ACTIVISTS IN EUROPE MARK DEATH OF MAHSA AMINI IAEA hits Tehran ban on key 'eyes'

BERLIN, Sept 17, (AP): The U.N. nuclear watchdog has harshly criticized Iran for effectively barring several of its most experienced inspectors from monitoring the country's disputed atomic program.

The strongly worded statement came amid longstanding tensions between Iran and the International Atomic Energy Agency, which is tasked with monitoring a nuclear program that Western nations have long suspected is aimed at eventually developing a nuclear weapon. Iran insists the program

Rafael Mariano Grossi, the head of the IAEA, said Iran had withdrawn the designation of "several experienced Agency inspectors," barring them from taking part in the monitoring of its program.

"Iran has effectively removed about one-third of the core group of the agency's most

experienced inspectors designated for Iran," he said. Grossi went on to "strongly

condemn this disproportionate and unprecedented unilateral measure," saying it "constitutes an unnecessary blow to an alresumption of sending workers ready strained relationship be-

tween the IAEA and Iran."
Iran's Foreign Ministry linked the move to what it said was an attempt by the United States and three European countries to misuse the IAEA "for their own po-

litical purposes."
The U.S., Britain, France and Germany criticized Iran in a joint statement at an IAEA board meeting in Vienna this week, calling on Tehran to step up co-

operation with the agency. Britain, France and Germany also said Thursday that they would maintain sanctions on Iran related to its nuclear and ballistic missile programs.

Gunmen attack paramilitary forces

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 17: A glimmer of hope appeared on the horizon for the Filipino workers to return to Kuwait following a statement issued by the Undersecretary of the Philippine Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Eduardo de Vega, who said Manila hopes to sit with the Kuwaiti side and discuss

the resumption of sending workers, reports Al-Rai daily. This came after the Kuwaiti Juvenile Court convicted the juvenile who is accused of killing the Filipino worker, Jullebee Ranara.

It may be noted that for more than 9 months Philippines stopped sending new domestic workers to Kuwait and Kuwait also suspended new visas for Filipino workers.

De Vega said, in a press interview the day before yesterday, that the ruling was a "positive step" in terms of achieving justice for the Ranara family, stressing his country's recognition of Kuwait's efforts, reports Al-Rai daily

He added: "We hope to sit down again with Kuwait, so that we

can talk about the current situation and find solutions for the return of workers."

He pointed out, "Depending on how our colleagues in the Department of Migrant Workers (DMW) feel, I think we can ask Kuwait to resume our talks, so that we can see how we can move forward, and ultimately be able to lift the suspension on both sides.

Commenting on the position of the Philippine government, Bassam Al-Shammari, a specialist in domestic workers' affairs, considered it "a good gesture to resolve the crisis between the two countries in a way that serves the interests of the two peoples," pointing out that this step is considered the beginning of resolving the problem of the shortage of domestic workers in Kuwait, which contributes to stability and balance in the Kuwaiti labor market.

BERLIN: German police said dozens of people, including at least 26 officers, were injured during unrest surrounding an Eritrean cultural festival in the southwestern city of Stuttgart.

Shortly before the event was set to begin Saturday afternoon, around 200 protesters gathered in the area outside and began throwing stones, bottles, and other items at police officers and participants of the event. Six of the 26 injured police officers were treated in a hospital for their injuries, police said. Four event participants and two protesters were also injured, according to police, although information wasn't immediately available about the severity of their injuries. (AP)

LONDON: London police arrested a 25-year-old man early Saturday morning after he allegedly climbed over a wall and entered the royal stables at Buckingham Palace.

The man was detained at 1:25 a.m Saturday for trespassing on a protected site, London's Metropolitan Police Service said in a statement. He was taken to a London police station, where he remained by late morning.

Officers found the man outside the royal stables following a search of the area. He didn't enter the palace or its gardens at any time, police said. (AP)

Jericho gets Heritage tag

JERICHO, West Bank, Sept 17, (AP): A U.N. conference voted Sunday to list prehistoric ruins near the ancient West Bank city of Jericho as a World Heritage Site in Palestine, a decision likely to anger Israel, which controls the territory and does not recognize a Palestinian state.

Jericho is one of the oldest continually inhabited cities on earth, and is in a part of the Israeli-occupied West Bank that is administered by the internationally recognized Palestinian Authority. The listing refers to the Tell es-Sultan archaeological site nearby, which contains prehistoric ruins dating back to the ninth millennium B.C. and is outside the ancient city itself.

The decision was taken at a meeting of the U.N. World Heritage Committee in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, under the auspices of the U.N. Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, UNESCO.

Israel quit UNESCO in 2019, accusing it of being biased against it and of diminishing its connection to the Holy Land. Israel also objected to UNES-CO's acceptance of Palestine as a member state in 2011. But Israel remains a party to the World Heritage Convention, and it sent a delegation to the meeting in

Israel captured the West Bank, along with Gaza and east Jerusalem, in the 1967 Mideast war. The Palestinians want all three territories for their future state. Israel views the West Bank as the biblical and cultural heartland of the Jewish people.

TRIPOLI, Sept 17, (AP): Zahra el-Gerbi wasn't expecting much of a response to her online fundraiser, but she felt she had to do something after four of her relatives died in the flooding that decimated the eastern Libyan city of Derna. She put out a call for donations for those displaced by the deluge.

In the first half-hour after she shared it on Facebook, the Benghazibased clinical nutritionist said friends and strangers were already promising financial and material support.

"It's for basic needs like clothes, foods and accommodation," el-Gerbi said.

For many Libyans, the collective grief over the more than 11,000 dead has morphed into a rallying cry for national unity in a country blighted by 12 years of conflict and division. In turn, the tragedy has ramped up pressure on the country's leading politicians, viewed by

The oil-rich country has been divided between rival administrations since 2014, with an internationally recognized government in Tripoli and a rival authority in the east, where Derna is located. Both are backed by international patrons and armed militias whose influence in the country has ballooned since a NATO-backed Arab Spring uprising toppled autocratic ruler Moammar Gadhafi in 2011. Numerous United Nations-led initiatives to bridge the divide have

In the early hours of Sept. 11, two dams in the mountains above Derna burst, sending a wall of water two stories high into the city and sweeping entire neighborhoods out to sea. At least 11,300 people were killed and a further 30,000 displaced.

An outpouring of support for the people of Derna followed. Residents from the nearby cities of Benghazi and Tobruk offered to put up the displaced. In Tripoli, some 1,450 kilometers (900 miles) west, a hospital said it would perform operations free of charge for any injured in the flood.

Ali Khalifa, an oil rig worker from Zawiya, west of Tripoli, said his cousin and a group of other men from his neighborhood joined a convoy of vehicles heading to Derna to help out with relief efforts. Even the local scout squad participated, he said.

The tragedy follows a long line of problems born from the country's lawlessness. Most recently, in August, sporadic fighting broke out between two rival militia forces in the capital, killing at least 45 people, a reminder of the influence rogue armed groups wield across Libya.

Under pressure, Libya's General Prosecutor al-Sediq al-Sour said Friday that prosecutors would open a file on the collapse of the two dams and investigate the authorities in the Derna, as well as past

But the country's political leaders have so far deflected responsibility. The Prime Minister of Libya's Tripoli government, Abdul-Hamid Dbeibah, said he and his ministers were accountable for the dams' maintenance, but not the thousands of deaths caused by the

Meanwhile, the speaker of Libya's eastern administration, Aguila Saleh, said the flooding was simply an incomparable natural disaster. "Don't say, 'If only we'd done this, if only we'd done that," said Saleh in a televised news conference.

Case of forged experience in Kuwait's medical sector

light the severe repercussions of neglecting primary duty. The duty of honesty.

The heart of the matter concerns an Egyptian consultant doctor with a

long history of service and a genuine medical degree, working diligently in a private hospital in Kuwait.

This medical professional, over the years, ascended the ranks due to his dedication and expertise, becoming a senior figure in his field. However, recently, a shadow was cast over his esteemed reputation.

Upon deciding to branch out to another Gulf country, this doctor furnished a resume and experience certificates, including one that attested to the duration of his employment at the private hospital in Kuwait. However, when a specialized authentication company in the receiving country undertook a routine verification process, the dark truth unravelled. This senior consultant doctor had forged the 'Certificate of Experience' related to his tenure at the Kuwaiti hospital.

To say this revelation was shocking would be an understatement. It serves as a powerful reminder of the fragile nature of trust, and how quickly it can crumble. The duty of honesty, which forms the bedrock of any professional undertaking, was severely compromised.

From a legal lens, forgery, especially in official documents, is a criminal offense. It not only tarnishes the reputation of the individual but also compromises the authenticity of professional standards in the entire sector. Beyond the immediate legal consequences, which includes potential imprisonment and deportation, the moral and ethical implications of such actions are pro-

This is not merely a case of an individual's dishonesty but a call to arms for Kuwait's authorities. It underscores the necessity for data verification processes for all professionals working within our borders. We, as a nation, must ensure that the honesty and authenticity of our professionals are above reproach.

In legal academia, there's a consistent emphasis on the importance of transparent, honest dealings, which play a pivotal role in shaping the conscience of any society. This incident is a reminder, albeit a grim one of the chasm that exists between academic teachings and real-world practices.

Our nation's employers, both in the private and public sectors, would greatly benefit from incorporating authentication and verification companies into their hiring processes. These entities ensure that the credentials provided by potential employees are genuine, safe-guarding the trust placed in them by the

larger community. Kuwait has always been a beacon of progress in the Gulf, with its rich heritage and forward-thinking policies. To maintain this status, we must ensure that the very foundations of our professional sectors are robust, unyielding, and uncompromised.

In closing, let this incident serve as a resounding reminder of our collective duty to uphold honesty. It is our hope that the concerned authorities will heed this call and enforce rigorous data checks, ensuring the credibility of all professionals working in Kuwait. After all, a society thrives on trust, and trust is built on honesty.

Court to hear appeal on pensions on Wed

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 17: The Constitutional Court has set the upcoming session on Wednesday to consider the appeal submitted against article 80 of the Social Security Law regarding the invalidation of exceptional pensions.

In a press statement, the appellant lawyer Mohammad Al-Ansari said, "Our refuge, our resort, and our fortress is the judiciary. The Constitution stipulates equality, and the exceptional pensions that allow increases and exceptions for leaders but not citizens indicate discrimination, not equality. Article 80 of the law failed to set a clear standard for entitle-

ment to the exceptional pension and left it open to interpretation, under the pretext of the existence of an article that allows the Council of Ministers to grant whomever it deems appropriate an exceptional salary without a fixed and fair standard for all.

MPs rap attack on citizen in Turkiye

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 17: MPs Muhannad Al-Sayer, Osama Al-Zaid and Muhammad Al-Regaib have called on Minister of Foreign Affairs Sheikh Salem Al-Sabah to take the necessary action regarding the attack on a Kuwaiti by some Turkish man (group) in Trabzon City, Turkiye.

Al-Zaid stressed the need for the Embassy of Kuwait in Turkiye to quickly take action against those behind the barbarian attack on a Kuwaiti tourist in front of his wife and children. He emphasized the need to provide proper treatment for the Kuwaiti and protection for his family until they return home under the supervision of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. He asserted that legal measures must be taken against the attackers who should be punished for their crime. He affirmed that the dignity of Kuwaitis inside the country is protected by Kuwaiti laws, but their protection is the responsibility of the ministry whenever they are abroad.

