WASHINGTON, Oct 27, (KUNA): Minister of Finance, Minister of State for Economic Affairs and Investment and Acting Minister of Oil Noura Al-Fassam said the State of Kuwait capitalizes on its human resources while working to improve business environment and diversify its economy.

Kuwait is also working to expand the scope of financing, encourage long-term partnerships and build a regulatory framework suitable for investors as part of economic diversification, she said at the 2024 Annual Meetings Plenary of the World Bank Group and governors of the Arab central banks on Saturday.

Kuwait's strategy for economic diversification focuses on expanding the priority sectors, seizing the market opportunities, strengthenmy prosperous enough to address future challenges, she stated.

The State of Kuwait and other members of the Gulf Coopera tion Council witness a big economic transformation that required gradual diversification of the sources of income and less reliance

The process necessitated turning to strategic long-term investments based on innovations, hi-tech and sustainability, the minister

Al-Fassam reaffirmed Kuwait's commitment to building strategic partnerships on regional and international levels in order to advance sustainable development across the Arab world.

The Plenary, part of the two-day 2024 IMF-WBG annual meetings which came to a close today, was attended by WBG President Ajay Banga and heads of monetary institutions of the Arab coun-

"This signals the great importance Kuwait attaches to international cooperation in the framework of both global financial institutions," she pointed out.

Eng. Al-Fassam noted that she has had "constructive talks" with IMF leaders, notably IMF Managing Director Kristalina Georgieva, on the role of the Fund in enhancing international cooperation, experience sharing and successful examples of partnerships particularly in the Middle East region.

"The meeting with WBG representatives explored ways for Kuwait benefiting from the Group's experience in economic and fi nancial reforms and promoting the partnership between both sides,

GCC grid saves \$3bn since 2009

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 27: The Gulf Cooperation Council Interconnection Authority announced that it has saved approximately USD 3 billion for member states over the past 14 years from 2009 to 2023.

In a recent report, the authority affirmed that this interconnection project is one of the most significant infrastructure projects approved by the leaders of the

It explained that the energy traded among member states amounts to five terawatt-hours. Savings achieved from reducing installed capacities reached USD 950 million, and reductions in operating costs resulted in savings of KD 180 million. Also, the economic value of the exchanged energy was estimated at USD 690 million.

The team will inventory and inspect properties allocated for women, including the Sabah Al-Salem residential complex and the Taima and Sulaibiya areas, to identify the best development strate-

Minister Al-Mishari emphasized that the team will have the authority to study the disposal of allocated areas, propose amendments, inspect buildings, and develop solutions, submitting recommendations for project enhancement. A four-month timeframe has been established for the team to complete its tasks from the date of the decision's issuance.

Kuwait committed to combat deadly threat of smoking, says Dr Al-Awadhi

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 27: Health Minister Dr. Ahmed Al-Awadhi said tobacco is one of the most harmful health risks the world has ever encountered; citing statistics that over a billion people use tobacco worldwide and the smoking epidemic kills more than a million people every year.

In his speech at the opening of the International Conference on Tobacco Control with the theme, "Smoking Scourge and Conflict of Interest," Al-Awadhi pointed out that smoking raises the risk of developing severe illnesses like heart disease, stroke, lung damage and numerous types of cancer. He stated that tobacco contains harmful chemicals like nicotine and cyanide, which deteriorate the human body over time.

Kuwait Society for Combating Smoking and Cancer, in collaboration with the National Program for Combating Smoking at the Ministry of Health, organized the two-day conference that will end on Monday. The conference sheds light on one of the most dangerous social scourges that threaten the lives of millions worldwide: tobacco

and smoking. Al-Awadhi affirmed that Kuwait has a comprehensive strategy centered on the primary axes of control, prevention and treatment; through which it has been working tirelessly to combat the deadly scourge of smoking in collaboration with civil society institutions.

He added the World Health Organization (WHO) had earlier studied the economics of the tobacco industry and its detrimental effects, particularly in developing nations where the importation or production of tobacco products results in significant economic and

Safiya cover and the 'water bottle' covers

It is said that the Egyptian politician, Sa'ad Zaghloul, was on his deathbed, looked at his wife, and said to her: "Pull the blanket tight, Safiya," or "Cover me, Safiya... it's no use." He was referring to the political situation in Egypt, which had reached the brink of collapse due to the tricks

of politicians and parties, and his inability to reach an agreement with them. T h e proverb is now said when things

reach



and there is no solution or way out, so we say: 'Cover me, Safiya... it's no use'

It is said that you can tell the quality of water in plastic or glass bottles by the color of their caps. Blue caps mean the contents are "spring water," black caps mean the water is alkaline, green caps indicate flavored or sparkling water, and white caps mean treated water. What "treated" means is unknown!

Water bottles have become a part of many people's lives, as it is important to drink water constantly to keep the body hydrated, especially in hot areas.

Regardless of how thirsty we feel, as we age, our need for water increases, and the brain's signals of thirst decrease, and we often do not notice our dehydration, and we are completely ex-

So some people see or believe that it is important to know the quality of the water that we drink in such large quantities from different sources.

The truth is that what is rumored about colors is just an illusion. Most of the major water bottling companies do not care about the above classification, the source of which is not known at all. There is no basis for saying that the black color cover is for alkaline water, the blue for fresh

water, the white for treated water, the green for fresh water, etc.

In the United States, two agencies regulate bottled water: the Food and Drug Administration and the Environmental Protection Agency. However, neither has any rules or regulations about what color-coded caps mean.

Some brands also use caps that comply with the so-called "rules," such as the black caps on Essentia Alkaline Water. But many brands don't care about the rules of the so-called coding system. Fiji Water exclusively uses a blue cap, and it comes from a spring, while Crystal Geyser also comes from a spring, but it uses white caps.

Furthermore, the so-called cap system does not take into account the caps, which have recently become popular in European countries, which have a folding feature, so that they remain attached to the end of their opening, making them difficult to detach and throw away.

These come in different colors than the standard caps, and we hope that their use will become widespread in Kuwait to help reduce plastic pollution.

Some bottled water companies also have their own color-coding systems to mark the differences in their products. San Benedetto, an Italian water company, uses a blue cap for its sparkling water and a red cap for its still water, and so on with other companies.

To maintain a clean environment, it is better not to buy water bottles, but to buy a bottle of mineral water, carry it with you in the car and office, and fill it from any clean source, instead of consuming water from plastic bottles and polluting the environ-

The bottle can be filled with filtered or purified water at home or from any clean source, outside, and it will most likely not be of lower quality than the water in plastic bottles, which are originally filled from taps... And cover me, Safiya!

KFAED said in statement on Saturday that the fund would lend Benin KD 4.5 million for a water project. The accord was signed by Benin's Minister of Economy and Finance Romuald Wadagni and KFAED's Acting Director General Walid Al-Bahr. The fund is granting Yemen KD 300,000 for renovating a hospital. Kuwait 6th in Saudi FDI: Kuwait ranked sixth in foreign direct investment (FDI) in Saudi Arabia by the end of 2023, with investments totaling 34.6 billion Saudi riyals (approximately 2.8 billion Kuwaiti dinars), reports Al-Seyassah daily.

Leading the list, the United States invested 202.3 billion riyals, followed by the UAE with 110.9 billion riyals, the United Kingdom with 69.6 billion riyals, France with 61.9 billion riyals, and Jordan at fifth with 34.6 billion riyals.

Fighting money-laundry: The Ministry of Commerce and Industry has invited participation in a series of awareness workshops organized by the National Committee for Combating Money Laundering and Financing Terrorism, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

Rent allowances see rise: A study conducted recently revealed that rent allowances have exceeded KD 1.16 billion in the last five years, reports Al-Shahed daily.

The increase in rent allowances is attributed to delays in the delivery of new houses and plots to beneficiaries by the Public Authority for Housing Welfare (PAHW). The average distribution rate of houses has decreased in the last five years from 0.58 percent to 10.67 percent, with an average of 5.3 percent.


Military's firefighting teams and firefighters from the Kuwait Fire Force managed to contain the blaze successfully before it spread fur-

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 27: Head of the Kuwait Teachers Society (KTS) Hamad Al-Houli announced a series of important recommendations from the 45th Educational Conference, which was held under the esteemed patronage of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Mishal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah.

The conference aims to reform the educational system in light of challenges such as leadership instability and the backlog of pending files that hinder educational progress.

At a press conference held at the society's headquarters, Al-Houli explained that the 45th Educational Conference took place under the esteemed patronage of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Mishal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah. This recognition reflects the pressing need to address the educational reality, which is experiencing significant developments amid leadership instability, a heavy legacy, and a large number of pending issues that obstruct educational reform.

The conference primarily focused on developing the educational system in Kuwait through a number of projects aimed at ensuring governance and improving quality of the educational system. It also shed light on several educational initiatives designed to reform the educational system and outline its future direction.

Al-Houli announced that these initiatives have resulted in a comprehensive list of recommendations, which include:

1. Issuing a decree for the Supreme Council for Education in line with New Kuwait 2035 vision, along with approving its rules and organizational structure, and appointing the National Authority for Quality and Educational Excellence, headed by the Prime Minister.

2. Expediting the completion of the functional structure project for the Ministry of Education.

3. Drafting national strategies for training, education, and scientific research, as well as general policies.

Establishing a national curric lum standards framework.

Qualification

5. Creating the National Center for Education Worker and Leader Training and Qualification.

6. Launching educational professional licenses, the teacher license project, and associated incentive pro-

7. Implementing academic accreditation for educational institutions.

8. Enhancing the quality, fairness, and independence of national exams, including university admissions tests. 9. Categorizing educational institutions and establishing a corre-

sponding reward structure. 10. Integrating individuals with disabilities into the educational sys-

11. Developing a digital education environment to improve the learning experience using cutting-edge digital and technological systems.

12. Activating community partnerships between civil society organizations and educational institutions.

Al-Houli highlighted several special recommendations (axes) from the conference that outline a roadmap for decision-makers to develop the educational process in line with the desired aspirations to improve Ku-

wait's educational reality.

First Axis - Developing educational policies:

The policies of the Supreme Education Council will cover education curricula, teacher qualifications, evaluation and assessment, student discipline, school safety and security, the use of technology, digital education, and artificial intelligence in

2. Emphasis will be placed on special education, inclusive education, and secondary education tracks, and ensuring justice and diversity in education, and language and cultural

3. Policies will provide alternatives for the learning environment, with the goal of maintaining consistency in decision-making and procedures. 4. There is a pressing need to ex-

pedite the process of securing leadership stability within the Ministry of Education and filling leadership and supervisory positions. 5. There will be focus on supporting scientific research, particularly

experimental studies, to inform educational policy development. 6. Teachers will be empowered to participate in shaping educational

policies and ensure their visions are taken into consideration. 7. Efforts will be directed towards en-

abling educational leaders to effectively exercise leadership roles and encourage innovation through the National Center for Rehabilitation of Personnel.

"WHERE is the Red Crescent Society, the humanitarian arm of the country of humanity, the State of Kuwait, in light of the tragedies that have befallen civilians, some of whom do not bear the burden of political decisions, which we may or may not agree with?" columnist and former Deputy Director-General of Kuwait News Agency (KUNA) Iqbal Al-Ahmed wrote for Al-Qabas daily.

