



Modern labs vital for effective treatment: Al-Awadhi

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 20: The 7th Medical Laboratory Conference, organized by the Medical **Laboratory Departments** Council and the Medical Laboratory Services Department at the Ministry of Health under the theme "Developments in Diagnostic Hematology and Precision Medicine (Personalized Medicine)... Future Trends in Diagnostic

Laboratories", kicked off on Sunday morning. In his opening statement, Minister of Health Dr. Ahmad Al-Awadhi highlighted that the conference is taking place at a time when the world is

witnessing a radical transformation in diagnostic and healthcare concepts. He emphasized the ministry's commitment to developing the medical laboratory system and strengthening its technical and human resources, describing it as the beating heart of modern medical work. Dr. Al-Awadhi stressed the ministry's focus on promoting personalized medi-

cine and precise diagnosis by investing in modern technology and benefiting from artificial intelligence to support medical decision-making.

He affirmed that innovation in laboratory medicine is at the heart of the shift toward an integrated digital health system that relies on accuracy and speed in

the medical labs conference. Council countries, Egypt, Tunisia, Spain, Italy, and the United Kingdom, reflecting the event's international scope and diverse expertise.

Furthermore, Dr. Al-Jumaa explained that hematology laboratories in Kuwait are undergoing a major improvement in performance and quality, with 67 specialized physicians, including 13 consultants.

Since the beginning of 2025, the laboratories have completed more than 7.6 million tests on over 3.1 million samples in public hospitals and specialized health centers, in addition to 712,000 tests conducted in primary healthcare centers.

These achievements result from adopting advanced technical systems that have reduced human error to its lowest levels, with the percentage of rejected samples reaching only 0.38 percent in 2025.

Defense, energy, trade to top 'Al-Zour' project to help Türkiye, Kuwait talks: Sonmez achieve KPC '40 strategy

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 20: Turkish Ambassador to Kuwait Tûba Nur Sönmez affirmed Monday that her country will continue to support Kuwait Vision 2035, led by His Highness the Amir Sheikh Meshal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah.

In a press statement, Sönmez disclosed that Türkiye will cooperate in the fields of development, energy and infrastructure. She said the upcoming visit of Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan will include discussions on developments in Palestine, Syria and elsewhere, enhancing joint cooperation, and maintaining peace and stability in the region. She added this visit is an opportunity to build on the momentum achieved during the visit of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Meshal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah to Turkiye last year, as several agreements and protocols in the fields of defense industries, energy, investment, transportation and trade, are scheduled to be signed to support bilateral relations and diversify investments.

She stressed that Turkish-Kuwaiti relations are considered a model of bilateral relations, pointing out that the foundation of the two countries' friendly relations is based on shared values, common interests, strong political will at the leadership level, and brotherly ties between the two peoples.

She confirmed that Kuwait is one of most reliable partners of Türkiye in the Gulf region, and that cooperation between the two countries encompasses various fields, such as trade, defense, tourism and investment. She added that the growing political will of the two leaders -- His Highness the Amir Sheikh Meshal Al-Ahmad and President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan -- allows the development of relations on multiple fronts.

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 20: The Al-Zour Refinery petrochemical complex project is expected to see a major breakthrough in the last quarter of 2025

or early 2026. According to informed sources, the Kuwait Integrated Petroleum Industries Company (KIPIC) aims to produce approximately 2.35 to 2.40 million tons of aromatics and polypropylene annually from this large-scale project.

The Kuwait Petroleum Corporation (KPC) has a strong interest in the project, primarily due to its role in supporting KPC's 2040 strategy. This strategy includes expanding the petrochemical industry both locally and globally, as well as producing petroleum derivatives that meet international environmental standards.

The project is also in line with Kuwait's goal of achieving carbon neutrality by 2050.

In a related development, KPC's 2024/2025 report revealed that the company aims, through the Al-Zour Refinery Petrochemical Complex project, to supply the local market with approximately 1.55 million tons of gasoline annually. This will also help deal with the current shortfall in gasoline supplied by Equate Petrochemical Company to its existing styrene plant.

The report explained that the project aims to support the development of both current and future petrochemical industries, in addition to creating job opportunities for Kuwaiti nationals.

Officers trio nabbed for tampering with records

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 20: The Land Borders Investigation Department at the General Department of Criminal Investigation in the Interior Ministry arrested three civilian employees at the General Department of Land Borders after they tampered with the computer system used to document passenger entry and exit, according to press release by the Ministry of Interior

This is in line with the efforts of the Criminal Security Sector to combat forgery and abuse of public office.

Details of the case indicate that information was obtained about two employees assigned in the Passport departments at Nuwaiseeb and Salmi borders, who abused their positions and the authority granted to them by entering incorrect data into the computer system of the ministry, thereby, recording false entry and exit records for two Kuwaiti women.



How did Israel defeat Hamas?

The war was neither equal nor The war was neutral equation fair. On one side stood Hamas, a small Palestinian faction with a few armed men who believed in the justice of their cause. On the other was a state with stronger economic power, superior weaponry, and advanced military, technological, and intelligence capabilities, backed by some of the

most powerful countries in the world.

Yet, the war dragged more than two years Throughout, the stronger side held firm to its position, insisting that

the military campaign would continue until Hamas was completely defeated, eliminated, and all hostages were freed.

The Israeli army, with its superior equipment and strength, and its aircraft and tanks announced that it would launch operations by land, air, and sea. It also declared its intention to starve the people of Gaza, imposing a comprehensive blockade and cutting off water, electricity, gas, food, and fuel until Gaza either surrendered unconditionally or was completely

Two years have passed, during which the Gaza Strip has suffered massive destruction. Its entire infrastructure and superstructure have been shattered, tens of thousands killed, and many times that number wounded. Yet, the threat Hamas posed to Israel's security was not eliminated, and the hostages were released only on Hamas's terms

Israel's belief in God's promises of a land of Israel stretching to the Arabian Peninsula was ultimately thwarted. Netanyahu paid a heavy and unexpected price. The world, particularly the West, turned against Israel. The dangers of Zionist ideology, the influence of AIPAC, and the Israeli leadership's drive for expansion and bloodshed were laid bare.

In the end, representatives of Hamas, the very group whose complete elimination was the objective of the war, sat at the negotiating table with Israel and the United States of America. That meeting alone signaled the collapse of Israel's commitments. The outcome now appears likely to be the eventual establishment of a Palestinian state.

Religious fervor, especially during religious wars, has long been a powerful motivator for soldiers to fight with courage. This is what Hamas capitalized on. However, such fervor has never been sufficient for governing a state once the war ends. The skills needed for leadership, governance, and reconstruction are vastly different from those required on the battlefield.

The clearest evidence of this was the wave of random field executions carried out by Hamas following its recapture of large parts of Gaza, which revealed a deeply troubling and complex side of the group. Therefore, Hamas must acknowledge its limitations and step aside from the responsibility of running the anticipated Palestinian state, leaving that task to those better equipped for it. Hamas can choose to transform into a civilian faction that embraces democratic principles.

There is nothing more damaging to the Palestinian cause, or to the Palestinian people, who are diverse in ethnicity, religion, beliefs, and ideas, than the imposition of religious rule. Support for Hamas, whether from us, others, or the international community, will quickly vanish if it overreaches or strays from its proper role, as is all too possible.

I hope Hamas will act wisely and avoid making this fatal mis-

At the height of the Palestinian-Israeli war, Gazan journalist Saleh al-Jafrawi launched a fundraising campaign to build a hospital in Gaza. He appealed to Kuwait, requesting that the funds be delivered directly to him to realize this goal.

The Muslim Brotherhood responded to his call and, within days, raised nearly \$13 million. A friend alerted me to the potential seriousness of the matter, and I reported my concerns about the campaign's true purpose to the authorities. As a result, the transfer of funds was halted.

Yesterday, news emerged of al-Jafrawi's death during a clash between Hamas militants and their rivals. I do not know which faction he belonged to.

Feminist foreign policy: Stepping up our collective action

How can we unite, act and resist together in order to defend gender equality and the rights of women and girls? This will be the guiding question of the 4th Ministerial Conference on Feminist Foreign Policy, which France will host on 22 and 23 October 2025. This conference will bring together ministers of foreign affairs from all regions of the world, representatives of international organizations, public development banks, as well as civil society, research bodies and philanthropic foundations.

Since 2019, France has pursued a feminist foreign policy, making gender equality and women's rights a crosscutting priority of its external action in the fields of development, democratic governance, peace and security, and humanitarian action, amongst others. Yet feminist foreign policy is not just lofty ideals; it follows through with concrete public policies and strong partnerships.

France and its partners are actively promoting women's and girls' rights.

France has made gender equality and defending women's and girls' rights a strategic and geopolitical priority in order to build just, inclusive, peaceful and sustainable societies. Research shows that the participation of women in negotiation processes increases the likelihood that a process be sustainable by 35%. Similarly, policies that effectively mainstream gender equality make it possible to combat global warming more effectively, to stimulate growth and to strengthen the resilience of societies.

On 7 March 2025, France presented its International Strategy for a Feminist Foreign Policy. A central tenet of this strategy is the defence of rights and sexual and reproductive health. New priorities have been established, placing gender equality at the heart of France's response to contemporary global challenges, including crises and conflicts, climate change, health, international finance, digital technology and artificial intelligence.

As part of its feminist foreign policy, France is implementing a number of flagship initiatives, including the Support Fund for Feminist Organizations (FSOF), launched in 2020 to help more than 1,400 organizations in 75 countries. Another example is the Laboratory for Women's Rights Online, created in 2024. As the first of its kind, it offers an international platform for exchanging ideas and serves as an incubator for projects to fight gender-based violence in the digital environment.

For as long as gender inequalities persist, there is much

Despite these initiatives and the progress made by the international community, much remains to be done. According to UN Women, at the current pace of change it would take close to 300 years to achieve real gender equality in the world.

Still today, gender inequalities persist, and in some cases are worsening. Conflict-related sexual violence rose by 50% from 2022 to 2023. In far too many countries, millions of women are denied the fundamental right to bodily autonomy: 193 million women only have access to abortion when their lives are in danger, and 142 million have no access to abortion under any circumstances. Wherever crises are shaking the foundations of society - in Afghanistan, Iran, Gaza, Ukraine or Sudan - it is women's rights that are the first to suffer.

A high-level conference to reaffirm our shared determination and collective ambition

In an international context marked by a significant decline in dedicated funding and the rise of anti-rights movements, the 4th Ministerial Conference on Feminist Foreign Policy will reaffirm our common determination to defend and promote women's rights and gender equality, and accept no regression. Together, we will keep moving forward.

Daily diplomatic duties are a national responsibility, do not call for praise

"FIRST of all, it must be emphasized that Kuwaiti diplomacy has long reached a stage of maturity and should not be treated as if it were newly established," columnist Eng. Adel Al-Jarallah Al-Kharafi wrote for Al-Sevassah

"That is why I am often surprised when officials visit certain countries and, upon completing their mission or visit, publicly praise the efforts of embassy staff. This is not a common practice in other parts of the world. The role of a country's diplomatic representatives is to ensure the success of the official's visit or mission. That is their duty and responsibility. Public praise in the media, therefore, seems unusual, as such acknowledgments are typically personal and should not be published in the media.

"So when an official says, "Thank you for the warm welcome", questions arise - What kind of welcome is being referred to? Isn't it the standard role of diplomatic missions, according to protocol, to handle logistical arrangements?

"While assisting citizens, whether during difficult times or in routine situations, is the primary responsibility of any mission, it is a consular service function. Embassies, by contrast, are primarily in charge of monitoring developments in the host country, protecting national interests, and providing regular reports to the Ministry of Foreign

"They are also responsible for implementing the state's policies with host countries and supporting the activities of officials involved in bilateral relations. Technical and protocol-related tasks are part of their routine, day-to-day responsibilities.

"Should an embassy issue a public statement of thanks every time a citizen or official visits, when its core mission

is to protect the interests of the state and its citizens, and to provide legal and consular support abroad?

"We understand that diplomatic work is not easy and can be demanding, but those in the field are specifically trained for it. They are expected to have strong skills in communication, negotiation, and problem-solving, along with a solid understanding of international politics and diplomatic protocol. They must also be capable of handling complex and sensitive situations with discretion, and be adaptable to working in diverse environments and engaging with various cultures.

