Renewal reverts to previous process

KUWAIT CITY, Nov 30: Kuwait has taken a significant step in revising its labor policies for older expatriate workers. Sheikh Fahad Yousef Saud Al-Sabah, the Acting Prime Minister, Minister of Defense, and Minister of Interior, has issued a decision to cancel Article 1 of the Public Authority for Manpower's decision No. 294/2023.

The now-cancelled provision had specifically targeted expatriate workers aged 60 and above with high school diplomas or lower, requiring them to pay an additional annual fee of 250 Kuwaiti dinars and obtain an irrevocable comprehensive health insurance policy to renew their work permits. This decision marks a notable change in the approach to managing older foreign workers in Kuwait's labor market.

GCC Summit opens amid regional, int'l turmoil

Coordination needed to confront Palestinian, Lebanon issues

Relentless Kuwaiti precursor efforts led to GCC's establishment

KUWAIT CITY, Nov 30, (KUNA): It is no secret that relentless Kuwaiti precursor efforts was one of the main reasons for the establishment of the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC).

Five years of nonstop effort by the late Amir Sheikh Jaber Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah made the dream of uniting Gulf countries under the umbrella of a regional organization a reality, which stands as a testament to Kuwaiti diplomacy.

Four decades on, the GCC still stands as a beacon of cooperation and a united front under the directives of the Gulf leaders, and the upcoming summit in Kuwait on December first will continue such legacy moving forward.

The initial idea for the GCC was born in 1976 when then Amir Sheikh Jaber visited the United Arab Emirates (UAE), meeting with its leader the late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al-Nahyan.

In December 1978, Sheikh Jaber directed then Crown Prince and Prime Minister, the late father Amir Sheikh Saad Al-Abdullah Al-Salem Al-Sabah, to visit the UAE, Bahrain, Saudi Arabi, Oman, and Qatar to review the proposal establishing the council.

After the visits, the Gulf countries called in joint statements for speeding up the process of establishing a unifying organization and in November 1980, Sheikh Jaber informed Gulf leaders on the sideline of the Jordan Arab summit about Kuwaits vision for joint Arab coop-

On February fourth, 1981, Gulf Foreign Ministers met, issuing a joint statement calling for the establishment of the GCC.

On February 24 and 25, 1981, a committee of experts met in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, to agree upon a comprehensive system for establishment as well as a draft law for the GCC

The Six Nations Gulf Foreign Ministers held a meeting Muscat, Oman, on March 9, 1981 where they agreed upon the organizational structure and signed the initial agreement for The day when all efforts to establish the GCC came on May 25, 1981 with the holding of the very first GCC Summit in Abu Dhabi, UAE, an event, which saw the approval of the statute as well as appointing the inaugural Secretary General of the organization Kuwaiti diplomat Abdullah Yaqoub Bashara.

The statute established the goals of the GCC, which were to achieve coordination, integration, and cooperation amongst the six nations organization on all possible domains and sectors.

Goals also pushed for scientific, technical, and industrial development amongst member countries in addition to coordinating efforts on matters of regional and international impor-

The final communique of the first GCC Summit reflected members' rejection of any external interference in matters of Gulf concern, affirming that the stability of the Gulf region and the Middle East were paramount for GCC members.

The summit called for a just solution to the Palestinian cause and urged for the end of the Iraqi and Iranian war.

Some 45 years on, the GCC remains as a vital organization keeping with its initial ethos, which were first planted by the State of Kuwait and the upcoming summit in Kuwait would only add to the achievements and joint cooperation of all member countries

Additionally, the phrase "In the name of Allah, the Most Gracious, the Most Merciful" is included, reflecting the deep Islamic values that unite the peoples of the council member countries.

Kuwait-hosted 7 summits up pan-Arab cooperation

KUWAIT CITY, Nov 30, (KUNA): Since the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) was established some 43 years ago, the State of Kuwait has hosted seven out of a total 44 summits mainly to promote pan-Gulf collaboration, attain integration and take concerted attitudes towards regional and

During its seven summits, Kuwait did its utmost to provide the congenial atmosphere to ensure successful gatherings and come up with outcomes that could accomplish the Gulf bloc's goals and its leaders and peoples' hopes of unity, cooperation and togetherness. Since May 25, 1981, the GCC has held 44 summits hosted

by all the six GCC member countries in the presence of their leaders or their representatives, with their findings having focused on cementing public coherence, beefing up stability and achieving development. In 1984, Kuwait played host to the first Gulf summit,

which was the council's fifth session, and one of its most significant resolutions was the adoption of a formula that regulated Gulf citizens' rights of ownership in member countries. Following the liberation of Kuwait from the brutal Iraqi

invasion of Kuwait, the second Gulf summit was held in Kuwait in 1991, having revolved around the regional developments and demands for Iraq to put UN Security Council (UNSC) resolutions in place immediately as well as ways how to ensure Gulf security and stability.

In 1997 Kuwait hosted the 18th Gulf mainly focused on the latest regional and international developments and adopted three significant pillars: protecting and developing wildlife, handling radioactive materials, managing waste and taking necessary measures for inter-Gulf hazardous waste.

Security

Regarding security, the GCC agreed to facilitate the movement of people, goods and trade exchange between

member countries and to issue machine-readable passports. In banking, the council decided to allow national banks to open branches in member countries as per specific regulations, permitting the Gulf International Bank to establish branches in Gulf countries.

In 2003, Kuwait hosted the 24th summit following the Iraq liberation war, with the GCC having voiced sympathy and solidarity with the Iraqi people and underlined the significance of linking member states together through various means of transport in a bid to better serve citizens, ensure smooth trade transport and facilitate citizens' movement by using ID cards, rather than passports.

Also during this Kuwait-hosted summit, the council adopted the Doha Document and Abu Dhabi Document regarding pan-Gulf legal and judicial cooperation.

In 2009, the 30th summit of the Gulf Cooperation Council was held in Kuwait, where GCC member countries' equal treatment in technical education was given the thumbs up, together with a defensive strategy aiming at reinforcing joint GCC forces. It was also decided to start promoting cooperation with the European Union (EU) in order to serve bilateral

The summit also called for bolstering international cooperation in counter-terrorism by mean of stepping up information exchange, preventing the use of countries' territories in preparing, planning and inciting terrorist activities and cooperating in the extradition of terrorists abroad.

The 34th GCC summit took place in Kuwait in 2013, with the leaders having decided to create a uniform GCC military command and assign the joint defense council to take everything necessary in this regard.

Rules

The council also decide to adopt uniform rules in member countries' financial markets, follow up on the proposed Gulf monetary fund and looked into the executive steps of the joint Gulf market, in addition to a decision authorizing the secondment of prosecutors and investigators between member countries.

Furthermore, the council asked the GCC Secretariat General to mull over a new fund to support Gulf young people's small and medium-sized enterprises and a standing program for Gulf youth aiming at developing their capabilities, boosting their contributions to developmental and humanitarian action, beefing up their leadership and positive values and promoting Gulf identity. Kuwait played host to the 38th Gulf summit in 2017; the

seventh gathering held in Kuwait and the first following the Gulf crisis involving Saudi Arabia, the UAE, Bahrain and Egypt on the one hand and Qatar on the other hand.

During this summit, the council denounced Iran's continued occupation of the three Emirati islands of the Greater Tunb, Lesser Tunb and Abu Musa and designated any Iranian decision or measure on the three islands as null and void, while calling on Tehran to respond to efforts to resolve the cause through face-to-face negotiations to go to the International Court of Justice (ICJ).

Finally, Kuwait is poised to host the 45th GCC summit, the eighth gathering held in Kuwait, on December 1 only out of its belief in member countries' united goals and common destiny and necessity of strengthening pan-Gulf cooperation and completing steps, programs and projects for economic, social, political, security and military integration between

Pro-peace foreign policy elevated GCC standing globally: Al-Budaiwi

KUWAIT CITY, Nov 30, (KUNA): The Gulf Cooperation Council member states enjoy a special standing on the international stage thanks to a unified foreign policy promoting global peace and security, the council chief said Friday.

Speaking to reporters and media figures who will cover the upcoming 45th GCC Summit in Kuwait Sunday, GCC Secretary General Jassem Al-Budaiwi

pointed out the international community views the GCC countries as a reliable and credible strategic partner "with no hidden agenda."

Al-Budaiwi congratulated His Highness the Amir of Kuwait Sheikh Me-

Al-Budaiwi shaal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah on the occasion of the 45th Summit of the Supreme Council of the Gulf Cooperation Council.

He underlined that the upcoming summit would be held after a full year of a diligent work in the joint committees in order to achieve integration among member states.

Since the council inception, the Gulf leaders held 44 regular summits, 17 consultative summits, four extraordinary summits, and six summits with non-

GCC countries, he said.

On GCC states' economic status, Al-Budaiwi stated that the GCC countries produce about 16 million barrels of crude oil per day and have the world's biggest crude oil and natural gas reserves.