"We are accustomed to the Red Crescent being the first international

humanitarian arm to extend a helping hand to all disasters that occur in the Arab and Islamic worlds, and even at the international level whether natural or political disasters. However, we were surprised

"I am not here to discuss the reason for this, because whoever took the decision knows the subject better, but I am talking about the timing of the dissolution of the Board of Directors of a very important association, which raised the name of Kuwait high in the world of humanity, and was ranked as one of the best among the local and international humanitarian organizations that take the initiative to provide aid and assistance.

"When the Beirut port explosion occurred, the aid bridge provided by the Kuwait Red Crescent Society to Lebanon was the fastest, strongest and largest. However, in recent events, Kuwait has been almost absent from the initiative and humanitarian aid to Lebanon, compared to the Gulf countries, such as the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, the Emirates, Qatar, and others.

"Our question here stems from our keenness to confirm Kuwait's humanitarian and pioneering role in this regard, as Kuwait's name is primarily associated with the humanitarian aspect, after all the past humanitarian evidence, most of which came from the Kuwait Red Crescent Society, in addition to charitable societies.

"I repeat once again ... I am not going to discuss the reasons and therefore whoever made the decision knows why, but as I said before, Lebanon is in its most difficult situation, as the conditions of the civilians there, regardless of their sect, religion or party, and the humanitarian cases that have affected them in the farthest corners of Lebanon, require humanitarian intervention from Kuwait, the country of humanity, and nothing else.'

"The elderly make many contributions to society through their work, volunteer work, and transferring the experiences and knowledge they have acquired in their lives to future generations. To recognize the amount of contributions they make, the International Day for Older People is celebrated globally every year, to highlight their great contributions in addition to raising awareness of the problems and challenges they face," columnist Dr Hind Al-Shoumer wrote for Al-Anba daily.

"The number of elderly people (those over the age of sixty) in the world has reached about 800 million, and the number is expected to increase to more than two billion by 2050. The elderly may suffer from some health problems, as some of them lose the ability to move or have limited movement, which makes them dependent on others to meet some of their needs.

"Some also suffer from health problems such as chronic diseases such as high blood pressure, diabetes, and heart disease, while others may suffer from mental and psychological prob-lems that require long-term medical

"For these reasons, it is impor-tant to help the elderly because they usually hesitate to ask for help from anyone. Caring for the elderly is not limited to health and medical care, but respecting them is very important. It is necessary to integrate them into the society and free them from their isolation, and reduce the severity of the

"It is necessary to ensure that they eat healthy foods that contain all the nutrients necessary for the body and are rich in vitamins and minerals, in addition to not exposing them to pressures of life and encouraging them to exercise regularly.

"The elderly are our fathers and mothers, and let us not forget that we will all be old one day, and it is more appropriate to care for them because they sacrificed their lives for their children and exhausted their energy in serving society and the country, and so they have the right to a decent and comfortable life when they reach the age of sixty and above."

"In many developed countries, a specialized Crisis and Disaster Management Authority stands as a vital force, responsible for planning and preparing to tackle emergencies, sudden crises, and major disasters that threaten the safety of citizens and residents," columnist **Dr Bahija Behbehani**, wrote for **Al-Qabas** daily.

"This body, approved by the state, is the go-to for swift, coordinated responses, backed by meticulously developed plans that are ready to be implemented at a moment's notice.

"By identifying risks and setting strategies to address them, this authority ensures that multiple sectors of the government work together, creating a safer environment for everyone.

"Kuwait, too, has faced its share of disasters. One of the most significant was the series of oil well fires that ravaged the land following the brutal Iraqi invasion in 1990.

"În those dark days, Kuwait overcame the crisis, thanks largely to international support. But there was a glaring issue: at that time, Kuwait had no trained, qualified base of professionals or volunteers skilled in handling such emergencies.

"Despite the country's success in quelling the fires, the absence of a local crisis management system was

"Fast forward to today, and despite the looming threats of regional and even global conflicts -- some of which might involve nuclear dangers -- there is still no dedicated center in Kuwait to monitor nuclear radiation.

"Crisis and disaster management infrastructures are scarce across government institutions, and there are no designated shelters in residential

"Citizens and residents remain in the dark about how to act in the face of a disaster, heightening the risk of dangerous scenarios, such as mass panic and crowding during evacuations.

"Recently, the Minister of Social Affairs, Family, and Youth Affairs took a step in the right direction by announcing the formation of the "Kuwait Society for Crisis and Disaster Management." This new society includes dozens of committee members whose tasks are clearly laid out.

"Their responsibilities range from training and qualifying volunteer cadres to assist in national response efforts, to creating a comprehensive database of volunteers who can work in coordination with government agencies during crises. The society also aims to host conferences, seminars, and workshops, while supporting programs to manage the continuity of essential services dur-

ing emergencies. "Yet, the qualifications and expertise of these volunteers remain unknown. While their enthusiasm is commendable, relying solely on this volunteer-based society may not be enough.

"Instead, Kuwait could benefit from establishing a Crisis and Disaster Management Institute within the Public Authority for Applied Education and Training (PAAET).

"This institute would prepare skilled graduates with the necessary competence and experience to enter the workforce and provide vital support across all government institutions. These professionals could become the backbone of Kuwait's response efforts in the face of any disaster."

"In a world full of uncertainties, Kuwait needs more than goodwill; it requires a solid foundation of trained experts ready to respond at a moment's notice. May God protect Kuwait and its people from all harm."

Court upholds KD 2,000 fine for woman assaulting two doctors

Court rejects father's attempt to reclaim gift to his sons

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 27: The Court of Cassation has rejected an appeal submitted by a Kuwaiti woman and upheld the ruling to impose a fine of KD 2,000 on her for assaulting and insulting an expatriate doctor and a Kuwaiti female doctor, as well as referred the civil suit to the concerned court.

The Public Prosecution had charged the citizen with assaulting two doctors - an expatriate and a Kuwaiti - at Farwaniya Hospital.

According to the complaint, the defendant was accompanying her grandmother when the expatriate doctor requested a document to proceed with treatment. She became angry and insulted him by saying, "Why are you interrupting me, you animal?". She then struck him with her phone twice on his nose and chest, causing injuries to him as well as a female Kuwaiti doctor who was present in the Intensive Care Unit.

During the session at the Criminal Court, Lawyer Elaf Al-Saleh, who was representing Kuwait Medical Association, demanded maximum penalties be imposed on the defendant based on witness statements and the medical report.

She also requested the acquittal of her client, the doctor, from any allegations.

The court granted Lawyer Al-Saleh's request, imposing a KD 2,000 fine on the defendant and acquitting the doctor. This ruling was upheld by both the Court of Appeals and the Court of Cassation

Lawyer Al-Saleh affirmed her commitment to prosecuting individuals who attack medical staff, in her role as a representative of the Kuwait Medical Association. She also demanded civil compensation from the convicted party for moral, ethical, and material damages.

Worker dies after being hit by crane: A Syrian resident succumbed to serious injuries that he sustained from a crane while working in Mutlaa.

When the Operations Room of the Ministry of Interior received information about the incident, security personnel and paramedics rushed to the location and discovered that the man had already passed away. His body was referred to the Forensic Medicine Department, and a case has been registered to investigate the circumstances surrounding his death.

Court rejects return of gift appeal: The Court of Cassa-

tion, presided over by Judge Adel Al-Essa, established a new rule that prohibits returning a property that a father (citizen) gifted to his sons who built more floors, leading to an increase in the property's value. According to the case file, the citizen appealed, in his capac-

ity as the giver, through a lawsuit he filed for the court to rule on returning the property he gifted to his sons and to restore his ownership of the property. In his lawsuit, the citizen stated that he is the father of the

beneficiaries and he gave the specified property to them. He pointed out that if he is blessed with a daughter after giving them the property, then he has the right to ask for the return of the gift, so he filed the lawsuit demanding the cancellation of the gift. The court stressed in the grounds of its ruling that Article 539 of the Civil Code states the gift cannot be revoked even if there is a change in the gift itself or a continuous expansion that leads to an increase in its value.

It was evident from the expert's report that the appellants built a second floor and a roof that increased the value of the property, so the gift became binding due to an obstacle to its revocation. Since the appealed ruling contradicted this opinion, the court rejected the appeal.

Young man assaults girl: A young man was arrested for assaulting a girl in a shopping mall in Abu Halifa in front of bystanders, and then fleeing the scene. Criminal investigation officers apprehended the suspect

within 24 hours, and a case has been filed against him. The girl was taken to the hospital for medical care and has since been released. In response to a video clip circulating on social media

showing the assault, the Ministry of Interior's Security Media Department stated that the Criminal Security Sector, through the General Department of Criminal Investigations and the Ahmadi Investigations Department, successfully located the perpetrator who had fled after committing the act.

It added, "The rumors regarding her health condition are incorrect. An assault case No. 406/2024 has been registered against the accused, who is currently in custody pending further legal action".

MoJ launches service on Sahel

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 27: Minister of Justice, Minister of Awqaf and Islamic Affairs Dr. Mohammed Al Wasmi announced the launch of the "Request a Letter of Inquiry for Ministries and Governmental Bodies" service via the "Sahel" application, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

He explained that this service allows the applicant (plaintiff) to obtain a letter to be submitted to ministries and government institutions to inquire about the defendant in order to submit it to the Sentences Enforcement Department.

The Ministry of Justice added it is continuing to intensify its efforts towards digital transformation and enhancing its participation in the process of launching services through the "Sahel" application and that its primary goal is to serve litigants.

No more ice cream carts

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 26: Kuwait Municipality, the Ministry of Interior, and the Public Authority for Food and Nutrition (PAFN) have agreed on a proposal to stop renewing licenses for ice cream tricycles that operate throughout the country, reports Al-Qabas daily.

According to informed sources, a meeting was held last week at the office of the Minister of State for Municipal Affairs Abdul Latif Al-Mishari. Attendees included the Chairman and Director General of PAFN Dr. Reem Al-Fulaij, and a representative from the Ministry of Interior.

The meeting focused on the conditions of the ice cream carts in Kuwait and it was decided to halt their licensing due to health, social, and security concerns, as well as poor storage practices in some of these carts, particularly during the summer months.

The collision was between two vehicles, and upon impact one of the vehicles had overturned. The accident resulted in injuries to four people.

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 27, (KUNA): Kuwait Municipality announced on Sunday that preparations for the Al-Qasr Al-Ahmar (Red Fort) Village project opening would continue until November 26.

In a press release, the Municipality stated that the projects development sector reviewed the project details with prospective investors in the presence of the Director General of Kuwait Municipality Saud Al-Dabbous and Deputy Director General for Projects Sector Affairs, Engineer Maysa Boushehri.

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 27: The Ministry of Electricity, Water, and Renewable Energy recently obtained conditional approval from the State Audit Bureau to contract for four auctions to sell materials that are no longer needed by the ministry, at a cost of KD 7.139 million out of a total of KD 12.2 million.

