Libya flood toll 5,100

Authorities struggle to get in aid

DERNA, Libya, Sept 13, (AP): Search teams combed streets, wrecked buildings and even the sea for bodies in a devastated eastern Libyan city on Wednesday, where authorities said massive flooding had killed at least 5,100

people, with the toll expected to rise further.

Authorities were still struggling to get aid to the Mediterranean coastal city of Derna after Sunday night's deluge washed away most access roads. Aid workers who managed to reach the city described devastation in its center, with thousands still missing and tens of thousands

left homeless. "Bodies are everywhere, inside houses, in the streets, at sea. Wherever you go, you find dead men, women, and children," Emad al-Falah, an aid worker

from Benghazi, said over the phone from Derna. "Entire families were lost." Mediterranean storm Daniel caused deadly flooding in many towns of eastern Libya on Sunday, but the worst-hit was Derna. Two dams outside in the mountains above the city

collapsed, sending floodwaters washing down the Wadi Derna river and through the city center, sweeping away entire city blocks. Waves rose as high as 7 meters (23 feet), Yann Fridez, head of the delegation of the International Committee of the Red Cross in Libya, told broadcaster France24.

Mohammed Derna, a teacher in the city, said he, his family and neighbors rushed to the roof of their apartment building, stunned at the volume of water rushing by. It reached the second story of many buildings, he said. They watched people below, including women and children being washed away.

They were screaming, help, help," he said over the phone from a field hospital in Derna. "It was like a Hollywood horror

S&P sees high profitability for Kuwaiti banks this year

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 13: A report issued by Standard & Poor's (S&P) global credit ratings agency expected that the profitability of Kuwaiti banks will remain high during the current year, indicating that the banking sector is in a good position to benefit from the high interest rate environment in the long term, reports Al-Anba daily.

The report added that the rise in net interest income will be offset to some extent by the move from non-interest deposits to interestbearing deposits and the increase in credit losses. However, financing in the banking sector continues to benefit from a strong domestic deposit base and a net external asset position, and this translates into positive investor sentiment. In terms of lending growth, the agency ex-

pected it to remain weak, as banks' lending books expanded at an annual rate of 3% in the first half of 2023, which is much lower than loan growth of 8% in 2022. S&P expects that higher interest rates will

lead to lower demand from corporate and individual borrowers, which will translate into low single-digit growth in banking sector loans.

Overall, the agency expects the cost of risk to rise and normalize by about 60-70 basis points in 2023 and 2024, from 40 basis points in the first half of 2023 and at the end of 2022. However, high provision margins, pared to 5\% in 2022 But prolonged high interest rates and a slowdown in the oil economy may pose challenges. Qatari banks, unlike their counterparts in the Gulf countries, will continue to face a sharp decline in credit growth, because the country's major infrastructure projects, which are the main driver of credit demand through contractors, have been completed before hosting the 2022 FIFA World Cup.

US House targets Iran over Amini, missiles

BEIRUT: Security guards from the Syrian president's Baath party on Wednesday fired shots at protesters trying to raid its local headquarters in southern Syria, wounding at least three people, activists said.

The incident marked a major escalation in anti-government protests over the past month that have otherwise been calm.

Anti-government protests have rocked the Druze-majority Sweida province over the past month. Hundreds continue to gather in demonstrations that were initially driven by the war-torn country's spiraling economy and skyrocketing inflation but quickly shifted focus to calling for the fall of President Bashar Assad's gov-

ernment. (AP)

HANOI: A fire in a nine-story apartment building in Vietnam's capital killed at least 56 people, including at least four children, and injured at least 37, authorities said Wednesday

The fire started just before midnight Tuesday in a building housing about 150 residents. Firefighters contained the blaze, but the building's location at end of a narrow alley made rescue operations

WASHINGTON, Sept 13, (AP): The U.S. House overwhelmingly approved measures Tuesday targeting Iran for its human rights record and placing restrictions on the country's ability to import or export its expanding arsenal of weapons

The measures would impose a series of sanctions on Iran's supreme leader, president and other individuals as Washington seeks to further punish the Islamic Republic ahead of the one-year anniversary of nationwide protests. The resolutions will now go to the Senate, where it is unclear if the Democratic-controlled chamber will take them up.

The first bill takes aim at Iran's production and exports of missiles and drones by sanctioning individuals involved in the process, while the second imposes sanctions on high-ranking government officials for "human rights abuses and support for terrorism." The third resolution specifically condemns the government's persecution of the Baha'i minority.

The near-unanimous passage of all three represents a renewed condemnation by Congress against Iran's government, which engaged in a brutal crackdown of its citizenry after the September 2022 death of Mahsa Amini

Rep. Jim Banks, R-Ind., the co-sponsor of the second bill, posted on social media that it was past time "to sanction those responsible for Mahsa's murder and the repression of brave Iranian protestors.

Amini had been detained for allegedly wearing her hijab too loosely in violation of strictures demanding women in public wear the Islamic headscarves. The 22-year-old died three days later in police custody. Authorities said she had a heart attack but hadn't been harmed. Her family has disputed that, leading to the public outcry.

The protests that ensued represented one of the largest challenges to Iran's theocracy since the 1979 Islamic Revolution. A security force crackdown that followed saw over 500 people killed and more than 22,000

The unrest only further complicated any attempt by the Biden administration

to restart negotiations between Washington and Tehran - after former President Donald Trump abruptly withdrew U.S. from the Iran nuclear deal in 2018.

And it has remained a point of contention for Republicans in Congress, who have sought to use the power of their majority in the House over the past several months to introduce or pass a series of binding and nonbinding resolutions related to the country's abuse of human rights as well as its nuclear and missile programs.

The passage of the resolutions also comes a day after the Biden administration cleared the way for the release of five American citizens detained in Iran by issuing a blanket waiver for international banks to transfer \$6 billion in frozen Iranian money without fear of U.S. sanctions.

BEIRUT: The U.S. Treasury on Tuesday slapped terrorism sanctions on a family network of seven individuals and businesses in Lebanon and South America accused of financing the militant group Hezbollah, including a Lebanese man who officials say was involved in two deadly attacks in Argentina in the 1990s.

Amer Mohamed Akil Rada was described as "one of the operational members" who carried out the attack on the Argentine-Israelite Mutual Association in Buenos Aires in 1994, which killed 85 people and wounded hundreds. A 1992 attack on the Israeli Embassy in Argentina killed 29 people.

'Today's action underscores the U.S. government's commitment to pursuing Hezbollah operatives and financiers no matter their location," said Brian Nelson, the Treasury's under-secretary for terrorism and financial

intelligence, in a statement. The Iran-backed group is designated a "foreign terrorist organization," and Washington also claims that the group has been involved in drug trafficking in Latin America to generate revenue.

Rada, according to the Treasury, spent over a decade in South America before relocating to Lebanon.

Arab world sends aid supplies

First KRCS plane arrives in Libya

CAIRO, Sept 13, (KUNA): Kuwait's plane arrived in Libya carrying 40 tons of equipment, food, medical supplies, power generators and tents on board, in addition to rescue boats provided by Kuwait Fire Force.

In remarks to KUNA, Libyan Foreign

Minister Dr. Abdul Hadi Al-Hawaij expressed his thanks and appreciation for Kuwait's humanitarian efforts in relieving those afflicted by Storm Daniel, appreciating the immediate response.

The Minister said that the disaster exceeds the available capabilities, calling for concerted humanitarian relief efforts from all parties to help Libya overcome this unprecedented ordeal.

In turn, the head of the KRCS mission, Dr. Musaed Al-Enezi, said that the Kuwaiti Air Force plane landed in Benghazi, northeastern Libya, carrying a shipment of various relief materials commensurate with the basic needs required by such conditions.

The KRCS said in a statement that the plane of Kuwait Air Force took off from Abdullah Al-Mubarak Air Base flying to Libya with 40 tons of equipment, food, medical supplies, power generators and tents on board, in addition to rescue boats provided by Kuwait Fire Force.

The Kuwaiti aid supplies are destined for victims of the ravaging hurricane Daniel that caused floods on large swaths of the Libyan territories, claiming more than 5,000 lives and inflicting wide scale destruction.

KRCS Deputy Chairperson Anwar Al-Hasawi affirmed in remarks to KUNA that the supplies were dispatched in line with instructions by the political leadership to relieve the floods' victims rapidly.

Egypt sends aid: Egypt on Tuesday sent

three military cargo planes, carrying a large quantity of humanitarian aid to the victims of the recent flooding in Libya.

The assistance includes medical supplies, tents, search and rescue equipment and an ambulance, as well as teams of aid workers from the Egyptian Red Crescent to back up the rescue operations in hard-hit area in eastern Libva.

The assistance falls in the frameworks of solidarity with the Libyan people to help alleviate the effects of the recent Storm Daniel, according to a press release from Egypt's Defense Ministry.

AIPU solidarity: The Arab Inter-Parliamentary Union expressed solidarity with Libya after the deadly flooding that ravaged the eastern region of the country.

In a statement on Tuesday, the AIPU appealed for the Arab countries and the international community to joint forces immediately to provide urgent aid to Libya and help alleviate the impacts of this natural disaster.

The AIPU Presidency offered sincere condolences to the Libyan people and government, expressing sympathy with the families of the victims.

Qatar field hospital: A Qatari cargo flight, carrying a field hospital, is arriving at Benina International Airport in Benghazi city, north Libya, on Tuesday night to help alleviate the suffering of Libyans from the flooding caused by Storm Daniel.

The aid flight, the first from Qatar, is donated by Qatar Fund for Development (QFFD), Spokesman of the Qatari Ministry of Foreign Affairs Majed Al-Ansari told

Scant Kuwait interest in BRICS

The BRICS group was established in 2009, with the aim of creating a new bloc independent of the US-led Western bloc. The founding countries were China, India, Russia and Brazil, before South Africa joined them next.

First, there is no real harmony between the BRICS countries. China and India have long had strong competition,

economic problems, and border disputes. Also, what brings these countries together is their dissatisfaction with America's policies, more than common interests, such as their quest to eliminate poverty among their



people, and their technical backwardness from the West, with a complete absence of any comprehensive political outlook, noting that India, South Africa, and Brazil enjoy democracy, while Russia and China are dominated by authoritarianism.

Moreover, what divides them is more than what unites them, which is why every previous statement of these countries' meetings, and after every event and conference, and for nearly 15 years, came diplomatically and is open to various interpretations

Three of the BRICS countries, India, Brazil, and South Africa, enjoy close relations with Western countries in general, and the United States in particular, and they are not prepared to escalate their relations, which are currently fruitful, with hostile positions towards the West, to please Russia and China.

The relationship between India and the United States is very deep, and the volume of trade exchange between them exceeded \$150 billion, according to the latest published data.

America is India's largest trading partner, and the most important market for its exports, and it was not surprising that America strongly supported the new trade line that will depart from it to Europe, passing through the Emirates, Saudi Arabia, Jordan and Israel, and its implementation will constitute an obstacle to any extreme decisions that the other BRICS countries may decide to take against America in the future.

The United States is also the largest supplier of weapons to the Indian army, and has always stood with it in its wars with its arch-neighbor, Pakistan, with

which China has always stood. What makes India's position, within BRICS, biased towards America is the large number of its citizens who work in the United States, estimated at five million, many of whom occupy very important and critical positions, and their presence constitutes a solid wall against any possibility of deterioration of the relationship between the two countries.

Observers also believe that the United States' relationship with Brazil is no less important than its relationship with India, and even exceeds it in some areas, such as the volume of huge American investments in Brazilian industries.

