained such a move is aimed at raising the level of productivity of the private sector, generating national income away from oil, detailed roadmap for the privatization process, and defining ways to raise the operational efficiency of the main workshops.

CMA mulls work-from-home initiative

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 19: The Capital Markets Authority (CMA) is exploring a groundbreaking initiative aimed at achieving a better work-life balance in Kuwait through a flexible work model, reports Al-Rai daily.

This initiative seeks to transition 25 percent of its total workforce to remote work designed exclusively for employees, excluding supervisors and managers.

A recent survey indicated strong interest among staff, with a higher than anticipated percentage --exceeding the target of 20 to 25 percent -- expressing a desire to participate.

The preliminary concept outlines certain limitations, such as reduced financial benefits for those working remotely compared to their in-office counterparts.

The CMA's relevant departments are actively developing the executive details for this initiative, balancing work flexibility with the goal of lowering operational costs.

Moreover, to ensure job discipline, specific administrative measures will be implemented for employees who do not fulfill their remote work responsibilities.

While the exact timeline for the implementation of the work-from-home initiative remains unclear, it is under study, along with other technical and financial aspects. The CMA is also establishing regulations and providing the necessary technical devices to facilitate remote work.

Financial Transfers

Al-Tahnoon supported the idea of imposing taxes on foreign financial transfers for both citizens and expatri-

He highlighted that many countries worldwide implement such taxes, suggesting that a rate of five percent would not significantly impact the average expatriate worker.

Al-Tahnoon said, "Since most expatriate workers transfer relatively small amounts, the overall volume of transfers would represent substantial sums that could support the state treasury."

He indicated that there are hidden customs fees applied to imports under the names of multiple fees, including customs clearance. He supported the idea of these "hidden taxes" in favor of imposing clear taxes on products imported from abroad, affirming that this would increase the state budget income.

However, Al-Tahnoon stressed the need for government oversight of commercial companies to prevent them from raising prices under the guise of implementing special taxes.

He affirmed that customs taxes are commonly levied in most countries that increasing taxes on businesses could lead to a yearly decline in final profits, as the state would need to provide more facilities and support to the private sector.

Increasing Revenues

Al-Tahnoon explained that all forms of taxes will enhance and support the state's general revenues by providing stable incomes for funding infrastructure, services for citizens, and other projects. Taxation will help curb the sale of tainted and counterfeit goods, which negatively impact the earnings of government organizations, manufacturing facilities, and private businesses. Furthermore, imposing taxes will strengthen the state's efforts to combat tax evasion and protect consumers from adulterated and non-compliant products that may enter the market.

Ireland, for example, has success-fully implemented a policy of balancing tax policies and promoting economic growth through a number of tax reforms. Therefore, it is important to establish a low tax system as a means to attract foreign investment.

Some new industrial facilities will be exempted from taxes. The overall tax burden on private sector businesses will be reduced. This approach has drawn foreign investment and spurred economic growth, incentivizing many capital owners to launch their enterprises in the first place.

The implementation of taxes in Kuwait will be in line with the initiatives of Gulf Cooperation Council countries with the aim of diversifying income sources, especially since the oil prices are not fixed.

Al-Tahnoon stated that Gulf countries have provided the opportunity to each country to enact internal legislation related to certain types of taxes, adding that when citizens see improvements in infrastructure and receive tangible benefits from the taxes they pay, they are more likely to support such measures.

He affirmed that taxes will have a positive impact on both current and future generations, and the implementation of conditional taxes can improve services and encourage better purchasing behavior among citizens.

In other news, the Palestinian movement Hamas officially declared on Friday that the head of its politburo Yahya Sinwar had been assassinated.

Time to 'end the suffering' in the Middle East: VP

Harris, Trump seek Arab American votes in Michigan

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich., Oct 19, (AP): Kamala Harris insisted it was time to "end the suffering" in the Middle East while Donald Trump visited one of the nation's only Muslim-majority cities on Friday as the dueling presidential contenders fought for a small but pivotal bloc of Arab American voters in swing-state Michigan.

In a rare reference to Israel's fight against Hamas and Hezbollah, Harris said, "This year has been very difficult, given the scale of death and destruction in Gaza and given the civilian casualties and displacement in Lebanon." She said the death of Hamas leader Yahya Sinwar "can and must be a turning point."

"Everyone must seize this opportunity to finally end the war in Gaza, bring the hostages home and end the suffering once and for all," she said.

Trump, meanwhile, avoided any specifics about his plans for the Middle East, but he said he didn't think the Arab American community would vote for Harris "because she doesn't know what she's doing.'

Later, he fought through technical glitches that silenced his microphone for almost 20 minutes at a rally in Detroit

Michigan is one of three "blue wall" states that, along with Pennsylvania and Wisconsin, will help decide the election on Nov. 5. Diverse voting blocs are key to winning virtually any swing state, but Michigan is unique with its significant Arab American population, which has been deeply frustrated by the Biden administration's support for Israel's offensive in Gaza following Hamas' Oct 7, 2023, attack on Israel.

Trump, who instituted a travel ban targeting Muslim countries while in office and has vowed to expand the ban to include refugees from Gaza if elected again, is trying to capitalize on the community's frustration with the Democratic administration, despite his well-documented history of hostile rhetoric and policies. There were modest signs Friday that

he may be making progress.

The Republican nominee visited a new campaign office in Hamtramck, one of the nation's only Muslim-majority cities, and was joined there by Mayor Amer Ghalib, a Democrat who has endorsed Trump. Meanwhile, three city council members in the same town have endorsed Harris.

"His visit today is to show respect and appreciation to our community, said Ghalib, who presented Trump with a framed certificate of appreciation.

Endorsement

Trump's allies have held meetings for months with community leaders in the state, which Biden carried by less than 3 points in 2020. Asked about the Hamtramck mayor's endorsement, Trump said: "I mean, frankly, it's an honor. I've got a lot of endorsements, Arab Americans, from a lot of people.'

Trump has held 15 separate events in Michigan dating back to April, when Biden was still the presumed Democratic nominee. Including a scheduled Saturday event in Detroit, Harris will have visited Michigan 11 times since she became the nominee, according to AP tracking of the campaigns' public events.

Foreign policy

And while foreign policy rarely sways US elections, the war in the Middle East is a critical concern for many of Michigan's Arab American voters.

Trump said Sinwar "was not a good person" when asked about the Hamas leader's death. Sinwar, one of the architects of the Oct. 7 attack, was killed Wednesday by Israelis.

'That's my reaction. That's sometimes what happens," Trump told reporters at the airport in Detroit.

Even as he reached out to disillusioned Arab American voters, Trump suggested he would end efforts to encourage Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu to restrain military operations that have killed tens of thousands of Palestinians.

Even though Biden "is trying to hold him back ... he probably should be doing the opposite, actually," Trump said

Harris highlighted her support from the Arab American community as well. On Friday, 52 Lebanese Americans endorsed Harris and her running mate, Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz, saying in a letter that the voice of their community "will be heard" under the ticket's leadership.

The letter reiterated calls for a cease-fire, and it cited a recent decision by the Department of Homeland Security to extend temporary legal status to Lebanese citizens in the U.S. Such status is made available to people from certain countries marred by war, turmoil or natural disasters.

But Harris has also faced demonstrators protesting U.S. support of Israel in the conflict. During a closeddoor meeting Thursday with students at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, she was confronted by a protester, according to a video posted by a pro-Palestinian student group on social media.

According to the video, as Harris was telling students she was invested in them, a protester interrupted her, asking, "And in genocide, right? Billions of dollars in genocide?"

A phalanx of Democratic governors - Maura Healey of Massachusetts, Wes Moore of Maryland, Tony Evers of Wisconsin, Gretchen Whitmer of Michigan, Josh Shapiro of Pennsylvania and Kathy Hochul of New York campaigned with Harris earlier Friday.

Longtime Michigan Sen. Debbie Stabenow, a Democrat, emphasized that the army of top Democrats descending on the state was not a sign of panic, stating, "We have to run like we're behind.

US election discussed in private talks

Biden meets with European leaders, says West must keep aiding Ukraine

BERLIN, Oct 19, (AP): US President Joe Biden said it's important for Ukraine's Western allies to "sustain our resolve" in supporting the country as he met Friday with European partners, with the upcoming U.S. presidential election casting a long shadow over his visit to Germany.

Biden met Chancellor Olaf Scholz of Germany, Ukraine's second-biggest military supplier after the US. They were joined by French President Emmanuel Macron and British Prime Minister Keir Starmer for discussions that also addressed the conflict in the Middle East.

With the election just weeks away and the race extremely tight, there are worries that a victory for Donald Trump, the Republican nominee, could upset the relationships that Biden is hoping to pass on to Vice President Kamala Harris, the Democratic nominee.

Trump has an appetite for imposing trade tariffs on key US security partners. He has expressed indifference to the security of Úkraine, refusing to say during a presidential debate if he wants the US ally to win its war against Russia. He's voiced doubts about coming to the defense of NATO members if

they come under attack.