This action was taken against the backdrop of a report published by Al-Seyassah newspaper on October 15, titled "Elec-

tricity Sold Materials and Equipment."

According to informed sources, the State Audit Bureau is still reviewing the fifth auction, which involves the sale of transformers of various sizes at a cost of KD 5.061 million, some containing 13,643 tons of oil.

The bureau informed the ministry that it has no objections to contracting with companies, provided that the contracts include a clause that stipulate obtaining approval from the Environment Public Authority to sell the materials in accordance with environmental aw No. 42/2014. The materials will not be delivered until this approval is obtained.

The bureau instructed the ministry to adhere to clause 2 of article 14 of the general provisions outlined in financial circular No. 4/2017 concerning the disposal of materials that are no longer in use. Also, clause 8 of circular No. 6/2018 has set a maximum approval validity period of 90 days. The sources explained that the first auction, valued at KD 5.017 million, involves copper cables and their accessories, including aerial copper cables and various copper types weighing 4,857 tons.

The second auction involves ductile pipes of different sizes and their accessories, weighing 11,819 tons, valued at KD 840,000. The third auction is for 2,580 aerial aluminum cables, costing KD 626,940, and the fourth auction includes used oil drums, empty iron drums, jerry cans, blue plastic drums, and 250-gallon tanks, valued at KD 673,020.

Al-Ghoss Road development receives KD8.9 million boost

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 27: The Ministry of Public Works has obtained approval from the concerned authorities to issue a third change order for Al-Ghoss Road development project -- an additional allocation of KD8.9 million or 18 percent of the original contract value to extend the completion period by 818 days, reports Al-Anba daily quoting sources.

Sources told the daily that the Public Authority for Roads and Transportation (PART) is implementing the project, which is a vital part of the country's infrastructure development initiative. Sources said it is located in Ahmadi Governorate, stretching from the Seventh Ring Road to Fahaheel-Ahmadi Road, and parallel to Fahaheel and King Fahad expressways.

"The primary objective of the project is to improve traffic flow by eliminating all traffic lights along the route and constructing three overpasses, complemented by roundabouts below. The existing bus stops will be improved and a new lane will

It explained that requests to waive job titles for the purpose of transferring to another department will be accepted until November 7 for individuals with special needs and residents of the Sabah Al-Ahmad, Wafra, and Khairan residential areas. For all other employees, the submission period will be from November 17 to December 19.

The decision allows all employees wishing to transfer internally to submit a request, in accordance with the guidelines and conditions outlined in the decision, which will regulate the transfer process between the ministry's sectors and departments.

Certain categories are given priority for transfer, including individuals with special needs. The ministry recognizes the importance of this group in society and aims to provide an appropriate work environment that meets their needs, supports their capabilities, and facilitates access to nearby workplaces.

The decision also grants priority for transfers to residents of the Wafra, Khairan, and Sabah Al-Ahmad residential areas. This approach aims to support new areas with qualified job candidates, promote balanced development, and ease commuting for these employees.

All applications should be submitted to the General Registry Control at the Communications Complex headquarters in Liberation Tower, in compliance with the terms of the decision, following the completion of the necessary steps and the approval of the relevant authorities.

'Solar activity a natural phenomenon'

Kuwait Muon Observatory unveils insights on space weather impact

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 27: Amid increasing media reports about the effects of space weather on our daily lives, the Kuwait Muon Observatory team in the Physics Department of the Faculty of Science at Kuwait University says these phenomena are a natural part of the solar system.

In a press release issued by Kuwait University, the team provided a simplified scientific explanation of space weather and highlighted the role of the Kuwaiti observatory in monitoring these phenomena and predicting their effects.

Just as Earth's weather exhibits seasonal variations, space weather refers to changes occurring in the outer space surrounding Earth due to solar activity. The sun follows an approximately 11-year cycle of solar activity, reaching its peak magnetic activity during this time. At the peak, sunspots, solar flares, and solar storms become more frequent, increasing the likelihood of high-speed charged particles being emitted from the sun. When these particles reach Earth, they can disrupt the magnetosphere that protects the planet, causing temporary disturbances in the

These solar storms can impact technological systems on Earth, including satellites, communication systems, power plants, and GPS devices. While such effects are rare, they can lead to temporary disruptions. This has

Earth's magnetic field.

prompted scientists to prioritize predicting these storms and implementing necessary precautions to safeguard technology. For instance, the Kuwaiti satellite team, KuwaitSat 1, continuously monitors space weather and takes necessary measures to protect satellite systems in the event of solar storms. To enhance space weather monitor-

ing, the Kuwait Muon Observatory was established in 2006 under the Department of Physics at Kuwait University. It is part of the Global Muon Detector Network (GMDN), funded by Shinshu University in Japan, which includes similar observatories in Japan, Australia, and Brazil to cover a large

The Kuwait Muon Observatory is the largest in the Global Muon Network. It monitors muons, which are particles formed from fragments created by cosmic ray collisions with the Earth's atmosphere.

During a solar storm, the intensity of cosmic rays is affected, which in turn affects the number of muons that reach the Earth's surface. When the Kuwait Muon Observatory detects such changes, the data is analyzed within the global network, allowing for warnings about major solar storms to be issued several hours before they reach Earth. This advance notice provides governments and companies with enough time to take necessary precautions, as changes in muon levels precede the arrival of solar storms.

The Muon Observatory team understands that some media reports may exaggerate the effects of space weather, especially as the Sun is entering its peak solar activity. However, they stress that space weather is not a threat to humans; rather, it is a natural phenomenon that occurs regularly. The Sun last reached its peak activity in 2014.

The team emphasized the importance of understanding space weather as a recurring natural event, and highlighted that scientific efforts and international cooperation are vital for accurate monitoring and prediction of these

The total economic savings from the electrical connection amounted to USD 20 billion. There were 2,700 support cases, and the total length of the electricity transmission lines reached 1,050 kilometers. There are nine high-voltage transmission stations spanning 400 kilometers, while underwater electricity transmission lines measure 100 kilometers. With the commencement of the Wafra project in Kuwait, the total length of the lines now stands at 1,372 kilometers.

Looking ahead, the next phase of the interconnection aims to supply approximately five megawatts of energy to south Iraq. Future plans include extending connections to Jordan and Egypt, ultimately reach-

Meanwhile, Chairman of the Board of Directors of the society Dr. Khaled Al-Saleh talked about the serious and sincere efforts being exerted to protect societies, particularly the youths, from the tobacco industry: which has started to target them and take advantage of its influence that has grown significantly in developing nations economies.

He said the best way to mitigate the impact of tobacco consumption is to take on the tobacco industry and its promotion. He said governments spend billions of dollars on special treatments for smoking-related diseases of all kinds and origins, considering the prevalence of chronic illnesses like cancer.

He highlighted the environmental, social and economic harms caused by tobacco cultivation. "This puts us in a position to demonstrate the alarming reality of our current world, considering there are about 1.1 billion tobacco users aged 15 and over --80 percent of whom reside in low and middleincome nations. More than seven million people die each year from direct tobacco use and 1.3 million die from secondhand smoke exposure; making the smoking epidemic one of the worst public health threats the world has ever faced," he revealed.

He also cited statistics that around 10 percent of people between the ages of 13 and 15 use tobacco worldwide, including 12 million teenagers who use new products. However, these figures are inaccurate due to lack of data from more than 70 countries, he clarified.

Aside from the prevalence of smoking among women; warnings also apply to electronic cigarettes that contain nicotine and are harmful to health, much like traditional tobacco products. Electronic cigarettes are rapidly spreading among all segments of society, especially the youths, he added.

He revealed one measure that government agencies are keen on taking in order to address the smoking issue and minimize negative effects on health, environment and economy is the implementation of national programs to combat smoking. He added such programs can be expanded, while the networks of communication can be established with the appropriate authorities to encourage the creation and implementation of policies on the tobacco

In this regard, economic expert Mohamed Ramadan said in a press statement that the resumption of loan installments was long overdue, as he wondered how long the postponements could continue.

He said, "The main mistake was the failure to adequately support small and medium enterprises during the COVID-19 pandemic. The Fund attempted to assist the enterprises by postponing the due installments indefinitely, but this measure did not yield the desired benefits, as many companies closed during that

Ramadan affirmed that while the postponement may have benefited some companies that did not actually need assistance, it is unreasonable to halt installments indefinitely.

He asked, "Is there data indicating that resuming payments will jeopardize the majority of enterprises or promising ventures? I don't think so. This step is both good and necessary.'

It is worth noting that the post-ponement of installment collections from SME owners financed by the National Fund began in October 2020 for six months, ending in March 2021, due to the repercussions of the COVID-19 crisis. A second decision extended the postponement for another six months, concluding at the end of September 2022. The third postponement lasted for a year and ended in late September 2023. This was followed by a fourth postponement for about six months, and then a fifth postponement for another six months that concluded in October 2024.

The Fund's capital amounts to KD 2 billion, through which it finances approximately 80 percent of the capital for small and medium enterprises owned by Kuwaiti citi-

Justice declares self Senate winner

More than a month before the Nov. 5 election, Jim Justice declared victory in his Senate race in deeply Republican West Virginia, a chest thump at the same time the twoterm governor was in a behind-thescenes fight to keep some of his family businesses in good stand-

In a state where Donald Trump won every county in the past two presidential elections, Justice Justice crowned himself as the runaway successor to retiring Sen. Joe Manchin, whose seat had been one of the last lines of defense for Democrats trying to preserve their slim majority

"I say over and over, judge me by my deeds," Justice told reporters

That challenge could have had another meaning, serving as a reminder about the banks, creditors, federal agencies and others who have hounded Justice for years to pay his debts, including loan defaults, late payments, court fines. He's faced threats of foreclosure. Early in his administration, the governor was sued for not living in the governor's mansion in Charleston as required by law, and when he was there, his list of accomplishments wasn't particularly long or noteworthy. Musk speaks at a town hall in Pennsylvania

Arab Americans rally with Trump on peace pledge

NOVI, Michigan, Oct 27, (Agencies): Former US president Donald Trump on Saturday brought several prominent Muslim leaders onstage at a Michigan campaign rally, aiming to gain support from Arab American and Muslim voters increasingly critical of US policy on Israel and Gaza.

Addressing the crowd in Novi, a Detroit suburb near Dearborn - America's first Arab-majority city - Trump highlighted the potential influence of these communities in the upcoming election, stating, "They could turn the election one way or the other."

Earlier in the day, Trump reportedly met with Muslim leaders and was later joined onstage by community figures his campaign described as "prominent leaders of Michigan's Muslim community. Among them was Imam Belal Alzuhairi, who endorsed Trump as the "peace" candidate, saying, "We, as Muslims, stand with President Trump because he promises peace - he promises peace, not war. We are supporting Donald Trump because he promised to end war in the Middle East and Ukraine."

Trump also criticized the ongoing conflict in Gaza, suggesting Israeli leaders and military forces should "get it over with fast." He faulted the Biden administration for insufficient support of Israel, although Biden and Vice President Kamala Harris have refrained from criticizing Israel or limit-

ing arms shipments to the country.

