The decision is part of efforts aimed at enhancing the efficiency of medical personnel and improving the quality of services offered to pediatric patients. It aligns with the government's action plan to raise the level of healthcare standards and facilitate citizens' access

to top-quality services. It is worth highlighting that this decision comes in conjunction with the ministerial resolution No. 63/2024, which mandates all doctors, dentists, pharmacists, and allied health workers in hospitals, specialized centers, and primary care centers affiliated with the ministry, and workers in the private medical sector to undergo training in cardiopulmonary resuscitation from accredited training centers affiliated with the American Heart Association (AHA) and the American Safety and Health Institute (ASHI) upon appointment and promotion.

### Kuwait strips citizenship for 6 men, three women

KUWAIT CITY, March 12: The Council of Ministers has approved the revocation of Kuwaiti citizenship for nine individuals, comprising six men, three women, including one American woman, reports Al-Qabas

These decisions were issued by the Supreme Committee for the Investigation of Kuwaiti Nationality, following a thorough review of relevant constitutional and legal provisions.

The Supreme Committee, in accordance with the Kuwaiti Nationality Law and its amendments, found that these individuals obtained citizenship through fraudulent means or were convicted by final court rulings, including some currently serving prison sen-

The American woman allegedly acquired citizenship in 2006 and the Emirati woman obtained citizenship in 1967, along with seven others who acquired citizenship at various

In light of recent decisions, the total number of individuals who have had their Kuwaiti nationality revoked has surpassed 30 within a week, highlighting the government's commitment to upholding legal integrity and combating fraudulent practices related to citizenship acquisition.

À government source revealed ongoing efforts to identify and address cases of fraudulent citizenship acquisition, with further decisions pending submission by the committee. The source emphasized that the government remains steadfast in its resolve to pursue legal measures against perpetrators and maintain transparency throughout the process.

2 candidates withdraw from parliamentary race

# **Election tally rises to 219 as 17 more register**

KUWAIT CITY, March 12: A total of 17 candidates registered for the upcoming parliamentary elections, including one woman, on Tuesday the ninth day of the registration period for candidates.

This increases the total number of candidates to 219, including seven women. Two candidates have so far withdrawn from the race.

The candidates who registered on Tuesday are as follows:

Second Constituency: three men (Mohammad Al-Mutair, Abdulwahab Al- Qattan and Bandar Mubarak Al-Mutairi)

Third Constituency: two men (Madhi Ibrahim Al-Khamees and Abdullah Al-Hendal)

Fourth Constituency: 11 men and one woman (Husain Al-Serafi, Hamad Al-Jadie, Saud Al-Heraiji, Adel Al-Jemaili, Abdullah Falah Al-Hajri, Askar Owaed Al-Anzi, Mubarak Haif Al-Hajraf, Mohammad Mahdi Al-Sulaimani, Mohammad Shenaifi Al-Majedi, Yousef Al-Bazzali, Ahmed Al-Sulaimani and Nawal Saleh Aba Al-Khail)

Third Constituency candidate Madhi Al- Khamees stressed the need for the government to submit an integrated work program, which is feasible and has a timetable.

He said political instability led to deterioration in all fields; wondering how the country witnessed the formation of four governments in seven years, while the upcoming parliamentary election is the third in four

Former Deputy National Assembly Speaker Mohammad Al-Mutair, who filed his candidacy in the Fourth Constituency, asserted that the corrupt should be bored, not the people. He hopes the people will not only vote

for pro-reform candidates, but continue supporting them to succeed in their legislative work as well.

Former MP Mubarak Al-Hajraf and Fourth Constituency candidate called on all eligible voters to participate in the election in order to decide about their future. He pointed out the time has come for a popular prime minister (not from Al-Sabah Family). He added this will minimize disputes whose source everyone is aware of.

### **UN chief renews** call for ceasefire

YORK, March 12, (KUNA): The UN secretary general, Antonio Guterres called on Monday for a truce in the Israel-Gaza war and Sudan as the holy Muslim fasting month of Ramadan begins.

In a statement, Guterres also urged the release of hostages held by Hamas and the removal of 'all obstacles to ensure the delivery of lifesaving aid at the speed and massive scale required' to Gaza. As Ramadan begins, Palestin-

ian health ministry in Gaza issued new casualty figures, noting at least 31,112 Palestinians have been killed and 72,760 wounded since 7 October in Israel's military offensive on the Gaza Strip. The UN chief also warned

from the repercussions of threats to attack Rafah city, which would push Palestinians in Gaza to new depths of hell, stressing on the importance of ending the cycle of violence.

Reiterating his call to the warring parties to halt the war, Guterres highlighted the same compelling appeal from the families of victims who visited the UN in New York recently.

"As one of those family members said, "we are not here for condolences. We are not here for apologies. We are here for imme-

diate action," Guterres added. **Continued on Page 5**

### Ramadan first day

On the first day of Ramadan, Al-Qabas observed notable traffic congestion, particularly during the rush hours at the beginning and end of the workday, prompting a robust security and traffic presence to man age the flow and ensure order, reports Al-Oabas daily.

Despite this, employees demonstrated commendable commitment and punctuality, with attendance rates exceeding 70% across various sectors.

During a tour of ministries, Al-Qabas noted a diligent work atmosphere, with employees efficiently completing transactions amidst a modest number of visitors during the initial hours.

However, inspection teams identified absenteeism, ensuring accountability for those not adhering to work obligations. Ministers emphasized the importance of addressing absenteeism promptly, especially during Ramadan.

Despite the fasting period, many transactions were smoothly processed, with minimal disruption and some offices remaining open during iftar time. As the workday drew to a close, requests for permission to leave increased, with approximately 60% of employees seeking early departure, citing various reasons.

The implementation of electronic transaction systems in service agencies played a significant role in reducing congestion and facilitating transactions, with many services now accessible online. Ministers reiterated the need to maintain discipline and deter laziness or negligence, especially during Ramadan.

In courtrooms, a high attendance rate of over 80% was observed among employees, ensuring the seamless operation of judicial proceedings. Similarly, lawyers and defendants demonstrated a high level of commitment to attending sessions, recognizing the consequences of absenteeism.

In schools, student attendance varied, with some schools experiencing full at-

Overall, the first day of Ramadan showcased a strong commitment to work discipline and attendance across various sectors, underscoring the importance of maintaining efficiency during this holy month.

### Ramadan 'iftar cannon'

One of the most iconic rituals associated with the holy month of Ramadan in Kuwait is the "Iftar Cannon," a tradition steeped in history and cultural significance, reports Al-Qabas daily.

For approximately 117 years, the launch of the Iftar cannon has marked the end of fasting hours and the Maghreb call to prayer, bringing joy and anticipation to both children and adults alike.

The origins of the Iftar cannon trace back to historical happenstance, with its inception dating back to the year 865 AH in Mamluk Cairo. Sultan Khashkadam's desire to test a new cannon coincided with the sunset call to prayer, resulting in the cannon shots firing at the precise moment of breaking the fast.

Mistaking it for a deliberate tradition, people embraced it as a way to alert fasting individuals, thus cementing its status as a beloved ritual during both Iftar and Suhoor.

Another account attributes the introduction of the Iftar cannon to Fatima, the daughter of Khedive Ismail, who purportedly decreed its use to announce the breaking of the fast throughout Ramadan, leading to its designation as the "Hajja Fatima cannon" in Egypt.