The gathered leaders never uttered Trump's name in public, yet their remarks often hinted at the possibility that he could withdraw support from Ukraine and scorn global alliances that Biden and his counterparts view as critical.

Biden in an exchange with reporters following his meeting with the three European leaders suggested that the US election was discussed in the private talks. Asked if the leaders were worried about the presidential race, Biden responded tersely, "They're interested." Earlier in the day Biden emphasized

the need to support Ukraine. "As Ukraine faces a tough winter, we must - we must - sustain our

resolve, our effort and our support," Biden said. Scholz said that "we will stand

beside Ukraine as long as it is necessary," pointing to a planned \$50 billion international loan package funded by interest on profits from frozen Russian assets.

"Our position is clear: We are supporting Ukraine as strongly as possi-ble," he added. "At the same time, we are taking care that NATO does not

become a party to the war so that this war doesn't culminate in an even bigger catastrophe.

Scholz has indicated that he's skeptical about aspects of a "victory plan" drawn up by Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy, and says he will stand by his refusal to supply Taurus long-range cruise missiles to Kyiv.

Biden is also opposed to loosening restrictions on letting Ukraine use western weapons to strike deeper into Russia, but did not shut the door on the issue.

"In foreign policy, there's never a 'never will I change my mind,"" Biden said. "Right now there is no consensus on long-range weapons.'

Biden didn't want his term to end without visiting Berlin, after having been to other key allies such as Japan, South Korea, France, India, the UK, Poland and Ukraine. The visit was a quick one, with Biden spending about 20 hours on the ground in Berlin.

Concerns about what might come next were reflected as Biden received the highest class of Germany's Order of Merit, which was also bestowed on former US president George H.W. Bush in recognition of his support for German reunification.

1st migrants sent to Albania for processing returned to Italy

An Italian navy ship on Saturday took back to Italy the first 12 migrants from newly opened asylum processing centers in Albania following a court decision in Rome.

The court ruling on Friday represents an early stumbling block to a five-year deal between Italy and Albania for Tirana to host 3,000 migrants per month picked up by the Italian coast guard. They will be vetted for possible asylum in Italy or to be sent back to their countries.

Italian Premier Minister Giorgia Meloni has hailed the deal as a new "model" to handle illegal migration.

The court in Rome rejected the detention of 12 of the migrants, arguing they cannot be sent back to their countries or origin -- Bangladesh and Egypt -- because the court did not deem them to be safe enough. (AP)

India's remaining diplomats on notice not to harm Canadians, says Canada's FM

TORONTO, Oct 19, (AP): Canada's foreign minister said Friday that India's remaining diplomats in the country are "clearly on notice" not to endanger Canadian lives after New Delhi's top envoy in Canada was named a person of interest in the assassination of a Sikh activist.

India's high commissioner was expelled Monday along with five other diplomats, prompting Foreign Minister Mélanie Joly to compare India to Russia, saying Canada's national police force has linked Indian diplomats to homicides, death threats and intimidation in Canada

Joly said Friday that Canada won't tolerate foreign diplomats putting the lives of Canadians at risk.

"We've never seen that in our history. That level of transnational repression cannot happen on Canadian soil. We've seen it elsewhere in Europe. Russia has done that in Germany and the U.K. and we needed to stand firm on this issue," she said in Montreal.

Asked if other Indian diplomats will be expelled, Joly said: "They are clearly on notice. Six of them have been expelled including the high commissioner in Ottawa. Others were mainly from Toronto and Vancouver and clearly we won't tolerate any dip-

lomats that are in contravention of the Vienna convention.

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police went public this week with allegations that Indian diplomats were targeting Sikh separatists in Canada by sharing information about them with their government back home. They said top Indian officials were then passing that information along to Indian organized crime groups who were targeting the activists, who are Canadian citizens, with drive-by shootings, extortions and even murder.

India, for its part, has rejected the Canadian accusations as absurd, and its foreign ministry said it was expelling Canada's acting high commissioner and five other diplomats in response.

Canada is not the only country that has accused Indian officials of plotting an assassination on foreign soil. The U.S. Justice Department announced criminal charges against an Indian government employee Thursday in connection with an alleged foiled plot to kill a Sikh separatist leader living in New York City.

In the case announced by the Justice Department, Vikash Yadav, who authorities say directed the New York plot from India, faces murder-for-hire charges in a planned killing that prosecutors have previously said was meant to precede a string of other politically motivated murders in the United States and Canada.

Train derails in south Louisiana: Seventeen cars of a train derailed in south Louisiana on Friday, and several leaked a chemical used to sanitize swimming pools, but authorities said it was not a threat to the public.

It was not immediately clear what led to the Union Pacific Railroad train derailment around 7:30 a.m. in Donaldsonville, about 60 miles (97 kilometers) southwest of New Orleans. No injuries were reported, and no hazardous materials were involved, authorities said.

"We want the community to know that everyone is safe," Ascension Parish Sheriff's Lt. Col. Cody Melancon said in a statement posted on Facebook. "We have no hazardous material leaks at this time. We do have several trains derailed. There's only a white powder substance on the ground that is non-hazardous, made to make medicine." (AP)

AG, ex-sheriff face off in race: Former US Rep Dave Reichert, a twoterm sheriff known for helping to hunt down a prolific serial killer, is trying to

become Washington's first GOP governor in 40 years. But he faces a difficult hurdle in the Democratic stronghold

against longtime Attorney General Bob Ferguson, a darling of liberals for his many lawsuits against the Trump administration. The two candidates have spent months trading accusations of dishonesty, especially

when it comes to abortion rights, as they fight to lead a state that hasn't had an open race for its top job in more than a decade.

They are seeking to replace Democratic Gov. Jay Inslee, the longest serving governor in office in the country, who declined to seek a fourth term.

Reichert, 74, has struggled to gain widespread appeal among independent and moderate Democratic voters - or unified support from the state Republican party, which endorsed a rival in the primary. And as ballots are sent out in the vote-by-mail state, his path to victory appears increasingly shaky. (AP)

Calif fire burns 2 homes: A fast-moving fire fed by strong winds burned two homes Friday and damaged several others in a hillside neighborhood in the city of Oakland, where roughly 500 people were ordered to evacuate, officials said.

Fire Chief Damon Covington said that at about 1:30 p.m., calls came in reporting a fire in front of a home in the Oakland hills. Crews arrived as the inferno quickly grew with winds ranging from calm breezes to 40 mph (64 kph) gusts during red flag conditions.

Michael Hunt, a spokesperson for the fire department, said one of the homes was significantly burned while the second suffered minor damage from the flames. Fewer than 10 other homes had smoke and water damage. Early reports had conflicting numbers of impacted structures. (AP)

Moldova to hold two pivotal votes

MAGDACESTI, Moldova, Oct 19. (AP): On a frigid evening in a village near Moldova's capital, President Maia Sandu warned locals of Russian meddling as she seeks reelection and touted joining the European Union as the only way forward.

Her message came days before key votes that could help to determine the country's future.

Sandu is seeking a second term in office in a presidential election Sunday in which she is opposed by several pro-Moscow candidates out of a total of 11. A "yes" or "no" referendum will also be held the same day on whether to enshrine the path toward joining the EU in the country's constitution.

This decision will influence our lives not only for the next four years," the pro-Western president told the crowd from an outdoor bandstand in Magdacesti, about 10 miles (16 kilometers) from the capital, Chisinau. "This decision will influence our lives for decades to come."

Charles visit rekindles Australia's debate on ending ties to British monarchy

MELBOURNE, Australia, Oct 19, (AP): King Charles III and Queen Camilla arrived in Sydney on Friday for the first Australian visit by a reigning monarch in more than a decade, a trip that has rekindled debate about the nation's constitutional links to Britain.

The Sydney Opera House's iconic sails were illuminated with images of previous royal visits to welcome the couple, whose six-day trip will be brief by royal standards. Charles, 75, is being treated for cancer, which led to the scaled-down itinerary.

Charles and Camilla were welcomed in light rain at Sydney Airport by Prime Minister Anthony Albanese, New South Wales state Premier Chris Minns and the king's representative in Australia, Governor-General Sam Mostyln. Charles is only the second reigning British monarch to visit Australia. His mother, Queen Elizabeth II, became the first 70 years ago.

While the welcome has been warm, Australia's national and state leaders want the royals removed from their constitution.

Monarchists expect the visit will strengthen Australians' connection to

their sovereign. Opponents hope for a rejection of the concept that someone from the other side of the world is Australia's head of state.

The Australian Republic Movement, which campaigns for an Australian citizen to replace the British monarch as head of state, likens the royal visit to a touring act in the entertainment industry.

The ARM this week launched what it calls a campaign to "Wave Goodbye to Royal Reign with Monarchy: The Farewell Oz Tour!"

ARM co-chair Esther Anatolitis said royal visits to Australia were "something of a show that comes to town."

"Unfortunately, it is a reminder that Australia's head of state isn't full-time, isn't Australian. It's a part-time person based overseas who's the head of state of numerous places," Anatolitis told the AP.