Meanwhile, tech mogul Elon Musk, speaking at a town hall Saturday night in Pennsylvania to support Republican Donald Trump, played down the Jan 6 attack on the US Capitol and exhorted supporters to cast votes early in the presidential swing state while describing mail ballots as a "recipe for fraud."

The freewheeling session inside a ballroom at a hotel in downtown Lancaster touched on a dizzying range of topics, from space exploration and the Tesla cybertruck to immigration and the efficacy of psychiatric drugs. The town hall was part of Musk's efforts through his super PAC to help boost Trump in swing states ahead of the Nov. 5 presidential election against Democrat Kamala Harris.

Musk, whom Trump has vowed to give a role in his administration if he wins next month, spent nearly two hours taking questions from town hall participants. While most were laudatory and covered a variety of topics, one was particularly pointed: A man wanted to know what Musk would say to concerns from voters that Trump's election could lead to democracy back-

While calling it a fair question,

Musk also said that the Jan. 6 attack by Trump's supporters has been called "some sort of violent insurrection, which is simply not the case" - a response that drew applause from the crowd. More than 100 law enforcement personnel were injured in the attack, some beaten with their own weapons, when a mob of Trump supporters who believed his lies that the 2020 election was stolen from him stormed the Capitol to stop the certification of votes.

Musk also claimed that people "who say Trump is a threat to democracy are themselves a threat to democracy," a comment that was also cheered by the crowd of several hundred people packed tightly into the ballroom. Many more watched the event on X, the social media platform Musk purchased two years ago.

Trump, he said, "did actually tell people to not be violent." While Trump did tell the crowd on Jan. 6 to protest "peacefully and patriotically," he also encouraged them to "fight like hell" to stop Democrat Joe Biden from becoming the president.

Musk, the world's richest man, has committed more than \$70 million to boost Trump in the election and, at events on behalf of his super PAC, has encouraged supporters to embrace vot-

Demonstrators march across Italy call for end to war

Tens of thousands of demonstrators took to the streets in seven Italian cities on Saturday calling for an immediate cease-fire in the Middle East, Ukraine and all global conflicts. Peaceful rallies were held in Rome, Turin, Milan, Florence, Bari, Palermo and Cagliari, with the support of hundreds of associations committed to peace, disarmament and human rights.

The marches came in response to escalating violence in the Middle East and growing conflicts worldwide and denounced the diminished role of the United Nations on the global scene. In Rome, a few thousand demonstrators marched waving a giant rainbow flag in front of the Colosseum and a banner with the slogan: "Let's stop wars. The time for peace is now!"

"The war in Ukraine has been going on for years now and what was the result? Nothing. ... There are only a lot of Ukrainian and Russian people who died, many soldiers and many children," said Daniela Ferraci, a demonstrator in the Italian capital. "The same is happening in

Giulio Marcon, one of the organizers of the Rome

"War brings more war, weapons bring more weapons. We must choose the path of negotiation, ceasefire and diplomacy. This is the message from this square," he said. (AP)

Helicopter crash kills 4 in Russia

MOSCOW, Oct 27, (AP): A Mi-2 helicopter crashed in Russia's central Kirov region on Saturday, killing all four people on board, emergency officials reported.

The helicopter, operated by one pilot and carrying a doctor and two paramedics, crashed in a forest near the village of Beleenki, about 700 kilometers (435 miles) east of Moscow, according to an online statement

from Russia's Emergency Ministry. Rescuers initially only found three bodies at the site of the crash, but later located the fourth, the ministry said.

The authorities didn't immediately say what may have caused the crash. The Mi-2 is a small, Soviet-de-

KALAMAZOO, Mich., Oct 27, (AP): Michelle Obama challenged men to support Kamala Harris ' bid to be America's first female president, warning at a rally in Michigan on Saturday that women's lives would be at risk if Donald Trump returned to the White House.

The former first lady described the assault on abortion rights as the harbinger of dangerous limitations on healthcare for women. Some men may be tempted to vote for Trump because of their anger at the slow pace of progress, Obama said, but "your rage does not exist in a vacuum."

"If we don't get this election right, your wife, your daughter, your mother, we as women will become collateral damage to your rage," Obama said. "So are you as men prepared to look into the eyes of the women and children you love and tell them you supported this assault on our safety?"

The rally in Kalamazoo was Obama's first appearance on the campaign trail since she spoke at the Democratic National Convention over the summer, and her remarks were searing and passionate in their support of Harris.
"By every measure, she has demonstrated that she's ready," the former first lady said. "The real question is, as a

country, are we ready for this moment?" Obama added, "Do not buy into the lies that we do not know who Kamala is or what she stands for. This is some-

body who understands you, all of you." Although Obama has been a reluctant campaigner over the years, she showed no hesitation on Saturday as her

speech stretched from the political to the personal. Obama said she fears for the country and struggles to understand why the presidential race remains close.
"I lay awake at night wondering, 'What in the world is

going on?" she said. Her voice vibrating with emotion, Obama talked about the struggle for women to understand and care for their own bodies, whether it's their menstrual cycles or menopause. And she spoke about the dangers of childbirth, when a splitsecond decision can mean the difference between life and death for a mother and her baby.

"I am asking y'all from the core of my being to take our Obama pieaded.

Harris took the stage after Obama and promised the crowd that she would keep their interests in mind - unlike Trump, who she accused of only being interested in himself.

"There is a yearning in our country for a president who sees the people, not just looking in the mirror all the time, but sees the people, who gets you and who will fight for

After the rally, Harris went to Trak Houz Bar & Grill with Michigan Gov. Gretchen Whitmer, where they drank a bev-

"I want to have whatever she's having," Harris said. The politicians chatted and took photos with people at the bar. When they approached a table of young women, one of

them burst into tears. Before arriving in Kalamazoo, Harris visited a local doctor's office in Portage to talk with health care providers and medical students about the impact of abortion restrictions. One of them said they have patients visiting from other parts of the country where there are strict limitations on abortion, and another said she's worried that people won't want to practice in important areas of medicine because of fears about government intrusion.

"We are looking at a health care crisis in America that is affecting people of every background and gender," Harris told reporters before visiting the doctor's office.

Harris appeared with Beyoncé on Friday in Houston, and she campaigned with former President Barack Obama and Bruce Springsteen on Thursday in Atlanta.

Bulgarians vote with little hope of breaking a political deadlock


SOFIA, Bulgaria, Oct 27, (AP): Bulgarians were voting Sunday in a seventh general election in just over three years with little hope that a stable government will be formed to stop the country's further slide into political instability.

Voter fatigue and disillusionment with politicians have created an environment where radical political voices, aided by Moscow's widespread disinformation, are successfully undermining public support for the democratic process and boosting the popularity of pro-Russian and farright groups.

The never-ending election spiral has a serious impact on Bulgaria's economy and its foreign policy. The country risks losing billions of euros in EU recovery funds due to lack of reforms. Full integration into the open-border Schengen area and joining the eurozone are likely to be delayed further.

Polling stations opened at 7 am local time (0500 GMT) on Sunday. Initial exit poll results will be announced after polls close at 8 p.m. (1800 GMT) and preliminary results are expected on Monday.

According to latest opinion polls, Bulgarians' lack of confidence in elections will result in a record low voter turnout. Gallup World Poll data show only 10% of Bulgarians trust

the integrity of their elections - the lowest proportion in the EU, where the average is 62%.

Some observers have labelled the past few years as a period of "revolving-door governments," which has additionally fueled voters' apathy.

There was no clear winner in the latest vote, held in June, and the seven groups elected to the fragmented legislature were unable to put together a viable coalition. Observers suggest that Sunday's vote will produce

Woman guilty of murder: A woman accused of leaving her boyfriend to die after he was zipped into a suitcase in their home was found guilty of second-degree murder by a jury in central

Four years after Sarah Boone was arrested in the death of Jorge Torres, jurors handed down the verdict against her on Friday evening after deliberating for about 90 minutes. Boone had pleaded not guilty.

Georgia's pro-Western opp'n disputes poll result that could decide EU path

TBILISI, Georgia, Oct 27, (AP): Georgia's pro-Western opposition disputed the results of the parliamentary election after officials declared Sunday the ruling party led the crucial vote that could decide whether the country remains on the path to joining the European Union or comes under Russian sway.

The Central Election Commission said Georgian Dream won 54.8% of Saturday's vote with almost 100% of ballots counted. Following a divisive pre-election campaign, initial figures suggested turnout is the highest since the ruling party

was first elected in 2012.

Georgian electoral observers, who stationed thousands across the country to monitor the vote, reported multiple violations and said the results "do not correspond to the will of the Georgian people." Georgian Dream has become increasingly authoritarian, adopting laws similar to those used by Russia to crack down on freedom of speech. Brussels suspended Georgia's EU membership process indefinitely because of a "Russian law," passed in June.

'Public's criticisms against slush funds scandal has intensified'

Japan's ruling party LDP braces for blow in parliamentary elections

TOKYO, Oct 27, (AP): Japanese Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba's conservative ruling party braced for a blow to its comfortable majority in the lower house of parliament in Sunday's elections as a result of public rage over financial scandals and discontent over a stagnant economy

According to exit polls by the NHK public television, Ishiba's Liberal Democratic Party is certain to lose the majority in the 465-seat house, the more powerful of Japan's two-chamber parliament. It's still unclear if his ruling coalition with the junior partner Komeito can retain a majority.

The results could weaken Ishiba's grip on power and if he can't get his party's policies through parliament, he may need to find a third partner.

Ishiba took office on Oct. 1, replacing Fumio Kishida, who resigned after failing to pacify the public over widespread slush fund practices among Liberal Democratic Party lawmakers. Ishiba immediately ordered a snap election in hopes of shoring up support by using his outspoken, reformist image.

A total of 1,344 candidates, including a record 314 women, are running for office. Early results are expected within hours.

Ishiba has set a goal of retaining a majority of 233 seats for the ruling coalition between the LDP and its Buddhist-backed Komeito. NHK exit polls indicated that the LDP alone was expected to win 153 to 219 seats, down sharply from 247, a comfortable single majority it held previously. Komeito was expected to win 21 to 35 seats. Ishiba, in his final speeches Satur-

day in Tokyo, apologized over his party's mishandling of funds and pledged "to restart as an equal, fair, humble and honest party." He said only the LDP's ruling coalition can responsibly run Japan with its experience and dependable policies.

Once a popular politician known for criticism of even his own party's policies, Ishiba has also seen support for his weeks-old Cabinet plunge.

The biggest opposition party, the

Constitutional Democratic Party of Japan, is led by centrist leader Yoshihiko Noda who briefly served as prime minister during the LDP's 2009-2012 descent from power.

Noda's party is expected to make significant gains, with exit polls suggesting a huge increase to as many as

191 seats from 98. Noda says Sunday's election is a rare chance for a change of government, which will be the most effective political reform, though his party has trouble finding other opposition groups with which to cooperate.

At a downtown Tokyo polling station early Sunday, a number of voters said they considered the corruption scandal and economic measures. But analysts say Ishiba's LDP was expected to remain the top party in Japan's parliament as voters are skeptical about the opposition's ability and inexperience.