As for the relationship of the American states with South Africa, it is truly special, for reasons that are too numerous to enumerate. It is sufficient that it is the only African country that has received visits from a remarkable number of American presidents.

The two sisterly countries, Saudi Arabia and the Emirates, may end up accepting the invitation to join the BRICS countries, but it is difficult to imagine that they will one day find themselves in the anti-American camp. Egypt, Argentina, Iran, and Ethiopia may become members of the bloc, but they represent a factor of weakness rather than a factor of strength, due to the weakness of their economies and the near weakness of

their political structures. I also do not personally believe that Kuwait has any interest, near or far, in being even semi-party to BRICS. The weakness of this new system, relatively speaking, lies in it, and its fate of becoming a formality is very likely, as its members disagree on most global issues, the

last of which was condemnation. The countries participating in the G20 summit, which President Putin did not dare to attend, due to Russia's aggression against Ukraine and the occupation of parts of it, without the statement of condemnation including Russia's name.

For all these reasons, it is impossible, in the short and medium term, for the BRICS group to become a competitor or equal in strength to the Western countries, led by America, due to the lack of political and economic harmony between them, let alone the other differences, and it cannot one day constitute a military force, and this makes it more fragile. While Western countries have NATO power, which constitutes a significant military force in addition to its financial, economic and political power.

'Provide students all they need on return to school'



Meeting on tender bids

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 13: According to informed sources at the Ministry of Public Works, the neutral technical committee responsible for studying the offers of international companies for road repair tenders held its meeting yesterday to negotiate and receive final price offers from companies competing to win ten tenders for road maintenance. These tenders include maintenance work in all six governorates, with a tender for each governorate, three contracts for the northern, southern, and central regions with a contract for each region, and one contract for the Jaber Bridge.

The sources explained that the committee has finished evaluating the companies' price offers with varying percentages of price increases compared to the estimate for street repair, which the ministry is fully committed to.

The evaluation process was carried out through a careful study, which the committee undertook since its formation, of the offers submitted by seven international companies that were qualified by the Ministry of Public Works to carry out various road maintenance works in the country.

The committee will submit its final report in preparation for awarding the best financial and technical offers in accordance with the conditions set by the ministry for road repair soon. The ministry is scheduled to complete the rest of the award-

ing procedures and sign contracts with the winning companies within the framework of the budget allocated by the Ministry of Finance, which was later agreed upon to implement the tenders once the committee's work is completed.

The ministry had discussed with the State Audit Bureau the plan to contract with international companies and the reasons that prompted it to offer limited tenders in accordance with Article 18 of the Public Tenders Law, which gives the ministry the right to offer limited practices to international companies without the local agent, which were earlier nominated by the embassies of their ministries.

the Durra gas field, Ambassador Jianwei said, "I have not heard any request in this matter from the Kuwaiti, Saudi, or Iranian side. I believe that the countries concerned have the ability and desire to resolve this challenge through negotiation and a political solution. We believe that the countries concerned will find fair and reasonable solutions as always in the end.'

Regarding mediation between Saudi Arabia and Iran, Ambassador Jianwei explained that, "China, based on a request from Iran and Saudi Arabia, played a positive mediating role. This is a positive role for China emanating from China's foreign policy. We will continue to call for peace and development, especially since we consider the Middle East region very important to the world and we support the countries of the region in making decisions according to their independent will. Our mediation is consistent with the desires of the countries of the region and the aspirations of their people for security, stability and development.

Belt and Road

Ambassador Jianwei said, "The Belt and Road Initiative, which was proposed by the Chinese President ten years ago, was very popular with the international community. We will continue to exert efforts to enhance cooperation with all countries that desire development and progress, especially since China has now become the largest trading partner for more than 140 countries. China refuses to politicize economic issues.

The world is going through a difficult phase, especially as we face serious challenges. Cooperation and solidarity among the international community is necessary to face these challenges. China will always remain the peaceful force and partner to advance global development, and the Chinese side is ready with all countries to confront every difficulty or challenge.'

Regarding Chinese companies in Kuwait, Ambassador Jianwei confirmed that more than 60 Chinese companies have entered Kuwait since the end of 1970s, and played a very important role in its infrastructural development. He explained that the companies have the

ability and rich experiences to participate in the country's infrastructure. They are accustomed to the Kuwaiti market and therefore want to enhance cooperation in the field of infrastructure development of roads, bridges, housing, etc.

Five years ago, there were no Chinese cars on the streets in Kuwait, but now Chinese cars can be seen everywhere in the Kuwaiti market. There are 28 Chinese brands in the car market. The Chinese industry is known to be excellent in quality, and Chinese designs and standards are used in Kuwait. This may help accelerate the pace of development in this field.

Public Investment Authority

Regarding the Public Investment Authority's investments in China, Ambassador Jianwei said the opening of the second office in China confirms the Kuwaiti side's inter-

est in Chinese cooperation and economic and banking investment, adding that this cooperation is considered an important part of our relations, and the sovereign Kuwaiti fund has been investing in China for years and has yielded excellent returns, especially after the development of Chinese-Arab and Chinese-Gulf relations.

is the main mission of the ruling Chinese Communist Party and the Chinese government. We are working to enhance cooperation with Arab countries and

The Chinese ambassador stressed that Kuwait is the first Arabian Gulf country to establish diplomatic relations with China, and the first Arab country to take the initiative to sign a memorandum of understanding with China for the joint construction of the Belt and Road Initiative, in addition to being the Arab country that provides China with preferential government loans.

Ambassador Jianwei revealed that China, since 2015, has maintained its position as Kuwait's largest trading partner, adding that in 2022, the total volume of bilateral trade between the two countries reached USD 31.48 billion, an annual increase of 42.3

He stressed that Kuwait is the seventh largest source of crude oil imports to China, as China imported 33.28 million tons of crude oil from it, an annual increase of

10.34 percent. Ambassador Jianwei indicated that the total Chinese direct investments in Kuwait are worth a total of about USD 550 million, making it the second largest source of foreign investment in Kuwait, adding that the Public Investment Authority established its second office abroad in

Parliament panel discusses cross-gender & segregation

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 13: The parliamentary Values Enhancement Committee met with Minister of Education, Higher Education and Scientific Research Adel Al-Mane and the representatives of Kuwait University on Tuesday during which they discussed cross-gender and segregation issues.

Meanwhile, MP Dawoud Ma'arafi forwarded queries to Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Interior Sheikh Talal Khalid Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah about the institution tasked to nationalize jobs in cooperative societies.

He wants to know the number of Kuwaitis who applied for supervisory positions in the cooperatives; reasons for the nationalization of jobs since it was announced in February 2023; number of vacancies; procedures followed in filling up vacancies; number of days that the Fakhruna platform functioned after its launching as per the decision issued by the Public Authority for Manpower (PAM) on July 25, 2023 to receive the applications of citizens looking for jobs in cooperatives through this platform; reasons for closing the platform; and legal basis for authorizing PAM to conduct interviews and exams for the applicants.

MP Abdullah Fehad asked Minister of Commerce and Industry and State Minister for Youth Affairs Muhammad Othman Al-Aiban about the collection of fees for citizens' shipments valued at less than KD100 by the company that signed a contract with Kuwait General Administration for Customs (KGAC). He pointed out this is a violation of KGAC decision number 94/2020, which is based on law number 42/2013.

He requested for a copy of the contract between KGAC and the company, including the tasks of the company and average completion rate. He wants to know the number of complaints filed by citizens against the company, measures that KGAC took to address these complaints, and if the penalties stipulated in

the contract were imposed on the company. MP Hassan Jawhar asked HH the Prime Minister Sheikh Ahmad Nawaf Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah about the regulations stated in the decision of the Council of Ministers to organize coordination among ministries and public institutions as per Article Three of law number 116/1992; and if the Council of Ministers issued a decision on Sept 4, 2023 to put Kuwait Investment Authority (KIA) and Kuwait Authority for Partnership Projects (KAPP) under the Ministry of Finance. If yes, he inquired about changes in the government's strategy that led to such a decision.

Jawhar forwarded queries to Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Salem Abdullah Al- Sabah about the headline of Al-Jarida daily published on Sept 3, 2023: "Britain to Kuwait: Why not ask for your money?" He confirmed that there is money belonging to Kuwait in British banks due to court decisions against some Kuwaiti citizens.

He demanded for copies of all correspondences between British and Kuwaiti authorities, including the amounts that belong to Kuwait; all correspondences between the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Kuwaiti public institutions urging them to collect the money; and all correspondences between the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and other countries regarding the money, if any.

He also asked the minister about the impact of the decision of the Federal Iraqi Court regarding the constitutionality of the Kuwaiti-Iraqi treaty on marine borders and sailing at Abdullah Bay, and if the minister submitted a request to the Council of Ministers to discuss the consequences of the decision as per the decree mandating the council to decide on sovereign issues. If yes, he demanded for a copy of the request, and if no, he wants to know the reasons for not taking this step.

'Alliances vital for urgent development, economic diversification'

"I AM delighted, as many Kuwaitis are, to hear about efforts to strengthen economic and political ties with the Republic of China -- a powerhouse that has not yet fully unveiled its development potential, and undoubtedly holds opportunities we can harness through a thoughtful and balanced approach in our relationship," columnist Asrar Jowhar Hayat wrote for Al-Qabas daily.

'Recent reports informed us that Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Defense, Sheikh Ahmed Al-Fahd, held discussions with the Chinese ambassador to Kuwait to prepare for the upcoming visit of His Highness

the Deputy Amir, Crown Prince Sheikh Mishaal Al-Ahmad, may God protect him, to China. Additionally, there is news of a delegation led by Al-Fahd planning a visit to China to facilitate His Highness's trip.

"This is a promising move that has the potential to advance our economic and developmental goals, provided we strike a balance between our aspirations and what we can offer to China.

"While I believe this step should have been taken earlier, the adage "better late than never" holds true. China is currently embracing the world, which means that agreements with them are more likely to be equitable and mutually beneficial.

"During my stay in Beijing for nearly a month and a half as part of the Chinese International Media Center's program under the auspices of the Chinese Public Diplomatic Association, I have observed numerous strengths that China can share with its partners through various agreements.

"China's remarkable transformation from poverty to one of the world's largest economies is testament to the vast human, intellectual, technological, and other resources it possesses.

"Having spent this time in Beijing, I've witnessed the Chinese people's eagerness, despite their challenges, to engage with the world, foster openness, and build partnerships for the benefit of all parties involved.

"Furthermore, China stands leagues ahead of us in various fields, with technology and artificial intelligence being particularly noteworthy.

"Today, as I witness my country turning its gaze eastward, I am pleased that we are expanding our options for economic alliances. It's heartening to see the government recognizing the importance of forging such alliances, especially with China. I remain optimistic that this step will pave the way for additional initiatives.

"Despite the prosperity we enjoy, we lag behind in terms of development, technology, and economic diversification. While our neighbors have begun reaping the benefits of economic diversification, we still rely on oil sales to cover our expenses.

"Even with our financial resources, which position us strongly at negotiation tables, we must acknowledge our pressing need for alliances that can drive urgent and practical development, promote economic diversification, and usher in a realistic era of digital transformation."

Also:

"The recurring seasonal campaigns from Iraq against Kuwait have raised numerous questions. These campaigns tend to escalate during critical periods for reasons unrelated to Iraq's interests, often driven by electoral motives and opportunistic exploitation. Such actions only strain the already delicate relations between the two nations, calling for rationality and a comprehension of the current situation," columnist Talal Abdul Karim Al

Arab wrote for Al-Jarida daily. "Iraq's involvement in the "Al-Durra" field, a matter where it has no rightful claim, appears as a grave misstep, lacking any logical justification unless it aims to sow confusion and complicate matters, potentially benefit-

"Iraq's strong opposition to Mubarak's port signifies a limited perspective, as this port could significantly benefit Iraq by opening up lucrative investment and trade opportunities, ultimately reducing commercial dependency, which would not align with Iran's interests.

