Kuwait hails Sudan deal

KUWAIT CITY, May 13, (KUNA): The Kuwaiti Foreign Ministry on Friday applauded the Jeddah Declaration on sparing civilians in Sudan and facilitating delivery of relief supplies to those in need in the afflicted nation.

The ministry in a statement acclaimed the Saudi-US declaration with respect of the signing by representatives of the Sudanese Army and the Rapid Support Forces of the commitment to protect civilians and facilitate humanitarian works to meet the emergency need of the civilians, ensuring delivery of humanitarian aid in addition to steps to be taken later.

It appreciates that the efforts by Saudi Arabia and the US to urge the Sudanese parties sit at the negotiating table and sign this important obligation aimed at safeguarding the civilians.

'Tone of voice'

KUWAIT CITY, May 13: Information technology and security experts have warned of a new trick that has begun to spread. It involves the use of tone of voice through voice artificial intelligence programs. They said the new method of fraud is based on the fraudster calling for one goal, which is to record the tone of the caller's voice, and the fraudster then ends the call, then calls a friend or relative, asking them to transfer money using the voice modified by artificial intel-ligence, reports Al-Rai daily.

In this context, cybersecurity expert Engineer Saleh Al-Shammari said, "There is a direct re-lationship between technological development and cyber-attacks." He said, "The latest that

hackers around the world have achieved is the use of artificial intelligence in imitating voices. In this method, the fraudster takes a sample of the victim's voice, either recorded or via communication, after luring the victim into talking for an appropriate time period to record all the letters and tones of his voice. It is then used to bait relatives or acquaintances into being swindled."

Al-Shammari stressed "the need to be cautious about these methods and always check incoming calls to see if the person calling is actually a real person that they know or is a technical person inspired by the world of artificial intelligence.'

In addition, information tech-nology expert Qusay Al-Shatti said, "Electronic fraud methods are evolving with the development of technical and technological means and the new possibilities they offer.

There are some who use this technology for harmful and abusive goals such as electronic fraud to steal funds and accounts and achieve illegal financial return.

Previously, short messages were received from mobile phone numbers claiming that the bank card was suspended and that the call must be taken to collect the card data from the individual. After this, the pattern has changed to a call with an audio recording to deceive the caller into thinking that it was coming from a financial institution. Now we have reached the technique of

The foreign affairs department also praised other components of the declaration and planned arrangements aimed at finding a mechanism to halt hostile acts "in a manner that would help in ridding Sudan of the current crisis.

The Ministry reiterated the State of Kuwait stance, calling for an immediate halt of the fighting and hostilities, pursuing the national dialogue for thrashing out the differences and reaching a viable and comprehensive solution to the current crisis for sake of safeguarding Sudan's security, stability and territorial sanctity.

The Jeddah Declaration, adopted by the Sudanese army and paramilitary Rapid Support Forces (RSF) early Friday, stressed joint commitment to protecting Sudanese civilians.

This came in recognition of the necessity of uplifting the plight and misery from people resulting from the ongoing fighting since April 15, 2023, in particular in the capital of Khartoum, responding to urgent humanitarian needs of civilian citizens.

Representatives of the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) and the Rapid Support Forces (RSF) reaffirmed their core obligations under International Humanitarian Law to facilitate humanitarian action to meet the needs of civilians, according to the declaration.

They stressed unwavering commitment to the sovereignty of Sudan and to maintaining its unity and territorial integrity.

Recognizing that commitment to the Declaration of Commitment will not affect any legal, security, or political status of the parties signing it, nor will it be linked to participation in any political process, it said.

They welcomed the efforts exerted by Sudan's friends who can use their relationships and good offices to ensure respect for International Humanitarian Law and for international human rights law, including by committing to this Declaration and immediately implementing it.

None of the points listed displace any obligations or principles under International Humanitarian Law and/or international human rights law that apply in this armed conflict, in particular the Protocol Additional (II) of 1977 to the Geneva Conventions of 1949, and that all parties must meet, said the document.

WASHINGTON: US 5th Fleet is working with regional allies and partners to increase the rotation of ships and aircraft patrolling in and around the Strait of Hormuz, said Naval Forces Central Command Public Affairs on Friday.

The remarks came following Iran's recent unlawful merchant vessel seizures.

The increased force presence supports multinational efforts to deter threats to commercial shipping and reassure regional mariners, the Command said in a press release. (KUNA)

Kuwait, Manila prep

KUWAIT CITY, May 13: The firm measures taken by Kuwait recently, driven by popular support, to stop granting any visas to Filipino workers, and restricting entry only to those who have a valid residence permit is beginning to bear fruit before the upcoming joint committee meeting, reports Al-Rai daily.

Primarily, a delegation from the Philippine Ministry of Labor was scheduled to visit Kuwait from May 16 to 18 to attend the joint committee meeting on the thorny issue of employment, and now it has been reported that the government in the Philippines has now decided to replace the members of the delegation which now will comprise of officials from the Department of Foreign Affairs, according to what the diplomatic sources told Al-Rai daily.

The sources indicated the mission of the Philippine delegation is to try to bridge the gap that has widened between the two countries, after talks faltered regarding resolving the problem of recruiting workers from Manila, noting that after Kuwait's decision to stop visas for the Filipinos, "the issue has returned to square one." The labor file now will be dealt with by officials from the foreign ministries of the two countries since "there are matters that were not clear or well understood by both parties with regard to labor rights."

The labor sources said that "the large number of requests from the Filipino side under the pretext of ensuring the well-being of its workers led to worsening the situation," pointing out that "most of the requests that were raised were exaggerated and showed Manila's lack of commitment to the

bilateral agreement signed with Kuwait regarding employment. .

The sources drew the attention to the broad popular support for the directives of the First Deputy Prime Minister, Minister of Interior and Acting Minister of Defense Sheikh Talal Al-Khaled to stop visas for Filipino workers, and to demand that no concessions be made in the face of the Filipino side's attempts to achieve undeserved gains for its workers at the expense of citizens and employers.

In an indication that Manila has begun to ease its conditions and the high ceiling it has set since its decision to stop sending workers to Kuwait last February, Department of Foreign Affairs Assistant Secretary Paul Raymund Cortes told CNN in the Philippines that his country is committed to resolving any issues with Kuwait in an "amicable manner," saying the two countries enjoy "very friendly" relations. Cortes added, "We are confident that we will

be able to find a mutually satisfactory solution to any issues we feel is necessary to discuss with Kuwait.

Meanwhile, the Kuwait International Airport prevented 25 Filipinos from entering Kuwait in implementation of the decision to stop issuing visas for Filipino nationals and allow entry only to those who have valid residence permit. The ban includes also newcomers who were earlier issued entry visas, reports Al-Rai daily.

The daily said a majority of those who were barred entry were domestic workers.

In this regard, the Kuwaiti foreign minister spoke highly of joint efforts being exerted by the US and Saudi Arabia to put an end to ongoing fighting between Sudanese rivals and resolve the crisis through dialogue.

They also addressed the developments of Syria, Palestine, Iraq and Yemen, vowing joint efforts to strengthen security and stability in the region.

The meeting was attended by Kuwait's Ambassador to the United States Sheikha Al-Zain Sabah Nasser Al-Saud Al-Sabah, Assistant Foreign Minister for the Foreign Minister's Office Affairs/Minister Plenipotentiary Nawaf Al-Ahmad, and a number of senior officials of Kuwait's Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the embassy in Washington.

This is the first official visit by the Kuwaiti foreign minister to Washington since he took up his position.

On Thursday, US Secretary of State Antony Blinken said the State of Kuwait plays a vital role in Middle East and world peace.

Al-Sallal added, "Microsoft has developed another program called the 'Vall E' application, which is an accurate tool for anyone looking to create a sound that sounds more natural than any other application, through an audio recording period that does not exceed three seconds only."

\$180m recovered, says prosecution

KUWAIT CITY, May 13: The Public Prosecution announced that within the framework of judicial cooperation with its counterpart in Bahrain, Kuwait has seized assets and money from the Kingdom worth \$180 million belonging to the former head of the Public Institution for Social Security (PIFSS) late Fahd Al-Raja'an and his wife Mona Al-Wazzan, reports Al-Jarida daily.

The daily added, this comes in implementation of the verdict issued by the courts in Kuwait against the the convicts.

The Public Prosecution Office thanked its Bahraini counterpart, headed by Attorney General Dr. Ali bin Fadl Al-Buainain, for helping recover the Kuwaiti property.

On December 18, the Public Prosecution Office announced that it had recovered assets and funds from Bahrain amounting to \$100 million, in implementation of a ruling issued against Al-Raja'an and Al-Wazzan.

The daily learned that a delegation from the Public Prosecution and PIFSS recently visited Britain and a number of countries, including Egypt, to recover money of Al-Raja'an and his family based on verdicts issued by the criminal court against Al-Raja'an.

'Kuwait's 60th 'versary of UN joining marks vital phase in diplomacy'

NEW YORK, May 13, (KUNA): Kuwait's Permanent Representative at the United Nations Ambassador Tariq Al-Bannai said that the 60th anniversary of Kuwait's membership at the UN is an important phase in the history of Kuwaiti diplomacy. In a statement to KUNA late Friday, com-

memorating Kuwait's joining of the UN on 14 May, 1963, Al-Bannai noted that Kuwait and the UN share strong ties, as the Kuwaiti leadership is continuously exerting ef-forts to enhance partnership with the international body.

The two sides have been cooperating with each other in different fields Martin Griffiths

through the decades, especially in the humanitarian, peace, security, economic and developmental fields, he said.