Al-Sayer asked the Kuwaiti Embassy in Turkiye to exhaust all diplomatic means to protect the Kuwaiti and his family. "Diplomacy is useless if it cannot defend and protect the citizens. Sheikh Salem Al-Sabah should immediately issue a statement on the steps taken and reassure the people of Kuwait about the health condition of their compatriot," he stated.

Al-Regaib urged the ministry to take tough measures to end the repeated crimes against Kuwaiti tourists in Turkiye. He appealed to the Kuwaiti Embassy in Turkiye to make an official announcement of the measures it has taken regard-

Footages of the crime have gone viral on social media, showing the Kuwaiti tourist being hit on the head until he fell down with his head strongly hitting the ground. Screams were heard, believed to be that of the citizen's wife and children.

Meanwhile, MP Dawoud Maarefi forwarded queries to HH the Prime Minister Sheikh Ahmad Nawaf Al-Ahmad Al-Sabah about the vacant senior positions in ministries and public institutions. He wants to know the number of such vacancies, number of senior officials who are still in office despite the end of their term, and number of senior officials whose term will end in fiscal 2023/2024.

He requested for a list of nominees to senior positions, reasons behind the delaved issuance of decrees to fill up vacancies, criteria for the appointment of senior officials, and target date for filling up all

Moreover, MP Hamdan Al-Azmi said the Public Authority for Disabled Affairs (PADA) has committed financial and administrative violations, including illegal payments and contracting with certain companies. He asked Minister of Social, Family and Childhood Affairs Sheikh Firas Saud Al-Malek Al-Sabah to take action regarding such violations and the manipulation of public funds allocated for

On the other hand, the Government-Parliament Coordinative Committee on Sunday discussed the priorities for the upcoming parliamentary year.

MPs Hassan Jawhar, Osama Al-Shaheen, Fahd Al-Massoud, Abdullah Al-Anbai and Soud Al-Asfour represented the National Assembly in the meeting; while the government party included Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of State for National Assembly and Cabinet Affairs Essa Al- Kandari, and Minister of Justice and State Minister for Housing Affairs Faleh Al-Raqaba.

The E'etelafiya Student Union also issued a statement, voicing objection to the decision. They urged the university administration to cancel the decision, taking into consideration the students' interests.

The five countries are the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, Iraq, Libya, Kuwait, and the

According to data from the US Department of Commerce, the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia came at the top of the list of the five countries in terms of the highest exports, as the value of its oil exports amounted to \$6.63 billion, at about 81.525 million barrels, while it exported \$946.11 million during last July with a quantity of 12.16 million

Iraq came second with oil exports amounting to 47.15 million barrels, with a value of 3.44 billion dollars, while the value of exports for the seventh month of the current year amounted to about 424.97 million dollars, with a quantity amounting to 5.992 million barrels.

In third place come Libyan oil exports to America at about 7.301 million barrels, worth \$627.45 billion, and during its seventh month it exported 608,000 barrels worth \$53,188 million.

Kuwait's oil exports to America ranked fourth, with the amount of its exports reaching 3,634 thousand barrels in the same period, worth \$279.73 million, and the amount of its exports reaching 819,000 barrels in July, worth \$67,906 million. The UAE ranked last, which did not ex-

port oil to America during the months of May, June, and July in 2023, while the total UAE oil imports before these two months since the beginning of the year reached 1.427 million barrels, worth 123.169 billion

'Endowments urged to cease covering school fees for non-Kuwaitis'

"WE WERE greatly surprised by the criticism aimed at MP Muhammad Haif over the past week. He had requested the Minister of Education to enforce the segregation policy in classrooms, citing adherence to Law No. 24/1996. This law, passed 27 years ago with unanimous approval from the National Assembly, has remained unchanged, despite subsequent assemblies, the previous or current liberal opposition, and civil society institutions failing to repeal it," columnist Bader Khaled Al-Bahr wrote for Al-Qabas daily.

"It's important to note that when this law was enacted, Haif was not a representative; his first parliamentary appearance occurred in 1999. Perhaps those opposing the law should direct their concerns towards the members of the 1996 Council, like the honorable MP Dr. Hassan Jowhar, the current Speaker of the National Assembly, who voted unanimously to pass the law. Criticizing and objecting in this arbitrary manner will bear no fruit unless channeled through official avenues for amending laws.

"For years, we have contemplated suggesting state partial support for citizens in exchange for paying their children's private school tuition fees. This was based on several reasons, including the potential savings of ap-

proximately three thousand and seven hundred dinars per student for the state, which is the average cost to the government per student from kindergarten to secondary school. Parents have contributed to the country by nurturing young individuals better prepared for the future labor market, compared to the declining quality of public education, acknowledged by the state to be at the level of a seventh-grade average for secondary school students.

"Additionally, cheating has exacerbated this issue, resulting in a high dropout rate for scholarships and universities. Government officials in certain specializations have achieved nearly 100 percent success rates in high school exams, highlighting the need for educational reforms, exemplified by a recent widespread failure in the College of Medicine.

"We chose patience in requesting government support for parents of private school students for higher education, aiming to present it in a convincing framework to the government and Parliament.

"However, our patience was tested when the Ministry of Endowments released a statement, mirroring the demands we were about to propose, but exclusively for non-Kuwaiti citizens. The statement announced the registration opening for the children of non-Kuwaiti imams and muezzins working in the mosque sector in private schools for the new academic year 2023/2024.

"The ministry would cover 300 Kuwaiti dinars in tuition fees for each student and 700 dinars for their children with special needs. Notably, they specified the payment for a maximum of six children for each imam and muezzin, emphasizing the word "only" in a manner suggesting limitation, even though six children constitute a significant number. The announcement failed to clarify whether these six children could be from one wife or multiple marriages, leaving room for misinterpretation.

"In light of the last statistics indicating 2,801 expatriate imams and muez-

zins, implementing this decision could result in the unjust waste of millions of public dinars while the state already provides free education. After communicating with imams and muezzins, we found that the state treats children from the Yemeni and Somali communities similar to Kuwaitis, allowing them to study in government schools.

"On the other hand, imams and muezzins of different nationalities have the option to study in the religious institute. Some exploit loopholes to enroll their children in government schools by requesting transfers to remote mosque areas, far from the religious institute. After securing enrollment in government schools, they relocate back to interior areas without returning their children to the institute.

"Hence, we caution the Ministry of Endowments against the unjustifiable waste of public funds and urge them to cease covering private school fees for non-Kuwaitis, considering the alternatives available to them. This Endowments announcement has provoked citizens, who are already grappling with frustration due to deteriorating conditions and the denial of their rightful entitlements. The ministry should step forward and ensure that some of these rights are granted to expatriates.

"Had it not been for the Ministry of Endowments' provocative statement, this article would delve into the concerning tensions between the government and partisan movements, pushing us closer to a perilous edge.

"We would emphasize the vital necessity for the state to align with national figures akin to the revered individuals etched in our history. Figures like Mr. Jassim Hamad Al-Saqr, whose death anniversary in 2006 coincides with today. He contributed significantly to his country's economic and political resurgence, leaving behind a lasting legacy in academia and humanitarian endeavors. We mention it today what we said in 2017 under the title 'Not Everything that Glitters is a Man'.

Also:

"Electronic fraud cases are considered the most complex and difficult for the security authorities, as these are transcontinental crimes in which the techniques being used make it difficult to track down the perpetrators and most of them are carried out in countries other than where the targeted victims are staying," columnist **Tariq Hamada** wrote for **Al-Anba** daily.
"Perpetrators obtain information about victims by hacking into telephones

through the installation of suspicious applications, or the victims' social media accounts or emails, as well as by impersonating security personnel or employees to request for seemingly ordinary personal information, such as the name or job of the owner of the telephone number.

"Some people believe this information is not valuable, yet the data collected are for future exploitation. We also see the exploitation of some ordinary people, asking for their bank account number and password, and then instruct them to re-send the OTP under false descriptions.

"Gangs operate professionally and they have information about the victims that was leaked to them or they obtained in one way or another. They begin communicating with the victims by exploiting such information and instructing the victim to take a specific action.

"Countries, including Kuwait, are exerting tremendous efforts to reduce these crimes by raising public awareness and coordinating with international security agencies. Reducing fraud crimes requires more awareness in the first place and remembering that any party in Kuwait - whether banks, investigators or the like - do not ask for bank data that are considered the property of the customer and cannot be disclosed to any party. People should not respond to calls or messages from unknown parties.

"Gangs can obtain personal data from telephones. Therefore, people should verify the identity of an individual or entity to whom they wish to send money through a link, confirm the amount, and refrain from sending electronic payment links on behalf of others without confirming the reason for this financial transaction and its legitimacy, so the mediator does not bear criminal account-

"Thank God, Kuwait is blessed with personalities who carry the heaviest burden in the country's renaissance and protect national wealth due to their patriotism, dedication at work, commitment to continue on the path of goodness and reform, and not using influence or positions to obtain privileges unjustly, columnist **Dr Mohammad Al-Azmi** wrote for **Al-Rai** daily.

"One of these personalities is Minister of Public Works Dr Amani Bouqamaz, as we closely follow up her achievements and serious reform movements like other national figures -- some of whom we have written about and others we will write about in order to contribute to national reconciliation and encourage national action.

"Despite being known as a calm person, the minister is a spark of activity in her field of work and in the important ministerial portfolio she holds. She carries heavy burdens and responsibilities that are difficult for any ordinary

"Her first achievement is the qualitative shift at the Directorate General of Civil Aviation manifested in the development of the directorate, legal measures taken

against those who violated the work system, and diligent follow up of the Terminal Two project which, I hope, will be completed without the intervention of parties keen on obstructing it. This is a national project that the country needs. "Bouqamaz holds a doctorate degree in Civil Engineering and she taught at the College of Civil Engineering in Kuwait University. This means she is pro-

fessionally and academically competent. She has the ability to follow up projects, considering her experience and sound opinions. Therefore, she achieved success after success as her decisions proved she is keen on addressing vital issues for the benefit of the country.

"Our esteemed minister's goal is to complete and operate State projects. God

willing, this will happen. Through our close follow up of her achievements, we bear witness to her sincerity, dedication and hard work to complete tasks in record time and with great mastery. Thus, she is a role model in terms of being fair to all workers, and striving for development to better serve Kuwait and its

'Next 48 hours real test for govt efforts'

Are flexible work hours successful?

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 17: The government measures which the authorities have worked on arranging throughout the summer to control traffic congestion, especially at peak times by adopting the so-called flexible working hours, will be determined over the next 48 hours, reports Al-Rai daily.

As the Civil Service Commission has given nod for the proposal submitted by the Ministry of the Interior to implement "flexible working hours," which allows the employee to choose the working hours between 7 and 9 in the morning while the Ministry of Education announced school working hours and different attendance and departure times for students in the four educational levels, all eyes remain focused on Sunday and Monday when school and university students begin full-time study and employees return to their jobs after the long summer vacation.

The fundamental difference this year lies in the implementation of "flexible working hours" to distribute the movement of employees and parents on the roads at different times, with the aim of resolving the issue of congestion, and the next 48 hours, starting this Sunday morning, will be a real test of all the government efforts and arrangements that have been made within this frame-

For its part, the Ministry of Interior confirmed that it has taken all security and traffic measures to welcome the new academic year.

Director of the Traffic Awareness Department of the General Traffic Department, Brigadier General Nawaf Al-Hayyan, said in a statement to KUNA that the necessary maintenance has been carried out for all traffic intersections and cameras to ensure their readiness.

Al-Hayyan added that the General Traffic Department has prepared 500 patrols to distribute to all governorates to welcome the academic year, hoping for safety and success for everyone.