He added that the financial value of the Gulf stock markets amounted to about USD 4 trillion by the end of 2023, noting that the economies of the GCC countries combined are ranked 12th globally. In 2022, the Gulf economy grew sev

en times more than the global economy, and the per capita share of the gross domestic product in the GCC countries is three times higher than the average per capita share globally, he said.

He noted that the GCC countries have sovereign wealth funds with assets of about USD 4.4 trillion, or about 34 percent of the total assets of the 100 largest sovereign wealth funds in the world.

As for the GCC electricity interconnection project, Al-Budaiwi said that the project aims to address power shortage at rush times, reduce carbon emissions, and reduce the costs of establishing fiber optic networks.

He thanked Kuwait's Minister of Information and Culture, Minister of State for Youth Affairs Abdulrahman Al-Mutairi. the head of the Gulf Weeks' organization team Salwa Al-Qarni, and all Kuwaiti entities which contributed to the Gulf Weeks' activities.

Historic chance to renew focus on Palestinian cause solution

"THE leaders of the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) countries will gather as honored guests in the State of Kuwait on December 1st for the 45th Gulf Cooperation Council Summit," Dr. Mohammad Hussain Al-Dallal wrote for Al-Qabas daily.

"This summit will take place under exceptionally sensitive and significant local, regional and international circumstances, impacting the Gulf, Arab,

Islamic and global arenas. In this article, we highlight several of these critical factors.

Gulf Summit occurs during a time of profound global transformation. At the Gulf level, globalization, media and electronic



openness have shaped the mindset of the Gulf peoples, both positively and negatively

"The Gulf individual has become more aware of and engaged with social, political and economic developments. These shifts in mentality require the Arab Gulf states to guide these changes in a positive direction, reinforcing Gulf, Arab and Islamic identity.

"This also presents an opportunity to harness human potential -- expertise, intellect and talent -- which, if nurtured well, can drive development and progress.

"However, it is essential that this is done within the framework of fostering participation, openness and responsible public freedoms.

"The Gulf Summit is also taking place against a backdrop of complex and highly sensitive regional circumstances that directly affect both the Gulf and Arab worlds.

"The Palestinian issue, despite the ongoing resistance of the Palestinian people in their struggle for liberation from Zionist occupation, remains unresolved and in some ways, is receding in international focus. Meanwhile, the Zionist aggression continues, marked by crimes such as genocide, displacement and starvation against the Palestinian and Lebanese peoples.

"Furthermore, leaders of the occupying Zionist entity are asserting their claims to expand into parts of Arab countries, violating international laws, human rights and regional and international peace agreements.

"It is crucial for the Gulf Arab states to consider the ongoing regional and international shifts during their upcoming summit. The occupying Zionist entity and its allies are currently facing one of their most challenging phases in the Arab region.

"On one side, they are confronted with fierce resistance in Gaza and other parts of Palestine, which has caused significant losses. The Zionist entity is increasingly condemned by much of the international community, including human rights organizations, as a perpetrator of war crimes, racism and violations of international resolutions.

"Some of its leaders face arrest warrants from the International Criminal Court, accused of war crimes against the Palestinian people. This growing global and popular support for the Palestinian resistance strengthens the case for defeating the occupation and establishing the Palestinian state.

"These new developments in the Palestinian issue, which is central to Arab concerns, present a historic opportunity for the Arab world to renew its focus on Palestine, ensuring that it remains the top priority for Gulf and Arab states.

This includes restoring the usurped rights of the Palestinian people, ending the occupation of Palestine and working toward the liberation of Al-Aqsa Mosque, one of Islam's holiest sites. Given the shifting dynamics in the region and globally, it is critical to take a firm Arab stance, compelling the occupying Zionist entity to adhere to international resolutions.

"The Zionist entity, now widely recognized as a rogue state in international law, has caused immense suffering to the Palestinian and Lebanese peoples. It is a morally, legally and politically illegitimate entity that has been embedded in the Arab world like a plague, causing devastation and destruction. Confronting and removing it is a necessity to

prevent further harm to the Arab region. "In addition to regional issues, international power dynamics are also undergoing significant change. The world is moving away from a unipolar Westerndominated system towards a more multipolar world with multiple influential political, economic and security powers.

'This underscores the need for the Gulf and Arab states to strengthen their joint efforts and avoid isolating themselves or engaging in conflict with the emerging global powers. A decline in coordination or internal division would

only harm the Gulf and Arab nations. "One of the most pressing issues at the summit will be the need for organized crisis management and preparedness within the Gulf States. While the Gulf States have made efforts in this area, they have not been sufficient to address the security challenges of the region effectively.

"The summit must focus on adopting swift and decisive actions to enhance coordination and develop strategies to manage crises and threats.

"As we welcome the leaders and officials of the Arab Gulf States to their upcoming summit in Kuwait, we pray for unity among them, for their hearts and actions to align in pursuit of good and for their leadership to play a pivotal role in supporting the Palestinian cause and ending the brutal Zionist occupation. May their efforts bring success for the betterment of the region and its peoples."

Also:

"In a state that claims to be governed by the rule of law, decisions must be based on principles of justice, fairness and accountability," columnist **Hassan** Al-Essa wrote for Al-Jarida daily.

"However, Kuwait finds itself at a critical juncture as the revocation of citizenship from dozens and potentially hundreds, of women challenges these

very ideals.
"Whether married, divorced, or widowed, these women -- many of whom are mothers of Kuwaiti citizens -- are now facing the devastating consequences of a decision that undermines their basic human rights and legal standing.

"For Kuwait to truly embody a state of law, it is not enough for the government to issue orders and implement laws without oversight. A robust judicial system must be empowered to re-

view and challenge government actions.
"Unfortunately, legislative barriers prevent the judiciary from examining nationality-related decisions, leaving these actions unchecked and fostering a climate of uncertainty.

"Laws are meant to provide stability, predictability and a sense of security for the people they govern. They must be general, abstract and applied consistently, allowing individuals to understand and anticipate the consequences of their actions. Most importantly, they should not be retroactive, particularly in criminal and punitive contexts.

"The recent actions of the Kuwaiti government fall far short of these standards. Women who acquired citizenship under Article 8 of the Nationality Law -- legally and with proper authorization at the time -- are now being stripped of their citizen-ship on the grounds that decrees were not issued to formalize their status.

"However, such decrees were not required under the law when their citizenship was granted. The Minister of Interior held the authority to confer or deny citizenship based on the law as it stood.

"The justification for this mass revocation appears to be the claim that the previous process was exploited in isolated cases.

"If true, those responsible for manipulating the system should be held accountable. Instead, the punishment has fallen on the women themselves -- a vulnerable group that bears no responsibility for the alleged misconduct of powerful individuals in the past.

"The consequences of this decision are profound. Many of these women have taken out loans, mortgaged homes and built lives around the assumption that their citizenship was secure.

"Widows and divorcees who have no other nationality or support system now face the terrifying prospect of statelessness. Where can they turn? Who will provide them with the protection and stability they once relied upon?

"If the government's aim is to correct past abuses, it should focus on the real perpetrators: those who exploited power to manipulate the law for their benefit Instead of targeting women who followed the law as it existed, authorities should hold accountable the influential figures who facilitated any irregularities.

"A Syrian expatriate was found to have forged his Kuwaiti citizenship, which was subsequently revoked. Despite the forgery. he was not deported for some unknown reason, and he was allowed to remain in the country to spread corruption. After some time, he was arrested again, this time for forging his civil ID, which had been revoked after his citizenship was withdrawn. He had forged the civil ID to continue with his transactions. Following his arrest, he was sentenced to three years in prison,'

Seyassah daily. "My brother, his citizenship was revoked from the very beginning, and it was proven to you that he is of Syrian nationality. He should have been sent back to Syria immediately, where the

There was no reason for him to remain here for forging documents and committing new crimes. Imprisoning him was not necessary, as his deportation alone would have served as a punishment he will never forget, especially

as he deserves.

he would be welcomed in Syria as a deportee from the State of Kuwait.

"This is not the only case; there are many similar cases that require a decision. Anyone whose citizenship has been revoked after it has been proven that they hold another country's citizenship should be deported to their country of origin. We don't need to create new problems to solve, as we are already struggling with existing issues, such as the problem of stateless persons and illegal residents, for which we are still seeking solutions. On top of that, we have created a new issue of our own accord, which we call the "children of Kuwaiti women.

"In most countries, a child inherits their father's nationality, but here, the child inherits the mother's nationality if she is Kuwaiti. The state is now trying to impose obligations on these children by providing them with jobs and treating them as Kuwaitis, and even attempting to naturalize them. Some of these mothers became Kuwaiti through Article 8 (i.e., they obtained citizenship after divorce from their Kuwaiti husbands and then remarried men from their home countries), and now they want to impose their children on us."

No loss of life as huge 'Shaqaya' fire tackled

KUWAIT CITY, Nov 30: Five firefighting teams from the Al-Shaqaya Jahra Crafts, Al-Istiqlal, Al-Isnad, and Hazardous Materials Centers successfully contained a fire at an electrical power generation station in the Al-Shaqaya area, on Fri-

The station, which contained highly flammable materials, was secured without the fire spreading to nearby locations, according to a press release by the Kuwait Fire Force.