Meanwhile, he underlined the UN Security Council's role in liberating Kuwait from the Iraqi Invasion in 1991.

He also spoke of Kuwait's prominent role in protecting international peace and security during its non-permanent membership of the UN Security Council from 1978 to 1979 and from 2018 to 2019.

Moreover, the ambassador noted Kuwait's strong partnership with the UN in supporting regional and international humanitarian work to ease the suffering of people affected by conflict and natural disasters, especially the country's recent contributions to face the aftermath of the violent earthquake that shook Turkiye and Syria earlier this year.

Kuwait marks Sunday six decades since it joined the United Nations (UN) amid fervent efforts to achieve peace and security and promote development and human rights worldwide, reflecting the country's foreign police since it became the 111th member.

Kuwait has ever since proved its competence and efficiency among other UN members by becoming non-permanent UN Security Council (UNŠC) member in 1978 and then 2018, and supporting global justice and the self-determination of nations and peoples

Kuwait has defended Arab and Islamic issues, mainly including the Palestinian cause, humanitarian issues, UNSC mechanism development, promotion of preventive diplomacy and mediation and prevention of conflicts.

Since becoming a UN member, Kuwait has adopted an unwavering approach of foreign policy, chiefly centered on the delivery of humanitarian and relief to all needy countries only out of its belief in the significance of international partnership.

Over recent years, Kuwait has become in the forefront of international humanitarian action by playing a key role in this field through its official agencies and charities and organizing three world donors' conferences on Svria.

Kuwait's great humanitarian initiatives have prompted the UN to grant the Gulf country the title of a global humanitarian hub and to name late Amir Sheikh Sabah Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah a global humanitarian leader in appreciation for his great humanitarian role.

As part of its highly commended relief efforts, Kuwait has recently pledged USD 90 million to support UN efforts to help refugees in the aftermath of recent powerful earthquakes in Syria and Turkiye.

UN Under-Secretary-General for Humanitarian Affairs and Emergency Relief Coordinator Martin Griffiths voiced gratitude to the State of Kuwait for this generous aid that would be immediately delivered to affected

The State of Kuwait was elected Vice President of the UN General Assembly for the 21st and 27th sessions, member of the Economic and Social Council for three years in 1967, chosen as council member in 1992, and elected member of the council's transcontinental cooperation committee in 1975.


It has also proved effective presence in several international organizations such as the Universal Postal Union, International Civil Aviation Organization, Food and Agriculture Organization, International Monetary Fund, World Bank and International Atomic Energy Agency.

In recognition of the significance of the United Nations, Kuwait opened the UN House in January 2009 in a ceremony that was attended by then UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon, reflecting deep relations between Kuwait and the UN.

In response to the anguish of many development countries, Kuwait has established a decent life fund with a capital of USD 100 million, aiming at developing and improving ag-ricultural production in developing countries.

It also donated USD 150 million to an OPEC fund created in 2007 for research and studies pertinent to energy, environment and climate change

Kuwait's aid makes up over 1.3 percent of its gross domestic product (GDP), exceeding the internationally allocated ratio of 0.7 percent. Kuwait set aside 10 percent of its voluntary contributions for supporting the UN and its agencies; having doubled this figure in September 2014.

'Not for buying or selling'

MoH defends blood fees hike

KUWAIT CITY, May 13: The Ministry of Health said blood is not a commodity for sale and purchase and added people's lives depend on it, clarifying once again that the fees which have been recently announced are symbolic.

The Al-Qabas daily quoting the ministry said, after the decision that was issued a few days ago sparked confusion regarding imposing fees on blood bags for expatriates the committee which was formed to study the prices of services provided by the blood bank and laboratory analyzes, and the problem according to Administrative Resolution 8222 of 2021 if the Ministry of Health, confirmed that blood is not a commodity, pointing out that promoting community solidarity, urging donations, and preserving the strategic blood stock represent most of the lofty goals of the ministry.

The sources indicated that the recently approved fees for blood transfusion services are symbolic related to administrative procedures, such as preserving and transporting blood bags and laboratory tests, which are exempted if there is a donor, which came as an incentive to urge people to donate blood.

The sources explained that the prescribed symbolic fees came after about a year and a half of study through the committee of specialists in the ministry, and it is not a goal of the ministry in itself, as far as achieving the noble goals that the ministry seeks from realizing the value of the donation, taking into account "exemption of medical cases such as the emergency cases that require transfusion of blood and its derivatives, such as critical cases, children's cases, cancer, and other cases that are exempt from these fees.

The sources pointed out that the committee for studying the prices of services provided by the Blood Bank and laboratory analyzes made strenuous efforts in studying and comparing these fees with those in the countries of the region, as they are still nominal fees, compared to

'Fingerprinting must for incoming public'

KUWAIT CITY, May 13: The Directorate General of Ports of the Ministry of Interior in cooperation with the Criminal Evidences Department and the Info Systems, has started implementing the decision to take the decimal fingerprint of all those coming to the country through the air, land and sea border crossings, reports Al-Jarida daily.

Informed security sources told Al-Jarida that the Criminal Evidence Department has finished installing automatic fingerprint devices at all border crossings, while the Information Systems Department has helped to link the devices to the Information Systems Center at the Ministry of Interior, pointing out that all travelers arriving in the country will have to abide by the decimal fingerprint decision.

Repairing roads: The government has set in motion the wheel to repair Kuwait's roads with the help of foreign companies and the details thereof are expected to be announced soon, reports Al-Anba daily.

The daily has learned that about 10 contracts will be floated for bidding to international contractors from sev eral countries. It has been reported about 30 foreign firms have shown interest in the road repairs.

The sources pointed out that the contracts are expected to be divided into 6 tenders, with a tender for road repair for each governorate, in addition to 4 other tenders related to the repair of main roads and bridges.

Meanwhile, former Badr Al-Mulla said His Highness the Prime Minister Sheikh Ahmad Nawaf Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah is a pro-reform figure. He pointed out that he did not ask for suspending the grilling motions and he is not involved in the suspicious bank deposits of politicians and MPs. He asserted the premier remains committed to his reform path, especially when he refused to take oath before a legislature rejected by the people.

He clarified that he agreed to be a member of the government to represent the pro-reform party. He then resigned from his position as Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Oil in order to run for the election to represent the citizens

Former Assembly Speaker Marzouq Al-Ghanim asserted that he is contesting the election away from political disputes, as his only aim is to serve in the interest of citizens.

Bid to cut traffic chaos

Bridge to link Al-Mutla'a, Capital

KUWAIT CITY, May 13: Six members of the Municipal Council -- the Council's Chairman, Abdullah Al-Muhri, and members Khaled Al-Mutairi, Fahd Al-Abdul-Jader, Nasser Al-Azmi, Ismail Behbehani, and Abdullah Al-Anzi, have submitted a proposal to construct a sea bridge to link the city of Al-Mutlaa with the Capital, to shorten the distance between the two cities to 29 kilometers from the current 41 kilometers, reports Al-Rai daily.

The construction of the bridge will

help motorists to bypass the Al-Jahra Road, especially since Al-Mutla'a is ranked as one of the model cities in the country, and its planning was carried out by international companies.

In the proposal, the members indicated that the population of the city of Al-Mutlaa is expected to reach 400,000, and therefore it has become necessary to link the city with the capital in order to facilitate traffic for its residents and reduce congestion.

'Keep judiciary away from your conflicts & problems'

"THERE are those who build on the recent political developments in Kuwait to portray the matter as catastrophic, and that the Kuwaitis have entered a tunnel from which it is difficult to get out, and that the coming days will bear witness, and all parties without exception participated in pouring oil on the fire of these expectations among their permanent contributions to distract the mind in favor of charging, escalating, and perpetuating divisions and alignments," columnist Jassim Marzouk Boodai wrote for Al-Rai daily.

"Some prudence is useful at this stage and every stage. Is there a political crisis? Of course, there is a crisis accompanied by problems that have made it more complicated.

"Rather, an objective view of the relations of the legislative and executive authorities in all countries of the world, especially the developed ones, reveal that the conflicts between them do not stop, but the constitutional and legal mechanisms prevent the impact of these conflicts getting out of hand that manages the state, development and people's affairs.

"We live today in Kuwait in the midst of a dispute between the two authorities. The disagreement was present and with greater force between them in the 2020 and 2022 councils.

"This disagreement will remain between future councils and future governments because the nature of the formation of these two authorities in various countries of the world is based on cooperation and consensus, as well as on lurking, obstruction and freezing.

"It suffices to follow what is happening in the parliaments of major countries in terms of accountability of ministers, sometimes around the clock, and real wars to prevent the issuance of a law or the amendment to a law.

"However, as we mentioned previously, the real problem lies in how to separate this relationship from the management of the affairs of the country and the people and avoiding paralysis in the various facilities and institutions, which we have written about repeatedly, especially in terms of the need to update and develop the constitution.

"His Highness the Prime Minister Sheikh Ahmed Al-Nawaf will form the new government. He is the choice of His Highness the Amir of the country and his place of trust, and this is a matter that is appreciated and respected and is not open to discussion.

"We all wish him to make a good selection of the best competencies to manage their ministries in a way that is consistent with their oath on the one hand and what achieves the interest of the people on the other hand, and he must be given enough time to move the wheel of development in all facilities and sectors.

"His Highness Sheikh Ahmed Al-Nawaf knows that the performance and achievement are the foundation, and they are judged by history and people, not the political clamor that always fluctuates between highs and lows.

