Prime Minister, amend laws of envy and grudge

YOUR Highness the Prime Minister, let us talk frankly: For 60 years, the two authorities have been boasting about creating a national industry and ensuring food self-sufficiency. In every work program of the successive governments, there has been an item to motivate and support these two sectors.

However, the opposite has been happening in reality. Instead of encouragement, thorns were put on the wheels and procedures have become increasingly arbitrary, until Kuwait became repellent for any individual initiative in all sectors.

Today, we are in a new era. His Highness the Amir Sheikh Mishal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah announced his general plans on several occasions, the most recent of which was his speech on May 10 about restoring Kuwait's 'pioneers' and renaissance. In its first meeting, His Highness instructed the government to work on this restoration, and that he will hold any negligent person accountable.

From this standpoint, the Council of Ministers must live up to the expectations of His Highness, who translates the aspirations of the Kuwaiti people into reality. Restoring 'pioneers' is done by creating a national industry that has the ability to compete through incentives, not obstructing its work as it is happening currently -- whether through what is called 'judicial control' granted to inspectors who sometimes work according to their whims, closing factories just for a minor mistake based on the interests of competitors or issuing decisions that increase the burdens of the factory and its workers, as if everyone is a thief.

In countries where an industry has emerged, governments have placed all incentives for it. They supported it financially, in the media and in marketing. They secured all capabilities for the industry, because it is one of the pillars of prosperity and the best evidence of the strength of the State. We have the best examples in our neighboring countries in terms of renaissance in this field.

Other countries also support the agricultural industry, because they want to attain food self-sufficiency and protect national products. In this regard, the late Lebanese-American writer, Gibran Khalil Gibran, was right when he said: "Pity the nation that wears a cloth it does not weave, eats a bread it does not harvest...."

"The first basis for the collapse of states is dependence on the outside for everything, starting with food and not ending with importing factors of comfort and luxury. Ibn Khaldun warned about these 600 years ago.

Amir condoles as helicopter crash claims Iran president

FM among 8 dead; Khamenei taps Mokhber

KUWAIT CITY, May 20, (Agencies): His Highness the Amir Sheikh Mishal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah sent on Monday a cable of condolences to Acting President of Iran Mohammad Mokhber over the demise of President Ebrahim Raisi and his accompanying delegation in a helicopter crash.

His Highness the Amir also expressed similar sentiments to the families of the deceased, wishing them and the Iranian people patience and solace.

His Highness the Prime Minister Sheikh Ahmad Abdullah Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah also sent on Monday a cable of condolences to the Iranian Acting President Mohammad Mokhber over the death of President Ebrahim Raisi and accompanying delegation in a helicopter crash.

In the cable, His Highness expressed his sincere condolences and deep sympathy to the

families of the victims and the Iranian people.

Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi, the country's foreign minister and several other officials were found dead on Monday, hours after their helicopter crashed in a foggy, mountainous region of the country's northwest, state media reported.

The crash comes as the Middle East remains unsettled by the Israel-Hamas war, during which Raisi, who was 63, under Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali Khamenei launched an unprecedented drone-and-missile attack on Israel just last month.

Khamenei announced Monday that Iran's first vice president, Mohammad Mokhber, would serve as the country's acting president until elections are held.

Meanwhile, Saudi King Salman bin Abdulaziz and Crown Prince and Prince Mohammad bin Salman, expressed their deepest condolences to Iranian Acting President, Mohammad Mokhber, and to the people of Iran over the deaths of President Ebrahim Raisi during an aircraft accident.

The Saudi Press Agency (SPA) indicated that they received the news of the death with deep sorrow, expressing wishes of solace and patience to the families of the deceased.

Among the dead was Iranian Foreign Minister Hossein Amir-abbadollahian, 60. The helicopter

Kuwait's inflation up by 3.17%: CAS

KUWAIT CITY, May 20: According to data released by the Kuwaiti Central Administration of Statistics, consumer price indexes, indicating inflation, rose by 3.17 percent locally during April compared to the same period last year, reports Al-Jarida daily.

The statistics further revealed a monthly increase of 0.30 percent in inflation for April compared to March. This surge in annual inflation was primarily driven by higher prices across key categories impacting index movement, notably clothing, food,

KUWAIT CITY, May 20, (KUNA): The Ministry of Information announced on Monday that it would test launch a news broadcasting channel in July as part of its new strategy to follow up on local, regional and international developments.

Cabinet holds weekly meeting at Seif Palace

KUWAIT CITY, May 20, (KUNA): The Kuwait Cabinet approved Sunday a draft decree forming the Civil Service Council and a decree to form a supreme committee for investigating Kuwaiti citizenship.

This came during its weekly meeting at Seif Palace, presided by His Highness the Prime Minister Sheikh Ahmad Abdullah Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah.

His Highness the Prime Minister thanked the ministers for accepting the participation in the newly formed government, calling them to devote themselves to work and implement what was stated in the contents of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Mishal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber's speech.

The cleanup process included sterilization of the schools as per the health and sanitation regulations. Around 590 workers were involved and they removed about 13 tons of waste.

Embassy workshop sheds light on admission procedures

4,000 Kuwaitis studying in Jordan universities

KUWAIT CITY, May 20: Around 4,000 Kuwaitis are currently studying in universities in Jordan, reports Al-Rai daily quoting the Jordanian Embassy.

The embassy made this disclosure at an introductory workshop titled, "Unified admission mechanisms in Jordanian universities and admission policies," hosted by the Kuwait Teachers Society for high school students and their parents.

The embassy also confirmed that over the past 10 years 11,000 Kuwaiti students have graduated from Jordanian universities, most of whom specialized in the medical field.

Attracting

Muhammad Al-Khatib, Advisor to the Jordanian Minister of Higher Education and Scientific Research and Director of the Admissions Coordination Unit, emphasized that Jordanian universities are attracting students from Arab and foreign countries. He said there are currently more than 46,000 international students from 111 countries enrolled in various Jordanian educational institutions. He added the Jordanian universities follow the American credit hour system, enabling students to join the university during three semesters, including vacation periods. He also confirmed the employees in Jordanian universities are highly qualified as proven by the excellence of their graduates.

He went on to say that seven public and private Jordanian universities are part of international rankings, with the University of Jordan ranking 498 among the top 500 universities in the world according to the 'QS' classification. He affirmed that university fees in Jordan are reasonable and competitive compared to other countries; indicating that students from sisterly Arab countries, particularly Kuwait, do not feel alienated as they live among their families and experience customs, traditions and social life similar to their own country.

Meanwhile, Awni Tbeishat, the cultural advisor at the Jordanian Embassy, advised those interested in studying at Jordanian universities to visit the Ministry of Higher Education's website for detailed information. "There are approximately 30 specializations available. Students must carefully select universities and specializations close to their desires. For unified admission, they

Treatment

Regarding Kuwaiti students in Jordan, Tbeishat stressed that they receive special treatment, along with students from other Gulf countries and expatriates in general. Kuwaiti students have access to a dedicated website to submit their applications directly, which operates 24 hours a day and eliminates the need for intermediaries. The website also provides support in responding to students' inquiries before or after enrollment in universities. Currently, around 4,000 Kuwaitis are studying in Jordan, primarily in the medical field. Over the past 10 years; more than 11,000 Kuwaiti students have completed their education in Jordanian universities, making them one of the largest Arab student popula-

tions, he revealed.

He stated that the 'Study in Jordan' website provides comprehensive information about Jordanian universities, specializations, fees, registration processes, tourism and living arrangements. He also confirmed the existence of a special directorate for international students, which offers necessary facilities and organizes extracurricular activities; such as a competition for the best reciter of the Holy Qur'an, a football league and honors for excellent students.

He then announced the launch of a unified admission system for international students before the start of the upcoming academic year. This system will allow students to obtain university admission while in their home countries, pay university fees, and obtain endorsements from their country's cultural attaché in Jordan, he added.

CSC promises open comm channels

KUWAIT CITY, May 20: The Civil Service Commission reaffirmed its commitment to maintaining coordination with government agencies to address important inquiries, suggestions, and complaints, whether through social media platforms or other communication channels, reports Al-Jarida daily.

In a blog post on its "X" platform account, the Civil Service Commission emphasized that the decision of the Civil Service Commission, which included the approval of the shift system along with the corresponding allowances and benefits, stemmed from a proposal submitted by the "Diwan" and subsequently approved and implemented.

It reiterated its dedication to fostering a conducive work environment that accommodates all shift workers.

Furthermore, the Civil Service Commission assured the ongoing disbursement of shift allowances and clarified that the method of displaying these allowances on salary certificates, without cancellation, was based on inquiries received from certain authorities seeking clarity on the correct display of salary items.

Additionally, it highlighted its continuous collaboration with government agencies regarding proposals they have submitted, which will be presented to the Civil Service Commission for further consideration.

Ban on books? ... Creativity and intellect are progress' hallmark

“KUWAIT is the Capital of Arab Culture for the year 2025, and this year, ‘according to what was announced’ by the Assistant Secretary-General for the Arts Sector at the National Council for Culture, Arts and Letters, Musaed Al-Zamil, we will witness distinguished events and activities worthy of Kuwait’s leadership and its usual role at the cultural level,” columnist **Iqbal Al-Ahmad** wrote for **Al-Qabas** daily.

“In today’s landscape, individuals are urged to embrace progress in all facets – developmentally, politically, socially, and recreationally – supported directly by a government that commands attention across all arenas.

“This call comes as freedoms continue to dwindle in various spheres, with the state’s mechanisms appearing lax for years, and representatives relinquishing control to the whims of external pressures and inquiries, which, unfortunately, do not always prioritize the nation’s welfare.

“It’s regrettable that this reflection coincides with a period witnessing a resurgence in freedom of expression, cultural expression, and artistic endeavors within the realm of publishing and display – a resurgence we had finally begun to experience.

“Two distinct scenes come to mind as I contemplate this piece. The first was the book cemetery that attendees of the 2018 book fair were greeted with, prompting citizens to stage a sit-in in front of the Ministry of Information in protest against the principle of book banning—a right fundamental to human dignity and intellect.

“In November 2018, the accomplished artist Muhammad Sharaf drew attention to media censorship of literature by symbolically erecting a graveyard featuring 45 tombstones representing banned books up until that year, with each tombstone available for purchase to fund educational initiatives.

“Although the Ministry of Information swiftly removed these symbolic graves, their attempts to stifle circulation were futile, as the images of this metaphorical cemetery circulated both domestically and internationally.

“It is widely acknowledged that any attempt to censor literature, visual arts, or auditory expression amounts to stifling the very essence of society -- a society’s ability to discern right from wrong, good from bad.

“Simultaneously, protests against the Ministry of Information’s censorship erupted in 2018, as citizens decried the banning of certain titles that had previously been deemed acceptable for years – a move viewed as a blatant overstep of boundaries. While previous bans were restricted to recent publications, an increase in arbitrary decisions saw even longstanding literary works facing prohibition.

“In today’s era of technological advancement and unrestricted access to information, over 4,000 books have been banned in Kuwait, highlighting a concerning trend of censorship that threatens intellectual freedom.

“Questions abound: Why are ministers of information not held accountable for their decisions to ban books? Why does censorship fluctuate, expanding and contracting sporadically? Does it hinge on the individual occupying the ministerial post, or the quality of representation in the National Assembly?

“What was once deemed unacceptable during Sheikh Jaber Al-Ali Al-Sabah’s tenure as Minister of Information in the 1960s became normalized, albeit without opposition at the time.

“Similarly, Sheikh Saud Al-Nasser Al-Sabah faced interrogation over minor infractions, a loss felt keenly by the nation.

“More recently, decisions regarding book censorship appear rife with contradictions, contradicting the constitutional guarantees of freedom. Is it reasonable for a Kuwaiti author’s work, honored with Arab and international accolades, to be banned over a single word or phrase?

“It is imperative that decisions regarding censorship are grounded in sound reasoning rather than personal whims or external pressures. We must not succumb to mood swings or vindictiveness, lest we stifle the creativity and intellectualism that are the hallmark of any progressive society.

“Moving forward, let us strive for a future where the approval and dissemination of literature and art in Kuwait are guided by principles of openness and integrity.”

Also:

“Is it better to die here than to live there? It’s often challenging to discern an absolute truth, just as it’s difficult for an individual to claim certainty while dismissing others as foolish or misguided,” columnist **Khawla Matar** wrote for **Al-Jarida** daily.

“Those labeled as ‘devils’ by some may, in fact, be regarded as the pinnacle of existence by others. Yet, many find themselves revisiting emotions experienced perhaps years prior, emotions that can linger for what feels like eternity, a time frame subject to each individual’s perception, much like the concept of age or the essence of existence itself.

“Questions arise, or perhaps they

persist, manifesting as a form of sophisticated philosophy. Seated comfortably in one’s chair or within the confines of a modest apartment, one may wonder why individuals opt to leave rather than confront the perceived other -- those ruling regimes, authorities, or even tyrannical establishments such as religious institutions.

“Regardless of their titles, they collectively assume the role of the other, convinced of their capacity and knowledge to dictate what’s best for individuals, wherever they may be.

“They advocate for resilience, promising the downfall of injustice in its myriad forms and hues through one’s endurance. Yet, the sun rises each day without the burden of seeking sustenance to feed hungry mouths, while pleas for healthcare rights echo in the void.

“Countless interpretations and scenarios tirelessly strive to convince individuals that remaining, even in a ravaged city, is preferable to departure. They argue that leaving implies either contributing to demographic shifts or denying the country’s claim over its inhabitants, urging them to endure and sacrifice for its sake.

“In these deliberations, the question lingers: Is it nobler to remain in one’s homeland, succumbing to hunger, bombings, or the suffocating darkness that shrouds one’s town or city? Or is departure the path to preserving the dream of a better place? The flame of ambition burns within, resilient against the pressures of media, seminars, slogans, and patriotic anthems, reminiscent of Goebbels’ manipulative tactics mastered by his disciples.

“‘Why remain in a country’, they query, ‘when all lands are supposedly God’s vast domain’? Yet, knowledge seekers venture even to the distant corners of China, once perceived as the distant beacon of enlightenment.

“Others urge them to remain in desolate towns, where only the echoes of past laughter and tales linger, asserting that death there is more honorable than forsaking one’s roots.

“Their departure, not physical but ideological, signifies a detachment from inherited values. Academic accolades from prestigious institutions transform into status symbols, bearing witness to the ruthlessness hidden behind the veneer of success. Certificates from Harvard, Yale, Boston, Oxford, and others become emblems of prestige, overlooking the suffering and deprivation inflicted by the elite.

“The question persists: Is it preferable to endure in the shadows of one’s darkened city or to seek illumination in distant lands like so many others? After all, are not these rights – human rights – applicable to every individual, regardless of their location?”

“The tooth of a Yemeni must be loosened.” This is an excerpt from Zuhairiyah Kuwaiti by the late poet Hamoud Al-Nasser Al-Badr. Due to its deep meaning, it has become a famous proverb. It is a wise proverb that summarizes the way to get rid of an illness that has no hope of being cured, threatens stability, undermines cohesion, gnaws at the roots and makes survival dangerous,” columnist **Talal Abdul Kareem Al-Arab** wrote for **Al Jarida** daily.