"Regarding the most recent seasonal turmoil concerning the demarcation of maritime borders in Khor Abdullah, it appears to be an ongoing issue in Iraqi politics, driven by electoral or regional considerations. This raises a perplexing question: Why do Iraqis consistently direct their grievances towards Kuwait, their peaceful Arab neighbor that was once unjustly and aggressively attacked? Why don't they similarly challenge their Iranian neighbor, who has committed numerous aggression against them?

"It seems that some parties are intent on destabilizing the region by sowing seeds of discord and disrupting Iraq's relations with Arab nations, particularly Kuwait. The demarcation issue has benefited Iraq at sea and led to the return of land wells dug by Iraqis, not Kuwaitis, on Kuwaiti territory.

"Kuwait possesses sufficient oil reserves, and accusations of oil theft from Iraq can only be attributed to those disconnected from reality. Oil theft typically involves occupying territory, as Iraq did in the past, or engaging in covert drilling at close proximity to the reservoir's location.

"In either case, Kuwait lacks the capability to execute such actions in practice, and if it could, it would not go unnoticed by international observ-

"Iraqi citizens must be vigilant about the deceit of politicians who prioritize interests other than their own nation's. They should recognize that their interests lie with Kuwait and other Arab nations, and they must understand that Iraq's resources and people are abundant.

"Corruption, sectarian quotas, and certain allegiances to Iran have been the root causes of Iraq's destruction. Iraq has become a breeding ground for criminal militias, and it is essential for Iraqi Arabs to realize that Iran, not Kuwait, is responsible for cutting off water and electricity supplies to Iraq. Iran, not Kuwait, diverted the rivers that have historically nourished Iraq's land, taking advantage of the silence of some Iraqi collaborators.

"It is not Kuwait that has depleted the livelihoods of Iraqis or militarily violated their northern and southern territories, nor has it forcefully occupied an Iraqi oil field near the border. We urge Iraqis to focus their efforts on liberating their country from its true enemy rather than directing their grievances at Kuwait, which remains steadfast against any covetous ag-

"The visit of His Highness the Crown Prince Sheikh Mishaal Al-Ahmad to Britain, in response to the invitation of British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak, adds appreciation, love and partnership to the pages of the long history of bilateral relations between the two countries -- over a period of 124

years," columnist Tariq Boursli wrote for Al-Anba daily. "Whoever browses the books of Kuwaiti historians knows the role that Britain has been playing in Kuwait since the 18th century. The relationship between the two countries is distinguished through the first military protection agreement that put Kuwait under the umbrella of the United Kingdom

in 1899. This resulted in the protection of Kuwait after its independence and the export of the first Kuwaiti oil shipment until the adoption of the Constitution and so on. Respect and appreciation prevailed between Kuwait and England, and the relationship between the British and Kuwaitis

"I feel elated whenever I witness the fervent desire to strengthen bilateral relations and security, economic and humanitarian strategies between the two countries. The festive atmosphere and hospitality are manifestations of the depth of high-level relations and friendship between Kuwait and the United Kingdom.

"In fact, the British ambassador issued a statement on this visit, affirming that Kuwait has been the largest investor in Britain since 1953 when the Kuwait Investment Office was established in London. The office is considered the investment womb from which the sovereign and investment funds of Kuwait emerged since the nationalization in 1975. It is worth pointing out that Kuwait and Britain have been cooperating in the fields of cyber and military security since 1991.

'Agreements were signed during this visit, which heralds a wave of Kuwaiti investments in the United Kingdom. In the same manner, we want Britain to be the largest investor in Kuwait. We also want to strengthen cooperation in other fields like culture, arts, literature and civilization.

"As a Kuwaiti citizen, I am happy over the signing of the investment partnership agreement. This is in addition to the memorandum of understanding signed by the Kuwaiti and British foreign ministries on commemorating the 125th anniversary of the Kuwaiti-British partnership in 2024. It makes us optimistic that there will be more progress and prosperity in the coming decades, such that Britain becomes an incubator for huge Kuwaiti

"It has been revealed that an average of three million sick leaves are granted every year in a sparsely populated country like Kuwait, far from epidemics and communicable diseases that are common in countries with forests and swamps," columnist **Sami Al-Nisf** wrote for **Annahar** daily.

The student goes to school reluctantly and it is natural for him to resort to sick leave. The solution is to use advanced curricula that are close to the curricula of foreign schools, where students are rarely absent

This is also the case with the stifling, boring and repellent administrative atmosphere in government work, the absence of a punishment and reward system, the spread of parachute promotions, and the misunderstanding of some managers that their role is not to create a comfortable atmosphere for employees to work and create.

Rather, their role is to dominate and take revenge until they are expelled from the workplaces. Thus, employees resort to sick leaves and early retirement, while the best job for the promising youth is one in which there is no work.

Fairness begins with removing the burdens of the borrowing citizens who are suffering, either through physical coercion that restricts them and almost deprives them of air because there are those who refuse to open the state as a window of hope to relieve them of their suffering. There are about 120,000 people who are either imprisoned due to their inability to repay or are facing civil lawsuits under the flimsy pretext of "preserving rights."

We said in the past and we repeat it today - Loans are a concern that worries about two-thirds of the people in this country. The abuse practiced by creditors towards debtors has reached the heights, and has even become a factor of social demolition.

As for the government, it is well aware that any obstacle that affects the financial cycle and an increase in the number of poor or needy people exacerbate the crises of citizens and negatively affects society.

Your Excellency the Minister, you stated a few days ago that the citizens' pocket will not be touched. This is true in one case, as there is an administration that can make decisions, and those in charge of it know the correct direction of public finances.

Therefore, the solution begins with increasing the salaries of low-income earners, then working on directing subsidies to those in need, and removing them from the wealthy.

In many countries, there are taxes on wealth and companies, after which it is possible to discuss value-added tax and other taxes that serve society and do not flow into the stomachs of whales of money. Otherwise, we are just plowing in the sea.

slicing off a chunk of mountain, killing residents and razing the hamlet to the ground.

Bulldozers, rescue crews and Moroccan first responders work around the clock try-

ing to dig through the wreckage to unearth the eight to ten corpses still underneath. "The mountain was split in half and started falling. Houses were fully destroyed," Ait Ougadir Al Houcine said as rescuers worked on recovering bodies, including his sister's. "Some people lost all their cattle. We have nothing but the clothes we're wearing. Everything is gone."

The scene in Imi N'Tala, which mainly houses herders and famers and where 96 residents perished in Friday's earthquake, mirrors that of dozens of places situated along the treacherous mountain roads south of Marrakech: Men in donated djellabas neatly arrange rugs atop dust and rocks to pray after looking for open space and solid ground. Donkeys bray as they pass by people covering their noses to block the smell of decomposing bodies

of decomposing bodies.

The death and injury counts continue to rise as more remote villages are reached, bodies get dug up and people sent to hospitals. Moroccan authorities reported 2,901 deaths as of Tuesday. The United Nations has estimated that 300,000 people were affected by Friday night's magnitude 6.8 quake.

But things look different than in the hours and days immediately after the temblor.

About 38 miles (62 kilometers) north in Marrakech, King Mohammed VI is visiting a hospital and donating blood. And in Imi N'Tala - as well as in nearby Anougal, Imi N'Isli and Igourdane - aid has finally arrived. White and yellow tents line partially paved roads. Pyramids of water bottles and milk cartons are stacked nearby. Moroccans who've come to the region from the country's larger cities hand clay tagine pots and neatly packed bags full of food aid off of the backs of trucks.

Camera crews from France, Spain and Qatar's Al Jazeera set up as Moroccan emergency responders - along with crews from Qatar, Spain and international NGOs - jack-hammer through rocks to recover a woman's body from under a crumbling house that looks like it could fall at any moment.

She's likely dead because - unlike the buildings that fell in Turkey and Syria's earth-quake earlier this year - the mud bricks used to build homes in Imi N'Tala left little space for air needed to keep people alive, said Patrick Villadry of the French rescue crew, ULIS.

"When we dig, we look for someone alive. From there, we don't ask ourselves questions. If they're alive, great. If they're dead, it's a shame," he said, noting that recovering the dead was important for Moroccan families.

Media plays significant role in promoting importance of food security: KUNA chief

SHARJAH, Sep 13, (KUNA): Director General of Kuwait News Agency (KUNA) Dr. Fatima Al-Salem stressed Wednesday the importance of the role played by news agencies and media in promoting the concept of food security, and to discuss and address all challenges facing it.

Minister Al-Barrak tapped to follow up Mubarak Al-Kabeer Port project

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 12: The Council of Ministers decided during its meeting to assign the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of **Economic Affairs Dr. Saad** Al-Barrak to complete work on the Mubarak Al-**Kabeer Port project.**

According to informed sources, Kuwait is heading towards actual operation of the port in the 2025/2026 fiscal year, that is, after approximately two years.

The project, which is included in the government's work program, will complete the operation of its first phase through global partner-ships. An amount of KD 9 million was included in the budget of the Ministry of Public Works in the current fiscal year to ensure the operation of this phase, especially since the cost of the first phase of the project was KD 544.6 million. From the total amount, KD 487.7 million were spent cumulatively,

Kuwait heading towards actual operation

at a rate of 88 percent, until the end of the 2021/2022 fiscal year, and the remaining amount was KD 66.9

The priority in this project was that the Ministry of Public Works was requested to merge the remaining stages, namely construction of container yards, establishment of the customs and services area, and establishment of administrative buildings and workers' housing, into one package to

shorten time. Regarding operating the port, the

sources revealed that the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Investment has begun coordination with Public Authority for Investment to take appropriate measures towards determining the best ways to operate the port.

General budget

They said the state's general budget will finance the Public Authority for Investment through the relevant expenses section, with a financial appropriation of KD 500 thousand in the current fiscal year, which is dedicated for consultations regarding Mubarak Al-Kabeer Port.

The sources explained that the port has been included in the budget of the Ministry of Public Works since the 2005/2006 fiscal year. It is considered one of the giant projects, which if completed will be a major regional center for trade and shipping. Its implementation plan was divided into three phases with each phase having several packages to be implemented with 24 docks with required capacities.

Kuwait could face economic challenges if it doesn't accelerate renewable energy efforts

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 13: As per a report released by the Global Energy Monitor, the Middle East and North Africa region has witnessed a 50 percent surge in its renewable energy capacity since 2022, and another 50 percent increase is anticipated by 2024, reports Al-Rai daily.

The report highlights that the region requires a capacity twenty times greater than this to replace the current gasbased power generation. These countries in the region are poised to reap substantial benefits from their endeavors to transition to renewable energy.

There are indicators suggesting that this transition could be imminent. Since May 2022, these nations have augmented their operational capabilities in solar and wind energy by 6.9 gigawatts, marking a 57 percent increase. Additionally, with 9 gigawatts of renewable energy currently under construction and slated for completion by the end of 2024, the growth rate continues to rise.