"As for receiving officials, providing transportation, and arranging hotel accommodations, these are routine duties that do not merit public praise. Highlighting such matters can create a negative impression, as it suggests that any official who does not publicly express gratitude may be met with resentment from embassy staff, despite the fact that these services are part of their job.

"Kuwait, which has played a leading role in conflict

resolution and demonstrated wise, balanced diplomacy that has earned it international respect, should not be sidetracked by such secondary issues. In fact, there have been occasions where Kuwaiti citizens have sought help from the embassies of neighboring Gulf countries.

"I recall in 2019, media outlets reported on the return of Kuwaiti citizens from Sudan. One headline read - "Kuwaitis returning from Sudan: The embassy let us down, and Saudi Arabia fulfilled its responsibility.

"I have traveled extensively over the years, and on one occasion, a friend accompanying me said, "We should inform the embassy." I asked him why. Was it so they could send us a car? There was no need for that. None at all.

"I don't say this to offend anyone, but rather to point out, indirectly, a critique of how some view diplomatic work. When every employee carries out their duties sincerely and without expecting public praise, it reflects a mature understanding of public service, which is serving the people and the state without seeking recognition.

"There are several laws that require strict and effective implementation to curb price manipulation and punish those who exploit it, especially some expatriates who rent licenses from citizens to work in food and vegetable markets," Kuwaiti journalist Salem Al-Wawan wrote for Al-Seyassah daily.

"Citizens are also complicit in encouraging price increases through various means, including residency trading. Therefore, strict enforcement of the law has become

"For example, the fish market is controlled by some expatriate workers who dominate the fishing industry. The Ministry of Commerce and Industry, the Ministry of Health, the Kuwait Municipality, and the Ministry of Social Affairs must enforce the law against anyone manipulating prices.

"The situation appears chaotic, which benefits opportunists. I hope that the relevant ministries will activate their oversight mechanisms to curb price increases. The sea is Kuwaiti, the boat is Kuwaiti, the license is Kuwaiti, but the fisherman is an expatriate. This is why a basket of mead now costs KD 70 or more, in addition to the lack of cleanliness at the Sharq fish market.

"The Ministry of Commerce and Industry and the Consumer Protection Agency are notably absent. The situation calls for increased oversight, stricter monitoring of license rentals, and the establishment of new mechanisms and conditions for issuing fishing licenses.

"We understand that the responsibilities of First Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Interior Sheikh Fahad Al-Yousef are complex. However, we have full confidence in his ability to protect citizens and consumers from the greed of merchants and the monopoly of some expatriates over basic commodities that have become unaffordable for many citizens.

"For example, the 500-meter road leading to the Wafra agricultural plot is neglected and in need of maintenance. Wafra also requires a fresh water station and a gas station, so that drivers of fresh water tankers in plot 6 do not have to travel approximately 25 kilometers to reach the near-

"The Wafra agricultural area, located in the far south

of the country along the Kuwaiti-Saudi border, is not

what it was forty years ago," former Minister of Justice

Kuwait acts to make atmosphere conducive for foreign investment

'Uncle' acquitted in breach of trust case

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 20: Minister of Justice Nasser Al-Sumait issued a ministerial decision to form a committee tasked to prepare a draft decree regulating real estate ownership by investment entities.

This is in line with Decree-Law No. 7/2025 amending Decree-Law No. 74/1979, which regulates real estate ownership by non-Kuwaitis.

In a press statement on Sunday, Al-Sumait revealed the committee will prepare a draft decree stating the rules governing ownership permits, permitted areas, and restrictions on disposal or mortgage. The draft will then be submitted to him to ask for the opinion of relevant authorities and complete the legal proce-

Al-Sumait stressed that this step is part of the efforts of the State to develop a legal environment that attracts investment and enhances the balance between encouraging capital and protecting real estate ownership to support the Kuwait 2035 vi-

The committee is chaired by Counselor Ahmed Al-Mutairi, with Hamad Al-Rashidi serving as rapporteur, while the members include the representatives of the Ministry of Justice, Kuwait Direct Investment Promotion Authority (KDIPA), Kuwait Municipality and Public Authority for Housing Welfare (PAHW).

It is worth mentioning that the amended draft decree grants investment entities licensed by KDIPA the right to own real estate, which is necessary to carry out their activities, manage them, or provide housing for investors and employees, in accordance with the regulations and conditions specified in the new decree.

Uncle acquitted: The Misdemeanor Court acquitted a defendant (uncle) of breach of trust and failure to carry out his deceased brother's will. The defendant was accused of withholding KD50,000 that the deceased entrusted to him, intended to be delivered to the deceased's son

upon reaching the age of 21. The incident boils down to the complainant's ex-husband, as prior to his death, he allegedly handed the disputed amount to his brother, asking him to keep it in trust for his son. However, years later, the family was surprised to discover that he denied ever receiving the money.

The complainant based her case on the tes-

timony of several relatives who confirmed the occurrence, stating that the deceased had indeed given the sum to his brother and instructed him to hand it over to his son once he reached the specified age. The accused, however, denied the allegation during the investigation, claiming that the disputed amount is his own money and that he opened the account in his name to deposit his share of his parents' inheritance. He denied that the money was held in trust for his nephew and presented an account statement showing that the withdrawn amounts belonged

Attorney Inaam Haider, lawyer for the accused, argued that the case was inadmissible, as it was filed by a party without legal standing, since the son already reached the age of majority. She demanded for her client's acquittal and, alternatively, asked the court to refrain from imposing penalty.

Ultimately, the court acquitted the defendant of the breach of trust charge, stating in its ruling that the case documents lacked conclusive evidence proving he received the money as a trust. The court concluded that this is a family dispute, which did not rise to the level of a criminal offense.

Workers' rights prioritized: In a landmark ad-

ministrative ruling that reinforces the principle of legality and protects the rights of employees, the Administrative Court issued a final ruling annulling the decision to transfer an employee from one government agency to another.

The ruling was based on the finding that the decision infringed on the financial benefits and job status of the plaintiff, hence, it is an arbitrary transfer without legal or regulatory justi-

Attorney Mohammad Al-Ansari, lawyer for the plaintiff, told the newspaper that this ruling is a victory for the principle of job stability and ensures that the transfer is not used as a means

to undermine the rights of employees or harm their financial status. He affirmed that the court exercised full oversight over the legality of the decision and determined that it is a disguised punishment in the form of an administrative

Al-Ansari disclosed that the court concluded in its reasoning that the transfer was not carried out in the interest of the public, as it resulted in the reduction of financial benefits and allowances, which the plaintiff enjoyed at his original workplace. He added the employee was transferred to a unit that is excluded from the approved organizational structure of the entity to which he was transferred. rendering the decision null and void and in violation of the law.

He pointed out that the ruling complements a series of principles established by the Administrative Cassation Court, including those contained in its ruling numbers 491/2018, 213/2019 and 102/2021, which stated "a transfer that results in the employee being deprived of his allowances or financial benefits without his consent is an unlawful decision and undermines the principle of equality and equal op-

He stressed that this ruling sends a clear message to government entities that they must adhere to the regulations governing transfer decisions, and that these decisions should not be taken as a means of administrative retaliation or to pressure employees, as they should be based solely on public interest, without prejudice to employment or financial rights.

He stated that this ruling reaffirms the principle of transparency and legitimacy in public service, and confirms that the Kuwaiti judiciary does not tolerate any administrative decision aimed at circumventing the law or undermining the guarantees provided by the employment system for civil servants.

The ruling affirmed that the administrative body has no authority to transfer an employee to a lower position in terms of financial grade. nature of work or job level, otherwise, the decision will be deemed tainted by abuse of power.

The ruling stated that the Administrative Court has the jurisdiction to hear transfer cases if it is determined that the transfer decision includes a disguised disciplinary penalty or infringes on the employee's financial rights.

This is based on established rulings of the Administrative Court of Cassation, including Administrative Appeal numbers 975/2015 and 976/2015 and Administrative Appeal No. 2 during the session held on March 29, 2022.

The Court of Cassation affirmed that a transfer deviating from the public interest and leading to reduction in salary or allowances is a harmful administrative decision and violates

Kuwait, Bangladesh eye boost in military and bilateral relations

NEW DELHI, Oct 20, (KUNA): Kuwait's Assistant Foreign Minister for Asian Affairs Ambassador Sameeh Johar Hayat met on Monday with Bangladeshi Chief of Army Staff, General Waker-Uz-Zaman, at the Army Command Headquarters. The two sides discussed military cooperation and coordination, as well as means to enhance bilateral relations and address issues of mutual interest.

Attending the meeting were Kuwait's Ambassador to Bangladesh, Ali Hamadah, Bangladeshi Ambassador to Kuwait Major General Syed Tareq Hussain, and a number of Bangladeshi officers.

The Army Chief lauded the military and

security cooperation between the two countries, expressing hope for further enhancement of bilateral ties.

The first round of political consultations between the two foreign ministries concluded with both sides reaffirming their commitment to strengthening ties.

Ambassador Hayat also met on Sunday with his Bangladeshi counterpart Mohammad Hussain and delivered a handwritten letter from Kuwaiti Foreign Minister Abdullah Al-Yahya regarding ways to bolster bilateral relations in various fields. The Kuwaiti diplomat concluded his two-day official visit and departed Bangladesh on Monday.



KUWAIT CITY, Oct 20: The Criminal Security Sector arrested two Kuwaiti employees of the Ministry of Defense for committing a violent robbery in Hawally Governorate, reports Al-Seyassah daily

The Ministry of Interior stated in a press release that the Operations Room received a report from an Asian resident who said he was robbed by two unidentified individuals. One of them restrained him while the other stole cash, mobile phone from him and then fled.

The ministry explained that the Hawally Investigations Department's Salmiya Investigations Office launched an investigation immediately after receiving the report. They arrived at the crime scene, collected surveillance footage, and gathered the nec-

essary information. The investigation led to identifying the suspects, who turned out to be citizens working at the Ministry of De-

One of the suspects was tracked down and arrested, and he confessed to committing the crime with the assistance of the other suspect. The second suspect was then lured and arrested, and he admitted his involvement in the crime.

Suspected narcotics and drug paraphernalia were found in the possession of both suspects. Legal action is being taken against them, and they, along with the seized items, will be referred to the competent authorities.

The Ministry of Interior affirmed its ongoing efforts to pursue and apprehend anyone who threatens the nation's security and the safety of citizens and residents, reaffirming its commitment to enforcing the law without exception.

Power cables, iron fence stolen from two locations

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 20: The Deputy Public Prosecutor ordered the dispatch of forensic personnel to Rawdatain in order to lift fingerprints and collect any traces that might have been left by unknown individuals who stole cables from an oil company site in the aforementioned area, reports Al-Anba daily.

These directives were issued after a citizen, serving as the legal representative of the oil company, filed a report regarding the theft that occurred at the company's site. He stated that the stolen items included seven cables, each measuring eight meters in length.

The case was registered as theft and classified as fel-

Meanwhile, the Deputy Public Prosecutor also ordered the assignment of a technical team to Mutlaa after a citizen, representing the Ministry of Electricity, Water and Renewable Energy, filed a report about a malfunction in the electrical

Following the dispatch of the technical team to investigate the cause of the malfunction, it was discovered that unidentified individuals climbed over the fence of an electrical tower and stole 415 circular fence meshes with a diameter of 19 millimeters, along with seven iron support angles. The value of the stolen items is estimated at KD2,128.

CAPT requested the ministry to submit its recommendations within 10 working days.



MoF vows to accelerate digital transformation

Finance Ministry wins Al Award for 'Tarasul Plus' system; CAIT, MoH and Kuwait Credit Bank recognized

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 20, (KUNA): Undersecretary of the Kuwaiti Ministry of Finance, Aseel Al-Munifi, affirmed on Sunday, the ministry's keenness to expand the implementation of digital transformation systems in a way that contributes to enhancing the level of government performance in the country.

This came in a statement made by Al-Munifi to KUNA on the sidelines of the Microsoft Artificial Intelligence Summit and on the occasion of the ministry receiving the Excellence Award for the "Tarasul Plus" system among the winners of the Artificial Intelligence Excellence Awards, during the awards ceremony held at the conclusion of the summit.