Today, there is a dispute between the two authorities, and tomorrow the dispute may disappear and be replaced by cooperation, whether the council remained or changed. Whether the government remained or changed... But everyone must be aware that the Speaker of the National Assembly and the MPs are transient at a certain stage and are not immortal, and that the prime minister and ministers are also transient at a certain stage and are not immortal. "Therefore, it must be emphasized that the judiciary is the red line and the fortress of institutions and the shield of the homeland, which, if it remains with its loftiness, independence, and justice, remains the state, and if it shakes, it shakes. "The concern of all Kuwaitis today is to remove all ongoing political disputes, problems and conflicts from the judiciary. This edifice is the title of safety in Kuwait, and it is a protective authority for all and its doors are open to reform, development, objection and doubt. "Judicial rulings in Kuwait are issued in the name of His Highness the Amir, and it must be remembered that these rulings in all countries of the world are not interpretations similar to choices and matches where some tie. The judiciary has judgment and there is no equality, and everyone must accept the judgment, whatever it is, because it is issued by an authority that is the basis for stability. "What is happening today is similar to what happened yesterday and decades ago. Praising a ruling if it is in the interest of a party and attacking it if it is against its interest. "The majority of the 2022 parliament attacked the judiciary and the ruling of the Constitutional Court because they did not like it, and a large number of the 2020 MPs praised the judiciary and the ruling of the Constitutional Court because they liked it, and the two parties dealt with the judiciary from political rather than institutional considerations. "That is, they looked at it in a way that serves their discourse, project, and goals. And if it is true that the government from its president and some of its ministers entered a party and asked the head of the Judicial Council to step down, then this forbidden, may God protect Kuwait from its repercussions. "In short, the judiciary is the fortress of Kuwait and the shield of institutions. Countries that were lost and returned thanks to the existence of an honest judiciary with which the affairs of the country and the people were established, so it ruled with justice and safeguarded freedoms and adjudicated the validity of decisions and fought corruption and restored rights to their owners and maintained security and safety. "The judiciary is not a piece of paper in a political file in order to burn it out of spite of an opponent or polish it out of spite of an opponent.

"If the precedents of interference in the judiciary are repeated and the political targeting of its men continues, it is as if we are demolishing the walls of our homes with our own hands and exposing ourselves to chaos.2

Also:

"The most dangerous thing that any country in the world can face is the conviction of the simple citizen that the state of institutions does not exist on the ground and that all talk about it is just slogans raised to achieve certain goals that the citizen has no interest in achieving," Nasser Al-Abdali wrote for Al-Qabas

daily.. "This will result in the voter not casting his/her parliament ballot to choose who represents him in Parliament and the simple citizen will not pay heed to the promises of the government and ministers, and with time he will be convinced that nothing said holds water.

"There is a popular feeling that the "executive and legislative" institutions are facing a major dilemma represented in their inability to confront the challenges that dominate the local arena and respond to them as they should, which left a great void that prompted the distinguished national elements to move away from them, and in such a step weakened those institutions. Their role is diminished, allowing less efficient and privileged elements to fill that void

"The reluctance to contest in the upcoming parliamentary is a dangerous indicator, especially with the growing talk about suspicions of fraud in the will of voters for the past and previous elections, and some talk about suspicions that affected the elections since 2012, because in this reluctance there is a heavy loss at all levels.

What has been rumored and the apologies and perhaps withdrawals of some of those who have filed papers to contest the elections has become a kind of phenomenon that deserves careful consideration.

"The democratic experience in the country has gone through many setbacks, most notably the relentless war waged by the Islamic movement on it through participation and sabotaging it from within in addition to questioning it and its inability to confront and resolve outstanding issues.

"But it managed to recover from those setbacks at every turn it faces, except this time we are facing a blatant challenge that may have obvious and hidden repercussions, just as the reluctance to participate in the executive authority has become clear over the past years, which has weakened the ability of governments to work politically and administratively as it should, until everyone is making fun of the various government formations, and it seems that the rest of the institutions are not good.

"The Information Ministry is thankful for the report that stirs historical feelings towards the caring mother - the tourist," columnist Mohamad Al-Saqr wrote for Al-Anba daily.

13 held as 22 recruitment offices temporarily closed

Three years imprisonment given for forging sick leave

KUWAIT CITY, May 13: The Public Authority for Manpower in cooperation with the **Residence Affairs In**vestigations Department carried out an inspection campaign on domestic workers recruitment offices in the governorates of Hawalli, Farwaniya and Al-Ahmadi, reports Al-Jarida daily.

The campaign was headed by the acting Director General of the Authority, along with Marzouq Al-Otaibi, and acting Deputy Director General of the Labor Force Protection Sector, Dr. Fahd Murad, the director of the Department for Regulating the Recruitment of Domestic Workers, Nasser Al-Musawi, and the Director General of the Residency Investigations Department, Major General Walid Al-Tarawah.

The campaign resulted in identifying 22 labor recruitment offices which were operating in violation of the laws, in addition to the arresting 13 domestic workers who were found on the offices premises.

They were then sent to the PAM Expatriate Labor Shelter Center until their legal status is settled, or procedures for their departure from the country are taken in coordination with employers.

With regard to the violating labor recruitment offices, reports of violations have been issued against them, in addition to that PAM will work, in coordination with the Ministry of Commerce and Industry, to suspend the licenses of the violating offices for 6 months for violating Article 11 of Resolu-tion No. 22 of 2022.

Meanwhile, in a step seen as deterrent and strict ruling in cases of forging sick leaves, the Criminal Court has sentenced an unidentified employee of the Ministry of Health to three years imprisonment with hard labor for forging sick leave, reports Al-Qabas daily.

KUWAIT CITY, May 13: Chargé d'Affaires of the European Union (EU) delegation in Kuwait Gediminas Varanavicius affirmed that Kuwait has long been a close and reliable friend of the EU, and was the first Gulf country to sign a Cooperation Agreement with the European External Action Service in July 2016, reports Al-Qabas daily.

He pointed out: "The agreement in itself is a reflection of our close ties. We view Kuwait as a like-minded partner in a dynamic region, especially when it comes to humanitarian issues and advocating for peace and diplomacy."

On the occasion of Europe Day 2023, he said: "It important to note that this enduring cooperation would not have been possible without the support of the Kuwaiti authorities."

He explained: "Europe Day is an annual celebration of peace and unity in the European continent. It marks the anniversary of the Schuman Declaration, which In 1950, set out the idea for integration as a new form of political cooperation. It was the beginning of what is now the European Union."

He disclosed that "EU delegations are considered the diplomatic face of the union. Close coordination with EU member-states is one of the most important roles we play. I would like to take this opportunity to thank the ambassadors and charge d'affaires of 16 member-states who are here with us today for their support and for rallying behind the EU flag in line with the Team Europe approach. In May last year, the union unveiled its 'Strategic Partnership with the Gulf'. It is a roadmap for broadening and deepening cooperation between the EU and the Gulf Cooperation Council (GCC) member- countries including Kuwait. "The document also highlights the need for EU-GCC collaboration on the green energy transition and fightKUWAIT CITY, May 13: Kuwaitis have reportedly spent 4 billion dinars on travel in 2022, a jump of 69.5% bringing their total spending to more than 4 billion dinars, compared to an expenditure of 2.36 billion dinars, according to the preliminary data of Kuwait's balance of payments for the past year issued by the Central Bank of

Kuwait, reports Al-Anba daily. The expenditure hiked after the Kuwait International Airport became fully operational and the resumption of summer flights, nearly two years after the closure of the Airport and the tightening of travel procedures to prevent the spread of the Corona epidemic.

According to the daily, money spent by Kuwaitis on the travel item during the past year is considered the highest since the outbreak of the Corona pandemic, and the total spending during the first quarter of last year was 1.13 billion dinars, and in the second quarter 835.8 million dinars, and in the third quarter 1.1 billion dinars and in the fourth quarter it was 935 million dinars.

In terms of spending by tourists inside Kuwait, it witnessed an increase, as their total spending reached 333 million dinars during 2022.







OPEC plans further reductions, forecasting future oil demand



IT seems OPEC is planning further crude oil production cuts to

It is also not enough to cover its investment costs for sending more fresh barrels into the market. It is the lowest level since 2021.

This is despite the fact that OPEC produced less volume by about 200,000 barrels of oil, mainly from Nigeria and Iraq; Nigeria due to technical problems and Iraq mainly due to legal issues between Baghdad, the North and Turkey. However despite such reductions, OPEC produced 28,600 million barrels per day less than the agreed volume last month.

The oil price remained weak, causing OPEC to act with more reductions. Further cuts are expected in the coming months in line with supply and demand rate for the coming months.

Banking concerns, with the inflation and lower economic activities, cause the oil price to remain weak, with OPEC's concerns about the unannounced target price, which is below its expectations.

As if this is not enough, the financial results of the first quarter for OPEC were poor when compared to the same quarter last year,

causing lower income for oil producing countries to meet its commitments towards mega projects and catch up with their development's plans.

In Saudi Aramco, the drop in earnings in the first quarter was about 19 percent, as compared to the same period last year, earning \$31.9 billion against \$39.5 billion. It maintained dividends to its shareholders of \$19.5, which is the same as last year. This is a strong message that the company is working towards achieving its target and long-term plans. Here is the main reason for adjusting the supply to meet the current low demand for oil.

Most oil producing countries, if not all, are faced with the same results of lower income and earnings due to lower oil prices and drop in oil production. This forces them to take action to bring prices to a comfortable level by reducing the throughput.

Lower oil production to balance the current oil demand will also help other oil companies like shale producers as well international oil companies, who have been minimizing their investments in fossil oil, imposing on OPEC to invest and spend while they benefit from OPEC's efforts and sacrifices in the end.