He called for the need to cooperate with traffic police and patrols deployed on the main roads, in the interior areas, and around schools and universities to avoid traffic

According to a statement issued by the Public Relations and Security Media Department of the Ministry of Interior an awareness plan has been developed that will be implemented throughout the year under the slogan "On One Heart" by broadcasting television flashes and publishing awareness-raising instructions and advice in all media and social media outlets to educate the students about the danger of some crimes, especially drugs and psychotropic substances, and their devastating negative effects resulting from their abuse.

Don't force 'mai saha' 'Provide filter water'

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 17: The Minister of Commerce and Industry and Minister of State for Youth Affairs, Muhammad Al-Aiban, issued a ministerial decision obligating restaurants and cafes to provide filtered water for free to customers if they request it, and not to force them to buy bottled water when ordering food or meals, reports Al-Qabas daily.

The decision also obliges all restaurants and cafés to install a special filter for the water provided to the consumer, in accordance with the requirements put in place by the official authorities regarding water quality and filter installation.

The following is the text of the decision:

-- Article One: Restaurants and cafés may not force the consumer to buy bottled (mineral) water when ordering any type of food or dietary

-- Article Two: Restaurants and cafés must provide the consumer upon request - water supplied by the Ministry of Electricity and Water to the restaurant or café. -- Article Three: The restaurant

and café are obligated to install a special filter for the water provided to the consumer, in accordance with the requirements of the official authorities regarding water quality and filter installation.

-- Article Four: Every provision that conflicts with the provisions of this decision shall be repealed.

-- Article Five: All officials – each within his jurisdiction - must implement this decision and it will come into effect from the date of its publication in the Official Gazette.

4th relief package headed for Libya

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 17, (KUNA): The fourth planeload of aid left Kuwait to hurricane-struck Libya on Sunday with tons of relief equipment and medical supplies onboard.

Kuwait had joined as a dialogue partner, and also joined "Sika". About two weeks ago, Kuwait signed the Treaty of Cooperation and Friendship as a dialogue partner with ASEAN."

Meanwhile, the Chinese Ambassador to Kuwait Zhang Jianwei affirmed that the presence of His Highness the Crown Prince of the State of Kuwait Sheikh Mishal Al-Ahmad at the opening ceremony of the Asian Games will advance the strategic partnership between China and Kuwait and raise it to a higher level, adding that work will be done to accelerate the pace of bilateral cooperation in various fields, including in the field of culture.

He explained that the Chinese Cultural Center in Kuwait is considered a symbol of Chinese-Kuwaiti friendship. Kuwait is the first and only Gulf country in which a Chinese medical team is stationed.

As the Chinese Cultural Center in Kuwait - the first of its kind in the Gulf region - celebrates its trial operation, Kuwait will be at the forefront of cultural exchanges between China and the GCC countries in the new era. It will establish a more solid cultural foundation for building a Chinese-Arab community with a common future, which once again highlights the special relationship between Kuwait and China.

"Iran had previously warned about the consequences of such political abuses, including the attempt to politicize the atmosphere of the agency," said Nasser Kanaani, spokesman for Iran's Foreign Ministry.

The Vienna-based IAEA reported earlier this month that Iran had slowed the pace at which it is enriching uranium to nearly weapons-grade levels. That was seen as a sign that Tehran was trying to ease tensions after years of strain between it and the U.S.

Iran and the U.S. are negotiating a prisoner swap and the release of billions of dollars in Iranian assets frozen in South Korea.

In other news, gunmen opened fire on a group of paramilitary forces in southern Iran, killing one of them and wounding another three, state media reported Sunday.

Local media did not give a motive for Saturday's attack, which occurred on the anni-

versary of the death while in police custody of 22-year-old Mahsa Amini and the outbreak of nationwide protests. It was unclear if the attack was linked to the anniversary.

The official IRNA news agency said the attack targeting members of the paramilitary

There would be no development without investing in future generations and this matter is within Kuwait's 2035 Vision, pointed out Mahdi.

Sustainable development is not a recent development, Kuwait had been working on it since establishing the future generations fund in the era of late Amir Sheikh Jaber Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah in 1979, a step aimed at ensuring the prosperity of future generations, added the official.

In regards to the 2030 United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), Dr. Mahdi affirmed that Kuwait was eager to contribute to the 17-points plan ranging from eradicating poverty worldwide to providing proper health care and more.

Kuwait's 2035 Vision is in line with the SDGs, said Mahdi, revealing that Kuwait had taken considerable strides into realizing its own development goals through the involvement of SCPD.

In regards to digital transforma-

Ministry launching project to increase pace of extending fiber-optic network

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 17: The Ministry of Communication announced that, "in fulfillment of the vision of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Nawaf Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah (New Kuwait 2035), and within the framework of the Ministry's efforts to develop its services for users and activate its role in the state's plan to transition to the digital economy, it seeks to complete the final stage in the national project of extending the optical fiber network to all parts of the country to provide the infrastructure for the communications network to include coverage of existing and new areas of Kuwait, thus providing competitive opportunities to provide communications services with high quality and diverse services comparable to those available in developed and pioneering countries in this field, reports Al-Rai daily.

The Ministry indicated that it will coordinate with the Public-

Private Partnership Projects Authority to choose a strategic partner through open competition for specialized and qualified international and regional companies.

The ministry added, this partnership will take the form of a specialized company licensed by Communications and Information Technology Regulatory Authority (CITRA), in which the competent operator participates and is managed alongside the entity representing the state and through public subscription in accordance with the public-private partnership law.

This is in addition to establishing, developing and operating the fixed telecommunications network which the Ministry will maintain and will provide communications interconnection services exclusively to telecommunications and information technology companies licensed in the country, which in turn will provide their services directly to users.

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 17, (KUNA): Director General of the Arab Planning Institute (API), Dr. Bader Malallah stressed Sunday the importance of digital conversion and creativity in enhancing sustainable economy.

This came in a statement by Dr. Malallah during the second Youth Scout Forum that starts Sunday and remaining five days.

Creativity and digital transformation depends on modernity require-

ment, research development and highly advanced education, he added.


Dr. Malallah also pointed out the API offers workshops for youth, highlighting creativity and digital transfor-

U.S. judge orders Argentina to pay \$16 billion for expropriation of YPF oil company

A U.S. judge ruled that Argentina must pay \$16.1 billion to minority shareholders of state-controlled oil company YPF due to the government's 2012 nationalization of a majority stake in the firm.

U.S. District Judge Loretta Preska in New York issued final judgment Friday detailing the dollar amount that the South American country would have

to pay.

Preska on Friday ordered Argentina to pay \$14.38 billion to Petersen Energía, including \$7.5 billion in damages and \$6.85 billion in interest and \$1.7 billion to Eton Capital, including \$897.75 million in damages and \$816.58 million in interest.

Interest will continue to accrue if Argentina fails to pay, Preska said.

Argentina, which is currently suffering dire economic woes that include a low level of Central Bank reserves, rising poverty and a galloping inflation of more than 100% per year, has vowed to appeal the

A week earlier, Preska had made clear it was siding with the plaintiffs in the long-running dispute. Burford Capital, which funded much of the litigation, had said after last week's ruling that it represented "a complete win against Argentina.

More than a decade ago, the government of Presi-

dent Cristina Fernández, who served from 2007-2015 and who is now vice president, decided to expropriate a majority stake in Argentina's largest energy company, YPF.

Congress passed a law expropriating 51% of the shares of YPF from then-majority shareholder Repsol, a Spanish firm. Repsol ultimately received compensation worth some \$5 billion. Yet minority shareholders Petersen Energia and

Eton Park filed suit, saying the government had vio-lated the company's statutes by not offering to tender for the remaining shares in the company

YPF is listed on the New York Stock Exchange, so

the plaintiffs were able to file their suit in U.S. court. In a ruling earlier this year, Preska agreed with the shareholders and said they were owed compensa-tion by Argentina and that YPF had no responsibility in the expropriation.

Argentina had argued it should not have to pay more than \$5 billion.

The opposition has used the ruling to criticize Fernández as well as Buenos Aires Gov. Axel Kicillof, who was then deputy economy minister and widely seen as the mastermind behind the expropriation. Kicillof is running for reelection in October.

European Central Bank hikes to 4%, hinting at peak

Inflation Rises above Forecasts

Driven by rising energy costs, US inflation rose above forecasts in August, likely complicating the Federal Reserve's battle to keep prices under control. Consumer prices rose by 3.7% on a yearly basis, up from 3.2% in July and beating consensus forecasts of 3.6%. On a monthly basis, prices increased 0.6% following a 0.2% gain the month prior. More than half the monthly increase in price pressures were driven by a recent jump in petrol prices after Saudi Arabia and Russia renewed efforts to push oil prices higher. Brent crude was last seen trading at a 10-month high of \$92.50.

Underlying price pressures were also marginally stronger than expected, but continued to decline year on year, providing the Fed cover to leave interest rates unchanged next Wednesday. The core figure gained a more modest 0.3% m/m, slightly above the 0.2% rate for July. However on an annual basis, it fell from 4.7% to 4.3%

After hiking rates 11 times since March 2022 in an effort to bring inflation back towards its 2% target, the Federal Reserve is widely expected to keep interest rates steady at its next meeting on September 19-20. Moving forward however, investors are split as to whether the central bank will make another interest rate rise later in the year.

PPI Accelerates on Gasoline

Prices paid to US producers increased in August, boosted by rising energy and transportation costs. The producer price index rose 0.7% last month, marking the largest gain since June 2022. Wholesale goods prices jumped 2.0% last month, with a 20% surge in gasoline prices accounting for 60% of the increase. Excluding volatile components, the core figure nudged up 0.1%.

Retail Sales Beat Expectations

US retail sales picked up in August, boosted by higher gas prices while spending on other items grew modestly. Retail sales rose 0.6% m/m, slightly faster than July's revised 0.5% gain, marking the fifth straight month of

growth. The acceleration was largely driven by spending at gas stations, which advanced 5.2% last month. Higher oil prices due to OPEC+ production cuts, strong demand and disruption in Libya have all contributed to higher prices at gas stations. Excluding sales at gasoline stations, retail spending advanced a more modest 0.2% in August from July. The data illus-

ECB Hikes Rates at Record Level

The European Central Bank announced its 10th consecutive hike in its main interest rate, as the fight against inflation took priority over a weakening economy. Rate hikes have now taken the central bank's main deposit facility from -0.5% in June 2022 to a record 4%. The main reason for the hike seems to be upward revisions in macroeconomic projections. For the euro area, inflation is seen averaging 5.6% this year from a prior forecast of 5.4%, and 3.2% next year from a previous forecast of 3%.

The ECB's statement shook markets as it indicated further hikes may be off the table for now. "Based on its current assessment, the Governing Council considers that the key ECB interest rates have reached levels that, maintained for a sufficiently long duration, will make a substantial contribution to the timely return of inflation to the target," it said. "The Governing Council's future decisions will ensure that the key ECB interest rates will be set at sufficiently restrictive levels for as long as nec-

Australia's Employment Surges

In a sign that decade-high interest rates have yet to soften demand in the labor market, Australia's employment surged in August. The data from the Australian Bureau of Statistics showed net employment rose 64,900 in August from July, while markets had forecast an increase of around 23,000. The jobless rate held steady at 3.7% while the participation rate surged to 67%, the highest since records began in 2013. The labor market has proven its resiliency with 410,700 net jobs added in the 12 months to August, despite interest rates climbing 400 basis points to an 11-year high of 4.1%. Markets maintained their bets that the Reserve Bank of Australia would keep rates steady next month, with an about 40% chance of one final hike early next year.