Al-Munifi added that this award came as a result of the ministry's efforts in the field of digital transformation, as it launched the "Tarasul Plus" system last June, representing a qualitative update

in the correspondence system, whether between ministry employees and senior management or with government entities, making it the first of its kind in the Ku-

waiti government sector. She explained that the system represents the beginning of digital transformation in the ministry, noting that it uses artificial intelligence through the "Copilot" feature to assist employees in efficiently searching and preparing memos. Employees are being trained to use this feature to ensure maximum benefit from the system.

For her part, Najat Ibrahim, Director General of the Central Agency for Information Technology, expressed in a similar statement to KUNA her pride in the agency winning the Artificial Intelligence Excellence Award for the achievement of deploying the "Secure Azure Landing Zones 44", which embodies the efforts of the agency's teams and the strong partnership with government entities.

Advanced tests have been introduced, including quantitative sickle cell anemia testing, chromogenic factor VIII, and precise genetic testing.

The turnaround time for laboratory test results has improved significantly, with the percentage of tests taking more than 60 minutes dropping from 15 percent to nine percent during the first half of 2025. This improvement directly enhances diagnostic accuracy and speeds up medical decision-mak-

Dr. Al-Jumaa emphasized that these successes are the result of strong support from the Ministry of Health and its leadership, noting that Kuwait has become a model of innovation and quality in medical laboratories.

'Al-Zour'

The project will be carried out in three main phases. The first involves the construction of gasoline production units. The second includes the development of aromatics and olefins units. The third focuses on building export facilities and ports, along with the implementation of

onshore and offshore pipelines. Furthermore, sources stated that KIP-IC recently resolved the issue of hard and hazardous work, and the file will be submitted to KPC in the coming days for final approval.

They noted that Wadha Al-Khatib, CEO of Kuwait National Petroleum Company (KNPC) and acting CEO of KIPIC. issued directives to resolve the hard and hazardous work concerns, which have been an issue of concern for KIPIC's oil personnel for the past seven years.

The sources highlighted that coordination took place between Al-Khatib, Director of Health, Safety, and Environment Omar Al-Mulhim, Health Team Leader Dr. Waleed Al-Harbi, and all relevant parties.

In addition, the same sources revealed a need to fill 50 vacant positions in the Operations Department of the Al-Zour Refinery.

They said Al-Khatib recently took this initiative in cooperation and coordination with Deputy CEO for Administrative and Commercial Affairs Bandar Al-Qahtani and Deputy CEO of the Al-Zour Refinery Fahad Al-Mutairi.

The sources explained that filling these vacancies coincides with ongoing development operations at the Al-Zour Refinery and is necessary to meet the increased refinery capacity

Following the completion of the development of the third phase in mid-2024, the refinery's capacity is expected to reach approximately 615,000 barrels per day (bpd), up from fluctuating production levels between 205,000 and 410,000 bpd in 2022 and 2023.

They added that the vacancies include ten positions for senior supervisors, five for grade 13 in Area 4, and five for grade

She pointed out that His Highness the Amir Sheikh Meshal's visit to Turkiye last year was highly successful and resulted in the signing of six agreements in the fields of defense, trade, investment, diplomacy and culture, in addition to the establishment of a joint strategic dialogue mechanism, elevating relations to the level of strategic partnership.

She indicated that the volume of trade exchange reached about \$720 million in 2024, adding this figure does not reflect the true potential, and that both sides have the capacity to double it within a short period.

She said more than 400 Kuwaiti companies operate in Türkiye in various fields, while around 50 Turkish companies are active in Kuwait, particularly in the construction sector, where Turkish companies play an important role in the implementation of infrastructure projects such as Terminal Two at Kuwait International Airport.

Regarding bilateral cooperation, she stated that high-level visits contributed to diversifying bilateral relations, and that cooperation in the defense industry has gained significant momentum, thanks to these visits. She cited the reciprocal visits by the chiefs of staff and military delegations between the two countries, as well as the visit of the head of the Turkish Defense Industries Authority to Kuwait in November 2024.

She added that a delegation from the

Turkish Ministry of Health visited Kuwait last May to discuss areas of health cooperation. She revealed that Kuwaiti investments in Türkiye have reached about \$2 billion since 2002, stressing the need to increase this figure by strengthening cooperation between the sovereign wealth funds.

She also disclosed that Türkiye received around 300,000 Kuwaiti tourists last year, and that the customs and traditions between the two peoples are similar. She expressed her happiness over the growing interest of Kuwaitis in learning the Turkish language and culture, unveiling a plan to open the Yunus Emre Cultural Center in Kuwait soon as a platform for cultural exchange.

She affirmed that Türkiye and Kuwait share a common vision for maintaining peace and stability in the region, and that Kuwait is a key factor in achieving regional stability. She added the ninth round of political consultations will be held in April 2025 in Turkiye, while emphasizing the importance of ongoing consultation and cooperation between the two countries, especially in light of developments in Palestine and Syria and the tension between Iran and Israel.

After Voting Rights Act case arguments, concerns over diminished minority representation rise

WASHINGTON, Oct 20, (AP): For decades, the faces of American politics have grown more diverse by nearly every measure, especially as racial minority communities gained political representation after longtime legal disenfranchisement and violent discrimination.

But after some Supreme Court justices expressed skepticism about a key provision of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, a landmark law that civil rights leaders credit with enabling pluralistic democracy in the US, Black lawmakers, civic leaders and organizers fear that the faces of the nation's elected representatives may soon return to a time before hard-fought civil rights

Justices on Wednesday heard oral arguments in Louisiana v. Callais, a case that scrutinizes whether Section 2, a part of the Voting Rights Act that bars discrimination in voting systems, is constitutional.

Rep Cleo Fields, who represents the Louisiana congressional district at the heart of the case, sat in the courtroom as the justices questioned attorneys on both sides of the case. He said he hopes

the scope of the ruling's impact would give justices pause about whether to gut the law.

"If they do away with Section 2, they know the ripple effect that's going to have all over this nation. It's not just Congress," Fields said in an interview with The Associated Press. He added that it was "hard to judge" what the justices are thinking, "but I am cautiously optimistic. I really think all of the justices know what's at stake.'

Since the passage of the Voting Rights Act, which bans a range of discriminatory voting practices by state and local governments and individuals, communities of color have turned longtime movements into direct political representation - and power. State legislatures in the Deep South,

once uniformly committed to white supremacy, now feature sizable minorities of Black, Asian and Latino lawmakers. The act was amended a decade after its passage to protect the rights of "language minorities," increasing protections for Asian American, Native American and Latino communities across the country.

US Homeland Security jet purchase draws criticism from Democrats

WASHINGTON, Oct 20, (Agencies): The US Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has come under criticism from congressional Democrats following reports that it purchased two business jets worth about 172 million US dollars amid the ongoing federal government shutdown, local media re-

According to public procurement documents cited by The New York Times, the US Coast Guard (USCG) signed a sole-source contract with Gulfstream Aerospace for two G700 aircraft to be used for the Coast Guard's Long-Range Command and Control Aircraft fleet. The planes will reportedly serve DHS Secretary Kristi Noem and other senior offi-

Several Democratic lawmakers questioned the decision and demanded clarification on the source of funding.

"Your first priority should be to organize, train and equip a Coast Guard that is strong enough to meet today's mission requirements. Instead, it appears your first priority is your own comfort," Democratic Representatives Rosa DeLauro and Lauren Underwood wrote in a letter to Noem.

"The procurement of new luxury jets for your use suggests that the USCG has been directed to prioritize your own comfort above the USCG's operational needs," the letter added, expressing deep concern about Noem's "judgment, leadership priorities, and responsibility as a steward of taxpayer dollars."

Nevertheless, the University of Virginia on Friday became the fifth university to decline to participate in Trump's compact. Providing federal money based on anything but merit would undermine the integrity of research and further erode public confidence in higher education, the university's interim president said in a letter to McMahon and White House officials.

"We look forward to working together to develop alternative, lasting approaches to improving higher education," Paul Mahoney wrote.

It's unclear exactly what universities have to gain by agreeing to the deal - or what they stand to lose if they don't. In a letter sent alongside the compact, Trump officials said it provided "multiple positive benefits," including favorable access to federal funding. In exchange, colleges were asked to adopt 10 pages of commitments aligned with Trump's views.

The administration asked for commitments to eliminate race and sex from admissions decisions, to accept the government's strict binary definition of "man" and "woman," to promote conservative views on campus and to ensure "institutional neutrality" on current events, among other provisions.

"Institutions of higher education are free to develop models and values other than those below, if the institution elects to forego federal benefits,' the compact said.

Shrapnel damages vehicle during drills: Metal shrapnel from an exploding artillery shell fell hit and damaged a California Highway Patrol vehicle as personnel at a U.S. Marine Corps base fired live rounds over a highway - against the objections of Gov Gavin Newsom - during weekend exercises observed by Vice President JD Vance, state authorities said Sunday. No one was injured.

The incident occurred when ordnance detonated overhead prematurely during Saturday's exercise at Camp Pendleton, the California Highway Patrol said in a news release.

Newsom had strongly objected to the firing of munitions over Interstate 5 for safety reasons. The Democrat closed a 17-mile (27 kilometers) stretch of the road connecting Los Angeles and San Diego during the drills, which were held to mark the upcoming 250th birthday of the Marine Corps. The incident occurred in an area where officers had shut down traffic, the highway patrol said. (AP)

"Let it be cut the way it is," he told reporters aboard Air Force One. "It's cut up right now," adding that you can "leave it the way it is right now."

Cargo aircraft skids off HK runway into sea, killing 2 airport workers

A cargo aircraft skidded off a Hong Kong runway and collided with a security patrol car before both fell into the sea early Monday, killing the two people in the car, authori-ties said. The plane's four crew members were unhurt.

The Boeing 747, flown by Tur-key-based ACT Airlines, was landing at Hong Kong International Airport around 3:50 am on arrival from Dubai, United Arab Emirates. The aircraft was being operated under lease by Emirates, a long-haul car-

rier based in Dubai.

The captains did not seek help before landing and had taxied about halfway down the runway before skidding off it to the left, Steven Yiu, the airport authority's executive director in airport operations, said during a press conference.

"The patrol car absolutely did not rush onto the runway. It was the plane that went off the runway and crashed into the patrol car outside the fence," he said.

When rescue crews arrived, the plane was broken into two parts, floating in the sea, and the four crew members were waiting to be rescued at its open door, said Yiu Menyeung, a fire services official. (AP)

S.Korea seeks to arrest online scam suspects

SEOUL, South Korea, Oct 20, (AP): Authorities are seeking to formally arrest most of the 64 South Koreans repatriated from Cambodia for allegedly working for online scam organizations in Cambodia, police said Monday.

The 64 South Koreans were detained in Cambodia over the past several months and were flown to Korea on a charter flight Saturday. Upon arrival in South Korea, they were detained while police investigated whether they voluntarily joined scam organizations in Cambodia or were forced to work

Online scams, many based in Southeast Asian nations, have risen sharply since the COVID-19 pandemic and produced two sets of victims: the tens of thousands of people who have been forced to work as scammers under the threat of violence, and the targets of their fraud. Monitoring groups say online scams earn international criminal gangs billions of dollars annually.

State prosecutors have asked local courts to issue arrest warrants for 58 of the 64 returnees at the request of police, the Korean National Police Agency said in a statement. Police said the people they are seeking to place under arrest are accused of engaging in online fraud activities like romantic scams, bogus investment pitches or voice phishing, apparently target-

NAIROBI, Kenya, Oct 20, (AP): Former prime minister Raila Odinga was buried Sunday at his rural home as the country, which has previously been marred by post-election violence and anti-government protests, faces political uncertainty. Leaders present at the burial, who

This enabled the Fund to invest early on in a company that has since emerged as a leader in AI-native enterprise operations.

The Fund leveraged its early exposure through emerging managers to secure a direct position in Kepler company, alongside Addition, Global Foundries, Temasek, Intel and others. Kepler is a leading player in AI infrastructure, developing a new type of chip architecture that will increase the storage capacity for High Bandwidth Memory Chips, a key component in the AI value chain.

ponent in the AI value chain.