The Public Relations and Media Department confirmed that the operation was carried out under the direct supervision of Major General Talal Muhammad Al-Roumi, Chief of the General Fire Force, and Brigadier General Ahmad Haif Hamoud, Deputy Chief of the Firefighting Sector.

Both leaders were present at the scene, ensuring efficient coordination and management of the firefighting efforts.

The Kuwait Institute for Scientific Research announced that firefighters extinguished a limited fire at the solar power unit of Al-Shagaya Renewable Energy Complex on Friday, says Kuwait News Agency (KUNA).

The fire was put out and no human losses were reported, KISR's Executive Director of the Marketing and Commercial Operations Sector Abdulmohsen Al-Haroun said in a press statement. Al-Haroun, however, noted that the blaze

caused limited material damage to the site. A probe into the incident would be launched to identify its causes, he confirmed.

Kuwaiti woman, child perish in car, truck crash on Abdali Road

Fire Dept shuts 258 shops violating rules

KUWAIT CITY, Nov 30: A tragic traffic accident on Abdali Road, at Kilo 40, involving a collision between a vehicle carrying a Kuwaiti family and a truck resulted in the deaths of a female Kuwaiti citizen and a child.

The security sources said, five others sustained injuries of various degrees and were taken to the Jahra Hospital in an air ambulance.

The accident site was secured by security personnel to oversee the response efforts and managing traffic in the area.

Meanwhile, the authorities are continuing their investigation into the cause of the col-

KFF shuts 258 shops: The Kuwait Fire Force (KFF) continued its inspection campaigns targeting facilities that violate safety regulations. It closed 258 shops and establishments last week for failing to meet the safety requirements and lacking a fire license.

KFF stated that these establishments had been previously warned about the violations and were given instructions to rectify them. However, their failure to comply resulted in their closure.

According to a source from KFF, such inspection campaigns to monitor safety violations will continue in all shops throughout the country.

Dawn traffic raids net scores: At the break of dawn on Thursday, the Ministry of Interior launched a major security and traffic campaign across Kuwait's main streets and expressways, involving multiple field sectors, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

The operation was designed to uphold security and public order and it yielded significant results.

In total, 1,790 traffic violations were issued during the campaign, signaling a strong enforcement of traffic laws.

Nine individuals reported absconding were apprehended and 11 others who were subject to arrest warrants. The authorities also detained 12 people for

violating residency and work laws and one individual was arrested for possessing narcotic substance. The operation also targeted illegal vehicles, leading to the seizure of three wanted

vehicles and 41 others for serious traffic of-Additionally, four individuals were referred to the juvenile investigations depart-

ment for further action. The Ministry of Interior emphasized that this comprehensive campaign is part of an ongoing strategy to ensure a safe and stable environment throughout the country, continuing its efforts to arrest violators and wanted individuals in all regions.

Meanwhile, during a recent surprise traffic campaign in the Ahmadi Governorate on Al-Wafra Road 101 traffic citations were issued, including for reckless driving, failure to follow traffic regulations and driving without a license, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

Moreover, two juveniles were referred to the Juvenile Prosecution Office. They were caught driving vehicles under the legal age. In total, 10 vehicles were impounded and taken to the Municipality garage.

Legal, legislative affairs: Kuwait Society of Lawyers held a seminar recently on the GCC efforts in the fields of legal, legislative affairs, AI and digitization, in collaboration with the GCC Secretariat General, reports KUNA.

The head of the legislative affairs at the back-up secretariat for legal and legislative affairs, justice Abdulmajid Al-Saadi, said in a statement during the session that the late Amir Sheikh Jaber Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah had played a pivotal role in establishing the GCC Secretariat General.

The Economic treaty inked by the GCC member states in 1981 is the basis for the pan-Gulf cooperation, he said.

The society secretary general, Khaled Al-Suwaifan, said in remarks to KUNA that the session addressed laws in the GCC countries and how the AI is being employed for updating them.

Significant step: Dr. Al-Fajjam

PAAET nods fire technology department

KUWAIT CITY, Nov 30: In a landmark decision aimed at advancing technical education in Kuwait, the Board of Directors of the Public Authority for Applied Education and Training (PAAET) has approved the establishment of a Fire Engineering Technology Department at the College of Technological Studies, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

This new department will offer Bachelor's and Diploma programs, developed in collaboration with the Kuwait Fire Force, which played a key role in bringing the initiative to fruition.

The announcement came during a meeting chaired by the Minister of Higher Education and Scientific Research, Dr. Nader Al-Jalal, alongside PAAET's Director General, Dr. Hassan Al-Fajjam and board members.

Dr. Al-Fajjam hailed the decision as a significant step forward in equipping students with specialized skills to meet the nation's needs in fire safety and engineering.

In addition to the new academic offer, the Board approved the promotion of 34 faculty members -- 17 promoted from assistant professor to associate professor and another 17 17 promoted from associate professor to professor.

The Board also adopted several policy updates, including:

-- Master's Degree Service Credit: Time spent earning a master's degree will now count as part of the service period, provided the qualification aligns with the faculty member's specialization.

-- Early Promotion Requests: Faculty

members may now submit promotion requests three months before completing the legal period, with final approval granted after fulfilling the required timeframe.

-- Exemptions for Research Publication: The Arabic Language and Islamic Education Departments at the College of Basic Education were exempted from the mandate to publish scientific research in foreign jour-

The establishment of the Fire Engineering Technology Department underscores PAAET's commitment to aligning its programs with national development goals.

It also reflects a broader effort to support faculty growth and flexibility, ensuring both students and educators benefit from a dynamic, forward-looking academic environment.

GCC sharing of electric power key agenda item

Al-Seyassah/Arab Times Staff KUWAIT CITY, Nov 30: On the eve of the Gulf Summit, set to be hosted by Kuwait on Sunday under the theme 'The Future is Gulf', one of the key agenda items is the Gulf electricity interconnection project.

A significant part of this project is the Al-Wafra station, which is set to open at the end of this year. This station marks the beginning of the Gulf electricity interconnection with the world, extending into southern Iraq.

Initially, the Al-Wafra station will supply Iraq with 500 megawatts of electrical capacity, with plans to increase this based on demand, ultimately reaching over 3,000 megawatts as the project expands.

The Al-Wafra station covers an area of 62,000 square meters and connects Kuwait's electricity grid to the Gulf electricity network. It does so via four overhead transmission lines spanning 256 kilometers to the Fadhili station in

Saudi Arabia, which is part of the Saudi Interconnection Authority.

This connection will eventually link the Gulf electricity grid to Iraq and from there, the network aims to extend to

Turkey and Europe in the future. The project, which is funded by the Kuwait Fund for Arab Economic Development and the Qatar Development Fund, aims to strengthen the national electricity grids of the Gulf countries and improve their reliability.

It will ensure a sustainable and consistent power supply, particularly during the summer months when electrical demand peaks.

Additionally, the project involves the construction of overhead lines and the installation of necessary electrical infrastructure, including circuit breakers, electrical reactors and control systems at various stations, including Al-Wafra, Al-Fadhili and Al-Faw.

This expansion will allow the network to support an electrical capacity of around 2,500 megawatts.

According to sources from the Public Authority for Manpower (PAM), the minister made this decision after PAM's Board of Directors submitted its approval to cancel the policy that allowed the aforementioned category of workers to renew their work permits annually, provided they paid the prescribed fees.

With this decision, the system will revert to its previous state, thereby allowing workers aged 60 and above with non-university degrees to renew their work permits or transfer them to another employer without the need to pay fees that could total up to KD 900, which had included KD 500 for an annual health insurance policy, KD 250 for the work permit, and other associated costs.

The decision has also abolished the requirement for workers in this category to hold a university degree in order to transfer or renew their work permits.

Meanwhile, the minister's decision also amended Article 14 of ministerial decision No. 9/2016, which pertains to regulations for workers in small and medium enterprises (SME).

The amendment states, "A worker hired in a small or medium enterprise can be transferred to another company within the same SME sector with the employer's approval, after one year from the issuance of the work permit. However, the transfer of such workers within the same sector and to the same employer's file is allowed without the need to abide by the time requirement, provided they pay the prescribed fee of KD 300 for transferring the worker before the one-year period has passed."

Furthermore, the decision cancelled the second clause of Article 1 of ministerial decision No. 57/A/2016, thereby allowing workers hired in the government contract sector and registered under the main employer's file to transfer to work outside that sector.

It also permits the transfer of workers from the "distinguished lists" sector to work outside that sector.

The sources affirmed that this decision will be effective from the date of its publication in the official gazette.

Meanwhile, the Ministry of Interior has announced that several key roads will be closed starting Sunday, in preparation for the Gulf Summit Conference. The closures include:

■ King Faisal Bin Abdulaziz Road: Closed from the airport roundabout towards Kuwait City, with vehicles diverted to Al-Ghazali Road and Road 6.5. The opposite direction from Kuwait City towards the airport will also be closed, diverting vehicles to the Sixth Ring Road towards Jahra.