This tradition eventually spread to various Arab and Islamic countries, including Kuwait. In 1907, during the reign of Sheikh Mubarak Al-Sabah, Kuwait witnessed the introduction of the Iftar cannon, with Ali bin Aqab bin Ali Al-Khazraji being credited as its first launcher. Gifted by the British government, the cannon served as a means for Kuwaitis to discern the timing of both Suhoor and Iftar.

Initially launched from the Seif Palace, the Ramadan cannon found its permanent home in the Naif Palace in the early 1950s, where it has continued to signal the end of fasting hours ever since. Built in 1920 under the reign of Sheikh Salem Al-Muharak, Naif Palace stands as a testament to Kuwait's enduring cultural traditions, with the Iftar cannon serving as a symbol of unity and anticipation during the holy month of Ramadan.

# **Zakat House enforces innovative** aid distribution plan in Ramadan

Focus on modern features, energy saving in schools

KUWAIT CITY, March 12: The Zakat House intensifies its endeavors to provide donations and alms to deserving individuals both within and outside Kuwait, leveraging the blessings and virtues of the holy month, reports Al-Jarida daily.

In this regard, the Director of Projects and Local Bodies Department at Zakat House, Radaan Al-Hajri, announced the launch of various initiatives aimed at ensuring efficient distribution of aid during this auspi-

This year, Zakat House has introduced a mobile iftar project within Kuwait, deploying twenty-five mobile units across strategic locations to distribute meals to the needy. With 6 sites in Al-Ahmadi Governorate, 5 in Farwaniya, 2 in Mubarak Al-Kabeer, 5 in Al-Jahra, 3 in the capital, and 4 in Hawalli, these points cater to areas with high worker concentrations, adjacent to mosques, facilitating the distribution of 6,635 meals daily.

Al-Hajri highlighted the implementation of a new mechanism for issuing magnetic cards in lieu of distributing food supplies, ensuring greater convenience and flexibility for beneficiaries.

These cards, allocated to individuals registered with the Social Service Department at Zakat House, enable the purchase of essential food supplies from designated locations, including Lulu Hyper, Farwaniya Cooperative Society, Oncost, and others.

Furthermore, the Zakat House is prepared to execute the in-kind Zakat al-Fitr project, designating 14 revenue centers across all governorates to receive Zakat al-Fitr contributions, particularly in the form of rice.

Al-Hajri reaffirmed Zakat House's commitment to serving donors, charities, and the needy, emphasizing its readiness to deliver aid swiftly and efficiently. With a vision focused on modernizing aid distribution methods, Zakat House continues to uphold its leadership in zakat and humanitarian endeavors, both locally and globally.

Modern features: Muhammad Al-Khalidi, Assistant Undersecretary for Educational Facilities and Planning at the Ministry of Education, underscored the Ministry's commitment to sustainability and energy-saving initiatives in newly constructed schools, reports Al-Jarida

Speaking at the official opening of a girls' middle school building in the Sabah Al-Nasser area, Al-Khalidi highlighted the modern features of the facility, including its advanced systems and focus on energy efficiency.

The newly inaugurated school is equipped with solar energy systems aimed at reducing electricity consumption, along with 50 smart boards, state-of-the-art laboratories adhering to international safety standards, sports facilities, spacious courtyards, and student restrooms. Additionally, the school is furnished with surveillance cameras and instructional screens to enhance security and learning environments

Al-Khalidi noted that the project, initiated in 2022, was completed within a remarkably short timeframe, reflecting the Ministry's dedication to timely infrastructure development. Spanning an area of 16 thousand square meters across three floors, the school comprises 30 classrooms, laboratories, a library, and a mosque. He emphasized the sector's efforts in utilizing weather-resistant external facades for the school building.

On the same lines, Eng. Muhammad Fahad, Director of Project Management, confirmed the completion of another project related to the establishment of two schools in the Sabah Al-Nasser area. A boys' middle school in plot (7) has been successfully completed, with a girls' middle school in plot (1) currently undergoing final checks. Fahad highlighted the innovative architectural design of the new schools, which are set to commence operations soon, further enriching educational opportunities in the region.

# Call to set up applied university

### 'Who or what instigated attack? Israel takes all from operation'

"IN depth... Deadly stubbornness... It is inconceivable that the Hamas movement did not anticipate the brutal Israeli enemy's response to its attack on July 10, 2023; or that it did not take into account the devastating consequences on Gaza and its people," columnist Talal Abdul Kareem **Al-Arab** wrote for **Al-Jarida** daily.

"So what was the goal of its operation? Why was this critical time chosen -- when the two-State solution discussion is acceptable to everyone except Israel and Iran? Was the goal to liberate its prisoners or to advance the Palestinian cause globally? Or, I wonder, was it in implementation of external instructions with false promises and a deadly deception? The at-

tack did not free prisoners, as it rather incited the world's ire against it, and later aroused the wrath of sympathizers against Israel for its brutality against the innocent Gazans. However, neither the demonstrations against it.

nor the resonant speeches and strong emotions, curbed its aggression.

"The ferocious attack, whether you knew it or not, served Israel to complete its old plan, which began with Hamas isolating Gaza from the legitimate authority under its nose. This is certainly what it wanted, because it was strange and illogical for Israel to remain silent about transforming Gaza into an emirate loyal to Iran and its Revolutionary Guard.

"Now that the axe has fallen on the head, and after Gaza was destroyed along with its hospitals, schools, homes and infrastructure, and after tens of thousands of its residents have been martyred and more than a million and a half Gazans have been displaced; the shouting and begging for a ceasefire has begun for nothing in return. This will not happen and Hamas knows this, yet it is stubborn and its stubbornness is fatal for the people

"Israel will not stop its brutal bombing. It may stop for a while in order to release its prisoners. Hamas realized that Israel will stop the fighting permanently if it leaves Gaza. Hamas knows that, but it is stubborn. Israel is an expansionist, colonial State. The fervent attack on it gave it the pretext and the western American cover to implement its plan to empty Gaza and start the 'Ben Gurion Canal' project. Hamas knows about it.

"Is the action of Hamas in that dark history justified? If Israel released stopped bombing Gaza and even if it did not stipulate Hamas' exit from it, would what happened to Gaza and its residents be justified? Do the safety of Hamas' leaders and members, and the release of its prisoners match what happened to it? There is nothing more heinous than turning defeats and destruction into imaginary victories. There is nothing more criminal than the murderer except the one who brags about the blood of the dead person -- the blood of the martyrs of Gaza -- on the necks of those who brag about it. You are the ones who threw them to destruction. Everyone who applauds and cheers for you -- whether intentionally or not -- shares in your sin. What happened was suicide and mass slaughter, not a struggle. There is no consolation for the Palestinians, as they will not get Gaza as it was.

"As for Israel, it received financial, military and political support from its allies, and even sports. As for Hamas, it received more warm encouragement for more deadly stubbornness, with leaders rejoicing in health and wellness. As for the others, let them go to hell.

"The two-State solution was ready according to the Arab-American agreement, which Israel rejects and which conflicts with Iran's interests, because it will isolate it from its agents. What happened in Gaza benefited them and aborted a peace opportunity that would have been the nail in the coffin of the Zionist State in the long run.

"The Gaza tragedy is painful, but emotion must not blind us from the truth of what happened. Is there any wise and honorable person who dares hang the bell of sin around the neck of the one who committed it?"

### Also:

"The solid waste recycling project is useful not only from the standpoint of getting rid of solid waste and the large number of landfills that have flooded the country, but the idea could be a productive industrial project by converting solid waste into alternative fuel and a number of other useful organic products," columnist M. Adel Al-Jarallah Al-Karafi wrote for Al-Seyassah daily.