The Fund built a meaningful stake in Deel company as well through secondary access despite the company being closed to new investors. Deel is a full payroll and HR software platform serving 1.25M workers across 150+countries, recently valued at USD17.3bn and led by Andreesen Horowitz. The company hit a USD1bn revenue run rate; a milestone only a handful of companies ever

Commercial property segment logs record high sales in Q3

Real estate sales surged to an 11-year high in Q3, led by record-high commercial transactions, though growth in residential and investment segments slowed. Overall sales in Q3 were well above the five-year average for this traditionally softer quarter, with a noticeable shift toward outer urban areas, especially in investment and commercial segments, indicating growing interest in rental and income-generating assets. Residential sales, on the other hand, are rising more slowly, weighed down by affordability and supply constraints. Meanwhile, real estate price rises softened in Q3 due to a sharper drop in residential prices and slower growth in investment unit prices, though price trends are still more upbeat than a year ago. Looking ahead, we expect a broadly positive overall market performance to be sustained, supported by the potential approval of the real estate financing law and the prospect of lower interest rates.

Overall property sales reached KD1.2 billion in Q3, marking a second consecutive quarter of strong quarteron-quarter growth (+24%), while yearly growth (+47% y/y) reached its fastest in four years. The commercial segment, despite its historical volatility, saw record-breaking sales of KD441 million, due to large-scale land transactions in Al-Ahmadi governorate (KD240m in August alone). Stripping out commercial activity would see sales growth (residential and investment) in Q3 ease from a four-year high of 61% y/y to 14.5%. Investment sales remained resilient at KD407 million and supported by strong bank lending to the real estate sector (+7% y/y in July and August) and the recent changes to investment housing and foreign ownership regulations. However, investment sales growth moderated to a still-high 28% y/y from Q2's more exceptional level of 116%.

Residential sales came in at KD396 million in Q3, down 5.3% q/q but up 3.2% y/y. This modest annual increase in sales comes despite a marked increase in the number of transactions (+15.6% y/y) and this can be explained by the fact that sales have increasingly been concentrated further out in lower-priced areas such as the Al-Ahmadi and Al-Jahra governorates.

Real estate price rises slowed in Q3 amid residential weakness

Meanwhile, real estate prices in Q3 rose at a slower 1.4% y/y compared to 2.9% in the previous quarter, according to our real estate price index. This deceleration was primarily a reflection of a larger contraction in residential prices (-1.8% y/y) and a more moderate increase (+5.3% y/y) in investment (i.e. apartments and buildings) prices. Although the pace of residential price declines has moderated since the beginning of the year, the figures suggest that downward pressures persist, albeit less intensely. One possible contributor is



the potential release of idle land due to the vacant residential lands law coming into effect in January 2026. However, the anticipated approval of the housing financing law and the prospect of lower interest rates may support prices in the months

PAHW advances housing agenda with strategic developer partnerships

Kuwait's Public Authority for Housing Welfare (PAHW) has recently launched a strategic roadmap to engage real estate developers for a foray into public-private housing development projects. The initial phase targets three key areas: Mutlaa (2,500 units), East Saad Al-Abdullah (1,200 units), and a combined development in Jaber Al-Ahmad and West Saad Al-Abdullah (1,000 units). The aim of this initiative is to address the housing shortage (outstanding applications for the government

housing scheme reached 103,110 by mid-July) and accelerate delivery. In parallel, PAHW signed an investment agreement in July for a 12,575 sqm mixed-use project in Al-Qairawan while reporting notable progress across major infrastructure projects in South Saad Al-Abdullah and South Sabah Al-Ahmad cities with several contracts signed ahead of schedule. Overall housing project awards slowed down in Q3, however, as reported by MEED Projects, dropping to KD20 million from KD100 million in Q2 2025. Meanwhile, the value of housing loans approved by the Kuwait Credit Bank for government plots increased for the second straight quarter in Q3 (+28% q/q to KD61 million), a positive turnaround since Q1 when loan approvals were at a four-year low. The value of disbursed loans, however, declined by 14% q/q to

AEO releases study on converting cooking oil to renewable energy

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 20, (KUNA): Arab Energy Organization (AEO) released a new study about converting used cooking oil into renewable energy, highlighting its economic and environmental benefits, to overcome current challenges and pave the way for sustainable biofuel production.

AEO Secretary-General Jamal Al-Loughani told KUNA that the study reviews the sources of used cooking oil, its collection and transport to production centers, as well as refining and processing steps required to produce high-quality, impurity-free biofuel.

He noted that the amount of used cooking oil collected

globally reached 14 billion liters in 2022, and is expected to exceed 30 billion liters by 2030. The study also examined recent global developments in producing sustainable fuels such as biodiesel and Sustainable Aviation Fuel (SAF) derived from used cooking oil, which are already being implemented by the United Arab Emirates and Saudi Arabia. Al-Loughani pointed out that several Arab countries have

shown interest in converting used cooking oil into sustainable aviation fuel, with such projects expected to expand, as nations seek to reduce carbon emissions, diversify income sources, and protect natural resources.

'Good Fortune' opens in third place despite positive reviews

Horror sequel 'Black Phone 2' dials up a No. 1 opening

LOS ANGELES, Oct 20, (AP): The horror sequel "Black Phone 2" topped the North American box office charts this weekend with \$26.5 million in ticket sales, according to studio estimates Sunday. Not only did it surpass the original's \$23.6 million debut, it's a much-needed win for Blumhouse after a string of disappointments this year like "M3GAN 2.0."

Though "Black Phone 2" opened in line with expectations, moviegoing in October continues to be slow - down about 11% from last year, according to Comscore. The overall box office is still up about 4% compared with last year, but a big blockbuster hit that could spark more momentum might not arrive until late November or December.

Universal Pictures released "Black Phone 2" in 3,411 theaters in North America on a wave of good reviews. Coming four years after the original, the sequel sees the return of filmmaker Scott Derrickson, as well as stars Ethan Hawke and Mason Thames. Opening weekend audiences were 63% between the ages of 18 and 34, according to exit polls, and the biggest demographic was Hispanics, making up 39% of ticket buyers while Caucasians accounted for 35%.

With an additional \$15.5 million from 71 international

territories, "Black Phone 2" had a \$42 million worldwide launch against a reported \$30 million production budget.

The first "Black Phone" was a bit of a sleeper hit for Universal and Blumhouse in 2021 as cinemas were beginning to come back to life after COVID shutdowns. By the end of its run, it had earned more than \$161 million worldwide against an \$18 million budget. Blumhouse has had a rocky 2025, with a handful of duds including "Wolf Man" and "The Woman in the Yard." But the once impenetrable horror hitmaker could be on the upswing again with a "Five Nights at Freddy's" sequel coming in December. The first movie earned nearly \$300 million worldwide.

earned nearly \$300 million worldwide.

"Black Phone 2" was also the only film to really break through this weekend, despite a slew of options playing in wide release including the R-rated Seth Rogen, Aziz Ansari and Keanu Reeves comedy "Good Fortune," which opened in 2,990 locations to \$6.2 million, and the expansion of the Julia Roberts and Andrew Garfield drama "After the Hunt," which made \$1.6 million from 1,238 theaters.


"Tron: Ares" fell about 67% to \$11.1 million in its second weekend in theaters, which was enough to snag second place on the charts. Globally it has now earned \$103 million.

"Good Fortune," which opened in third place, had mostly positive reviews on its side, but Ansari's comedy with a side of social commentary did not drum up a lot of enthusiasm in its first weekend. With a B+ CinemaScore, though, it likely has a better chance in the coming weeks than the campus drama "After the Hunt," which got a very poor C- score.

Next weekend audiences will get another batch of awardshopefuls, including Yorgos Lanthimos's latest Emma Stone collaboration "Bugonia" and the Bruce Springsteen biopic "Springsteen: Deliver Me from Nowhere," starring "The Bear's" Jeremy Allen White.

With final domestic figures being released Monday, this list factors in the estimated ticket sales for Friday through Sunday at U.S. and Canadian theaters, according to Comscore: 1. Call to offer tax credits

Unions push to bring film studios to Nevada

LAS VEGAS, Oct 20, (AP): Movies like "The Hangover" and "Ocean's Eleven" piqued interest in the Las Vegas Strip long ago. But now Nevada labor unions hoping to boost jobs and tourism are pushing state officials to offer tax credits aimed at bringing more Hollywood filmmaking to the state.

The effort to offer up to \$95 million in tax credits to Sony Pictures Entertainment and Warner Bros. Discovery for a new film production facility in the Vegas suburbs didn't win enough legislative support earlier this year. But more than a dozen labor unions are pushing to revive the proposal during an expected special session next month.

"We believe if we can get the public behind us, we'll be able to get the legislators to understand what a big change this can bring to Southern Nevada," said Tommy White, business manager-secretary treasurer of Laborers' International Union of North America, Local 872 in Las Vegas.

Trade unions formed a political action committee called Nevada Jobs Now, which has raised over \$1 million to be used for digital advertisements, mailers and some TV commercials, White said. The production companies behind the project say it would create 19,000 construction jobs.

If the unions are successful, Las Vegas would be competing with cities like Atlanta, where the film industry has boomed for more than a decade thanks to a far more generous tax break. California, meanwhile, recently revamped its own tax incentive programs to combat a multiyear downward trend in Hollywood film production.

The production companies would not come to Las Vegas if they don't receive the tax incentives, according to David O'Reilly, CEO of Howard Hughes Holdings, the developer of the proposal called Summerlin Studios. It would include 10 movie stages, hotels, a medical center and be part of a master-planned neighborhood in West Las Vegas.

"There would be no reason for Sony and Warner to film in Nevada when they can get tax credits in 20 other states or around the globe," he said. "They need to bring their productions to where they have the best economic deal, and we're just trying to make Nevada competitive with everybody else."

Eligible

To be eligible for the tax credits, \$400 million needs to be spent building a studio and \$1.8 billion spent building the mixed-use development of shops and restaurants, O'Reilly said. Sony and Warner Bros. would have to spend \$4.5 billion over 15 years. They would be eligible for the tax credits after the studio is built and filming begins, he said.

The proposal comes as Las Vegas continues to see a decline in tourism. Between June 2024 and June 2025, the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority reported an 11.3% decline in visitors.

White and other supporters argue that not only will the film studios bring jobs and revenue, it will also attract tourists.

"With movie studios, you bring in a whole different type of tourist," White said, likening it to how major sports teams draw visitors. "You don't just bring the person that's come in to go to a resort to gamble."

Stephen Weizenecker, an Atlanta attorney who was involved in Georgia's film tax credit program since its inception in 2008, said Georgia has seen more tourists wanting to visit the scenes where movies like "The Hunger Games" and "Forrest Gump" were filmed.

Dubbed the "Hollywood of the South," metro Atlanta became a ubiquitous backdrop for huge projects, including Marvel films and Netflix's "Stranger Things." Its program has supported thousands of jobs and the creation of several thriving studios. But it is expensive - the state in 2024 was projected to give out \$1.35 billion in credits that year alone.

The state's return is an average of 17 cents in tax revenue for every state dollar spent, according to Carlianne Patrick, an associate professor at Georgia State University who conducts audits of the state's tax credit

programs.

Georgia has seen a large increase in production activity and an increase in jobs, though not all of them are full-time, permanent positions, Patrick said.

Some don't see the payoff in giving tax credits to the film studios. The American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME), a union representing thousands of state workers, joined other Nevada organizations this week in sending a letter to the governor urging him to not include the film tax credit proposal in the upcoming

special session. Republican Gov. Joe Lombardo says he will call law-makers back to the capital before the years ends, but it's not yet clear what issues lawmakers will tackle.

They argue the project is "fiscally irresponsible and politically indefensible" and would only generate \$0.52 in tax revenue for every \$1 in

credit, citing a May 2025 report commissioned by the state.


"Every dollar we lock into a corporate handout is a dollar we can't put toward our rainy-day readiness, public education, health care, wildfire mitigation, housing, and the basic services Nevadans rely on when times

get tight," the organizations wrote in the letter.

Jared Kluesner, a psychiatric nurse at the Southern Nevada Adult Mental Health campus in Las Vegas and member of AFSCME, said the state should prioritize public carries

should prioritize public services for people with mental health issues. Kluesner wants Sony and Warner Bros. to build a film studio facility and create more jobs for Nevadans, but "if they're going to do it at the cost of public services and funds that should be allocated to state workers, then that's not really solving any problems."