"The public's criticisms against the slush funds scandal has intensified, and it won't go away easily," said Izuru Makihara, a University of Tokyo professor of politics and public policy. "There is a growing sense of fairness and people are rejecting privileges for politicians." Makihara suggested Ishiba needs bold political reform measures to regain public trust.

Ishiba pledged to revitalize the rural economy, address Japan's falling birth rate and bolster defense. But his Cabinet has old faces, only two women and was seen as alienating members of the scandal-tainted faction led by late premier Shinzo Abe. Ishiba quickly retreated from earlier support for a dual surname option for married couples and legalizing same-sex marriage, an apparent compromise to the party's influential ultra-conservatives.

His popularity fell because of "the gap in what the public expected him to be as prime minister versus the reality of what he brought as prime minister, said Rintaro Nishimura, a political analyst at The Asia Group.

The LDP is also being tested Sunday for its ability to break from the legacy of Abe, whose policies focused on security, trade and industry but largely ignored equality and diversity, and its nearly eight-year long rule led to the corruption, experts say.

There could be regrouping attempts among opposition parties to decide whether to cooperate among themselves or join the ruling coalition, political watchers say.

China criticizes move

US approves \$2 billion in arms sales to Taiwan

TAIPEI, Taiwan, Oct 27, (Agencies): The United States has approved \$2 billion in arms sales to Taiwan, including the first-time delivery to the self-ruled island of an advanced surface-to-air missile defense system, in a move that has drawn China's criticism.

Taiwan's presidential office on Saturday thanked Washington for greenlighting the potential arms sales. Under the island's new president, Lai Ching-te, Taiwan has been stepping up defense measures as China increased its military threats against the territory it claims as its own. Beijing last week held war games encircling Taiwan for the second time since Lai took office in May.

The US is Taiwan's strongest unofficial ally and its laws bound it to provide Taiwan with the means to defend itself. "Strengthening Taiwan's selfdefense capabilities is the foundation for maintaining regional stability," Taiwan's presidential spokesperson Karen

China criticized the move, saying it

undermined its sovereignty and security interests, was harming US-China relations and threatened peace across the Taiwan Strait, which separates China from Taiwan.

"China strongly condemns and firmly opposes this and has lodged serious protests with the U.S.," read a statement by a Chinese Foreign Ministry spokesperson. "We will take resolute countermeasures and take all measures necessary to firmly defend national sovereignty, security and territorial in-

The potential sales package includes three National Advanced Surface-to-Air Missile Systems (NASAMS) and related equipment valued at up to \$1.16 billion, according to the US State Department's Bureau of Political-Military Affairs.

It also includes radar systems worth an estimated \$828 million. The NA-SAMS system has been battle-tested in Ukraine and will help to strengthen the Taiwanese army's air defense capabilities, Taiwan's Defense Ministry said. China's war games last week were aimed at practicing the "sealing off of key ports and key areas" around Taiwan, according to Chinese officials. Taiwan counted a record one-day total of 153 aircraft, 14 navy vessels and 12 Chinese government ships.

China urges the United States to immediately stop arming Taiwan and stop its dangerous moves that undermine peace and stability in the Taiwan Strait, a Chinese foreign ministry spokesperson said on Saturday.

The US arms sales to China's Taiwan region severely violate the one-China principle and the three China-US Joint Communiques, especially the August 17 Communique of 1982. The sales seriously infringe upon China's sovereignty and security interests, harm China-US relations and peace and stability across the Taiwan Strait, and send a gravely wrong message to "Taiwan independence" separatist forces, the spokesperson said.

'Third time in a week'

Indonesia drives out China ship in disputed sea

JAKARTA, Indonesia, Oct 27, (AP): Indonesian patrol ships drove a Chinese coast guard vessel away from a survey vessel in a disputed area of the South China Sea for the third time in a week, according to a statement from Indonesia's Maritime Security Agency on Saturday.

A video distributed by the agency showed the Indonesian ship following the Chinese one on Friday after-

China's coast guard said it was patrolling within its own jurisdiction.

However, Indonesia's coast guard and navy insisted that the Indonesian Continental Shelf in the area has received international recognition and that Indonesia has sovereign rights to exploit and explore natural resources in that area without being disturbed by any country.

Indonesian authorities said the Chinese ship was first detected near MV Geo Coral on Monday. An Indonesian patrol ship contacted the ship, whose crew insisted that the area was under China's jurisdiction, before Indonesian coast guard and

navy ships drove the Chinese ship away.

The second attempt happened on Wednesday morning when the Chinese ship again approached the site of the seismic survey and was driven away, according to the Maritime Security Agency.

"Indonesia's Maritime Security Agency will continue to show its commitment to maintaining security and enforcing the law in Indonesian waters and Indonesian jurisdictional areas." said the statement from the agency.

China's "nine-dash line," which it uses to roughly demarcate its claim to most of the South China Sea, overlaps with a section of Indonesia's exclusive economic zone that extends from the Natuna Islands.

Indonesia does not have a formal territorial dispute with China over the South China Sea but has become increasingly protective of its rights in the region, while Chinese ships have regularly entered the area Indonesia calls the North Natuna Sea, fueling tensions between the countries.

DPRK slams US for military drill with allies

The Foreign Ministry of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) on Saturday condemned the United States for the latest military drill conducted with its allies, along with other provocations, saying these actions exacerbated the already heightened tensions on the Korean Peninsula.

In a press statement released by the official Korean Central News Agency (KCNA), the DPRK condemned Washington for staging a large-scale joint air drill, codenamed "Freedom Flag," with South Korea and Australia, which the United States openly stated was directed at the DPRK. Stressing the drill "shows the offensive and aggressive nature more vividly in its scale, content and character," the statement called the drill "a very dangerous military provocation aimed at preemptive and surprise strike on the DPRK." UN calls for more attention to Sudan's 'forgotten' war amid fresh atrocities

CAIRO, Oct 27, (AP): A senior United Nations official on Friday called for more international attention to "the forgotten crisis" in Sudan, where more than a year and a half of war pushed the African country to the brink of

The appeal by Ted Chaiban, deputy head of the U.N. children's agency UNICEF, came as the notorious paramilitary Rapid Support Forces rampaged through villages and towns in east-central Gezira province, looting and vandalizing public and private properties, according to a doctors' union and a youth group. Dozens of people were reported killed.

Chaiban said the war, which erupted in April 2023 between the military and the RSF, created "one of the most acute crises in living memory" with more than 14 million people forced to flee their homes, making Sudan the world's largest displacement crisis.

"We've never in a generation seen these types of numbers," he told The Associated Press in an interview, referring to the displaced people, as well as the 8.5 million people who are facing emergency levels of food insecurity, and 775,000 others who are facing famine-like conditions

"The whole country has been dislocated," he said. "And yet, despite that, the country and the crisis is forgotten.'

The war came four years after a pro-democracy uprising forced the military's ouster of the country's longtime dictator Omar al-Bashir that was followed by a short-lived transition to democracy. It has killed more than 24,000 people so far, according to the Armed Conflict Location and Event

Data, a group monitoring the conflict since it started.

Chaiban spoke to the AP after he and Raouf Mazou, assistant high commissioner for operations at the U.N. refugee agency, UNHCR, visited eastern Sudan earlier this week. They met with local authorities and visited displaced people in a sprawling camp hosting over 4,000 people in the eastern province of Kassala. They called for unimpeded access to people in need across the country, and advocated for more global attention to what Chaiban described as "one of the critical

generational crises we're facing.' Global attention has been shifted to the Middle East since the militant group Hamas launched its attack on southern Israel in October last year, triggering a war that has killed about 42,000 people in Gaza. The health ministry in Hamas-run Gaza does not differentiate between militants and civilians but say more than half of the dead were women and children. Hamas' attack killed about 1,200 people in Israel, mostly civilians. Now, international efforts are focusing on the Israel-Hezbollah war in Lebanon amid mounting concerns about a regional war between Israel and Iran.

"We have done everything to respond to the war in Gaza and the war in Lebanon. ... Sudan also needs this level of attention," he said.

The Sudanese military has been pursuing a major offensive since September to retake RSF-controlled areas in and around the capital, Khartoum.

Mexico accident kills 24: Twenty-four people were killed and five others injured after a passenger bus collided with a tractortrailer early Saturday in the central Mexican state of Zacatecas, local authorities reported.

National Guard coordinator Juan Manriquez said the crash occurred when the trailer detached from the truck transporting corn, causing the bus to tip onto its right side.

Rodrigo Reyes, secretary general of the Zacatecas government, said in a video statement that the bus was traveling from Tepic in the western state of Nayarit to Ciudad Juarez in the northern state of Chihuahua. He advised travelers to avoid the highway which remained closed after the accident.

The injured are receiving treatment at the Mexican Social Security Institute, Reyes added. (Xinhua)



Gang violence in Haiti: A gang coalition on Saturday reinforced its attacks on one of the few communities in the Haitian capital not under the control of criminal groups, seeking to take it over.

After a week of clashes with the police in the Solino neighborhood in Port-au-Prince, members of the gang coalition, Viv Ansanm, attacked once again, setting fire to several homes, as the national police union warned that the area was almost under total control of the gunmen.

As morning broke on Saturday, images from social media showed the neighborhood engulfed in smoke and flames. (AP)

Uruguay votes for new president

MONTEVIDEO, Uruguay, Oct 27, (AP): Polls opened in the small South American nation of Uruguay on Sunday in an election race between moderates that defies regional trends of bitter division and democratic erosion.

Some 2.7 million registered voters in Uruguay are set to pick a new president in the race pitting an incumbent conservative coalition against a center-

left alliance. Voters will also pick 30 senators and 99 deputies and decide whether to overhaul the country's social security system in a contentious constitutional referendum that would expand the fiscal deficit in one of Latin America's

wealthiest countries. No one expects the outcome of the presidential vote to herald drastic change in this nation of 3.4 million people, long heralded as a model democracy and island of stability in the

With the main parties in broad agree ment on many issues, the campaign is being fought over voter concerns like child poverty and security. Rising homicides and robberies represent the biggest concern for Uruguayans, polls show, even though the country is one of the region's safest.

"In a way, Uruguay has been boring, but boring in this sense is very good, said Juan Cruz Díaz, a political analyst who runs the Cefeidas consultancy group in Buenos Aires. "We've seen so many dramatic changes in Argentina, Brazil, Ecuador, Colombia and suddenly we face elections in Uruguay in which there is a general consensus, there's stability.'

While in neighboring Brazil and Argentina, voters recently vented their rage at the status quo, Uruguay's electorate remains largely satisfied with the government's business-friendly policies and the economy's steady growth.

Kuwait faces financial havoc due to oil price fluctuations

Report calls for urgent financial strategies in Kuwait

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 27: A recent weekly economic report examined the severe impact of fluctuating oil prices on Kuwait's financial stability, emphasizing that sound financial planning demands consistent budget revenue stability, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

In Kuwait, where oil accounts for approximately 90 percent of government revenues, the country has little control over the volatility in oil income within a single fiscal year or over the assurance of sustainability in the near future.