■ Sixth Ring Road: Closed from Jahra towards Al-Masilah, with traffic rerouted to King Faisal bin Abdulaziz Road towards Kuwait City. Vehicles coming from Al-Masilah towards Jahra will also be diverted to King Faisal bin Abdulaziz Road

■ King Fahd Bin Abdulaziz Road: Closed from Ahmadi, with vehicles redirected to the Sixth Ring Road towards Al-Masilah. Traffic coming from Madinah will be diverted to the Fifth Ring Road, which will also be closed beyond that point. Vehicles from Kuwait City towards Ahmadi will be redirected to Jahra and Salmiya.

■ Subhan Road: completely closed

in both directions.

These closures are part of security and traffic measures to accommodate the Gulf Summit Conference. Drivers are advised to plan alternative routes.

Kuwait's hosting the 45th GCC Summit due on Sunday reflects its firm commitment to supporting the council's shared path and boosting the Gulf unity, Kuwait's Ambassador to Saudi Arabia Sheikh Sabah Nasser Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah said on Saturday

Speaking to KUNA in a statement, Sheikh Sabah Nasser said the Summit comes at an accurate time, which requires further coordination and cooperation among member states to face regional and international challenges.

He stressed the need of exerting efforts to enhance security and stability, and meet aspirations of Gulf nations toward further progress and prosperity.

The Kuwaiti ambassador expressed confidence that the Summit would have key decisions to foster Gulf integration in different fields.

The Ministry of Information has placed all available resources at the disposal of ensuring success of the summit. Special committee are coordinating with the GCC Secretariat General, he said, noting that the ministry supplied the participating journalists with statistics and information to back up their

feeds from the venue of the summit. An exhibition held at the media center displays the GCC countries' achievements at various levels, he added.

The minister of information inaugurated, on Friday, the center that had been prepared to accommodate 80 media personnel. State-of-art technologies have been installed at the center halls.

The Ministry of Health (MoH) has also fulfilled its preparations and drawn up a plan for the 45th GCC Summit due in Kuwait on Sunday, tomorrow, the ministry's spokesman Dr. Abdullah Al-Sanad said on Saturday.

Medical efforts are ongoing in full spirit as part of an integrated system and strategy, under the follow-up and supervision of Minister of Health Dr. Ahmad Al-Awadhi and MoH Undersecretary Dr. Abdulrahman Al-Mutairi, Dr. Al-Sanad added in a press release.

Hospitals will have shifts as of Sunday, fomorrow, to ensure continued medical services, in line with required quality, he said, noting that all health-care centers across the governorates will work round the clock.

The ratings agency noted a growing trend toward mergers, with Gulf Bank (the fifth-largest bank in Kuwait) exploring a potential merger with Boubyan Bank (the third-largest), which could create an Islamic banking entity with a 15 percent market share.

Islamic banking currently represents 49 percent of Kuwait's total banking sector assets by the end of H1 2024.

Fitch highlighted that Islamic banks enjoy significant advantages in the retail sector, benefiting from higher net financing margins compared to traditional banks.

However, the average non-performing financing ratio for Islamic banks rose slightly to 2 percent in H1 2024, reflecting pressure from rising interest rates and slower financing growth.

Despite concerns about high concentration and exposure to real estate, which poses a risk to asset quality, Fitch expects stability in the asset quality of Islamic banks during 2024-2025.

The capital remains sufficient, supported by modest growth and strong profitability in the near term. While Fitch predicts a slight decline in profitability for 2025 due to expected interest rate cuts, Islamic banks maintain strong financing levels, with financing representing 80 percent of customer deposits.

The factory, run by Asian men and women, was a fully equipped center for producing and manufacturing local booze in huge quantities.

During the operation, approximately 2,030 barrels containing raw materials used in alcohol production were seized, along with 10,000 one-liter plastic bottles filled with booze ready

The CID men said a swimming pool was used as a storage facility for the alcohol after the distillation process.

The suspect and the seized items have been handed over to the relevant authorities for further legal action.

North Korean leader Kim vows steadfast support for Russia's war in Ukraine

SEOUL, South Korea, Nov 30, (AP): North Korean leader Kim Jong Un vowed his country will "invariably support" Russia's war in Ukraine as he met Russia's defense chief, the North's state media reported Saturday.

A Russia military delegation led by Defense Minister Andrei Belousov arrived in North Korea on Friday, amid growing international concern about the two countries' expanding cooperation after North Korea sent thousands of troops to Russia last month.

The official Korean Central News Agency said that Kim and Belousov reached "a satisfactory consensus" on boosting strategic partnership and defending each country's sovereignty, security interests and international justice in the face of the rapidly-changing international security environments in a Friday meeting.

Kim said that North Korea "will invariably support the policy of the Russian Federation to defend its sovereignty and territorial integrity from the imperialists' moves for hegemony,' KCNA said

North Korea has supported Russia's

invasion of Ukraine, calling it a defensive response to what both Moscow and Pyongyang call NATO's "reckless" eastward advance and U.S.-led moves to stamp out Russia's position as a powerful state.

Kim slammed a U.S. decision earlier in November to let Ukraine strike targets inside Russia with U.S.-supplied longer-range missiles as a direct intervention in the conflict. He called recent Russian strikes on Ukraine "a timely and effective measure" demonstrate Russia's resolve, KCNA said.

According to U.S., Ukrainian and South Korean assessments, North Korea has sent more than 10,000 troops to Russia and some of them have already begun engaging in combat on the frontlines. U.S., South Korean and others say North Korea has also shipped artillery systems, missiles and other conventional weapons to replenish Russia's exhausted weapons inventory.

Both North Korea and Russia haven't formally confirmed the North Korean troops' movements, and have steadfastly denied reports of weapons shipments. South Korea, the U.S. and their partners are concerned that Russia could give North Korea advanced weapons technology in return, including help to build more powerful nuclear missiles.

Last week, South Korean national security adviser Shin Wonsik told a local SBS TV program that that Seoul assessed that Russia has provided air defense missile systems to North Korea. He said Russia also appeared to have given economic assistance to North Korea and various military technologies, including those needed for the North's efforts to build a reliable space-based surveillance system.

Belousov also met North Korean Defense Minister No Kwang Chol on Friday. During a dinner banquet later the same day, Belousov said the the two countries' strategic partnership was crucial to defend their sovereignty from aggression and the arbitrary actions of imperialists, KCNA said.

In June, Kim and Putin signed a treaty requiring both countries to provide immediate military assistance if either is attacked. It's considered the two countries' biggest defense deal since

Philippine president says impeaching VP Duterte, his rival, would be waste of time

MANILA, Philippines, Nov 30, (AP): Philippine President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. said Friday that filing impeachment complaints against the vice president, who is facing a legal storm after publicly threatening to have him killed, would be a waste of time for Congress.

It was unclear whether Marcos' remark would stop plans by several groups to file impeachment complaints against Duterte over a number of criminal allegations, including her alleged misuse of confidential government funds and her recent public threat to have the president, his wife and the speaker of the House of Representatives killed if she herself were killed in a plot she has not detailed.

The legal troubles facing the vice president and her father, former President Rodrigo Duterte, are unfolding in the backdrop of their worsening feud with Marcos. It's the latest battle between the country's most powerful families in a long-unwieldy democracy that has been dominated for decades by political dynasties.

But Marcos played down the political showdown

"It's a storm in a teacup," he told

"This is not important. This will not make any difference to even one single Filipino life, so, why waste time on it?" he said of an impeachment. Impeachment complaints are being prepared for

filing before the House, which is led by Marcos' cousin and political ally, Martin Romualdez.

Duterte regards Romualdez as a bitter opponent. Both are seen as potential presidential candidates in 2028.

Duterte has ruled out a political reconciliation with Marcos. They were running mates in 2022 and won by landslides in a campaign of national unity but later had a falling out on several issues, including over their support for China or the Unites States.

Marcos has strengthened a defense alliance with the U.S. as the Philippines faces an increasingly aggressive China in the disputed South China Sea.

The vice president has refused to condemn China's assertive actions and her father nurtured close ties as president with his Chinese counterpart, Xi Jinping, and Russian leader Vladimir Putin while criticizing U.S. and Western security policies.

6 Democratic lawmakers from Connecticut report bomb threats against their homes

WEST PALM BEACH, Fla., Nov 30 (AP): Six Democratic members of Congress from Connecticut were targeted by bomb threats on their homes, the lawmakers or their offices said.

Sen Chris Murphy and all five House members - Reps. Jim Himes, Joe Courtney, John Larson, Jahana Hayes and Rosa DeLauro - reported being the subject of such threats. Police who responded said they found no evidence of explosives on the lawmakers' proper-

Democratic Sen. Richard Blumenthal told reporters Friday he did not receive a bomb threat on Thursday but was targeted as recently as a couple weeks ago, adding of such threats, "Unfortunately, very regrettably, they are part of our life."