“In the past, there was no dentist to treat toothache and clean tooth decay. Therefore, there is no treatment for a rotten tooth if the pain worsens other than uprooting it. The above is a suggestive proverb, as the areas of nuisance, danger or disease will not be eliminated unless uprooted from its foundation.

“Another proverb says: ‘I have a defective molar. Remove it with an iron.’ The molar is the last tooth of the jaw and your defect is your pain. What is meant by the iron here is the tool for extracting the tooth. In Palestine, they say: ‘Remove the tooth and remove the pain.’ In Algeria: ‘The ailing tooth, the heavy tooth and the weak wife, may they rest.’ In Morocco: ‘Whoever burned the tooth should be searched by the tool.’ This means the affected person must find the appropriate means of treatment in order to get rid of the source of the pain. If a human being develops a cancerous tumor, it must be removed, otherwise it will cause his death.

“Likewise, if the corruption, forgery and bribery epidemic spreads in a country, this is the beginning of its end. If the rule of law is absent from a nation, if chaos prevails, if the tone of extremist rhetoric rises, if ignorance and scientific backwardness dominate it and pandemonium prevails, the values and principles disappear and the identity is lost. Nationalism is dominated by tribal, sectarian and party affiliations. If those who solve the issue are unable to untie the knots, then the defects must be painfully uprooted from the sources.

“Proverbs in countries all over world that agree that the last cure is cauterization, and that uprooting the illness is the last solution to get rid of it. It is a painful treatment, no doubt, but it is successful and guaranteed. The proverb comes with a pun and connotation intended to indicate crucial matters that must be decided.

“Uprooting rampant corruption is painful and difficult, like removing a rotten tooth, but it is possible if the efforts, determination and will of everyone are combined with honest intentions, free and pure of all ambitions for power and money. Then no one, regardless of his status or position, will be able to stop it.”

Kuwait takes action against fake social media accounts

Authorities intensify security measures

KUWAIT CITY, May 20: Security authorities -- under direct instructions from First Deputy Prime Minister, Minister of Defense and Minister of Interior Sheikh Fahad Yusuf Al-Sabah -- have intensified the monitoring of fake accounts on social media, reports Al-Seyassah daily.

These accounts deliberately spread lies about the political, economic and social conditions in the country or insult officials, personalities, social figures and even hurt foreign relations of the country.

This comes within the context of reviews being conducted with the aim of correcting the course and combating fake social media accounts that break the law, especially since some of them deliberately spread rumors and lies that affect the security and stability of the country or harm Kuwait’s foreign relations.

Sources confirmed that the owners of these accounts will be confronted firmly and strictly, and that directives have been issued to conduct investigations and collect information about the suspicious account owners, arrest them and prosecute them in accordance with the Penal Code and Law No. 63/2015 regarding information technology crimes and others.

They pointed out that whoever is arrested will be subject to investigation to determine the sources of funding and the parties that support or direct him.

They also indicated that the matter is being investigated, information is being collected, and indictments are being prepared by the competent authorities, before taking the necessary legal measures.

Sources explained that the ministry, through the Criminal Security Sector, arrested a number of people running fake social media accounts over the past year, and spreading false news and baseless rumors.

They stressed that the ministry is intensifying its investigations to arrest the owners of these accounts and take the necessary measures against them, especially since some of them had previously been convicted with final sentences of imprisonment in similar cases.

Sources affirmed this step was taken after the spread of fake accounts that have become a real threat to national unity and to the country’s security and stability, particularly in light of the recent regional and international developments. They warned the pioneers of social media platforms against interacting with these accounts through retweets because it is considered a crime punishable by law.

In addition, security sources confirmed that the Department of Oversight and Inspection in the Ministry of Interior is monitoring some of the ministry employees who photograph the security tasks assigned to them and publish them on TikTok, Snapchat and other platforms. They said the security personnel are prohibited from photographing their security missions, placing flashers or photographing inside patrols and publishing them.

In a press interview a few days ago, the minister asserted that the “weak souls” that want to create strife in Kuwait will be deterred by the force of the law, stressing that they cannot be left alone to spread rumors and fake news. He said no Kuwaiti loyal to his country accepts the rumors which are being spread, indicating that “we are trying to curb the fake accounts being managed from outside Kuwait and find out who is feeding these accounts.”

Power outage in Ministries Complex ‘resolved’ – MEW

KUWAIT CITY, May 20: A low-voltage network malfunction caused a power outage in the Ministries Complex in Kuwait City on Monday morning, according to sources from the Ministry of Electricity, Water, and Renewable Energy. The issue affected the Al-Mirqab, Al-Hilali, and Naif Gate stations, taking them out of service, reports Al-Jarida daily.

The outage, which occurred at 6:40 a.m., resulted in approximately 32 megawatts of power being lost. Emergency teams were dispatched to the affected stations to carry out necessary repairs. Power was successfully restored by 9:11 a.m. to all impacted areas, including the Mirqab and Qibla districts.

The Kuwait Municipality’s main building experienced a power cut, disrupting its services. The Ministry of Justice advised its visitors in the Ministerial Complex to seek assistance at court complexes, branches, and service centers during the outage.

In response, Abdulaziz Sari, the Acting Undersecretary of the Ministry of Social Affairs, instructed the Assistant Undersecretary for Financial and Administrative Affairs, Faisal Al-Kandari, to inform employees to leave the complex if the outage persisted past 9 a.m. This directive was followed, and employees who had been at the complex since 7 a.m. were allowed to leave.

Sources from the Ministry of Social Affairs reported that the Administrative Affairs Department will communicate with the Civil Service Commission to ensure no administrative actions are taken against these employees. This includes not recording absences or incomplete working hours due to the emergency circumstances, which included non-functional elevators and escalators, preventing many employees from accessing their upper-floor offices.

Citizen found dead inside car

Royal, accomplices remanded to ‘police custody for 21 days’

KUWAIT CITY, May 20: The body of a 72-year-old citizen was found in his vehicle on Mutlaa Road recently.

A security source revealed that the Ministry of Interior’s Operations Unit received a report that an individual was found motionless inside a car in running mode on Mutlaa Road.

Security personnel and ambulances rushed to the location, where they discovered that the individual was already dead. They identified the body as that of a 72-year-old citizen. The body was transferred to the Forensic Medicine Department to determine the cause of death. A case was registered and investigations are ongoing.

21 days remand: The Public Prosecution has remanded a Kuwaiti citizen, a member of the ruling family, along with his Asian accomplices, to police custody for 21 days pending investigation in a case involving the cultivation of marijuana and possession of other narcotic substances, reports Al-Jarida daily.

They have been referred to the central prison following their arrest by the General Administration for Combating Narcotics last week. During the operation, large quantities of marijuana seedlings, pots, and seeds were seized from two homes owned by the accused. The investigation into this matter will continue under the jurisdiction of the Public Prosecution.

6 held for theft: The Directorate-General of Security Media at the Ministry of Interior has reported that, as part of the Criminal Security Sector’s ongoing efforts to arrest wanted criminals and outlaws, the Jahra Governorate Investigation Department has arrested six persons involved in the theft and subsequent sale of sheep in local markets, reports Al-Jarida daily.

Crime Briefs

TRAFFIC: The General Traffic Department continued its traffic campaigns over the past week; resulting in the issuance of 24,138 violation citations, impounding of 57 vehicles and 20 motorcycles, referral of 30 people to the traffic police, and arrest of 36 juveniles who were referred to the Juvenile Prosecution.

The weekly statistics showed that 39 wanted vehicles were impounded and 15 wanted persons were arrested on various charges.

The department also dealt with 1,328 minor accidents and 238 serious accidents.

FRAUD: An Egyptian registered a forgery case against an unknown person who stole KD500 from his account.

A security source revealed that the Egyptian went to a police station in Jahra Governorate and informed the security personnel there that an unknown person withdrew KD500 after seizing his bank card.

A case was registered and investigations are ongoing.

FIGHT: Iranian sailors engaged in a fistfight inside the Iranian ship docked at Shuwaikh Port, reports Al-Rai daily.

A security source told the daily that the ship was docked at the port to unload goods, but the sailors involved in the fight had to obtain entry visas to undergo treatment at the hospital and then refer them to the police station for interrogation.

A case was registered and investigations are ongoing to establish the circumstances leading to the fight.

VIDEO: The Public Relations and Security Media Department of the Ministry of Interior said the video clip circulating on some social media sites, showing women rioting inside a prison facility is old and dated back to 2016, and all necessary measures were taken at the time, reports Al-Anba daily.

The MOI has called on everyone to be accurate in reporting and take information from official sources only.

BARRIERS: The Coast Guard General Department in the Ministry of Interior, in cooperation with the Public Authority for Agriculture Affairs and Fish Resources (PAAAFR) and under the field supervision of Director of the Department Brigadier General Sheikh Mubarak Al-Sabah installed concrete barriers along Al-Khuwaisat coastal area in the northern part of the country, reports Al-Jarida daily.

KUWAIT CITY, May 20: The Fatwa and Legislation Department has given approval to the Directorate-General of Civil Aviation to proceed with the bid for the new Kuwait Air Cargo City project, reports Al-Qabas daily.

This project aims to design, construct, manage, operate, maintain, renovate, and develop facilities for cargo handling, storage, and distribution services at Kuwait International Airport.

The legal opinion provided affirmed that the General Administration of Civil Aviation has the discretion to offer the Cargo City project in line with Ministry of Finance Circular No. 1 of 2023 regarding government auctions.

It was emphasized that the Administration's request fulfilled all necessary legal procedures, hence the Ministry of Finance is urged to proceed with bidding procedures accordingly.

The project, located west of Kuwait International Airport, includes various components such as designing shipping, storage, distribution, and logistics buildings, as well as parking lots and offices.

The project also involves financing the construction and equipment, managing operations, comprehensive maintenance, and development to compete globally in terms of strategy and service.

Moreover, it aims to train and qualify Kuwaiti nationals to manage and operate the Cargo City.

The bidding process is expected to be limited to specialized international companies, considering the

Fingerprints to monitor attendance

Ministry of Information implements new work mechanism for employees

KUWAIT CITY, May 20: The Ministry of Information has determined the official work mechanism for administrative, technical and program employees and those working in shifts.

The daily obtained a copy of the circular that the ministry issued recently, stating the technical and program employees were allowed to have their fingerprints to prove attendance and leave for work in accordance with official working hours between 6:00 am and 6:00 pm. During this period, the employee must fulfill the official working period of seven hours. In the event that he proves attendance and departure with his fingerprint outside the period referred to, he will be considered absent and the rules governing that will be applied to him, the circular stated.

The circular added that working under the shift systems for employees assigned to departments that operate these systems must adhere to a specific work time for attendance and departure as per the letters approved by the relevant sector, in which the working hours are specified for each of the approved shift systems.

For departments with a special nature of work and without prejudice to the provisions and regulations of the shift in force, the circular said the assistant undersecretaries and department directors must determine the work hours for those who occupy jobs with special conditions or nature of work as per the need imposed by the nature of the work and the requirements for its proper conduct and organization. The Administrative Affairs Department must be provided with the work schedule of employees who perform these tasks, the circular added.

Regarding the rest of the employees, the circular confirmed that the official working hours are flexible working hours of seven hours from Sunday to Thursday. The employee is allowed to start working from 7:00 am to 9:00 am, provided that he leaves after completing seven working hours without prejudice to the legally prescribed grace periods.

The ministry stated that this circular is considered an experimental regulation of the work mechanism and proof of attendance and departure in its sectors.

Abdally ready for 200MW photovoltaic installation

Kuwait's solar drive gains ground

KUWAIT CITY, May 20: All the necessary infrastructure works for the supply, installation and maintenance of photovoltaic panels in Abdally have been completed, reports Al-Seyassah daily quoting sources from the Ministry of Electricity and Water.

Sources disclosed the project is aimed at producing 180 to 200 megawatts of photovoltaic electricity, indicating the project area spans 2.28 square kilometers and that the ministry has asked the Municipality Council to allocate land for this purpose.

According to the sources, the Kuwait Institute for Scientific Research (KISR) conducted a study on this project. Sources said the ministry relied on this institute's expertise in the field, as it carried out research to gain a better understanding of the perfor-

mance of various types of photovoltaic solar energy units in Kuwait's environmental conditions.

Sources affirmed this project has been included in the ministry's budget for the current fiscal year; in preparation for its referral to the Central Agency for Public Tenders (CAPT) to invite specialized companies in the field of photovoltaic energy to participate in the bidding.

Sources said this project is considered one of the renewable energy projects that will contribute approximately 200 megawatts to the total energy production. Currently, the total renewable energy production stands at 71 megawatts; with 70 megawatts coming from the Al-Shaqaya project, which was opened in February 2019, sources added.

Contract to purchase 500 MW signed

Kuwait bolsters summer energy reserves with Gulf Network deal

KUWAIT CITY, May 20: The Ministry of Electricity, Water and Renewable Energy has signed a contract to purchase 500 megawatts of electrical energy through the Gulf electrical interconnection network extending from the Sultanate of Oman to the State of Kuwait.

This step aims to cover the shortage of electrical energy during the summer months.

The ministry starts the process of importing purchased energy at the beginning of June until Aug 31.

The contract was signed in the presence of Acting Undersecretary Eng. Haitham Al-Ali and CEO of the Gulf Interconnection Authority Eng. Ahmed Al-Ibrahim.

Al-Ali, explained that "this purchase has technical and economic benefits to Kuwait, especially with the convergence of the offers submitted for energy purchase prices with the cost of production."

He stated that Kuwait owns 26.7 percent of the founding shares of the Gulf Cooperation Council Electricity Interconnection Authority.

It is a joint stock company registered by the member states of the council for the purpose of connecting the electricity networks of the members, securing energy supply to the networks of the members, investment, and achieving economic benefits in the areas of energy exchange and diversification of its

sources.

He pointed out that contracting directly with the authority contributes to supporting electrical networks in emergency situations, indicating that purchasing energy is not a new matter for member states during emergency situations.

On the other hand, Al-Ibrahim said the Gulf electrical market for trading electrical energy is one of the effective markets in the region, and allows for the conclusion of bilateral deals through the electronic platform for energy trading.

He stated that the platform schedules traded energy and financial settlements between traders; affirming an agreement was reached between the ministry and the authority on the offers that were submitted to supply electrical energy to Kuwait in June. It is subject to renewal during the months of July and August based on circumstances and needs of the interconnected networks of member states, he clarified.

He pointed out that trading in electrical energy between the GCC countries aims to sustain development, raise the level and reliability of electricity supply, and achieve savings in electricity production costs by providing sustainable electrical energy at competitive prices.

It is worth noting that the value of the electrical exchange in the Gulf network amounted to \$136.64 million in 2021 and reached \$83.75 million in 2022.

Consequently, it is important for Kuwait to have its own industry and agriculture, rather than depending on others for everything -- even cleaning tools, livestock and tomatoes.

Other countries that took many of our ideas now export everything to us, because they relied on local industry. They even concluded agreements with major factories in the world to manufacture weapons and parts of some heavy equipment.

HH the Prime Minister Sheikh Ahmad Abdullah Al-Sabah, you are an economist. You have long experience in what can help strengthen financial mobility in the country, and what self-reliance in food and industry means. We have money and vast areas of wasted land. The real value of such land lies in the facilities therein. Thus, allocating industrial and agricultural plots is not enough if this is not accompanied by practical incentives.