A five-hour conversation with a legend

In Miller's 'Mr. Scorsese,' fitting a filmmaking titan into the frame

NEW YORK, Oct 20, (AP): The first time the film-maker Rebecca Miller met Martin Scorsese was on the set of 2002's "Gangs of New York." Miller's husband, Daniel Day-Lewis, was starring in it. There, Miller found an anxious Scorsese on the precipice of the film's enormous fight scene, shot on a sprawling

set.
"He seemed like a young man, hoping that he had chosen the right way to shoot a massive scene," Miller recalls. "I was stunned by how youthful and alive he was."

That remains much the same throughout Miller's expansive and stirring documentary portrait of the endlessly energetic and singularly essential filmmaker. In "Mr. Scorsese," which premiered recently on Apple TV, Miller captures the life and career of Scorsese, whose films have made one of the greatest sustained arguments for the power of cinema.

"We talk about 32 films, which is a lot of films. But there are yet more films," Miller says, referencing Scorsese's projects to come. "It's a life that overspills its own bounds. You think you've got it, and then it's more and more and more."

Scorsese's life has long had a mythic arc: The asthmatic kid from Little Italy who grew up watching old movies on television and went on to make some of the defining New York films. That's a part of "Mr. Scorsese," too, but Miller's film, culled from 20 hours of interviews with Scorsese over five years, is a more intimate, reflective and often funny conversation about the compulsions that drove him and the abiding questions - of morality, faith and filmmaking - that have guided him.

"Who are we? What are we, I should say?" Scorsese says in the opening moments of the series. "Are we intrinsically good or evil?" "This is the struggle," he adds. "I struggle with it all the time."

Miller began interviewing Scorsese during the pandemic. He was then beginning to make "Killers of the Flower Moon." Their first meetings were

outside. Miller first pitched the idea to Scorsese as a multifaceted portrait. Then, she imagined a two-hour documentary. Later, by necessity, it turned into a five-hour series. It still feels too short.

"I explained I wanted to take a cubist approach, with different shafts of light on him from all different perspectives - collaborators, family," Miller says. "Within a very short amount of time, he sort of began talking as if we were doing it. I was a bit confused, thinking, 'Is this a job interview or a planning situation?""

Scorsese's own documentaries have often been some of the most insightful windows into him. In one of his earliest films, "Italianamerican" (1974), he interviewed his parents. His surveys of cinema, including 1995's "A Personal Journey With Martin Scorsese Through American Movies" and 1999's "My Voyage to Italy," have been especially revealing of the inspirations that formed him. Scorsese has never penned a memoir, but these movies come close.

While the bulk of "Mr. Scorsese" are the director's own film-to-film recollections, a wealth of other personalities color in the portrait. That includes collaborators like editor Thelma Schoonmaker, Paul Schrader, Robert De Niro, Leonardo DiCaprio and Day-Lewis. It also includes Scorsese's children, his ex-wives and his old Little Italy pals. One, Salvatore "Sally Gaga" Uricola for the first time is revealed as the model for De Niro's troublemaking, mailbox-

"Cinema consumed him at such an early age and it never left him," DiCaprio says in the film. "There will never be anyone like him again," says Steven Spielberg.

It can be easy to think of Scorsese, perhaps the most revered living filmmaker, as an inevitability, that of course he gets to make the films he wants. But "Mr. Scorsese" is a reminder how often that wasn't the case and how frequently Scorsese found himself on the outside of Hollywood, whether due to box-of-

fice disappointment, a clash of style or the perceived danger in controversial subjects ("Taxi Driver," "The Last Temptation of Christ") he was drawn to.

"He was fighting for every single film," Miller says. "Cutting this whole thing was like riding a bucking bronco. You're up and you're down, you're dead, then alive."

Film executives today, an especially risk-averse lot, could learn some lessons from "Mr. Scorsese" in what a difference they can make for a personal film-maker. As discussed in the film, in the late '70s, producer Irwin Winkler refused to do "Rocky II" with United Artists unless they also made "Raging Bull."

For Miller, whose films include "The Ballad of Jack and Rose" and "Maggie's Plan," being around Scorsese was an education. She found his films began to infect "Mr. Scorsese." The cutting of the documentary took on the style of his film's editing. "In proximity to these film," she says, "you start to breathe the air."

Nearness to Scorsese also inevitably means movie recommendations. Lots of them. One that stood out for Miller was "The Insect Woman," Japanese filmmaker Shōhei Imamura's 1963 drama about three generations of women.

"He's still doing it," Miller says. "He's still sending me movies."
"Mr. Scorsese" recently debuted at the New York

"Mr. Scorsese" recently debuted at the New York Film Festival, where Miller's son, Ronan Day-Lewis made his directorial debut with "Anemone," a film that marked her husband's return from retirement. At the "Mr. Scorsese" premiere, a packed audience at Lincoln Center's Alice Tully Hall came to enthusiastically revel in, and pay tribute to its subject.

"You hear all those people laughing with him or suddenly bursting into applause when they see Thelma Schoonmaker or at the end of the 'Last Waltz' sequence," Miller says. "There was a sense of such palpable enthusiasm and love. My husband said something I thought was very beautiful: It reminded everyone of how much they love him."

'Pure magic ... the soul in the sound'

Bass player Sam Rivers of Limp Bizkit band has died

LOS ANGELES, Oct 20, (AP): Sam Rivers, the bass player in the nu metal band Limp Bizkit, died on Saturday, according to social media posts by his band mates.

The band did not disclose where Rivers died or the circumstances, but praised him as "pure magic" and "the soul in the sound."

"From the first note we ever played together, Sam brought a light and a rhythm that could never be replaced," they wrote in a group Instagram post. "His talent was effortless, his presence unforgettable, his heart enormous."

Fred Durst, the band's front man and lead vocalist, posted a video Sunday morning that recounted

how they met at a club in Jacksonville Beach, Florida, and went on to music stardom and performances around the globe. Durst said he has shed "gallons and gallons of tears since yesterday."

"He really did have an impact on the world and his music and his gift is the one that's going to keep on giving," Durst said. "I just love him so much."


Rivers, 48, had spoken of heavy drinking that had caused liver disease. He left the band in 2015 and received a liver transplant before reuniting with Limp Bizkit three years later.

Limp Bizkit has scheduled a tour of Central and South America to begin in Mexico City in late November Durst said he and Rivers shared a love of grunge music, naming the bands Mother Love Bone, Alice in Chains and Stone Temple Pilots.

"He had this kind of ability to pull this beautiful sadness out of the bass that I'd never heard," Durst said, calling Rivers "so talented I can't explain."

Limp Bizkit, with roots in Jacksonville, Florida, emerged in the late 1990s with a sound that melds altenative rock, heavy metal and rap.

Their off-the-wall sense of humor is reflected in the titles of their mega-selling 2000 album, "Chocolate Starfish and the Hot Dog Flavored Water," and a single released last month, "Making Love to Morgan Wallen."

Singer shares her poetry with the world in new book

Poetry helped R&B singer Jessie Reyez find her voice

LOS ANGELES, Oct 20, (AP): Long before Jessie Reyez was celebrated for her voice, poetry was the Toronto-bred musician's "first love."

The Grammy-nominated and Juno Award winner's music often feels like spoken poetry, backed by a mix of R&B, hip-hop and Latin beats. When music, and the commercial demands of the industry, fail to satiate her creative hunger, Reyez turns to writing and often asks her millions of Instagram followers for poetry prompts.

She compiled some of those poems, previously only available on a 24-hour Instagram story timeline, into a book, "The People's Purge: Words of a Goat Princess Volume II," releasing Tues-

day.
The exercise, which Reyez now does weekly, allows her to create and release almost instantly and felt like scratching "an itch in the middle of my brain that I can't reach," she told The Associated Press

"When you're fortunate enough to find a job in creativity and you're getting paid for your art, it can create this bastardized version of what you're making. Some of the purity is jeopardized," Reyez said. "You really have to be your art's security guard."

Revez has written about "Breadcrumbs" and "Air." Other prompts are specific, like one titled, "Stubbing your

toe on the table when you were having a good day." The prompts are boundless, Reyez said. "It's like having a snapshot of the world's emotional

This year has been a busy one for Reyez, emblematic of the her non-stop creative flow. She has been on tour since early June for her latest album, "Paid in Memories." She began a US book tour this month and will return

to the international leg of her musical tour in November.

She recently spoke about her upcoming book, the freedom that poetry offers and how she protects her creative flow.

Remarks have been edited for clarity and brevity. AP: How does writing poetry differ

Reyez: Writing has always been my

from writing songs?

first love. Poetry has been my love before music. I like the idea of release. I love the idea of freedom. Freedom feels like home for me. Even though I love creating as a musician, when you are creating a song, you have the boundaries of the music around it for the lyrics and for the melody. There's just more rules that you have to abide by. But I feel the most free when I write and I'm not beholden to the fences of the chords of the song that I'm in, or to the melody of the song that I'm in.

AP: Why did you decide to compile the poems into a book?

Reyez: I love the ephemeral nature of them when I'm making it. But, because it is such a community thing, there were people that started to be like, "I wish I was here for it. I wish we can keep it." It became more apparent to me that this is a team thing. I wanted to make sure that people could, you know, hold what they've made in tandem with me.

AP: How did you choose which poems were included?

Reyez: I've become very skilled at objectively critiquing myself. For music, it's a little bit more difficult because the thing is, music can act like makeup sometimes. If you take a great song and you read it, it should be strong enough to be able to sound like a beautiful poem without having any

music. That's kind of what I love when I play with words. It just becomes that much more apparent what is well done versus what is going to hit the cutting room floor.

AP: One of the poems is completely in Spanish and your Colombian heritage shines throughout the book. Did that come naturally?

Reyez: It's not so much something that I have to be cognizant of because it's naturally in me. It is in my blood, it's in my heart, it is in my soul, it's in the way I love. However, as much as Spanish is my first language - it's the language I learned to be human in, it was the language that I learned love in - it's not the language which I studied. The library of words that I can pull from is just a lot larger in English, so by default my output is more in Eng-

AP: Some of the prompts are super specific and others are vague. How did that impact your writing process?

Reyez: There is not one that I like more than the other. I literally just love the entire process because it's challenging in both ways. When it's specific, it's a challenge because you have to dig a little bit deeper to find it. I think everybody has that ability. You just need to learn how to like open the box. dig in, and then you're able to find so many things in common and so many like a different shade of blue, but it's

AP: I really enjoyed how you flipped some of the prompts on their head. For instance, one prompt asked for a poem about "Big butts," and you wrote about buts, as in hesitations in a

relationship. Was that intentional? Reyez: Î do it a lot. That's the method of finding how it relates to you, you know what I mean? "Big Butts" is a good one. I love that you recalled that one as an example. I love the idea of play. I love the idea of challenge. Every now and then, I get one where it feels like the person is almost like, "In what world is she gonna make something with a prompt like that," vou know?

AP: You do this exercise about once a week. I'm sure you've written many more poems. Are there more iterations of this book that might come in the fu-

Reyez: Yeah, maybe. It's really funny, because the day we turned it in, I did the exercise again. The week after the deadline, I did the exercise again. I really had to show some restraint. Shout out to deadlines. Deadlines are the gift of the creative because otherwise this would have been a neverending book. We'll see. If it's meant to

Females find empowerment

More women embrace baldness with style

NEW YORK, Oct 20, (AP): "Being bald is sexy. It's an attitude. It's a luxury. It's a lifestyle.'

That's how Brennan Nevada Johnson, who shaved her head voluntarily 14 years ago, opens the video podcast she launched last November to celebrate the advantages of choosing a bald look.

Sensuous, self-assured and glamorous are not the adjectives typically assigned to women with shorn hair. For centuries, many cultures have viewed long hair as a symbol of femininity, health and fertility. But more women are defying that traditional beauty standard and finding empowerment by baring their

"Once you do it, it brings all this confidence into your life," Johnson, 34, said. "Whenever you see someone who's bald and not wearing a wig, just know that they have fully embraced themselves, and I think that's something that's really challenging to

Her initial decision to go baldheaded was practical. Johnson played competitive volleyball in college and found the sweating she did on the court affected the expensive hair relaxing treatments she often had

Once she started shaving off her hair, though, she was hooked. She was relieved to save money on sa-

Johnson now owns a New York public relations firm. "Bald and Buzzed with Brennan," the video podcast she posts on YouTube, was an attempt to fill a void in social media content that affirmed bald people, especially women. She says she always thought baldness was sexy.