"If this project will not cost the State's general budget, and will be implemented and managed by a national company owned by Kuwait Investment Authority, then it is compatible with our high level of consumption and the resulting waste, and nothing is more

evident than the abundance of rubbish. "Although the project data and its

cost are not available till date, I hope the administrative and technical procedures will be free of defects and impurities in both contracting and implementation. This is extremely important for the success of the project.

"Without a doubt, this step opens the door to industrial initiatives and projects that our national economy desperately needs. It is also a step in economic diversification, so we hope it will be followed by productive industrial projects that enhance the contribution of the industrial sector to the gross domestic product.

"Solid waste recycling' is a government industrial project. We await the results on the executive side. We must be convinced of the necessity of developing an effective industrial sector, because it is one of the requirements of economic diversification.

Here, we must point out that government investment should not be limited to the government. It must be led by the private sector, including the small projects.

"The government must also provide the necessary investment climate, including the land needed for industrial facilities. Its role should be through partnership with the private sector or be limited to regulation, su-

pervision and control.

"There are promising sectors for investment in our national economy, such as renewable energy projects, information technology, petrochemicals, pharmaceutical industries, food industries, manufacturing and others. These can be successful investment projects that are compatible with our resources and needs.

"On this basis, the waste recycling project is the first step toward the path of a thousand miles. The government must continue it until the end.'

"Your tongue is your horse... Homeland, homeland, and then homeland. From now until the fourth of April, there will be an opportunity to criticize and insult some figures -- both governmental and non-governmental -- by some old and new candidates who have no way to succeed except through the demonstration of their heroism and boldness in front of their voters to reach the National Assembly. They have always dreamed of entering the Assembly in order to benefit it, as this had been the custom of some lawmakers over the past years," Sheikh Ali Al-Jaber Al-Ahmad wrote for Al-Seyassah daily.

"This is not the correct and ideal way to success. Whoever wants to reach Abdullah Al-Salem Hall must be honest with Allah first, and then with himself. He must have pure intentions in front of his voters to serve his country, so that Allah Almighty will grant him success in his efforts. This candidate and other citizens should know that every human being has his own tongue in the middle of his mouth. Your tongue is your horse. If you protect it, it will protect you, and if you insult it, it will ruin you.

"Unfortunately, many people insult their tongues without achieving any goal other than proving their courage. They think so in front of their acquaintances, without knowing that their followers see it as lack of morals, while knowing well that someone else's tongue is in their mouth, but that someone else's upbringing requires him not to use it, except for what Allah has commanded in terms of good speech. Allah forgives those who are arrogant and utter bad words. The reward is permission for whoever receives it without responding.

"There is no country devoid of problems, and each one searches for solutions that suit them. We are concerned about our internal problems, especially social problems, which require the government to exert utmost effort to find appropriate solutions, given the effects that the Kuwaiti society is suffering. This step must be taken before the problems get worse and expand, such that it becomes difficult to control and solve them.

"In short, these problems are family disintegration, spread of drugs, betrayal of trust, corruption and debts. These are extremely dangerous issues if they continue. It is important to solve them as soon as possible in order to maintain cohesion of Kuwaiti society and to pass it on to the next generation.

"Gratitude and appreciation for every citizen who works and strives with all his energy for the sake of the country, whether he is in the government or outside it. He must also preserve the trust. His duty is to continue with what his conscience dictates to him to preserve it. He is responsible for it in front of Allah Almighty, as long as he is in good health and that he is not stingy with his giving and service to her (conscience), just as he takes from her, for she is the caring mother and safe haven for our dignity and pride, and our survival after Allah Almighty. There is no gratitude or appreciation for anyone who belittles her. She takes care of him and looks out for his interests before hers, so she shows her love through action, not words.

"May Allah protect Kuwait and its people from all forms of evil and

# MPW enhances quality control measures for asphalt factories

Roads maintenance top on list: minister

**KUWAIT CITY, March 12: The Ministry** of Public Works announced the withdrawal of 52 samples from various asphalt factories and sites across the country as part of its ongoing efforts to monitor the quality of asphalt production and road maintenance, reports Al-Jarida daily.

These samples underwent 79 tests at road laboratories to ensure compliance with quality standards. Additionally, the ministry conducted 607 visits to asphalt factories, issuing six certificates related to factory calibration in February.

Sources within the Ministry emphasized its commitment to addressing complaints from citizens and residents, particularly concerning road maintenance. These complaints are promptly addressed, with maintenance teams dispatched to carry out necessary repairs across the country's governorates.

KUWAIT CITY, March 12: Meteorologist Issa Ramadan said temperatures will vary during the holy month of Ramadan, with moderate weather at night, reports Al-

In a statement to the daily, Ramadan pointed out this is common during spring and it is a good weather for the

He disclosed that the southeast wind speed will be moderate, and then become active, with partly cloudy weather and a chance of scattered light rain with low horizontal visibility and temperatures ranging from 28 to 30 degrees Celsius.

He added the weather forecasts state that the winds will shift to northwesterly winds with sunny weather on Tuesday and Wednesday, and temperatures will rise starting from Thursday and during the weekend — more than 30 degrees Celsius on Friday until Sunday; with light to moderate southeasterly winds that will be active at times, and then temperatures will drop with a chance of scattered rain until Tuesday.

Ramadan said that day and night will be equal in Saturday on March 16, while the vernal equinox in the northern hemisphere will be on March 21. The day will begin to lengthen and the night will shorten after March 21, and the angle of incidence of the sun's rays

Burial timings: Kuwait Municipality recently issued an administrative circular on the burial timings during the holy month of Ramadan – 11:00 am, after the afternoon prayers and after Tarawih prayers, reports Al-Anba daily.

The Municipality explained in its circular that it set these burial timings to alleviate the burdens of the families of the deceased, starting from the first day of Ramadan. It added this is out of concern for the health and safety of mourners in cemeteries.

### 5 dead in mishaps on Ramadan 1

KUWAIT CITY, March 12: On the first day of Ramadan, the country witnessed a total of five deaths in traffic accidents. Three individuals - 2 Nepalese and an unidentified man - were run over by

a car driven by a Kuwaiti citizen on the Coastal Road opposite Mahboula, resulting in their death. When the Operations Room of Ministry of Interior received information

about the accident, securitymen and paramedics rushed to the location and referred the bodies of the deceased to the Forensic Medicine Department. The Kuwaiti motorist has been arrested. An investigation was opened into the accident, and a case was registered.

Meanwhile, a Kuwaiti citizen was run over by a car on Subiya Road, and succumbed to serious injuries. His body was taken to the Forensic Medicine Department, and a case was registered.

In addition, an Afghan expatriate died when his vehicle collided with another on Subiya Road. He was removed from the wreckage of his vehicle, and his body was referred to Forensic Medicine. A case was registered.

Meanwhile, the Deputy Prime Minister, Minister of Defense, and Acting Minister of Interior Sheikh Fahad Al-Yousef has issued a decision for amending allowances, bonuses, and additional personnel for the officers, requiring the addition of a second paragraph to article 68 of the ministerial resolution No. 500/2021.

KUWAIT CITY, March 12: Informed sources at the Ministry of Public Works revealed the readiness of the construction projects sector to float a tender on the special education school complex project in Egaila through the Central Agency for Public Tenders (CAPT).

They explained that the establishment of the project in Egaila comes within the framework of the construction of three similar buildings in Jahra and Hawally, which will be proposed and implemented successively.