"We say to Charles and Camilla: 'Welcome, we hope you're enjoying our country and good health and good spirits.' But we also look forward to this being the final tour of a sitting Australian monarch and that when they come back to visit soon, we look

forward to welcoming them as visiting dignitaries," she added

Philip Benwell, national chair of the Australian Monarchist League, which campaigns for Australia's constitutional links to Britain to be maintained, expects reaction to the royal couple will be overwhelmingly positive.

"Something like the royal visit brings the king closer in the minds of people, because we have an absent monarchy," Benwell told the AP.

"The visit by the king brings it home that Australia is a constitutional monarchy and it has a king," he added.

Benwell is critical of the premiers of all six states, who have declined invitations to attend a reception for Charles in the national capital Canberra.

The premiers each explained that they had more pressing engagements on the day such as cabinet meetings and overseas travel.

"It would be virtually incumbent upon the premiers to be in Canberra to meet him and pay their respects," Benwell said. "To not attend can be considered to be a snub, because this is not a normal visit. This is the first visit of a king ever to Australia.

Two-day trip an attempt to reset ties with Beijing

UK's foreign secretary urges China against supporting Russia's military

BEIJING, Oct 19, (AP): Britain's foreign secretary raised concerns about China's support of Russia in its war against Ukraine, urging his Chinese counterpart to prevent Chinese firms from supplying to Russia's military in a meeting in Beijing.

David Lammy made the comments as he made his first visit by a Cabinet minister to China since the Labor government took control in July. He met Friday with Vice Premier Ding Xuexiang and held talks with Foreign Minister Wang Yi later the same day.

The two-day trip is an attempt to reset ties with Beijing after relations turned frosty in recent years over spying allegations, China's support for Russia in the Ukraine war and a crackdown on civil liberties in Hong Kong, a former British colony.

While Britain's government stressed that engagement with China was "pragmatic and necessary," officials said Lammy raised thorny issues including Russia and human rights concerns in Hong Kong and China's far-

western Xinjiang province. Lammy "stated how both the UK and China have a shared interest in European peace and ending the war. He reaffirmed that concerns over China's supply of equipment to Russia's military industrial complex risks damaging China's relationships with Europe whilst helping to sustain Russia's war," the Foreign Office said in a state-

ment after the meeting. Lammy urged Wang to "take all measures to investigate and to prevent Chinese companies from supplying Russia's military," the statement said, adding the two sides agreed to continue discussions on this and other geopolitical issues such as the conflict in the Middle East.

The United States sanctioned two Chinese companies on Thursday for allegedly helping Russia build longrange attack drones used in the war in Ukraine. The Chinese Embassy in Washington said the allegations were false. Lammy also raised "serious concerns" about the implementation of a sweeping national security law in Hong Kong, and called for the release of Hong Kong publisher and activist Jimmy Lai.

Lai, 76, has been in custody since December 2020 and will testify in November for his defense in a landmark national security trial. He has British citizenship and his legal team has been pressing British authorities to do more to help him.

Before traveling to China, Lammy said it was important to speak "candidly" about "both areas of contention as well as areas for cooperation in the UK's national interest.

Human rights groups have demanded that Lammy press the Chinese government over its crackdowns on dissent in Hong Kong, Xinjiang and Tibet.

Japan's LDP HQs attacked, suspect arrested

A man threw several firebombs into the headquarters of Japan's ruling party in Tokyo Saturday, then crashed his car into the fencing of the prime minister's residence, Tokyo police said. There were no reports of injuries.

The man, identified by police as Atsunobu Usuda, 49, was arrested on the spot on charges of obstructing the performance of official duties, although additional charges can be added later.

Although the motive for the attack was not immediately clear, Japanese media reports said social media posts believed to be Usuda's showed him complaining about the sums of money required to run for office under Japanese law, implying Usuda had political ambitions.

The media reports also quoted unidentified sources as saying Usuda had taken part in protests against nuclear plants. Usuda was not immediately available for comment.

The ruling Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) is increasingly unpopular with the public due to a ballooning money scandal involving dubious funding and suspected tax evasion. The party declined to comment on Saturday's attack, referring all queries to the police.

Voting for the lower house of Parliament is set for Oct. 27. Some tarnished politicians lost the official backing of the ruling party but are running as independents. (AP)

N.Korea discovers remains of South Korean drone

North Korea said Saturday it found the remains of a South Korean drone during a search in its capital, Pyongyang, claiming the drone proved the South's military was behind the alleged drone infiltrations over the city's skies earlier in the month.

South Korea's Joint Chiefs of Staff in a statement described the North Korean claim as "unilateral" and "unworthy of responding." The North's official Korean Central News Agency released photos showing a seemingly

damaged aircraft with wide, V-shaped wings and winglets. It said a joint investigation by North Korea's military and state security agencies concluded that the aircraft, which it said was found on Oct. 13, was the same type of drone that appeared in a South Korean military parade earlier in October. North Korea accused South Korea of flying drones over the night skies of Pyongyang three different times this month to drop anti-North Korean propaganda leaflets.

It threatened to respond with force such flights occur again.

The aircraft allegedly found in Pyongyang was likely one of the drones that were used to drop leaf-lets, North Korea's Defense Ministry said, but further examinations were needed to verify that. Should South Korea deny that the aircraft was used to drop leaflets, that would only confess to a separate infiltration of North Korea's airspace by the South's military, the ministry said. (AP)

Venezuela prez names Saab as industry minister

CARACAS, Venezuela, Oct 19, (AP): Venezuelan President Nicolás Maduro on Friday appointed to his Cabinet a close ally who was pardoned by US President Joe Biden last year as part of a prisoner swap and following assurances that Venezuela would hold a fair presidential election in 2024

Maduro named Alex Saab minister of industry and national production and tasked him with promoting "the development of the entire industrial system of Venezuela within the framework" of what he called a "new economic model." Maduro made the announcement on the messaging app Telegram.

Saab returned to Venezuela a free man in December after being in custody since 2020, when authorities in Cape Verde arrested him on a US warrant for money laundering charges. US prosecutors long regarded him as a bagman for Maduro.

The president secured his release and clemency in a deal conducted with the Biden administration. In exchange for Saab, Maduro released 10 Ameri-

cans and a fugitive defense contractor known as "Fat Leonard" who was wanted for his alleged role at the center of a massive Pentagon bribery scandal The largest release of American prisoners in Venezuela's history took place weeks after the White House granted the South American country a broad reprieve from economic sanctions, following a commitment by Maduro to work with the political opposition toward free and fair conditions for the 2024 presidential election.

The US ended the sanctions relief earlier this year after hopes for a democratic opening faded.

Last month, it responded to Venezuela's highly disputed July presidential election by sanctioning 16 of Maduro's allies, accusing them of obstructing the vote and carrying out human rights abuses.

Saab was arrested in 2020 during a fuel stop en route to Iran to negotiate oil deals on behalf of Maduro's government. The US charges were conspiracy to commit money laundering tied to a bribery scheme that allegedly siphoned off \$350 million through state contracts to build affordable housing.

Ivory Coast dissolves unions: Ivory Coast's government has announced a ban on all student unions following the deaths of two students and the arrest of 17 suspects in a confrontation between police and a student association with connections to some of the most powerful people in the country.

The ban on Thursday came after a government raid on student housing controlled by a student union, known by its French acronym FESCI, that the government says was connected to the deaths.

The National Security Council said that officers discovered large caches of weapons as well as several "illegal businesses" within the student housing complex on the main campus of the University of Abidjan. (AP)

2 Mozambique politicians killed:

Gunmen in two vehicles chased down the lawyer for Mozambique's leading opposition politician and a senior opposition official and fatally shot them in their SUV late at night on a main avenue in the capital, their party said Saturday, in a brutal burst of violence that rocked a country where tensions were already high amid a disputed election.

The killings came as the opposition party the two men were associated with prepared to challenge the results of this month's presidential election that drew more allegations of vote rigging and clamping down on dissent against the long-ruling governing party, which has been in power for nearly 50 years.

Elvino Dias, a lawyer and advisor to opposition presidential candidate Venancio Mondlane, was killed late Friday night by gunmen who riddled his car with bullets in the port capital of Maputo, the PODEMOS opposition party said. Paulo Guambe, a senior member and the spokesperson for PODEMOS, was also in the car with Dias and died in the shooting. (AP)

Boursa Kuwait ends week with general market index up 0.45%

Main market index rises 2.65%

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 19: The Boursa Kuwait concluded the week on a positive note, with the General Market Index climbing by 31.9 points, closing at 7,080.1, an increase of 0.45 percent.

The Main Market Index saw a notable rise of approximately 2.65 percent, gaining 167.91 points to end at 6,496.71 points.

Meanwhile, the Main Market Index 50 also experienced a 2.15 percent increase, up by 135.74 points, reaching 6,445.43 points by the week's end, while the Premier Market Index dipped slightly by 0.03 percent, losing 2.58 points to close at 7,576.66 points.