Economic dependence

In terms of economic dependence, the report reveals that Iraq, Kuwait, Libya, Oman, Qatar, and Saudi Arabia derive over a quarter of their GDP from oil and gas extraction. Should the world shift away from fossil fuels, these countries could face significant economic challenges. It's no surprise that many of these nations have not embraced renewable energy to the same extent as their less oil-rich counterparts in the region, such as Morocco

However, Oman is taking steps to transform its economy and serve as an example for other nations in the region. Libya, too, appears to be exploring diversification by considering renewable energy exports to Europe, although their 25GW project is still in

The Office for National Štatistics said the strikes by so-called junior doctors weighed on health sector activity, while the sixth wettest July on record hit retailers after a buoyant June. when business was brisk as a result of warm weather Most economists downplayed the prospect that the British economy would fall into recession as monthly growth figures have been yo-yoing up and down as of late. Still, growth is expected to stay tepid.

James Smith, developed markets economist at ING, said a recession "can't be ruled out" but that the economy "seems to be still growing, albeit fractionally." (AP)

Europe's economic outlook worsens

The European Union has lowered its forecast for economic growth this year and next, saying inflation is taking a heavy toll on people's willingness to spend in shops - while higher interest rates are sharply restricting the credit needed for investment and purchases.

The revised forecast Monday from the European Commission, the EU's executive arm, comes as fears of recession grow and as the European Central Bank faces a key decision this week on whether to keep raising rates, which are aimed at getting inflation under control.

The 20 countries that use the euro currency are expected to see growth of 0.8% this year instead of 1.1% projected in the spring forecast, the commission said. For next year, growth expectations were lowered to 1.3% from 1.6%. (AP)

Ministry organizes panel discussion

Offshore exploration drilling enters new era of exploration ops in Kuwait

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 13, (KUNA): The Kuwaiti Ministry of Oil (MoO) confirmed that the offshore exploration drilling project enters a new and promising era of oil and gas exploration operations in the country, contributing to achieving the Kuwait Petroleum Corporation's 2040 strategy and increasing its production capacity.

The Director of Public Relations and Media at the Ministry Sheikha Tamader Khaled Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah said during a discussion panel organized by the ministry on Wednesday entitled "Offshore Drilling Project," that the project currently being implemented by Kuwait Oil Company (KOC) will broaden horizons for a future that the country looks forward to for further

She pointed out KOC's keenness to ensure that the offshore drilling experience is complete, integrated and safe in all its aspects, underscoring the aim of achieving the maximum benefit.

On his side, Senior Geophysicist at KOC Maitham Ebrahim underlined the importance of the marine exploration project as a national project whose purpose is to contribute to increasing Kuwait's reserves of hydrocarbon re-

The project ensures the continuity of new hydrocarbon resources to meet the needs of the global market and enhances Kuwait's role as one of the reliable producers in the world, Ebrahim said.

The project includes Kuwait among the leading regional players as a prominent marine operator in accordance with international standards and ensures the addition of new technical specializations connected to offshore drilling operations and the creation of new and diverse job opportunities, he added.

Meanwhile, Senior Geologist at KOC Ahmad Al-Otaibi said that the stages of the current marine exploration project focused on implementing a two-dimensional seismic survey, studying the areas surrounding the marine area, conducting geophysical and geological studies to know the details of the earth's layers and their compositions, identifying the best marine drilling sites, and preparing for logistical operations.

The marine area represents approximately one-third of Kuwait's total land area, and the program includes drilling six exploratory wells to explore for oil and gas in the marine areas of Kuwait as a first stage, and based on the drilling results, the subsequent stages will be determined successively, Al-Otaibi

During the marine exploratory project, two jackup rigs were used, and a marine risk assessment was carried out and all obstacles were removed to ensure that the drilling platforms reached the drilling sites and settled safely. Drilling of the first exploratory well began using the Oriental Phoenix rig. The Oriental Dragon drilling rig is expected to begin drilling the second exploratory well soon, he mentioned.

He pointed out the use of the latest methods and means during drilling operations, which protect the surrounding marine area from pollution. The workers also undergo special training for this purpose, he added, indicating that if any accident occurs, it will be dealt with within the emergency response plan prepared in advance for all possible scenarios.

Wall St churns after highly anticipated 'inflation data'

Asian shares slide after tech, rising oil prices drag WS lower

NEW YORK, Sept 13, (AP): Stocks were churning in place on Wall Street Wednesday after a highly anticipated report showed inflation accelerated across the country last month, but not by much more than expected.

The S&P 500 was up 0.3% in afternoon trading after drifting between small gains and losses earlier. The Dow Jones Industrial Average was 58 points higher, or 0.2%, at 34,703, as of 12:36 p.m. Eastern time, and the Nasdaq composite was up 0.5%.

The moves follow a shaky immediate reaction across financial markets to the inflation report, where bond yields and stock prices swung back and forth several times. The report said U.S. consumers paid prices last month that were 3.7% higher than a year earlier, up from July's inflation rate of 3.2%.

That's discouraging for shoppers paying higher prices, but much of the acceleration was because of higher fuel costs, which can swing very sharply and quickly. Ignoring those, underlying inflation trends still look to be pointing toward continued moderation, economists said. Inflation peaked last year above 9%.

The inflation report was so highly anticipated because it will help steer what the Federal Reserve does next on interest rates. The Fed has already hiked its main rate to the highest level in more than two decades, which hurts prices for stocks and other investments, and the hope on Wall Street is that inflation has cooled enough for it to be done.

Wednesday's data likely keeps the Fed on track to keep rates steady at its meeting next week, said Gargi Chaudhuri, head of iShares Investment Strategy, Americas. It could also mean trends continue in such a way that the Fed does not hike

rates any more during this cycle. But she also said expectations among traders on Wall Street for cuts to interest rates next year may be too aggressive. Such cuts can act like steroids for stocks and other investments, but inflation is still above the Fed's target of 2%.

"If anything, higher headline inflation is proof that the Fed will need to keep rates higher for longer and that heavy rate cuts next year are mispriced," Chaudhuri said.

Even though economists are willing to ignore fuel costs when looking at inflation to find the underlying trends, households and companies don't get the same luxury.

Stocks of airlines were struggling after a couple warned of the hit to profits they're taking because of higher costs.

American Airlines cut its forecast for profits during the summer because fuel costs are running higher than it expected. It also had to pay about \$230 million in retroactive pay to pilots after they ratified a new labor contract. Its stock fell 4.2%.

Spirit Airlines said it's also paying higher fuel costs this summer than expected, roughly \$3.06 per gallon instead of the \$2.80 it had earlier forecast. It's also been seeing steep discounting to fares during the last few weeks. That pushed it to cut its forecast for revenue during the third quarter, and its stock fell 2.6%.

Other airlines also sank, including declines of 2.5% for United Airlines, 2.1% for Delta Air Lines and 1.9% for Southwest Airlines.

On the winning end of Wall Street were highgrowth stocks that could be big beneficiaries if the Fed is indeed done hiking interest rates. High rates hurt all kinds of investments, but they often most hurt technology companies and others promising big growth far out in the future.

Amazon climbed 2% and was one of the strongest forces pushing upward on the S&P 500. Microsoft gained 1.1%, and Tesla climbed 1.3%.

Moderna jumped 2.8% after it reported encouraging results from a trial of a flu vaccine.

In the bond market, the yield on the 10-year Treasury fell to 4.25% from 4.27% late Tuesday. It had swung as high as 4.34% immediately after the inflation report.

The two-year Treasury yield, which moves more on expectations for Fed action, slipped to 4.97% from 5.02% late Tuesday. It also briefly leaped and was as high as 5.07% a minute after the inflation report's release.

Europe

Stocks retreated Wednesday in Europe and Asia and oil prices rose ahead of a key report on U.S. inflation that could sway the Federal Reserve's future decisions on interest rates.

Germany's DAX shed 0.5% to 15,636.61 and the CAC 40 in Paris declined 0.5% to 7,213.81. In London, the FTSE 100 edged 0.1% lower, to

Stocks fell Wednesday in Asia after a slide in technology stocks dragged Wall Street lower ahead of a key report on U.S. inflation.

Hong Kong's Hang Seng lost 0.2% to 17,986,56 and the Shanghai Composite index sank 0.8% to

Japan's Nikkei 225 index shed 0.2% to 32,706.52, while the Kospi in Seoul edged 0.1% lower, to 2,533.61. Australia's S&P/ASX 200 gave up 0.7% to 7,154.60.

Shares rose in India and Taiwan but fell in Southeast Asia. Regional markets have been relatively quiet

ahead of this week's release of Chinese and U.S. economic data.

In other trading Wednesday, U.S. benchmark crude was up 21 cents at \$89.05 a barrel in electronic trading on the New York Mercantile Ex-

change. It jumped \$1.55 on Tuesday. Brent crude oil, the international pricing standard, picked up 15 cents to \$92.21 a barrel.

Currencies The U.S. dollar rose to 147.28 Japanese yen from 147.08 yen late Tuesday. The euro slipped to \$1.0739 from \$1.0755.



iPhone 15 models not making any major leaps in tech

New iPhones get faster chips, better cameras and new charging ports

CUPERTINO, Calif., Sept 13, (AP): Apple on Tuesday unveiled its next generation of iPhones - a lineup that will boast better cameras, faster processors, a new charging system and a price hike for the fanciest model.

The showcase at Apple's headquarters in Cupertino, California, comes as the company tries to reverse a mild slump that has seen its sales drop from last year in three consecutive quarters. The malaise is a key reason Apple's stock price has dipped by about 10% since mid-July, dropping the company's market value below the \$3 trillion threshold it reached for the first time earlier this summer.

Investors apparently weren't impressed with what Apple rolled out Tuesday. The company's shares fell nearly 2% Tuesday, a steeper decline than the major market indexes.

As has been case with Apple and other smartphone makers, the four types of iPhone 15 models aren't making any major leaps in technology. But Apple added enough new bells and whistles to the top-of-the line model -the iPhone 15 Pro Max - to boost its starting price by \$100, or 9%, from last year's version to \$1,200. As part of the higher base price, the cheapest iPhone 15 Pro Max will provide 256 megabytes of storage, up from 128 megabytes for the least expensive version of the iPhone 14 Pro Max.

Apple is holding the line on prices for rest of the lineup, with the basic iPhone 15 selling for \$800, the iPhone 15 Plus for \$900 and the iPhone 15 Pro

Although maintaining those prices are bound to squeeze Apple's profit margins and put further pressure on the company's stock price, Investing.com analyst Thomas Monteiro believes it's a prudent move with still-high inflation and spiking interest rates pinching household budgets. "The reality was that Apple found itself in a challenging position leading up to this event,"

And the price hike for the iPhone 15 Pro Max could help Apple boost sales if consumers continue to gravitate toward the company's premium models. Wedbush Securities analyst Dan Ives expects the iPhone 15 Pro and Pro Max to account for about 75% of the device's total sales in the upcoming year.

Preorders

All the new models will be available in stores Sept. 22, with preorders beginning this Friday

One of the biggest changes that Apple announced is a new way to charge the iPhone 15 models and future generations. The company is switching to the USB-C standard that is already widely used on many devices, including its Mac computers and many of its iPads.

Apple is being forced to phase out the Lightning port cables it rolled out in 2012 because of a mandate that European regulators plan to impose in

Although consumers often don't like change, the transition to USB-C ports may not be that inconvenient. That's because the standard is already widely used on a range of computers, smartphones and other devices people already own. The shift to USB-C may even be a popular move since that standard typically charges devices more quickly and also offers faster data transfer speeds.

iPhone 12 emits too much radiation: French agency

PARIS, Sept 13, (AP): A government watchdog agency in France has ordered Apple to withdraw the iPhone 12 from the French market, saying it emits levels of electromagnetic radiation that are too high.

The National Frequency Agency, which oversees radio-electric frequencies as well as public exposure to electromagnetic radiation, called on Apple in a statement Tuesday to "implement all available means to rapidly fix this malfunction" for phones already being used.