About 30 years ago, Kuwait signed the offset system with several countries. It is an obligation imposed on foreign entities that sign contracts with the government to implement projects that achieve the objectives of the program. Was this implemented? What joint actions (JOINT VENTURE) were taken?

Your Highness the Prime Minister, the Public Authority for Industry and the Agriculture Authority are under your jurisdiction. You currently have the authority to legislate and implement. Therefore, you have the capabilities to embark on the revival of the industrial and agricultural sectors, so that Kuwait enters the era of self-sufficiency like the rest of the Gulf countries.

also carried the governor of Iran's East Azerbaijan province, a senior cleric from Tabriz, three crew members and a Revolutionary Guard official, the state-run IRNA news agency reported. IRNA said the crash killed eight people in all, including three crew members, aboard the Bell helicopter, which Iran purchased in the early 2000s.

Aircraft in Iran face a shortage of parts, often flying without safety checks against the backdrop of Western sanctions. Because of that, former Iranian Foreign Minister Mohammad Javad Zarif sought to blame the United States for the crash in an interview Monday.

"One of the main culprits of yesterday's tragedy is the United States, which ... embargoed the sale of aircraft and aviation parts to Iran and does not allow the people of Iran to enjoy good aviation facilities," Zarif said. "These will be recorded in the list of US crimes against the Iranian people."

State TV gave no immediate cause for the crash that occurred in Iran's East Azerbaijan province.

The U.S. has yet to comment publicly on Raisi's death. Ali Bagheri Kani, a nuclear negotiator for Iran, will serve as the country's acting foreign minister, state TV said.

Early Monday morning, Turkish authorities released what they described as drone footage showing what appeared to be a fire in the wilderness that they "suspected to be wreckage of helicopter." The coordinates listed in the footage put the fire some 20 kilometers (12 miles) south of the Azerbaijan-Iranian border on the side of a steep mountain.

Footage released by IRNA early Monday showed what the agency described as the crash site, across a steep valley in a green mountain range. Soldiers speaking in the local Azeri language said: "There it is, we found it."

Condolences started pouring in from neighbors and allies after Iran confirmed there were no survivors from the crash. Pakistan announced a day of mourning and Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi said in a post on X that his country "stands with Iran in this time of sorrow."

Leaders of Egypt and Jordan also offered condolences, as did Syrian President Bashar Assad. Lebanon and Syria both declared three days of mourning.

Azerbaijan's President Ilham Aliyev said he and his government were "deeply shocked" - Raisi was returning on Sunday after traveling to Iran's border with Azerbaijan to inaugurate a dam with Aliyev when the crash happened.

Union of Coop Societies' debt relief plan approved

Cooperative boards to aid payment

KUWAIT CITY, May 20: The Ministry of Social Affairs has given nod to the Union of Cooperative Societies for the cooperative boards of directors to contribute towards settling the remaining debt owed by the Union, reports Al-Jarida daily.

This debt is 750 thousand dinars, of which 300 thousand has already been paid. The debt is owed to a company supplying goods and products, against which an enforceable court ruling has been issued for payment.

The approved payment process will utilize the "expenses" allocation of each cooperative to settle the outstanding debt. There is a strong desire from the Union's Board of Directors to clear all debts at once to close this long-standing issue.

The union has formally approached the Ministry to seek approval for involving the cooperative boards of directors in paying off the remaining debt according to the capacity of each individual cooperative.

While the participation of the boards of directors in paying the debt is not mandatory, there has been a positive response from many associations, indicating a genuine desire to contribute towards strengthening the Union's financial position, which serves as the legitimate and legal umbrella for safeguarding its financial interests and gains.

Following the resolution of this debt, the Union aims to enhance its revenue streams through various methods, including expanding its product offerings bearing the Union's name and brand in cooperative markets. These products will prioritize quality and competitive pricing to effectively compete with similar offerings in the market.

inspections. Iran has armed Russia in its war on Ukraine, as well as launched a massive drone-and-missile attack on Israel amid its war against Hamas in the Gaza Strip. It also has continued arming proxy groups in the Mideast, like Yemen's Houthi rebels and Lebanon's Hezbollah.

The food and beverages category saw a significant increase in price index, rising by 5.79 percent in April compared to the same month in 2023. Similarly, the price index for cigarettes and tobacco witnessed a slight uptick of 0.22 percent annually.

Clothing prices surged by 5.95 percent, while housing services and home furnishings saw increases of 1.14 percent and 3.74 percent, respectively.

Health-related expenses also contributed to inflation, with the health group's price index rising by 3.58 percent; transportation costs increased by 1.06 percent year-on-year and communication services experienced a 2.54 percent increase in prices, while entertainment and culture expenses rose by 2.69 percent. Education expenses saw a modest increase of 0.80 percent.

Furthermore, prices in the restaurants and hotels category climbed by 2.37 percent compared to April

Born in Kuwait in 1930, Al-Naqeeb's academic pursuits led him to study social and economic sciences in the United States, where he graduated in 1957 and later undertook a study mission at Oxford University.

During his diplomatic tenure, Al-Naqeeb played a significant role in representing Kuwait's interests on the international stage, earning recognition such as the prestigious "Quaid-e-Azam" Medal, the highest civilian honor in Pakistan. After retiring from diplomatic service in 1975, he transitioned to the world of business and investment, where he continued to excel.

‘Assange can appeal’

Slovakia PM Fico’s condition improves

BRATISLAVA, Slovakia, May 20, (AP): Slovak populist Prime Minister **Robert Fico**’s condition is improving following an assassination attempt last week that shocked the European Union nation deeply polarized over his policies.

“After today’s consultation, the patient’s condition is stabilized,” the hospital treating the Slovak leader in the central city of Banská Bystrica said on Monday.

A statement released by the clinic said Fico is “clinically improving, communicating, inflammatory parameters are slowly decreasing.”

It said Fico remains hospitalized in the clinic for the time being.

On Sunday, the clinic said that Fico, 59, was no longer in life threatening condition after he was shot in the abdomen as he greeted supporters on Wednesday outside a cultural center in the town of Handlova, nearly 140 kilometers (85 miles) northeast of the capital, Bratislava.

Video showed the Slovak premier approach people gathered at barricades and reach out to shake hands as a man stepped forward, extended his arm and fired five rounds before being tackled and arrested.

Fico immediately underwent a five-hour surgery to treat multiple wounds he suffered in the shooting followed by another two-hour surgery Friday to remove dead tissue from his gunshot wounds.

The country’s Specialized Criminal Court in the town of Pezinok on Saturday ordered the suspected assailant, who is charged with attempted murder, to remain behind bars. The suspect can appeal the order.

Little information about the would-be assassin has been disclosed after prosecutors told police not to publicly identify him or release details about the case.

The government officials originally said they believed it was a politically motivated attack committed by a “lone wolf,” but announced on Sunday that a “third party” might have been involved in “acting for the benefit of the perpetrator.”

Fico’s government has made efforts to overhaul public broadcasting - a move critics said would give the government full control of public television and radio. That, along with his plans to amend the penal code to eliminate a special anti-graft prosecutor, have led opponents to worry that Fico will lead Slovakia down a more autocratic path.

The government’s smallest coalition partner, the ultranationalist Slovak National Party, was expecting a government meeting early this week to discuss the new media law, which the Parliament started to debate last week.

TBILISI, Georgia: Georgia’s parliament speaker on Monday vowed to override the presidential veto on divisive legislation that sparked weeks of mass protests by critics who see it as a threat to democratic freedoms and the country’s aspirations to join the European Union.

The legislation, passed by the parliament earlier this month, requires media and nongovernmental organizations and other nonprofits to register as “pursuing the interests of a foreign power” if they receive more than 20% of their funding from abroad.

The opposition has denounced the bill as “the Russian law,” because Moscow uses similar legislation to crack down on independent news media, nonprofits and activists critical of the Kremlin. The government argues it is necessary to stem what it deems as harmful foreign influence over the country’s politics and to prevent unspecified foreign actors from trying to destabilize it.

Georgian President **Salome Zourabichvili**, who is increasingly at odds with the governing party, Georgian Dream, vetoed the legislation on Saturday, but the ruling party has a majority sufficient to override a presidential veto.

Shalva Papuashvili, parliament speaker and Georgian Dream member, told reporters on Monday that “of course, the parliament will override this veto.” He said the parliament will hold a session to do so next week.

The bill that sparked protests this year is nearly identical to one that Georgian Dream was pressured to withdraw last year after street protests. Renewed demonstrations have rocked Georgia for weeks, with demonstrators scuffling with police, who used tear gas and water cannons to disperse the crowds.

The bill also drew criticism from European Union officials. In a joint statement Sunday, French President **Emmanuel Macron** and German Chancellor **Olaf Scholz** expressed “deep regret” over “the decision of the Georgian government and ruling party to deviate from this path by acting against our common European values and the aspirations of the Georgian people, such as through the adoption of the so-called law ‘on transparency of foreign influence.’”

LONDON: WikiLeaks founder **Julian Assange** can appeal against extradition to the **United States** on espionage charges, a London court ruled on Monday - a decision that is likely to further drag out what has already been a long legal saga.

High Court judges **Victoria Sharp** and **Jeremy Johnson** said Assange has grounds to challenge the United Kingdom’s government’s extradition order.

Assange, 52, has been indicted on 17 espionage charges and one charge of computer misuse over his website’s publication of a trove of classified US documents almost 15 years ago.

His supporters cheered and applauded outside court as news of the ruling reached them from inside the Royal Courts of Justice.

The Australian computer expert has spent the last five years in a British high-security prison after taking refuge in the Ecuadorian Embassy in London for seven years. The WikiLeaks founder was not in court to hear his fate being debated. He did not attend for health reasons, his lawyer said.

Lawyers for Assange argued Monday that the US provided “blatantly inadequate” assurances the WikiLeaks founder would have free press protections if extradited to the US.

Lawyer **Edward Fitzgerald** said prosecutors had failed to guarantee that Assange, who is an Australian citizen and claims protections as a journalist for publishing US classified information, could rely on press protections of the First Amendment of the US Constitution.

“The real issue is whether an adequate assurance has been provided to remove the real risk identified by the court,” Fitzgerald said. “It is submitted that no adequate assurance has been made.”

Many remember solid economy under Trump

Haley faces murky path forward

COLUMBIA, SC, May 20, (AP): Nikki Haley is perhaps the highest-profile Republican in the nation who has refused to fall in line and endorse Donald Trump’s presidential bid.

It’s unclear how long that might last. Some allies believe she may be forced to endorse him before the November election to avoid permanently alienating the Republican Party base. Some even suspect that Haley will re-emerge on Trump’s short list of vice presidential contenders in the coming months, despite Trump’s recent statement to the contrary.

Coalition

But if Haley submits to Trump, as so many of his GOP critics have done, she also risks destroying her own coalition of independents, moderates and anti-Trump Republicans, who are still showing up to support her in low-profile primary contests from deep-red Indiana to deep-blue Maryland.

Her decision in the coming months will be closely watched not just by her supporters, but by allies of Trump and President Joe Biden. What she decides to do - and whether her coalition follows - could have a profound impact on this year’s general election and her future as a top-tier Republican whose brand appeals to many people outside her party.

“Nikki Haley could be the person that unites us,” said Thalia Floras, a 62-year-old retail manager from Nashua, New Hampshire, who was a lifelong Democrat before casting a ballot for Haley in her state’s January primary.

But Floras also has a warning: “Nikki Haley has a good place with me now. But if she goes with Trump, I’m done.”

Those close to Haley, a 52-year-old former governor and UN ambassador, say it’s unclear what she’ll do.

Haley and Trump haven’t spoken in months. That includes the period after she bowed out of the GOP primary campaign in early March, according to a person with direct knowledge of Haley’s private conversations who was not authorized to speak about them publicly.

And while some Republicans who supported Haley will certainly drift back to Trump organically, the Biden campaign is working to win over her supporters, whom they view as true swing voters.

Biden’s team is quietly organizing a Republicans for Biden group, which will eventually include dedicated staff and focus on the hundreds of thousands of Haley voters in each battleground state, according to people familiar with

the plans but not authorized to discuss them publicly.

The Democratic president hasn’t kept his intentions a secret.

Biden issued a statement thanking Haley for her courage to challenge Trump just minutes after she bowed out of the primary race in March.

“Donald Trump made it clear he doesn’t want Nikki Haley’s supporters. I want to be clear: There is a place for them in my campaign,” Biden said at the time.

To date, Biden had limited his public comments around the protests on US college campuses to upholding the right to peaceful protest.

The speech - and a separate one he gave later Sunday in Detroit - are part of a burst of outreach to Black constituents by the Democratic president, whose support among these voters has softened since their strong backing helped put him in the Oval Office.

Biden spent much of the approximately 30-minute speech focused on the problems at home. He condemned Donald Trump’s rhetoric on immigrants and noted that the class of 2024 entered college during the COVID-19 pandemic and following the murder of George Floyd, a Black man killed by a Minneapolis police officer. Biden said it was natural for them, and others, to wonder whether the democracy “you hear about actually works for you.”

But as **Donald Trump** recalled that moment at a recent rally, the former president exuded pride.

“We had the greatest economy in history,” the Republican told his **Wisconsin** audience. “The 30-year mortgage rate was at a record low, the lowest ever recorded ... 2.65%, that’s what your mortgage rates were.”

The question of who can best steer the US economy could be a deciding factor in who wins November’s presidential election. While an April Gallup poll found that Americans were most likely to say that immigration is the country’s top problem, the economy in general and inflation were also high on the list.

Trump may have an edge over President **Joe Biden** on key economic concerns, according to an April poll by The Associated Press-NORC Center for Public Affairs. The survey found that Americans were more likely to say that as president, Trump helped the country with job creation and cost of living.

Ex-deputy faces fed charges: A former San Diego sheriff’s deputy who already pleaded guilty to voluntary manslaughter for the 2020 fatal shooting of an unarmed suspect has been indicted on two federal charges that could bring a life sentence, federal prosecutors said.

A federal grand jury returned a two-count indictment Friday charging Aaron Russell with depriving Nicholas Bils of his right to be free from officers using excessive force and with discharging a firearm in a violent crime, the US Department of Justice said in a statement.

Bils, 36, was arrested in May 2020 at Old Town State Park in San Diego where he had been pitching balls to his off-leash dog. He brandished a golf club at a ranger before running away and was arrested on suspicion of assault with a deadly weapon and resisting arrest.

Bils was in a State Parks patrol car heading to the downtown jail when he managed to slip out of his handcuffs, reached out a window to open the car door, then jumped out and ran. (AP)

Canada boat crash kills 3: Three people were killed and five others injured Saturday night following a boat crash in Canada, local media reported Sunday.

11 hurt in mass shooting: An argument between two women led to a gunfight that left 11 people hurt in a busy tourist area of Savannah, Georgia, late Saturday, one of five weekend shootings in the city, two of which were fatal, authorities said.

Two people were injured in separate shootings Friday. Two more shootings Saturday resulted in two deaths. Then came the gunfire just before midnight Saturday near Savannah’s Ellis Square.

The shooting broke out as two women argued in an area business, according to Police Chief **Lenny Gunther**, who didn’t name the establishment.