The overall market capitalization rose by 189 million dinars (approximately \$617.78 million), reaching 41.863 billion dinars, compared to 41.674 billion dinars the previous week

However, trading activity reflected a mixed performance: liquidity decreased by 15.46 percent to 338.59 million dinars, and the number of transactions dropped by 1.68 percent to 96,940 deals. In contrast, trading volumes increased by 5.75 percent, exceeding two billion shares.

From a sector perspective, eight sectors gained ground, led by consumer services with a 3.98 percent increase. In contrast, the healthcare sector remained stable, while four sectors experienced declines, with the industrial sector leading the downturn at 5.44 percent.

Notably, Alafco emerged as the top performer, surging by 111.16 percent, while Cinema led the decliners with a drop of 7.40 percent. Business City topped trading volume with 249.51 million shares, generating liquidity of 31.24 million dinars.

Market analysts attribute the current focus on medium and small company stocks to their attractive prices following a period of stagnation.

The overall market sentiment is positive, bolstered by the robust third-quarter profits reported by the National Bank of Kuwait. This trend is expected to enhance confidence in the banking sector and support ongoing government spending on projects, benefiting multiple sectors.

Regarding geopolitical tensions in the Middle East, analysts note a sense of anticipation for developments, particularly regarding potential military actions against Iran.

Recent statements suggest that any strikes will target military facilities rather than oil or nuclear sites, providing some reassurance and lowering the likelihood of widespread conflict in the region.

Daily Trading Summary -- On a daily basis, the Boursa Kuwait saw its general index decline by 23.6 points, or 0.3 percent, closing at 7,080 points. A total of 324 million shares were traded through 17,570 cash transactions, valued at 57.2 million dinars (about \$174.4 million). The main market index rose by 50.9 points, or 0.7 percent, to reach 6,496 points, with trading volumes of 248 million shares through 10,865 transactions worth 31 million dinars (approximately \$94.5 million).

Bayt Al-Taqah Company Update -- The Ordinary Gen-eral Assembly of Bayt Al-Taqah Company approved the reversal of its voluntary withdrawal from the Boursa Kuwait. This decision follows the Board of Directors' recommendation to revoke the withdrawal made on September 18. Notably, the company's losses increased by 30 percent year-on-year in the second quarter of 2024, amounting to 122.86 thousand dinars compared to losses of 94.55 thousand dinars in the same period of 2023.

ECB cuts interest rates again

Bank sees no signs of recession ahead

LONDON, Oct 19, (AP): The European Central Bank, which sets interest rates for the 20 countries that use the euro currency, does not expect the bloc to slide into recession as it cut borrowing costs once again Thursday in the wake of recent data showing inflation across the bloc falling to its lowest level in more than three years, and economic growth waning.

The bank's rate-setting council lowered its benchmark rate from 3.5% to 3.25% - its third reduction since June - at a meeting in Llubljana, Slovenia, rather than its usual Frankfurt, Germany, headquarters, and said the "disinflationary process is well on track."

According to revised figures on Thursday, inflation across the 20-country eurozone, sank to 1.7% in September, the first time in three years that it has been below the ECB's target rate of 2%

In a statement accompanying the de-

cision, the ECB predicted an inflation pick-up in the coming months, before a return to its target in the course of next year.

In a press briefing following the decision, ECB President Christine Lagarde gave few signals that the bank would be cutting interest rates again at the next policy meeting in December, stressing that the governing council is "not pre-committing to a particular rate path.'

She insisted that decisions will "follow a data-dependent and meeting-bymeeting approach."

Lagarde did acknowledge that the

recent data on economic activity had come in "somewhat weaker than expected," pointing to a contraction in manufacturing sector and weaker exports. Even though Germany, Europe's powerhouse economy, saw output shrink in the second quarter, albeit by 0.1%, Lagarde said that she she didn't expect the eurozone economy overall to fall into recession.

"On the basis of the information that we have, we certainly do not see a recession," she said.

Economists think mounting evidence of an economic slowdown in the eurozone, particularly in Germany, will pile pressure on rate-setters to consider another cut to help bolster growth by making it even cheaper for businesses and consumers to borrow. In the second quarter of the year, the eurozone expanded by a modest quarterly rate of 0.2%.

"Although the ECB did not precommit to any specific rate path, we believe that downside risks to growth in a context of easing inflationary pressure will lead to more rate cuts starting in December and continuing in 2025," said GianLuigi Mandruzzato, senior economist at EFG Asset Management.

China's economy on steady course to realize targets

Young people are applying for jobs at Gulf Bank.

BEIJING, Oct 19, (Xinhua): The Chinese economy gained a firm footing in the third quarter (O3) of this year in the face of mounting challenges at home and abroad, and authorities believe the country will remain on a steady course to achieve its full-year targets.

China's gross domestic product (GDP) grew 4.8 percent year on year to around 94.97 trillion yuan (about 13.33 trillion U.S. dollars) in the first three quarters of this year, data from the National Bureau of Statistics (NBS) showed Friday. In Q3, the economy expanded 4.6 percent from a year ago and went up 0.9 percent on a quarterly basis.

Despite a complicated external environment and emerging challenges at home, the Chinese economy has posted generally stable performance, Sheng Laiyun, deputy head of the NBS, told a press conference Friday.

In a breakdown, industrial output climbed 5.8 percent compared to the first nine months of the previous year, as robust increases were seen in equipment and high-tech manufacturing industries. The service sector reported continued recovery with a 4.7-percent increase in added value.

Consumption maintained an upward trend during the period with retail sales of consumer goods up 3.3 percent from a year ago. Fixed-asset investment rose 3.4 percent, spurred by vibrant capital influx into high-tech industries.

The job market was stable as the surveyed urban unemployment rate on average stood at 5.1 percent in the first three quarters, down from 5.3 percent a vear ago. The nominal growth of per capita disposable incomes of urban and rural residents came in at 5.2 percent.

Stable trend unchanged

According to the NBS data, the third quarter's growth was slightly down from 4.7 percent in the second quarter and 5.3 percent in the first. Despite this dip, authorities noted that the overall stability of the economy has remained intact.

Italian autoworkers embark on industrial action

ROME, Oct 19, (AP): Workers in Italy's troubled automotive sector are holding a national strike on Friday for the first time in 20 years, with a massive demonstration crossing the center of Rome. Tens of thousands automotive workers marched through the capital's streets, waving the unions' red flags and holding banners asking for better work conditions.

'We are working one to two days a week when it goes well. So, what we are saying today is that the (ecological) transition cannot be exclusively paid for by the workers,"

said Riccardo Falcetta, representative of the UIL metalworker union in Bari. The sector's three main unions in Italy are asking the government to defend employment in the sector and relaunch the future of the carmaking industry in Italy, beginning with global automaker Stellantis.

Wealthier Americans driving retail spending & powering US economy

WASHINGTON, Oct 19, (AP): It's a trend that has surprised many: Why, despite being squeezed by high prices, have Americans kept spending at retail stores and restaurants at a robust pace?

One key reason is a relatively simple one: Wealthier consumers, boosted by strong gains in income, home equity and stock market wealth, have increasingly driven the spending.

That trend, documented by Federal Reserve research, represents something of a shift from the pre-pandemic period. And it suggests that consumer spending, the primary driver of the U.S. economy, could help sustain healthy growth this year and next.

Lower-income consumers, by contrast, have been disproportionately squeezed by higher-priced rent, groceries and other necessities, leaving them less able to spend on discretionary items, like electronics, entertainment and restaurant meals, than they were before the pandemic. Though their spending is starting to rebound as inflation-adjusted incomes rise, it could be years before their finances fully recover.

The disparities help explain the gap between gloomy consumer sentiment and widespread evidence of a healthy U.S. economy - a major dynamic in the presidential race that is now in its final weeks. Only a portion of the American population is fueling most of the growth that is evident in government economic data.

The trends also help illustrate how the economy has managed to keep expanding at a solid pace even though the Federal Reserve, until last month, kept its key interest rate at its highest level in more than two decades. Despite the much higher borrowing costs for mortgages, auto loans and credit cards that resulted from the Fed's rate hikes, inflation-adjusted consumer spending rose 3% in 2022 and 2.5% in 2023. And it increased at a 2.8% annual rate in the April-June quarter, the government said last month.

On Thursday, the Commerce Department reported that retail sales in the United States rose 0.4% from August to September, a solid gain that suggested that shoppers are confident enough in the economy to continue spending freely. Restaurant sales jumped 1%, a particularly encouraging sign because it meant that many people felt they could spend on meals outside the home. The Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta now estimates that the economy grew at a strong 3.4% in the July-September quarter.

Higher-income households have been fortified by huge gains in housing and stock market wealth since the pandemic. Home values have marched steadily up, fueled by high demand and an unusually low supply of houses. And the stock market has been consistently hitting new highs, with the S&P 500 index up a sizzling 22.5% for the year. Roughly 80% of stock market value is owned by the richest 10% of U.S. households. "It speaks to the ongoing strength of those Americans. which is still carrying overall spending," said Michael Pearce, deputy chief U.S. economist at Oxford Economics.