Optimistic Data out of China

China's industrial output grew 4.5% in August from a year earlier, accelerating from the 3.7% pace seen in July. Meanwhile retail sales, a gauge of consumption, grew at a faster 4.6% pace in August compared to a 2.5% increase in July. The figures followed better than expected bank lending data, narrowing in the declines of exports and imports, as well as easing deflationary pressure. The latest bulk of data indicates that the recent support measures may be starting to stabilize a choppy economic recovery. However, the economy remains pressured by an ailing property sector and high youth unemployment.

KUWAIT CITY, Sept 17: Gold prices surged to \$1,923 in response to the weakening of the US dollar against the yuan, spurred by favorable economic data from China, a key consumer of gold worldwide. However, apprehension loomed among investors due to the potential for the Federal Reserve (the US central bank) to raise interest rates once more.

Spot gold prices saw a 0.3% uptick, reaching \$1,923 per ounce, while US gold futures contracts also gained by 0.2%, closing at \$1,936.90.

The yuan appreciated to its highest levels against the dollar in two weeks, following robust August data that exceeded expectations in Chinese factory production and retail sales. This shift in the dollar's value made gold, priced in US currency, more appealing to international buyers, as reported by Reuters.

Despite these advances, gold was still on track for a modest weekly decline after dipping close to the \$1,900 mark on Thursday, marking its lowest point since August 23.

Yip Jun Rong, an expert in financial markets at IG, remarked, "The anticipation of prolonged high-interest rates is exerting pressure on gold prices, as gold doesn't yield returns." He further added, "Current economic conditions in the United States do not appear to warrant an imminent interest rate reduction, with the expected timing of any reduction continuing to be pushed back to the middle of next year."

Egypt extends car import initiative

This initiative, which permits Egyptians living abroad to bring vehicles into Egypt with a customs exemption in exchange for a dollar deposit, was initially introduced last year and con-cluded in May after generating approximately \$900 million in

As part of a broader set of initi-

atives introduced by the Egyptian government, the program aimed to revise customs and all associated fees concerning Egyptians' gold imports. Data reveals that since the government's decision in May to allow Egyptians to import gold without customs duties, more than 600 kilograms of gold have been brought into the country, contributing to efforts aimed at stabilizing the local gold mar-

Not right away – unless consumers panic

The auto workers strike will drive up car prices

DALLAS, Sept 17, (AP): Car shoppers are heading for a new round of sticker shock if the strike by the United Auto Workers doesn't end soon, particularly for popular vehicles that are already in

The number of vehicles on dealer lots will shrink the longer the walkout goes on. Dealers are likely to lose incentives that the manufacturers pay

them to boost sales by cutting prices.

And consumers might make things worse with panic-buying.

Many analysts think it will take several weeks before dealer lots start to look a bit empty. Ford, General Motors and Stellantis built up inventories of vehicles ahead of Thursday night's strike, and the UAW decided to limit the walkout to just three plants - at least for now.

"Guys at the dealerships are going to tell you, 'The UAW this and that,' but their lots are full of cars now," says Ivan Drury, the director of insights at Edmunds, a provider of information about the auto industry. He estimates that at current inventory levels and the pace of vehicle sales, most car shoppers shouldn't notice much change for a couple of months.

Vehicles from the Detroit Three sat in inventory an average 52 days before being sold in August, up from 31 days at the start of last year, according to Edmunds data.

The UAW began striking at factories that make only a few vehicles - Ford Broncos and Rangers, Jeep Wranglers, Chevrolet mid-size pickups and GMC vans. Dealers have good inventories of

Labor negotiations continue in good faith, said Mark Stewart, chief operating officer for North America at Stellantis. He detailed on Saturday his company's latest offer to the union, which included cumulative raises of nearly 21% in hourly wages. That's roughly in line with proposed wage increases from Ford and GM, though short of what the union wants.

Stewart also said Stellantis has contingency plans to limit any impact on consumers, though he declined to give details about them.

"We really want to encourage customers: Don't be afraid," Stewart said, while suggesting they see the deals

If the strike isn't ended soon, however, there could be shortages of some makes and models -big sellers or vehicles that are already in short supply, such as Chevrolet Silverado and Tahoe, GMC Sierra and Ford F-Series pickups. The car companies have plants in Mexico that could keep producing some models - as long as they have a supply of parts.

While the supply of cars from Detroit's Big Three will largely depend on how long the strike lasts and how quickly it spreads to other plants - there were rumors Friday that additional factories could be added next week - there are other factors.

Garrett Nelson, an auto analyst for CFRA Research, expects manufacturers to eliminate incentives they pay to dealers to boost sales. Those incentives let dealers reduce their sticker prices, and they're often targeted at slower-

The biggest wild card could be consumer psychology - panic-buying that would drive up prices.

"The impact on prices would be almost instantaneous," Nelson says. "Dealers will say, 'Look, we're not sure how many additional vehicles we're going to be getting.' There could be somewhat of a panic effect that could stimulate consumers to make that purchase sooner rather than later.' As cars from Ford, GM and Stellantis, the successor to Fiat Chrysler. become harder to find, there will be a ripple effect. Consumers who need a vehicle would likely turn to nonunion competitors like Toyota, Honda and Tesla, who would be able to charge them more.

"You'll start to see that pricing gets affected everywhere - and not just on the new end of the business," Drury says. "Used-car values, which have been seeing a bit of a decline from last year's highs, could start going back up" as consumers look for an affordable alternative to new vehicles.

Consumers who lease their vehicle and are coming to the end of the term could be especially vulnerable. Drury says leasing companies want their cars back while the used-car market is hot, and might be unwilling to extend the

Anyone shopping for a new, used or leased car right now will also be hit by higher interest rates. The average rate for a new-car loan this week stood at 7.46%, and for a used car, it was 8.06%, according to Bankrate.

High rates are contributing to a spike in rejections for consumers looking to buy a ride. The Federal Reserve Bank of New York said this month that the rejection rate for auto loans is now 14.2%, the highest since the bank started tracking figures in 2013 and up from 9.1% six months ago. (Rejections are also up for mortgages, credit cards and other loans, as lenders recoil at the growing number of people falling behind on payments. Household debt is

Car prices were rising long before the auto workers even raised the possibility of a strike. A chip shortage, disruptions in the global supply chain and strong demand pushed prices higher.

The average price for a new veicle jumped from \$39.919 in 2020 to \$48,798 so far this year, according to Kelley Blue Book. Cheap cars have all but disappeared, and consumers are forced into ever-longer loans to limit their monthly payments. Prices for used cars rose sharply in 2021 and 2022, but have slipped slightly this

Prices are almost certain to rise even if the strike is settled quickly, because the auto makers' labor costs will in-

"It's almost a foregone conclusion that the UAW will succeed in getting substantial wage increases," says Patrick Anderson, the founder of Anderson Economic Group, a research firm that conducts market analysis, "Part of that is simply due to inflation, part of that is due to the profits of the automakers, and part of that is due to the leverage that the UAW has right now with a short inventory and an economy that still has a lot of people that want to buy cars.'

The UAW is asking for a 36% increase in wages over four years, plus other demands that would increase expenses for the companies. Ford, GM and Stellantis have countered with offers to boost wages by about half that

UAW President Shawn Fain is sensitive to the impression that the union's gains will come out of consumers' pocketbooks. He points out that prices were rising before the strike, and says labor accounts for a fraction of the Big Three's total costs.

"They could double our wages and not raise car prices and still make billions of dollars in profit," he said during an online presentation to union

Buffett's co trims investment in HP

Warren Buffett's company sold off 5.5 million of its HP Inc. shares this week, trimming a stake that it established just last year, but even after the sales, Berkshire Hathaway still owns nearly 12% of the printer and computer maker's

HP stock dropped nearly 2% to sell for \$27.80 Thursday in the first trading session after the stock sales were disclosed in a filing with the Securities and Exchange Commission.

Many investors follow Buffett's moves closely because of his remarkably successful track record over the years.

Even after this week's sales, Berkshire still holds more than 115 million HP shares. But it likely won't be clear for some time whether Buffett is just trimming the position or whether he has soured on the stock. The

billionaire investor never comments on these transactions that he's only required to disclose because Berkshire owns such a

big chunk of the company.
The HP investment raised some eyebrows last spring because throughout his career Buffett has been famously reluctant to invest in technology companies because he said it was too hard to pick the long-term winners. (AP)

Airbnb, Vrbo or other rental hosts ghosted you ... now what?

auren Gumport was en route to a ✓ vacation on the island of Chios, Greece, in July, where she was set to stay in an Airbnb for five nights with her best friend.

But upon her arrival in Athens to connect to her flight to Chios, she received a WhatsApp message from someone stating that their dad owned the Airbnb property, but that they managed it. The son said they'd be out of town - and that their dad didn't speak English - but that Gumport would still be able to check in with

Gumport, who works for the travel insurance company Faye, is no stranger to stories of travel mishaps. She sensed something was off but forged ahead with the Chios flight. When she arrived at the meeting spot near the Airbnb, no one was there.

'It was hot and not in a touristy area, so it didn't feel great," she says. "We were exhausted from the flights and just wanted to drop our bags, so that was frustrating.

She had an international cell phone plan, so after 15 minutes of waiting for the owner, she called Airbnb customer service. An hour later, an Airbnb customer service agent finally offered to rebook them elsewhere. But with no other suitable Airbnb listings, Gumport declined the offer. Airbnb then offered to pay for two nights at a hotel.

"Airbnb didn't give any type of nightly cap on cost, and frankly the island didn't have a ton of options," she said. "We found a great hotel and sent

Airbnb the receipt."

The two-night hotel stay came out to \$443.50, and Gumport received a reimbursement from Airbnb to her bank account in a few days. Airbnb also refunded the \$434.22 cost of her original five-night reservation.

As for the other three nights they were supposed to spend in Chios? Gumport took the opportunity to check out another Greek island, where she booked a last-minute stay.

Compensate

Gumport contacted Airbnb as soon as she realized her host wasn't there and says Airbnb appropriately compensated her for the inconvenience.

"Luckily, my friend and I have traveled so much that when things go wrong, we just quickly pivot and laugh it off," she said. "We stayed two nights in the other hotel, had a great time, then hopped on a ferry to Samos, Greece, for the rest of our

But not all vacation rental companies have robust customer support, and not all will be as generous with compensation. Plus, not all travelers will be able to pivot like Gumport.

So, if the host cancels 31 days before Super Bowl Sunday for a home in the host city, good luck finding affordable

alternative lodging.
■ Carefully read the reviews and only book listings that have plentiful, positive reviews. Previous guests might offer insights into the host's reliability and help indicate which rentals to skip.

■ Have contact information handy for the host and customer support. Should you be abroad, consider purchasing an international phone plan or at least know where to find free Wi-Fi (such as train stations or cafes).

■ Research nearby alternatives, including other available listings. Be prepared to be flexible and change plans if necessary.

■ Take advantage of last-minute deals. Just as Gumport ferried to another Greek island for part of her stay, you could be similarly flexible. Hotels can often be cheaper when booked lastminute anyway. Jamie Lane, chief economist at vacation rental data platform AirDNA, says the same holds true with lodging beyond hotels.

"Ask for last-minute deals," Lane says. "Unbooked weeks or recent cancellations can lead to big discounts to fill open nights." (AP)

Will customers go along?