Nevertheless, this is happening despite OPEC's efforts to stabi-lize oil markets by providing continuous and adequate supply and avoiding any shortages. The organization will be met with criticism, as not to reduce supply and not interfere; regardless of how low the oil price will fall.

The question, however, remains as to who will pay for OPEC's cost in investing and exploring for new barrels.

US jobless claims filings highest since '21, but job market remains healthy

WASHINGTON, May 13, (AP): The number of Americans filing for jobless claims last week rose to its highest level in a year-and-a-half, though the labor market remains healthy by historical standards.

Wall Street 'slips' as households get more nervous; European shares rise

Asia drops over US banks, China growth worries

NEW YORK, May 13, (AP): Another seemingly listless week on Wall Street came to a quiet close on Wall Street Friday, but big worries continue to roil under the surface.

The S&P 500 dipped 6.54 points, or 0.2%, to 4,124.08 to cap a sixth straight week where it moved by less than 1%. The Dow Jones Industrial Average slipped 8.89, or less than 0.1%, to 33,300.62, while the Nasdaq composite lost 43.76, or 0.4%, to 12,284.74.

Despite the seemingly placid moves for the overall market, big swings have swirled underneath the surface amid worries about a possible recession, high inflation and the U.S. government inching toward what could be a catastrophic default on its debt.

It's not just Wall Street that's concerned. Sentiment among U.S. consumers is tumbling, according to a preliminary survey by the University of Michigan. That's a worry because strong spending by consumers has been one of the main forces preventing a recession as the economy slows.

Joanne Hsu, director of the Surveys of Consumers, pointed to the looming June 1 deadline when the U.S. government could run out of cash to pay its bills unless Congress allows it to borrow more.

"If policymakers fail to resolve the debt ceiling crisis, these dismal views over the economy will exacerbate the dire economic consequences of default," she said in a statement.

President Joe Biden and congressional leaders postponed a meeting set for Friday on the debt limit crisis to next week. The delay was billed as a sign of positive exchanges, and staff-level talks are expected to continue through the weekend.

One area under heavy pressure this week looking to stabilize was PacWest Bancorp's stock. It's been under heavy scrutiny as Wall Street hunts for the next possible U.S. bank to fail following three high-profile collapses since March

PacWest fell 3% after flipping from a gain in the morning. A day earlier, it slid sharply after disclosing a flight of deposits from the prior week. Its stock lost 21% this past week.

Europe

European benchmarks rose Friday after Asian shares mostly declined on looming worries over U.S. banks and lagging demand from China, the region's major driver of growth.

France's CAC 40 rose 1.0% in early trading to 7,451.96. Germany's DAX added 0.6% to 15,931.25. Britain's FTSE 100 gained 0.5% to 7,767.52.

Asia

"Asian equities struggled for direction after weak inflation data in China pointed to weakening demand," said Stephen Innes, managing partner at SPI Asset Management.

Recent data reflect very low inflation and weak credit extensions in China, which all indicate slowing growth following an initial jump after the nation dropped pandemic-related restrictions, he said.

Japan's benchmark Nikkei 225 gained 0.9% to finish at 29,388.30 as companies like Nissan Motor Co. gained after reporting relatively favorable earnings. But SoftBank Group Corp. slumped after reporting its second year in a row of losses.

Australia's S&P/ASX 200 edged up nearly 0.1% to 7,256.70. South Korea's Kospi dropped 0.6% to 2,475.42. Hong Kong's Hang Seng slipped 0.6% to 19,627.24, while the Shanghai Composite dove 1.1% to 3,272.36.

Investors have been hunting for the next possible victim in the U.S. banking industry after high interest rates helped lead to three failures since March.

Helping to limit the losses for the overall market was a report showing U.S. inflation at the wholesale level was a bit cooler last month than economists expected. It followed a report from the prior day that showed inflation at the consumer level was also behaving largely as forecast.

Oil

In energy trading, benchmark U.S. crude lost 46 cents to \$70.41 a barrel. Brent crude, the international standard, shed 56 cents to \$74.42 a barrel.

Currencies

In currency trading, the U.S. dollar rose to 134.77 Japanese yen from 134.52 yen. The euro cost \$1.0904, inching down from \$1.0921.



'Irag's oil-gas reserves are growing'

Iraqi Oil Minister Hayyan Abdulghani said the nation's crude oil reserves have grown by ten billion barrels and the gas reserves by eight trillion cubic feet. The minister was speaking on side-

lines of inaugurating a new project within Majnoun field in southern governorate of Basra, according to a statement

released by the ministry of oil. Abdulghani said these amounts of the fossil fuel have been added to the reserves after an agreement between the Iraqi Oil Exploration Company and Ma-

joun field administration to conduct a 3-d survey of the locations Hartha, Al-Zubair and Mishref. He inaugurated the project of water injection at Majnoun field at a ca-pacity of 80,000 barrels per day.

River water is employed for injection at four main reservoirs. The minister has also laid the corner stone for the second gas separation station in the same field at a capacity of 120,000 barrels per day. Iraq boasts the world's fourth largest oil reserve estimated at more than 145 billion barrels. (KUNA)

The hot jobs market has been defying a weakening economy and confound-ing the Federal Reserve for months, but now shows signs of cooling. The latest set of employment data from the government shows that job openings fell in March to their lowest level since April 2021. Layoffs rose to 1.8 million, their highest level since December 2020.

Employers are also slowing the pace of hiring. While hiring remained strong in April, the government lowered its hiring figures for February and March. More broadly, job gains for February through April marked the weakest three-month average since January 2021. The persistently strong labor market has bewildered the Fed and economists for more than a year as higher interest rates meant to slow economic growth did little to loosen a historically tight job market with record low unemployment. That resistance is now slowly fading, according to analysts.

'The labor market is usually the last to break in an economic downturn, and when it does, things can change guite

rapidly," said David Kelly, chief global strategist at JPMorgan Funds, in a note. Factors including tighter business

conditions, weak sentiment and declining job openings will likely keep factoring into future labor data.

"The labor market can't dodge a downturn indefinitely," Kelly said. The strong job market and higher

wages for workers have resisted the Fed's efforts to cool inflation, while also keeping a weakening economy from slipping into a recession. (AP)

Agility reports KD 15.3 mln net profit for Q1 2023

Revenue grows to KD 320.5million

KUWAIT CITY, May 13: Agility, a long-term investor and operator in supply chain services, infrastructure, and innovation, today reported first quarter 2023 earnings of KD 15.3 million, or 6fils per share, an increase of 20% over the same period in 2022. Agility's EBITDA increased 78.1% to KD 60.4 million and revenue grew 142.7% to KD 320.5million.

Talks push US toward new era of deficit cuts

WASHINGTON, May 13, (AP): One outcome is clear as Washington reaches for a budget deal to end the debt standoff: The ambitious ceiling COVID era of government spending - to cope with the pandemic and rebuild in its aftermath - is giving way

"The appetite to throw a lot more money at major problems right now is significantly diminished, given what we've seen over the past several years," said Shai Akabas, director of economic policy at the Bipartisan Policy Center, a nonpartisan organization in Washington. The Treasury department has warned it will begin running out of money to pay the nation's bills as soon as June 1, though an estimate Friday by the nonpartisan Congressional Budget office put the deadline at the first two weeks of June, potentially buying the negotiators time. The contours of an agreement between the White House and Congress are within reach, even if the political will to end the standoff is uncertain. Negotiators are considering clawing back some \$30 billion in unused COVID-19 funds, imposing spending caps over the next several years and approving permitting reforms to ease construction of energy projects and other developments, according to those familiar with the closed-door staff discussions.

The end result is a turnaround from just a few years ago, when Congress passed and then-president Donald Trump signed the historic \$2.2 trillion CARES Act at the start of the COVID crisis in 2020. And it's a dramatic realignment even as Biden's bipartisan infrastructure law and Inflation Reduction Act are now investing billions of dollars into paving streets,

Hesitant

The White House has been hesitant to engage in talks, insisting it is only willing to negotiate over the annual budget, not the debt ceiling, and Biden's team is skeptical that McCarthy can cut any deal with his far-right House majority.

"There's no deal to be had on the debt ceiling. There's no negotiation to be had on the debt ceiling," said White House press secretary Karine Jean-Pierre.

But McCarthy allies say the White House has fundamentally underestimated what the new Republican leader has been able to accomplish - first in the grueling fight to become House speaker, and now in having passed the House bill with \$4.5 trillion in savings as an opening offer in negotiations. Both have emboldened McCarthy to push hard for a deal.

"The White House has been wrong every single time with understanding where we are with the House," said Russ Vought, president of Center for American Renewal and Trump's former director of the Office of Management and Budget. "They're dealing with a new animal."

The nation's debt load has ballooned in recent years, to \$31 trillion. That's virtually double what it was during the last major debt ceiling showdown a decade ago, when Biden, as vice president to Barack Obama, faced the new class of "tea party" Republicans demanding spending cuts in exchange for raising the debt limit.

While the politics of the debt limit have intensified, the nation's debt is nothing new. The U.S. balance sheets have been operating in the red for much of its history, dating back to the pre-Civil War era.

NIIGATA, Japan, May 13, (AP): The Group of Seven's top financial leaders united Saturday in their support for Ukraine and their determination to enforce sanctions against Russia for its aggression but stopped short of any overt mention of China.

The finance ministers and central bank chiefs ended three days of talks in Niigata, Japan, with a joint statement pledging to bring inflation under control, help countries struggling with onerous debts and strengthen financial systems.

They also committed to collaborating to build more stable, diversified supply chains for developing clean energy sources and to "enhance economic resilience globally against various shocks."