Housing and stock values have soared in particular for the wealthiest one-tenth of Americans over the past four years. The value of their home equity has leapt 70% from the first quarter of 2020 through the second quarter of this year, according to Fed data - to \$17.6 trillion. Their stock and mutual fund wealth has jumped 86%, to just under \$37 trillion. Though inflation has eroded some of those gains, they are still quite substantial.

Such sharp growth in wealth has reduced the need for affluent Americans to save from their paychecks while still ramping up their spending. A report last week by Fed economists found that before the pandemic, retail spending had been rising for all income groups at roughly the same pace.

Star-studded ceremony honors fallen legends

2024 Rock & Roll Hall of Fame induction has poignant vibe

CLEVELAND, Oct 19, (AP): The Rock & Roll Hall Fame induction ceremony on Saturday night promises to be starry, jamming - and bittersweet. So many of the honorees this time have been lost.

Of the seven original members of Kool & the Gang, there is only one, Robert "Kool" Bell. There will be no living members of the MC5, which suffered the recent deaths of its two last original members, drummer Dennis "Machine Gun" Thompson and guitarist and singer Wayne Kramer.

Foreigner's original bassist Ed Gagliardi and multi-instrumentalist Ian McDonald have died and guitarist Mick Jones has been sidelined by Parkinson's disease. A Tribe Called Quest has lost Phife Dawg.

"I wish George was here and the rest of the other gentlemen - the other original members -

because they well deserve this recognition," said Hahn Brown, widow of Kool & the Gang drummer and songwriter George Brown, who died in 2023

In many ways, the class of 2024 - which also includes Peter Frampton, Cher, Mary J. Blige, Ozzy Osbourne, Dave Matthews Band, the late Jimmy Buffett, Dionne Warwick and the late Alexis Korner, the late John Mayall and the late Big Mama Thornton - is a catch-up class, reflecting turnover in the hall's leadership.

"There's been a change over from some of the old guard in years past to you see artists like Rush and Kiss and Stevie Ray Vaughan and Randy Rhodes, the MC5 and Judas Priest getting in. Whereas before that might not have been the case," says Tom Morello, a Rock & Roll Hall of Fame guitarist for bands like Rage Against the

Machine and Audioslave.

Morello recalls bringing up the issue of membership with Jon Landau, Bruce Springsteen's manager and a former Rolling Stone critic, who was then chairman of the nominating committee.

He told him: "Myself and my friends, we don't think so much about the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame because none of our favorite bands are in it.'

Now it will have a band Morello has long championed, the MC5, who paved the way for the Stooges, the Ramones, the Clash, the Sex Pistols, Rage Against the Machine and System of a Down.

Saturday's induction ceremony will be held at the Rocket Mortgage Fieldhouse in Cleveland. It will stream live on Disney+. A special featuring performance highlights and standout moments

will air on ABC on Jan. 1.

Cher - the only artist to have a No. 1 song in each of the past six decades - and Blige, with eight multi-platinum albums and nine Grammy Awards, will help boost the number of women in the Hall, which critics say is too low.

Artists must have released their first commercial recording at least 25 years before they're eligible for induction. Nominees were voted on by more than 1,000 artists, historians and music industry professionals.

There had been a starry push to get Foreigner with the hits "Urgent" and "Hot Blooded" - into the Hall, with Mark Ronson, Jack Black, Slash, Dave Grohl and Paul McCartney all publicly backing the move. Ronson's stepfather is Mick Jones, Foreigner's founding member, songwriter and lead guitarist.

Golden age icon Mitzi Gaynor dies aged 93

LOS ANGELES, Oct 19, (AP): Mitzi Gaynor, the effervescent dancer and actor who starred as Nellie Forbush in the 1958 film of "South Pacific" and appeared in other musicals with Bing Crosby, Frank Sinatra and Gene Kelly, has died. She was 93.

Gaynor, among the last survivors of the so-called golden age of the Hollywood musical, died of natural causes in Los Angeles on Thursday morning, her long-time managers Rene Reyes and Shane Rosamonda confirmed in a statement to The Associated Press.

"As we celebrate her legacy, we offer our

thanks to her friends and fans and the countless audiences she entertained throughout her long life," Reyes and Rosamonda said in a joint state-"Your ment. love, support

and appreciation meant so very much to her and was a sustaining gift in her life."

Her entertainment career spanned eight decades across film, television and the stage, and appeared in several notable films including "We're Not Married!" and "There's No Business Like Show Business," but she is best remembered for her turn

in "South Pacific."

Keaton, Kunis go from strangers to family

A story of healing, trust in 'Goodrich'

LOS ANGELES, Oct 19, (AP): Michael Keaton and Mila Kunis went from strangers to father and daughter in short order for the new film "Goodrich."

Before cameras started rolling, they were essentially only able to meet once. It was a dinner with their writer-director Hallie Meyers-Shyer, who just had a feeling they'd be great together.

And before they knew it they were off to the races, embodying two people with a lifetime of hurt behind them, wondering if a real relationship is even possible at this point: He's attempting to reconcile his absence in her youth and find a place in her life now, while parenting young twins from his second marriage; She's preparing to have a child of her own and wondering if she can trust her dad to be there this time.

But neither were particularly worried. The script, they said, was just that good.

"Hallie's writing was so honest and genuine and never felt forced," Kunis said. "It never felt fake and never felt anything other than the story of these people. Everything made sense. The dynamic was real. The relationships felt real.

Meyers-Shyer is the daughter of filmmakers Nancy Meyers and Charles Shyer, who not only got a film education at home, but also frequented her mother's sets and even appeared in several films as an extra. She made her directorial debut in 2017 with the Reese Witherspoon romantic comedy "Home Again" and started writing "Goodrich" soon after. She'd been thinking about a lot of things, about parenting in different decades and what that's like for an older father with young and adult kids, and about a complicated father-daughter relationship.

"In my personal life, my father remarried and had a second set of kids. And that was complicated for me," Meyers-Shyer said. "I felt like if that was something I was struggling with, it might be something other people struggle with.'

But perhaps the biggest inspiration was Keaton himself, an actor she'd always dreamt of working with. So she got to work writing

the character, a Los Angeles art gallery owner who is at a crossroads, with only him in mind. He was flattered, agreeing to star and executive produce the speedy 25-day shoot in LA. That meant both bringing production work back to the city Hollywood calls home and getting to wake up in their own beds.

Distribution

"It's nice to bring some business back to Los Angeles and I'm really proud of the fact that we got to shoot an LA movie in LA," Meyers-Shyer said. "LA is hard to fake. It's a very special, unique place.3

"Goodrich" is opening in theaters this weekend, from the indie production and distribution company Ketchup Entertainment, in a marketplace where it can be hard for a movie that isn't based on established intellectual property to make a splash - and even those aren't guarantees. But the mere fact that "Goodrich" is getting a theatrical release is notable, as opposed to going straight to streaming like many star-driven originals these days.

"It's sad that we're even talking about the fact that it's coming out in theaters," Kunis

said. "A movie in theaters, isn't that a mira-cle?' What a time to be living in that that's like a 'congratulations.'

Keaton is still a romantic about the theatrical experience too but doesn't get too hung up on where a movie might end up, as long as it gets made. Meyers-Shyer too saw "Home Again," which was a modest success in theaters, earning over \$37 million against a \$12 million budget get a nice afterlife on streaming

"It's really difficult for movies like 'Goodrich' to get made and get to the finish line now. I'm so grateful that we have and it's being released in theaters," she said. "I wrote this movie in 2018 and it's coming out in 2024. It was a really long process."

This time, she also did it without her mother producing.

"We were never going to be a filmmaking duo," Meyers-Shyer said. "I had always asked that she produce my first film ("Home Again") and that was only going to be that one. And that was the right film for us to make together. We had such an incredible experience, and I couldn't possibly have learned more from her.

Plus, her mom was just a phone call away when needed.

"I would call her all the time and ask her a million questions," she said. "She's a great asset and so smart about filmmaking."

Kunis and Keaton both agree that Meyers-Shyer is standing on her own and distinguishing herself as separate from her parents. They loved her classic taste and touchstones, from Mike Nichols to Jim Brooks. Keaton said a film like "Kramer vs. Kramer," a big influence on "Goodrich," is a "recent reference" for her. Ernst Lubitsch is more her style.

"She's not her mom," Kunis said. "I think that she's carved her own way through this industry. She's really talented and has her own voice. And the same way that people watching a Nancy Meyers movie can put it on mute and they'll know visually that looks like a Nancy Meyers movie, I equate the same thing with Hallie. She has a different aesthetic but an aesthetic nonetheless.'

The screen version of South Pacific" received three Academy Award nominations and won for best sound, while Gaynor was a best actress nominee for a Golden Globe. The role of the love-sick nurse Nellie, created on Broadway by Mary Martin, had been eagerly sought by Hollywood stars. Sinatra helped Gaynor land it.

She was starring with him in "The Joker Is Wild," when she had a one-day opportunity to audition for lyricist Oscar Hammerstein II. It was the same day she was scheduled for her biggest scene with Sinatra. When she explained her plight, he told her, "Don't worry, I'll change the schedule."