The bomb threats against Democrats happened a day after a number of President-elect Donald Trump 's most prominent Cabinet picks and appointees reported that they had received such threats, as well as "swatting attacks," in which perpetrators initiate an emergency law enforcement response

against a victim under false pretenses. Murphy's office said his Hartford home was the target of a bomb threat, "which appears to be part of a coordinated effort involving multiple members of Congress and public figures.' Hartford Police and US Capitol Police determined there was no threat.

DeLauro said in a Thursday evening post on X that the New Haven Police Department's bomb squad responded to the threat and "determined no bomb was present at our home. I am thankful for their swift response & relieved no one was harmed.'

Hayes said the Wolcott Police Department informed her Thursday morning that it had received "a threatening email stating a pipe bomb had been

placed in the mailbox at my home." State police, US Capitol Police, and the House sergeant at arms were notified, Wolcott and state police responded "and no bomb or explosive materials were discovered.'

Courtney's Vernon home received a bomb threat while his wife and children were there, his office said.

Himes said he was told of the threat against his home during a Thanksgiving celebration with his family. The U.S. Capitol Police, and Greenwich and Stamford police departments responded.

Hines extended his family's "utmost gratitude to our local law enforcement officers for their immediate action to ensure our safety." Echoing other lawmakers who were threatened, he added: There is no place for political violence in this country, and I hope that we may all continue through the holiday season with peace and civility.

Larson also said Thursday that East Hartford Police responded to a bomb threat against his home.

The FBI declined to give details on the latest episodes except to say it is investigating them in partnership with other agencies

The threats follow an election season marked by violence. In July, a gunman opened fire at a Trump rally in Butler, Pennsylvania, grazing him in the ear and killing one of his supporters.

Wisconsin election chair certifies Trump's victory in back-to-routine teleconference

Wisconsin's election commission leader quietly certified Donald Trump 's victory on Friday, moving past the chaos that surrounded the 2020 election results in the battleground state.

Commission Chair Ann Jacobs certified results that show Trump won the state with 1,697,626 votes compared to Democrat Kamala Harris' 1,668,229 votes during a morning Zoom teleconference that lasted six minutes.

The certification felt almost anticlimactic compared with the aftermath of the 2020 election, when Trump refused to accept that Joe Biden had won the state by about 21,000 votes.

Trump forced a recount in Dane and Milwaukee counties, the state's two Democratic strongholds, but it didn't change the outcome. Trump later sued to disqualify more than 221,000 ballots in the two counties. He wanted to disqualify absentee ballots cast early and in-person, saying there wasn't a proper writ-

MADISON, Wis., Nov 30, (AP): ten request made for the ballots; duct during the investigation. The absentee ballots cast by people who claimed "indefinitely confined" status; absentee ballots collected by poll workers at Madison parks; and absentee ballots where clerks filled in missing information on ballot envelopes.

The state Supreme Court dismissed the case in December 2020, finding four of Trump's claims were filed too late and the other was without merit. A federal judge that same month dismissed another lawsuit filed by two Republican legislators, voting rights groups and others seeking to overturn the results.

Facing pressure from Trump, Wisconsin Assembly Speaker Robin Vos hired former state Supreme Court Justice Michael Gableman in the spring of 2021 to investigate allegations of fraud and abuse related to the election.

The probe ultimately turned up nothing. The state Office of Lawver Regulation filed a complaint against Gableman last week accusing him of violating multiple rules of constate Supreme Court will decide vnat sanctions, if any, Gabieman will face.

The election commission's nonpartisan administrator, Meagan Wolfe, found herself the target of conspiracy theorists and election skeptics who falsely claimed she was part of a plot to rig the 2020 election for Biden. Republican legislators are trying to fire her but the commission has filed a lawsuit to keep in her post. That case is currently before the state Supreme

Trump's national victory in November has calmed conservative anger but a vocal faction of the GOP remains deeply skeptical of election processes, particularly the use of mail ballots and scanners to tally votes. Still, several states that saw tumultuous certifications during the 2020 election and 2022 midterms have smoothly approved their results in recent weeks, including Arizona, Michigan, Nevada and New

More than 100 arrested in Georgia

More than 100 demonstrators were arrested overnight in Georgia as protesters clashed with police following the government's decision to suspend negotiations to join the European Union, the country's Interior Ministry said Saturday.

fortifications on border with Russia DABROWKA, Poland, Nov 30, (AP): Poland's Prime Minister Donald Tusk traveled Saturday

to his country's border with the Russian region of Kaliningrad to inspect progress in the construction of military fortifications along the eastern frontier, calling it "an investment in Tusk's visit comes a month before Poland is to

take over the rotating presidency of the 27-member European Union. Polish officials say their priority is to urge Europeans to beef up defenses at a time of Russian aggression and with change coming soon in Washington. Some European leaders are concerned that the incoming administration of Donald Trump might be less committed to Europe's defense.

Poland's government and army began building the system dubbed East Shield this year. It will eventually include approximately 800 kilometers (500 miles) along the Polish borders with Russia and Belarus, at a time when Western officials accuse Russia of waging hybrid attacks against the West that include sabotage, the weaponization of migration, disinformation and other hostile measures.

"The better the Polish border is guarded, the more difficult it is to access for those with bad intentions," Tusk said at a news conference near the village of Dabrowka as he stood in front of concrete anti-tank barriers.

come a leading European voice for security at a

time when France and Germany are weakened by internal political problems. Poland aims to spend 4.7% of its gross domestic product on defense next year, making it one of NATO's leaders in defense spending.

Tusk said he expected the East Shield to eventually be expanded to protect the small Baltic states of Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania.

"Everything we are doing here - and we will also be doing this on the border with Belarus and Ukraine - is to deter and discourage a potential aggressor, which is why it is truly an investment in peace," Tusk said. "We will spend billions of zlotys on this, but right now the whole of Europe is observing these investments and our actions with great satisfaction and will support them if

He said he wants Poles "to feel safer along the entire length of the eastern border." Tusk also said the fortifications would include Poland's border with Ukraine, a close ally, but did not elaborate.

Along the frontier, anti-tank barriers known as "hedgehogs" will be integrated with natural barriers like ditches. Tusk said parts of the project are not visible to the naked eye, but it is nonetheless the largest project of its nature in Europe

since the end of World War II. The plans also include the construction of appropriate threat reconnaissance and detection systems, forward bases, logistics hubs, warehouses and the deployment of anti-drone systems, the state news agency PAP reported.

Kuwait oil price up to USD 72.76 pb

to USD 72.94 pb, and the West Texas Intermediate dropped by 72 cents to USD 68 pb.

Meanwhile, Kuwait's crude oil exports to Japan in October fell 46.4 percent from a year earlier to 2.04 million barrels, or 66,000 barrels per day (bpd), down for the 13th consecutive month, government data showed Friday.

Economic climate improves though geopolitical factors weigh on outlook



KUWAIT CITY, Nov 30: Nine months on from the sharp currency devaluation in March, Egypt's macrofiscal situation has substantially stabilized. Foreign inflows and financing catalyzed by the Ras El-Hekma deal with the UAE have transformed the economic climate, restoring fiscal and external buffers and setting off a fiscal reform process, centered initially on hikes to energy prices, that shows promise in terms of bringing the country's public finances under control. Inflation, meanwhile, has trended lower as the central bank (CBE) has maintained interest rates at elevated levels, with policy rate cuts expected before long. Finally, the pound has been fairly valued with the virtual elimination of the parallel market so far. There are also signs from the credit and PMI numbers that economic growth is finally accelerating.

Risk factors stem largely from the external front, with ongoing regional conflict and tensions spilling over into Egypt on various fronts including via the impact on Red Sea shipping trade. Egypt's Suez Canal receipts slumped 50% y/y to \$6 billion in H1 2024, imports of natural gas from Israel are being pressured, while inflows of refugees from Sudan, Libya, Palestine and elsewhere are estimated at around 10 million. To contain the repercussions, the authorities haveasked the IMF for some leeway on the pace of reform implementation

Economic growth to accelerate to 3.5-4.0% in FY24/25

GDP growth in the final quarter of the fiscal year (Apr-Jun FY23/24) ticked up to 2.4%y/y from 2.2% in O3. (Chart 1.) This is amid improved FCY liquidity ensuing from the devaluation in March.



OPEC Plus meetings moved


Brian Lan from Gold Silver Central in Singapore noted that investors are turning to gold, hoping for potential price increases amid these tensions and the slight decline in the dollar has further supported gold prices.

■ Macro-financial indicators have stabilized since the currency devaluation in March amid large foreign investment flows and the introduction of critical reforms including a more flexible exchange rate regime, subsidy cuts and moves to privatize some state assets.