The ministry is awaiting the formation of the board of directors of CAPT, and will then resume the agency's work progress in order for the project to be presented to the companies classified by

The project is one of the major development

and it will be implemented in three areas, namely Hawally, Egaila, and Jahra.

According to the project implementation schedule, two complexes for schools for people with special needs will be established, the first in Egaila and the second in Jahra. After the completion of construction and operation of the two complexes in Egaila and Jahra, the private schools in Hawally will be demolished and a new complex will be built on their land.

### **Components**

The components of the project are in the three buildings, which are specialized buildings for teaching cases of deafness, mutism, movement disabilities, cases of Down syndrome, autism, and speech difficulties.

The complex contains physical therapy buildings with swimming pools, as well as a gym, a multi-purpose hall, and another for education and treatment of speech difficulties. It also contains craft workshops, student housing, and the administration building, as well as libraries, workshops, and theaters equipped with the modern technological means required to meet the needs and requirements of people with special groups with the maximum capacity.

Meanwhile, according to an informed source, Kuwait Municipality has extended three addiperiod will be six months, with a total revenue of up to KD 1.665 million.

### Europe

'Open accession negotiations with Bosnia': The European Union's executive arm will recommend that member countries open accession negotiations with Bosnia-Herzegovina, European Commission President Ursula von der Leyen said Tuesday, despite lingering ethnic divisions in the Western Balkan country.

Bosnia-Herzegovina country is among six nations from the region - alongside Albania, Serbia, Kosovo, Montenegro and North Macedonia - who are at different stages of the EU accession process, following a period of wars and crises in the 1990s.

Their memberships have been stalled for years. But after Russia's war on Ukraine, EU officials are more keen on trying to lure them away from the Kremlin's influence. "We have realized that it is not enough

to just wait for the Western Balkans to move closer to us," von der Leyen told EU lawmakers on Tuesday. "It is not Von der leyen enough to say that the door is open. We must also take responsibility, and support their path towards our

Union in any possible way. EU leaders are expected to discuss the European Commission's recommendation at a summit scheduled in Brussels next week.

Top Polish leaders to visit White House: US President Joe Biden is hosting Poland's president and prime minister for White House talks on Tuesday with the Polish leaders looking to press Washington to break its impasse over replenishing funds for Ukraine at a critical moment in the war in Europe.

Ahead of the visit, President Andrzej Duda called on other members of the NATO alliance to raise their spending on defense to 3% of their GDP as Russia puts its own economy on a war footing and pushes forward with its plans to conquer Ukraine. Poland already spends 4% of its own economic output on defense, double the current target of 2% in NATO. "The war in Ukraine has clearly shown that the United States is

and should remain the leader in security issues in Europe and the world," Duda said in an address to Poland on Monday. "However, other NATO countries must also take greater responsibility for the security of the entire alliance and intensively modernize and strengthen their troops.

In a Washington Post opinion piece to spotlight his call for greater NATO spending, Duda argued that Russia was switching its economy to "war mode," allocating close to 30% of its annual budget to arm itself. (AP)

Ukraine's 1st Oscar reminder of war horrors: Ukraine awoke Monday to another day of war - Russian drones blasted buildings in the Kharkiv and Odesa regions - but also the news it had won its first Oscar.

The best documentary victory for Mstyslav Chernov's "20 Days in Mariupol," a harrowing first-person account by The Associated Press journalist of the early days of Russia's invasion in 2022, was bittersweet. "This is the first Oscar in Ukrainian history, and I'm honored,"

an emotional Chernov said Sunday at the Academy Awards. "Probably I will be the first director on this stage to say I wish I'd never made this film, I wish to be able to exchange this to Russia never attacking Ukraine. Back home in his native Ukraine, the award was applauded for exposing the brutal devastation of the war and the message Cher-

nov had sent to the world from one of the biggest stages. "I really liked what the director said during the award acceptance, that it would have been better if he hadn't made this film and if all of this hadn't happened," said Oleksii Kurka, a Kyiv office worker. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy hailed the award as "important for our entire country" and said he was grateful to the team and thanked journalists across the world still

South Korean accused of espionage in Russia: A South Korean citizen arrested in Russia earlier this year on suspicion of spying is to remain in custody until mid-June, Russia's state news

been arrested for espionage in Russia. Tass said the man, identified by the agency as Baek Won-soon was detained "at the start of the year" in the far eastern city of Vladivostok and was taken to Moscow at the end of February. He is being held in Lefortovo Prison, where a court on Monday ordered his detention extended until June 15, Tass said.

Tass cited an unnamed law enforcement official as saying the suspect passed on information "constituting state secrets to foreign intelligence services." The case has been labelled "top secret" and no further details have been made public. (AP)

Sweden's flag raised at NATO's HQ: Sweden's flag was raised at NATO headquarters on Monday, cementing the Nordic country's place as the 32nd member two years after Russia's fullscale invasion of Ukraine persuaded its reluctant public to seek safety under the alliance's security umbrella.

Under a steady rain, Swedish Prime Minister Ulf Kristersson, Crown Princess Victoria and NATO Secretary-General Jens Stoltenberg looked on as two soldiers raised the blue banner emblazoned with a yellow cross among the official circle of national flags at the alliance's headquarters in Brussels.

The Russian, brutal, full-scale invasion against Ukraine united Sweden behind the conclusion that a full-fledged NATO membership is the only reasonable choice," Kristersson said. Swedish government ministers and party leaders from across the political spectrum attended in a show of national unity. (AP) 

French govt targeted by intense cyberattacks: The French government said Monday that several of its services have been targeted by cyberattacks of "unprecedented intensity," and a special crisis center was activated to restore online services.

Prime Minister Gabriel Attal's office said in a statement that the attacks started Sunday night and hit multiple government ministries, without providing details. By Monday afternoon, it said, "the impact of the attacks has been reduced for most services and access to government sites restored."

A group of hackers called Anonymous Sudan, which is considered by cybersecurity experts as pro-Russia, claimed responsibility for the attacks in online posts. The French prime minister's office and digital safety agency wouldn't comment on the claim, or provide details of what was targeted or what damage might have

Denmark's Queen Margrethe designs costumes: Danish Queen Margrethe, who surprised her country by abdicating earlier this year, is back as a ballet costume designer for Denmark's famed Tivoli amusement park, which celebrates its 150th anniversary this year, the gardens said Monday.

The 83-year-old-queen, who has designed costumes and stage sets more than a dozen of times at the Tivoli gardens' Pantomine theater, is creating the costumes and set for a ballet based on a fairy tale by the Danish writer Hans Christian Andersen, "Klods Hans," or "Clumsy Hans.

In a statement, issued by the Tivoli Gardens, the queen said "it should be a fun show, and I'm looking forward to seeing the adventure unfold on stage." The show opens June 22.

The open-air Pantomime is one of the downtown amusement park's landmarks. (AP)

Norway's king gets permanent pacemaker: Europe's oldest monarch, King Harald V of Norway, is getting a permanent pacemaker on Tuesday, the palace said, adding that the monarch will followingly remain in hospital for a few days.

In a brief statement, the royal household said the 87-year-old would get it at Oslo's university hospital, Rikshospitalet. Last month, Harald fell ill during a private holiday with his wife

Queen Sonja on the Malaysian resort island of Langkawi. He underwent surgery and received a temporary pacemaker due to a low

Harald returned to Norway aboard a medical airplane and was immediately transferred to an Oslo hospital.

The monarch has been in frail health in recent years with numerous hospital stays. He had an operation to replace a heart valve in October 2020 after being hospitalized with breathing difficulties. (AP)

**Bus-truck collision kills 5:** Five people, including three children, were killed in western Illinois when a school bus and semitruck collided on a highway Monday, authorities said.