Corrective updates to the iPhone 12 will be monitored by the agency, and if they don't work, "Apple will have to recall" phones that have already been sold, according to the

French regulator's statement.

Apple disputed the findings and said the device complies with all regulations governing radiation.

Twitter privacy probe

WASHINGTON, Sept 13, (AP): The US government its data privacy and security practices is "meritless" and owner Elon Musk should not be immune to testifying about the company since he has "first-hand knowledge" of the conduct being investigated.

This includes decisions he made since acquiring the company - including mass layoffs, hasty product launches and an overall "chaotic environment" - that could be in violation of a government order limiting its privacy and security practices.

The company now called X Corp. had filed a motion in July for a protective order that would prevent Musk from having to testify about the company - and for relief from its 2022 consent order with the Federal Trade Commission. In a Monday filing on behalf of the FTC, the US Department of Justice said that in seeking to end the FTC's order, X merely "complains the FTC asked too many questions after Elon Musk acquired the company.

But the FTC was asking questions, according to the filing, because of "sudden, radical changes at the company" after Musk took over. Within weeks, half of Twitter's employees were terminated or resigned, "including key executives in privacy, data security, and compliance roles.'

Outages

There were also "alarming site outages, product malfunctions, and issues with data access controls, the filing says - so the FTC had "every reason to seek information" about whether the company was still complying with the order.

The FTC has been watching the company for years since Twitter agreed to a 2011 consent order alleging serious data security lapses. But the agency's concerns spiked with the tumult that followed Elon Musk's Oct.

27 takeover of the company.

In March it was disclosed that the FTC was investigating Musk's mass layoffs at Twitter and trying to obtain his internal communications as part of ongoing oversight of the social media company's privacy and cybersecurity practices, according to documents described in a congressional report.

Twitter paid a \$150 million penalty in May 2022, about five months before Musk's takeover, for violating the 2011 consent order. An updated version established new procedures requiring the company to implement an enhanced privacy-protection program as well as beef up information security. The company's July filing seeks relief from the consent order, saying that the FTC's investigation has "spiraled out

Information

But the government's filing Monday said the FTC was requesting information because it wanted to see if the company was properly protecting user data during its transformation from Twitter into X under Musk's rule. The FTC heard from five former X employees during its investigation, who "revealed a chaotic environment at the company that raised serious questions about whether and how Musk and other leaders were ensuring X Corp.'s compliance" with the consent or-

For instance, Twitter's former director of security engineering, Andrew Sayler, testified that he had "ongoing questions about Elon's commitment to the overall security and privacy of the organization" because "the manner in which Elon was requesting us to grant access to third parties that had not undergone our regular vetting process struck Sayler as "having some degree of disregard for the overall sensitivity and security at that level of access," according to the filing.

'Musk shouldn't be In closed forum, technology titans to give senators advice on 'artificial intelligence'

WASHINGTON, Sept 13, (AP): Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer has been talking for months about accomplishing a potentially impossible task: Passing bipartisan legislation within the next year that both encourages the rapid development of artificial intelligence and also mitigates its biggest risks. On Wednesday, he is convening a meeting of some of the country's most prominent technology executives, among others, to ask them how Congress should do it.

The closed-door forum on Capitol Hill will include almost two dozen tech leaders and advocates, and some of the industry's biggest names: Meta's Mark Zuckerberg and Elon Musk, the CEO of X and Tesla, as well as former Microsoft CEO Bill Gates. All 100 senators are invited, but the public is not.

Schumer, D-N.Y., who is leading the forum with Republican Sen. Mike Rounds of South Dakota, won't necessarily take the tech executives' advice as he works with Republicans and fellow Democrats to try and ensure some oversight of the burgeoning sector. But he's hoping that they will give senators some realistic direction as he tries to do what Congress hasn't done for many years - pass meaningful regulation of the tech industry.

"It's going to be a fascinating group because they have different points of view," Schumer said in an interview with The Associated Press ahead of the forum. "Hopefully we can weave it into a little bit of some broad consensus.'

Rounds, who spoke to AP with Schumer on Tuesday, said Congress needs to get ahead of fast-moving AI by making sure it continues to develop "on the positive side" while also taking care of potential issues surrounding data transparency and privacy.

Challenge

"AI is not going away, and it can do some really good things or it can be a real challenge," Rounds said.

Schumer says regulation of artificial intelligence will be "one of the most difficult issues we can ever take on," and ticks off the reasons why: It's technically complicated, it keeps changing and it "has such a wide, broad effect across the whole world," he said. Congress has a lackluster track record

when it comes to regulating technology. Lawmakers have lots of proposals - many of them bipartisan - but have mostly failed to agree on major legislation to regulate the industry as powerful tech companies have resisted. Many lawmakers point to the failure to

pass any legislation surrounding social media - bills have stalled in both chambers that would better protect children, regulate activity around elections and mandate stricter privacy standards, among other measures.
"We don't want to do what we did with so-

cial media, which is let the techies figure it out, and we'll fix it later," says Senate Intelligence Committee Chairman Mark Warner, D-Va., on the AI push.

Google pays more than \$10bn a year to maintain its dominance, says US

WASHINGTON, Sept 13, (AP): Google has exploited its dominance of the internet search market to lock out competitors and smother innovation, the Department of Justice said Tuesday at the opening of the biggest US antitrust trial in a quarter century.

"This case is about the future of the internet and whether Google's search engine will ever face meaningful competition," said Kenneth Dintzer, the Justice Department's lead litiga-

Over the next 10 weeks, federal lawyers and state attorneys general will try to prove Google rigged the market in its favor by locking in its search engine as the default choice in a plethora of places and devices. US District Judge Amit Mehta likely won't issue a ruling until early next year. If he decides Google broke the law, another trial will decide what steps should be taken to rein in the Mountain

View, California-based company Top executives at Google and its corporate parent Alphabet Inc., as well as those from other powerful technology companies are expected to testify. Among them is likely to be Alphabet CEO Sundar Pichai, who succeeded Google co-founder Larry Page four years ago. Court documents also suggest that Eddy Cue, a high ranking Apple executive, might be called to the stand.

The Justice Department filed its antitrust lawsuit against Google nearly three years ago during the Trump administration, alleging that the company has used its internet search dominance to gain an unfair advantage against competitors. Government lawyers say Google protects its franchise through a form of payola, shelling out billions of dollars annually to be the default search engine on the iPhone and on web browsers such as Apple's Safari and Mozilla's Firefox.

"Google pays more than \$10 billion per year for these privileged positions," Dintzer

Contracts

"Google's contracts ensure that rivals cannot match the search quality ad monetization, especially on phones," he said. "Through this feedback loop, this wheel has been turning for more than 12 years. It always turns to Google's advantage.'

Google counters that it faces a wide range of competition despite commanding about 90% of the internet search market. Its rivals, the company argues, range from search engines such as Microsoft's Bing to websites like Amazon and Yelp, where consumers can post questions about what to buy or where to go. "There are lots of way users access the web other than default search engines, and people use them all the time," said attorney John Schmidtlein, a partner at the law firm Williams & Connolly which is representing Google.

But the more searches Google processes, the more data it collects, data that can be used to improve future searches and give it an even bigger advantage over its rivals, Dintzer said. "User data is the oxygen for a search engine," he said. Because of its market dominance, "Google search and ad products are better than its rivals can hope to be."

That is why, he said, Google pays so much for its search engine to be the default option on products from Apple and other companies. Google "began weaponizing defaults"

more than 15 years ago, Dintzer said, citing an internal Google document calling its arrangements an "Achilles Heel" for rival search engines offered by Yahoo and MSN.

He also alleged that Google strong-armed Apple into giving its search engine a default position on its devices as a condition for revenue sharing. "This is not a negotiation," Dintzer said. "This is Google saying: Take it or leave it.'

Litigators argue the company's anticompetitive tactics prevented Apple from developing a search engine of its own.

And Dintzer said Google deleted documents to keep them out of court proceedings and sought to hide others under attorney-cli-

ent privilege. 'They destroyed documents for years," Dintzer said. "They turned history off, your honor, so they could rewrite it in this court.'

coming 2024 presidential race.

On the more positive side, Rounds says he

would like to see the empowerment of new medical technologies that could save lives and allow medical professionals to access more data. That topic is "very personal to me," Rounds says, after his wife died of cancer two years ago.

Many members of Congress agree that legislation will probably be needed in response to the quick escalation of artificial intelligence tools in government, business and daily life. But there is little consensus on what that should be, or what might be needed. There is also some division - some members worry more about overregulation, and others worry more about the potential risks of an unchecked industry.

"I am involved in this process in large measure to ensure that we act, but we don't act more boldly or over-broadly than the circumstances require," says Sen. Young, one of the members of Schumer's working group.

Todd Young of Indiana - is hoping that the rapid growth of artificial intelligence will create more urgency. Sparked by the release of ChatGPT less than a year ago, businesses across many sectors have been clamoring to apply new generative AI tools that can compose human-like passages of text, program computer code and create novel images, audio and video. The hype over such tools has accelerated worries over its potential societal harms and prompted calls for more transparency in how the data behind the new products is collected and used.

"You have to have some government involvement for guardrails," Schumer said. "If there are no guardrails, who knows what could happen.'

Schumer says Wednesday's forum will focus on big ideas like whether the government should be involved at all, and what questions Congress should be asking. Each participant will have three minutes to speak on a topic of their choosing, and Schumer and Rounds will moderate open discussions among the group in the morning and afternoon.

Some of Schumer's most influential guests, including Musk and Sam Altman, CEO of ChatGPT-maker OpenAI, have signaled more dire concerns evoking popular science fiction about the possibility of humanity losing control to advanced AI systems if the right safeguards are not in place. But for many lawmakers and the people

they represent, AI's effects on employment and navigating a flood of AI-generated misinformation are more immediate effects. A recent report from the market research

group Forrester projected that generative AI technology could replace 2.4 million jobs in the US by 2030, many of them white-collar roles not affected by previous waves of automation. This year alone the number of lost jobs could total 90,000, the report said, though far more jobs will be reshaped than eliminated.

AI experts have also warned of the growing potential of AI-generated online disinformation to influence elections, including the up-

The CDC's broad recommendation comes one day after the Food and Drug Administration approved Moderna's and Pfizer's updated mRNA vaccines that target a previously dominant variant of the omicron family called XBB.1.5. The updated shots will be available to the public within days.

The Conversation asked Prakash Nagarkatti and Mitzi Nagarkatti, a husband and wife team of immunologists from the University of South Carolina, to weigh in on how the new vaccines might stand up against the latest COV-ID-19 variants that are swirling across the globe

Formulated

When the first vaccine against CO-VID-19 was rolled out in December 2020, it was designed as a monovalent vaccine, meaning that it was formulated against only the original SARS-CoV-2 virus. That vaccine, as well as the updated ones, target the spike protein, which the virus uses to infect our cells and cause the disease.

That design made sense before the virus began mutating into a complex family tree of variants and sublineages. But as the virus structure shifted over time, the antibodies produced in response to the original vaccine became less effective against the new variants.

This necessitated the development in 2022 of new "bivalent" vaccines that targeted both the original strain of SARS-CoV-2 and new viral variants such as the omicron BA.4 and BA.5 lineages that were dominant in mid-2022.

But, not surprisingly, new variants

of the virus continued to emerge.
In June 2023, the FDA asked vaccine developers to formulate new fall shots to target the then-dominant XBB.1.5 subvariant.