“One shot rang out. That triggered other individuals to shoot,” he said. “We had multiple individuals discharge their weapons to shoot at each other, which resulted in multiple people getting shot.”

Ten of the 11 injured were hit by gunfire. Authorities did not say what caused the 11th injury. Victims were treated at the scene and “several” were taken to a hospital, police said. None of the injuries appeared life threatening.

Mayor **Van Johnson** said a proliferation of guns was a factor in the shootings and that reasonable gun control laws are needed. He also stressed the need for gun owners to keep their weapons from being stolen and for people carrying guns to know how and when to use them. (AP)

Dominican Republic president re-elected

SANTO DOMINGO, Dominican Republic, May 20, (AP): Dominican Republic President **Luis Abinader** is headed to a second term following Sunday’s general elections, declaring victory after his top competitors conceded early in the night as he held a strong leader in early vote tallies.

The outcome reinforced both Abinader’s anti-corruption agenda, the government’s crackdown along its shared border with Haiti and the expulsion of hundreds of thousands of migrants fleeing the Dominican Republic’s violence-stricken neighbor. Such policies are only likely to continue in his next term.

Abinader, one of the most popular leaders in the Americas, and the early results showed him with nearly 60% of the votes. His competitors, former President Leonel Fernández and Mayor Abel Martínez, conceded early in the night.

Abinader supporters in his campaign headquarters started celebrating early on, blowing horns and cheering. In his victory speech, Abinader delivered a nationalistic message promising change and anti-corruption measures. He notably spoke little about of the government’s harsh measures on Haitian migrants and the crisis

in its island neighbor. “The message from the results is clear, the changes that we’ve made are going to be irreversible,” Abinader said. “In the Dominican Republic, the best is yet to come.”

Decision

While opposition parties reported a number of small irregularities, voting largely ran smoothly. Many of the 8 million eligible voters are still traumatized by an electoral authority decision to suspend the 2020 municipal elections due to a technical glitch, prompting what appears to be high voter turnout.

The president’s Modern Revolutionary Movement was also expected to win a majority in the Dominican Republic’s congress, which would allow him to push through changes to the constitution. It also would allow him to further his anti-corruption and economic agendas, which have earned him the approval of many in the Caribbean nation.

Willy Soto, a 21-year old economics student, was among those in the crowd. He said Abinader’s anti-corruption measures and economic and educational reforms gave him hope for the future of the country long plagued by political corruption.

“We young people, we see a different kind of government,” Soto said.

Much of the president’s popularity, however, has been fueled by the crackdown on Haitian migrants.

Policies

The Dominican Republic has long taken a hard line with Haitian migrants, but such policies have ramped up since Haiti entered a free fall following the 2021 assassination of President Jovenel Moïse. As gangs have terrorized Haitians, the Dominican government has built a Trump-like border wall along the 250-mile (400-kilometer) border. He has also repeatedly urged the United Nations to send an international force to Haiti, saying such action “cannot wait any longer.”

Soto also voiced approval for the migrant crackdown. While saying he knows “the policies against (Haitians) are very strict” and many migrants worried Abinader would win, he said the steps the president has taken are important in guaranteeing the security of Dominicans like him.

“This isn’t a problem that gets resolved one day to the next,” Soto said. “The policies he’s implemented, how he’s cracked down, closed the border and built a wall, I feel like it’s a good initiative to control the problem of Haitian migration.”

While the policy is popular among Dominicans, it has drawn sharp criticisms from human rights groups that call it racist and a violation of international law. The government has rejected calls to build refugee camps for those fleeing Haiti’s violence, and it conducted mass deportations of 175,000 Haitians last year, according to government figures.

MEXICO CITY: Less than two weeks from national elections, opposition presidential candidate **Xóchitl Gálvez** hit away on security, one of Mexico’s most stubborn challenges, in her final debate Sunday night with governing party candidate **Claudia Sheinbaum**.

Sheinbaum, the frontrunner in the race, defended the security record of her mentor, outgoing President **Andrés Manuel López Obrador**, while Gálvez accused the administration of playing nice with the country’s powerful drug cartels.

“What has been this administration’s strategy? Give the country to organized crime,” said Gálvez, a former senator and tech entrepreneur.

But Sheinbaum, a former Mexico City mayor and climate scientist, maintained the conservative strategy that she employed in two previous debates, not taking the bait when Gálvez attacked.

Gálvez promised to keep and strengthen the National Guard that López Obrador created, but also strengthen state and local police forces.

Earlier Sunday, tens of thousands of mostly opposition supporters protested against the president in the capital’s vast colonial-era main plaza.

TAPACHULA, Mexico: Attacks on political candidates in Mexico’s violence-torn southern state of Chiapas have left at least 14 people dead in recent days, local authorities and candidates said Sunday.

The latest attack early Sunday targeted the car driving **Nicolás Noriega**, who is running to lead the municipal government of the town of **Mapastepec**. Noriega confirmed the attack to The Associated Press and said he was wounded and at least five people from his campaign were fatally shot.

Running under the country’s ruling party, Morena didn’t add more details and was noticeably shaken after the attack. The Chiapas Prosecutor’s Office also confirmed that five attack. Photos shared by local media showed a red truck dotted by bullet holes, and bloodied bodies laying in the trunk and on the ground.

“I deeply mourn the deaths of my friends, whose lives were taken in a cowardly manner. Evil is never going to reign in our hearts, because there are more of us who love life, who think of doing good,” Noriega posted on Facebook Sunday. “I’m asking all of society to unite to honor life.”

Lai inaugurated as Taiwan leader

TAIPEI, Taiwan, May 20, (Agencies): Taiwan’s new president, Lai Ching-te, said in his inauguration speech Monday that he wants peace with China and urged it to stop its military threats and intimidation of the self-governed island that Beijing claims as its own territory.

“I hope that China will face the reality of (Taiwan)’s existence, respect the choices of the people of Taiwan, and in good faith, choose dialogue over confrontation,” Lai said after being sworn into office.

Lai pledged to “neither yield nor provoke” Beijing and said he sought peace in relations with China. But he emphasized the island democracy is determined to defend itself “in the face of the many threats and attempts at infiltration from China.”

Lai’s party, the Democratic Progressive Party, doesn’t seek independence from China but maintains that Taiwan is already a sovereign nation.

The Chinese office in charge of Taiwan affairs criticized Lai’s inauguration speech as promoting “the fallacy of separatism,” inciting confrontation and relying on foreign forces to seek independence.

“We will never tolerate or condone any form of ‘Taiwan independence’ separatist activities,” said Chen Binhua, spokesperson of the Taiwan Affairs Office of China’s State Council.

“No matter how the situation on the island changes, no matter who is in power, it cannot change the fact that both sides of the Taiwan Strait belong to one China ... and cannot stop the historical trend of the motherland’s eventual reunification,” Chen said.

The Chinese Ministry of Commerce on Monday also announced sanctions against Boeing and two other defense companies for arms sales to Taiwan.

Development

Lai, 64, takes over from Tsai Ing-wen, who led Taiwan through eight years of economic and social development despite the COVID-19 pandemic and China’s escalating military threats. Beijing views Taiwan as a renegade province and has been upping its threats to annex it by force if necessary.

Lai is seen as inheriting Tsai’s progressive policies, including universal health care, backing for higher education and support for minority groups, including making Taiwan the first place in Asia to recognize same-sex marriages.

In his inauguration speech, Lai pledged to bolster Taiwan’s social safety net and help the island advance in fields such as artificial intelligence and green energy.

Lai, who was vice president during Tsai’s second term, came across as more of a firebrand earlier in his career. In 2017, he described himself as a “pragmatic worker for Taiwan’s independence,” drawing Beijing’s rebuke. He has since softened his stance and now supports maintaining the status quo across the Taiwan Strait and the possibility of talks with Beijing.

Thousands of people gathered in front of the Presidential Office Building in Taipei for the inauguration ceremony. Donning white celebratory hats, they watched the swearing-in on large screens, followed by a military march and colorful performances featuring folk dancers, opera performers and rappers. Military helicopters flew in formation, carrying Taiwan’s flag.

Lai accepted congratulations from fellow politicians and delegations from the 12 nations that maintain official diplomatic relations with Taiwan, as well as politicians from the US, Japan and various European states.

Security

Lai, also known by his English name William, has vowed to continue his predecessor’s push to maintain stability with China while beefing up Taiwan’s security through imports of military equipment from close partner the US, the expansion of the defense industry with the manufacture of submarines and aircraft, and the reinforcing of regional partnerships with unofficial allies such as the U.S., Japan, South Korea and the Philippines.

US Secretary of State Antony J. Blinken congratulated Lai on his inauguration. “We look forward to working with President Lai and across Taiwan’s political spectrum to advance our shared interests and values, deepen our longstanding unofficial relationship, and maintain peace and stability across the Taiwan Strait,” Blinken said in a statement from his office.

India holds 5th stage of poll: When Indian Prime Minister **Narendra Modi** opened a Hindu temple on the site of a razed mosque in the city of Ayodhya in early 2024, he was making a bet on mixing Hindu nationalism and politics ahead of a national election in which he’s seeking a rare third term.

On Monday, that bet faced a test as the northern city swarmed with voters, many of them Hindu devotees, lining up in scorching heat as India began the fifth phase of its six-week-long staggered national election.

Modi’s Hindu nationalist politics have resonated with many supporters, and most polls show his Bharatiya Janata Party in the lead. But it’s not clear whether that fervor can carry him to victory as Indians face rising unemployment and inflation.

“Issues like unemployment, inflation, lack of security and the government’s attempts to muzzle dissent are glaring problems that the BJP has no answers to,” said Amarnath Agarwal, a political analyst.

The staggered election will run until June 1 and nearly 970 million eligible voters, more than 10% of the world’s population, will elect 543 members to the lower house of Parliament for five years. The votes are scheduled to be counted on June 4.

Monday’s polling, in constituencies across six states and two union territories, is crucial for the BJP, as it includes some of strongholds in states like Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal. (AP)

Nepal PM wins vote: Nepal’s prime minister will continue leading his shaky governing coalition after winning his fourth vote of confidence in two years on Monday.

Prime Minister **Pushpa Kamal Dahal** called the vote in Nepal’s lower house of parliament after a minor party in his coalition broke apart and its members withdrew support from the government. Dahal won the vote with 157 votes, a majority of the 272-member house.

Dahal has struggled to keep his coalition together since becoming prime minister in December 2022 following an inconclusive election. Dahal’s Nepal Communist Party Maoist Center came in third in that election, but was the first party to piece together majority support.

That left him in a precarious position. He has had to switch coalition partners to keep his majority.

The latest challenge is allegations that his Home Minister was involved in financial irregularities involving cooperatives.

Opposition lawmakers are demanding the minister resign and have been protesting for days inside the House of Representatives,

Seven people were wounded in the attack on Friday in on Bamiyan province, a major tourist area, according to Abdul Mateen Qani, a spokesman for the interior minister. He said seven suspects were arrested at the scene.

The Islamic State group issued statements on its Amaq news agency late Sunday that said IS fighters attacked a bus carrying tourists and their guides. “The attack was in response to the IS leaders’ directions to target citizens of the European Union wherever they are found,” it said.

Spain’s Foreign Ministry said three Spaniards died and at least one more had been wounded. A Taliban official in Bamiyan, who spoke on condition of anonymity because he was not authorized to speak to the media, said the four wounded foreigners were from Spain, Norway, Australia and Latvia.

Spanish Prime Minister Pedro Sánchez wrote on social media platform X that he was “overwhelmed” by the news.

Qani said that all those who were wounded have been transferred to capital of Kabul for treatment and they are stable condition.

The Islamic State group’s affiliate in Afghanistan is a major Taliban rival and its militants have attacked schools, hospitals, mosques and minority Shiite areas throughout the country.

The Taliban seized power in Afghanistan in August 2021 as US and NATO forces were in the final weeks of their withdrawal from the country after 20 years of war. (AP)

Russian court freezes assets of 2 German banks

A court in the Russian city of St. Petersburg has ordered the seizing of assets of Germany's Deutsche Bank and Commerzbank in the country, the Russia state news agency Tass says. The order is in response to a lawsuit over the planned construction of a liquefied natural gas terminal in the Baltic Sea. The banks were among the guarantors in the contract for building a gas processing plant by a multinational construction firm, Renaissance Heavy Industries, and German company Linde. But the project was cancelled after Western sanctions, with the banks withdrawing their guarantees. The cancellation came at the request of RusChemAlliance, a subsidiary of Russian gas giant Gazprom and the operator of the project, German news agency dpa reported.

RusChemAlliance paid advances to Linde for the building of the plant. The company is claiming about 238.61 million euros (\$260 million) against Deutsche Bank and 94.92 million euros (\$103 million) against Commerzbank, according to dpa. In a statement Deutsche Bank said that it has made a provision for approximately 260 million euros (\$283 million) under an indemnification agreement. (AP)

Musk launches Starlink sat net service in Indonesia

Elon Musk traveled to Indonesia's resort island of Bali on Sunday to launch Starlink satellite internet service in the world's largest archipelago nation. Wearing a green Batik shirt, Musk was greeted with a garland of flower petals at a community health clinic in Denpasar, the provincial capital of Bali, where he launched the Starlink service alongside Indonesian ministers. Indonesia, a vast archipelago of 17,000 islands sprawled across three time zones with a population of more than 270 million, has been trying for years to secure deals with Musk's Tesla on battery investment and for Musk's SpaceX to provide fast internet for the country's remote regions. During the ceremony, Musk took a speed test of the Starlink internet service with several health workers in Indonesia's remote regions, including in Aru, one of Indonesia's unserved and outermost islands in Maluku province. "This can make it really a life-saver for remote medical clinics, and I think it could be a possibility for education as well," Musk told reporters. b"If you can access the internet and then you can learn anything and you can also sell your business services worldwide. So, I think it's going to be incredibly beneficial," he said. (AP)

UN experts confirm deal

S.Sudan close to securing \$13b oil-backed loan from a UAE co

UNITED NATIONS, May 20, (AP): U.N. experts say South Sudan is close to securing a \$13 billion loan from a company in the United Arab Emirates, despite the oil-rich country's difficulties in managing debts backed by its oil reserves. The panel of experts said in a report to the U.N. Security Council that loan documents it has seen indicate the deal with the company, Hamad Bin Khalifa Department of Projects, would be South Sudan's largest-ever oil-backed loan. The experts, who monitor an arms embargo against South Sudan, said in the oil section of the report obtained by The Associated Press this week that "servicing this loan would likely tie up most of South Sudan's revenue (for) many years, depending on oil prices." Hamad Bin Khalifa Department of Projects, registered in Dubai, has no listed phone number and its website isn't working. An email address associated with the company bounced back. The UAE Mission to the United Nations declined to comment, saying Hamad is a private company. South Sudan gained independence from Sudan in 2011 following decades of civil war that cost million of lives, and oil is the backbone of the young nation's economy. Soon after independence, South Sudan fought its own civil war from 2013 to 2018, when rivals President Salva Kiir and Vice President Riek Machar signed a power-sharing agreement and formed a coalition government. South Sudan is under

pressure from the United States and other nations to more quickly implement the 2018 peace deal that ended the civil war and prepare for elections. According to the U.S. Energy Information Administration's latest update, South Sudan produced an average of about 149,000 barrels of liquid fuels per day in 2023. The landlocked country uses Sudan's pipelines to transfer its oil to Port Sudan for shipment to global markets in an agreement with the Sudanese government, which pockets \$23 per barrel as transit fees for the oil exports. South Sudanese Information Minister Michael Makuei Lueth told reporters in February that outside factors, including the civil war still raging in Sudan, have hurt South Sudan's oil exports. He also said oil wells, which were water-logged by heavy floods during the past rainy season, weren't yet fully operational. The section on oil in the experts report said documents for the loan from the UAE company, signed between December and February by South Sudan's minister of finance, indicate the loan is split into tranches. According to the documents, around 70% of the loan is to be allocated to infrastructure projects, with the first payment in excess of \$5 billion, the panel said. Following a three-year grace period, "the loan will be secured against the delivery of crude oil for a period of up to 17 years." The panel of experts raised serious questions about South Sudan's oil-based debts.