The statement did not include any specific mention of China or of "economic coercion" in pursuit of political objectives, such as penalizing the companies of countries whose governments take actions that anger another country

Talk this week of such moves by China had drawn outraged rebukes from Beijing. Officials attending the talks in this port city apparently balked at overtly condemning China, given the huge stake most countries have in good relations with the rising power and No. 2 economy.

The finance leaders' talks laid the groundwork for a summit of G-7 leaders in Hiroshima next week that President Joe Biden is expected to attend despite a crisis over the U.S. debt ceiling that could result in a national default if it is not resolved in the coming weeks.

China accuses Washington of hindering its rise as an increasingly affluent, modern nation through trade and investment restrictions. Yellen said they are "narrowly targeted" to protect American economic security.

Despite recent turmoil in the banking industry, the G-7 statement said the financial system was "resilient" thanks to reforms implemented during the 2008 global financial crisis.

"Nevertheless, we need to remain vigilant and stay agile and flexible in our macroeconomic policy amid heightened uncertainty about the global economic outlook," it said.

Meanwhile, inflation remains "elevated" and central banks are determined to bring it under control, it said.

Since prices remain "sticky," some countries may see continued rate hikes, said Kazuo Ueda, Japan's central bank governor. "The impact of the rate hikes has not been fully realized," he told reporters

The financial leaders took time to listen to ideas on how to focus more on welfare in policymaking, rather than just GDP and other numerical indicators that often drive decisions with profound impacts on people's well being.

"These efforts will help preserve confidence in democracy and a market-based economy, which are the core values of the G-7," the finance leaders' statement concluded.

KUWAIT CITY, May 13: Sheikh Mohammed Jarrah Al-Sabah, Chairman of Kuwait International Bank (KIB), announced the financial results for the first quarter of 2023. Stapleton owned the stage at the end of the night, winning the ACMs' top honor.

"I am shocked, truly," Stapleton said. "By any imaginable metric, I don't deserve this. ... I've never thought of myself as somebody who

He dedicated the award to his children at home, saying they sacrifice a lot of time with him and his wife because of his career.

Garth Brooks and Parton hosted the two-hour awards show, streamed live on Amazon Prime from the Ford Center at the Star in Frisco.


The easy banter between Brooks, in his first hosting gig, and Parton carried the show's early moments. Parton closed out the show with a performance of a song from her upcoming rock album.

NEW YORK: CNN is facing a backlash over its town hall featuring former president Donald Trump, an event that swiftly turned chaotic in a stark display of the tightrope facing journalists covering a leading 2024 Republican candidate who refuses to play by the rules.

The town hall recently was the first major television event of the 2024 presidential campaign, and CNN defended its decision to hold it as a chance to put Trump in front of a wider audience, outside of the conservative media bubble he has largely kept to since early in his presidency.

Critics said the event, which was staged in front of Republicans and unaffiliated voters who were expected to vote in the GOP primary, instead turned into a Trump campaign rally and allowed him to repeat longstanding falsehoods while dodging difficult questions **Tom Jones**, a senior writer at the

media research institute Poynter, said he had favored the idea of CNN holding the town hall at St. Anselm College in New Hampshire. But he said he was surprised by the conduct of the audience, which he had expected to be more neutral.

Instead, the crowd gave Trump a standing ovation when he walked onstage, applauded some of his most provocative comments and laughed at many of his quips, including when he criticized E. Jean Carroll, the advice columnist who accused him of raping her in 1996 and this week won a \$5 million judgment against him.

Jones said the atmosphere put CNN's moderator, Kaitlan Collins, in an almost impossible position as she tried to elicit straightforward answers from Trump and fact-check his comments about the Jan 6 storming of the Capitol by his supporters and the 2020 election, which he still falsely insists he won.

The event was indicative of the new era of leadership at CNN and management's efforts to lure back viewers who turned to Fox News and other conservative outlets over the past decade. (AP)

The most interesting part of "The Mother," a de-L cent if forgettable action pic starring Jennifer Lopez, is the one that is left largely unexplored. The movie is a high-concept thriller that boils down to just a few words: She's a mother and an assassin. OK, you're probably thinking, fine.

Misha Green's script was a hot commodity in 2017, around the time "Wonder Woman" opened, which had left some studios scrambling for action movies fronted by women. There were condescending headlines propping it up as a "female empowerment" script. And, eventually, with Niki Caro signed on to direct and a movie star like Lopez on board to star and produce, it was enough for greenlight and a Netflix budget. The final film also credits Peter Craig and Andrea Berloff for the script.

But history has unfortunately taught us to be suspect of a Mother's Day rollout. The greeting card holiday is where studios always seem to dump mediocre material that happen to have women at the center. If the movies were better, you start to suspect, maybe they wouldn't need the lame hook. Happy Mother's Day! Here's a woman doing... something!

This is a bit unfair to "The Mother," which at worst is just what you expect it to be - a mostly generic action trifle that's very self-serious and wants to be a lot of different kinds of films. Lopez's character is basically Jason Bourne, James Bond, John Wick and Nikita rolled into one, at least when it comes to her skills which are vast and seemingly just the product of her tours in Afghanistan She's. Just. That. Good.

After her military service, she's left with few job prospects so she becomes a guard in Guantanamo and gets entangled, professionally and personally, with a few handsome arms dealers, Adrian (Joseph Fiennes) and Hector (Gael García Bernal). A bit of this is revealed in a brief prologue, in which she gives

birth and has to give up the baby before even holding her. It's for everyone's safety and her only wish is that the kid gets placed with the most boring, stable family out there - that and that FBI Agent Cruise (Omari Hardwick) sends updates on her birthdays.

There is a "Mamma Mia"-esque mystery about who the father is and an even bigger mystery about if this pregnancy was planned or expected or wanted. And all of this is very interesting in theory. But the movie itself is set 12 years later when Mother learns that the daughter (who does get a name, Zoe) is in danger. This brings her out of her glamorously rugged Alaska retirement and back in action as a superhuman spy/assassin/one-woman army.

Emotional

At first, Mother denies her Mother-hood to Zoe (Lucy Paez), whose foster parents get about as much character development and screen time as a couple in a cell phone commercial. This is supposed to be a big emotional journey for Mother and Zoe and the viewing audience, but I can't say this movie ever really convinces you to care about this relationship, which is especially odd because there have been plenty of random pairings of adult assassins and non-blood relation children in movies that I've felt invested in. "The Mother" just expects that you're on board with some essential connection, which Paul Raci (nice to see him again on screen) tries his best to sell.

As expected, Lopez is an athletic and capable action hero (maybe too capable, but that could also be said of most of the guys out there, too). This is taken much more seriously than the over-the-top "Shotgun Wedding" and Caro and her filmmaking team ably capture Lopez in all her glory, whether walking through the Alaskan snow framed by a fur hood, jumping out of multi-story parking garages and sliding over cars in a chase, or dancing with Fiennes in a body hugging dress. It's all a much better showcase for Caro as a director in this big budget arena than the live-action "Mulan" was.

Lopez's output has been prolific lately as she and her closest collaborators continue to look for interesting projects for her, undeterred by any Hollywood or societally imposed ideas about movies a woman in her 50s should be making. Romantic comedies, action movies - they're all fair game, which is great. You just wish the movies could match the ambition.

"The Mother," a Netflix release currently streaming, is rated R by the Motion Picture Association for "violence, some language and brief drug use." Running time: 115 minutes. Two stars out of four.



Displaced Ukrainians flock to contest Eurovision Song Contest fetes Ukraine

LIVERPOOL, England, May 13: This weekend's Eurovision Song Contest is taking place in a city brimming with Ukrainian flags, Ukrainian food, Ukrainian musicians and Ukrainian fans: Liverpool.

The English port city that gave the world The Beatles is using the contest to offer displaced Ukrainians a taste of home -- free from war, and glittering with sequins and sparkle.

Britain is hosting the glitzy pancontinental music competition for the first time in 25 years after stepping in to hold it on behalf of last year's winner, Ukraine. Organizers have vowed to make the event a celebration of Ukrainian spirit and culture "I want all life to be like this - whole life Eurovision village, and whole life Eurovision celebration." said Darvna Borodaikevych, 29, one of more than 200.000 Ukrainians who have moved

alongside lessons in Ukrainian art and history.

"We feel like (we're) at home in Ukraine," said Iryna Schcerbuk, 30, of Kyiv, who came from her new home in southeast England to watch Thursday's Eurovision semifinal. "It's a very beautiful atmosphere."

One thing missing will be Ukraine's leader, President Volodymyr Zelenskyy. Eurovision organizers say they turned down his request to make a video address to Saturday's contest final. The European Broadcasting Union, a grouping of national public broadcasters that runs Eurovision said that letting Zelenskyv participate would breach "the nonpolitical nature of the event.

tinent shattered by war, Eurovision strives to keep pop and politics separate. Overtly political lyrics, signs and symbols are banned.

But politics can't be shut out entirely. Russia was banned from the contest after it invaded Ukraine in February 2022. Belarus was kicked out the previous year over its government's clampdown on dissent.

British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak's spokesman said the UK government was "disappointed" by Eurovision organizers' decision, though there were no plans to challenge it.

The brothers have set aside a period for family after the release and promo duties for "The Album," before gearing up to tour in August.

NEW YORK: Last summer's surprise set by Joni Mitchell at the Newport Folk Festival has been turned into a live album.

Mitchell took the stage alongside Brandi Carlile and friends in her first full-length performance since 2002, performing "Big Yellow Taxi," "Shine," "Help Me" and "Come In From the Cold." She also played a solo instrumental version of "Just Like This Train.'