The report, issued by Al-Shall, highlighted that in 2024, Kuwait's oil prices ranged between a peak of \$91.4 per barrel on April 5 and a low of \$70.9 on October 1.

This \$20.5 swing shifted the budget outlook from a potential surplus of KWD 462.3 million to a possible deficit

By October 23, the average price of Kuwaiti oil settled at \$82.3 per barrel. Kuwait also faced a reduction of

around 135,000 barrels per day due to OPEC+ production quotas, further impacting revenue.

The report noted that, aside from a brief period in April, Kuwaiti oil prices consistently fell below the \$89.8

breakeven point needed to balance the national budget. This dependency on oil revenue, along with decreased production, has positioned Kuwait as the only Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) economy expected to post negative growth of -2.7 percent for 2024.

This heavy reliance on oil revenues and Kuwait's vulnerability to price shocks, the report argued, leaves the nation in need of a "financial magician."

Without such intervention, Kuwait faces two undesirable choices: depleting its savings or falling into global debt as it did in 2017. The report further underscored that while infrastructure concerns such as roads and agriculture are significant, Kuwait's primary challenge is its lack of a sustainable vision for stability.

It suggested abandoning the slogan "Kuwait 2035" or "New Kuwait," noting that these goals have become more elusive than when they were first proposed.

Premier market leads gains with 1.79% increase

Boursa Kuwait general index climbs 1.52%

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 27, (KUNA): Boursa Kuwait concluded Sunday's trading session with its general index up by 106.19 points, a 1.52% gain, closing at 7,087.72 points. A total of 456.7 million shares were traded in 19,657 transactions, with a turnover of 92.3 million Kuwaiti dinars (about \$281.5 mil-

The Main Market Index rose 22.21 points, or 0.34%, to 6,468.38 points, with 258.19 million shares changing hands across 12,312 transactions, valued at

36.5 million dinars (about \$111.3 million).

The Premier Market Index saw a stronger increase, adding 133.60 points, or 1.79%, to close at 7,594.10 points, with 198.5 million shares traded in 7,345 transactions, totaling 55.8 million dinars (around \$170.19 million).

Similarly, the Main 50 Index rose by 37.47 points, or 0.59%, closing at 6,401.27 points, with 204.3 million shares traded in 8,879 transactions, valued at 30.6 million dinars (approximately \$93.3 million).

International Monetary Fund lowers 2025 global growth forecast to 3.2%

IMF Global Growth Forecast

The IMF lowered its 2025 global growth forecast ■ to 3.2%, a 0.1 percentage point drop from July's estimate, while keeping this year's projection at 3.2%. It warned of rising risks like conflicts and trade protectionism but commended central banks for managing inflation without triggering recessions. The US growth forecast for 2024 was raised to 2.8%, while the Euro Area's forecast dropped to 0.8%, with Germany expected to stall. Growth estimates were also reduced for China (4.8%) and Japan (0.3%), but the UK's forecast improved to 1.1%, and India's growth projection remained steady at 7%.

North America

United States Flash Manufacturing and Services

The latest data from S&P Global shows that the US manufacturing and services sectors performed better than anticipated in October. The preliminary Manufacturing PMI reached 47.8, slightly above the expected 47.5 and the previous month's 47.3. Meanwhile, the Services PMI rose to 55.3, exceeding the forecast of 55 and September's 55.2. Despite prior economic challenges due to tight monetary policy, these improved PMI readings suggest signs of recovery, closely watched by markets for potential impacts on the U.S. dollar. In the PMI system, readings above 50 indicate growth, while those below 50 signal contraction.

US Revised UoM Consumer Sentiment

The University of Michigan's US consumer sentiment index for October 2024 was revised up to 70.5, marking its highest level in six months and a third consecutive monthly increase. Improvements were seen in both economic conditions (64.9) and expectations (74.1), driven by better buying conditions for durable goods amid easing interest rates. Consumer sentiment was also influenced by the upcoming election. Yearahead inflation expectations remained steady at 2.7%, while five-year expectations edged down to 3%, aligning with earlier estimates.

Bank of Canada Overnight Rate

The Bank of Canada made a significant interest rate cut of 0.5 percentage points, bringing the policy rate to 3.75%, as it shifts focus to supporting the Canadian economy. This marks the fourth consecutive rate cut since June and the largest reduction since the 2009 financial crisis, excluding cuts during the COVID-19 pandemic. Governor Tiff Macklem explained that the central bank's priority has shifted from reducing infla-

Words From ECB President Christine Lagarde

European Central Bank (ECB) President Christine Lagarde emphasized that the status of a global reserve currency should not be "taken for granted" during an Atlantic Council event alongside the International Monetary Fund-World Bank meetings. She discussed key challenges facing Europe, including the ECB's focus on price stability, and how Europe's weaker economic competitiveness impacts its inflation battle. Lagarde reviewed the ECB's monetary policy, noting inflation in the eurozone dropped from 10.6% in October 2022 to below 2%, though she expects it to rise above 2% again soon. Unlike the US Federal Reserve, which also targets growth, the ECB's mandate is strictly focused on price stability. Lagarde highlighted the importance of trade for innovation, growth, and poverty reduction, warning that trade barriers could negatively affect both growth and inflation. She advised that the next US president consider the historical correlation between US economic leadership and periods of open trade, cautioning against restrictive trade policies.

Flash Manufacturing and Services PMIs

In October, the Flash Eurozone Composite PMI slightly improved to 49.7 from September's 49.6 but remained below expectations, indicating a minor increase in business activity. Services growth eased to 51.2, and the manufacturing downturn softened to 45.9, as companies scaled back output in response to declining demand. New orders fell for the fifth consecutive month, leading to the largest reduction in employment in nearly four years and an 11-month low in business confidence. Input costs rose at their slowest rate since November 2020, and output charge inflation eased. Weakness in Germany and France continued to drag down overall Eurozone activity.

United Kingdom

Flash Manufacturing and Services PMIs

In October 2024, the UK Services PMI declined to 51.8 from 52.4, indicating the slowest sector growth since June and missing market expectations. New business remained in expansion, boosted by strong export sales, but firms continued to reduce backlogs to maintain output and cut jobs at the fastest rate in 13 months amid economic concerns and cost-cutting pressures. Rising costs from salaries and technology also led firms to increase output charges, while business confidence softened. Meanwhile, the UK Manufacturing PMI dropped to 50.3 from 51.5, signaling a slowdown in growth as new orders, especially from international clients, fell. The upcoming Autumn Budget on October 30 and concerns over domestic economic growth added uncertainty. Although input prices rose more slowly, firms raised output charges to protect margins, with manufacturers expressing their lowest confidence in nearly two years due to rising political and economic uncertainties.

The GBP/USD currency pair closed the week at 1.2959.

Asia Pacific

China's Benchmark Lending Rates

The People's Bank of China has decided to lower its benchmark lending rates, as anticipated by markets and following reductions to other policy rates last month as part of its stimulus measures to revive the economy. The one-year loan prime rate was lowered by 25 bps, reaching 3.10% down from 3.35%, while the five-year loan prime rate was also cut to 3.60%, down from 3.85% previously. The decision comes following cuts to the bank's reserve requirement ratio by 50 bps, and the seven-day repo rate by 20 bps in September, which was considered the most aggressive stimulus since the pandemic. Recent data show that China's economic growth saw a slight improvement in the third quarter, while property investment fell by about 10% in the first nine months of 2024, and retail sales and industrial production saw a slight pickup.







strong Indian community in Kuwait has these languages as their native language. A Linguistic Experts Committee (LEC) was



'The Great Impersonator' is reflective

In illness, Halsey tells deep truths on ambitious new album

LOS ANGELES, Oct 27, (AP): "Long story short, I'm lucky to be alive," are the words Halsey chose to introduce their fifth studio album, "The Great Impersonator."

Born Ashley Frangipane, the pop singer who uses she/they pronouns shared the note on Instagram in June, later revealing she'd been privately battling both a form of lupus and a rare T-cell lymphoproliferative disorder since 2022. "The Great Impersonator," out Friday, is a chronicle of that time, made in the space of survival. And it wasn't only health crises and treatment threatening their well-being: Across the last two years, she was also dropped from her longtime label and separated from the father of their son.

In some ways, "The Great Impersonator" is an artifact of someone not sure they'll live to make another record. It's full of reflection, from the early days of her career, the whirlwind that followed and the existential wisdom that comes when cut-

ting it close to death.

It may seem ironic, then, that on this album - the one that feels like an artist trying to get to the core of their interiority - she's chosen to compose songs that directly pull from her greatest inspirations. Each song is a kind of impersonation of another performer, filtered through her own songwriting style. But that's exactly the point: Halsey has been chameleonic across their career, a forerunner in the internet's age of genre-averse alt-pop. What is truest to them may very well be an album of impressions

It's a return to both the music that made Halsey a teenage superstar all those years ago and the influences that were previously hidden from their work. In the former category, there's the interpolation of Britney Spears on "Lucky," the shoegaze-meets-nu-metal "Lonely is the Muse," where Deftones and Evanescence can be heard in equal measure, the pop-punky, Third Eye Blind-like "Ego" and the folky "The End."

Elsewhere, there's the big-hearted, reverbed Bruce Springsteen-channeling

"Letter to God (1983)," lest anyone forget Halsey is from New Jersey. Sonically, "Hometown" is Halsey's cursive-singing take on Dolly Parton; "Arsonist," a nearparody of Fiona Apple. "Panic Attack" pulls a Stevie Nicks, while the title track is her homage to Björk.

"The Great Impersonator" is also about an artist rectifying their relationship with fame and by extension, career. Halsey's blockbuster pop singles appear to be a thing of the past, a necessary sacrifice to make the most interesting work of their career. Her last album, 2021's "If I Can't Have Love, I Want Power," saw Halsey teaming up with Nine Inch Nails' Trent Reznor and Atticus Ross for an industrial concept record on motherhood and the Freudian "Madonna-whore complex." It is her most ambitious work, and what she has recently called her least commercially successful release. "The Great Impersonator" is aware of that legacy, and instead of at-

tempting to reclaim traditional markers of achievement, bucks up against them.
In the opening track, "Only Living Girl

in LA," Halsey offers both brutal honesty and crippling satire: "I don't know if I could sell out my own funeral (Ah-ah) / At least not at this point in time." Near the end, the folky opener fractures into explosive distortion - something that might be at home on an Alex G record. He is one of this album's producers, along with Michael Uzowuru, known for his work with SZA, Frank Ocean, FKA Twigs, Beyoncé and more.

But those collaborators are only a piece of "The Great Impersonator," of course, an album that feels truest to Halsey - strangely, arriving in a moment where she's made herself the least available she has ever been to the public. It's an ambitious, contemplative album - self-involved and hyper-referential - perhaps the best document yet of the person behind the moniker.

NEW YORK: Leonardo DiCaprio is endorsing Kamala Harris for president, with the Oscar-winning actor expressing support for the Democratic nominee in a video Friday. "Climate change is killing the

earth and ruining our economy, we need a bold step forward to save our economy, our planet and ourselves," DiCaprio said in the video posted to Instagram. "That's why I'm voting for Kamala Harris.