The FDA approved that monovalent mRNA-based vaccine based on the overall efficacy data presented by the vaccine manufacturers

Unfortunately, XBB.1.5 is no longer the dominant strain in the U.S.; it has been displaced by other variants from the XBB lineage, thereby raising concerns about the potential efficacy of the new shot. As of mid-September. the dominant variants nationwide are EG.5, also known as Eris, followed by FL.1.5.1 - called Fornax - and XBB.1.16.6.

Meanwhile, a new highly mutated omicron offshoot, BA.2.86, nicknamed Pirola, is making its way across the globe - albeit so far in small num-

The CDC recommended that everyone ages 6 months old and up should get an updated COVID-19 vaccine so that they can be better protected against developing serious outcomes from COVID-19, including hospitalization. The agency noted that people who received the 2022-2023 bivalent COVID-19 shot "saw greater protection against illness and hospitalization

the newly formulated vaccine at no

cost, according to the CDC. The FDA approved a single shot of the updated vaccine for anyone ages 5 and older - regardless of whether they were previously vaccinated or not. The agency also approved unvaccinated individuals 6 months to 4 years of age to receive three doses of the updated Pfizer vaccine or two doses of the updated Moderna vaccine.

Based on its current assessment, the CDC indicates that the BA.2.86 variant may be able to cause infection even in people who have been previously vaccinated or those who have had CO-VID-19 infection in the past. But the CDC says it still expects the updated fall 2023 booster shot to be effective at reducing severe disease and hospitalization.

Moderna reported in August 2023 that the new monovalent mRNA CO-VID-19 vaccine gave a "significant boost" in antibodies that are protective against two of the currently circulating variants: EG.5 - which is responsible for most cases in the U.S. as of mid-September - and FL.1.5.1. Then, in early September, Moderna announced that its most recent data from human trials showed an 8.7-fold increase in neutralizing antibodies against the newest variant, BA.2.86, following vaccination with the updated shot.

Similarly, new pre-clinical data from Pfizer shows that its version of the new mRNA vaccine produced antibodies that were effective at neutralizing the XBB.1.5, BA.2.86 and EG.5.1

This early research suggests that the new mRNA vaccines - although developed specifically against XBB.1.5 - are still effective against some of the most

Response

Novavax, which specializes in traditional protein-based vaccines, also announced in August that its updated COVID-19 vaccine directed against the XBB variant produced a broad neutralizing antibody response against key variants in animal studies. However, the company does not yet have data on its vaccine's performance against two other key variants, FL.1.5.1 and BA.2.86. The Novavax vaccine has not yet gone up for FDA review, but its approval is also expected within months

It is important to keep in mind that while all three vaccines have been shown to trigger antibodies that can neutralize most of the currently circulating variants, it is unclear whether the vaccines will be able to effectively prevent COVID-19 infection in humans. Such clinical studies are time-consuming, so given the urgency and speed needed to develop vaccines against the ever-changing COVID-19 variants, vaccine manufacturers rely on antibody levels as an indicator of protection.

Antibodies produced after a COV-ID-19 infection or vaccination last for about six months, and then their levels start declining. This is called "waning immunity.

About a year after getting a COV-ID-19 infection or vaccination, only a small fraction of antibodies can be detected. This is why health care providers recommend getting another shot if a year has passed since you were vaccinated or had an active infection.

It has become very clear that vaccines against COVID-19 do not provide 100% protection against catching a new COVID-19 infection, but they can make illness from the infection 'Enable more equitable care'

'Elon Musk' offers revealing but not surprising portrait of tech mogul

NEW YORK, Sept 13, (AP): For those who have been paying attention to Elon Musk for at least the past couple years, Walter Isaacson's biography of the tech billionaire doesn't feel that surprising.

Isaacson's biography "Elon Musk" does a good job hammering home the portrayal of the SpaceX founder and now owner of X formerly Twitter — as a visionary but mercurial figure who's given to mood swings and self-destructive behavior.

It's a familiar descriptor for Musk's fans and detractors, but Isaacson's biography still offers plenty of revealing details about the tech mogul.

In the opening pages of the book on Musk's childhood, he's described as someone "not hardwired to have empathy," a characteristic that comes into play throughout his work endeavors and personal life. What Isaacson doesn't conclude is whether those characteristics are propelling Musk's success or undoing it.

The Musk biography is a fitting addition to Isaacson's works chronicling the lives of major figures in science and technology, including Albert Einstein, Leonardo da Vinci, Jennifer Doudna and Steve Jobs. As with those books, Isaacson deftly handles complicated matters

like the development of electric vehicles, rockets and artificial intelligence while also deeply exploring Musk's background and family. By shadowing the billionaire over two years and through interviews with Musk's family and colleagues, Isaacson is also able to show how Musk's risk-taking may work well in designing electric cars and rock-

ets but hasn't fit well with running a social media platform. Isaacson provides insight into how badly Musk misjudged his ability to run Twitter and the consequences of his missteps. He also offers his own theories on why the billionaire wanted to take over the social

The book has already made headlines, including Isaacson walking back his initial reporting in the book on Musk not allowing Ukraine to use Starlink internet services to launch a surprise attack on Russian forces in Crimea. Isaacson's book initially reported that Musk secretly told his engineers to turn off coverage within 100 kilometers of the Crimean coast as Ukraine was launching the attack. Isaacson has since posted on X the coverage hadn't been activated over Crimea.

The book has also gained attention for previously undisclosed details about Musk's family life. The news generated by Isaacson's book underscores just how much Musk's legacy remains in flux and the difficulty any biographer faces in assessing it.

But the most fascinating parts are early on, as Isaacson delves into Musk's upbringing, particularly his father. Musk's father is portrayed in the book as a conspiracy-minded, verbally abusive Jekyll-and-Hyde figure. Musk's fear that, as his mother puts it, "he might become his father," is identified early on as a specter and possibly a driver of his success.

NEW YORK: Drew Barrymore has been dropped as host of the upcoming National Book Awards ceremony, a day after her talk show taped its first episode since the Hollywood writers strike began.

'The National Book Awards is an evening dedicated to celebrating the power of literature, and the incomparable contributions of writers to our culture," the National Book Foundation, which presents the award, said in a statement Tuesday. "In light of the announcement that 'The Drew Barrymore Show' will resume production, the National Book Foundation has rescinded Ms. Barrymore's invitation to host the 74th National Book Awards Ceremony.

The awards event, sometimes referred to as the Academy Awards of the publishing world, is scheduled for Nov. 15.

Barrymore's resumption of her CBS talk show doesn't inherently cause issues with the actors guild, which is also on strike, as daytime talk shows are governed by a different Screen Actors Guild-American Federation of Radio and Television Artists contract that was renewed and ratified last year. But Barrymore's show employs at least three writers who are members of the writers guild, which has been on strike since early May. Those writers were picketing outside the CBS Broadcast Building on Monday.

"The only people I know for sure that are not going back are us three WGA writers. And the rest, I can't really speak for," Chelsea White, one of the show's writers, said on the picket line. "I think first and foremost, this is obviously way bigger than just 'The Drew Barrymore Show' and writers. We are out here standing with our union and feeling great and excited always to stand with our union.'

Barrymore drew criticism from members of both guilds for crossing the picket line, and from Colson Whitehead, Alexander Chee and other authors who questioned whether she should remain as host of the National Book Awards.

The fourth season of the talk show is slated to start airing Sept. 18. A representative for Barrymore did not immediately respond to a request

his release pending the outcome of the appeal. A ruling is expected to take several weeks.

Among a long list of arguments in Smollett's 76-page written appeal is that his 2021 trial violated his Fifth Amendment protections against double jeopardy - being punished for the same crime twice.

Hernández biopic charms and inspires Unlikely astronaut soars in 'Million Miles'

LOS ANGELES, Sept 13, (AP): If ever there was an inspirational story about reaching for the stars, it's "A Million Miles," the real-life journey of a how a boy who grew up as a migrant farmworker became a NASA astronaut.

It starts in the corn fields of Michoacan, Mexico, as José Hernández looks up into the sky in wonder, and it ends two hours later with him 200 miles above the Earth in the International Space Station.

"Tell me something," his cousin tells him. "Who better than a migrant? Somebody who knows what it's like to dive into the unknown. Who better than that?"

Biopics with outsized heroes can lay it on thick, but "A Million Miles" manages to keep its hero's feet firmly on earth before his space shot, largely thanks to star Michael Peña as Hernández and Rosa Salazar as his wife. They keep their characters' humanity even as the soundtrack and visuals blast off. He may be an astronaut, but someone still needs to take out the trash.

Screenwriters Bettina Gilois, Hernán Jiménez and Alejandra Márquez Abella - who base their story on Hernández's memoir - tell a linear story of a gifted young man who is helped along the way by a teacher, his parents and his extended family. He is rejected so many times from NASA that he keeps all their letters

Everyone sacrifices for Hernández to eventually become a mission specialist: His parents stop moving from field to field and lose their home, his wife delays her dreams of opening a restaurant and Hernández himself misses the birth of a child and spends endless hours away preparing. As an engineer, he is mistaken for a janitor at his first day at Lawrence Livermore National Laboratory

"A Million Miles" is wisely more about one man's obsession and nicely touches on topics like racism, assimilation, deferred dreams, family guilt and dedication. "Tenacity is a superpower," he is told and that's a pretty great lesson amid all these superhero flicks.

In many ways, the movie is an outsized twin to another biopic this year - "Flamin' Hot," the story of how a struggling but tenacious Mexican American janitor came up with the hit snack Flamin' Hot Chee-

tos. "A Million Miles" even has a scene with a bowl

of Doritos. Alejandra Márquez Abella directs with assurance and there are some truly elegant touches, like when a box of paperwork dissolves to become a box of field crops or when the camera captures Hernández as a boy in the family car and then seamlessly shows him all

grown up in a car following. But the director also threatens to lay it on thick, like adding the image of a Monarch butterfly floating in the space shuttle - a symbol from the film's first frames but one that feels labored by the time zero-gravity has been reached. We've already had a shot of farmworkers gazing up in their field as his shuttle streaks heaven-ward.

Sacrifices

Better are the scenes in which Hernández tries to make himself typical NASA material, like trading in his Impala for something more suburban, eating sandwiches at work - not enchiladas - and giving up blasting Mexican music for Rick Astley. "I think you're trying to forget who you are," he is told.

There is a scene later with no dialogue that soars because we've watched Hernández persist for so long: Seeing him drive through the NASA headquarters front gate with a Los Tigres del Norte song blaring from his truck and a smile on his lips.

Peña almost underplays his hero - a smart move and nicely done - but Salazar threatens to steal the film completely as a strong, loving, stressed-out mother and wife. "We grew up watching our people make sacrifices. It's on us now," she says.

Toward the end, he shows up at her restaurant in one of those coveted blue astronaut coveralls for the first time after being chosen to fly to space and is promptly sent to the kitchen. They are a dishwasher down, after all, and he needs to put in a shift, NASA or not. That perfectly captures this sweet, loving and worthwhile

portrait of a family's grit. "A Million Miles Away," an Amazon Prime Video release, is rated PG for "thematic elements and language." Running time: 120 minutes. Three stars out of



NEW YORK, Sept 13, (AP): Taylor Swift took home the top prize at the 2023 MTV Video Music Awards for her "Anti-Hero" music video on a night full of surprises.

"This is unbelievable. The fact that this is a fan-voted award means so much to me," Swift said in her acceptance speech. "I can't believe it was a year ago that I announced the 'Midnights' album."

The show, held at the Prudential Center in Newark, New Jersey, was Swift's from nearly the beginning. The night's first presenters were none other than NSYNC, who reunited to hand the best pop video award to Swift.