On July 28, Rhino Records will release the 11-track live album, "At Newport," produced by Carlile and Mitchell, with liner notes by noted music writer Cameron Crowe. It will be available on streaming services and a two-LP or two-CD set.

Carlile had been expected to perform at the fes-tival on July 24, 2022, alongside **Wynonna Judd**, Lucius' Holly Laessig, Mumford & Sons' Marcus Mumford and more, but Mitchell was a surprise. Judd, was seen wiping away tears while Mitchell sang 1966's "Both Sides Now.'

Mitchell has been returning to the public eye since suffering a life-threatening brain aneurysm in 2015. In June, she will headline a concert at the Gorge Amphitheater in Quincy, Washington.

Mitchell was honored as MusiCares' Person of the Year during this year's Grammy festivities and she accepted a Grammy for best historical album. She was also the 2023 recipient of the Library of Congress Gershwin Prize for Popular Song, and performed a sultry version of "Summertime.

NEW YORK: The pioneering mommy blogger Heather Armstrong, who laid bare her struggles as a parent and her battles with depression and alcoholism on her site Dooce.com and on social media, has died at 47.

Armstrong's boyfriend, Pete Ashdown, told The Associated Press that he found her Tuesday night at their Salt Lake City home.

She had two children with her former husband and business partner. Jon Armstrong, began Dooce in 2001 and built it into a lucrative career. She was one of the first and most popular mommy bloggers, writing frankly about her children, relationships and other challenges at a time that personal blogs were on the rise. She parlayed her successes with the

blog, on Instagram and elsewhere into book deals, putting out a memoir in 2009, "It Sucked and then I Cried: How I Had a Baby, a Breakdown and a Much Needed M

That year, Armstrong appeared on "The Oprah Winfrey Show" and was on the Forbes list of the most influential women in media.

In 2012, the Armstrongs announced they were separating. They divorced later that year. She began dating Ashdown, a former US senate candidate, nearly six years ago. They lived together with Armstrong's children, 19-year-old Leta and 13-year-old Marlo. He has three children from a previous marriage who spent time in their home as well.

Ashdown said Armstrong died by suicide. He told the AP that she had been sober for more than 18 months, and recently had a relapse. He did not provide further details.

Armstrong didn't hold back on Instagram and Dooce, the latter a name that arose from her inability to quickly spell "dude" during online chats. Her raw, unapologetic posts on everything from pregnancy and breastfeeding to homework and carpooling were often infused with curses. As her popularity grew, so too did the barbs of critics, who accused her of bad parenting and worse.

One of her posts on Dooce spoke of a previous victory over drinking. (AP)

Conserve water

Floating solar farms are 'booming' in US

NEW YORK, May 13, (AP): When Joe Seaman-Graves, the city planner for the working class town of Cohoes, New York, Googled the term "floating solar," he didn't even know it was a thing

What he did know is that his tiny town needed an affordable way to get electricity and had no extra land. But looking at a map, one feature stood out.

"We have this 14-acre water reservoir," he said

Seaman-Graves soon found the reservoir could hold enough solar panels to power all the municipal buildings and streetlights, saving the city more than \$500,000 each year. He had stumbled upon a form of clean energy that is steeply ramping

Floating solar panel systems are beginning to boom in the United States after rapid growth in Asia. They're attractive not



just for their clean power and lack of a land footprint, but because they also conserve water by preventing evaporation.

A study published in the journal Nature Sustainability in March found that thousands of cities -- more than 6,000 in 124 countries -- could generate an amount equal to all their electricity demand using floating solar, making it a climate solution to be taken seriously. In the process, they could save roughly enough water each year to fill 40 million Ölympic-sized swimming pools.

Zena

Zhenzhong Zeng, a contributor on that study and associate professor at the Southern University of Science and Technology in Shenzhen, China, said in the United States, counties across Florida, Nevada, and California have the potential to generate more power than they use. Of course, they would need a mix of energy to actually provide power all hours of the day, Zeng said.

The concept of floating solar is simple: attach panels onto rafts so they float on water instead of blocking off land that could be used for agriculture or buildings. The panels are sealed and act as a lid that brings evaporation down to nearly zero, benefiting regions like California that repeatedly experi-ence periods of drought. The water also keeps the panels cool, allowing them to generate more electricity than their land-mounted counterparts, which lose efficiency when they get too hot.

Advantage

"We hear from our installers that they like it because it's something different," said Chris Bartle, director of sales and marketing for floating solar company Ciel & Terre, which has built 270 projects in 30 countries. "They get to go out on the water as opposed to on a rooftop. We joke that you need life jackets instead of ladders," he said.

Bartle's company has launched 28 floating solar projects in the US.


Limited land may have spurred some countries in Asia like Japan and Malaysia to expand floating solar, and other countries just took advantage of the steep plunge in prices for solar that has dramatically changed the economic picture for solar adoption globally.

A report by London-based Fairfield Market Research says the region currently accounts for 73% of revenue from float-ing solar and "spearheads the global landscape," but predicts that policy incentives in North America and Europe will spur significant growth.

One of the biggest floating solar farms in the US is the 4.8 MW project in Healdsburg, California, built by Ciel & Terre

"It's funny, I don't think a lot of people in Healdsburg know about it," said David Hargreaves, a local realtor and YouTuber who lives nearby. People may not know that solar panels can be placed on water, so they don't look out for it, he said.

The world's largest array so far is the 320 MW Dezhou Dingzhuang Floating Solar Farm in Shandong, China. North America's largest, by comparison, is a fraction of that - 8.9 MW at the Canoe Brook Water Treatment Plant in Millburn, N.J., owned by New Jersey Resources Clean Energy Ventures, which operates utility-scale commercial as well as residential solar systems across the Northeast.

Tedros said the novel way mpox was infecting people, via sexual contact in many countries that had never before identified cases, raised numerous concerns that warranted more attention. It was the biggest-ever outbreak of mpox.

"We're excited to see it start gaining traction in the US," said Robert Pohlman, vice president of NJRCEV.

But high up costs up front remain a barrier. Bartle estimates floating solar costs 10-15% more than land solar initially, but owners save money in the long run. Deeper water can increase installation costs, and the technology can't operate on fastmoving water, on the open ocean, or shorelines with large waves.

Engineers are working on other challenges. If the solar panels cover too much of a water body's surface, dissolved oxygen levels could change and water temperature will drop, which could harm aquatic life. Researchers are looking into whether the electromagnetic fields generated by cables could negatively influence aquatic ecosystems, however, there's no evidence of that yet.

Duke Energy, the large US utility that owns some 50,000 MW of energy capacity, is aiming to achieve net zero carbon emissions from electricity production by 2050. It just launched a small floating solar pilot, just shy of 1 MW in Bartow, Florida.

"The favorite part of my job is that I get to come out here," said Tommy Oneal, an environmental specialist at Duke Energy, as he gestured towards new panels floating on top of the cooling pond of an adjacent gas power plant.

"I see eagles, alligators, and all kinds of cool stuff ... It's fun, these issues make my job different every day. When I went to college, I never thought I'd be dealing with alligator issues, said Oneal.

In Cohoes, public officials are preparing for the installation of their project later this year at an estimated final cost of \$6.5 million. The federal government is paying almost half of that through a federal Housing and Urban Development grant. Another \$750,000 is covered by the utility National Grid. The city is also looking into New York solar incentives and the Inflation Reduction Act.

As far as he knows, Seaman-Graves said, it's is the first municipally-owned floating solar project in the country.

DULUTH, Minn.: Federal authorities have proposed new regulations that would force the Minnesota and Michigan iron mining industry to slash its mercury emissions.

The rule announced by the US Environmental Protection Agency last week follows two decades of litigation and other pressure by tribes and environmental groups who have long urged the agency to adopt mercury limits.

The six iron ore processing plants in northeastern Minnesota would be required to cut their emissions by 57% by the end of 2026. They're the largest source of mercury pollution in Minnesota, accounting for about half its emissions. The rule also applies to two mining operations in Michigan's Upper Peninsula. Virtually all US iron ore processing occurs at those Michigan and Minnesota mines.

"We're glad to see some limits at long last on this pollution," James Pew, an attorney with Earthjustice, told Minnesota Public Radio. He sued the EPA on behalf of the Fond du Lac Band of Lake Superior Chippewa and two environmental groups

But Pew said the EPA should have gone further, especially considering that limits were supposed to be put in place decades ago. Congress in 1990 first required the EPA to set mercury emission standards for the plants by 2000, but the agency never did.

"Instead the agency has allowed it to build up for the last 20 years, and mercury is a persistent pollutant, so we've still got all the mercury that was emitted over the last 20 years in the environment," Pew said.





Stuck antenna freed: A crucial radar antenna on a European spacecraft bound for Jupiter is no longer jammed.

Flight controllers in Germany freed the 52-foot (16-meter) antenna Friday after nearly a month of effort.

The European Space Agency's Jupiter Icy Moons Explorer, nicknamed Juice, blasted off in April on a decade-long voyage. Soon after launch, a tiny pin refused to budge and prevented the antenna from fully opening. Controllers tried shaking and warming

the spacecraft to get the pin to move by just millimeters. Back-to-back jolts finally did the trick.

The radar antenna will peer deep beneath the icy crust of three Jupiter moons suspected of harboring underground oceans and possibly life. Those moons are Callisto, Europa and Ganymede, the largest moon in the solar system.

Juice will attempt to go into orbit around Ganymede. No spacecraft has ever orbited a moon other than our own.