"It's such a fashion statement, and it's a really powerful look," Johnson said.

Other women without hair, whether voluntarily or due to medical conditions, also have sought ways to support each other, attending conferences, joining "baldie" groups and swapping grooming and scalp

"There's a whole community of us out there," said Dash Lopez, a content creator who posts a weekly video series of her shaving routine called "Fresh Cut Friday." "We need to talk about it because we do find comfort and empowerment and beauty in what some

people think is weird." Lopez said members of her family praised the long

curly hair she had growing up. Some of her friends played with different hair colors and styles, but Lopez said she didn't have the same freedom. And she didn't enjoy detangling her hair or spending long afternoons at the salon.

As soon as she turned 18 and could get a haircut without permission, she chopped her locks into a pixie cut. Then she shaved it all off during the COV-ID-19 pandemic.

"It makes me feel powerful in the sense that I'm able to detach from the things that people place so much emphasis on," Lopez, 29, said. "I'm not sitting here planning, 'Oh my gosh, when am I going to get my next color appointment done? That's gonna cost me \$300. Oh my gosh. I've got to get my hair done before I go to this event.'

Lopez signed a contract with a modeling agency in 2020, a time when brands wanted to showcase diversity, she said. Back then, being bald worked for her professionally.

"There was an appreciation for quirks and if you had a gap in your tooth, if you had a bald head, if you had a face full of freckles, that's what casting directors were looking for," Lopez said.

She noticed the tide shifting last year, when her

bookings for modeling jobs decreased. "Let's be honest, the odds were stacked against me in the modeling world," Lopez said. "I was 5'4", 5'5" on paper, no

A client suggested she wear wigs to land more work. Lopez did not want to do that or grow out her hair. Her modeling contract ended. Since then, she has shared glimpses of her life as a bald woman on Instagram and TikTok, where some of her videos have been watched millions of times. "I feel powerful in the sense that I'm making my own choices," Lopez said. "I'm doing it for my own self-empowerment, I am doing it from my own self-clarity, for a deeper understanding of what it is that I value, a deeper understanding of what beauty means to me.'

Many women are confronted with how they define beauty when they lose hair due to health conditions such as alopecia or during chemotherapy treatment

Felicia Flores, a flight attendant who lives in Atlanta, was diagnosed in 2001 with alopecia, an autoimmune disorder that causes hair to fall out. Six years later, all her hair was gone. Initially, she wore wigs.

Then she came across a group called The Baldie Movement on Facebook. "The ladies just really inspired me," Flores, 47, said. "They really did help to encourage me and give me strength, ... and they were iust so confident.

She eventually decided to stop wearing wigs and embrace being bald in 2015, after a romantic breakup. "I was tired of lying. I felt like I was hiding something. I felt like I wasn't myself," she said.

To help uplift and inspire other women, Flores founded an annual conference called Baldie Con.

The fourth one drew drew more than 200 attendees to Atlanta last month for a fashion show, guest speakers, a jazz brunch and a black tie gala, she said.

Aicha Soumaoro, who works in Philadelphia as a nurse on weekdays and as a mechanic on weekends, said some of her patients call her "sir" instead of "ma'am," but she doesn't let it bother her. "It's new to them, girls that are bald." Soumaoro, 27, said that after she shaved her head, her mother told her that most men wouldn't want to marry a woman with no hair. She focuses instead on the compliments she's received while out in public, including "You wear it with confidence" and "Your face is gorgeous."

Louvre to remain closed one day after jewel heist

PARIS, Oct 20, (AP): The Louvre said on Monday it would remain closed a day after historic jewels were stolen from the world's most-visited museum in a daring daylight heist.

The museum's staff asked dozens of visitors who were queuing in front of the glass pyramid entrance to leave the site. In a message posted on social media, the Louvre said visitors who have booked tickets will be refunded. It did not provide additional details.

On Sunday, thieves rode a basket lift up the Louvre 's facade, forced a window, smashed display cases and fled with priceless Napoleonic jewels, officials said. The theft occurred about 30 minutes after the museum opened, with visitors already inside, and was among the highest-profile museum thefts in living memory.

It unfolded just 250 meters (270 yards) from the Mona Lisa, in what Culture Minister Rachida Dati described as a professional, four-minutelong operation.

French Justice Minister Gerald Darmanin acknowledged security fail-

"One can wonder about the fact that, for example, the windows hadn't been secured, about the fact that a basket lift was on a public road," he said on France Inter radio. "Having (previously) been interior minister, I know that we cannot completely secure all places, but what is certain is

Culture Minister Rachida Dati said investigators are working on evidence found at the scene.

'We did find a motorcycle and it has a license plate," Dati said on news broadcaster CNews. "I also want to pay tribute to the security officers who prevented the basket lift from being set on fire. One of the criminals tried to set it on fire, but they forced him to flee. This allowed us to recover

Dati stressed that a decade-long "Louvre New Renaissance" plan that was launched earlier this year includes security improvements.

"When the Louvre Museum was designed, it was not meant to accommodate 10 million visitors," she said.

The plan calls for €700 million (\$760 million), also intended to modernize infrastructure, ease crowding and give the Mona Lisa a dedicated

Around 9:30 a.m. on Sunday, several intruders forced a window, cut panes with a disc cutter and went straight for the glass display cases, officials said. Interior Minister Laurent Nunez said the crew entered from outside using a basket lift via the riverfront facade to reach the hall with the 23-item royal collection.

Their target was the gilded Apollon Gallery, where the Crown Diamonds are displayed. The thieves smashed two display cases and fled on motorbikes, Nunez said. No one was hurt. Alarms brought Louvre agents to the room, forcing the intruders to bolt, but the theft was already done.

Eight objects were taken, according to officials: a sapphire diadem, necklace and single earring from a matching set linked to 19th-century French queens Marie-Amélie and Hortense; an emerald necklace and earrings from the matching set of Empress Marie-Louise, Napoleon Bonaparte's second wife; a reliquary brooch; and Empress Eugénie's diadem and her large corsage-bow brooch, a prized 19th-century imperial ensemble.

Early peanut feeding helped 60,000 kids avoid allergies: study

NEW YORK, Oct 20, (AP): A decade after a landmark study proved that feeding peanut products to young babies could prevent development of life-threatening allergies, new research finds the change has made a big difference in the real world. About 60,000 children have avoided developing peanut allergies after guidance

About 60,000 children have avoided developing peanut allergies after guidance first issued in 2015 upended medical practice by recommending introducing the

allergen to infants starting as early as 4 months.

"That's a remarkable thing, right?" said Dr. David Hill, an allergist and researcher at Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, and author of a study published Monday in the medical journal Pediatrics. Hill and colleagues analyzed electronic health records from dozens of pediatric practices to track diagnoses of food allergies in yours shill deep the during and offer the guideline ways issued.

"I can actually come to you today and say there are less kids with food allergy today than there would have been if we hadn't implemented this public health

effort," he added.

The researchers found that peanut allergies in children ages 0 to 3 declined by more than 27% after guidance for high-risk kids was first issued in 2015 and by more than 40% after the recommendations were expanded in 2017.

more than 40% after the recommendations were expanded in 2017.

The effort hasn't yet reduced an overall increase in food allergies in the U.S. in recent years. About 8% of children are affected, including more than 2% with

a peanut allergy.

Peanut allergy is caused when the body's immune system mistakenly identifies proteins in peanuts as harmful and releases chemicals that trigger allergic symptoms, including hives, respiratory symptoms and, sometimes, life-threatening ana-

For decades, doctors had recommended delaying feeding children peanuts and other foods likely to trigger allergies until age 3. But in 2015, Gideon Lack at King's College London, published the groundbreaking Learning Early About Peanut Allergy, or LEAP, trial.

Lack and colleagues showed that introducing peanut products in infancy reduced the future risk of developing food allergies by more than 80%. Later analy-

sis showed that the protection persisted in about 70% of kids into adolescence.

The study immediately sparked new guidelines urging early introduction of peanuts - but putting them into practice has been slow.

Only about 29% of pediatricians and 65% of allergists reported following the expanded guidance issued in 2017, surveys found.

Confusion and uncertainty about the best way to introduce peanuts early in life led to the lag, according to a commentary that accompanied the study. Early

on, medical experts and parents alike questioned whether the practice could be adopted outside of tightly controlled clinical settings.

The data for the analysis came from a subset of participating practice sites and may not represent the entire U.S. pediatric population, noted the commentary, led by Dr. Ruchi Gupta, a child allergy expert at Northwestern University.

However, the new research offers "promising evidence that early allergen introduction is not only being adopted but may be making a measurable impact," the authors concluded.

Advocates for the 33 million people in the US with food allergies welcomed signs that early introduction of peanut products is catching on.

"This research reinforces what we already know and underscores a meaningful opportunity to reduce the incidence and prevalence of peanut allergy nationwide," said Sung Poblete, chief executive of the nonprofit group Food Allergy Research & Education, or FARE.

The new study emphasizes the current guidance, updated in 2021, which calls for introducing peanuts and other major food allergens between four and six months, without prior screening or testing, Hill said. Parents should consult their pediatricians about any questions.

"It doesn't have to be a lot of the food, but little tastes of peanut butter, milk-based yogurt, soy-based yogurts and tree butters," he said. "These are really good ways to allow the immune system exposure to these allergenic foods in a safe

way."
Tiffany Leon, 36, a Maryland registered dietician and director at FARE, introduced peanuts and other allergens early to her own sons, James, 4, and Cameron,

At first, Leon's own mother was shocked at the advice to feed babies such foods before the age of 3, she said. But Leon explained how the science had changed. "As a dietician, I practice evidence-based recommendations," she said. "So when someone told me, 'This is how it's done now, these are the new guidelines,' I just though, OK, well, this is what we're going to do."

'Whole foods beat supplements'

Antioxidants offer health benefits, but calculating intake can be tricky

When it comes to describing what an antioxidant is, it's all in the name: Antioxidants counter oxidants.

And that's a good thing. Oxidants can damage the structure and function of the chemicals in your body critical to life - like the proteins and lipids within your cells, and your DNA, which stores genetic information. A special class of oxidants, free radicals, are even more reactive and dangerous.

As an assistant professor of nutrition, I've studied the long-standing research showing how the imbalances in antioxidants and oxidants lead to oxidative stress, which is linked to cancer, diabetes, cardiovascular disease and dementia and Alzheimer's disease. In fact, a primary cause of aging is the damage accumulated across of a lifetime of oxidative stress.

Simply put: To help prevent oxidative stress, people need to eat foods with antioxidants and limit their exposure to oxidants, particularly free radicals.

There's no way for any of us to avoid some oxidative stress. Just metabolism - the processes in your body that keep you alive, such as breathing, digestion and maintaining body temperature - are a source of oxidants and free radicals.

Inflammation, pollution and radiation are other sources. As a result, everyone needs antioxidants. There are many different types: enzymes, minerals, vitamins and phytochemicals.

Two types of phytochemicals deserve special mention: carotenoids and flavonoids. Carotenoids are pigments, with the colors yellow, orange and red; they contain the antioxidants beta-carotene, lycopene and lutein. Some flavonoids, called anthocyanins, are pigments that give foods a blue, red or purple color.

Although your body produces some of these antioxidants,

you can get them from the foods you eat, and they're better for you than supplements.

In fact, researchers found that antioxidant supplements did not reduce deaths, and some supplements in excessive amounts contribute to oxidative stress, and may even increase the risk of dying.

It should be pointed out that in most of these studies, only one or two antioxidants were given, and often in amounts far greater than the recommended daily value. One study, for example, gave participants only vitamin A, and at an amount more than 60 times an adult's recommended intake.

In contrast, increased antioxidant intake from whole foods is related to decreased risk of death. And although antioxidant supplementation didn't reduce cancer rates in smokers, the antioxidants in whole foods did.

But measuring antioxidants in foods is complicated. Extensive laboratory testing is required, and too many foods exist to test them all anyway. Even individual food items that are the same exact variety of food - such as two Gala apples - can have different amounts of antioxidants. Where the food was grown and harvested, how it was processed and how it was stored during transportation and while in the supermarket are factors. The variety of the food also matters - the many different types of apples, for instance, can have different amounts of antioxidants.