Starbucks' iconic cup to get sustainable revamp

TEMPE, Ariz., Sept 17, (AP): Bethany Patton steps up to the counter and places her pink mug into a shoeboxsized dishwasher. It spins. It whirs. Water splashes inside. After 90 seconds, the door opens and steam emerges. A barista grabs the mug, dries it and prepares Patton's order - a 16-ounce Starbucks double espresso on ice.

For bringing her own cup, Patton gets \$1 off her drink.

"Saving the environment is important and all, but I probably come here more in knowing that I'm going to get a dollar off," says Patton, 27, a cancer researcher at Arizona State University. Two friends who came on the afternoon coffee run nod as they hold the cups that they, too, brought along.

Just as noteworthy as what they're carrying is what they are not: the disposable Starbucks cup, an icon in a world where the word is overused.

For a generation and more, it has been a cornerstone of consumer society, first in the United States and then globally - the throwaway cup with the emerald logo depicting a longhaired siren with locks like ocean waves. Ubiquitous to the point of being an accessory, it has carried a message: I am drinking the world's most recognizable coffee brand.

Now, in an era where concern for sustainability can be good business. the Starbucks disposable cup may be on its way to extinction thanks to an unlikely force: Starbucks itself.

Disposable

By 2030, Starbucks wants to move away completely from disposable cups, which represent big portions of the company's overall waste and greenhouse gas emissions.

The stated reason is that it's the right thing to do for the environment. and Starbucks has a history of lofty sustainability goals around various aspects of their global operations. Some have been met, such as new stores being certified for energy efficiency; others have been revised or scrapped entirely. For example, in 2008 the company said that by 2015 it wanted 100% of its cups to be recyclable or reusable. Today, that's still a long way away.

Today's drive to overhaul the cup comes with an obvious business imperative. Producing disposable products like cups creates greenhouse gas emissions, which warm the planet and lead to extreme weather events and other manifestations of climate change. That goes against customers' increasing expectations for companies to be part of the solution to climate change.

Still, while customers want companies to be environmentally conscious, that doesn't mean they're willing to give up convenience. And there's this: Could eliminating the millions of paper and plastic cups used each year hurt Starbucks? After all, those cups, in the hands of customers, are advertising - a market penetration that makes Starbucks feel ubiquitous.

At the store where Patton gets her coffee, Starbucks already doesn't serve any in disposable paper or plas-

tic cups. Customers who don't bring their own are given a reusable plastic one that can be dropped off in bins around campus. It's one of two dozen pilots over the last two years, aimed at changing how the world's largest coffee maker serves its java.

The goal: to cut the company's waste, water use and carbon emissions in half by 2030. Pulling that off will be tricky and fraught with risks. It provides a window into how companies go from ambitious sustainability targets to actual results.

"Our vision for the cup of the future - and our Holy Grail, if you will - is that the cup still has the iconic symbol on it," says Michael Kobori, head of sustainability at Starbucks. "It's just as a reusable cup.

Starbucks sees the change as an opportunity to cast the siren, and the company, in a different light. It also wants to push more suppliers in its production chain to provide recycled material and partners, such as universities and other locales that house stores, to be able to handle all that comes with reusable cups.

Erin Simon, vice president for plastic waste and business at World Wildlife Fund, says commitment from major companies can help. But ultimately, she says, major change can happen only with corporate collaboration - and government regulation.

"Not one institution, not one organization, not even one sector can change it on its own," Simon says.

At Starbucks, the changes will create ripple effects. Jon Solorzano, a Los Angeles lawyer who advises companies on developing climatefriendly operations and disclosures. (an area referred to as "environmental, social and governance"), says the company likely has hundreds of suppliers that help manufacture cups.

"It's kind of like turning an aircraft carrier around," Solorzano says. "Little tiny tweaks, which seem insignificant, can actually have big operational challenges for an organization."

Starbucks is not the first company to push toward a reusable cup. From large companies in Europe, such as RECUP in Germany, which uses reusable cups and other food packaging, to local coffee houses in cities like San Francisco, the goal for years has been to shed disposable paper and Trained using real-world data from expert drivers

Hollywood strikes enter new phase as daytime shows return

NEW YORK, Sept 17, (AP): "The Drew Barrymore Show" will begin airing fresh episodes on Monday but a lot of off-air controversy will be clinging to its typically bubbly host.

Barrymore - a daughter of a proud acting dynasty - is making new batches of her syndicated talk show despite picketers outside her studio, as daytime TV becomes the latest battlefield in the ongoing Hollywood labor strife.

"We're four months approximately into this strike and it's not surprising that there are defectors," said Michael H. LeRoy, a professor of labor and employment relations at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. "I couldn't predict that this would happen on daytime TV,

but everybody has a breaking point in a labor dispute."

"The Drew Barrymore Show," operating without its three union writers, isn't the only daytime show to resume. "The View" has returned for its 27th season on ABC, while "Tamron Hall" and "Live With Kelly and Ryan" - neither are governed by writers guild rules have also been producing fresh episodes. "The Jennifer Hudson Show" and "The Talk" are also restarting Monday.

As long as the hosts and guests don't discuss or promote work covered by television, theatrical or streaming contracts, they're not technically breaking the strike. That's because talk shows are covered under a separate contract - the so-called Network Code - from the one actors and writers are striking. The Network Code also covers reality TV,

sports, morning news shows, soap operas and game shows.
"I know there is just nothing I can do that will make this OK to those that it is not OK with. I fully accept that," Barrymore said in a video posted Friday on Instagram that was later deleted. "I just want everyone to know my intentions have never been in a place to upset or hurt

anymore. It's not who I am."

The ongoing strike pits Writers Guild of America and the Screen Actors Guild-American Federation of Television and Radio Artists against the Alliance of Motion Picture and Television Producers, which represents Disney, Netflix, Amazon and others.

The return of daytime hosts, producers and studio crews will make for some awkward exchanges, predicted Zayd Ayers Dohrn, a writer, professor and director of the MFA in Writing for Screen and Stage at Northwestern University.

Support

"It's kind of amazing that they're going to go back to work with their own writers picketing outside the doors of the studios," said Dohrn, a writers guild member. "They're literally walking past the picket line of the workers who they say they're supporting.'

Barrymore's decision to return to the air was met with pushback on social media. "You have the heart and mind to be more tapped into the needs of the community than this," wrote one viewer on Instagram. Another was more blunt: "You don't get to play a generous and relatable character when it's financially expedient for you and then scab when your pocketbook is at risk.'

Actor and activist Alyssa Milano, whose friendship with Barrymore stretches back years, also criticized the return, calling it "not a great

"I love her very much - I grew up with her - but I'm not sure that this was the right move for the strike. I'm sure in her eyes it's the right move for her and the show, but as far as the WGA and SAG and union strong - not a great move.

Barrymore's stance was also met with some puzzlement since she walked away as host of the MTV Movie & TV Awards in May, the first big awards show to air during the strike. Back then, she wrote: "I have listened to the writers, and in order to truly respect them, I will pivot from hosting the MTV Movie & TV Awards live in solidarity

She has since lost another hosting gig: the National Book Awards in November. The organization rescinded her invitation "in light of the announcement that 'The Drew Barrymore Show' will resume produc-

LeRoy, who has studied labor-employer struggles for 30 years, warned that TV shows like Barrymore's may think they can get by without using union writers but may find long-term costs.

"No members of the Writers Guild will ever work with that show again," he said. "It's a short-term, feel-good moment or get-by moment for Drew Barrymore and maybe the others, but long term they really have, in my view, basically given themselves an early retirement.'

He noted other strikes in the past that left bitter feelings for decades, like when Major League Baseball umpires went on strike in 1999. New umpires were hired and integrated with veteran ones but tensions con-

"For the next 25 years, those umpires would not talk to each other if they were assigned to work games together," LeRoy said. "Twenty-five years of shunning. People do not forget it.'

Viewers who tune into new episodes of daytime talk shows these days will find a changed landscape. Guests aren't always the A-listers with blockbuster TV shows or films to promote. Since the strike began, authors, musicians and comedians are filling the gaps.

Singer gets key to NYC

Diddy made music a 'priority' over biz

LOS ANGELES, Sept 17, (AP): If **Sean "Diddy" Combs** had a choice, the self-proclaimed serial entrepreneur would be hunkered down in a recording studio rather than running his many successful businesses.

But for more than a decade, Diddy put creating albums on hold. He credits a late-night dream a couple years ago with waking him up from his musical

"I stepped away for a little bit, went through a lot of things in life, and then got that call one day from God. She was like, 'It's time," he recalled in a recent interview. The three-time Grammy winner said the soft voice he heard instantly motivated him to refocus his

attention back to making his own music again.



Last Friday, Diddy released his new album called "The Love Album - Off the Grid.' His fifth studio project features nearly 30 guests including Mary J. Blige, Justin Bieber, H.E.R., Babyface, John Legend, Busta Rhymes, Summer Walker, Teyana Taylor, Coco Jones and Jazmine Sullivan. The album's lead single "Another One of Me" features The

Weeknd, French Montana and 21 Savage. It's his first solo studio project since his 2006 charttopping "Press Play," which had two top 10 hit singles: "Last Night" with Keyshia Cole and "Come to Me" featuring Nicole Scherzinger.

After his epiphany, Diddy built a recording studio at his home and started to work on music.

"It was God as a woman. ... And I was like, 'It's time," he said, describing his dream.

"I was asking myself the question: 'If you had to do one thing for the rest of your life, what would you do?' And that would be to make music.

"What would bring you joy?" That would be mu-

sic.'
"'What has helped you to have a positive effect on the world? That would be music.' But I wasn't doing music. From that second on, I jumped headfirst into this project.'

Responsibilities

But first, he had to offload his business responsibilities. Diddy had lots to delegate: He's the head of his widely-popular label Bad Boy Records, Revolt TV and its focus on music, the fashion clothing line Sean John and Empower Global, a curated marketplace featuring Black-owned brands that launched in July

This month, Diddy reassigned his Bad Boy publishing rights back to artists and songwriters. The move came after some over the years criticized him for mistreating his artists.

"I am passionate about driving progress in all in-istries," he told The Associated Press after the interview. "If I speak about change, I am committed to being an active participant in that change. Reassigning the publishing was simply the right thing to do.'

Diddy was one of the popular suitors looking to purchase BET Media Group until Paramount Global decided against selling the majority stake of the network. He's in a dispute with spirits giant Diageo after he sued the company over allegation of racism over how they handle his liquor brands. The company denies his claims.

"I love being a businessman. That's my job. Making music is my love," said Diddy, who received the Global Icon Award at the MTV Video Music Awards on Tuesday. He recently donated \$1 million each to the Jackson State University football team and the Earn Your Leisure fund, which is expected to be used toward financial literacy investments.

"I had to have self-love and choose what I really love to do. Business is still getting done. But I can't be in no meeting for three or four hours no more. I need to be making music and living life and spreading this frequency of love. I'm going to handle my business. But this right here, it's like a kid in a candy store. This is what I love to do. This is my joy. This is my blessing.

Diddy said the most rewarding part during the recording process was working with all the artists, producers and writers. He imagined how Motown Records founder Berry Gordy must've felt when stars like The Temptations and Marvin Gaye recorded at the Hitsville U.S.A. studio back in the days

"I would take over the studio," he said. "Everybody was calling to be a part of the 'Love Album.' Nobody made me wait more than 30 seconds for an answer if they wanted to do it. It was all authentic. I thank God, nobody told me 'No.'

Diddy said he wanted to tell a story on the album that mirrored his fun-filled love life.

"It was important to make an album that people can make love to, baby-making music, for them to dance and go off the grid for 48 hours," he said. "Turn off your phone and lock in with a significant other. Laugh, dance, cry, make love, eat, chill and do it all over again. That's important."