The bus was traveling eastbound when it crossed the center line on US Route 24 into the westbound lanes "for an unknown reason" and into the path of a semitruck carrying sand, Illinois State Police Troop 6 Capt. Jody Huffman said at a news conference. Both vehicles caught on fire in the crash. The crash happened around 11:30 a.m. in Rushville, a Schuyler County community of about 3,000 roughly 60 miles (95 kilometers) west of Springfield.

All four people aboard the bus from Schuyler-Industry Schools - three children and the driver - as well as the driver of the semitruck were killed.

"There's not really words at this time that can be said," Schuyler County Sheriff Bill Redshaw told reporters. "When you have a loss of life like this, it's devastating." He said the tragedy hit the small, close-

knit community particularly hard. (AP) 

NTSB probes plane crash: A small plane crash in a remote area of central Oregon has killed everyone on board, local authorities said Monday.

The Jefferson County Sheriff's Office said a 911 call around 7:40 p.m. Sunday reported the crash outside the city of Madras, and deputies found the site with the help of power company officials. "Due to the extent of the crash there were

no survivors," the sheriff's Facebook post said. Authorities did not specify the number of passengers in the single-engine plane. The sheriff's office says it won't release the names of the victims until identities are confirmed and families are notified.

The National Transportation Safety Board said it has opened an investigation into the crash, which involved a Piper PA-32. It will oversee the probe along with the Federal Aviation Administration, the sheriff's office said. (AP)

### House GOP moves ahead with TikTok vote

NEW YORK, March 12, (AP): House Republicans are moving ahead with a bill that would require Chinese company ByteDance to sell TikTok or face a ban in the United States even as former President Donald Trump is voicing opposition to the effort.

House leadership has scheduled a vote on the measure for Wednesday. A Republican congressional aide not authorized to speak publicly said that's still the plan and there has not been significant pushback to the bill from lawmakers.

A vote for the bill would represent an unusual break with the former president by House Republicans, but Speaker Mike Johnson and others have already forcefully come out in favor of the bill, and dropping it now would represent a significant reversal. "It's an important bipartisan measure to take on China, our largest geopolitical foe, which is actively undermining our economy and security," Johnson

Trump said Monday that he still believes TikTok poses a national security risk but is opposed to banning the hugely popular app because doing so would help its rival, Facebook, which he continues to lambast over his 2020 election loss.

"Frankly, there are a lot of people on TikTok that love it. There are a lot of young kids on TikTok who will go crazy without it," Trump said in a callin interview with CNBC's "Squawk Box." "There's a lot of good and there's a lot of bad with TikTok. But the thing I don't like is that without TikTok you're going to make Facebook bigger, and I consider Facebook to be an enemy of the people, along with a lot of the media.

"When I look at it, I'm not looking to make Facebook double the size,' he added. "I think Facebook has been very bad for our country, especially when it comes to elections.

Trump has repeatedly complained about Facebook's role during the 2020 election, which he still refuses to concede he lost to President Joe Biden. That includes at least \$400 million that its founder, Mark Zuckerberg, and his wife donated to two nonprofit organizations that distributed grants to state

The bill being considered by the House would require the Chinese firm ByteDance to divest TikTok and other applications it owns within six months of the bill's enactment in order to avoid a nationwide ban. The legislation also creates a process that lets the executive branch prohibit access to other apps that pose a threat to national security.

CAPE TOWN, South Africa, March 12, (AP): South Africa's ruling African National Congress said Monday that six officials facing accusations of corruption have been included on its list of candidates for this year's election, bringing more scrutiny on a party that already has had its reputation badly damaged by graft.

Mbalula said every one of the approved candidates for the election, from Ramaphosa down, were the subjects of "rigorous" eligibility investigations, were interviewed by an ANC integrity commission and agreed to lifestyle audits as the ANC attempts to restore its credibility following the corruption-tainted era of Zuma.

Zuma led South Africa from 2009-2018 and is alleged to have overseen a period of widespread government graft that is estimated to have cost the country over \$20 billion.

He is currently on trial for corruption, although that case relates to him allegedly receiving bribes before he was president. The trial started in 2021 but Zuma has launched a series of legal actions that have delayed the case and no testimony has yet been

DAKAR, Senegal: Gueva Ba tried to reach Europe by boat 11 times from Morocco, failing each attempt. Then, in 2023, the former welder heard about a new route to the United States by flying to Nicaragua and making the rest of the journey illegally by land to Mexico's northern border.

"In Senegal, it's all over the streets - everyone's talking about Nicaragua, Nicaragua, Nicaragua," said Ba, who paid about 6 million CFA francs (\$10,000) to get to Nicaragua in July with stops in Morocco, Spain and El Salvador. "It's not something hidden."

Ba, 40, was deported from the US with 131 compatriots in September after two months in detention, but thousands of other Senegalese have gained a foothold in America. Many turn to savvy travel agents who know the route - touted on social media by those who've successfully settled in the US.

They are part of a surge in migration to the United States that is extraordinary for its size and scope, with more people from far-flung countries accounting for crossings at the border. And as with this route used by the Senegalese, more are figuring out plans, making payments, and seeking help via social networks, and apps like WhatsApp and TikTok.

Arrests for illegal crossings on the US border with Mexico reached record highs in December. January saw a drop for the month, but arrests have topped 6.4 million since January 2021. And Mexicans account for only about 1 of 4 arrests, with the others coming from more than 100 countries.

US authorities arrested Senegalese migrants 20,231 times for crossing the border illegally from July to December. That's a 10-fold increase from 2,049 arrests during the same period of 2022, according to U.S. Customs and Border Protection. Many cross in remote deserts of western Arizona, like Ba, and California.

Word of the Nicaragua route began spreading early last year in Dakar and took hold in May, said Abdoulave Doucouré, who owns a travel agency that sold about 1,200 tickets from Dakar to Nicaragua in the last three months of 2023, for the equivalent of several thousand dollars each.

"People didn't know about this route, but with social networks and the first migrants who took this route, the information quickly circulated among migrants," he said.

### Ramadan kicks off in much of Asia, a day after most of Middle East

The Muslim holy month of Ramadan, when the faithful fast from dawn to dusk, began at sunrise Tues-day in much of Asia, a day after many Muslims in the Middle East began their fasts.

In the Muslim lunar calendar, months begin only when the new moon is sighted, which can lead to variations of a day or two.

Middle Eastern nations including Saudi Arabia, Egypt, Syria, Sudan and the United Arab Emirates

declared the month would begin early Monday, but in the Asia-Pacific countries including Australia, Brunei, Indonesia, Malaysia and Singapore began Ramadan on Tuesday after failing to see the crescent moon the previous night. India, Pakistan and Bangladesh also began Ramadan on Tuesday, as did Iran and Jordan. During Ramadan, Muslims rerain from eating, drinking and smoking from sun-rise until sunset. Even a tiny sip of water or a puff

of smoke is enough to invalidate the fast. At night, family and friends gather and feast in a festive at-

The fasting is aimed at bringing the faithful closer to God and reminding them of the suffering of the poor. Muslims are expected to strictly observe daily prayers and engage in heightened religious contemplation. They are also urged to refrain from gossip, fighting or cursing during the holy month. (AP)

### Haiti's prime minister bows to pressure

PORT-AU-PRINCE, Haiti, March 12, (Agencies): Haitian Prime Minister Ariel Henry announced early Tuesday that he would resign once a transitional presidential council is created, bowing to international pressure to save the country overwhelmed by violent gangs that some experts say have unleashed a low-scale civil war.