The news wasn't so good for NASA's Lunar Flashlight spacecraft. After struggling unsuccessfully for months to get the Cubesat into orbit around the moon, the space agency called it quits Friday. NASA Administrator is **Bill Nelson**.

Launched in December, the Lunar Flashlight was supposed to hunt for ice in the shadowed craters of the lunar south pole. Now it's headed back toward Earth and then into deep space, continually orbiting the sun. (AP)

'Metallic object was meteorite': A metallic object that punched a hole in the roof of a central New Jersey home this week, smashing into a hardwood floor and bouncing around a bedroom, was a meteorite, experts announced.

Scientists with The College of New Jersey determined the 6-by-4-inch object, which weighs about 2.2 pounds, is a rare stony chondrite meteorite. They came to that conclusion after conducting a visual examination, making density measurements and scanning electron microscope images. They were assisted in their work by Jerry Delaney, a retired meteorite expert from Rutgers University and the American Museum of Natural History.

"Getting the chance to examine the meteorite (Wednesday) was a rare and thrilling opportunity for me, as well as for a group of physics students and professors at TCNJ," said **Nathan Magee**, chair of the school's physics department. "We are excited to be able to confirm that the object is a true chondrite meteorite, in excellent condition, and one of a very small

He said at a media briefing on Thursday that his expert committee had concluded that the dramatic decline in cases in recent months, with about 90% fewer cases in the last three months, was no longer an acute concern.

Mpox has been established in parts of central and west Africa for decades, where people are mainly infected by animals like wild rodents. But the disease wasn't known to spark big outbreaks beyond the continent or to spread easily among people until last May, when dozens of epidemics emerged in Europe, North America and elsewhere.

North America declined, and there were no signs of widespread transmission beyond men who were gay, bisexual or had sex with other men. European health authorities said that 98% of mpox patients are men and of those, 96% are men who have sex with men.

Vaccines

Mpox vaccines in rich countries were quickly rolled out and reports of severe illness were relatively rare. Cases have since slowed to a trickle in Europe and North America. To date, WHO says there have been more than 87,000 cases and 140 deaths worldwide. In the last week, WHO said cases spiked by 64% compared to the previous week, with most cases in the Americas and the Western Pacific.

The U.S. has reported the biggest outbreak, with more than 30,000 cases. This week, the US Centers for Disease Prevention and Control said that it was investigating a recent surge in cases around the country, including Chicago.

In central and west Africa, mpox cases are continuing to rise, mainly driven by a spike in Congo. WHO said there has been about a 7% jump in new infections in the last two weeks, and Tedros said the routes of transmission were still not well understood. Cases have also been reported in the Central African Republic, Nigeria, Liberia and Ghana

The new pill is not a hormone. It carries an FDA warning about potential liver damage. Women will need to be screened for liver damage or infection before getting a prescription, then get a blood test every three months for nine months to monitor for safety problems, according to the FDA label.

ens of zoo animals in Sudan's capital - including an elderly crocodile, parrots and giant lizards - are feared dead after street battles between the country's rival forces made the location unreachable.

At least 100 animals, all kept inside enclosures, will have gone more than three weeks without food or water, said Sara Abdalla, the head zoologist at the zoo, which is part of the Sudan Natural History Museum.

Millions of people in Sudan have endured shortages of food, water and medicines after the conflict halted the most basic services. But as the sounds of explosions ring across the Sudanese capital of Khartoum, Abdalla has been wracked with worry over her animal charges, particularly those that are increasingly rare to find in their natural habitats in Sudan.

"I feel a great deal of misery and sad-ness, as well as helplessness," she said in a telephone interview from Khartoum. "I have assumed that we lost the birds and mammals.'

The zoo is home to species including an African grey parrot, a vervet monkey, giant lizards known as Nile monitors, a desert tortoise, a horned viper snake and a Nubian spitting cobra. Prior to the fighting, these were all fed twice a day. But the last time they received their meals and for some, medications, was on April 14, the day before fighting broke out, according to Abdalla. (AP)

Crusaders edge Blues in Super Rugby Pacific as Hurricanes 'pile on' points

WELLINGTON, New Zealand, May 13, (AP): The Christchurch-based Crusaders scored a single try in each half to beat the Auckland-based Blues 15-3 in a pivotal match in Super Rugby Pacific on Saturday.

The match between the fourth-place Blues and fifth-place Crusaders was much-anticipated and watched by a capacity crowd of 17,000 in Christchurch. But while it was physically intense, it provided little in terms of excitement.

The Crusaders hogged possession, especially in the first half when the few shreds the Blues obtained, usually in their own half, were wastefully kicked away by flyhalf Beauden Barrett.

Possession evened out to about 60-40 in favor of the Crusaders during the second half but they retained the

advantage in terms of territory and the Blues weren't able to marshal a coherent attack.

"The game was won with out defense," Crusaders captain Scott Barrett said. "To hold them to three points was a huge testament. At times it was a bit ugly and we didn't fire too many shots. But I think we closed down their game and a lot of their firepower didn't get into the game."

Thirty minutes passed before the first points came with a try to Crusaders backrower Quinten Strange. Beauden Barrett kicked a penalty and Mo'unga another and that ended the first-half scoring.

In the third minute of the second half, winger Leicester Fainga'anuku finished a long-distance try from a wayward Blues' kick. The next 37 minutes were scoreless.

"There was plenty of defense out there tonight and some sore bodies," Blues captain Beauden Barrett said. "They just took their opportunities. There weren't many in that game. When we sped the ball up in the second half we started to see some opportunities through the middle. But we weren't good enough to execute and finish."

The scoring action came in Wellington, where the Hurricanes scored their first try inside two minutes and added 10 more in a record 71-22 win over Moana Pasifika, their eighth win from 11 matches. The Hurricanes posted their highest score in a Super Rugby match, bouncing back from last week's shock loss to the Fijian Drua.

Three of those tries went to captain Ardie Savea, whose tireless ball-carrying kept the Hurricanes on the front foot.

"I'm proud of the boys' effort tonight," Savea said. "We knew what Moana would bring. I'm just happy the boys bounced back after last week and produced a good performance in front of our fans."

Moana Pasifika also had a try inside five minutes and were competitive at first in a match that produced 48 firsthalf points. The Hurricanes led 29-19 at halftime then outscored Moana Pasifika 42-3 in the second spell, adding six tries including Savea's hat trick.

The scrum was a weapon for the Hurricanes in the first half and in the second their fast passing and offloading ability was too much for Moana Pasifika.

Kini Naholo scored two tries and Billy Proctor, Jordie Barrett and Aidan Morgan also touched down for the Hurricanes in the first half. Jacob Devery, Salesi Rayasi and Caleb Delaney added to Savea's three tries in the second half.

In a later match at Sydney, the New South Wales Waratahs beat the Melbourne Rebels 38-20 after overcoming a 14-0 deficit for their third win in a row.

The Waratahs scored 14 of their points while the Rebels were a player down. Skipper Brad Wilkin and lock Josh Canham were both yellow-carded for trying to pull down Waratahs mauls.



LAS VEGAS, May 13, (AP): Vegas gave up three powerplay goals Friday night, but the Golden Knights are one victory from the Western Conference Final largely because of their penalty kill.

Clinging to a two-goal lead and entering the third period facing 4:36 of a major penalty against the NHL's most lethal power play, the Knights gave up just one more goal and remained in front to beat the Edmonton Oilers 4-3. "That could've been a turning point in the game big time, and we got through it," Vegas coach Bruce Cassidy said. "Even though we lost the special teams battle three goals to two, I think in our minds we won.' Jack Eichel had a goal and two assists as the Knights took a 3-2 series lead. Mark Stone, Reilly Smith and Nic Hague also scored, and Jonathan Marchessault tied a franchise playoff record with three assists for the Golden Knights. Adin Hill had 31 saves

The Oilers have scored within the first 6:46 in each game this season and in the first four minutes all but once. Vegas responded to the early deficits to come back and win Games 1 and 3, but never recovered in the other two of what became one-sided Oilers victories.

The Knights, however, scored three goals in 1:29 of the second period to surge in front 4-2. That was the fastest three goals in a playoff game in Vegas' six-year history.

"It's not like we don't want to score the first goal," Cassidy said. "Don't take yourself out the game in the first period. One goal shouldn't do that, whereas the other night in Edmonton, it did. Two goals came on essentially the same power play - Stone at 5-on-3 and Smith's first of this playoffs on a 5-on-4. Hague soon after scored from near the blue line to chase Skinner, the third time this postseason he has been pulled in favor of Campbell. "Jack came in and did his job," Oilers coach Jay Woodcroft said. "He gave us a chance to win the game, and I thought our team pushed hard in that third period. I thought that the power play did its thing right off the bat. We had numerous chances to tie it up.' That five-minute power play came just when it appeared Vegas would take all the momentum into the third period. Keegan Kolesar then shoved Edmonton's Mattias Ekholm into the boards with 20.9 seconds left. Kolesar was sent off with a game misconduct penalty. McDavid scored 2:40 into the third period, but that was the only goal of the power play, allowing the Knights to remain ahead at 4-3. That was McDavid's seventh goal of this playoffs. "That's the difference in the game," Hill said. "You give two there and and it's a tie game and who knows what happens from there? Our guys did a great job bearing down."

Lakers 'close out' GSW, advance to West finals

Heat back to East finals

LOS ANGELES, May 13, (AP): Six months and a day after the Los Angeles Lakers fell to 2-10 to start the regular season, they emphatically eliminated the defending NBA champions to reach the Western Conference finals.