Meanwhile, Diddy Combs got the key to New York City on Friday, the same day that he released his first studio album in 17 years.

"The bad boy of entertainment is getting the key to the city from the bad boy of politics!" Mayor Eric Adams said as he presented a giant key to Combs in

Times Square. The entertainer thanked Adams and shouted, "Diddy finally has the key to the city!"

Combs, 53, was born in New York City and raised in nearby Mount Vernon.

His new album "The Love Album - Off the Grid" is his first solo studio project since 2006.

LOS ANGELES: Drake is no stranger to an inventive roll-out: the OVO rapper has a preference for surprise drops (last year's "Honesty, Nevermind" is evidence enough). "Of Black artists - you know, Stevie Wonder, genius, right? I suppose when you use a word as broad as 'masters,' the fault is using that word. Maybe Marvin Gaye, or Curtis Mayfield? I mean, they just didn't articulate at that level," Wenner said. (AP)

'Filmmaking is gone with the algorithm'

Linklater's 'Hit Man' a hit at TIFF

TORONTO, Sept 17, (AP): There's been no shortage of hit-man movies at film festivals this fall. You could line them up on a rooftop somewhere, each with their sniper rifles aimed out at audiences: David Fincher's "The Killer," Michael Keaton's "Knox Goes Away," Harmony Korine's "Aggro Dr1ft."

But the one that has most resonated - killed, you might say - has been a gentler, funnier take on the genre that says right up front: The hired hit man is a Hollywood myth.

Richard Linklater's "Hit Man" stars Glen Powell as Gary Johnson, a reallife guy who worked for the police as a fake hit man in sting operations to catch would-be murders looking for someone to do their dirty work.

The film takes Johnson's true story and has some fun with it. Gary, thrust into his faux-hit-man role, dons increasingly colorful personas and finds himself in an especially tricky conundrum of selfhood after falling for a wife (Adria Arjona) who wants her husband dead.

The film, which played at both the Venice and Toronto festivals, is an extremely entertaining showcase for the charismatic Powell, the "Top Gun: Maverick" star who co-wrote the script with Linklater.

For Linklater, the 63-year-old director of "Boyhood," "Dazed and Confused" and "Before Sunset," "Hit Man" is a typically existentialist film but playfully twisted into a genrebending noir screwball. Linklater also made the film without a distributor. "Hit Man" is for sale at TIFF, and given the response - may be the hot-

test property at the festival. "Ît used to be the head of studio would sit down with you, talk, maybe say, 'I think you've got the movie in you. Let's do it.' Now, they don't even want to hear from you. You're up against algorithms and marketing in advance," says Linklater. "So it was kind of great to go: 'Let's just make the movie and bet on ourselves."

AP: Around your Venice premiere, you said an era of filmmaking was "gone with the wind - or gone with

the algorithm." Is it that bleak? Linklater: I'm a very optimistic person. It's an optimistic business. It's a good time to be a filmmaker. I'm not a pessimist by nature. But you have to acknowledge changing times. I've seen it change over the years, we all have. My thing is trying to get outside our little insular world. The attack is on human consciousness. It has a formidable opponent in something grabbing our brains and grabbing our attention.

AP: That idea was present in your last film, the animated "Apollo 10 1/2" for Netflix, which fondly recalled a less structured, pre-digital upbring-

ing. **Linklater:** Yeah, it was kind of an abildhood where analog, free-range childhood where you really had to make your own fun. Nothing was catered to you. There were very few movies or TV shows that catered to kids. You find your way in. They weren't just spoon-feeding you. They saw kids as a nuisance or a thing to be put up with, not such a market.

AP: The question of how much people change seems to hover over your films. "Boyhood," filmed over an 12-year period, seemed designed to measure change in your actors.

Linklater: Yeah, I think so. Identy or the development of self. It's hard to inject that into a narrative. This one, it wasn't so much in the article I read for "Hit Man" in 2001. It's really more in the flight of fancy part. I was always in the school - they talk about it in "Before Sunset" - saving you can change but you have your set points. I've always been on that. I'm as happy as I can be given my set points. I had more recently read stuff that said you can change quite a bit. But can you really tweak up that dial? I would like to be different.

AP: How so? Linklater: Everything you say, you can always follow with, "Then I wouldn't be me." But I wish I enjoyed things that other people seem to enjoy

so much. **AP:** Like what?

Linklater: Oh, I don't know. The big premiere of your movie. (Laughs) Going to awards show. Dressing up. Being on. I'd really rather be watching a movie or reading. I have the opposite of FOMO. I don't really want to be anywhere. (Laughs)

AP: Your films have a rare amiability and gentleness to them. How does that get filtered in?

Linklater: If you take things really serious or it's a big deal, then it's a big deal in your film. I don't really take anything too seriously. I'm kind of like, "Eh." I just can't do certain things with a straight face. It's all stupid. As an old-school existentialist, I just go through life with a certain detached, fun, irony. Engaged. I care about a lot of things. But I'm not that invested in outcomes. I don't believe mostly in fictional plotting. That's why it was interesting to be a little more plotty, to be more in some genres I'm mashing up. Plotting I've always said is just fake. It's not how life works. We don't have plot-driven lives. We have character-driven lives.

AP: Here, you're kind of mocking the idea of one of Hollywood's favorite plots.

Linklater: I've had to talk about this with the movie now. "Hit men don't exist?" Of course they don't exist. Do the math. Do you ever hear

about hit men getting arrested? They don't exist at the retail level. The notion that someone you've never met who's this icy professional you meet for five minutes is going to risk the death penalty. (Laughs) I think as a culture we have to believe in it. We enjoy believing in it.

AP: Could you tell Powell had something special when you cast him at 14-year-old for a small role in "Fast Food Nation"? The real revelation was "Everybody Wants Some!!"

Linklater: That was the big leap. For "Fast Food Nation," I mean, I cast him out of hundreds of kids. I went: "That guy's kind of interesting to play this small part. There's some thing about that kid." But it was when he came back on "Everybody Wants Some!" he was just fully formed. Anvone who knows Glen knows he's a star. I think the times we're living in, the industry isn't as invested in creating stars as much. Maybe they don't want to pay 'em.

AP: What do you think changed? Linklater: Well, there's a lot of YouTube stars. They're coming from everywhere. It used to be that movies and music was it. Now, this century has produced famous people that we'll never know or hear about. There's a glut, and in our industry there's a shortage.

AP: Your films have launched quite a few stars so you've watched it happen. What does it take?

Linklater: I've worked with a lot of people over the years and think, "If things break right for them or they get that part..." But planets have to align. You've got to kind of get lucky. You have to get that right part at the right time. Kind of like Matthew (McConaughey) with "A Time to Kill." He had been in a bunch of movies. Even Glen, I knew he was up for certain parts in different movies and I was like, "They didn't cast Glen against

AP: So in this age of the algorithm, do you still enjoying moviemaking?

Linklater: When it's in my control, I love it. I love everything about making movies. "Apollo 10½," I loved that whole experience. It was such a personal experience. And then one day it showed up on a platform with no fanfare. It's always kind of sad when you realize even your friends don't know your film is out. To me, if anything good happens from this stage on, it's just lucky. You know there's an audience for your movie, it's just whether they find it. I've never made a film that I didn't think people would like. Even some strange, weird-ass film, you think, "There's a way this could catch on." You gotta be a little delusional. I'm good at selfdelusion. (Laughs) It's what keeps me

UN pushes 'phase out'

'Heat' to turn up on fossil fuels, warming

NEW YORK, Sept 17, (AP): The heat is about to be turned up on fossil fuels, the United States and President Joe Biden.
As a record-smashing and deadly hot summer draws to

a close, the United Nations and the city that hosts it are focusing on climate change and the burning of coal, oil and natural gas that causes it. It features a special UN summit and a week of protests and talk-heavy events involving leaders from business, health, politics and the arts. Even a royal prince - William - is getting in on the action.

The annual Climate Week, which coincides with the UN General Assembly, was to kick off Sunday with tens of thousands of people expected in the "March to End Fossil Fuels" Manhattan rally, one of hundreds of worldwide



protests. This week "is the start of an incredible pressure cooker that we are all part of," said Jean Su, a march organizer and energy justice director for the Center for Biological Diversity. "It is coming from the top down, from that chief of the United Nations and now it is coming from bottom up in over 400 distributed actions across the world."

Much of the heat is coming from Secretary-General Antonio Gu-

mate Ambition Summit on Wednesday that has a special twist: Only leaders from nations that bring new and meaningful action will be allowed to speak. And the UN isn't saying yet who will get that chance.

It won't be Biden, who is speaking Tuesday at the UN, the White House said. Nor will it be the leaders of China, the United Kingdom, Russia or France - all major players in the development and use of fossil fuels -- who won't even be in New York.

Guterres has repeatedly aimed his criticism at fossil fuels, calling them "incompatible with human survival." He and scientific reports out of the United Nations have emphasized that the only way to curb warming and meet international goals is to "phase out" fossil fuels.

Negotiations

Phase-out is a term that world leaders in past climate negotiations and meetings of large economic powers have refused to back, instead opting for watered-down phrases such as "phase down" of unabated coal, allowing fossil use if its emissions are somehow captured and stored. The president of the upcoming international climate negotiations in Dubai is an oil executive from the United Arab Emirates and will be speaking at Wednesday's summit, though his dual role has upset activists and some scientists.

"This really is an unprecedented soft power moment where the UN chief is throwing fossil fuels into the limelight and forcing heads of states to respond," Su said. "Whether it's yes or no, he's at least forcing them to respond as to will you commit to no new fossil fuel development in line with climate science?

But UN chiefs have little real power, said Climate Analytics CEO Bill Hare, a climate scientist.

"They can talk. They can persuade. They can from timeto-time constructively criticize and that's all the tools that he's got," Hare said. "The UN secretary-general has moral authority and he's using that.'

Guterres "can shame leaders who show up with pitiful offers in terms of climate action," said Power Shift Africa Director Mohamed Adow, a longtime climate diplomacy observer. "We've got to a point where we can no longer be

able to afford the velvet glove diplomacy.' Guterres will ask nations to accelerate their efforts to rid themselves of carbon-based energy, with the richest nations that can afford it going first and faster, and providing cial aid to the poorer nations that can't afford it, said Selwin

Hart, Guterres' special adviser for climate action. "We know the use of fossil fuels is the main cause of the climate crisis, coal, oil and gas," Hart said Friday. "We need to accelerate the global transition away from fossil fuels.

But it must be just, fair and equitable.' But the same 20 richest economies who promise to slice carbon emissions "are now issuing new oil and gas licensing at a time when the (International Energy Agency and the science-based Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change) has clearly stated that this is incompatible with the 1.5 degree (Celsius, 2.7 degrees Fahrenheit) goal of the Paris

Agreement," Hart said. Yet speeding to net zero emissions of carbon requires rapid and huge reshaping of the energy landscape that "could inflict serious harm on the economy," American Energy Alliance President Thomas Pyle said last month.

Environmental activists calculate that five rich northern countries - the United States, Canada, Australia, Norway and the United Kingdom - that talk about cutting back emissions are responsible for more than half of the planned expansion of oil and gas drilling through 2050. The United States accounts for more than one-third.

So activists and protesters at Sunday's march say they are aiming their frustration - and pressure - at Biden and

However, Biden has repeatedly trumpeted last year's Inflation Reduction Act, which includes \$375 billion to fight climate change, mostly on solar panels, energy efficiency, air pollution controls and emission-reducing equipment for coal- and gas-fueled power plants.