In coordinating suits, Justin Timberlake, Joey Fatone, Lance Bass, Chris Kirkpatrick and JC Chasez shared the stage with Swift. Bass handed her a friendship bracelet, just as fans do at the superstar's shows. "You're pop personified," she told the group.

The night's top nominee later returned to the stage to pick up the song of the year trophy for "Anti-Hero" and also the best direction award.

Swift took home nine of the 11 awards she was up for, including artist of the year in a category made up entirely

of women nominees for the first time in VMA history. Her "Karma (Remix)" collaborator, Ice Spice, won best new artist. "Oh my God, this is so cool," she said. "I just want to thank my munchkins.'

New music was abundant throughout the show. Host Nicki Minaj performed her latest single, the dreamy "Last Time I Saw You" before jumping into a brand-new tease of a fiery new trap cut from her highly-anticipated "Pink Friday 2" album.

"I ain't nothing like you," she raps, "I'm on a whole other level.'

As much as Swift dominated, the VMAs centered on music's global power. K-pop boy band Tomorrow X Together and Brazilian superstar Anitta premiered their new collaboration, the glossy retro-pop of "Back for More."

Another K-pop group, Stray Kids, brought "S-Class" to the stage, regional Mexicana star Peso Pluma performed "Lady Gaga" and reggaetonera Karol G delivered "Oki Doki" and "Tá OK (remix),"

Comedian Tiffany Haddish presented the award for "Best Afrobeats" in the category's inaugural year, given to Rema and Selena Gomez for their massive hit "Calm Down."

"Africa in the house!" Rema started his acceptance speech. "Shout out to Fela (Kuti) who started Afrobeats in the first place...and I want to give a big shout out to the

next generation of Afrobeats." Gomez stood a few feet from the microphone but jumped in when Rema asked her to, telling the crowd: "I want to send all of my love to Nigeria, thank you.'

Colombian icon Shakira received the Video Vanguard Award and performed an incredible bilingual medley of her decades of hits - "She Wolf," her collaboration with Rauw Alejandro "Te Felicito," the viral, record-breaking "Shakira: Bzrp Music Sessions, Vol. 53" with Bizarrap among them - in a set introduced by her "Hips Don't Lie" collaborator Wyclef Jean.

"MTV, thank you for being such a big part of my career

since I was only 18 years old," Shakira said, also thanking her parents and her children, who she brought to the show.

'This is for you my people, my Latin American people, inside and outside this country," she said, switching to Spanish. "Thank you for inspiring me and for injecting me with so much strength and so much desire to move forward, I love you so much."

She also took home the award for best collaboration for "TQG," her song with Karol G. The duo gave their acceptance speech entirely in Spanish. "If collaborating with the legendary Shakira had been impressive, having an award with her is something from another planet," Karol G ex-

Diddy received the Global Icon Award from Mary J. Blige and his daughter Chance Combs. He is third recipient of the award, following the Red Hot Chili Peppers in 2022 and the Foo Fighters in 2021.

Collection

The legendary rapper also performed at the VMAs for the first time since 2005. It was an incredible collection of some of his biggest hits like "Bad Boy for Life" and "Mo Money Mo Problems," joined by some of his greatest collaborators: Yung Miami, Keyshia Cole, and sweetest of

all, his son, King Combs. "Love wins, y'all, love wins," he started his speech. "I started out as a paper boy, I didn't know I was going to be

here." He then led the audience with a chant of "bad boy." "This is for 30 years," he continued. "I pray to God that you get to do what you love for 30 years.

Lil Wayne opened the show with a performance of his new single "Kat Food." Immediately afterward, Olivia Rodrigo brought her "Vampire" music video set to the stage, before launching into her cheeky pop-punk single "Get Him Back!"

Between the two tracks, snippets of her sold singles played aloud - at the same moment, she was rushed from the staged in a pre-planned "malfunction," further mirroring the "Vampire" video and symbolizing a move from her first record to her second. The live sets were many: Cardi B and Megan Thee Stal-

lion brought "Bongos" to life with big choreography; Demi Lovato played a rock 'n' roll medley of her biggest hits: "Heart Attack," into "Sorry Not Sorry," "Cool for the Summer" before the best K-pop award was given to Stray Kids.

Later, Anitta would win the "best Latin" award for the second year in a row, delivering one of the more endearing acceptance speeches of the night - "I wanna thank myself," she laughed. "Because I work so hard!"

French Montana used his position as best R&B presenter alongside Ashanti to draw attention to Morocco earthquake relief, spotlighting a relief fund that he said he would personally donate to. Montana grew up in Morocco.

Near the end of the show, the MTV Video Music Awards celebrated 50 years of hip-hop with a star-studded finale performance. Grandmaster Flash and the Furious Five started with "The Message," which led to Doug E. Fresh and Slick Rick's "The Show." Nicki Minaj, Lil Wayne, LL Cool J and DMC of Run-DMC closed it out - an energetic celebration of a multigenerational culture.


Popular decongestant ineffective: FDA panel

WASHINGTON, Sept 13, (AP): The leading decongestant used by millions of Americans looking for relief from a stuffy nose is no better than a dummy pill, according to government experts who reviewed the latest research on the long-questioned drug ingredient.

Advisers to the Food and Drug Administration voted unanimously on Tuesday against the effectiveness of the key drug found in popular versions of Sudafed, Dayquil and other medications stocked on store shelves.

"Modern studies, when well conducted, are not showing any improvement in congestion with phenylephrine," said Dr. Mark Dykewicz, an allergy specialist at the Saint Louis Uni-

versity School of Medicine. The FDA assembled its outside advisers to take another look at phenylephrine, which became the main drug in over-the-counter decongestants when medicines with an older



ingredient - pseudoephedrine - were moved behind pharmacy counters. A 2006 law had forced the move because

sometimes labeled "PE" on packaging - make up the rest. If the FDA follows through on the panel's recommendations, Johnson & Johnson, Bayer and other drugmakers could be required to pull their oral medications containing phenylephrine from store shelves. That would likely force consumers to switch to the behind-the-counter pseudoephedrine products or to phenylephrine-based nasal sprays and drops.

In that scenario, the FDA would have to work with drugstores, pharmacists and other health providers to educate consumers about the remaining options for treating congestion, panelists said Tuesday. The group also told the FDA that studying phenylephrine at

higher doses was not an option because it can push blood pressure to potentially dangerous levels.

"I think there's a safety issue there," said Dr. Paul Pisaric of Archwell Health in Oklahoma. "I think this is a done deal as far as I'm concerned. It doesn't work.'

This week's two-day meeting was prompted by University of Florida researchers who petitioned the FDA to remove most phenylephrine products based on recent studies showing they failed to outperform placebo pills in patients with cold and allergy congestion. The same researchers also challenged the drug's effectiveness in 2007, but the FDA allowed the products to remain on the market pending additional research.

That was also the recommendation of FDA's outside experts at the time, who met for a similar meeting on the drug in 2007. This time, the 16 members of the FDA panel unanimously agreed that current evidence doesn't show a benefit for the

drug.
"I feel this drug in this oral dose should have been removed from the market a long time ago," said Jennifer Schwartzott, the patient representative on the panel. "Patients require and deserve medications that treat their symptoms safely and effectively and I don't believe that this medication does that."

The advisers essentially backed the conclusions of an FDA scientific review published ahead of this week's meeting, which found numerous flaws in the 1960s and 1970s studies that supported phenylephrine's original approval. The studies were "extremely small" and used statistical and research techniques no longer accepted by the agency, regulators said.

"The bottom line is that none of the original studies stand up to modern standards of study design or conduct," said Dr. Peter Starke, the agency's lead medical reviewer.

Additionally, three larger, rigorously conducted studies ublished since 2016 showed no difference between phenylephrine medications and placebos for relieving congestion. Those studies were conducted by Merck and Johnson & Johnson and enrolled hundreds of patients.

A trade group representing nonprescription drugmakers, the Consumer Healthcare Products Association, argued that the new studies had limitations and that consumers should continue to have "easy access" to phenylephrine.

Like many other over-the-counter ingredients, phenylephrine was essentially grandfathered into approval during a sweeping FDA review begun in 1972. It has been sold in various forms for more than 75 years, predating the agency's own regulations on drug effectiveness.

"Any time a product has been on the market that long, it's human nature to make assumptions about what we think we know about the product," said Dr. Theresa Michele, who leads the FDA's office of nonprescription drugs.

But FDA reviewers said their latest assessment reflects new testing insights into how quickly phenylephrine is metabolized when taken by mouth, leaving only trace levels that reach nasal passages to relieve congestion. The drug appears more effective when applied directly to the nose, in sprays or drops, and those products are not under review.

There's unlikely to be any immediate impact from Tuesday's panel vote, which is not binding.

The group's negative opinion opens the door for the FDA to pull phenylephrine from a federal list of decongestants deemed effective for over-the-counter pills and liquids. The FDA said removing the products would eliminate "unnecessary costs and delay in care of taking a drug that has no benefit."

If approved, the bills go to Democratic Gov. Gavin Newsom, who will have until Oct. 14 to decide whether to sign them into law, veto them or let them become law without his sig-

The state Legislature almost never overrides a veto from the governor, no matter what political party is in charge.

Lawmakers on Tuesday voted to become the first state to ban four chemicals from processed food and drinks sold in California by 2027.

The chemicals - red dye no. 3, potassium bromate, brominated vegetable oil and propyl paraben - are still used in popular products like Peeps, the popular marshmallow chicks most associated with Easter.

Democratic Assemblymember Jesse Gabriel, the author of the bill, said those chemicals have already been banned by the European Union and other countries because of scientific research linking them to health problems, including cancer.

An earlier version of the bill would also have banned titanium dioxide, which is used in Skittles. But amendments in the state Senate removed that chemical from the ban.

The state Assembly approved a bill requiring companies making more than \$500 million annually to disclose what financial risks climate change poses to their businesses and how they plan to address those risks.

State Sen. Henry Stern, a Democrat from Los Angeles who introduced the legislation, said the information would be useful for individuals and lawmakers when making public and private investment decisions. The bill was changed recently to require companies to begin reporting the information in 2026, instead of 2024, and mandate that they report every other year, instead of annually.

The changes would help make it more feasible for businesses to follow through with reporting requirements, said Anne DiGrazia, a spokesperson for Stern.

The bill was among the biggest climate proposals in the state Legislature this year, collecting support from major companies including IKEA and Microsoft, as well as former California Air Resources Board Chair Mary D. Nichols.

Astronaut Rubio breaks US record: NASA astronaut Frank Rubio now holds

the record for the longest US spaceflight. Rubio surpassed the US space endurance record of 355 days on Monday at the International Space Station. He arrived at the outpost last September with two Russians for a routine six months. But their stay was doubled after their Soyuz capsule developed a coolant leak while parked at the space station.

The trio will return to Earth on Sept 27 in a replacement capsule that was sent up empty for the ride home. By then, Rubio will have spent 371 days in space, more than two weeks longer than Mark Vande Hei, the previous US record holder for a single spaceflight, Russia holds the world record of 437 days, set in the mid-1990s.

"Your dedication is truly out of this world, Frank!" NASA chief Bill Nelson said via X, formerly known as Twitter.

from Kazakhstan on Friday. (AP)

Couple rescues baby shark: A Connecticut couple's scuba diving trip in Rhode Island on Monday turned into a mission to

rescue a baby shark.

Deb and Steve Dauphinais, of Glastonbury, Connecticut, were diving on the sand flats off Jamestown, Rhode Island, when Deb Dauphinais spotted the 16-inch (41-centimeter) juvenile shark with its head stuck inside a work glove at the bottom of about 35 feet (10 meters) of water.

