Oil Minister affirms deeply rooted oil ties with Vietnam

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 4, (KUNA): Kuwaiti Minister of Oil, Electricity and Water Dr Khaled Al-Fadhel affirmed on Wednesday, the deeply rooted relations in field of oil shared between Kuwait and Vietnam.

Al-Fadhel told KUNA that he met with Vietnamese Prime Minister Nguyen Xuan Phuc and Vietnam's Minister of Industry and Trade Tran Tuan Anh and discussed exchanging expertise and trade relations, especially in the oil sector.

Al-Fadhel stressed importance of Kuwait's mission to invest in Vietnam, most importantly the oil sector.

Vietnamese officials applauded remarkable improvement in the Nghi Son Refinery Petrochemical Complex project, stressing Vietnam's keenness and support for the success of the project, which estimates 40 percent of market fuel needs, he added.

Al-Fadhel expressed deep appreciation to Vietnamese government efforts in the project and hailed the relations between Vietnam, Japan and Kuwait.

The Nghi Son Refinery Petrochemical Complex project established in April 2008 between Kuwait Petroleum International (KPI) by 35.1 percent, Vietnam Petrovietnam 25.1 percent, Japan Idemitsu Kosan by 35.1 percent and Mitsui Chemicals Inc. 4.7 percent.

Kuwait Voluntary Work Center announced Wednesday that the Union of Consumer Co-Operative Societies (UCCS) agreed on replacing plastic bags with environment-friendly biodegradable bags.

The remarks were made to KUNA by the center's Chairperson Sheikha Amthal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah, after meeting with advisors from the Environment Public Authority (EPA), deputy chairman of the UCCS Khaled Al-Hodheiban and heads of co-operative societies.

Nine new cases of human trafficking reported

PAM committed to rights of workers

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 4: The Public Authority of Manpower has confirmed its keenness to implement international standards in the field of work and workers, and to protect their rights in line with the law, reports Al-Rai daily.

The daily quoting sources said the PAM also deports workers including domestic helpers if they are carriers of contagious diseases or if they are infected with AIDS or if the person is known to have past criminal record.

The daily disclosed one of the workers was recently deported because she was a carrier of AIDS. The daily said after the first result proved positive her blood re-examined which confirmed the disease.

The Ministry of Interior has meanwhile referred nine new issues of human trafficking to the Public Prosecution, reports Al-Qabas daily.

Sources familiar with the issue said those involved in human trafficking are individuals and compa-

nies who allegedly brought the workers into the country under the employment of fake companies.

The same sources indicated each visa is sold for between 2,000 and 1,500 dinars, depending on the nationality of the person.

The sources pointed out the human rights activists played a big role in helping the security authorities unearth this illegal activity, and asserted Kuwait continues to fight all forms of human trafficking.