Hammerstein was impressed with Gaynor, who had already won the approval of director Josh Logan and composer Richard Rodgers. She was cast opposite Rossano Brazzi, about whom she sang "I'm in Love with a Wonderful Guy."

Television

"South Pacific" was not the turning point in her career that Gaynor had hoped it would be, and she shifted her focus from film to television, making early appearances on Donald O'Connor's variety series "Here Comes Donald," and on CBS' "The Jack Benny Hour." In October of 1959, she was the only women to guest star alongside Sinatra, Crosby, Dean Martin and Jimmy Durante on ABC's "The Frank Sinatra Timex Show" special.

Later in her career, Gaynor reinvented herself as a performing entertainer. Working with her husband and manager Jack Bean, she starred in her own musical revue that was a big draw in theaters throughout the US, Canada, the UK and Australia.

She became the highest paid female entertainer in Las Vegas and was the first woman to be awarded the Las Vegas governor's trophy for "Star Entertainer of the Year" in 1970.

When touring with a full orchestra, a corps of dancers and backstage personnel became too unwieldy and expensive, Gaynor slimmed down the production, eventually making it a one-woman show. They continued touring every year until 2002 when Bean's illness required a hiatus.

"I love touring; I've been doing it much of my life," Gaynor said in a 2003 interview. "We go back to the same places; it's like visiting friends. After the show, people come backstage to the dressing room, and we renew friendships. We send out almost 3,000 Christmas cards every year."

1D bandmates and more mourn singer

Payne's father arrives in Buenos Aires days after singer's death

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina, Oct 19, (AP): The father of former One Direction star Liam Payne arrived in Buenos Aires on Friday to arrange for the return of his son's body to England two days after the famous boy band singer fell to his death from a hotel balcony.

After landing at the Buenos Aires International Airport in the early morning hours, Geoff Payne was photographed emerging in a blue suit from a downtown hotel accompanied by British consular officials. He was hustled by security officers into a sleek van with black-tinted windows.

Payne visited the Buenos Aires morgue to identify his son's body before heading to the local prosecutor's office, which is investigating the case as a matter of protocol, to organize the repatriation of his son's remains, Argentine authorities said. He later stopped at the Casa Sur Hotel where Payne died to collect his son's belongings, where throngs of distraught Argentines had gathered for the third straight day to pay their respects.

A chain of young fans with linked arms maintained effective crowd control as Payne squeezed past the flowers, photos and hand-written cards piled outside the hotel in tribute to his son. He paused at the makeshift memorial, leaning down to pick up a photo of Liam before thanking everyone and disappearing into the hotel.

It's the first time that any of Payne's family members have been seen publicly since the star's sudden death, which set off a global outpouring of grief and emotion from major pop industry figures and diehard One Direction fans. The shock hit particularly hard at home, with his family saying in a statement hours after his death that they "are heartbroken."

Friends, collaborators and fellow musicians have expressed shock and sadness over the death of former One Direction singer Liam Payne, who died in Buenos Aires, Argentina, on Wednesday at age 31. "We're completely devastated by the news of Liam's

passing. In time, and when everyone is able to, there will be more to say. But for now, we will take some time to grieve and process the loss of our brother, who we loved dearly. The memories we shared with him will be treasured forever." the surviving members of One Direction, Niall Horan, Louis Tomlinson, Harry Styles and Zayn Malik, in a statement.

"We are heartbroken. Liam will forever live in our hearts and we'll remember him for his kind, funny and brave soul. We are supporting each other the best we can as a family and ask for privacy and space at this awful time." - Payne's family, in a statement.

"Liam was not only a pop star and a celebrity, he was a son, a brother, an uncle, a dear friend and a father to our 7 year old son. A son that now has to face the reality of never seeing his father again. What is troubling my spirit the most is that one day Bear will have access to the abhorrent reports and media exploitation we have seen in the past two days. It is breaking my heart further that I cannot protect him from that in his future." - Cheryl, the Girls Aloud singer and mother of Payne's son Bear Grey Payne, on Instagram. "Liam will forever live in our hearts and we'll remember

him for his kind, funny and brave soul," it said. "We are supporting each other the best we can as a family and ask for privacy and space at this awful time.

In media interviews over the years, Payne had expressed gratitude and affection for his auto mechanic father and nurse mother, describing them as hard-working and supportive. Both parents made cameos in "One Direction: This Is Us," the 2013 concert documentary about the popular boy band

"When I see him on stage I absolutely burst with pride, but we do miss him so much," Payne's mother, Karen, said at one point in the film.

The 31-year-old singer's final hours at the Casa Sur Hotel in Palermo, a trendy neighborhood of Buenos Aires, remain murky as Argentine prosecutors say he appeared to have excessively consumed drugs and alcohol. The prosecution cited investigators who found Payne's hotel room a mess with what appeared to be narcotics and alcohol strewn about broken objects and furniture.

It remains unclear whether Payne intentionally jumped or accidentally fell from the third floor. The autopsy performed a few hours after his death showed he died from the plunge, which caused "multiple trauma" and "internal and external bleeding" in the skull, chest and abdomen and limbs. The results of toxicology reports are pending.

Investigators said that there were no signs of anyone else being involved in his death, citing a lack of defensive wounds on Payne's body that also indicates he did not try to protect himself from the fall. The prosecutor's report said Payne could have fallen into a state of semi-consciousness or unconsciousness.

UNICEF warns over 3 mln in Sudan at risk of cholera

UNICEF activates emergency cholera response in Lebanon

BEIRUT, Oct. 19, (Xinhua): The United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) announced Friday that it has activated its emergency cholera response with Lebanon's Health Ministry after the detection of a case in northern Lebanon amid increasing displacement across the country.

"The war in Lebanon is already putting children at grave risk, and now cholera and other contagious diseases have emerged as a new risk," said Edouard Beigbeder, UNICEF's representative in Lebanon.

Lebanon recorded the return of cholera cases in October 2022 after their disappearance since 1993. In June 2023, Lebanon's Health Ministry announced the end of the cholera outbreak in the country after taking several measures to combat the epidemic. According to UNICEF, a multi-

sectoral response was launched on Wednesday -- when Lebanon announced the detection of a cholera case in the north -- in high-risk areas to ensure that children and families have access to safe water, sanitation, and personal hygiene supplies.

"UNICEF is making significant efforts to support the Ministry of Public Health to help protect all children and families in Lebanon from the spread of cholera," Beigbeder said.

"A ceasefire is more important than ever to protect children from being killed and injured, to stem the growing humanitarian crisis on the ground, and to focus on making sure that basic services are functioning

properly," he said.

Since Sept. 23, the Israeli army has been launching intensive attacks on Lebanon in a dangerous escalation with Hezbollah, causing great casualties and mass displacement.

Meanwhile, the UNICEF on Friday warned that over three million people are at risk of cholera in Sudan.

"3.1 million people, including 500,000 children under 5, are at risk of cholera," UNICEF said on social platform X.

According to UNICEF, the vaccination coverage in Sudan has plummeted to some 50 percent from 85 percent before the outbreak of the internal conflict between the Sudanese Armed Forces and the Rapid Support Forces in April 2023.

More than 70 percent of hospitals in conflict-affected areas are non-operational, and frontline healthcare workers have not been paid in months, it said.

Since the outbreak of the civil conflict, epidemic diseases such as cholera, malaria, measles, and dengue fever have spread, leading to hundreds of deaths.

Sudan's Health Ministry declared a cholera outbreak in the country in August, attributing the spread of cholera to deteriorating environmental conditions caused by the conflict and the use of unclean water.

The death toll from an outbreak of cholera in Nigeria has risen from 359 earlier this month to 378, with suspected cases since the onset in January exceeding 14,000 across the most populous African country, a senior public health official said Thursday.

At least 14,237 suspected cases had been reported in 35 out of 36 states as of Oct. 13, with a case fatality rate of 2.7 percent, Jide Idris, head of the Nigeria Center for Disease Control and Prevention (NCDC), told reporters at a news conference in Abuja, the capital.

"Cholera has remained a significant public health challenge, especially in states affected by flooding and poor water and sanitation infrastructure," Idris said, adding the five northern states of Borno, Adamawa, Jigawa, Yobe, and Kano had been identified as the epicenters of the outbreak.

He said that the NCDC deployed rapid response teams to affected areas and conducted reactive cholera vaccinations in internally displaced persons camps to combat the outbreak.

Ghana has confirmed nine cases of cholera in the country's southeastern Greater Accra Region, health authorities said late Monday.

The Ghana Health Service (GHS) said that it has received confirmation from the Ada East and Ada West districts that samples from patients tested positive for cholera.

The first case presented at a health facility with symptoms such as vomiting, diarrhea and abdominal pain a few days after attending a funeral in the Ada East District.

CDC reports 18,506 cases, most since 2014

Whooping cough at a decade-high level in US

MILWAUKEE, Oct 19, (AP): Whooping cough is at its highest level in a decade for this time of year, US health officials reported Thursday.

There have been 18,506 cases of whooping cough reported so far, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention said. That's the most at this point in the year since 2014, when cases topped 21,800.