DiCaprio, long an outspoken advocate for addressing the climate crisis, has supported Democratic candidates in the past. In early 2020, he attended a fundraiser for Joe Biden at the home of former Paramount Pictures chief Sherry Lansing.

His Instagram caption cited the recent devastation from Hurricane Helene and Hurricane Milton. In the video, DiCaprio praised Harris' ambitious targets for achieving net zero emissions by 2050 and helping to build a green economy. He also noted her involvement in passing the Inflation Reduction Act. As vice president, Harris cast the tiebreaking vote on President Joe Biden's landmark climate law that was approved with only Democratic support. (AP)

SANTA FE, N.M.: A New Mexico judge has upheld her decision to dismiss an involuntary manslaughter charge against Alec Baldwin in the fatal shooting of a cinematographer on the set of a Western movie.

In a ruling Thursday, state District Court Judge Mary Marlowe Sommer stood by her July decision to dismiss an involuntary manslaughter charge against Baldwin. She said prosecutors did not raise any factual or legal arguments that would justify reversing her decision.


"Because the state's amended motion raises arguments previously made, and arguments that the state elected not to raise earlier, the court does not find the amended motion well taken," the judge wrote, adding

that the request was also untimely. A spokesperson for Baldwin's law-yers said Friday that they had no immediate reaction to the decision.

The case was thrown out halfway through trial on allegations that police and prosecutors withheld evidence from the defense in the 2021 death of cinematographer Halyna Hutchins on the set of the film "Rust."

Baldwin's trial was upended by revelations that ammunition was brought into the Santa Fe County sheriff's office in March by a man who said it could be related to Hutchins' killing. (AP)

'Healthcare risks rise'

Al tool used in hospitals fabricates transcriptions

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct 27, (AP): Tech behemoth OpenAI has touted its artificial intelligence-powered transcription tool Whisper as having near "human level robustness and accuracy."

But Whisper has a major flaw: It is prone to making up chunks of text or even entire sentences, according to interviews with more than a dozen software engineers, developers and academic researchers. Those experts said some of the invented text - known in the industry as hallucinations - can include racial commentary, violent rhetoric and even imagined medical treat-

Experts said that such fabrications are problematic because Whisper is being used in a slew of industries worldwide to translate and transcribe interviews, generate text in popular consumer technologies and create subtitles for videos.

More concerning, they said, is a rush by medical centers to utilize Whisper-based tools to transcribe patients' consultations with doctors, despite OpenAI's warnings that the tool should not be used in "high-risk domains.

The full extent of the problem is difficult to discern, but researchers and engineers said they frequently have come across Whisper's hallucinations in their work. A University of Michigan researcher conducting a study of public meetings, for example, said he found hallucinations in eight out of every 10 audio transcriptions he inspected, before he started trying to improve

Problems

A machine learning engineer said he initially discovered hallucinations in about half of the over 100 hours of Whisper transcriptions he analyzed. A third developer said he found hallucinations in nearly every one of the 26,000 transcripts he created with Whis-

The problems persist even in well-recorded, short audio samples. A recent study by computer scientists uncovered 187 hallucinations in more than 13,000 clear

audio snippets they examined. That trend would lead to tens of thousands of faulty transcriptions over millions of recordings,

researchers said. Such mistakes could have "really grave consequences," particularly in hospital settings, said Alondra Nelson, who led the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy for the Biden administration

until last year.

"Nobody wants a misdiagnosis," said Nelson, a professor at the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton, New Jersey. "There should be a higher bar."

Whisper also is used to create closed captioning for the Deaf and hard of hearing - a population at particular risk for faulty transcriptions. That's because the Deaf and hard of hearing have no way of identifying fabrications "hidden amongst all this other text," said Christian Vogler, who is deaf and directs Gallaudet University's Technology Access Program.

Hallucinations

The prevalence of such hallucinations has led experts, advocates and former OpenAI employees to call for the federal government to consider AI regulations. At minimum, they said, OpenAI needs to address the flaw

"This seems solvable if the company is willing to prioritize it," said William Saunders, a San Francisco-based research engineer who quit OpenAI in February over concerns with the company's direction. "It's problematic if you put this out there and people are overconfident about what it can do and integrate it into all these other

An OpenAI spokesperson said the company continually studies how to reduce hallucinations and appreciated the researchers findings, adding that OpenAI incorporates feedback in model updates.

While most developers assume that transcription tools misspell words or make other errors, engineers and researchers said they had never seen another AI-powered transcription tool hallucinate as much as Whisper.

The tool is integrated into some versions of OpenAI's flagship chatbot ChatGPT, and is a built-in offering in Oracle and Microsoft's cloud computing platforms, which service thousands of companies worldwide. It is also used to transcribe and translate text into multiple languages.

In the last month alone, one recent version of Whisper was downloaded over 4.2 million times from open-source AI platform HuggingFace. No evidence bird flu is spreading between people

NEW YORK, Oct 27, (AP): Health officials have said recently that there's no evidence bird flu is spreading between people after investigating a mysterious infection in Missouri.

The illness reported last month was different from the 30 other bird flu infections in people in the US so far this year. Those cases have been in farmworkers who had contact with infected dairy cows or chickens.

There was no known contact with an infected animal in the Missouri case, but health officials said that's the only remaining explanation.

"There is no evidence of person-toperson transmission," said Dr. Demetre Daskalakis of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

The H5N1 bird flu has been spreading widely in the US among wild birds, poultry, cows and a number of other animals. Its growing presence increases the chances that people will be exposed, and potentially catch it,

The most recent of the 31 confirmed human cases are two workers at a commercial egg farm in Franklin County, in southeast Washington state. The



Few details have been released about the Missouri case. The person had preexisting health problems and was hospitalized in late August. The patient was given a test for flu that was positive for influenza A, a broad virus category. Further testing found partial genetic sequences similar to bird flu viruses from US dairy cows.

Because the Missouri person did not work at a farm and had no known contact with an infected animal, health officials have been looking into the person with an undetected infection. That kind of spread would be a worrisome sign the virus might be turning into a more common threat to humans.

They did complicated blood testing of the patient, five hospital workers, and a person described as a "household contact" of the patient - looking for antibodies that would serve as proof of a past infection. The household contact got a stomach illness at the same time as the patient, but was not initially

On Thursday, CDC officials said test results were negative for the health care workers. The patient and the household contact showed signs of past infection in one round of testing, but not in others. Neither met the World Health Organization's blood testing threshold for a bird flu case. The household contact is not part of

Since they both got sick at the same time, officials believe the patient and the contact were exposed together to some unknown animal or animal product - ruling out spread of the virus from one of them to the other, Daskalakis said.

UN urges nations to fulfill climate pledges

World on pace for significantly more warming without swift climate action

NEW YORK, Oct 27, (AP): The world is on a path to get 1.8 degrees Celsius (3.2 Fahrenheit) warmer than it is now, but could trim half a degree of that projected future heating if countries do everything they promise to fight climate change, a United Nations report said Thursday.

But it still won't be near enough to curb warming's worst impacts such as nastier heat waves, wildfires, storms and droughts, the report said.

Under every scenario but the "most optimistic" with the biggest cuts in fossil fuels burning, the chance of curbing warming so it stays within the internationally agreed-upon limit "would be virtually zero," the United Nations Environment Programme's annual Emissions Gap Report said. The goal, set in the 2015 Paris Agreement, is to limit humancaused warming to 1.5 degrees Celsius (2.7 degrees Fahrenheit) since pre-industrial times. The report said that since the mid-1800s, the world has already heated up by 1.3 degrees Celsius (2.3 degrees Fahrenheit), up from previous estimates of 1.1 or 1.2 degrees because it includes the record heat last year.

Instead the world is on pace to hit 3.1 degrees Celsius (5.6 degrees Fahrenheit) since pre-industrial times. But if nations somehow do all of what they promised in targets they submitted to the United Nations that warming could be limited to 2.6 degrees Celsius (4.7 degrees Fahrenheit), the report said.

In that super-stringent cuts scenario where nations have zero net carbon emissions after mid-century, there's a 23% chance of keeping warming at or below the 1.5 degrees goal. It's far more likely that even that optimistic scenario

will keep warming to 1.9 degrees above pre-industrial times, the report said.

'The main message is that action right now and right here before 2030 is critical if we want to lower the temperature," said report main editor Anne Olhoff, an economist and chief climate advisor to the UNEP Copenhagen Climate Centre. "It is now or never really

if we want to keep 1.5 alive." Without swift and dramatic emission cuts "on a scale and pace never seen before," UNEP Director Inger Andersen said "the 1.5 degree C goal will soon be dead and (the less stringent Paris goal of) well below 2 degrees C will take its place in the intensive care unit." Olhoff said Earth's on a trajectory to slam the door on 1.5

sometime in 2029.

"Winning slowly is the same as losing when it comes to climate change,' said author Neil Grant of Climate Analytics. "And so I think we are at risk of a lost decade.'

One of the problems is that even though nations pledged climate action in their targets submitted as part of the Paris Agreement, there's a big gap between what they said they will do and what they are doing based on their existing policies, report authors said.

The world's 20 richest countries which are responsible for 77% of the carbon pollution in the air - are falling short of their stated emission-cutting goals, with only 11 meeting their individual targets, the report said.



Yin breaks away from tie to win Maybank Championship

KUALA LUMPUR, Malaysia, Oct 27, (AP): Starting her final round in a three-way tie for the lead, Yin Ruoning shot a 7-under 65 on Sunday to win the LPGA Tour's Maybank Championship in Malaysia by one stroke for her second title this month.

Yin of China finished at 23-under 265 after a safe twoputt on the final hole held off Thai player Jeeno Thitikul (66), who was also runner-up at last year's event after losing the second longest playoff in LPA Tour history.

Yin had a dominant 6-shot win at LPGA Shanghai earlier this month and also won the 2024 Dow Championship in June, where she partnered with Thitikul.

"I had such great year last year I was wondering if I can win again, what if I can't, such things," Yin said. "But I think I just really learned that I just need to enjoy myself

out here and have fun, happy, so that's what I do."
South Korea's Haeran Ryu shot a 67 and was two shots


American Bailey Tardy, who shot the round's equal best of 65, and second-round leader Maja Stark (70) of Sweden were tied for fourth at 16-under 272.

Hannah Green, who earned her third victory of 2024 and sixth of her career last week in South Korea, also carded a 65 to finish sixth at 15-under 273. She was tied with American Marina Alex (69), Hsu Wei-Ling (68) and Choi Hye-Jin (66).

Defending champion Celine Boutier of France was 11 strokes behind Yin after a 72 and was tied for 12th.

Nico Echavarria claimed the Zozo Championship for his second PGA Tour victory, shooting 3-under 67 on Sunday to win by a shot over Max Greyserman and Justin Thomas

Echavarria, a Colombian who played at the University of Arkansas, birdied two of the final three holes - includ-

ing the 18th - to add to the title he won last year at the Puerto Rico Open.

"It's incredible to win a tournament that Tiger's won," Echavarria said, setting up a joke. "This is my second

victory, so I just need 80 more victories to catch him. I'm on my way, though."