Henry made the announcement hours after officials including Caribbean leaders and US Secretary of State Antony Blinken met in Jamaica to urgently discuss a solution to halt Haiti's spiraling crisis and agreed to a joint proposal to establish a transitional council.

### Installation

"The government that I'm running cannot remain insensitive in front of this situation. There is no sacrifice that is too big for our country," Henry said in a videotaped statement. "The government I'm running will remove itself immediately after the installation of

the council.' Earlier on Monday, Blinken announced an additional \$100 million to finance the deployment of a multinational force to Haiti. Blinken also announced another \$33 million in humanitarian aid and the creation of a joint proposal agreed on by Caribbean leaders and "all of the Haitian stakeholders to expedite a political transition" and create a "presidential college.'

Henry has been unable to enter Haiti because the violence closed its main international airports. He had arrived in Puerto Rico a week ago, after being barred from landing in the Dominican Republic, where officials said that he lacked a required flight plan. Dominican officials also closed the airspace to flights to and from Haiti.

It wasn't immediately clear who would be chosen to lead Haiti out of the crisis in which heavily armed gangs have burned police stations, attacked the main airport and raided two of the country's biggest prisons. The raids resulted in the release of more than 4.000 inmates.

Scores of people have been killed, and more than 15,000 are homeless after fleeing neighborhoods raided by gangs. Food and water are dwindling as stands and stores selling to impoverished Haitians run out of goods. The main port in Portau-Prince remains closed, stranding dozens of containers with critical supplies.

The urgent meeting in Jamaica was organized by Caricom, a regional trade bloc that has pressed for months for a transitional government in Haiti while violent protests in the country demanded Henry's resignation.

Guyana President Irfaan Ali said that the transitional council would have seven voting members and two

nonvoting ones.

Those with votes include the Pitit Desalin party, run by former senator and presidential candidate Moïse Jean-Charles, who is now an ally of Guy Philippe, a former rebel leader who led a successful 2004 coup and was recently released from a United States prison after pleading guilty to money laundering. Also with a vote is the EDE party of former prime minister Charles Joseph: the Fanmi Lavalas party; the December 21 coalition led by Henry; the Montana Accord group; and members of the private sector.

### **Transitional**

Before sharing details of the proposed transitional council, Ali said, "I want to pause and thank Prime Minister Henry for his service to Haiti," as Caribbean leaders and others clapped.

Henry served the longest single term as prime minister since Haiti's 1987 constitution was approved, a surprising feat for a politically unstable country with a constant turnover of premiers. He was sworn in as prime minister nearly two weeks after the July 7, 2021, assassination of President Jovenel Moïse.

Critics of Henry note he was never elected by the people, much less Parliament, since it remains nonexistent after the terms of the last remaining senators expired in January 2023, leaving Haiti



KUWAIT CITY, March Trade and Industry's efforts to streamline joint stock company transactions have yielded positive results, with closed joint stock companies experiencing a significant increase of 45% in 2023 compared to the same period in 2022. The establishment of closed joint stock companies rose from 20 in 2022 to 29 in 2023. In contrast, no public joint stock company was established during this period.

In May, the Ministry approved development measures, simplifying the transaction clearance cycle for joint-stock companies. The 17-step establishment cycle, previously taking 60 days, was streamlined, with 4 steps now completed within 24 hours through the Ministry's automated system, eliminating the need for physical visits

Commercial Licensing Department data revealed 119 new licenses issued to natural persons and addressed changes for 162 licenses of natural persons and 2 for legal persons in December 2023. Additionally, modifications were made to 27 activities for natural persons and 2 for legal persons, while 73 licenses for natural persons and 2 for legal persons were canceled. Furthermore, 12 licenses were issued to replace lost ones for legal

### Geopolitical risks drive oil prices up in Feb

# Oil futures 'surge' to November highs amid positive economic developments


rent futures rallied for a second consecutive month in **B** February, rising by more than 2% to \$83.6/bbl (+8.5% ytd) on the back of positive macroeconomic signals and continuing geopolitical tensions surrounding events in Gaza and the Red Sea. (Chart 1.) Stimulus measures undertaken by the Chinese government and expectations of an extension of OPEC+' supply cuts into Q2, which were announced on 3 March, also factored in oil's move to its highest level since November. Brent's backwardated price structure, where prices for prompt delivery are higher than prices for delivery in the future, widened to more than \$2.4/ bbl (M1-M3) by February's close, a four-month high, signaling increasing supply tightness. Local marker Kuwait Export Crude (KEC), meanwhile, closed the month at \$81.8/bbl (-2.7% m/m; +2.9% ytd).

In the futures markets, bullish speculator positioning increased substantially in February, with net length (the difference between the number of bullish "long" and bearish "short" contracts) reaching the highest in nearly a year at 276k contracts, before pulling back towards the end of the month. (Chart 2.) The ratio of longs to shorts was back up over 5 in mid-February, the most since last October. Furthermore, as a sign of renewed appetite for oil trades, Brent open interest (the total number of outstanding derivative contracts) rose in February to its highest level since last July.

Oil demand growth forecasts for 2024 remained relatively unchanged in February, though all the reporting agencies noted the likelihood of a softer pace of expansion this year compared to last. The International Energy Agency (IEA) reduced its projection by 20 kb/d to 1.2 mb/d, still a huge 1 mb/d below OPEC's estimate of 2.2 mb/d, which is by far the most bullish among forecasters. Non-OECD economies including China, India and Brazil are expected to drive the increase this year, accounting for 78% of total oil demand gains in 2024. OECD members, on the other hand, will likely post much slower growth amid a lackluster economic environment. For 2025, OPEC sees oil demand rising by a still strong 1.85 mb/d to 106.2 mb/d.

On the supply side, combined data from OPEC secondary sources and S&P Global show aggregate OPEC+ production (quota-bound members) falling 234 kb/d m/m to 34.4 mb/d in January. Among OPEC members, the steepest declines came from Kuwait (-109 kb/d) and Iraq (-98 kb/d) as both countries began implementing their voluntary cuts. Increased production in the UAE (+31 kb/d), in accordance with its new higher baseline, and in Saudi Arabia (+25 kb/d), slightly offset the losses. Of the 8 OPEC+ members taking part in the latest round of supply cuts, which on paper total 2.1 mb/d but which in practice will see only about 500 kb/d of fresh production cuts (the remainder is a combination of Saudi's 1 mb/d output cut rollover from mid-2023, Russia's 300 kb/d export cut rollover from 2023 and an additional Russian 200 kb/d refined product exports cut, while the UAE's 163 kb/d cut is offset by a 200 kb/d increase to its baseline) only Saudi Arabia was in perfect compliance in January, with Kazakhstan yet to move at all with its 82 kb/d cut. Meanwhile, quota-exempt Libya saw its output fall 135 kb/d to 1.0 mb/d in February following protests at Al-Sharara field earlier in the month and Iran recorded its first monthly production decline in a year (-5 kb/d to 3.16 mb/d). As was widely expected, OPEC+ announced on 3 March that these producers will extend their cuts through Q2, with Russia also signing up, but with a mix of production and export cuts totaling 471 kb/d rather than an outright 500 kb/d export cut as was the case in Q1. Russia intends to gradually deepen its production cut from 350 kb/d in April to 471 kb/d in June while simultaneously reducing its export cuts from the initial 121

kb/d in April. Outside of the OPEC+ group, the IEA reckons that output gains from the US, Canada, Brazil and Guyana will drive aggregate non-OPEC supply growth of 1.5





mb/d in 2024, which, while down on 2023's breakneck pace of 2.5 mb/d, will, nonetheless, outpace expected demand growth this year, leading to a surplus of supply over demand and potentially around 0.2 mb/d of oil inventory gains on average. The US Energy Information Administration (EIA) and OPEC do not share that view, with the former pegging non-OPEC supply growth in 2024 at around half the IEA's rate and OPEC at around 1.3 mb/d. We think non-OPEC supply growth could come in lower at about 1.1 mb/d, which, with OPEC+'s supply cut extension into Q2, could almost certainly leave the market short of barrels and facing an inventory drawdown in Q1-Q3 and for the year as a whole (-0.4 mb/d). Were OPEC+ to extend their voluntary cuts beyond Q2 then the oil market balance/stock change would tip further into a supply deficit/drawdown.