Nonetheless, in 2018, researchers quantified the antioxidant content of more than 3,100 foods - the first antioxidant database. Each food's antioxidant capacity was determined by the amount of oxidants neutralized by a given amount of food. The researchers measured this capacity in millimoles per 100 grams, or about 4 ounces.

For fruits easily found in the grocery store, the database shows blueberries have the most antioxidants - just over 9 millimoles per 4 ounces. The same serving of pomegranates and blackberries each have about 6.5 millimoles.

For common vegetables, cooked artichoke has 4.54 millimoles per 4 ounces; red kale, 4.09 millimoles; cooked red cabbage, 2.15; and orange bell pepper, 1.94.

Coffee has 2.5 millimoles per 4 ounces; green tea has 1.5; whole walnuts, just over 13; whole pecans, about 9.7; and sunflower seeds, just over 5. Herbs and spices have a lot: clove has 465 millimoles per 4 ounces; rosemary has 67; and thyme, about 64. But keep in mind that those enormous numbers are based on a quarter-pound. Still, just a normal sprinkle packs a powerful nutritional punch.

Other ways to choose antioxidant-rich foods: Read the nutrition facts label and look for antioxidant vitamins and minerals - vitamins A, C, E, D, B2, B3 and B9, and the minerals selenium, zinc and manganese. (AP)

Building with mushrooms

Fungi-based panels in Kenya pave the way for greener construction

NAIROBI, Kenya, Oct 20, (AP): A large mushroom farm near the Kenyan capital of Nairobi is one of a kind: It grows fungi on an industrial scale - not as food for restaurants but as a building material that some Kenyans say could make more people homeowners.

The farm produces mycelium, the root structure of mushrooms that a local company then uses to make building materials it says are more sustainable than regular brick and mortar.

The company, MycoTile, combines the roots with natural fibers and agents to make panels that can be used for everything from roof and wall insulation to interior decor, at a fraction of the cost of building with standard clay bricks. It currently produces about 3,000 square meters (yards) of such materials every month.

Street vendor Jedidah Murugi, whose house was made with fungibased construction materials, said she believes "there is no huge difference in the quality of the houses made from

brick and these boards."
"The only difference." she

"The only difference," she said, is in the cost. Her house, she added, "is not cold at night and neither is it hot during the day."

MycoTile's work could be a boon for Nairobi, where local leaders cite a housing crisis that has left many homeless or living in informal settlements and dwelling enclaves, prone to fires and sanitary issues. Official figures say there is a housing deficit of at least 2 million units in this metropolis of over 5 million people.

Most Kenyans are renters and those who are homeowners build from the ground up over many years instead of hiring contractors. It is common to find people living in badly finished or incomplete homes to avoid paying rent elsewhere.

"Introducing affordable materials like ours taps into an existing huge market and contributes to providing affordable housing solutions," said Mtamu Kililo, MycoTile's founder.

Kililo said his company's insulation products cost roughly two-thirds of the price of standard materials.

Building a one-bedroom unit in Nairobi using materials such as brick, timber and tin sheets typically costs up to 150,000 Kenyan shillings (about \$1,000), for a simple structure, and the figure can double depending on the quality of finishes, according to estimates from builders

FDA approves new lupus treatment

SOUTH SAN FRANCISCO, Calif., Oct 20, (AP): Genentech, a member of the Roche Group, has announced that the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has approved Gazyva® (obinutuzumab) for the treatment of adult patients with active lupus nephritis (LN) who are receiving standard therapy, as well as a shorter 90-minute infusion time after the first infusion, for eligible patients. Following four initial doses in the first year, Gazyva can be administered twice yearly, offering an effective and potentially more convenient treatment option than traditional targeted therapies.

"People with lupus nephritis who achieve a complete renal response are more likely to experience preserved kidney function and delay, or even prevention, of progression to end-stage kidney disease," said Levi Garraway, M.D., Ph.D., chief medical officer and head of Global Product Development. "The approval of Gazyva by the FDA marks an important step towards a potential new standard of care for lupus nephritis, one that could allow clinicians to offer their patients more effective disease control."

"As a severe and potentially life-threatening disease, lupus nephritis greatly disrupts daily life with chronic pain, fatigue, and the constant fear of worsening kidney health," said Louise Vetter, President and Chief Executive Officer, Lupus Foundation of America. "The FDA's approval of Gazyva offers renewed hope for people with lupus nephritis and their loved ones, as it provides an important new treatment

option that has the potential to prevent long-term complications, including kidney failure."

This approval is based on positive results from the Phase II NOBILITY and Phase III REGENCY studies. In REGENCY, data showed that nearly half of the participants (46.4%) on Gazyva in combination with standard therapy achieved a complete renal response (CRR) compared to 33.1% on standard therapy alone.

This was accompanied by clinically meaningful improvements in complement levels and reductions in anti-dsDNA, corticosteroid use, and proteinuria, all signaling improved disease control. The safety profile of Gazyva was consistent with the well-characterized profile observed in its hematology-oncology indications.

New polio case detected in S. Afghanistan

WHO says DRC could declare end of Ebola outbreak by December

KINSHASA, Oct 20, (Xinhua): The World Health Organization (WHO) said Sunday that health authorities could declare the end of the current Ebola outbreak in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) in early December if no new cases are detected before then.

The announcement came in a statement from the WHO Regional Office for Af-

rica after the last Ebola patient was discharged from a treatment center following full recovery, a milestone in the country's battle against the deadly virus.

"This discharge marks the start of a 42-day countdown, after which the outbreak

can be officially declared over, provided that no new cases are identified," the statement said.

Since the outbreak was declared on Sept. 4 in Bulape, a health zone in the

central province of Kasai, a total of 64 cases have been reported, including 53 confirmed and 11 probable. Nineteen patients have recovered, and no new cases have been reported since Sept. 25, according to the WHO.

Mohamed Janabi, WHO regional director for Africa, hailed the progress made

so far. "The recovery of the last patient, only six weeks after the outbreak was declared, is a remarkable achievement. It reflects the strength of partnerships, national expertise, and collective determination to overcome challenges and save lives," he said.

The DRC previously declared the end of its 15th Ebola outbreak in September

2022, which had emerged in the eastern province of North Kivu.

Ebola is a highly contagious hemorrhagic fever that causes a range of symptoms such as fever, vomiting, diarrhea, generalized pain, and malaise, and in many cases, internal and external bleeding, according to the WHO.

Polio: Local authorities have reported the detection of a new case of polio in the southern Afghanistan Uruzgan province, spokesman for the provincial govern-

southern Afghanistan Uruzgan province, spokesman for the provincial government Samiullah Akrama said Monday.

According to the official, the eight-month-old girl was infected with the virus

and cannot move her arm, both legs, and neck.

At least nine polio cases have reportedly been registered in Afghanistan so far this year amid government efforts to eradicate the crippling disease among children in the post-war nation.

Afghanistan and Pakistan are among the few countries in the world that have yet to eradicate the wild poliovirus.

Food poisoning: A total of 49 people have been affected by a food poisoning outbreak in the Republic of Buryatia in Russia's Far East, local health authorities said Sunday.

Regional Health Minister Evgenia Ludupova said 40 people, including 22 children, have been hospitalized. One patient remains in intensive care. Laboratory tests have confirmed 11 cases of salmonellosis, Ludupova said, adding that the outbreak was linked to poor-quality prepared food produced by a local company.

JGR earns 2nd spot in finale

Briscoe's late surge secures Phoenix ticket

TALLADEGA, Ala., Oct 20, (AP): Chase Briscoe gave Joe Gibbs Racing its second spot in NASCAR's championship-deciding season finale with an over-time victory Sunday at Talladega Superspeedway.

Briscoe raced to the first superspeedway victory to join teammate Denny Hamlin as Toyota drivers guaranteed slots in the four-driver winner-take-all finale at Phoenix Raceway in two weeks.

Briscoe was sixth on the restart - a two-lap sprint in overtime to the finish - and Hendrick Motorsports drivers William Byron and Kyle Larson split the front row and lined up side-by-side for the Chevrolet drivers to control the restart.

Byron was getting help from behind from fellow Chevrolet driver Carson Hocevar, a driver for Hen-drick aligned Spire Motorsports. Larson's push was from Toyota driver Bubba Wallace, who did get Wallace into the lead.

But Larson appeared to run out of fuel and dropped dramatically off the pace and Byron, who is in danger of playoff elimination, lost his chance at victory when his push from Hocevar was too strong and it caused Byron to spin.

Briscoe, meanwhile, had no problems with all his

help coming from JGR driver Ty Gibbs, the only one of his teammates not eligible for the championship.

"Ty Gibbs, just incredible teammate there. I mean, I honestly would not have won that race without Ty, Briscoe said. "This is an amazing team effort. I can't believe I won a superspeedway race. I haven't done it at any level."

There are two open spots left in the championship field to be determined next week in the finale of the third round of the playoffs. Larson and JGR driver Christopher Bell are above the elimination line, while Byron, Hendrick teammate Chase Elliott, and Team Penske drivers Joey Logano and Ryan Blaney are below the cutline

Logano and Blaney have combined to win the last three Cup titles for Penske.

The race went to overtime when Chris Buescher was leading with two laps to go and he was spun from behind by Byron, who was shoved into Buescher by Hocevar. Buescher spun across the front of the pack and slammed hard into an inside wall in a one-car crash that sent the race to overtime.

Chasing a winning target of 289, India stumbled from a position of strength to fall just short as it was contained to 284-5 in its 50 overs.

India was on course for victory for much of its innings - Smriti Mandhana top-scored with 88, while skipper Har-

England captain Nat Sciver-Brunt picked up 2-47 and left-arm spinner Linsey Smith bowled a tight spell -1-40 in 10 overs, including the key wicket of Mandhana - to apply the brakes on the home team and help pull off a stunning win.

- following defeats to Australia and South Africa -- and stunned the home crowd at Holkar Stadium.

Leão scores twice as Milan reclaims top spot in Serie A

Como shocks Juventus

ROME, Oct 20, (AP): Rafael Leão must have been inspired by seeing Stefano Pioli back at the San Siro.

The Portugal winger scored twice in his first start of the Serie A season following an injury layoff, and under-strength AC Milan came from a goal down to beat Pioli's Fiorentina 2-1 and move back atop the Italian league Sunday.

Leão was the Serie A player of the season when Milan won the Italian title under Pioli in 2021-22, but hasn't performed anywhere near that level since then.

But with Christian Pulisic, Adrien Rabiot, and Christopher Nkunku all out injured, Milan needed Leão to step up.

After Robin Gosens put Fiorentina ahead from close range shortly before the hour mark, Leão quickly equalized with a long, low shot. Then he stepped up to the penalty spot for the first time in his Milan career and converted from the spot following a foul on Santiago Gimenez.

"This is the Rafa that we need. He is an amazing talent," said Luka Modric, who joined Milan in July after 13 seasons at Real Madrid. "For me, he's one of the best players in the world. And he can still improve."

Milan moved one point ahead of Inter Milan, Napoli, and Roma.

It's been quite a turnaround for Milan under returning coach Massimiliano Allegri after an eighth-place finish last season left the seven-time European champion out of continental competition.

Fiorentina remained winless, piling pressure on Pioli. At this rate, it's only a matter of time before Real Madrid buys back Nico Paz from Como.

The 21-year-old Argentina playmaker scored one goal and set up another as Como beat visiting Juventus

2-0 to hand the Bianconeri their first loss of the season.

Deal worth \$90 million

Durant signs two-year extension with Rockets

HOUSTON, Oct 20 (AP): Kevin Du-Rockets plenty of flexibility for other rant wants to be in Houston for more than one year. And he left more than \$30 million on the bargaining table to make that possible.

Durant has signed a contract extension that could keep the four-time scoring champion and four-time Olympic gold medalist with the Rockets through the 2027-28 season, the team announced Sunday.

It is a two-year extension, the second year at Durant's option, according to a person who spoke to The Associated Press on condition of anonymity because the Rockets did not disclose those details.