PARIS, May 20, (KUNA): Prices for key minerals used in clean energy technologies dropped in 2023, but a new International Energy Agency (IEA) analysis shows the need for greater and more diversified investment to support efforts to reach energy and climate goals.

The Global Critical Minerals Outlook 2024, published Friday, updates the IEA's inaugural review of the market last year while also offering new medium- and long-term outlooks for the supply and demand of important energy transition minerals, such as lithium, copper, nickel, cobalt, graphite and rare earth elements. Materials used to make batteries saw particularly significant decreases, with the price of lithium dropping by 75 percent and the prices of cobalt, nickel and graphite falling by between 30 percent and 45 percent, helping drive battery prices 14 percent lower, it said.

Growth

With demand growth remaining robust, these declines were mostly driven by a strong increase in global supply, helping to offset the steep price rises in 2021 and 2022, according to the report. The report finds that while lower prices for critical minerals in the past year have been good news for consumers and affordability, they have also provided a headwind for new investment. In 2023, investment in critical minerals mining grew by 10 percent and exploration spending rose by 15 percent, still healthy, but slower than in 2022. Today's well-supplied market may not be a good guide for the future, with the Outlook noting that demand for critical minerals continues to grow strongly in all IEA scenarios, driven by the deployment of clean energy technologies, it showed. Arab League: Energy security is essential for economic growth

CAIRO, May 20, (KUNA): Assistant Secretary General and Head of the Economic Affairs Sector at the Arab League Dr. Ali Al-Maliki underlined that energy security is vital for impacting economic growth, national security, and citizens' well-being. In a speech delivered on Al-Maliki's behalf by Director of the Energy Department at the Arab League Eng. Jamila Matar, during the 12th Arab Energy Efficiency Day, Al-Maliki underscored the strategic importance of energy security in a world driven by interests and conflicting with strife. He pointed out the challenges in ensuring energy security and transitioning to sustainable sources, encouraging for a comprehensive approach that includes improving energy efficiency, developing renewable energy, protecting critical energy infrastructure, and reducing carbon emissions. Al-Maliki identified energy efficiency as crucial for energy security, aiming to provide energy services at the lowest cost without compromising quality, which involves managing energy demand through various efficiency strategies to reduce consumption in line with national development plans. The Arab Ministerial Council for Electricity (AMCE) has been tracking energy efficiency progress in the region, developing and tracking national energy efficiency plans, where they also prepared a guide on renewable energy and energy efficiency in Arab countries, providing statistical

information on policies and programs aimed at improving energy production and consumption efficiency, he mentioned. Al-Maliki announced the theme for the 12th Arab Energy Efficiency Day competition: "Best Patent in Energy Efficiency," following the decision of the 38th session of AMCE of implementing resolution 294, underlining the role of intellectual property in promoting innovation and achieving sustainable development goals (SDGs). Focusing On his side, Executive Director of the Regional Center for Renewable Energy and Energy Efficiency (RCREEE) Jauad Al-Kharraz described the day as a celebration of energy, focusing on patents due to the Arab world's lag in this area, calling for greater efforts in patent registration, research, and innovation in sustainable energy. Al-Kharraz emphasized the significant role patents play in economic development, supporting decision-making in research, innovation, and investment, stressing the need for a focus on social responsibility to improve economic, social, and cultural conditions by ensuring reliable and equitable energy supplies for all citizens in the Arab region. Meanwhile, First Undersecretary for Research, Planning and Authorities Follow Up at the Egyptian Ministry of Electricity Dr. Ahmad Mohina

discussed Egypt's achievements in energy efficiency, including high-efficiency power plants and substantial investments in electricity transmission, clarifying the urgent need for enhanced efforts in energy efficiency across the Arab world. Approximately USD 10 billion were spent on electricity transmission networks in the past 10 years, he said, noting that Egypt reduced the rate of fuel needed to produce each unit of electricity measurement by 20 percent, which saved about a billion dollars and led to a reduction in emissions harmful to the environment. The Arab League Energy Department, in collaboration with RCREEE, organized the 12th Arab Energy Efficiency Day celebration at its headquarters in Cairo, featuring a session on the best energy efficiency patent competition, won by Qatari Eng. Dr. Yousef Mohammad Yousef Al-Horr for his air conditioning system project. The day also included discussions on the role of research, development, and innovation in achieving energy efficiency goals and the cumulative environmental and social impact of renewable energy projects in the Arab region. The event, attended by senior officials from electricity ministries, international and regional organizations, and major energy companies, underscored the strategic importance and Arab efforts of energy efficiency.

Things to know about an AI safety summit in Seoul

SEOUL, South Korea, May 20, (AP): South Korea is set to host a mini-summit this week on risks and regulation of artificial intelligence, following up on an inaugural AI safety meeting in Britain last year that drew a diverse crowd of tech luminaries, researchers and officials. The gathering in Seoul aims to build on work started at the U.K. meeting on reining in threats posed by cutting edge artificial intelligence systems. Here is what you need to know about the AI Seoul Summit and AI safety issues. What international efforts have been made on AI safety? The Seoul summit is one of many global efforts to create guardrails for the rapidly advancing technology that promises to transform many aspects of society, but has also raised concerns about new risks for both everyday life such as algorithmic bias that skews search results and potential existential threats to humanity. At November's U.K. summit, held at a former secret wartime codebreaking base in Bletchley north of London, researchers, government leaders, tech executives and members of civil society groups, many with opposing views on AI, huddled in closed-door talks. Tesla CEO Elon Musk and OpenAI CEO Sam Altman mingled with politicians like British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak. Delegates from more than two dozen countries including the U.S. and

China signed the Bletchley Declaration, agreeing to work together to contain the potentially "catastrophic" risks posed by galloping advances in artificial intelligence. In March, the U.N. General Assembly approved its first resolution on artificial intelligence, lending support to an international effort to ensure the powerful new technology benefits all nations, respects human rights and is "safe, secure and trustworthy." Earlier this month, the U.S. and China held their first high-level talks on artificial intelligence in Geneva to discuss how to address the risks of the fast-evolving technology and set shared standards to manage it. There, U.S. officials raised concerns about China's "misuse of AI" while Chinese representatives rebuked the U.S. over "restrictions and pressure" on artificial intelligence, according to their governments. What will be discussed at the Seoul Summit? The May 21-22 meeting is co-hosted by the South Korean and U.K. governments. On day one, Tuesday, South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol and Sunak will meet leaders virtually. A few global industry leaders have been invited to provide updates on how they've been fulfilling the commitments made at the Bletchley summit to ensure the safety of their AI models.

key energy transition minerals is set to more than double to USD 770 billion by 2040 in a pathway to net zero emissions by mid-century, it said. Detailed project-by-project analysis suggests that announced projects are sufficient to meet only 70 percent of copper and 50 percent of lithium requirements in 2035 in a scenario

in which countries worldwide meet their national climate goals, according to the IEA report. Markets for other minerals look more balanced if projects come through as scheduled. However, announced projects do not change the high geographical concentration of supply, and China is projected to

retain a very strong position in the refining and processing sector. Secure and sustainable access to critical minerals is essential for smooth and affordable clean energy transitions. The world's appetite for technologies such as solar panels, electric cars and batteries is growing fast, it concluded.

Promising future seen for photovoltaic solar power in Spain

MADRID, May 20, (Xinhua): Photovoltaic (PV) solar energy has a "promising future ahead" and "great potential to expand" in Spain, an industry executive told Xinhua in an interview on Friday. In April, renewables in Spain reached a share of 64.6 percent of total monthly generation. For the first time, three renewable technologies led the mix: wind (22.2 percent), hydro (19.7 percent) and solar photovoltaic (18.8 percent), official figures showed. Solar photovoltaics increased production by 4.4 percent compared to the same month in 2023.

"The demand for solar energy remains high, and there is great potential to expand our business. With government policies increasingly favorable towards renewable energies, we are confident the industry has a promising future ahead," Daniel Fernandez, co-CEO of Spanish company SotySolar, told Xinhua. The firm, which works with European and Chinese manufacturers, began installing PV technology in Spain and Portugal in 2016. "China provides us with products fueled by innovation, while SotySolar guarantees the expansion of photovoltaics and its brands," Fernandez said. Last year, Spain raised its target for reduction of greenhouse gas emissions by 2030 to 32 percent, up from a previous goal of 23 percent. It also elevated its renewables target to 48 percent of final energy production by 2030, reaching 81 percent in electricity while improving energy efficiency to 44 percent. However, Fernandez explained, "although more roofs are seen full of solar panels, obstacles persist such as high initial investment, lack of public awareness and regulatory complexity."

At an industrial level, meanwhile, companies have already understood the advantages of solar power, and more power purchase agreements are being negotiated. Fernandez said these contracts enable companies "to stop suffering from fluctuations in electricity costs, while reducing their energy costs." In 2023, the installation of solar photovoltaic power increased by 28 percent in Spain, bringing an additional 5,594 MW to the generation pool, the highest figure since records began, according to Spanish electricity grid operator Red Elctrica.

secure network. Customers must also create strong passwords that do not include their names, dates of birth, or phone numbers for all e-commerce accounts. They are also advised to adopt Two-Factor Authentication to add an extra layer of security against any hacking attempts."

Behbehani also highlighted: "Shopping should be confined to reputable websites that are known to have safe electronic point of sale systems, ensuring the security of data transfers. Additionally, consumers should be cau-

tious about the personal information they share online and adjust their privacy settings on social media and other platforms to minimize the exposure of information that may be exploited by fraudsters through social engineering. Awareness of common online scams, such as phishing emails and fake websites, is also of great importance."

Behbehani warned against sharing OTP codes with anyone and advised users to carefully read OTP text messages, as they often contain the transaction details and the transaction amount. Addi-

tionally, he emphasized the importance of reviewing the reason for validation before authenticating any process via the Kuwait Mobile ID app.

For more safety, activating notifications to view the details of each online banking transaction processed through all the different types of debit cards is recommended, Behbehani added. Consumers are advised to regularly monitor their bank statements and transaction histories for any signs of unauthorized or suspicious activity, as prompt reporting can prevent further fraud, while the password and PIN should be changed frequently. He also advised keeping track of the social media accounts of local banks and the Central Bank of Kuwait to stay well-informed about the latest methods employed in cyber fraud through the 'Let's Be Aware' campaign.

Philippines marks 126th Independence Day

KUWAIT CITY, May 20: The Embassy of the Republic of the Philippines, Sunday, celebrated the 126th anniversary of the country's independence.

The event was graced by chief guest HE Ambassador Sameeh Essa Johar Hayat, Assistant Foreign Minister for Asian Affairs, Ministry of Foreign Affairs; HE Zubaydullo Zubaydov Ambassador of the Republic of Tajikistan, Dean of the Diplomatic Corps, members of the Diplomatic Corps accredited to Kuwait and invited guests.

Speaking on the occasion, HE Jose A. Cabrera III, the Ambassador of the Republic of the Philippines to Kuwait said, "This occasion holds special significance as it also marks the 46th anniversary of the formal establishment of diplomatic relations between the Philippines and Kuwait on 17 January 1979, which subsequently led to the opening of the Philippine Embassy in Kuwait later that same year.

Developments

"As we celebrate this momentous occasion," he said, "I am pleased to share positive developments regarding the Philippine economy despite facing challenges such as a global economic slowdown, supply chain disruptions, and higher inflation and interest rates.

"In 2023, the Philippine Gross Domestic Product (GDP) grew by 5.6 percent, reaching \$471.52 billion, positioning the Philippine economy as the 33rd largest in the world.

"This growth trend continued into the first quarter of 2024 at 5.7 percent, surpassing expectations despite significant challenges, including the impact of El Nino.

"Moreover, foreign direct investments played a crucial role in driving economic growth, with the Philippine Board of Investments approving USD 22.6 billion worth of investments in 2023, marking a 73% increase from 2022.

"Additionally, inflation has stabilized within the 2 to 4 percent target range, contributing to consumer re-



lief, while unemployment rates have reached their lowest level in 18 years," he added.

Over the years, the Philippines and Kuwait, he said, have forged strong bilateral ties, culminating in eight agreements covering various fields such as labor, fisheries, trade, cultural cooperation, investment, and visa waivers for diplomatic and official passport holders.

The Philippines deeply appreciates Kuwait's humanitarian assistance, particularly through the Kuwait Red Crescent Society (KRCS), which provided aid during disasters such as Typhoon Haiyan in 2013. Moreover, Kuwait has offered valuable scholarship and study programs to Filipino students, fostering educational cooperation between our nations, he added.

Trade between Kuwait and the Philippines has witnessed significant growth, reaching \$387.3 million in 2023, a 72% increase from the previous year. With over 267,000 Filipino workers in Kuwait, "our countries share a strong economic partnership, with Filipino nationals making valuable contributions to Kuwait's economy and society."

Cooperation

He went on to say, the Philippines remains committed to strengthening cooperation with Kuwait across various sectors, including security, climate action, and disaster risk reduction. "We are grateful for the support and cooperation extended by Kuwait, and we look forward to further enhancing our partnership for mutual benefit and prosperity," the Philippines said.

On another note the Philippine envoy said, he is pleased to announce the commencement of preparations for the first parliamentary elections to be held in May 2025 for the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM).

This significant milestone, he said, will mark the completion of major targets outlined under the Comprehensive Agreement on the Bangsamoro, emphasizing the importance of peace and development in Southern Mindanao.

Claudia Al Rashoud shares Kuwait's history at KES

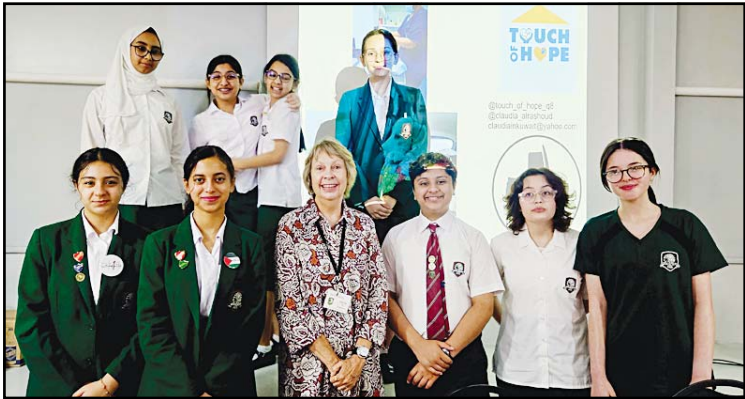

Al Rashoud has dedicated herself to capturing traditional lifestyles and modern developments through her photography, amassing over 5,000 images

Film

LOS ANGELES, May 20, (AP): John Krasinski’s imaginary friends movie “IF” claimed the top spot at the box office this weekend according to studio estimates Sunday. Its \$35 million North American debut was also a bit lower than some projections.