In the US, crude oil production returned in February to the record 13.3 mb/d level following January's winter storms when 1 mb/d of output was shut in. It is partly as a result of this and partly on expectations of lower drilling during the rest of the year that the EIA has reduced its crude oil output growth projections this year from 290 kb/d to just 170 kb/d, a sizeable drop from 2023's growth of 1.0 mb/d. The EIA expects output to generally flatline around 13.1 mb/d on average for 2024. For 2025, however, the agency expects production to rise to 13.5 mb/d (+400 kb/d) despite no significant change in the expectations of oil prices over the period. Meanwhile, active oil rigs increased to 506 (+1.2% ytd) by February's close, the highest level since September.

OPEC's policy path will likely be the focal point for markets this year. Having announced an extension to their Q1 supply cuts, the producer bloc will be watching carefully how oil demand fares through the months ahead and the trajectory of non-OPEC supply. Of comfort to OPEC+ will be that prices appear to have firmed with a price floor established at around the \$80/bbl level. We think that level will be a reasonable base case for 2024, though with a stronger upside risk developing than before.

### **KIPIC** extends bidding deadline for Al-Zour Refinery project

troleum Industries Company (KIPIC) has extended the bidding deadline for a contract to deliver alternative feeding systems for the hydrogen production unit at Al-Zour Refinery, reports Al-Qabas daily

The new deadline, set by KIPIC has been postponed to April 14 from the initial date of March 12. The project, with a budget of \$150 million and an estimated completion time of 36 months, has seen multiple deadline extensions since its inception last year, with the most recent extension moving the deadline from March 12 to April 14.

The project's scope encompasses engineering, procurement, and construction (EPC) work, as well as precommissioning, start-up, and quality testing phases.

MEED reported that several contractors have expressed interest in the project, including Hyundai Engineering & Construction, Larsen & Toubro Hydrocarbon Energy, Petrofac, Samsung Engineering, and SK Engineering and Contracting.

The EPC scope involves constructing Unit 38, Compression Facilities, steam generating units, and associated facilities, among other tasks.

In a separate development, Kuwait Oil Company has reopened applications for the design consultant contract for the heavy oil development program in the Lower Pars region. Interested companies are encouraged to apply online, with the deadline set for June 2,

The heavy oil project's first phase, awarded to a consortium led by Petrofac and Consolidated Contractors Company, was completed in 2019, with subsequent phases yet to commence. The project includes construction of central processing facilities, infrastructure, and pipeline packages, with phases two and three estimated at \$2 billion each.

# Resilient economy a key selling point

MOSCOW, March 12, (AP): Russians are finding a few imported staples, like fruit, coffee and olive oil, have shot way up in price. Most global brands have disappeared - or been reincarnated as Russian equivalents under new Kremlin-friendly ownership. A lot more Chinese cars are zipping around the streets. Those who want a particular luxury cosmetic may be out of luck.

Other than that, not much has changed economically for most people in President Vladimir Putin's Russia, more than two years after he sent troops into Ukraine.

That's despite the sweeping sanctions that have cut off much of Russia's trade with Europe, the U.S. and their allies.

That sense of stability is a key asset for Putin as he orchestrates his foreordained victory in the March 15-17 presidential election for a fifth, sixyear term

Inflation is higher than most people would like, at over 7% - above the central bank's goal of 4%. But unemployment is low, and the economy is expected to grow 2.6% this year, according to the International Monetary Fund, double the previous forecast. That's far above the 0.9% expansion predicted for Europe.

"There are difficulties, of course - they're connected with the general situation in the world," said Andrei Fedotov, 55, who was walking down the Tverskaya Street central shopping avenue a few blocks from the Kremlin. "We know this very well, but I believe we'll overcome them."

Higher prices "bother me, of course - like any consumer, I see them going up," said Fedotov, who works in education. "It's connected to the times that we're in, and which will pass."

Brand manager Irina Novikova, 39, was upbeat despite higher prices in stores: "More domestic products have appeared, more agricultural products. Yes, we all see that some goods have disappeared."

"Prices have gone up - if I used to buy three items for a certain price, now I buy one," she said, but added, "Go look for Russian products, the shops with Russian goods."

"Industry may have suffered, we know there have been some setbacks in that regard, but again, we're adjusting and we're reorienting our thinking, and we're starting to look to our Chinese friends," Novikova said.

Massive Russian spending for military equipment and hefty payments to volunteer soldiers are giving a strong boost to the economy. Government-subsidized mortgages are supporting apartment buyers in a powerful kick to the booming construction sector, as evidenced by several mammoth high-rise developments going up on the banks of the Moscow River.

Inflation rankles, but it's also nothing new. Russia became more self-sufficient in producing its own food after 2014, when it took over Ukraine's Crimea Peninsula and the resulting Western sanctions led the government to ban a broad range of food imports from Europe.

Planned government spending this year is roughly twice what it was in 2018. Yet the deficit remains manageable as taxes and oil revenue keep flowing in.

So-called parallel imports via third countries such as Georgia, Kazakhstan or Uzbekistan have allowed Russians with money to keep buying Western products - from sneakers to mobile phones and cars - from companies that no longer do business in Russia, usually for a significant markup.

A BMW SUV is still easily available, though at twice the price in Germany. IKEA shut its 17 Russian stores, but its furniture and home goods can be bought online - for a price.

Apple left, but an iPhone 15 Pro Max with 512 gigabytes sells for the ruble equivalent of \$1,950 on Russia's Wildberries retail site, about what the phone sells for in Germany.

# **US companies invest more** than bln **USD** in Philippines

KUALA LUMPUR, March 12, (KUNA): The United States Commerce Secretary Gina Raimondo said during an official visit to Manila on Monday that American companies are set to announce investments of more than a USD billion in the Philippines.

In a joint statement with her Filipino counterpart Alfredo Pascual, she mentioned that the investments will span areas like solar energy, electric vehicles and digitization.

She added that the American companies are keen to do business in the Philippines, saying that the US-Philip-

pine alliance has been preserved for 72 years and will remain loyal friends and partners in prosperity.

She pointed that the Philippines has a 73-year-old mutual defense treaty with the U.S., making it Washington's oldest treaty ally in the Asia-Pacific region.

Raimondo is heading a two-day trade and investment mission in the Philippines on behalf of the United States president Joe Biden, the delegation includes executives from 22 companies including United Airlines, Alphabet's Google, Visa, KKR Asia Pacific and Microsoft.

# **US inflation 'likely stayed' above Fed target last mth**

WASHINGTON, March 12, (AP): Consumer prices likely rose last month at a pace that would exceed the Federal Reserve's inflation target, underscoring why the Fed is being cautious as it considers when to cut interest rates and suggesting that inflation will remain a potent issue in this year's presidential election.