- Improving high-frequency indicators augur well for economic growth prospects, to be helped by falling inflation and interest rates. GDP grew by only 2.4% in Q4 FY23/24but could improve to 4%
- The government may negotiate a revision to some key points in the IMF program updated earlier this year, possibly including extending the period for key subsidy cuts. A first sovereign credit rating upgrade by Fitch since 2019 capped the economic and fiscal progress the authorities have made
- The most significant downside risk to the outlook is the unstable regional geopolitical environment, with Egypt dependent on valuable Suez Canal receipts,gas importsand pressured by refugee


In the months that followed the initial devaluation, the pound stabilized around EGP48/49/\$1, which helped lower inflation and facilitate the recovery in household purchasing power that has lifted consumer spending and credit activity. We expect growth to accelerate from Q2FY24/25onwards. The PMI gauge of private sector activity rose to 50.4 in August from an average of 48.9in Q4, surpassing the 50-neutral benchmark for the first in about four years (although it has edged back down since). This was mainly driven by a recovery in local order books, boosted by cooling inflation. Business optimism is on the rise as well, with firms looking ahead to interest rate cuts that would boost the outlook. With this in mind, we think growth could accelerate in the current year (FY24/25) to4.0% from 2.4% in FY24 – albeit still below what we believe is Egypt's long-term potential rate.

Current account deficit balloons in FY23/24



The current account deficit more than quadrupled inFY23/24 to \$20.8billion from \$4.7billionin FY22/23 as Egypt's energy exports plummeted by almost 60% due to gas production declines, especially at the giant offshore Zohr field, and as Suez Canal receipts fell by 24% (\$2.1bn) amid ongoing troubles in the Red Sea. Tourism revenues, however, surprised on the upside, growing by a strong 5% y/y despite elevated regional tensions.

A closerlook at the impact of the EGP devaluation on the current account in Q4 FY23/24 shows the effect was most pronounced in (1) remittances, where volumes rose by 50% y/y as more Egyptians living abroad transferred money back through official channels, and (2) in non-petroleum exports, which rose 17%. These gains resulted in a sharp narrowing of the current account deficit to \$3.7billion from \$7.4billion in Q3 FY23/24.(Chart 2.)



That said, the improvement was likely an immediate response to the devaluation and not likely to be repeated in the immediate future. We therefore expect the deficit to remain large at \$15-20billion in FY24/25, mainly on the back of an inflated energy import bill. Moreover, as interest rates drop and consumption picks up, imports will likely increase, by a minimum of 10-15%. Critical to preventing the deficit from spiraling out of control is the maintenance of a more flexible

No further rises in foreign reserves expected – or needed

In our last quarterly report, we hinted that further improvement in foreign reserves and banks' net foreign assets will be limited as repeating investments of the magnitude of the giant \$35billion Ras El Hekma deal and the large post-devaluation portfolio inflows would be unrealistic. The latest data confirm this to an extent, with CBE FX reserve levels in Octoberat \$46.9 billion unchanged since June (\$46.4billion). In addition to commercial banks' NFAs declining by \$2.96billion (-118% m/m) in September, the first decrease in eight months (with a small recovery in October), which reflects the large energy import bill.(Chart 3.)

While we maintain our view that there is no need to raise foreign reserves and NFAs to higher levels, we reiterate that a sustained government commitment to a flexible exchange rate is imperative to prevent these external buffers from eroding and to allow Egypt to negotiate a path through the current and future geopolitical landscape -especially given what we forecast will be a high net cumulative financing gap of \$10billion to FY25/26. These external buffers, in tandem with progress on reforms made so far including fuel and utility price hikes, have managed to limit the impact of recent external shocks on key risk indicators. Yields on Egypt's 5-yrEurobondsremain at 8.6%, unchanged since July, and 5-yr CDS levels (a measure of default risk) were also mostly unchanged at 578 bps from 570bps in mid-July. We believe this is much lower than would have been the case had reforms and investor optimism in Egypt's economic prospects not been forthcoming.Indeed, as a vote of confidence, Fitch in November upgraded Egypt's credit rating to 'B' (outlook stable) from 'B-', and other agencies could follow with upgrades of their own reflecting the move towards a more flexible exchange rate, the significant improvement witnessed in the NFA position and the strong external support the sovereign has received this year.

Commerce grows 14.8%, reaching £5.9 billion

KUWAIT CITY, Nov 30: "Over the past year, the UK-Kuwait trade reached £5.9 billion, a 14.8 percent increase from the previous 12 months, said Alastair King, Lord Mayor of the City of London

The Lord Mayor also highlighted the robust relationship between the UK and the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC), citing the growing trade volume between the UK and Kuwait during a press interaction at the British Embassy premises in Kuwait.

He underscored the historic and contemporary strength of investment ties, symbolized by the Kuwait Investment Office's 71-year presence in the City of London and the Sovereign Investment Partnership signed during His Highness the Amir's state visit to the UK last August.

Addressing the impact of the UK's exit from the European Union and the recent change in government, Lord Mayor assured journalists of London's continued dominance as a global financial hub.

He pointed out that the city's financial and professional services sector has grown significantly, with over 100,000 more employees compared to pre-Brexit levels.

To emphasize London's scale, he noted that the number of people working in the sector exceeds the entire population of Frankfurt, Germany.

The Lord Mayor extended a warm invitation to Kuwaiti investors, emphasizing the UK's openness to business while at the same time highlighting the UK's strong political and fiscal stability, robust legal framework and London's highly international workforce, with approximately 40 percent of workers in its financial services sector coming from abroad. Furthermore, he expressed his aim to promote Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) into the UK while encouraging more British businesses to leverage opportunities in Kuwait, where over 100 UK firms are already operational.

OPEC+ delays talks, compliance at risk

COMPLIANCES - this is the key word for the oil organization, as they adjourn their meetings until December 5 due to the meeting to be held among the

GCC heads of state in Kuwait on December 1. The postponement may give OPEC+ some space and time to prepare for their meeting. However, some of its members, such as Kazakhstan and Iraq, are yet to clarify their commitment to the production

Despite recent visits by OPEC+ ministers, oil prices remain around \$72-\$73 per barrel, and production stands at 28.6 million barrels per day. However, demand remains weak, and production from non-OPEC countries continues to grow, raising concerns among OPEC and its partners. The question now is: where does OPEC+ go from here?

The delay of a few days in the OPEC+ meeting will neither improve the current oil situation nor help push oil prices higher. In fact, the upcoming OPEC+ session may put downward pressure on oil prices, as it is unlikely to produce any constructive outcomes or resolutions. The group will also face challenges in pressuring its non-compliant members to adhere to their commitments, knowing that some oil will inevitably slip into the open market regardless.

Looking ahead, it appears that next year may not be more promising than the current one. Oil prices are expected to remain weak and could average at a lesser rate than in 2024. The anticipated outcome of OPEC+ extending production cuts for another year, coupled with a lack of significant global demand growth, will likely contribute to weaker oil prices.

This means that oil production will likely require further budget cuts to balance the books by the end of the year. Many Arabian Gulf countries are facing deficits and will need to continue searching for longterm solutions and resolutions.

For the time being, oil prices are expected to remain weak, but there is hope that they will not fall further below \$70 per barrel. Today's political crisis is not helping oil prices move forward either.

As a result, OPEC+ members have little choice but to comply with the agreed-upon resolutions. It is their only option moving forward.

The general market index ended the month at 7,245.99 points, reflecting a 1.23 percent growth, or 88.27 points. The main market index also rose by 1.30 percent to 6,608.47 points, gaining 84.72 points.

At the close of trading, the market value of shares reached 42.84 billion dinars, a 1.23 percent increase from the previous month.

Sector-wise, 8 sectors saw growth, led by basic materials, which rose by 10.76 percent. However, 5 sectors declined, with consumer goods experiencing the

largest drop of 10.55 percent. Analysts noted that the completion of third-quarter corporate disclosures, showing growth for listed companies, supported the market's positive performance.

They expect continued momentum in the coming period, driven by positive market factors and investor expectations for dividends from large stocks.

Despite this, the stock exchange indices declined at the end of the last week of November, following four consecutive weeks of gains.

Festival highlights Middle Eastern, African cinema

Marrakech Festival opens with 'The Order'

MARRAKECH, Morocco, Nov 30, (AP): One of the Middle East and North Africa's largest film festivals opened Friday in Morocco, drawing actors and directors from throughout the world to present 70 features from 32 countries.

The Marrakech International Film Festival, now in its 21st year, will showcase Oscar contenders and screen films for members of the public. But unlike larger festivals in Venice, Cannes or Toronto, it places unique emphasis on emerging directors and films from the Middle East and Africa.

The roster of actors and directors who will participate in this year's conversations and tributes includes Sean Penn, Alfonso Cuaron and David Cronenberg.

Remi Bonhomme, the festival's artistic director, said what makes the festival unique is its ability to draw talent on par with the world's largest festivals while also spotlighting upand-coming directors from Morocco, the Middle East and

"We pay a lot of attention to countries that are underrepresented in cinema," he said. "We support filmmakers who have their own voice, who develop a story that is in a specific context, whether it is Iran, Morocco or the US.

"But they don't have to be the voice of their country. They have the need to have the freedom to express their own personal vision," he added.