Is that a disappointment? An ominous sign of the box office times? Or is the final story on “ IF “ yet to be written? It’s not just your imagination: In these bumpy early weeks of the 2024 summer box office season, in which nothing has been a runaway hit and every new movie has more and more pressure to succeed, “IF” hit a nerve.

Starring Ryan Reynolds, Cailey Fleming, and an army of A-list voices including Steve Carell, Matt Damon, Emily Blunt, Louis Gossett Jr., Phoebe Waller-Bridge and Maya Rudolph, “IF” was an original idea from Krasinski, who wrote, directed and co-stars.

Paramount debuted the film, which cost a reported \$110 million to produce, in 4,041 locations in North America. Internationally, it earned an estimated \$20 million from 56 markets, adding up to a \$55 million global debut.

“Families came out in force and they loved the film,” said Chris Aronson, who heads Paramount’s domestic distribution.

There are several somewhat contradictory narratives swirling around its performance as well. With its PG-rating, “IF” was the first major family friendly film to open in theaters in weeks. And unlike a front-loaded superhero or horror movie, family pics are often running a mar-

athon not a sprint. Last June, Pixar’s “Elemental” was assumed to be dead on arrival when it opened with \$29.5 million domestically. But it continued earning throughout the summer and ultimately made nearly \$500 million globally.

“IF” got middling reviews from critics (it’s currently sitting at a “rotten” 49% on Rotten Tomatoes), but, as with “Elemental,” audiences gave it a solid A CinemaScore this weekend. The studio considers it a successful debut and is optimistic about its longevity as summer actually begins for school age children.

Summer

“I think it bodes well for moviegoing in general as we move into the summer movie season,” Aronson said. “Kids are out of school starting this coming week and I couldn’t think of a better film to be in the marketplace than this one: It’s new, it’s fresh, its original, and it’s such a heartwarming film.”

“Kingdom of the Planet of the Apes ” continues to be a bright spot. In just 10 days, it surpassed \$100 million domestically and \$237 million globally. It came in second place in its second weekend with \$26 million (down 55%).

But there also hasn’t been a major movie moment akin to last year’s “The Super Mario Bros. Movie,” “Barbie” or “Oppenheimer” in quite some time. Last year on this weekend “Fast X” opened to over \$60 million.

LOS ANGELES: Sean “Diddy” Combs admitted that he beat his ex-girlfriend Cassie in a hotel hallway in 2016 after CNN released video of the attack, saying in a video apology he was “truly sorry” and his actions were “inexcusable.”

“I take full responsibility for my actions in that video. I was disgusted then when I did it. I’m disgusted now,” the music mogul said in a video statement posted Sunday to Instagram and Facebook.

The security video aired Friday shows Combs, wearing only a white towel, punching and kicking Cassie, an R&B singer who was his protegee and longtime girlfriend at the time. The footage also shows Combs shoving and dragging Cassie, and throwing a vase in her direction.

Cassie, whose legal name is Cassandra Ventura, sued Combs in November over what she said was years of sexual, physical and emotional abuse. The suit was settled the next day, but spurred intense scrutiny of Combs, with several more lawsuits filed in the following months, along with a federal criminal sex-trafficking investigation that led authorities to raid Combs’ mansions in Los Angeles and Miami.

He had denied the allegations in the lawsuits, but neither he nor his representatives had responded to the newly emerged video until Sunday.

“It’s so difficult to reflect on the darkest times in your life, but sometimes you got to do that,” Diddy says on the video. He adds, “I went and I sought out professional help. I got into going to therapy, going to rehab. I had to ask God for his mercy and grace. I’m so sorry. But I’m committed to be a better man each and every day. I’m not asking for forgiveness. I’m truly sorry.”

Combs is looking somber and wearing a T-shirt in the selfie-style apology video, and appears to be on a patio. It is the hip-hop mogul’s most direct response and first apology after six months of allegations that have threatened his reputation and career. (AP)

NEW YORK: The man charged with assaulting actor Steve Buscemi on a Midtown street has been held in jail on bond in New York, prosecutors said.

Police have said the 66-year-old actor - known for his roles

in “Boardwalk Empire,” and “ Fargo,” among other performances - was walking in Manhattan on May 8 when a stranger punched him in the face. Police arrested a man Friday in connection with the assault, three days after having released a photo of the suspect.

Buscemi’s publisher has confirmed the attack, and said the actor was treated at a hospital

with injuries to his eye but was otherwise okay.

The accused man, who is 50 years old, was arraigned on Saturday and the judge set bail at \$50,000, prosecutors said. It was unclear if the defendant had a lawyer who could speak for him. A phone message has been left with the local public defender’s office. The suspect is due back in court

on Thursday. (AP)

GENEVA: With an assist from Paul McCartney the Paralympic Games starts its 100-day race on Monday to the opening ceremony in Paris in August.

The former Beatle has let “We All Stand Together” - the signature tune from an award-winning

animated film he wrote and produced 40 years ago - be used in a promotional film for the International Paralympic Committee.

“Sir Paul really understands what we stand for as a movement and he was so generous to us,” IPC president Andrew Parsons told The Associated Press. “He was not difficult to convince, it was something that came very naturally.” (AP)

Actor’s biggest ever gamble for ‘Horizon’

Costner unveils Western epic at Cannes

CANNES, France, May 20, (AP): A month before Kevin Costner puts the first installment of his multi-chapter Western “Horizon: An American Saga” into theaters, the actor-director came to the Cannes Film Festival to unveil his self-financed passion project.

“Two of my boys are out fishing right now,” Costner said with a grin in an interview at the Carlton Hotel. “And the three girls found their way onto a boat. So dad’s in here, stumping for his movie.”

The movie is actually two, or if Costner has his way, four. “Horizon: Chapter One,” which runs three hours, will be released by Warner Bros. in theaters June 28. “Chapter Two” follows August 16. Costner has scripts ready for parts three and four.

It’s only the fourth time Costner, 69, has directed, following 1990’s “Dances With Wolves,” 1997’s “The Postman” and 2003’s “Open Range.” But when he has, Costner has usually done it with a clear-eyed passion for storytelling and character. That’s on display in the wide-ranging epic “Horizon,” with a cast including Sienna Miller, Abbey Lee, Sam Worthington and Costner.

It’s also Costner’s biggest gamble, ever. To raise the money for the \$100 million-plus production, he mortgaged his seaside Santa Barbara, California, estate. He’s been trying to make “Horizon” for more than 30 years.

“I thank God for Cannes. I’m an independent filmmaker, essentially, and I’m here by myself,” said Costner, whose film premiered Sunday. “So this is a high moment for me because it’s helping me create awareness for a movie. I don’t have all the money in the world to expose this movie. But I have my time and a platform here.”

Remarks have been lightly edited for brevity.

AP: What was your calculus in deciding to put your money into “Horizon”? What made it worth it to you?

Costner: You can spend your life just trying to make your pile grow bigger and bigger. And I’ve not been really terribly great at that. I’m like anyone else, I’d like it to be big. But not at the expense of not doing what I feel like I’ve love to do. If no one will help me do it and I believe strongly in its entertainment value – there’s commerce on my mind. But I don’t let it overshadow the entertainment value and essence of what I’m trying to portray. I don’t try to let the fear of that control my instincts on any level. I don’t want to live that way. If

I was watching a movie about me and I thought, “Oo, don’t risk your money and make something like that,” what a (expletive).

AP: Was it an easy decision? You didn’t look around your seaside Santa Barbara estate and question mortgaging it?

Costner: No, it wasn’t an easy decision, but it was the decision I needed to make. It’s like, wow, why am I having to do this? I think I’m making mainstream entertainment. I don’t know what you felt about the movie but I felt like it’s really mainstream. I don’t feel that I’m an avant-garde type of a person. But yet I think my things are a little off. I’m willing to (in a wagon trail scene in the film) see a woman bathe because her desire to be clean was so pronounced. If you’re a woman, who wouldn’t want to be? But then in the next moment, you realize it’s against the rule, man. You could cost yourself your life. So that scene became important to make the next scene important. To me, a scene like that is just as important as a gun fight. And if that kind of scene doesn’t want to exist in a mainstream movie...

AP: Could this have been a series?

Costner: I guess. It will be. They’re going to break this up into a hundred pieces, you know what I mean? After four of these, they’re going to have 13, 14 hours of film and they’re going to turn into 25 hours of TV, and they’re going to do whatever they’re going to do. That’s just the way we live in our life but they’ll also exist in this form. And that was important for me, to make sure that happened. And I was the one who paid for it.

AP: It’s an audacious release plan, with the second film opening two months after the first. What appealed to you about that?

Costner: The studio wanted to try that. I knew this was going to come out fairly quickly, like every four or five months. That may have been easier. But this is something they feel like people can remember the first one and it can tie into the second one. I built into all of them a montage of what’s coming.

AP: Since directing “Dances With Wolves,” you’ve directed “Open Range” and starred in “Wyatt Earp” and “Yellowstone.” What keeps bringing you back to the West?

Costner: I like seeing behavior in men that makes sense. I make movies for men. I just make sure there’s great women characters because that’s really important

to me. The backbone of our movie is actually women. I don’t like boys behaving stupid. I like the little boy who (fleeing an attack) takes the two horses and effectively saves his life. I like seeing people behave honestly in desperate situations. The heroism of a little boy saying “I’ll stay with you, Dad” is a really powerful moment. That’s my son (Hayes Costner) and it was very hard to watch.

AP: In dramatizing the drive West of settlers, what was the Native American perspective you wanted to consider?

Costner: Confusion about it. The colonel says, “If we salt the earth with enough of their dead, the wagons won’t come anymore.” When you’re that far out there, you can’t go. When people said goodbye in the East Coast, they didn’t come back. So the confusion for the Native American was they couldn’t make sense of that. Normally if you kill enough people they won’t bother you. But these Americans, these people were getting flyers saying you could have this land. There are salesmen in every century, every decade selling something they don’t really know what it is. It’s just America. It’s just this giant experiment of hope.

AP: But America means different things to different people, right? You have Chinese immigrants in the film as well.

Costner: When they weren’t useful, they were just cast away. And they had to create a sense of community and they came en masse. They came together and they were very industrious. They’ll be the wealthiest people in that town until there’s a tipping point and racism kicks in and suddenly they’re gone, too. You watch. That’s what would happen in real life.

AP: What I’m getting at is there’s tragedy in this. Do you see westward expansion and your film as a tragedy?

Costner: There’s inevitable tragedy to it. And there’s divisions. You see a whole tribe break in half. You see a father break from a son.

AP: Have you already started shooting the third installment?

Costner: I’ve shot three days and I continue to have to press for money to finish this. I have to figure out what else I can do to make this. But I’m not waiting to see how people feel. I know what this is, and I think if people love the movie experience, they have a really good chance of wanting to see the next one. That’s all I can believe. The prudent thing would be to wait, but I guess I’m not built for that wait.

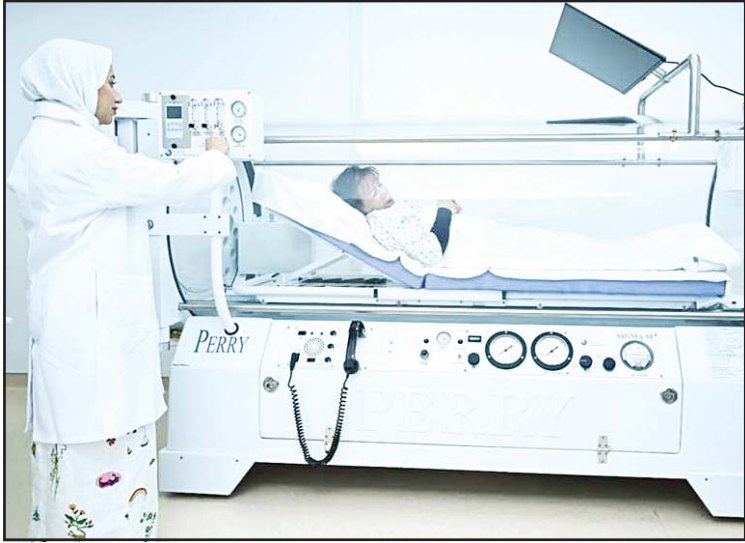

Nutrition expert unveils four key dietary strategies

Dr. Fajr offers tips to combat cancer through diet

KUWAIT CITY, May 20: Dr. Fajr Al Jumairi, a specialist in public health and community nutrition, sheds light on the pivotal role of nutrition in bolstering the body's defenses against cancer, reports Al-Qabas daily.

She underscores four key factors that influence the body's ability to combat cancer cells and emphasizes the significance of incorporating anti-cancer foods into one's diet.

Dr Al-Jumairi highlights the importance of blood flow to cancer cells for their growth and proliferation. Larger capillaries facilitate this process, whereas weaker and thinner ones impede it, allowing the immune system to eradicate cancer cells.

Foods rich in certain nutrients can help reduce the mass of blood capillaries around cancer cells. These include organic soy, artichoke, pars-

ley, garlic, turmeric, various berries, pomegranate, grapes with seeds, green tea, red tea, and bone broth soup.

Stem cells, she says play a crucial role in cell regeneration and preventing mutations that could lead to cancer. Al-Jumairi notes that populations following the Mediterranean diet, rich in leafy greens, vegetables, seafood, legumes, and healthy fats, exhibit higher levels of stem cells.

Additionally, consuming dark chocolate with a high cocoa content can increase stem cell production.

Saying beneficial bacteria in the gut help prevent cancer cell mutation by supporting digestion, nutrient absorption, and immune function, Dr Al-Jumairi, emphasizes the importance of maintaining a healthy microbiome, particularly by promoting the growth of Akkermansia bacteria.

Foods that can enhance Akkermansia levels include pomegranate, berries, and raw almonds or walnuts.

The DNA damage from factors like sunlight, toxins, and environmental pollutants can contribute to disease development. Ensuring DNA health is vital for disease prevention and Dr Al-Jumairi recommends consuming organic black coffee, dark green leafy vegetables, and vitamin C-rich foods to support DNA integrity.

In conclusion, Al-Jumairi underscores the importance of adhering to a balanced diet rich in nutrient-dense foods to support the body's natural defenses against cancer. While nutrition plays a crucial role, she also emphasizes the importance of following prescribed treatment plans and undergoing regular medical check-ups for cancer patients.

Ex-NASA candidate flies with Blue Origin

Ed Dwight soars into space at age 90

VAN HORN, Texas, May 20, (AP): Ed Dwight, America's first Black astronaut candidate, finally rocketed into space 60 years later, flying with Jeff Bezos' rocket company on Sunday.

Dwight was an Air Force pilot when President John F. Kennedy championed him as a candidate for NASA's early astronaut corps. But he wasn't picked for the 1963 class.

Dwight, now 90, went through a few minutes of weightlessness with five other passengers aboard the Blue Origin capsule as it skimmed space on a roughly 10-minute flight. He called it "a life changing experience."