Deb Dauphinais, a dive instructor, said she thought the shark was dead, but when it twitched she motioned for her husband to come over and help.

"He came over and did his own little double-take," she said.

She said her husband tugged on the glove, which seemed to be suctioned to the shark's head, but it eventually popped free. Deb Dauphinais said they were not afraid

of being attacked by what appeared to be a juvenile Dogfish shark, but were cautious, in case it snapped at them. "It kind of looked at both of us, didn't look at all injured, got its equilibrium back

and then swam off back to where it is sup-

posed to be," she said. Deb Dauphinais, who has been an instructor for about 30 years, said this is not the first time she has rescued a marine animal in distress. A few years ago, she freed a black sea bass that had been hooked on a

discarded fishing line, she said. "There are countless stories of underwater sea creatures being killed by underwater sea trash," she said. "It's an ongoing issue that's near and dear to my heart. But these are the only times I've been able to save something, at least a shark, like that." (AP)

Special mosquitoes to fight dengue

TEGUCIGALPA, Honduras, Sept 13, (AP): For decades, preventing dengue fever in Honduras has meant teaching people to fear mosquitoes and avoid their bites. Now, Hondurans are being educated about a potentially more effective way to control the disease and it goes against everything they've learned

Which explains why a dozen people cheered last month as Tegucigalpa resident Hector Enriquez held a glass jar filled with mosquitoes above his head, and then freed the buzzing insects into the air. Enriquez, a 52-year-old mason, had volunteered to help publicize a plan to suppress dengue by releasing millions of special mosquitoes in the Honduran capital.

The mosquitoes Enriquez unleashed in his El Manchen neighborhood - an area rife with dengue - were bred by scientists to carry bacteria called Wolbachia that interrupt transmission of the disease. When these mosquitoes reproduce, they pass the bacteria to their offspring, reducing future outbreaks.

This emerging strategy for battling dengue was pioneered over the last decade by the nonprofit World Mosquito Program, and it is being tested in more than a dozen countries. With more than half the world's population at risk of contracting dengue, the World Health Organization is paying close attention to the mosquito releases in Honduras, and elsewhere, and it is poised to promote the strategy glob-

Infectious

In Honduras, where 10,000 people are known to be sickened by dengue each year, Doctors Without Borders is partnering with the mosquito program over the next six months to release close to 9 million mosquitoes carrying the Wolbachia bacteria.

"There is a desperate need for new approaches," said Scott O'Neill,

founder of the mosquito program. Scientists have made great strides in recent decades in reducing the threat of infectious diseases, including mosquito-borne viruses like malaria. But dengue is the exception: Its rate of in-

fection keeps going up. Models estimate that around 400 million people across some 130 countries are infected each year with dengue. Mortality rates from dengue are low - an estimated 40,000 people die each year from it - but outbreaks can overwhelm health systems and force many people to miss work or

"When you come down with a case of dengue fever, it's often akin to getting the worst case of influenza you can imagine," said Conor McMeniman, a mosquito researcher at Johns Hopkins University. It's commonly known as "breakbone fever" for a reason, McMeniman said.

Traditional methods of preventing mosquito-borne illnesses haven't been nearly as effective against dengue.

The Aedes aegypti mosquitoes that most commonly spread dengue have been resistant to insecticides, which have fleeting results even in the bestcase scenario. And because dengue virus comes in four different forms, it is harder to control through vaccines.

Aedes aegypti mosquitoes are also a challenging foe because they are most

India braces to contain Nipah virus as 2 deaths, 4 infections confirmed in Kerala

NEW DELHI, Sept 13, (KUNA): Indian health authorities on Wednesday braced to contain the spread of Nipah virus as two deaths and four infections were confirmed from Southern Indian state of Kerala.

Kerala Health Minister Veena George said that the test of samples confirmed that two people form Calicut district died after been infected by the deadly virus while Four others were infected.

A high level team of officials were send to Kerala to help the health workers carry out the necessary

precautionary measures. According to local media reports around 350 people have come into contact with the affected and 50 of them are said to be in high risk cat-

August followed by another case in September prompting Health authorities to imposed restrictions on movement of people and shut down schools in the affected areas.

Velayudhan and other experts from the WHO plan to publish a recommendation as early as this month to promote further testing of the Wolbachia strategy in other parts of the world.

The Wolbachia strategy has been decades in the making. The bacteria exist naturally in about 60% of insect species, just not in the

Aedes aegypti mosquito. "We worked for years on this,"

said O'Neill, 61, who with help from his students in Australia eventually figured out how to transfer the bacteria from fruit flies into Aedes aegypti mosquito embryos by using microscopic glass needles.

Infected

Around 40 years ago, scientists aimed to use Wolbachia in a different way: to drive down mosquito populations. Because male mosquitoes carrying the bacteria only produce offspring with females that also have it, scientists would release infected male mosquitoes into the wild to breed with uninfected females, whose eggs would

But along the way, O'Neill's team made a surprising discovery: Mosquitoes carrying Wolbachia didn't spread dengue - or other related diseases, including yellow fever, Zika and chikun-

And since infected females pass Wolbachia to their offspring, they will eventually "replace" a local mosquito population with one that carries the virus-blocking bacteria. The replacement strategy has re-

quired a major shift in thinking about

mosquito control, said Oliver Brady, an epidemiologist at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medi-

"Everything in the past has been about killing mosquitoes, or at the very least, preventing mosquitoes from biting humans," Brady said.

Since O'Neill's lab first tested the replacement strategy in Australia in 2011, the World Mosquito Program has run trials affecting 11 million people across 14 countries, including Brazil, Mexico, Colombia, Fiji and Vietnam.

Strategy

The results are promising. In 2019, a large-scale field trial in Indonesia showed a 76% drop in reported dengue cases after Wolbachia-infected mosquitoes were released.

Still, questions remain about whether the replacement strategy will be effective - and cost effective on a global scale, O'Neill said. The three-year Tegucigalpa trial will cost \$900,000, or roughly \$10 per person that Doctors Without Borders expects it to protect.

Scientists aren't yet sure how Wolbachia actually blocks viral transmission. And it isn't clear whether the bacteria will work equally well against all strains of the virus, or if some strains might become resistant over time, said Bobby Reiner, a mosquito researcher at the University of Washington.

"It's certainly not a one-and-done fix, forever guaranteed," Reiner said.

Many of the world's mosquitoes infected with Wolbachia were hatched in a warehouse in Medellín, Colombia, where the World Mosquito Program runs a factory that breeds 30 million of them per week.

The factory imports dried mosquito eggs from different parts of the world to ensure the specially bred mosquitoes it eventually releases will have similar qualities to local populations, including resistance to insecticides, said Edgard Boquín, one of the Honduras project leaders working for Doctors Without Borders.

After claiming 5-40 with his left-arm spin to help bowl out India for 213, Wellalage kept Sri Lanka in the game with an unbeaten 42 before he ran out of partners and Sri Lanka got dismissed for 172 in 41.3 overs.

"The pitch got slightly better towards the end so we had to hold our nerve and bowl consistently," Indian skipper Rohit Sharma said.

The defeat broke Sri Lanka's 13-match winning streak and it must now beat Pakistan in its last Super 4 game on Thursday to qualify for the Sunday's final. Pakistan also has two points like Sri Lanka after both beat Bangladesh in the Super 4 stage, but lost to India

But the introduction of Wellalage in the 11th over saw Indian top order struggling to read the left-arm spinner as the ball started to grip on the wicket. Wellalage clean bowled Gill off his first ball that turned enough as Gill tried to defend.

Kohli, who scored his fourth successive ODI hundred at the R. Premadasa Stadium on Monday, fell cheaply to Wellalage and Sharma got beaten with a straight delivery that skidded through the Indian skipper and hit the stumps.

K.L. Rahul (39) and Ishan Kishan (33) shared a half-century stand before Rahul gave a tame return catch to Wellalage. With the wicket started favoring spinners, Sri Lanka skipper Dasun Shanka brought on his parttime offspinner Charith Assalanka and Wellalage plucked a brilliant two-handed catch over his head at mid-wicket which got Kishan dismissed.

Wellalage rounded his spell when he had Hardik Pandya caught behind off his final delivery as Assalanka got through the tail. Axar Patel (26), who replaced Shardul Thakur in the playing XI, added a valuable 27 for the last wicket with Mohammed Siraj before the left-hander holed out at long off in the final over as Sri Lanka bowled out the opposition for its 14th successive ODI.

'Investigation did not uncover serious corruption'

PARIS, Sept 13, (AP): France's top financial prosecutor said Wednesday that investigations into the organization of the 2024 Paris Olympics have not revealed any serious corruption or influence peddling, and that his goal is not to disrupt the event.

Speaking in an interview with RTL radio, Jean-Francois Bohnert said the potential infractions currently investigated by the the financial prosecutor's office are "mainly formal."

"It's about favoritism, of illegal interest-taking," he said.

"It's about the way certain contracts have been distributed, the arrangements ... But I don't see any elements, at least not at this stage, that would lead the investigation towards the most serious cases of corruption or influence peddling."

French police searched the Paris Olympic organizing committee headquarters in June as part of corruption investigations into contracts linked to the event.

The search and other related raids were linked to two preliminary investigations of the Paris Olympics. One probe was opened in 2017 - the year Paris was picked by the International Olympic Committee as the 2024 host - and the other began last year.

Asked whether arrests could take place during the Olympics, Bonhert said the office wants to "ensure the smooth running of what is going to be a global event" and a "universal party."

"It's not up to us to come and disrupt that order," he added. "And that's why we started early enough. The searches that took place were carried out more than a year before the start of the Games."

The probe, opened in 2017, is looking into suspected embezzlement of public funds and favoritism, and concerns about an unspecified contract reached by Paris organizers, the prosecutor's office said in June.

The 2022 investigation followed an audit by the French Anti-Corruption Agency. The prosecutor's office said that case targets suspected conflict of interest and favoritism involving several contracts reached by the organizing committee and Solideo, the public body in charge of Olympic infrastructure.

Argentina, Brazil stay unbeaten in World Cup qualifiers

LA PAZ, Bolivia, Sept 13, (AP): Argentina expected a struggle in the altitude of La Paz. The World Cup champion's climb appeared even steeper with Lionel Messi out

of the lineup. Argentina still beat Bolivia 3-0 on Tuesday in its second match of the qualifying campaign for the

2026 World Cup. It's now two for two in qualifiers for coach Lionel Scaloni's team, which was led by veteran Ángel Di María and a strong midfield.

Brazil joined Argentina on six points atop the South American standings after a last-minute 1-0 win at Peru.

Uruguay had a chance to join the leaders but lost 2-1 at Ecuador.

The Ecuadorians now have moved back to zero; they started the tournament at -3 after having three points deducted by FIFA for the falsification of birth information of defender Byron Castillo, who is of Colombian origin.

The next World Cup in the United States, Mexico and Canada is expanding to a 48-team format, meaning direct entry to the top six teams in South America. The seventh-place team will contest an intercontinental playoff for

Colombia is in third place on four points after a 0-0 draw with Chile on Tuesday. Uruguay and Venezuela each have three points, followed by Paraguay, Peru and Chile with one point each.

The next games in South American World Cup qualifying will be played in October.

Argentina defined the match in the first half with two goals, kept its pace in the second half and added a third near the final whistle. A red card for Bolivia's Roberto Fernández in the 39th minute also made it less troublesome for the Argentin-

Enzo Fernández opened the scoring in the 31st from close range after a low cross by Di María from the right. The veteran striker also took part in the second goal lifting the ball into the penalty box from a free kick in the 42nd for Nicolas Tagliafico to score with his shoulder.