Although the Lakers' transformation has become increasingly incredible over the past several weeks, the primary forces behind it are LeBron James and Anthony Davis. The superstars won a ring together only three years ago, and they shared a joyous hug Friday night after they led their team to its biggest home victory in over a decade.

James had 30 points, nine rebounds and nine assists and the Lakers ended the Golden State Warriors' reign with a 122-101 victory in Game 6 of the second-round series.

BASKETBALL

Davis had 17 points and 20 rebounds for the seventh-seeded Lakers, who never trailed in their third home victory over Golden State in seven days. Austin Reaves scored 23 points - highlighted by a 54-footer from midcourt at the halftime buzzer - along with six assists and five rebounds while Los Angeles inexorably pulled away, weathering every attempt by Stephen Curry to will the Warriors back into it. After the Lakers unseated the champs with remarkable style, they will face Nikola Jokic and the topseeded Nuggets in the Western Conference finals starting Tuesday night in

Denver. It's a rematch of the conference finals in the 2020 Florida bubble, won in five games by Los Angeles.

sandar Mitrovic, in his first game back Erik ten Hag's team lost its previous after an eight-game ban for grabbing two games 1-0 and both were away,

United moved level on points with third-placed Newcastle and both were four clear of fifth-placed Liverpool, with all three teams having three games left. Significantly, two of United's are at home against Chelsea and Fulham.

Martial slotted home in the 32nd minute after a square ball from Brazil winger Antony to give United the lead and only an impressive display by Wolves goalkeeper Dan Bentley, making his league debut, kept the score down.

Garnacho sealed the victory after beating the offside trap to race onto Bruno Fernandes' pass and providing the finish in the fourth minute of stoppage time.

Wolves arrived at Old Trafford knowing it was safe from relegation.

Newcastle dropped more points in its push for Champions League qualification by drawing 2-2 at Leeds, which remained in the Premier League relegation zone after a thrilling game that ended with Newcastle manager Eddie Howe being accosted by a fan.

Howe wasn't hurt in the incident and said he "was struggling to make sense" of a chaotic match that saw Leeds have a penalty saved, concede two more converted by Callum Wilson and have Junior Firpo sent off in stoppage time.



Rasmus Kristensen's deflected shot in the 79th minute ultimately earned Leeds a point but the team now managed by Sam Alladryce will come away from the match with big regrets because of errors by Patrick Bamford and Firpo.

Leeds was leading 1-0 through Luke Ayling's seventh-minute goal when Bamford was given a chance to double the advantage from the penalty spot after Firpo was tripped by Joelinton.

Bamford saw his penalty saved by goalkeeper Nick Pope and, three minutes later, Newcastle striker Wilson converted a spot kick at the other end after Alexander Isak was bundled over by Max Wober.

Firpo then had a moment of madness when he raised his hand following a cross into the area, with the ball brushing his fingertips to give away a penalty.

While routing the Warriors one last time, the Lakers improved to 7-0 at home since the regular season ended. They also snapped Golden State's streak of 28 playoff series with at least one road victory - an NBA-record run encompassing Curry's entire career.

James, Davis and the Lakers are the first team since 2014 to eliminate Curry's Warriors from the playoffs before the NBA Finals. Golden State has played in six of the last eight NBA Finals, missing the playoffs entirely in the other two seasons.

Curry scored 32 points while missing 10 of his 14 3-point attempts for the sixth-seeded Warriors, whose pursuit of their fifth championship in nine seasons ended with three straight road losses and an inept offensive performance by Curry's teammates in Game 6, including a 3-of-19 effort by Klay Thompson, who missed 10 of his 12 3-point attempts.

The Splash Brothers were far too dry when it mattered against the Lakers: Thompson went 10 for 36 on 3-pointers in the series' final four games, while Curry was 14 for 49.

Curry was their only starter in double figures, with the other four shooting 11 for 38.

The Lakers took charge early, survived the Warriors' rallies and blew it open in the fourth quarter with a balanced effort led by the 38-year-old James, who produced his first 30-point playoff game since the 2020 NBA Finals.

The 20-year veteran can still assert his will as forcefully as almost any elite player, and he quarterbacked the Lakers' offensive effort while Davis who left Game 5 early after taking a shot to the head - played another standout defensive game.

D'Angelo Russell scored 19 points as the Lakers capably survived the third-quarter ejection of Dennis Schröder, the sparkplug guard and primary defender on Curry. Schröder had five assists and defended doggedly in his first start of the postseason for the Lakers, but the German point guard was ejected with his second technical foul on a curious call after Green pushed the ball into Schröder's face. His absence scarcely seemed to help

Heat coach Erik Spoelstra walked into the postgame interview room, a cup of a celebratory beverage in his hand, took a seat and began explaining how difficult the journey has been for Heat.

The regular season was a struggle. They needed to survive the play-in. They were three minutes away from going home before the playoffs even started, needing a rally just to earn the right to play top-seeded Milwaukee.

All forgotten. They're in the NBA's final four - getting there as a No. 8 seed.

Jimmy Butler scored 24 points, Bam Adebayo added 23 and the Heat are headed back to the Eastern Conference finals after topping the New York Knicks 96-92 in Game 6.

Maybe for some franchises. Not for Miami. The Heat are headed there for the 10th time overall, the seventh time in the last 13 years and the third time in the past four seasons. They'll play Game 1 at either Boston or Philadelphia on Wednesday; those teams will decide their East semifinal series Sunday.

Union on Champs League

BERLIN, May 13, (AP): Bayern Munich captain Thomas Müller scored on a rare start as the defending champion took another step toward a record-extending 11th consecutive Bundesliga title by routing Schalke 6-0 on Saturday.

Bayern moved four points clear of Borussia Dortmund before the late game. Dortmund could restore the one-point gap by beating Borussia Mönchengladbach at home, while it must also maintain hope in Bayern dropping points in its final two games.

Bayern next plays Leipzig and Cologne, while Dortmund plays Augsburg and Mainz for its last games of the season.

Bayern missed a couple of good chances before Müller finally made the breakthrough in the 21st minute.

Müller, who is captain while Manuel Neuer works on his comeback from a broken leg, was making his first start since April 22.

"I was happy to get the 'can-opener' today. It was a brilliant feeling. The stadium exploded - and then we kept going," Müller said.

Joshua Kimmich made it 2-0 10 minutes later with a penalty awarded through VAR after Cedric Brunner caught Jamal Musiala in the face with his arm. The Schalke defender was booked and Musiala showed no lasting damage.

Serge Gnabry added two more goals in the second half, Mathys Tel added another, and Noussair Mazraoui completed the scoring in injury time.

It continued a long tradition of Bayern routing Schalke. Schalke hasn't beaten the Bayarian powerhouse in 23 league games since a victory in December 2010, with Bayern clocking up 71 goals in that run.

Union Berlin made its own big step toward Champions League qualification after winning at home over chief rival Freiburg 4-2. Union's win lifted it three points clear of fifth-placed Freiburg. The top four qualify for Europe's premier competition.

Sheraldo Becker set up Kevin Behrens to put Union ahead in the fifth minute, then scored the second himself in the 36th after surging past a couple of defenders and playing a one-two with Robin Knoche before shooting between Freiburg goalkeeper Mark Flekken's legs.

Becker celebrated with a Spiderman mask, for which he was booked, and he responded a minute later with another goal, again set up by Knoche.

But Vincenzo Grifo sent in a corner for Manuel Gulde to head one back for Freiburg in the 56th, then added a penalty in the 70th to ensure an exciting finale. But the outstanding Becker wasn't finished, sprinting clear after Jordan Pefok won the ball in midfield and setting up Aïssa Laïdouni to seal the win on a counterattack in the 80th. It was Laïdouni's first goal for Union since his winter switch from Ferencvaros. Few can be as important. Bochum climbed out of the relegation zone with a 3-2 win over Augsburg. Bochum moved a point above Schalke with two games remaining.

Wilson converted that one, too, right down the middle in the 69th only for Kristensen to equalize.

Firpo was sent off for a second yellow card in the first minute of stoppage time, during which there was an alarming incident that saw a spectator walk up to Howe in the technical area and barge him in the chest before being escorted away by security.

It wasn't immediately clear whether it was a Leeds or Newcastle fan.

Leeds is one point from safety with two games left, at West Ham and at home against Tottenham.

Tottenham dropped out of contention for Champions League qualification after a 2-1 loss at Aston Villa, which moved level on points with its beaten opponent. They are fighting for berths in the two minor European competitions - the Europa League and the Europa Conference League - with Brighton, which is two points further back in eighth place but has three games in hand.

Crystal Palace beat Bournemouth 2-0 in the other game.

Taiwo Awoniyi's second goal of the day helped relegation-threatened Nottingham Forest draw with Chelsea 2-2 in the English Premier League on Saturday after Raheem Sterling's quickfire goals at Stamford Bridge.

Awoniyi, who also netted twice last week, opened the scoring in the 13th minute with a powerful header and nodded home again just past the hour mark, shortly after Sterling equalized and put Chelsea in front with goals seven minutes apart.

The draw inched Forest closer to safety, with Steve Cooper's team in 16th place and three points above the relegation zone with two games remaining. Forest hosts Arsenal next weekend and ends its season at Crystal Palace. Chelsea is winless in its past six league games at Stamford Bridge as its disappointing season grinds to-ward completion. The Blues are in 11th place.

Sterling's performance was a positive development for interim manager Frank Lampard. The England forward scored from Trevor Chalobah's pass in front of the net in the 51st minute and then beat a defender to curl one home seven minutes later.

Awoniyi just needed a glancing header from Orel Mangala's pass to level the score in the 62nd.

Forest has just one win from 18 away games this season.