"I thought I really didn't need this in my life," Dwight said shortly after exiting the capsule. "But, now, I need it in my life I am ecstatic."

The brief flight from West Texas made Dwight the new record-holder for oldest person in space - nearly two months older than "Star Trek" actor William Shatner was when he went up in 2021.

It was Blue Origin's first crew launch in nearly two years. The company was grounded following a 2022 accident in which the booster came crashing down but the capsule full of experiments safely parachuted to the ground. Flights resumed last December, but with no one aboard. This was Blue Origin's seventh time flying space tourists.

Dwight, a sculptor from Denver, was joined by four business entrepreneurs from the U.S. and France and a retired accountant. Their ticket prices were not disclosed; Dwight's seat was sponsored in part by the nonprofit Space for Humanity.

Dwight was among the potential astronauts the Air Force recommended to NASA. But he wasn't chosen for the 1963 class, which included eventual Gemini and Apollo astronauts, including Apollo 11's Buzz Aldrin and Michael Collins. NASA didn't select Black astronauts until 1978, and Guion Bluford became the first African American in space in 1983. Three years earlier, the Soviets launched the first Black astronaut, Arnaldo Tamayo Mendez, a Cuban of African descent.

After leaving the military in 1966,

High-frequency

China's radar network aids space weather forecasting

BEIJING, May 20, (Xinhua): China has built a mid-latitude high-frequency radar network in the country's northern regions to provide high-quality detection data for global space weather forecast and warning.

The first batch of scientific detection results of the network was released at an international workshop of the Super Dual Auroral Radar Network (SuperDARN), which opened in Beijing on Monday.

The network, constructed by the National Space Science Center (NSSC) under the Chinese Academy of Sciences, was completed in October 2023. It's also a part of the second phase of China's Meridian Project, a space weather monitoring network comprising ground-based stations.

China has made new breakthroughs in high-frequency coherent scattering radar technology and scientific research, and will deepen international cooperation in this field, said NSSC.

The ionosphere is home to all the charged particles in Earth's atmosphere. It's also home to many spacecraft including the space stations. Ionospheric irregularities can disrupt signals, scientists say.

Six high-frequency coherent scattering radars were set up in Jilin Province, Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region and Xinjiang Uygur Autonomous Region in northern regions of China.

This high-frequency radar chain achieves large-scale continuous detection of ionospheric irregularities in mid and high latitudes of the Asian sector. The detection range can reach 4,000 km from south to north, and the east-west span exceeds 12,000 km, according to NSSC.

The high-frequency radar chain is expected to join the SuperDARN, a global network of scientific radars monitoring conditions in the near-

Earth space environment, and realize real-time data exchange and sharing with databases in the United Kingdom and Canada.

The SuperDARN, which has members from a dozen of countries including the UK, the United States, Canada, Japan, China, France, Italy, Norway, Australia and South Africa, is also one of the main international organizations participating in the International Meridian Circle Program proposed by China.

Also:

LOS ANGELES: NASA plans to launch a new mission this month to study the heat loss from Earth's polar regions and provide information on changing climate, NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL) said recently.

The mission, named the Polar Radiant Energy in the Far-Infrared Experiment (PREFIRE), will study two of the most remote regions on Earth: the Arctic and Antarctic.

A pair of shoebox-size climate satellites will be launched to measure the amount of heat the planet emits into space from these polar regions. Each of PREFIRE's cube satellites, or CubeSats, will use a thermal infrared spectrometer to measure the heat, in the form of far-infrared energy, radiated into space by Earth's surface and atmosphere.

The data from the mission will help improve our understanding of the greenhouse effect at the poles -- specifically, the capacity of water vapor, clouds, and other elements of Earth's atmosphere to trap heat and keep it from radiating into space, according to the JPL. Researchers will use this information to update climate and ice models, which will lead to better predictions of how sea level, weather, and snow and ice cover are likely to change in a warming world.

Dwight joined IBM and started a construction company before earning a master's degree in sculpture in the late 1970s. He's since dedicated himself to art. His sculptures focus on Black history and include memorials and monuments across the country. Several of his sculptures have flown into space.

'Medications can effectively suppress virus'

HIV-positive mothers can now breastfeed

NEW YORK, May 20, (AP): People with HIV can breastfeed their babies, as long as they are taking medications that effectively suppress the virus that causes AIDS, a top US pediatricians' group said Monday in a sharp policy change.

The new report from the American Academy of Pediatrics reverses recommendations it had in place since the start of the HIV epidemic in the 1980s.

It recognizes that routinely prescribed drugs can reduce the risk of transmitting HIV via breast milk to less than 1%, said Dr. Lisa Abuogi, a pediatric HIV expert at the University of Colorado and lead author of the report.

"The medications are so good now and the benefits for mom and baby are so important that we are at a point where it is important to engage in shared decision-making," Abuogi said.

The drugs, known as antiretroviral therapy, don't eliminate all risk of transmitting HIV through breast milk. Avoiding breastfeeding is the only certain way to prevent spreading the virus, Abuogi said.

In addition, parents must breastfeed

exclusively for the babies' first six months because research shows that switching between breast milk and formula can disrupt an infant's gut in ways that increase the risk of HIV infection.

About 5,000 people who have HIV give birth in the US each year. Nearly all take drugs to suppress the virus to very low levels, Abuogi said, though viral levels can rebound if they don't stay on them.

Infections

Before the medications became widely available starting a decade ago, about 30% of HIV infections transmitted from moms to babies occurred during breastfeeding, said Dr. Lynne Mofenson, an adviser to the Elizabeth Glaser Pediatric AIDS Foundation. In the early 1990s, about 2,000 infections occurred in U.S. infants each year. Today, it's fewer than 30.

The AAP policy comes more than a year after the National Institutes of Health and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reversed longstanding recommendations against breastfeeding by people with HIV.

That guidance said people who have consistent viral suppression should be counseled on their options. It also emphasizes that health care providers shouldn't alert child protective services agencies if a parent with HIV seeks to breastfeed.

The goal is listening to patients "and not blaming or shaming them," said Dr. Lynn Yee, a Northwestern University professor of obstetrics and gynecology who helped draft the NIH guidance.

Breastfeeding provides ideal nutrition for babies and protects them against illnesses and conditions such as obesity and Type 2 diabetes, research shows. Nursing also reduces the mother's risk of breast and ovarian cancer, diabetes and high blood pressure.

The World Health Organization has recommended since 2010 that women with HIV in developing countries breastfeed their infants and have access to antiretroviral therapy. The guidance weighed the risk of infants acquiring HIV through breastfeeding and the risk of babies dying from malnutrition, diarrhea and pneumonia in places where safe replacements for breast milk aren't available.

Hyderabad tops Punjab to finish second in IPL table

HYDERABAD, India, May 20, (AP): Abhishek Sharma smacked 66 runs off 28 balls as Sunrisers Hyderabad beat Punjab Kings by four wickets to finish second in the Indian Premier League points table after the second game between Rajasthan Royals and Kolkata Knight Riders was abandoned without a ball being bowled because of rain.

Kolkata had opted to bowl after winning the toss in Guwahati. The match was shortened to seven overs a side, but the game hadn’t been able to start at the cut-off time of 10:56 p.m IST. That meant both Kolkata and Rajasthan were awarded a point each. Kolkata finished atop the table on 20 points and will take on Sunrisers Hyderabad (17 points) in Qualifier 1 in Ahmedabad on Tuesday. Rajasthan (17) finished third and will play Royal Challengers

ers Bengaluru in the eliminator on Wednesday, also in Ahmedabad. Bengaluru had secured the fourth playoff spot after beating defending champions Chennai Super Kings on Saturday. Earlier, Sharma hit five fours and six sixes as Hyderabad equalled its highest run-chase on its home ground, finishing with 215-6 in 19.1 overs. Punjab chose to bat first and scored 214-5 with Prabhsimran Singh scoring a 45-ball 71. Punjab made a good start. Singh hit seven fours and four sixes, putting on 97 off 55 balls with Atharva Taide who scored 46. Left-arm pacer T Natarajan (2-33) provided the breakthrough but Singh put on another 54 off 32 balls with Rilee Rossouw. Shashank Singh was run out for two, after Singh’s dismissal in the 15th over, but Rossouw carried the innings forward with 45 off 24 balls. Stand-in captain Jitesh Sharma scored 32 not out off 15 balls to take Punjab past 200.

Rajasthan vs. Kolkata game washed out

Co-hosts from the Caribbean aiming to defy history and win a 3rd T20 WC title

KINGSTON, May 20, (AP): After leading the West Indies to two Twenty20 World Cup titles as a captain, Daren Sammy has to defy history to win again as a head coach. No host has won the tournament on home soil in the first eight editions, a trend Sammy is hoping to break with the 2024 T20 World Cup being staged in the United States and the Caribbean. Sri Lanka went the closest by reaching the final in 2012 before losing to West Indies in Colombo. That win is widely remembered for the ‘Gangnam Style’ celebrations of the Caribbean players after Sri Lanka was bowled out for 101 in pursuit of a 138-run target. Four years later, a fearless brand of West Indies cricket set the Eden Gardens alight in India, where Carlos Brathwaite hit four consecutive sixes against Ben Stokes in the final over to steer the Caribbean team a second T20 World Cup title. Sammy was appointed head coach of the West Indies limited-overs squads last year. His past teammates Johnson Charles and Andre Russell, T20’s most accomplished allrounder, are the only two-time champions still in the squad. “We know how to select winning teams,” Sammy said in a news conference with Caribbean media to announce the squad. “We’ve done it before and I think, as a selection group, we’re really excited about it.” “It’s an exciting time, and this preparation did not start now. It started from the last World Cup in Australia,” Sammy was quoted as

saying by CNC3. “What we’ve been able to do throughout the last year as a T20 group, the players we’ve exposed, has brought us to this moment, and I think we’re about to ‘knock it out of this world.’” Curtley Ambrose, the great West Indies pace bowler, was confident the squad could play the consistent, smart cricket required to win a third title. West Indies and England are the only teams to have won the title twice, and no host has ever won, he said, “so all that is motivation for the guys to do well.”

The last two T20 World Cups in the United Arab Emirates in 2021 and Australia in 2022 didn’t go well for West Indies. Kieron Pollard’s team was eliminated in the group stage in the UAE with just one win. Nicholas Pooran’s side didn’t qualify for the main round in Australia the following year. It was a setback for West Indies cricket, which dates back to the late 1800s when a collection of mainly English-speaking Caribbean nations and territories began playing under a unified banner. And it’s something Sammy’s squad is determined to put right, coming off some solid individual performances in the Indian Premier League. Without the pressure of the captaincy, Pooran could be a key to success in the middle-order. The left-hander had an impressive out-

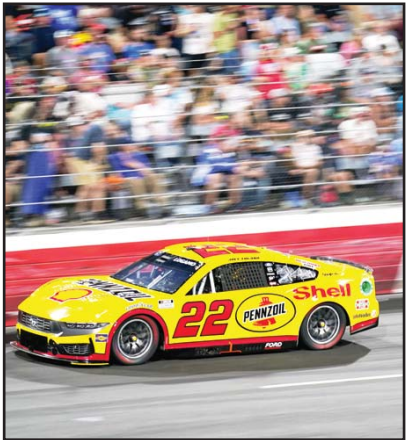

NORTH WILKESBORO, May 20, (AP): A little prep work paid off for Joey Logano. Logano dominated the short track at North Wilkesboro Speedway leading all but one of 200 laps to win his second All-Star Race on Sunday night and earn \$1 million. Logano started on the pole after posting the fastest time in qualifying on Saturday and was never really challenged, setting a record by leading more laps than any driver has in the race’s 40-year history. “We were so fast,” Logano said. “We came here before and tested and ran over 800 laps and really figured out what it was going to take to win the race.” He also won the All-Star Race in 2016. Denny Hamlin finished second and Chris Buescher third in a race that lacked drama for the second straight year at the renovated track. Kyle Larson, who arrived about an hour before the race after spending the afternoon qualifying fifth for the Indianapolis 500 and flying to North Wilkesboro, finished fourth and came up short in the quest to tie Jimmie Johnson for the most All-Star Race wins with four after starting at the back of the field.

The newly paved track and different versions of soft tires were supposed to create more passing. They didn’t. Hamlin admitted afterward that he just couldn’t get the lead. “I would run to him, and then you couldn’t pass,” Hamlin said. “I would lose a little bit of air there, and I would try to give my car a break and then run to him again - just have to be so much faster to get around.” Said Logano: “If it wasn’t for the clean air (and being out front) I would not have won.” Team Penske president Michael Nelson called it a great day for the organization after they swept the top three starting spots at Indianapolis 500 earlier in the day. “We have been close this year (in NASCAR) and to finally make it happen on a day like today, if you had to wait this was the day to get that done,” Nelson said. “A great day for Mr. Penske and the whole organization.” There only real fireworks came on the second lap when Kyle Busch sent Ricky Stenhouse Jr. into the wall after Stenhouse tried to pass him on the first lap. An upset Stenhouse pulled his wrecked car down pit lane and parked in Busch’s pit stall, got out and climbed a ladder to yell at Busch’s crew. Afterward, Stenhouse confronted Busch in the pits, then threw a punch at Busch igniting a scuffle that involved members of both crews. Stenhouse said that he was tired of Busch “running his mouth talking about me” after he had

wrecked him at Daytona in the past. “I know he is frustrated because he doesn’t run as well as he used to,” Stenhouse said after the race. Larson was the big story ahead of the race. He arrived at North Wilkesboro Speedway about an hour before the race following a busy afternoon. His plane landed at Wilkes County Airport and was then transported via helicopter to the racetrack and then taken by golf cart to his hauler to begin preparations for the 200-lap exhibition race. Fans cheered his arrival into the track and he waved to them along the way. NASCAR and its broadcast partner FOX helped accommodate the sport’s star attraction and points leader by moving the start of the race back 16 minutes to 8:30 p.m. to ensure he would arrive in time after shocking some in the racing world by qualifying for the Fast 6 at Indianapolis. Larson will have to do it again next weekend when he attempts to run the double and finish the Indianapolis 500 and the Coca-Cola 600 in Charlotte, North Carolina. Seventeen drivers qualified for the race based on their past accomplishments. All-Star Open winner Ty Gibbs and second place finisher Bubba Wallace advanced into the race on Sunday, along with fan vote winner Noah Gragson. Hendrick Motorsports vice president of competition Chad Knaus marveled at what Larson was able to do in his first qualifying runs in Indianapolis in an open-wheel racecar against the best drivers in the world. “We were watching him run and we were like, my gosh, I can’t believe this,” Knaus said. “I was like my goodness how did that happen? Very limited track time. Did a couple of tests. Was able to go up there and he holds a pretty good wheel as anybody I have seen. He is a phenomenal talent. He gets it. He is so emotionally stable. You can put him in just about any environment and he is going to excel.”