The increase is not unexpected whooping cough peaks every three to five years, health experts said. And the numbers indicate a return to levels before the coronavirus pandemic, when whooping cough and other contagious illnesses plummeted.

Still, the tally has some state health officials concerned, including those in Wisconsin, where there have been about 1,000 cases so far this year, compared to a total of 51 last year. Nationwide, CDC has reported

that kindergarten vaccination rates dipped last year and vaccine exemptions are at an all-time high. Thursday, it released state figures, showing that about 86% of kindergartners in Wisconsin got the whooping cough vaccine, compared to more than 92% nationally.

Whooping cough, also called pertussis, usually starts out like a cold, with a runny nose and other common symptoms, before turning into a prolonged cough. It is treated with antibiotics. Whooping cough used to be very common until a vaccine was introduced in the 1950s, which is now part of routine childhood vaccinations. It is in a shot along with tetanus and diphtheria vaccines. The combo

shot is recommended for adults every 10 years.

They used to call it the 100-day cough because it literally lasts for 100 days," said Joyce Knestrick, a family nurse practitioner in Wheeling, West Virginia.

Whooping cough is usually seen mostly in infants and young children, who can develop serious complications. That's why the vaccine is recommended during pregnancy, to pass along protection to the newborn, and for those who spend a lot of time with infants.

But public health workers say outbreaks this year are hitting older kids and teens. In Pennsylvania, most outbreaks have been in middle school, high school and college settings, an official said. Nearly all the cases in Douglas County, Nebraska, are schoolkids and teens, said Justin Frederick, deputy director of the health department.

That includes his own teenage daughter.

"It's a horrible disease. She still wakes up - after being treated with her antibiotics - in a panic because she's coughing so much she can't breathe," he said.

It's important to get tested and treated with antibiotics early, said Dr. Kris Bryant, who specializes in pediatric infectious diseases at Norton Children's in Louisville, Kentucky. People exposed to the bacteria can also take antibiotics to stop the spread.

"Pertussis is worth preventing," Bryant said. "The good news is that we have safe and effective vaccines."

Death toll from mpox in Africa surges to 1,100

Marburg cases reach 62 in Rwanda

ADDIS ABABA, Oct. 19, (Xinhua): The death toll from Africa's ongoing mpox outbreak has reached 1,100, with a total of 42,438 cases, including 8,113 confirmed ones, since the beginning of 2024, according to the Africa Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (Africa CDC).

During an online media briefing Thursday evening, Africa CDC Director-General Jean Kaseya said that the African continent reported 3,051 new cases and 50 new deaths in the past week alone.

"For the first time, we have cases in Zambia reported on Oct. 8, and we have cases in Zimbabwe reported on Oct. 12. We also have additional cases in Uganda and Ghana. Unfortunately, we have the first death in Kenya," Kaseya said.

The Africa CDC said 18 African

"Cumulatively, we have confirmed 62 cases of the Marburg virus disease in Rwanda. We have recorded 38 recoveries and 15 deaths," Nsanzimana said Thursday evening during a special online media briefing on the multi-country mpox outbreak in Africa and the Marburg virus disease outbreak in Rwanda, alongside Africa Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (Africa CDC) Director-General Jean Kaseya.

Nsanzimana noted nine people are currently receiving medical treatments in health facilities, with most showing signs of improvement.

With a case fatality rate of around 24 percent, Nsanzimana emphasized that medical treatments and preventive measures are being intensified to reduce fatalities and curb further transmission. He highlighted Rwanda tered immediately. Infection prevention and control protocols similar to those used for Ebola are essential to limiting its spread.

Malaria: Nigeria on Thursday rolled out a new malaria vaccine that will be given free to recipients, a historic step in the fight against the deadly disease that has killed thousands of children under the age of five in Africa's most populous nation.

Nigerian Coordinating Minister of Health and Social Welfare, Ali Pate, said 846,200 doses of the vaccine have been procured in partnership with global vaccine group Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance and the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF).

Some 153,800 more doses are expected for delivery before the end of his month, totalin

key to fertilization process

NEW YORK, Oct 19, (AP): How a sperm and an egg fuse together has long been a mystery.

New research by scientists in Austria provides tantalizing clues, showing fertilization works like a lock and key across the animal kingdom, from fish to people.

"We discovered this mechanism that's really fundamental across all vertebrates as far as we can tell," said co-author Andrea Pauli at the Research Institute of Molecular Pathology in Vienna.

The team found that three proteins on the sperm join to form a sort of key that unlocks the egg, allowing the sperm to attach. Their findings, drawn from studies in zebrafish, mice, and human cells, show how this process has persisted over millions of years of evolution. Results were published Thursday in the journal Cell.

Scientists had previously known about two proteins, one on the surface of the sperm and another on the egg's membrane. Working with international collaborators, Pauli's lab used Google DeepMind's artificial intelligence tool AlphaFold - whose developers were awarded a Nobel Prize earlier this month - to help them identify a new protein that allows the first molecular connection between sperm and egg. They also demonstrated how it functions in living things.

Data from the African Union's specialized healthcare agency showed that Central Africa is the hardest-hit region, accounting for 86.4 percent of all cases reported and more than 99 percent of all mpox-related deaths.

The Africa CDC also expressed concern over new outbreaks in two prisons in Uganda, with cases having no travel history outside the country.

Mpox, also known as monkeypox, was first detected in laboratory monkeys in 1958. It is a rare viral disease typically 2024. (AP

spread through body fluids, respiratory droplets, and other contaminated materials. The infection usually causes fever, rash, and swollen lymph nodes.

In mid-August, the Africa CDC declared the ongoing mpox outbreak in Africa a public health emergency of continental security. Soon after, the World Health Organization also declared mpox a public health emergency of international concern, activating its highest level of global alert for mpox for the second time in two years.

Marburg: The number of confirmed Marburg virus disease cases in Rwanda has risen to 62, with 15 deaths, Rwanda's Health Minister Sabin Nsanzimana has announced.

has seen consecutive days with zero fatalities, and recoveries in the past week outpaced deaths.

The Marburg virus disease outbreak, which was first declared in Rwanda on Sept. 27, coincides with Rwanda's ongoing response to manage the mpox outbreak.

Despite the challenges, Africa CDC has urged countries not to impose travel bans or movement restrictions in response.

Marburg virus disease is a severe and often fatal hemorrhagic illness transmitted from fruit bats to humans. Human-to-human transmission occurs through direct contact with an infected person's bodily fluids or contaminated materials. There is currently no vaccine or specific treatment for the virus, and supportive care must be administhe vaccine, he added.

The new R21 vaccine was developed by scientists at Oxford University and made by the Serum Institute of India and Novavax.

Pate said ahead of the national rollout, the first phase of the vaccine's rollout will begin next month in the northwestern state of Kebbi and the southern state of Bayelsa, where malaria prevalence has been particularly high. It will be administered as part of the West African country's routine immunization schedule for children under one year of age, with over 800,000 doses set to be distributed during this phase.

"The arrival of the malaria vaccine is a monumental step in our national efforts to reduce malaria morbidity and mortality," the health minister told reporters.

China's Qin wins 50m breaststroke gold at Swimming World Cup

SHANGHAI, Oct 19, (Xinhua): China claimed two gold, four silver and two bronze medals at the World Aquatics Swimming World Cup in Shanghai.

Held in a short-course format, the tournament comprises three legs - in China, South Korea and Singapore - all of which serve as qualifiers for the World Short Course Swimming Championships in Budapest this December.

Liu Yaxin triumphed in the women's 400m freestyle with a time of three minutes and 58.45 seconds, with Li Bingjie and Tang Muhan taking second and third respectively.

"I am pleased with my time," Liu expressed. "Having five Chinese swimmers in the 400m freestyle final felt like competing with friends, which made it less pressured.

The men's 100m breaststroke saw world champion Qin Haiyang claim gold in 55.73 seconds, while his compatriot Sun Jiajun captured bronze.

În the women's 200m butterfly, 17-year-old Chen Luying earned a silver for China, clocking at a new junior world record of 2:02.71. America's Regan Smith secured gold in 2:01.85.

Olympic champion Zhang Yufei secured a silver in the women's 50m freestyle, finishing just 0.18 seconds behind the winner, Poland's Katarzyna Wasick.

China's Yu Yiting narrowly missed the women's 100m medley gold, settling for silver after a close race with Olympic champion Kate Douglass of the United States, who also won the women's 200m breaststroke.

"It's my first time swimming the 100m med-

ley in short course, so I'm very excited," Douglass shared.

France's Olympic champion Leon Marchand dominated the men's 100m medley with a time of 50.65 seconds. Chinese veteran Wang Shun finished fourth, while Olympic 100m freestyle champion Pan Zhanle came in sixth.

"I felt great," Pan said, reflecting on his per-formance. "I've improved my personal best by one second." Pan also expressed his admiration for Wang, stating, "It's my first time competing with him, and I learned a lot." The star-studded World Cup attracted 200 swimmers, including 19 Olympic champions, and marked the first international competition for China's swimming team since the Paris Olympic Games

Forward Fabio Abreu was the star

of the show for Beijing, delivering a masterful performance with one goal and an impressive four assists.