Among the themes that Bonhomme is excited about in this year's films is family. Filmmakers, including "The Seed of the Sacred Fig" director Mohammad Rasoulof, are "exploring social and political impact through the scale of a family," Bonhomme

The festival opened Friday with "The Order" - a thriller starring Jude Law that chronicles an FBI manhunt for the leader of a white supremacist group.

The jury competition contains 14 first or second films. The nine-person jury includes actors Jacob Elordi and Andrew Garfield as well as Ali Abbasi, the Iranian-Danish director of "The Apprentice." Luca Guadagnino, the Italian-Algerian director of Queer" will preside over the jury.

The films in competition include Saïd Hamich's "Across the Sea" about a young Moroccan man's immigration to Marseille and Damian Kocur's "Under the Volcano," Poland's Oscar entry for Best International Feature.

The festival - founded by Morocco's King Mohammed VI and is presided over by his brother Prince Moulay Rachid - plays a major role in showcasing and promoting Moroccan films and

It has rarely shied away from diverse subject matter and this year will screen Moroccan films about immigration, homosexuality, bar performers and Moroccan communist Jews.

Motorsports icon leaves lasting legacy in racing

'Motorcycle Mary' McGee dies ahead of doc release

GARDNERVILLE, Nev., Nov 30, (AP): Mary McGee, a female racing pioneer and subject profiled in an Oscar-contending documentary "Motorcycle Mary," has died, her family said. She was 87.

"McGee's unparalleled achievements in off-road racing and motorcycle racing have inspired generations of athletes that followed in her footsteps," her family said in a statement.

The family said McGee died of complications from a stroke at her home in Gardnerville, Nevada, on Wednesday, the day before the release of the short documentary "Motorcycle Mary" on ESPN's YouTube channel. Seven-time Formula 1 champion Lewis Hamilton was an executive producer on the film, which became available globally on Thursday. Its premiere was at the Tribeca

Festival in June. "Mary embodied resilience, grace, and optimism," McGee's family wrote on social media. "She was a historic athlete and a motorsports pioneer who embraced life's chal-

lenges, cared deeply for others, and made time to brighten the lives of those around her. While we are deeply saddened by this loss, we are comforted knowing that her light will

continue to shine in everyone she touched." McGee had an accomplished racing resume, first in auto racing and later in motorcycle racing. She became the first person - man or woman - to complete the grueling

Baja 500 off-road race in Mexico solo, which she did in 1975. The film about her was directed by Haley

Watson. Two-time Oscar winner Ben Proudfoot also was an executive producer. "I'm deeply saddened by this news, but I

am comforted to know that Mary was surrounded by friends and family at the time of her passing," Watson said. "In early 2022, I was researching stories when I came across Mary's. That discovery marked the tipping point into uncovering a much larger and truly incredible career in motorsports and life jour-

ney."
Shortly after her family announced her is instagram death, Hamilton paid tribute on his Instagram account: "I'm deeply saddened to hear that Mary McGee, the first woman to road race motorcycles in the U.S and the first person to solo the Baja 500 has passed on," Hamilton wrote. "My condolences to her family and everyone who she's inspired. Her legacy will live on as a trailblazer in the world of motorsports and beyond.'

Born in Juneau, Alaska, during World War II, McGee and her older brother were sent to Iowa to live with their grandparents. Her brother became a race car driver and encouraged his sister to take up the sport, even though it was almost unprecedented for women at that time.

Racing team owner Vasek Polak persuaded McGee to drive a Porsche Spyder, and she won races. Polak later persuaded her to try motorcycle racing and she also excelled.

Steve McQueen, the late actor and racing enthusiast, was the one who persuaded Mc-

Gee to take part in the Baja 500. McGee was the first woman to race motocross in the United States, the first to compete in an international motocross competition and the first to receive sponsorships

from major brands. She was one of the most influential women in the history of motorsports and known for

her mentorship of other women in racing. McGee was inducted into the AMA Motorcycle Hall of Fame in 2018.

Emotional debate

UK MPs give initial nod to bill on assisted dying

LONDON, Nov 30, (AP): British law-makers gave initial approval on Friday to a bill to help terminally ill adults end their lives in England and Wales, following an impassioned debate that saw people sharing personal stories of loss and suffering.

Members of Parliament approved the assisted dying bill by a 330-275 vote, signaling their approval in principle for the bill, which will undergo further scrutiny before it goes to a final vote.

Friday's vote came after hours of debate - emotional at times - that touched on issues of ethics, faith and law. There was no braying and shouting that often marks debates in the House of Commons and speeches were considered respectfully and heard in silence.

"Let's be clear, we're not talking about a choice between life or death, we are talking about giving dying people a choice about how to die," the bill's main sponsor, Kim Leadbeater, said as she presented the bill to a packed chamber.

Supporters said the law would provide dignity to the dying and prevent suffering, while protecting the vulnerable.

Opponents said the disabled and elderly were at risk of being coerced, directly or indirectly, to end their lives to save money or relieve the burden on family members. Others called for the improvement of palliative care to ease suffering as an alternative.

The proposed bill would allow adults over the age of 18 who are expected to have fewer than six months to live to request and be provided help to end their life, subject to several safeguards.

They would have to be capable of taking the fatal drugs themselves, and two independent doctors and a High Court judge will have to sign off on any decision. The bill will not apply to Scotland or Northern Ireland.

Backers of the bill told heart-wrenching stories about constituents and family members who suffered in the final months of their lives and dying people

who committed suicide in secret because it is currently a crime for anyone to provide assistance.

Danny Kruger, who led the argument against the bill, cautioned lawmakers not to back a "state suicide service." He argued that no amount of safeguards will stop many vulnerable people feeling the pressure to make a request to end their lives.

Kruger voiced his disappointment at the outcome but said there's a chance lawmakers will reject the bill when it comes back for a vote in the next few months. Some of those voting in favor said they only did so to examine the details further and could potentially vote against it in the future.

"I still think we can stop it," he said. Although the bill was proposed by Leadbeater, a member of the ruling center-left Labour Party, it was an open vote with alliances formed across the political divide.

The government is widely expected to come up in the next few months with assessments on how assisted dying will be funded and how it would impact the U.K.'s state-funded National Health Service, hospice care and the legal system.

Prime Minister Keir Starmer did not show his hand ahead of the vote, but backed the change. Others in his Cabinet, including Health Secretary Wes Streeting and the Justice Minister Shabana Mahmood, voted against. There were similar divisions across other political parties.

Long-time British campaigner Esther Rantzen, who is terminally ill with lung cancer and played a leading role in advocating the need for a vote on assisted dying, voiced her joy at the "wonderful" outcome and said it will give people an "equal choice."

When diagnosed with her terminal illness, Rantzen said she would travel to Switzerland to bring an end to her life, where the law allows assisted dying for non-residents.

Norris hands Piastri victory in Qatar F1 sprint, defying McLaren orders

LUSAIL, Qatar, Nov 30, (AP): Lando Norris ignored team orders as he handed his McLaren teammate Oscar Piastri the win in the sprint race at the Qatar Grand Prix on Saturday.

With McLaren eyeing its first Formula 1 constructors' title in 26 years and George Russell close behind for Mercedes, Norris was told by the team over the radio to "finish in this order," ahead of Piastri.

He chose to gift his teammate the win anyway, easing off to the right on the exit of the final corner and then swooping back across in front of Russell, who finished third.

"The team told me not to do it, but I thought I could get away with it and we did," Norris said. "Honestly, I don't mind. I'm not here to win sprint races. I'm here to win races and the championship, but that's not gone to

Norris was paying Piastri back for doing the same in the sprint race in Brazil when Norris was still fighting

Max Verstappen for the drivers' title. "I made my mind up in Brazil when it happened," Norris said. "I needed to do something to give it back.'

Piastri said he hadn't expected Norris to take the risk.

"I was aware it could happen. I was a bit surprised that with George half a second (away) it did," Piastri said. "It just shows off our teamwork and the lack of egos within the team.'

It continues a season where McLaren's race tactics have often been a talking point, such as when Norris and Piastri swapped for the lead in Hungary after a lengthy and often-awkward radio exchange with the team.

On Saturday, Norris started on pole position and kept the lead at the start as Piastri squeezed past Russell for second. As Russell repeatedly attacked Piastri for second, Norris dropped back instead of building a lead. That put Piastri within one second of Norris, allowing the Australian to use the DRS overtaking aid for extra speed.

BRIGHTON, England, Nov 30, (AP): Southampton was denied a priceless victory by a controversial VAR decision and ended up drawing with host Brighton 1-1 in the **English Premier League.**

Kaoru Mitoma spectacularly headed Brighton into a first half lead and Flynn Downes hammered the equalizer an hour in. Then minutes later teammate Cameron Archer converted a cross from Saints substitute Ryan Fraser.

A VAR check of more than four minutes eventually decided Archer was onside but then penalized Adam Armstrong, who was offside but did not touch the ball, for interfering with goalkeeper Bart Verbruggen.

"I find it hard to accept," Southampton manager Russell Martin told broadcaster Sky Sports.