Echavarria said the win last year helped build his con-

"I don't think I would have won this week without the victory in Puerto Rico," he said. "I pulled a lot from that moment in the last round on Sunday in Puerto Rico, I

used it a lot this week to stay patient, stay calm.' Echavarria hugged his girlfriend, Claudia De Antonio. on the 18th after the victory in what he called "a very special moment."

"It's surreal," he said. "It's been a good year for me, I just haven't had that top result. I've been very consistent, I've learned a lot this year. To finish the year this way is, it's incredible, especially doing it here in Japan in such an amazing country.

Thomas, who played in the final threesome with Greyserman and Echavarria, closed with a 66. He is trying to win his first PGA title in 2 1/2 years. His last was the 2022 PGA Championship, which gave him 15 PGA titles.

"Obviously bummed and disappointed, but I played so well," Thomas said. "I played plenty well enough to win the tournament. Hit so many good putts today that just didn't go in, that's the difference.'

Greyserman, trying for his first tour win, took a oneshot lead with a 30-foot birdie on the 14th - his only birdie on the back nine. He closed with a 65 at the Narashino Country Club and has been runner-up in three of his last five PGA events.

He's a close friend of Echavarria's. But the loss, of course, hurt.

"You know, I didn't quite execute down the stretch when I needed to. I mean, Nico stepped up there and he hit a great second shot (on 18). He earned it."

Montenegrin coach Nebojsa Jovovic knows that a win is essential for Kuwait



Move over Messi and Ronaldo

New generation of soccer stars lining up to win Ballon d'Or

MANCHESTER, England, Oct 27, (AP): No Lionel Messi. No Cristiano

When the Ballon d'Or is presented at a gala ceremony in Paris on Monday, it will feel like the start of a new era in soccer. There is also a sense of void now that one of sport's most engrossing rivalries is likely over.

"It's interesting that as it starts to come to an end, we are sort of saying, what's the next equivalent rivalry going to be," soccer author Jonathan Wilson told The Associated Press. "As if that kind of rivalry was a natural state. But there's never been a rivalry like that before.

Messi and Ronaldo won soccer's most prestigious individual award a combined 13 times over a 16-year period of unprecedented dominance. Neither has been nominated this year.

Instead Real Madrid winger Vinicius Junior is the favorite to be crowned the world's best player and become the first winner born this century.

He underlined his credentials this week with a stunning Champions League hat trick against Borussia Dortmund.

"Vinicius had an incredible season where he was a key player... he proved he's the best player in the world," Madrid teammate Lucas Vazquez said.

But rather than Vinicius spearheading a new era of dominance, it seems likely the award will revert to a time

before Messi and Ronaldo when multiple winners were relatively rare.

France great Zinedine Zidane, for instance, only won it once. The same goes for Ronaldinho, Rivaldo, Luis Figo and George Best. Originally limited to European players, it was never won by Pele or Diego Maradona.

Before Messi, the last player to win back-to-back awards was Dutch striker Marco van Basten in 1988 and '89.

Messi won a record-extending

eighth Ballon d'Or last year after leading Argentina to triumph at the World Cup in 2022. Wilson, who wrote about the history of Argentinian soccer in his book "Angels With Dirty Faces," sees no obvious successor to the Barcelona

great, now at Inter Miami. "Messi's been phenomenal for 17, 18 years," he said. "It's not a pure tallying process, but in terms of greatness over a protracted period, Messi is the greatest there has ever been by quite some margin.

"I don't think there's anybody in the world now who has anything remotely close to that talent.

Such was the dominance of Messi and Ronaldo, not only would Vinicius Junior become the first winner born this century, but there has never even been a recipient born in the '90s.

Vinicius Junior, whose goals helped Madrid to a record-extending 15th European Cup last season, is part of a new generation of stars that are flourishing as Messi and Ronaldo reach the final stages of their careers.

Kylian Mbappe, Erling Haaland, Jude Bellingham and Lamine Yamal make up a field of contenders who could challenge for years to come.

Manchester City midfielder Rodri is second favorite to win this year and would become the first player born in the '90s to take the award.

Mbappe, who has long-been seen as the heir to Messi and Ronaldo as the world's best player, was born in 1998, meaning it's likely there will eventually be a winner from that decade even if Rodri misses out.

The only other winners since Ronaldo won his first Ballon d'Or in 2008 were Luka Modric in 2018 and Karim Benzema in 2022. Both were born in

The award was cancelled in 2020, when Robert Lewandowski was widely regarded the best player that year. He was also born in the '80s.

Renard back to coach Saudi Arabia

RIYADH, Saudi Arabia, Oct 27, (AP): Herve Renard was hired to coach Saudi Arabia for a second time on Saturday, two days after the departure of Roberto Mancini.

"I'm back," Renard said in a social media video posted by the Saudi Arabia Football Federation. The Frenchman most recently

coached France women to the Paris Olympics quarterfinals. He was previously in charge of Saudi Arabia from 2019-23, a ten-

"I did not intend to leave (Saudi). But when your country

knocks on your door you have to respond," Renard said. "My connection with Saudi, the fans, the players and all the memories - I can never forget. I did not finish my story with Saudi."

Renard's contract will run until the end of 2025 with an option to extend until the 2027 Asian Cup, which will be hosted in Saudi Arabia for the first time.

Mancini was hired by Saudi Arabia in August 2023 having led Italy to victory at the 2021 European Championship. But the serial trophy winner was quickly under pressure after an underwhelming Asian Cup in January and an exit in the round of 16.

In Asia's third round of World Cup qualifying that started in September, Saudi Arabia has collected just five points from four games. This month at home it lost to Japan 2-0 and drew with Bahrain 0-0.

It left Saudi third place in the six-team group. The top two qualify automatically for the 2026 World Cup while the thirdand fourth-placed finishers progress to the fourth stage.

Renard's first game back in charge is against Australia in Melbourne on Nov. 14.

Barcelona ends Real unbeaten run in style

Lewandowski shines with double, Yamal breaks record

BARCELONA, Spain, Oct 27, (AP): Robert Lewandowski scored twice and Lamine Yamal piled on to ruin Kylian Mbappé's first clasico as Barcelona routed Real Madrid 4-0.

The lopsided victory in Spain's capital ended the host's unbeaten run in La Liga at 42 games, one shy of Barcelona's record streak in 2017-18. Carlo Ancelotti's side suffered its first loss since Sept. 23 last year. And what a loss it was.

Lewandowski got the visitors going from a superb pass by Barcelona's latest youth talent Marc Casadó in the 54th minute and rose up to head in a fine header three minutes later to silence Santiago Bernabeu Stadium.

Yamal made it a rout in the 77th when the teenage phenom rifled a shot from an angle over goalkeeper Andriy Lunin. That goal made him the youngest scorer in a clasico at 17 years, 105 days, surpassing teammate Ansu Fati, who was about 250 days older in October 2020.

Raphinha then broke free with Madrid completely unhinged and chipped Lunin in the 84th.

The win came three days after Barcelona thumped Bayern Munich 4-1 in the

Champions League. It has outscored its last five opponents 21-2. "We came here to do just this," Yamal said. "We had lots of confidence and when we scored the second goal, we wanted to score a third, and then a fourth, as many goals as possible. To win 4-0 at this ground and beat Bayern 4-1, we showed that we are ready for anything."

It is an understatement that Mbappé had a frustrating first game against Barcelona in a white shirt.

The France star was caught eight times offside by Barcelona's synchronized back four and failed to beat second-choice goalkeeper Iñaki Peña one-on-one with his team down two goals.

'We knew that they played with a high line, and we just couldn't take advantage of it," Ancelotti said. "Sometimes (Mbappé) fell offside, but he had three or four chances to score and needed a better finishing touch."

Hansi Flick, meanwhile, had a night to remember in the first clasico for the German coach. Barcelona still has financial troubles that cast doubt over its future but its youthful team has made huge steps forward since Flick replaced Barcelona great Xavi Hernández in the summer.

"Today we made a fantastic match and it is all about the team. Everyone gave it 100%," said Flick, who Ancelotti called "a gentleman" for telling his bench to cool it when they effusively celebrated the fourth goal near Madrid's dugout.

After opening a six-point lead over Madrid at the top of La Liga, it is no longer a foregone conclusion that with Mbappé on board Madrid will waltz to a second straight domestic title.


Casadó was one of five homegrown players that Flick put in his starting lineup, the same 11 from the Bayern win. Six players under 22 years old started for Barcelona, led by 17-year-olds Yamal and Pau Cubarsí.

Casadó had flashes of the flawless ball control of a Sergi Busquets as he helped compensate for Madrid's extra man in the midfield before he cued up the gamechanging pass to play Lewandowski clear to slot home.

Yamal upstaged Mbappé this summer when Spain beat France en route to winning the European Championship, and he did it again. To top it off, he scored with his supposedly "not as good" right foot before flashing his new braces decorated with Barcelona's colors for the cameras.

Mbappé was ruled offside five times in the first half hour, as Barcelona pressed high. Vinícius Júnior, who featured in a fascinating duel with Cubarsí, missed a golden chance in the 21st when he shot past the post from close.

"When they scored those back-to-back goals it took the energy out of us," Ancelotti said. "This is a complicated moment for us. It hurts to lose a game and especially after going 42 games unbeaten, but we shouldn't just throw everything away because this team will play better."

Steen Olsen leads Norwegian

SOELDEN, Austria, Oct 27, (AP): Alexander Steen Olsen held on to his first-run advantage to lead a Norwegian sweep of the podium at the sea-son-opening men's World Cup giant slalom on Sunday, while Lucas Pinheiro Braathen and Marcel Hirscher made successful comebacks to the circuit.

Defending overall champion Marco Odermatt skied out in the opening run. Holding a slim lead after the first

run, Steen Olsen finished 0.64 seconds ahead of Henrik Kristoffersen and was 0.65 faster than Atle Lie McGrath.

"That is what we have been dreaming of, everybody on the podium," Steen Olsen said.

Former slalom World Cup winner Pinheiro Braathen, who returned after one year off and a switch from the Norwegian to the Brazilian federation, started 41st and finished 0.90 behind in fourth after posting the fastest secondrun time.

Austrian great Hirscher, who came out of retirement after five years to start for the Netherlands, trailed Steen Olsen by 2.16 seconds in 23rd position, after the record eight-time overall champion just qualified for the final run but then posted the third-fastest

Hirscher's comeback drew a record number of spectators to the traditional World Cup opening weekend in Austria, with 33,000 fans in total attending Sunday's event and the women's race on Saturday, which was won by Federica Brignone.

Steen Olsen celebrated his third career podium, after winning a slalom in Palisades Tahoe, California, two seasons ago and finishing runner-up in a GS in Bansko, Bulgaria, in February.

"I feel like I'm learning from my mistakes last year. I'm not scared to grab the opportunity. I know my contenders went full speed down the hill, I just did give it my everything," Steen Olsen said.

Odermatt, who dominated the GS discipline last season by winning nine of the 10 races, started the opening run strong in perfect sunny conditions on the Rettenbach glacier and posted the fastest split times at the first two check

However, he later suddenly lost control over his left ski and slid off the