"They want to be seen as the good guys, but the fact is they have very little to back it up," said Brandon Wu, policy director at ActionAid USA. He pointed to the new drilling plans and said the United States has failed to deliver on its promised climate-based financial aid to poor countries and

has not increased its money pledges like other nations. "How much carnage does the planet have to suffer for global leaders to act?" Su said. "We want President Biden and other major oil gas producers to phase out fossil fuels."

MORIGAON, India: Monuwara Begum is growing weary of moving every time water pours into her home.

The 45-year-old farmer, who lives on an island in the mighty Brahmaputra River in the northeastern state of Assam, said she and her family suffer from more violent and erratic floods each year.

They live in knee-deep water inside their small hut, sometimes for days. Cooking, eating and sleeping, even as the river water rises.

Then when the water engulfs their home completely, "we leave everything and try to find some higher ground or shift to the nearest relief camp," Begum said.

Begum is one of an estimated 240,000 people in the Morigaon district of the state that are dependent on fishing and selling produce like rice, jute and vegetables from their small farms on floating river islands, known locally as Chars.

When it floods, residents of Char islands often row in makeshift rafts with a few belongings, and sometimes livestock, to dry land. They set up temporary homes with mos-

Having nowhere else to permanently go, they then go back when the water subsides, clean up their homes and resume farming and fishing to make ends meet.

Begum said the river has always intruded on the Chars but it has become much more frequent in recent years.

'\$1 bln for tree plantings': Hundreds of communities around the country will share more than \$1 billion in federal money to help them plant and maintain trees under a federal program that is intended to reduce extreme heat, benefit health and improve access to nature.

US Department of Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack will announce the \$1.13 billion in funding for 385 projects at an event recently in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. The tree plantings efforts will be focused on marginalized areas in all 50 states as well as Washington, DC, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands and some tribal nations.

"We believe we can create more resilient communities in terms of the impacts of climate," Vilsack told reporters in previewing his announcement. "We think we can mitigate extreme heat incidents and events in many of the cities."

In announcing the grants in Cedar Rapids, Vilsack will spotlight the eastern Iowa city of 135,000 people that lost thousands of trees during an extreme windstorm during the summer of 2020. Cedar Rapids has made the restoration of its tree canopy a priority since that storm, called a derecho, and will receive \$6 million in funding through the new grants.

Other grant recipients include some of the nation's largest cities, such as New York, Houston and Los Angeles, and much smaller communities, such as Tarpon Springs, Florida, and Hutchinson, Kansas.

Brenda Mallory, chair of the White House Council on Environmental Quality, planned to join Vilsack at the Iowa event. She told reporters earlier that many communities have lacked access to nature and that all the tree grants would benefit marginalized and underrepresented communities.

The federal money comes from the Inflation Reduction Act. (AP)

Jericho a World Heritage Site: A UN conference voted Sunday to list ruins of the ancient West Bank city of Jericho as a World Heritage Site in Palestine, a decision likely to anger Israel, which controls the territory and does not recognize a Palestinian

Jericho is one of the oldest continually inhabited cities on earth, and is in a part of the Israeli-occupied West Bank that is administered by the internationally recognized Palestinian Authority. The listing refers to the Tel es-Sultan archaeological site nearby, which contains ruins dating back to the 9th millenium B.C.

The decision was taken at a meeting of the UN World Heritage Committee in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, under the auspices of the UN Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization, UNESCO.

The modern city of Jericho is a major draw for tourism to the Palestinian territories, both because of its historical sites and proximity to the Dead Sea. In 2021, the Palestinian Authority unveiled major renovations to one of the largest mosaics in the Middle East, in a Jericho palace dating back to the 8th century. (AP)

Legal psilocybin access launched amid high demand

MDMA eases PTSD symptoms

NEW YORK, Sept 17, (AP): The psychedelic drug MDMA can reduce symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder, researchers reported in a new study published recently.

The company sponsoring the research said it plans later this year to seek US approval to market the drug, also known as ecstasy, as a PTSD treatment when combined with talk

"It's the first innovation in PTSD treatment in more than two decades. And it's significant because I think it will also open up other innovation,' said Amy Emerson, CEO of MAPS Public Benefit Corporation, the research sponsor.

Earlier this year, Australia became the first country to allow psychiatrists to prescribe MDMA and psilocybin, the psychoactive ingredient in psychedelic mushrooms. The drugs are gaining wider cultural acceptance in the U.S. in part because of efforts by the nonprofit advocacy group Multidisciplinary Association for Psychedelic

For the new study, researchers measured symptoms in 104 people with PTSD who were randomly assigned to get either MDMA or a dummy pill during three sessions, one month apart. Both groups received talk therapy. Common side effects in the MDMA

group were muscle tightness, nausea, decreased appetite and sweating. But only one person in the MDMA group dropped out of the study.

After treatment, 86% of the MDMA group improved on a standard PTSD assessment compared to 69% of the placebo group. The assessment measures symptoms such as nightmares, flashbacks and insomnia.

By the study's end, 72% of people in the MDMA group no longer met the diagnostic criteria for PTSD, compared to about 48% of the placebo

"The results that they got are very exciting," said Barbara Rothbaum, who directs the Emory Healthcare Veterans Program in Atlanta. She was not involved in the research, which was published in the journal Nature Medicine.

PTSD also can be treated with other medications or talk therapy.
"They are very effective, but noth-

ing is 100% effective," Rothbaum said. "So we absolutely need more options for treatment."

Before MDMA could be prescribed

in the US, the Food and Drug Administration would need to approve it and the Drug Enforcement Administration would need to change its classification. MDMA is currently classified as Schedule 1, on par with heroin and deemed to have "no currently accepted medical use and a high potential for Psilocybin tea, wind chimes and a

tie-dye mattress await those coming to an office suite in Eugene to trip on psychedelic mushrooms. For roughly six hours, adults over 21 can experience what many users describe as vivid geometric shapes, a loss of identity and a oneness with the universe.

Epic Healing Eugene - America's first licensed psilocybin service center - opened in June, marking Oregon's unprecedented step in offering the mind-bending drug to the public. The center now has a waitlist of more than 3,000 names, including people with depression, PTSD or end-of-life dread.

Prescription

No prescription or referral is needed, but proponents hope Oregon's legalization will spark a revolution in mental health care.

Colorado voters last year passed a measure allowing regulated use of psychedelic mushrooms starting in 2024, and California's Legislature this month approved a measure that would allow possession and use of certain plant- and mushroom-based psychedelics, including psilocybin and mescaline, with plans for health officials to develop guidelines for therapeutic use.

The Oregon Psilocybin Services Section, charged with regulating the state's industry, has received "hundreds of thousands of inquiries from all over the world," Angela Allbee, the agency's manager, said in an interview.

"So far, what we're hearing is that clients have had positive experiences,' she said.

While psilocybin remains illegal in most of the United States, the Food and Drug Administration in 2018 designated it a "breakthrough therapy. This summer, the FDA published draft guidance for researchers designing clinical trials for psychedelic drugs.

Researchers believe psilocybin changes the way the brain organizes itself, helping a user adopt new attitudes and overcome mental health issues.

The Oregon Psychiatric Physicians Association, however, opposed Or-

egon's 2020 ballot measure legalizing psilocybin, saying it "is unsafe and makes misleading promises to those Oregonians who are struggling with mental illness.' Allbee noted that psychedelic mush-

rooms have been a part of tribal spiritual and healing practices for thousands of years. Her agency is focused on safety, she said.

First, customers must have a preparation session with a licensed facilitator who stays with clients as they experience the drug. The facilitator can deny access to those who have active psychosis, thoughts of harming anyone, or who have taken lithium, which is used to treat mania, in the past month.

The clients can't buy mushrooms to go, and they must stay at the service center until the drug wears off.

Besides approving psilocybin, Oregon voters in 2020 decriminalized possession of hard drugs, cementing the state's reputation as a leader in druglaw reform. Oregon was the first state to decriminalize marijuana possession and one of the first to legalize its recreational use.

But these days, the regulated marijuana industry is struggling with massive oversupply. And drug decriminalization has not greatly expanded addiction treatment or reduced overdoses as hoped. According to AP VoteCast, 58% of Oregon voters in the 2022 midterm elections thought Oregon's drug decriminalization effort had been a bad thing.

It's too early to assess Oregon's mushroom legalization.

Oregon Psilocybin Services spent two years establishing regulations and began accepting license applications in January. There are now 10 licensed service centers, four growers, two testing labs and dozens of facilitators.

While Epic Healing Eugene has a long waitlist thanks in part to early media attention, other service centers say business is picking up as awareness spreads.

Omnia Group Ashland, which opened this month in southern Oregon, has a prospective client list of 150, said co-founder Brian Lindley. Jeanette Small, the owner of Lucid Cradle in Bend, said she intends to see only one client per week to give close attention to each and is already booked through December.

The law allows local jurisdictions to ban psilocybin operations, and several rural counties have done so.

"We regret that we must file this law-

suit, but the world famous and critically imperiled ghost orchid is out of time," said George Gann, executive director at The Institute for Regional Conservation. "Only the Endangered Species Act can provide both the deterrence against poaching and the resources needed to respond to growing threats from hurricanes, invasive species, and counterproductive management decisions such as increased oil exploration."

The other plaintiffs in the lawsuit are the Center for Biological Diversity and the National Parks Conservation Association. The Fish and Wildlife Service, a part of the Interior Department, did not immediately respond to an email seeking comment. Ghost orchids are found mainly in the Big

Cypress National Preserve, the Florida Panther National Wildlife Refuge, Fakahatchee Strand Preserve State Park and Audubon's Corkscrew Swamp Sanctuary, all east of the Naples area. They are also found in Cuba, in certain restricted places.

"The ghost orchid, with its long, delicate petals and spur of nectar has become a symbol of the South Florida landscape,' the National Park Service says on its Big Cypress website. "Habitat destruction and hydrologic changes due to human development in South Florida have been partially responsible for the decline of ghost orchid populations. Also, over-collecting has had a negative impact on this special plant." (AP)

Ingebrigtsen wins Bowerman Mile

Coleman edges world champion Lyles in 100m at Prefontaine Classic

EUGENE, Ore., Sept 17, (AP): American Christian Coleman edged world champion and fellow countryman Noah Lyles in the 100 meters at the season-ending Prefontaine Classic on Saturday

Coleman won in 9.83 seconds, matching Lyles' world best this season, with Lyles finishing in 9.85. Coleman roared after his time became official and slapped the hand of a cheering fan at Eugene's Hayward Field.

The annual Prefontaine Classic, normally run earlier in the year, served as the Diamond League finale this season. Thirty-two champions were to be crowned over the two-day event, each winning \$30,000.

Lyles won gold medals in the 100, 200 and 4x100 relay at the track and field world championships in Budapest, Hungary, last month. Coleman finished fifth in the 100, so on Saturday he got a bit of revenge.

"As a professional, you definitely want to take advantage of every op-portunity that you can," Coleman said. "I knew this one would be a good one. It was a world-class field, a chance for me to redeem myself a little bit coming off of a world final.'

Lyles was treating the Prefontaine as something of a victory lap in his own country. After Saturday's race, he celebrated second place with a salted caramel milkshake.

"I gotta come bring it back home." Lyles said about running one final race this year on American soil.

Joining Coleman and Lyles in the star-studded event was sprinter Sha'Carri Richardson, who won golds in the 100 meters and the 100 relay in

Richardson is in the midst of a comeback in the run-up to the Paris Olympics next summer, after she was denied a chance to run in the Tokyo Games because of a positive drug test for marijuana.