ESPN, which first reported the agreement, cited Durant's business partner Rich Kleiman and said the deal could be worth \$90 million. If Durant plays both seasons as planned, that \$90 million would push his on-court earnings to nearly \$600 million - which could be an NBA record, depending on how long LeBron

James continues to play. Durant - a 15-time All-Star, one of only seven players in NBA history with that many selections - was eligible for an extension that could have been worth \$122 million. He opted for less, a move that will provide the deals going forward.

"Generous guy," Rockets forward Amen Thompson told reporters in Houston on Sunday. The new deal had been expected

since Durant chose to join the Rockets and they swung a trade for him this past summer. Houston was the Western Conference's No. 2 seed last season after going 52-30, snapping a fiveyear playoff drought. The Rockets are 93-71 in Ime Udoka's two seasons as coach, after going 59-177 in the three previous seasons.

"I think we all knew when we traded for him and when he came here it wasn't a short-term thing," Udoka said. "Good to get to a point where everybody's happy and hopefully he

finishes his career here." Durant said at Rockets' media day last month that he expected to sign an extension.

"Just seeing the quick progression of this franchise from where it was right after that James Harden-Chris Paul era, seeing when Ime got here and how he turned it around so fast ... it just felt organic and natural coming into the gym and being a Houston Rocket for the first time," Durant said.

KUWAIT CITY, Oct 20: Kuwait Club continued its dominance in the Zain Premier League, defeating Al-Shabab 4-0 in the fifth round to maintain 13 points at the top of the standings. Meanwhile, Al-Arabi kept up the chase, defeating Al-Salmiya 3-1 to stay close to the leader.

The victory marked Kuwait's fourth win of the season, keeping them on track to defend their title for the fifth consecutive season and claim the 21st championship in the club's history.

Al-Arabi achieved a double boost by beating Al-Salmiya 3-1, knocking it down from second place while maintaining a two-point gap behind Kuwait. The "Green" team bounced back after a 0-0 draw with Kazma in the fourth round, recording its

Al-Salmiya, now with 9 points, suffered its second defeat, slipping to fourth place. Similarly, Kazma (9 points) capitalized on Al-Qadsia's struggles, earning a 1-0 victory to rise three places in the standings, keeping its title hopes alive for the first time in 30 years.

Verstappen wins US GPrix, Norris pulls closer to Piastri Asian Youth Games showcase strength

AUSTIN, Texas, Oct 20, (AP): Red Bull's Max Verstappen raced to his third victory in four races Sunday at the Formula 1 United States Grand Prix, while McLaren's Lando Norris took a huge chunk out of teammate Oscar Piastri's championship lead by finishing second.

Piastri was a distant fifth, allowing Norris to pull within 14 points with five grand prix and two sprint races to go.

Verstappen also is closing fast with his late-season charge. Verstappen now trails Piastri by 40 points, and Norris by 26, in third place, and has put the McClarens on notice he intends to chase them all the way to the end of the season.

Piastri and Norris are trying to win their first career drivers championship. Verstappen is hunting his fifth in a row, and his dominant form of late has given him a real chance to get it. He also won the sprint race Saturday after the two McLarens ran into each other on the first turn and crashed out.

"It was an unbelievable week-end for us," Verstappen said. "The chance is there. We just need to try to deliver these kind of weekends until the end."

Norris' late pass of Ferrari's Charles Leclerc for second earned the British driver a crucial position and points as he chases Piastri and hopes to hold off Verstappen over the final stretch of the season.

Verstappen started on the pole Sunday at the Circuit of the Americas and was never challenged for the lead in collecting his 68th career victory, and fourth in five years in Austin. The Dutch driver built a 10-second lead by the halfway point as Norris and Leclerc drove a furious battle for second.
"It was a good battle with

Charles. He fought hard," Norris said. "We'll have to take second. No more we could have done today."
Piastri's day never got going.

The Australian started sixth and quickly made up a spot in the first few corners but was stuck there for the rest of the race. Piastri's lead is rar

ing under pressure. He hasn't won since the Dutch Grand Prix on Aug. 31 and hasn't finished on the podium the last three races.

"I'd still rather be where I am than the other two, but obviously this weekend was not what I want-

Kuwait eyes another win after impressive start at Asian Youth Games

MANAMA, Oct 20: Kuwait handball team will play its second match today at the 3rd Asian Youth Games in Manama, facing Thailand at 6:00 p.m. in the preliminary round of Group B, which also includes China, the UAE, Iran, and Kazakhstan.

The Kuwait aims to maintain its winning momentum after a dominant 42-26 victory over Kazakhstan in the opening match.

The team relies on a group of promising talents such as Abdulatif Saleemin, Omar Madou, Abdulwahab Al-Mutawa, and goalkeeper Mohammad Farhan to continue their strong run in the tournament.

Assistant Secretary of the Kuwait Olympic Committee and delegation director Captain Ali Al-Marri praised the team's impressive start and the players' performance in their opening game.

He noted that today's match represents the next step toward advancing to the knockout stages and competing for a podium finish, commending the players' high spirits and determination to showcase the progress of Kuwaiti handball on the Asian stage.

The 3rd Asian Youth Games, hosted by the Kingdom of Bahrain, will offi-cially open on October 22 and continue until October 31, featuring more than 5,000 athletes from 45 Asian countries competing in 26 sports and 253 events held across 20

Kuwait's delegation includes 75 male and female athletes participating in 14 individual and team sports, including swimming, triathlon, athletics, badminton, table tennis, golf, equestrian (show jumping and endurance), handball, judo, teqball, taekwondo, muay thai, and jiu-jitsu.

Kuwait's teqball player Nasser Al-Saqer advanced to the semifinals of the singles event after defeating Bahrain's representative 2-0. Al-Sager secured his qualification from the group stage with victories over Cambodia and Lebanon (2–0), despite losing his first match 1-2 to Paki-

Kuwait golf team manager Dr. Swaid Al-Abkal confirmed that golfer Salem Al-Abkal began daily training sessions immediately upon arriving in Bahrain, preparing for the competition that kicks off on October 23.

He explained that Salem's preparation included participation in the Gulf Golf Championship, where he clinched the gold medal, and the Arab Championship in Egypt, where he finished as runner-

Masood and Shafique survive dropped catches

Pakistan grinds to 259-5 against scrappy South Africa in 2nd test

RAWALPINDI, Pakistan, Oct 20, (AP): Captain Shan Masood and Abdullah Shafique survived four dropped catches to hit half-centuries as Pakistan ground to 259 for five against world champion South Africa on the opening day of the second and final test on Monday.

Masood, put down on 71, scored the bulk of his runs in singles before falling for 87 off 176 balls in the final session on a dry wicket that is expected to favor the spinners more and more.

Kagiso Rabada should have dismissed Shafique off his fourth ball of the test match, but had to wait for his first wicket until late on the first day when he trapped Mohammad Rizwan (19) plumb lbw on the backfoot.

Left-hander Saud Shakeel was batting on 42 and Salman Ali Agha was not out on 10 at stumps as South Africa could get just one wicket with the second new ball late on Day 1.

Surprisingly, South Africa used its best bowler in the first test -Senuran Muthusamy - for only two brief spells of two overs each. Keshav Maharaj (2-63) and Simon Harmer (2-75) kept the scoring rate under control by sharing 54 overs in between them. Muthusamy had bagged a career-best 11-wicket haul at Lahore on a spin wicket.

Shafique's (57) luck finally ran out after getting dropped on 0, 15, and 41 when he feathered a catch down the legside to wicketkeeper Kyle Verreynne but South Africa had to review the not out on-field decision as ultra edge showed a clear spike when the ball passed Shafique's bat.

South Africa's scrappy fielding allowed Masood and Shafique to add 111 runs for the second wicket stand after spinners created several chances in the first two sessions, but got little support from the fielders.

Maharaj, who missed South Africa's 93-run defeat in the first test last week, had to wait until his 20th over for his first wicket when he dismissed Babar Azam for 16 in the most productive second session for the visitors in which they got two wickets for 82 runs.

Babar, who hasn't scored an international century since his hundred against Nepal in an ODI in August 2023, hit three boundaries against the spinners in his brief 19-minute stay at the wicket before he was caught one-handed by a diving Tony de Zorzi at forward short leg.

Earlier, Shafique had three reprieves after Masood won the all-important toss and Pakistan reached 95-1 at lunch. Shafique was dropped by Tristan Stubbs at third slip off Rabada's fourth ball, before he'd scored. Then Marco Jansen's sharp delivery beat the inside edge of Shafique's bat, but the bails didn't fall after the ball grazed the off stump.

Maharaj could ĥave made an early impact but failed to grab a return catch to his left in his first over after inducing an outside edge off Shafique's bat. And luck continued to go Shafique's way when he was adjudged leg before wicket against Maharaj, but went for a successful television review as replays suggested the ball had hit his bat first.

Amongst all those nervy for Shafique, Masood ments smashed two sixes against Harmer's off-spin and welcomed Muthusamy with another big hit over the long-on boundary before the left-armer was taken out of the at-

It was the first loss in the tournament for Argentina, which was aiming for its seventh title.

Argentina reached the final despite missing its two best players in this age group, Bayer Leverkusen's Claudio Echeverri and Real Madrid's Franco

Mbappé continues fine form as Madrid edges nine-man Getafe to retake lead

MADRID, Oct 20, (AP): Real Madrid took advantage of a red card for a Getafe player who stayed less than a minute on the field to win 1-0 with an 80th-minute goal by Kylian Mbappé.

The hard-fought victory moved Madrid back on top of the Spanish league, two points ahead of Barcelona, which beat last-placed Girona 2-1 with a stoppage-time goal by Ronald Araújo on Saturday. Mbappé's league-leading 10th goal of the season came shortly after host Getafe

went a man down because of a straight red card shown to Allan Nyom about 40 seconds after he came off the bench. Nyom fouled Real Madrid forward Vinícius Júnior away from the ball as Ma-

drid started to build a breakaway in the 77th. Madrid, which had been struggling to create significant scoring chances, took advantage of the sending off, and Mbappé scored with a shot from inside the area after a nice through ball by Arda Güler.

Mbappé has scored in 13 of the 14 games he played this season for club and country. He has scored at least once in 11 straight matches. "We're very pleased with how Kylian is doing," Madrid coach Xabi Alonso

said. "He's been decisive with his goals and his involvement. Goals give you points, but we need everyone because a lot is going on in the background. Getafe went another man down four minutes later when Alex Sancris was shown a second yellow card for another foul on Vinícius.

Despite playing with nine men, Getafe nearly equalized in stoppage time, with Madrid goalkeeper Thibaut Courtois charging from the net to make a difficult close-range save from a shot by Abu Kamara inside the area.

"That missed chance by Kamara was a pity," Getafe coach José Bordalás said. "Nyom's red card made the difference. For me, that's not a red card, at most a yellow."

Bordalás criticized Vinícius, claiming the Brazilian forward provoked him by saying something to the effect of "good job making the substitution" to include Getafe, which had only one attempt on target, stayed in 12th place. It has a five-

game winless streak. Madrid has won 10 of its 11 games in all tournaments this season, with its lone

setback a league loss at Atletico Madrid last month. Just like at the other league matches this weekend, players stood still for the first 15 seconds of the game in opposition to La Liga's plan to hold the Barcelona-Villarreal game in the U.S. on Dec. 20.

Jorge de Frutos scored two first-half goals as Rayo Vallecano won 3-0 at Levante for its third straight win across all competitions.

De Frutos, a former Levante player, scored in the 12th and 25th minutes, and

Álvaro García sealed the victory in the 65th. Rayo was coming off another road win in the league against Real Sociedad, and

it had beaten Shkendija 2-0 at home in the Europa League. Levante has won only one of its last four league matches.

Real Sociedad needed an 89th-minute goal by Carlos Soler to draw 1-1 at 10man Celta Vigo, extending both teams' poor start to the season.

Sociedad, sitting in 18th, has only one win in nine league matches, with five losses and three draws. The Basque Country team's only win was against Mallorca.

Celta, which had defender Carl Starfelt sent off with a second yellow card in first-half stoppage time, opened the scoring with Pablo Durán in the 20th.

In 17th place, Celta remains the only team without a league win after nine rounds. It has seven draws and two losses.

Athletic Bilbao needed a solid performance by Spain goalkeeper Unai Simón to salvage a 0-0 draw at promoted Elche. The result kept seventh-placed Elche tied with eighth-placed Athletic on 14