The 31-year-old Angolan set the tone early, heading the ball to Cao Yongjing in the 18th minute to break the deadlock. Abreu scored a header from Lin Liangming's cross eight minutes later, and just before halftime, he returned the favor with a sublime pass that allowed Lin to make it 3-0.

Henry trapped Ravichandran Ashwin lbw for 15 and then removed the tailenders in the space of six deliveries. India lost its last six wickets for 29 runs across 68 deliveries.

South Africa looms in Women's T20 World Cup final NZ survives anxious last over to reach final

SHARJAH, United Arab Emirates, Oct 19, (AP): Suzie Bates held her nerve in the final over as New Zealand advanced to the Women's T20 World Cup final for the first time in 14 years with an eight-run victory over West Indies.

Bates (1-6) bowled her only over with West Indies needing 15 more runs to win the semifinal match at Sharjah Cricket Stadium. The rightarm medium conceded a four off the first delivery before taking a wicket and conceding only two runs in the rest of the over.

Eden Carson took 3-29, while Amelia Kerr picked up 2-14 in four overs, as New Zealand restricted West Indies' chase to 120-8 in 20 overs. This was after 2016 champion West Indies had bowled well enough to restrain New Zealand to a competitive 128-9 after the White Ferns chose to bat first.

New Zealand is twice runners-up in this tournament - 2009 and 2010.

It will now take on South Africa in Sunday's final at Dubai, where a first-time champion will be crowned. South Africa stunned defending champion Australia in the first semifinal on Thursday, winning by eight wickets to reach its second straight final.

Emirates Team NZ wins 37th America's Cup

BARCELONA, Spain, Oct 19, (AP): Emirates Team New Zealand won the 37th America's Cup by clinching match point for a 7-2 victory over INEOS Britannia on Saturday.

Zealand's eight-man New crew embraced and cheered on the deck of the 75-foot Taihoro after holding Britannia off to win Race 9.

"It is just sinking in. What an amazing day, this team has been amazing, what an amazing feel-ing," New Zealand skipper Peter Burling said after his America's Cup finals-record 22nd race win.

New Zealand secured a threepeat after also winning the oldest trophy in international sport in 2017 and 2021. It was the Pacific island nation's fifth cup in total.

Burling and the New Zealand team posed behind a winner's banner as a fleet of fan boats gathered around and sounded horns in celebration.

"It has been a huge journey and I have loved every minute of it," New Zealand helmsman Nathan Outteridge said after his first cup title, compared to No 3. for Burling, his steering partner.

Britain has never won the America's Cup in its 173-year history. They were competing in their first final in six decades.

"A huge well done to Team New Zealand, what an amazing campaign and team," Britannia skipper Ben Ainslie said. "In my view they are the best team ever

in the America's Cup. New Zealand dominated the best-of-13 final off the Barcelona beachfront by sweeping the first four races.

Britannia bounced back with two wins on the same day in choppy waters and light winds, but the Kiwis then ran off three straight victories to wrap it up.

The Brits put up a fight in the final race, pulling level midway through, only for Taihoro, which means "To move swiftly as the sea between both sky and earth,' blocked their passing attempt and then sped off to win by a comfort-

able margin. "We had our moments in the finals but at the end of the day the better team won," Ainslie said.

It sparked a comeback that saw Rasmus Hojlund hit the winner to secure United only its third league victory and ease the pressure on manager Erik ten Hag.

It looked like being another disappointing day for United and Ten Hag, who was angered when Ethan Pinnock opened the scoring for Brentford in contentious circumstances in first half added time

United defender Matthijs de Ligt was ordered off for medical attention because his head was bleeding following an earlier collision. It left the home team a man down as Brentford prepared to take a corner and Pinnock headed over the line in the fifth minute of added time.

United responded quickly after the break thanks to Garnacho's goal in the 47th.

Hojlund flicked past Brentford goalkeeper Mark Flek-ken in the 62nd. Tottenham scored three times in eight minutes in a 4-1 win over West Ham.

Spurs trailed to Mohammed Kudus' 18th-minute goal at Tottenham Hotspur Stadium but powered back with a brilliant second-half performance.

Evangelos Marinakis was charged by the English Football Association for misconduct after Forest's 1-0 loss to Fulham last month in a match that was decided by a contentious, VAR-awarded penalty. The governing body claimed his behavior around the tunnel area after the match at Forest's City Ground was "improper" but did not give specific details of the incident.

An independent panel sanctioned Marinakis with a five-game ban. Forest said it would appeal.

Forest manager Nuno Espirito Santo was given a sep-arate punishment on Friday when fined 55,000 pounds (\$72,000) and banned from the touchline for two games after being sent off in his team's 2-2 draw with Brighton last month. He admitted using abusive and/or insulting words toward a match official. The FA said the sanction activated a further one-match touchline ban, which had been suspended, making three games in total.

Forest midfielder Morgan Gibbs-White was also sent off in that match and admitted using abusive and/or insulting words toward the fourth official. He was fined 20,000 pounds (\$26,000) and suspended for one match.

Brighton manager Fabian Hurzeler was also sent off, and he was fined 8,000 pounds (\$10,000) for acting in an improper manner.

Forest was fined 750,000 pounds (\$980,000) last week for an inflammatory post that got more than 46 million views. The club was found to have questioned the integrity of match officials in an "irresponsible" post on X in April following a 2-0 loss to Everton.

Leipzig blanks Mainz away

Wirtz returns as Leverkusen edges in-form Frankfurt

BERLIN, Oct 19, (AP): Florian Wirtz returned from injury to help Bayer Leverkusen defeat in-form Eintracht Frankfurt 2-1 in the Bundesliga on Saturday, when the latter was aggrieved not to be awarded a penalty in stoppage time.

Hugo Ekitiké looked set to score by heading the ball into an unguarded net after a mix up between goalkeeper Lukas Hradecky and Jonathan Tah, but Tah rushed back to put the airborne Ekitiké off balance and miss the ball.

Frankfurt's protests went unheeded and Victor Boniface's 72nd-minute goal proved to be the winner for the defending champion.

Boniface had an early chance from the penalty spot but Kevin Trapp saved his poorly struck spot kick in the ninth minute.

Frankfurt's Omar Marmoush showed how it's done seven minutes later, firing a penalty inside the left post after a

clumsy challenge from Robert Andrich. It was Marmoush's ninth goal in seven Bundesliga games, and it stretched his six-game scoring run.

But Andrich atoned by equalizing in the 25th after playing a one-two with Amine Adli and then Martin Terrier before a cool finish inside the far post.

Boniface finally scored when Trapp deflected substitute Wirtz's cross kindly for a simple header.

Leverkusen said on Tuesday that Wirtz injured his ankle while on international duty with Germany.

Also, Xavi Simons starred for Leipzig to beat Mainz 2-0 away, Freiburg routed Augsburg 3-1 at home, Borussia Mönchengladbach defeated Heidenheim 3-2, and Hoffenheim defeated winless Bochum 3-1.

Serhou Guirassy scored late as Borussia Dortmund beat promoted St. Pauli 2-1 in the Bundesliga on Friday, easing some pressure on the club before facing Real Madrid.

Substitute Jamie Gittens invigorated Dortmund's attack, beating a defender and crossing for Guirassy to head the winner in the 83rd minute, just five minutes after Eric Smith had equalized with a thunderous strike for the visitors.

Dortmund had dominated from the start but failed to turn possession into chances. St. Pauli goalkeeper Nikola Vasilj twice denied Guirassy when it seemed the Guinea star had to score.

Ramy Bensebaini broke the deadlock in the 43rd with a header to Pascal Groß' cross.

St. Pauli had a goal by Morgan Guilavogui ruled out through VAR for offside in the 30th.

Dortmund next visits Madrid in the Champions League on Tuesday. The two teams met in last season's Champions League final, which Madrid won 2-0.

Green keeps 2-shot lead: Hannah Green of Australia shot a 2-under 70 on Saturday to hold a two-stroke lead after three rounds of the BMW Ladies Championship in South Korea.

Green shot 64 in each of the first two rounds. The second round was completed early Saturday after rain washed out much of the play on Friday.

Green has led outright or shared the lead at the end of each round. She is 18-under 198 overall.

Yu Jin Sung of South Korea soared up the leaderboard with her 9-under 63, the best score of the round at the Seowon Valley Country Club, and was two shots back.

Ashleigh Buhai of South Africa was three off the lead after a 71, and Haeran Ryu of South Korea and Ryann O'Toole of the United States were four off the pace after they both carded 68s.

The field is loaded with 17 of the tour's 18 winners this season. The one major absence is Nelly Korda, the LPGA's No. 1-ranked golfer. She withdrew before the event with a neck injury. (AP)

Dallas Wings fire coach: The Dallas Wings fired coach Latricia Trammell on Friday.

Trammell went 31-49 in two sea-

sons with the Dallas Wings, including 2-3 in playoff appearances. This past season the team went 9-31 and missed the WNBA postseason for the first time since 2020.