She ran a world-best time this season of 10.65 in Budapest but on Saturday she finished fourth in 10.80. Jamaican Shericka Jackson, the second-place finisher at the worlds, won the $\overline{100}$ in 10.70.

"I want people to understand, it is not related to just winning," Richardson said about her resurgence. "I'm having fun because I'm embedded within my spirit, within my mind, and within my community that I created for myself. So that's the happiness that you guys see. And the wins are just a bonus.'

Jakob Ingebrigtsen of Norway won the Bowerman Mile, an event unique to the Prefontaine Classic, in a European record 3:43.73. It was also a Diamond League record.

American Rai Benjamin won the 400-meter hurdles in a Diamond League and meet record 46.39. He bested Norway's Karsten Warholm, who won the event at the worlds.


"I came out here with no expectation, just to have fun and close out the season," Benjamin said.

Kenya's Laban Kipngetich Korir was second in a time of 2:08:43, with

Ethiopian Getaneh Molla Tamire a further minute and a half behind in third.

Saina, who attended Iowa State University and now represents the United States, finished in 2:26:47 and held off a late challenge from Ethiopian Rahma Tusa Chota to win the women's race by six seconds. Gladys Chesir Kiptagelai of Kenya was third in a time of 2:28:41.

Canada's Joshua Cassidy won the men's wheelchair event, with Australia's Madison de Rozario winning the women's race.

Félix and Cancelo score in Barca rout

BARCELONA, Spain, Sept 17, (AP): João Félix and João Cancelo scored after making their first starts for Barcelona in a 5-0 rout of Real Betis in the Spanish league on Saturday.

The pair of Portugal internationals made their debuts last round for Barcelona as substitutes two days after they joined the defending champions on loan just hours before the summer transfer market closed.

Félix opened the scoring and Cancelo capped the biggest win so far this season for the defending champions.

"I would underscore that I see both (Félix and Cancelo) as very happy to be here and motivated to help the team," Barcelona coach Xavi Hernández said. "They give us more variety and improve the team thanks

to their individual talent, and today

the team was brilliant."

Félix scored in the 25th minute and then cleverly let a pass run between his legs in the area that Robert Lewandowski fired home to double the lead in the 32nd.

Ferran Torres, who also made his first start of the season, added a third goal in the 62nd when he became the first Barcelona player to score directly from a free kick since Lionel Messi did so against Valencia in May 2021, according to OPTA statistics.

After substitute Raphinha struck from just outside the area in the 66th, Cancelo topped the victory in the 81st with a great solo effort after he cut back twice to ditch his marker and beat goalkeeper Rui Silva from an angle.

Max run ends

SINGAPORE, Sept 17, (AP): The dominant Red Bulls were out of the picture and Formula One had its most thrilling fight for a win this season.

Runaway standings leader Max Verstappen's winning run ended at 10 races and Red Bull's at 15 both F1 records - as Carlos Sainz Jr. won the Singapore Grand Prix for Ferrari on Sunday.

Red Bull dreamed of winning every race this year but had Verstappen fifth and Perez eighth after struggling all weekend in Singapore.

Sainz started on pole position and held on with badly worn tires over several tense final laps for his second career win in F1 ahead of McLaren's Lando Norris and the Mercedes of Lewis Hamilton. It was a four-car fight for the win before George Russell crashed the other Mercedes on the final lap from third position to promote Hamilton to the podium.

"I felt under control. I felt like I could manage well and we brought it home. That was the best feeling," Sainz said after celebrating with his team as fireworks lit up the Singapore circuit.

slowed down to ensure Norris stay within the one-second window that allowed the McLaren driver access to the DRS straight-line speed boost - a valuable aid in holding off the two Mercedes.

"Carlos was very generous trying to help me get DRS. It helped my race and also helped his," said Norris, who has placed second in three of the last six races but has yet to win in F1. "We held (Mercedes) off, we did everything we needed to do and more." Norris said he clipped the wall in the same spot where Russell later went off.

Mercedes had Russell on course for second before taking a risk with a second stop for both cars in the hope of taking the win on fresher, faster tires. Russell dropped back to fourth, ahead of Hamilton, and they both passed Ferrari's Charles Leclerc but couldn't get past Norris to reclaim second.

"We rolled the dice this weekend," Hamilton said after a Mercedes strategy call saw both cars stop for fresh tires late on, meaning Russell dropped back from second in pursuit of the win.

Leclerc was fourth after failing to hold off the Mercedes cars on older tires, ahead of Verstappen in fifth. The champion had an eventful race after starting 11th and was briefly second on track behind Sainz, though only because almost all other cars stopped for fresh tires. After Verstappen's own pit stop, he fought his way back through the field from 15th.

Despite his worst result since Nov. 2022, Verstappen increased his championship lead to 151 points over Perez with seven races to go.

Hosts suffer historic loss

Injury-hit Chelsea held by Bournemouth in EPL

Newcastle back to winning ways

COLOMBO, Sri Lanka, Sept 17, (AP): India cruised to a comfortable ten-wicket win in the Asia Cup final, handing Sri Lanka a historically heavy defeat at R. Premadasa Stadium on Sunday. Having bowled out Sri Lanka for

50 runs, Indian openers Ishan Kishan and Shubman Gill knocked off the target in just 6.1 overs to secure the victory.

Kishan finished off the run chase with a single off part-time spinner Charith Asalanka as the rain-affected tournament's final ended inside just two hours.

"It was a great performance," said India captain Rohit Sharma. "To come out and play like that in the final shows the mental character. Great start with the ball and clinical finish with the bat." Pacer Mohammed Siraj was the hero for India claiming career best figures of 6-21 while all-rounder Hardik Pandya took three wickets to bowl out Sri Lanka.

"Very pleased with the effort today," said Siraj. "I have been bowling well since a long time. Was missing the edges earlier in the tournament but found the rhythm today."

It's the lowest total in an ODI final and Sri Lanka's second lowest total after its 43 all out against South Africa in Paarl in 2011.

It was also Sri Lanka's lowest total at home with the previous lowest being the 98 all out against South Africa at the same venue in 1993. It is also the lowest total in the

history of Asia Cups. Jasprit Bumrah had opening bats-

man Kusal Perera caught behind for no score in the first over of the innings and then Siraj took over, claiming four wickets in his second over, becoming the first Indian bowler to do so.

Pathum Nissanka, Sadeera Samarawickrama, Charith Asalanka and Dhananjaya de Silva all fell in the space of six deliveries as Siraj wrecked Sri Lanka's innings in a manic over.

Siraj then bowled captain Dasun Shanaka in his next over to reduce Sri Lanka to 12 for six. He had a sixth wicket by cleaning up Kusal Mendis

Mendis' 17 was the top scorer in Sri Lanka's innings in a dismal display as five batters were dismissed without scoring. Siraj's six for 21 is now the fourth-best bowling figures by an Indian bowler in ODI cricket.

Sri Lanka had opted to bowl first on a wicket that was expected to assist spin bowling, but it was the Indian quicks who ran through the Sri Lankan batting in front of a full house of 35,000 fans.

Sri Lanka and India had progressed to the Asia Cup finals while Pakistan and Bangladesh were knocked out in the Super Four stage. Afghanistan and Nepal failed to get beyond the first round.

Job 'done' as SAfrica thump Romania 76-0

BORDEAUX, France, Sept 17, (AP): All of South Africa's plans came together at the Rugby World Cup on Sunday.

The first objective was achieved in a thumping 76-0 win over underdog Romania, with hat tricks by scrumhalf Cobus Reinach and wing Makazole Mapimpi among the Springboks' 12 tries without reply in Bordeaux.

The defending champions had the first four of their tries and a bonus point inside 12 minutes, and Reinach sniped from close-in for his third try in the 24th minute to just miss his own record for the fastest hat trick at the Rugby World Cup. He set that four years ago with three in 20 minutes against Canada.

South Africa went over five times in the first half and seven times in the second to dismantle the Romanians in a Pool B match that was one-sided from the start.

Away from the convincing result, South Africa also made

big gains with a series of experiments. At least one of them might have a significant impact for the business end of the tournament, starting with South Africa's next pool game, a huge showdown with top-ranked Ireland next weekend.

Ireland showed it's ready by mauling Tonga 59-16 on Saturday night.

Among the experiments, Grant Williams, a scrumhalf starting on the wing, collected two tries for South Africa in the second half. Faf de Klerk, yet another scrumhalf showing his versatility, came on as flyhalf and ran the backline for the last 24 minutes.

And Deon Fourie, a flanker who switched to reserve hooker, marked his Rugby World Cup debut at the age of 36 with a try in the middle of a rolling maul two minutes after he came off the bench at halftime.

BOURNEMOUTH, England, Sept 17, (AP): Injury-hit Chelsea could not catch the break it badly needs in a 0-0 draw at Bournemouth on Sunday and stayed in the bottom half of the Premier League standings where it finished last season.

Chelsea twice had shots strike the frame of Bournemouth's goal and the 51st-minute free kick by Raheem Sterling bounced down from the bar on to the goal line. Though defender Levi Colwill followed up to put the ball in the net, he was ruled offside.

Nicolas Jackson's shot in the 13th had struck the post after exchanging passes with Ukraine winger Mykhailo Mudryk.

Chelsea needed goalkeeper Robert Sanchez to preserve the point

with a save in the 79th from Dominic Solanke, the Bournemouth forward who started his career at the London club.

One day after two Premier League games were decided with goals deep into added time, Bournemouth and Chelsea could not find a goal in the eight minutes given them at the end of the second half.

Time expired with Chelsea lacking urgency in attack and was met with some boos from its fans.

Chelsea now has just one win in five league games and is 14th in the league standings - one place below Manchester United and one above Bournemouth which has yet to win.

Injuries in the Chelsea squad - including captain Reese James, midfielder Moises Caicedo and forward Christopher Nkunku - meant despite the club's \$1 billion spending spree in the past year, coach Mauricio Pochettino filled his substitutes bench with teenagers yet to make their first-team debuts.

Fresh from signing a new contract, Callum Wilson struck from the penalty spot as Newcastle beat Brentford 1-0.

Wilson has just signed a one-year extension to keep him at the club until 2025. And he quickly began to repay the faith Newcastle showed in him with the winner against Brentford at St. James' Park. It was the Magpies' first win since the opening game of the season and ended a three-match losing run.

Wilson converted a 64th-minute penalty and Eddie Howe's team moved up to 11th in the standings.

Newcastle had not won since routing Aston Villa 5-1 on Aug. 12 and had since slipped to defeats against Manchester City, Liverpool and Brighton.

The win should help boost confidence ahead of the team's Champions League opener against AC Milan on Tuesday.

Newcastle was awarded a penalty after Brentford goalkeeper Mark Flekken's clumsy challenge on Anthony Gordon.



have spent around \$950 million on some of the biggest stars in the world. The spending is being fueled by a move by the kingdom's sovereign wealth Public Investment Fund to take a majority ownership stake in four of the country's top clubs, Al-Hilal, Al-Ittihad, Al-Ahli and Al-Nassr.

As well as Neymar, Al-Hilal has signed English Premier League stars Ruben Neves, Kalidou Koulibaly and Aleksandar Mitrovic as well as goalkeeper Moroccan Yassine

Bounou, Brazilian winger Malcom and Serbian midfielder Sergej Milinkovic-Savic.

Mumbai City has been placed in the same group and the Indians are looking forward to a chance to take on Hilal and especially its Brazilian superstar.
"I think anyone that's seen the