"We were told it affects Bart Verbruggen's ability, and if Adam's run moved Verbruggen from his position then I would understand the decision, but he hasn't moved. I cannot see how

it has affected the goalkeeper. "It is still human error in my opin-

ion. The mistake is, it's not clear and obvious enough to be corrected. The on-field decision carries weight. I am frustrated." It meant Saints, still on the bottom of the league, had to settle for a first away point.

Martin was proud of his team: "They have been creeping up with belief. We were excellent and went toe to toe with a team who have gone second.

Brighton's point lifted it up to second on the table, level on points and goal difference with Manchester City.

The disallowed goal was brilliantly set up. Tyler Dibling wriggled clear of three Brighton players inside his own half and spread the ball to Fraser. The midfielder's low cross evaded Armstrong and was finished at the far post by Archer - only to be chalked off to the dismay of Martin. The official explanation was "Arm-

strong was in an offside position and deemed to be impacting Verbruggen's ability to play the ball.' There was more drama towards the

end of 13 minutes of added time when Brighton sub Simon Adingra's effort beat Saints goalkeeper Joe Lumley in his league debut but flicked the outside of the far post.

At fulltime, managers Martin and Fabian Hurzeler squared up to each other, and later accused the other of disrespect.

Both of them were booked during the bad-tempered match; Hurzeler for waving an imaginary yellow card in the first half and Martin for his reaction to more protesting from the Brighton boss after a foul by Downes.

"It's important to respect each other and how you talk to each other," Hurzeler said. "That's how I was educated."

Martin was unimpressed with Hurzeler's touchline antics.

"The manager decided to say something about respect," Martin said. "I've never known a manager try to get as many players booked as that. Respect is reciprocal. It's mutual.

Sri Lanka was set an improbable 516 target and started the fourth day in a deep hole at 103-5. It was all out for 282, hastened by the dismissal of Dinesh Chandimal, who led the resistance with 83.

After Chandimal was out caught and bowled by Gerald Coetzee, Sri Lanka's last three wickets folded for 11 runs in the next six

Jansen, the 2.06-meter left-armer, took the last two wickets for 4-73 in the innings and 11-86 in the match for his maiden 10-for in

Kuwait schedules friendlies against Syria, Lebanon & Yemen ahead of Khaleeji Zain 26

DOHA, Nov 30: Kuwait has finalized its schedule for three friendly matches during their training camp in Doha. The team will face Syria on December 9, Lebanon on December 12, and conclude against Yemen on December 15.

The "Al-Azraq" training camp began last Thursday in Doha as part of their preparations for the Khaleeji Zain 26 tournament, which Kuwait will host from December 21 to January 3.

The tournament draw placed Kuwait in Group A alongside Qatar, the UAE, and Oman. Group B includes Iraq, Saudi Arabia, Bahrain, and Yem-

Meanwhile, Iraqi Football Federation President Adnan Darjal announced

that Iraq's national team will return to Kuwait immediately after completing its camp in Qatar to gear up for the Gulf tournament.

Darjal noted that several Iraqi players based overseas would be unavailable for the tournament due to club commitments. However, he expressed confidence in Iraq's prospects for both the Khaleeji Zain 26 and its World Cup qualification campaign.

He highlighted Iraq's strong position in the World Cup qualifiers, saying, "We are just three points behind the leading Korean team, sitting in second place. We are close to achieving significant results and securing our spot in the 2026 World Cup.'

Barca loses at home for 1st time this season

Catalans fall to Las Palmas

BARCELONA, Spain, Nov 30, (AP): Barcelona lost at home for the first time this season when the Spanish league leader was stunned 2-1 by Las Palmas on Saturday.

Barcelona had played superbly in the first three months under new coach Hansi Flick and was flying high after convincing victories over Real Madrid in the domestic competition and Bayern Munich in the Champions League. It had won all eight home games overall.

But it has now gone three rounds of La Liga without a win. Prior to the loss to Las Palmas, it fell 1-0 at Real Sociedad and drew 2-2 at Celta

Madrid, despite its own troubles especially in the Champions League, can now move ahead of Barcelona in the Spanish league. It trails Barcelona by four points with two games more to play.

Sandro Ramirez and Fábio Silva scored for the Canary Islands club on either side of Raphina's equalizer.

Barcelona's Lamine Yamal returned from a right ankle injury that had sidelined with for three weeks as a halftime substitute, but Jasper Cillessen saved his best shot. The Las Palmas goalkeeper also did well to palm a Raphinha free kick over his bar in the final minutes.

The mascot cavorted on the field at Lluís Com-

panys Olympic Stadium before Barcelona hosted Las Palmas in a Spanish league game Saturday. The visitors won $2-\hat{1}$.

It wears Barcelona's burgundy and blue shirt and shorts, and its mouth opens to reveal the same soccer ball icon found on the club's emblem.

The club describes the mascot as a "friendly, positive puss that is especially passionate about football, but also embraces all sports that are part of FC Barcelona's multi-sport ethos, whether male or female, pro or amateur.

In addition to its champion women's soccer team, Barcelona competes in other sports, including basketball, handball, indoor soccer, and roller

'The Saudi bid committed to working with the ILO'

FIFA inspection praises Saudi Arabia bid to host 2034 WC

GENEVA, Nov 30, (AP): Ahead of giving Saudi Arabia the men's 2034 World Cup to host, FIFA approved the quality of its bid in a 110-page evaluation Saturday.

FIFA's in-house inspection team noted Saudi Arabia must invest "significant effort and time" to fulfill promises for the tournament that comply with international standards.

The Saudi bid also was scored by FIFA staff as "medium risk" for huge construction projects to build most of the 15 stadiums and dozens of new hotels needed, plus picking which months to play the 48-team,

104-game tournament. Shortly past midnight local time, FIFA published a mandatory evaluation of the Saudi project that is the only candidate since a fast-track bidding process was unexpectedly started in October last year. FIFA president Gianni Infantino has built strong ties in recent years to Saudi Crown Prince Mohammed bin Sal-

On Dec. 11, in a scheduled online meeting of 211 national soccer federations, FIFA will ask them to acclaim without an itemized vote both Saudi Arabia for the 2034 World Cup - for which only Asian and Oceania members could bid - and the Spain-Portugal-Morocco co-hosting bid for the 2030 edition. That project also gives one game to each of Argentina, Paraguay and Uruguay, which was the original World Cup

host in 1930. FIFA said Saudi Arabia is promising "the establishment of robust workers' welfare systems to protect workers connected to tournament infrastructure." The Saudi bid has committed to working with the ILO but not international trade unions or rights groups.

The 32-team World Cup in Qatar was played in just 28 days in November and December, outside the traditional time of June-July when temperature in the region routinely exceed 40 Celsius (104 degrees).

The November-December slot for a 48-team World Cup of about 38 days would be difficult for Saudi Arabia. Riyadh is hosting the multisport Asian Games in the first two weeks of December 2034 and the holy month of Ramadan also runs from mid-November to mid-Decem-

Another clash for international sports in 2034 is the Winter Olympics being hosted in two weeks in February by Salt Lake City, Utah.

On climate issues, FIFA noted the Saudi World Cup will have "a reliance on air travel" between the five cities proposed: Riyadh, Jeddah, Al Khobar, Abha and Neom.

There has been speculation Saudi Arabia could eventually give some of the 104 games to neighboring states and emirates.

On the financial prospects for FIFA, the inspection report cited a "strong commercial position" with a "substantial hospitality footprint proposed."

FIFA said it put a cap of 25% of the tickets being offered for corporate hospitality packages in the stadiums which range from 46,000 capacity to 92,000 seats for the planned King Salman International Stadium in Riyadh that will stage

FIFA signed a World Cup sponsorship in April with Saudi oil firm Aramco and more deals are expected to follow the Dec. 11 win, including for the Club World Cup tournament that relaunches next June in the United States.

Kazma sweeps Al-Sulaibikhat to continue impressive streak

KUWAIT CITY, Nov 30: Kazma secured its fourth victory in the volleyball league, defeating Al-Sulaibikhat 3-0 in the fifth round of the preliminary stage. The round also featured Al-Shabab's commanding 3-0 win over Al-Yarmouk.

Kazma dominated the match, comfortably taking the first set 25-12. The second set saw more resistance from Al-Sulaibikhat, but Kazma edged it out 25-23 before wrapping up the match with a decisive 25-15 victory in the third set.

In the other game, Al-Shabab delivered a strong performance, defeating Al-Yarmouk in straight sets with scores of 25-21, 25-11, and 25-18. With this win, Kazma increased its tally to 12 points, placing third in the standings, while Al-Sulaibikhat remains seventh with no points after five con-

secutive losses. Al-Shabab climbed to fifth with 7 points, leaving Yarmouk at the bottom without any points. The round began on Thursday, where Kuwait Club defeated Al-Arabi, and Al-

Qadsiya triumphed over Al-Nasr, both with 3-0 scores. The tournament follows a single-round league format, with the top four teams advancing to the semi-finals. The first-ranked team will face the fourth, and the second will meet the third, with the winners progressing to the final.