PSG grab league title

Brest secure CL spot in French league

PARIS, May 20, (AP): Brest secured the final automatic berth in next season’s Champions League with a 3-0 win at Toulouse that sealed a third-place finish for the surprise package of the French league on a dramatic final day. Heading into the last round of matches, Lille and Brest were level on points behind already-crowned champion Paris Saint-Germain and Monaco, with Lille ahead only by a difference of two goals. Lille looked set for a third place finish but blew a 2-1 lead against Nice in added time to draw 2-2, dropping into fourth place. After the expansion of Europe’s top club competition from next season, the French league will have three automatic spots in the tournament rather than two. Brest, whose attack-minded approach developed by coach Eric Roy has been a pleasure for fans to watch this season, will play in Europe for the first time. Its previous best league finish was eighth. The club stadium holds 15,000 compared to PSG’s capacity of nearly 49,000 at Parc des Princes, while PSG’s yearly budget of 700 million euros (\$763 million) dwarfs Brest’s 48 million euros (\$52 million) - among the smallest in the league. The small club from the Brittany region’s trophy cabinet is also small - the club won the second division in 1981. Lille captain Benjamin Andre thought he had scored the winner in the 73rd minute with a powerful and precise header from a corner but the hosts could not hold onto their lead as Jordan Lotomba found the net with a header between the legs of Lille goalkeeper Vito Mannone. Roy has done a remarkable rebuilding job at Brest. The team was in the relegation zone when he was hired midway through last season and finished

14th. Roy had been 12 years without a coaching job, too. Mahdi Camara, Jordan Amavi and Kenny Lala scored Brest’s goals. Already crowned champion for a record-extending 12th time, PSG concluded its campaign with a 2-0 win at Metz that condemned the hosts to a relegation playoff. Carlos Soler and Lee Kang-in scored PSG’s goals. PSG finished top of the league with 76 points, nine more than second-place Monaco, which thrashed Nantes 4-0. PSG was without star striker Kylian Mbappé, who was left out of the Paris Saint-Germain squad for the final French league game of the season amid media reports that he spent the weekend at the Cannes film festival. Mbappé is leaving PSG after seven seasons at the French league club.

Asked to comment, PSG did not give a reason to explain Mbappé’s absence. Ousmane Dembélé, Vitinha, Marquinhos, Fabian Ruiz and Gianluigi Donnarumma also sat out the trip to Metz. Unless PSG coach Luis Enrique decides to snub him, Mbappé will have a final occasion to play with PSG in the French Cup final on May 25 against Lyon. Lyon captain Alexandre Lacazette scored a brace in a 2-1 win over Strasbourg, including one goal deep in added time, to help Lyon finish in sixth place ahead of Lens, which was held 2-2 at home by Montpellier. Nine-time champion Marseille concluded a mediocre season with a rare victory on the road, a 2-1 win at Le Havre. In a contest between two teams that will be demoted to the second-tier of French soccer next season, Lorient demolished last-place Clermont 5-0.

Paris organizers launching a campaign to boost ticket sales for Paralympics

PARIS, May 20, (AP): With 100 days until the Paralympics begin, Paris organizers are delivering a message from the athletes in a bid to boost ticket sales: I am not missing anything, except you. The countdown campaign for the Aug 28-Sept. 8 Paralympic Games begun Monday. It features three Paralympic athletes, each of them alone in an empty stadium. The campaign slogan - “Il ne me manque rien, sauf vous” (I’m not missing anything, except you) - is a rallying call to get people to come along and watch them competing.

The French athletes featured in the campaign are Arnaud Assoumani, a long jump and triple jump specialist who won gold at the 2008 Games in Beijing; wheelchair tennis player Pauline Déroulède, and blind soccer player Gaël Rivière who was a European championship winner two years ago. He plays at club level for Bondy Cécifoot Club - in the same suburb where France star Kylian Mbappé grew up. National broadcaster France Télévisions will show the campaign in a bid to raise awareness and - ultimately - boost

sales. So far, 900,000 of the 2.8 million tickets have been sold. A total of 4,400 athletes will take part in the Paralympics. Tickets are available from 15 euros (\$16) for track and field sessions at Stade de France, wheelchair tennis at Roland Garros, or blind soccer at the foot of the Eiffel Tower. The finals cost from 25 (\$27) euros and it’s 45 euros (\$49) to watch the closing ceremony. Ticket sales could escalate once posters start appearing around Paris, with organizers aiming to raise awareness and in-

crease fan engagement and solidarity. There will be 651 posters dotted around the city, 972 on the subway and a further 2,520 on the sides of buses. On Tuesday, four Paralympic athletes will walk up the famed steps at the Cannes Film Festival along with Paris 2024 Olympic head Tony Estanguet. Of the tickets sold so far, organizers said 300,000 have been bought by the state and 150,000 by the International Olympic Committee and National Paralympic Committee.

Schauffele wins first major

Korda continues fine form

LOUISVILLE, Ky., May 20, (AP): Xander Schauffele cashed in at just the right time Sunday, swirling in a 6-foot birdie putt on the final hole to win the PGA Championship for his first major with the lowest score in major championship history.

The Olympic gold medalist got something even more valuable in silver - that enormous Wanamaker Trophy after a wild week at Valhalla.

Schauffele closed with a 6-under 65 to beat Bryson DeChambeau, who made a 10-foot birdie putt on the par-5 18th for a 64.

Schauffele became the first player

Troon.

Masters champion Scottie Scheffler, whose week included an arrest and brief jail time right before his second round for not following police directions, shot 65 and tied for eight.

Schauffele moved to No. 2 in the world and secured his spot in the Olympics.

Nelly Korda won a back nine showdown with Hannah Green of Australia with a par on the 18th hole to capture the Mizuho Americas Open by a stroke Sunday for her sixth win in seven starts on the LPGA Tour this year.

The victory made the 25-year-old Korda the first player since Inbee Park (2013) to record six wins in a single season. Korda also bounced back from seeing her record-tying five-tournament winning streak snapped last week by Rose Zhang at the Cognizant Founders Cup.

Zhang withdrew Thursday after three holes with an intestinal issue.

After playing the front nine in 2 over, Korda matched birdies with Green on the 10th, 13th and 15th holes at scenic Liberty National to stay tied with Green. The Australian's two wins this year made her the only other multiple winner on tour this year.

After Korda put her drive in the fairway on the par-4, No. 18, Green pulled her drive into the left rough. Her second to the green was short and left and still in the rough and she failed to get up-and-down for par to force a playoff.

Harry Higgs made eagle on the par-5 18th hole Sunday to force a playoff with Tanner Gore, and then made birdie on the first extra hole to capture the AdventHealth Championship on the Korn Ferry Tour.

It was a sudden turnaround at the end. Higgs was three shots behind

when he made his eagle putt for a 6-under 66. Gore, a Monday qualifier, took bogey on the 17th and then narrowly missed a birdie putt for the win on the closing hole. He shot 69.

Higgs, who grew up in the area, was projected to move to No. 7 on the points list, a big step toward returning to the PGA Tour.

Dalton Ward birdied his last two holes for a 64 and missed the playoff by one shot.

Fiona Xu closed with an 8-under 64 to win the Copper Rock Championship by seven shots. She set the Epson Tour record by finishing the 54-hole event at 22-under 194. Takahiro Hataji won for the second time this year when he closed with a 3-under 67 for a three-shot victory in the Kansai Open on the Japan Golf Tour. Hataji also won the New Zealand Open before the Japan tour season began.

Alexandra Forsterling of Germany won the Amundi German Masters for her fourth Ladies European Tour title in the last nine months. She shot 5-under 67 in the final round and defeated Emma Spitz of Austria in a playoff. ... Harry Hillier, who shot a 59 in the second round, closed with a 5-under 67 for an eight-shot victory in the Inter Rapidissimo Golf Championship in Bogota on the PGA Tour Americas. It was the sixth sub-60 round on tours around the world this year.

Rio Takeda closed with a 4-under 68 and won the Bridgestone Ladies Open by two shots on the Japan LPGA.

Hyunkyung Park lost a 3-up lead early and then won the last two holes for a 1-up victory over Ye Won Lee in the Doosan Match Play on the Korea LPGA.

Boca sink Central Cordoba: Boca Juniors recovered from a two-goal deficit to secure a 4-2 away win over Central Cordoba in Argentina's Primera Division on Sunday.

Rodrigo Atencio and Mateo Sanabria gave the hosts a 2-0 lead before Ezequiel Fernandez and Miguel Merentiel netted twice each after the interval at Estadio Unico.

The result leaves the Buenos Aires giants 10th in the 28-team top flight standings with three points from their first two games while Central Cordoba are last, having yet to pick up a point. (Xinhua)

For now competition is still evident

Is Man City dominance making EPL boring?

MANCHESTER, England, May 20, (AP): After the celebrations come the questions.

A fourth straight Premier League title for Manchester City marks an unprecedented period of dominance by one team in English soccer. A sixth in seven seasons underlines City's superiority in a league that is widely regarded as the most competitive - and certainly the most popular - in the sport.

But does City's pre-eminence mean England's top division is in danger of becoming a turn-off for billions of fans around the world? Pep Guardiola doesn't think so.

"It's boring? It's not. It is so difficult," the City manager said last week as his team closed in on another title.

City's run of success bares comparison to the likes of Germany where Bayern Munich had turned the Bundesliga into a one-horse race until its 11-year winning streak was ended by Bayer Leverkusen this season. Paris Saint-Germain has won 10 of the last 12 titles in France. Celtic has won all but one of the last 13 in Scotland.

None of those leagues are as popular as England's top flight and a lack of competition could be a reason why.

That is not City's problem. But if four in a row becomes five, six, seven, it could be a problem for all of England's leading clubs if it impacts on the revenues generated by the sale of global broadcast rights.

The competition is what makes the Premier League such box office entertainment. And, for now, that competition is still evident.

City needed to win its final game of the season against West Ham to finally hold off the challenge of Arsenal and clinch the title by two points. It was the third time Guardiola's team had been taken to the final day of the campaign

before being crowned champion, having twice been pushed all the way by Liverpool.

While the headline figure tells the story of City's near unbroken rule over the past seven seasons, the detail shows just how closely they were challenged, with Liverpool missing out by just one point in 2019 and 2022.

Liverpool amassed totals of 97 and 92 points in those campaigns - more than any team that hasn't gone on to win the title. A total of 97 points would have been enough to win the title in all but two other Premier League seasons - in 2018 when City set a new record of 100 points and in 2022 when Liverpool ended its 30-year wait to be champion with 99.

That is a measure of the heights City has had to reach to stay ahead of the rest. Even last season it had to over-

come an Arsenal team that spent 248 days at the top of the standings - the most for any team that hasn't gone on to win the title.

This season Arsenal set a new club record for wins (28) and goals (91) in the Premier League - even surpassing its last title-winning team from 2004, which went an entire league campaign unbeaten.

"Before it was Liverpool to push our limits and now it was Arsenal," Guardiola said. "We got the message from Mikel (Arteta) and his players. We have to make the right decisions in the next years because they are here to stay." City's dominance has certainly been underpinned by the fabu-

France, Lithuania and Poland advanced from the men's category,

The 3x3 competition at the Paris 2024 will take place at Place de La Concorde on July 30-August 5.

Timberwolves end Nuggets title defense

Pacers make Eastern Conference finals

DENVER, May 20, (AP): Anthony Edwards overcame a slow start and the Timberwolves roared back from a 20-point second-half deficit to eliminate the reigning NBA champion Denver Nuggets 98-90 in a Game 7 Minnesota masterpiece.

The Timberwolves overcame a 15-point halftime deficit - the largest comeback in a Game 7 in NBA playoff history - behind Edwards, who had just four points, no rebounds and three assists at halftime but finished with 16 points, eight boards and seven assists.

His impact belied his 6-of-24 shoot-

ing that included a 2-for-10 3-point performance.

As the seconds ticked away, Edwards dribbled the ball upcourt and took time to wave good-bye to the crowd.

The Wolves, who got 23 points each from Karl-Anthony Towns and Jaden McDaniels, advanced to the Western Conference finals for the first time in exactly 20 years. They'll face the Dallas Mavericks beginning Wednesday night at Target Center.

The Nuggets became the fifth consecutive defending champion to fail to reach the conference finals. Behind Jamal Murray's 24 first-half points, the Nuggets raced to a 53-38 halftime lead and Murray's 3-pointer with 10:50 left in the third pushed Denver's lead to 58-38.

The Wolves turned to their defense, the NBA's stingiest, to get back into the game, and they closed the quarter on a 28-9 run to pull to 67-66 heading into the fourth.

Rudy Gobert gave the Wolves their first lead since the first quarter with a bucket to start the fourth and when Towns picked up his fifth foul, Naz Reid, the NBA's Sixth Man of the Year, was spectacular at both

ends of the floor to keep Minnesota ahead.

Tyrese Haliburton scored 26 points and the Pacers set an NBA playoff record by shooting 67.1% from the field, beating the New York Knicks 130-109 on Sunday to advance to the Eastern Conference finals for the first time in 10 years.

The Pacers averaged 123.3 points during the regular season, sixth highest in league history, and set an NBA record by scoring 140 11 times.

They haven't slowed down much in the playoffs.

The Pacers made 29 of their 38 shots in the first half, a shooting percentage of 76.3% that was the highest in the postseason since 1997, when the NBA began keeping detailed play-by-play for all four quarters. They led 70-55 at that point and pulled away every time the Knicks tried to make a run in the second half.

The No. 6-seeded Pacers advanced to face top-seeded Boston in a se-

ries that begins Tuesday. Indiana last reached the conference finals in 2014, losing to Miami.

Jalen Brunson left in the second half with a broken left hand, one final injury for a Knicks team that was decimated by them.

They got OG Anunoby back Sunday after he missed the previous four games with a strained left hamstring, but he clearly wasn't moving well and was taken out of the game after just five minutes.

Pascal Siakam and Andrew Nembhard each scored 20 points and Aaron Nesmith was 8 for 8 en route to his 19 for the Pacers.

Donte DiVincenzo made nine 3-pointers and scored 39 points for the Knicks, who were trying to reach the conference finals for the first time since 2000 but couldn't overcome the losses of Julius Randle, Mitchell Robinson and Bojan Bogdanovic, before losing Anunoby and finally Brunson.

Chinese dominate

Al-Rajhi 'finishes' 5th in 400m final

TOKYO, May 20, (Agencies): Kuwaiti athlete Faisal Al-Rajhi concluded the men's 400 meters T54 final at the Para Athletics World Championships on Monday, securing a fifth-place finish. His impressive performance saw him clocking in at 46.78 seconds. Meanwhile, China's Hu Yang clinched the gold medal with a Championship record time of 44.98 seconds in the event held at the Kobe Universiade Memorial Stadium in Western Japan.

Prior to this, on Saturday, the 25-year-old Al-Rajhi had a remarkable victory, securing the gold medal in the 5,000-meter wheelchair race, showcasing his exceptional talent ahead of the

upcoming Paralympic Games in Paris 2024. Additionally, he is scheduled to compete in the 1,500 meters and 800 meters races during the Kobe games.

Throughout the nine-day championships, which run until May 25, Kuwait has fielded a team of four athletes. Alongside Al-Rajhi, the team includes Dhari Buti competing in the men's shot put F37 category, Tokyo Paralympics bronze medalist Faisal Sorour in the men's shot put F63 event, and Malak Ali participating in the women's javelin throw F54 discipline.

Meanwhile, China impressed the Universiade Memorial Stadium in Kobe with a clean sweep of all three medals in the men's 400m T54 final at the Para Athletics World Championships on Monday.