Yet Tuesday's report from the Labor Department may also show that underlying price pressures continue to ease, which would be an encouraging sign that inflation is gradually coming under control.

Economists have estimated that prices rose at a brisk 0.4% annual pace from January to February, up from a 0.3% rise the previous month, according to estimates compiled by FactSet. Compared with a year earlier, inflation is expected to have remained 3.1% in February, unchanged from January.

Higher gas costs likely drove much of last month's overall inflation. The average national pump price climbed from \$2.94 a gallon in mid-January to \$3.08 in mid-February, according to the Energy Department. Grocery prices are thought to have ticked up, too. And because of higher food and labor costs, restaurant prices are expected to have risen more than they did before the pandemic.

Excluding volatile food and energy costs, economists think "core" prices increased 0.3% from January to February, down from a hot 0.4% in the previous month. Compared with 12 months earlier, core prices are projected to have risen 3.7% in February, according to FactSet, down from 3.9% in January, and the smallest rise in nearly three years. Core inflation is watched especially closely because it typically provides a better read of where inflation is likely headed.

Overall inflation has plummeted from a peak of 9.1% in June 2022, though it's now easing more slowly than it did last spring and summer. The prices of many goods, from appliances to furniture to used cars, are actually falling after clogged supply chains during the pandemic had sent prices soaring higher. There are more new cars on dealer lots and electronics on store shelves.

By contrast, prices for restaurant meals, car repairs, hospital care and other services are still rising faster than they did before the pandemic. Car insurance has shot up nearly 21%, reflecting rising costs for auto repair and replacement. And after having sharply raised pay for nurses and other in-demand staff, hospitals are passing their higher wage costs on to patients in the form of higher prices.

Voter perceptions of inflation are sure to occupy a central place in this year's presidential election. Despite a healthy job market and a record-high stock market, polls show that many Americans blame President Joe Biden for the surge in consumer prices that began in 2021. Though inflationary pressures have significantly eased, average prices remain about 17% above where they stood three years ago.

In his State of the Union speech last week, Biden highlighted steps he has taken to reduce costs, like capping the price of insulin for Medicare patients. The president also criticized many large companies for engaging in "price gouging" and so-called "shrinkflation," in which a company shrinks the amount of product inside a package rather than raising the price.

"Too many corporations raise prices to pad their profits, charging more and more for less and less," Biden said.

# Fed cautious on eventual rate cuts

Fed Chair Jerome Powell signaled in congressional testimony last week that the central bank is getting closer to cutting rates. After meeting in January, Fed officials said in a statement that they needed "greater confidence" that inflation was steadily falling to their 2% target level. Since then, several of the Fed's policymakers have said they believe prices will keep declining. One reason, they suggested, is that consumers are increasingly pushing back against higher prices by seeking out cheaper alternatives.

"When we do get that confidence, and we're not far from it, it'll be appropriate to begin" reducing the Fed's benchmark rate, Powell told Congress last week.

Most economists expect the Fed's first rate cut to occur in June, though May is also possible. When the Fed cuts its benchmark rate, over time it reduces borrowing costs for mortgages, car loans, credit cards and business loans.

One factor that could keep inflation elevated is the still-healthy economy. Though most economists had expected a recession to occur last year, hiring and growth were strong and remain healthy. The economy expanded 2.5% last year and could grow at about the same pace in the first three months of

this year, according to the Federal Reserve's Atlanta branch.

Last week, the Labor Department said employers added a robust 275,000 jobs in February, the latest in a streak of solid hiring gains, and the unemployment rate stayed below 4% for the 25th straight month. That is the longest such streak since the 1960s.

Still, the unemployment rate rose from 3.7% to 3.9%, and wage growth slowed. Both trends could make the Fed feel more confident that the economy is cooling, which could help keep inflation falling and lead the central bank to begin cutting rates.

While Egyptian cities steal the spotlight, other cities elsewhere also feature on most-searched destinations from





Thomas, held her own statuette, for best picture, and did most of the talking as waves of well-wishers descended on the couple. They found a couch near the dance floor with their two children and were immediately met by a woman

at the signature Oscars after-party where end-of-awardseason decadence is the norm. Nolan did have the relax-it's-all-over vibe down pat. Billie Eilish soon strode by with two friends, her best original song Oscar slung in one arm. It was the lone Oscar won by the film that has stood opposite Oppen-

heimer since their simultaneous release in July, but it's already the second for Eilish at age 22. The Nolan clan left early, as the party was just get-





### Oscar-winning Miyazaki defies retirement plans

TOKYO, March 12, (AP): Ghibli, the Japanese studio that just won its second Oscar for feature animation for "The Boy and The Heron," hasn't said yet what it plans next.

But founder Hayao Miyazaki, who at 83 was the oldest director ever nominated in that category, won't rule out making another film, even if his next project is a short instead of a full-length



feature. Miyazaki, according to a longtime confidante, is a bit embarrassed about having pronounced a decade ago that he would no longer make

movies, citing his age. "He regrets having announced to the world he won't make another film," producer Toshio Suzuki, the co-founder of Studio Ghibli,

said after the latest win. When the Oscar was announced early Monday in Japan, a cheer went up in the tiny, humble building that houses the studio on

the fringes of sprawling Tokyo where dozens of invited media had crammed in to watch the ceremony on a big screen. It was a big day for Japanese filmmaking, with

"Godzilla Minus One" winning the award for best visual effects, marking Japan's first win in that cat-Japanese media heaped praise on both the Ghibli

and Godzilla films, noting that a double win at the Oscars hadn't happened for the country since 2009. An editorial Tuesday in the mass-circulation Yomiuri newspaper heralded "a new page in the history of Japanese filmmaking."

### **Backdrop**

Japan is also very much in the backdrop of "Oppenheimer," which won seven Oscars, including best picture. The biopic centers on an American scientist working on the atomic bomb. The film has yet to be released in Japan.

"Perfect Days," Wim Wenders' touching film about a sanitation worker, was nominated in the international feature film category but did not win. Japanese actor Koji Yakusho, who portrays a gentle and lonely man who takes photos and cares for plants, won best actor for his performance at Cannes in May last year.

"War is Over," which won for short animation, was inspired by Yoko Ono and John Lennon's music. Their son Sean, who co-wrote the film, gave a shout-out to his mother, who is Japanese, at the Academy Awards.

Miyazaki celebrated his Oscar win in private at his atelier and did not attend the studio event, Suzuki said. When asked why Miyazaki had shaved off his trademark beard, Suzuki said: "He doesn't want to look important."

Suzuki said he spent time analyzing why Ghibli's latest film was chosen, wondering if it was because of the Old Testament references in the storyline, which centers on a young boy dealing with his mother's illness and death, and the relationship he develops with a talking bird. Suzuki said Ghibli's hand-drawn illustrations were more effective than computer graphics in portraying the bird's metamorphosis.

Ghibli didn't do much publicity for the film, choosing instead a low-key approach for a work that was 10 years in the making and released after Miyazaki was supposedly retired.

LOS ANGELES: The Academy Awards were full of sure-things, long-awaited anointments and easy predictions. The "Oppenheimer" romp. **Ryan Gosling**'s Ken stealing the show. That put even more focus on the category that was hardest to call: best actress.

When Emma Stone was announced as the winner, a ceremony light on surprise got a genuine shock, perfectly illustrated by Stone's stunned expression. Stone's win, for her sensational performance in "Poor Things," was hard not to cast as a defeat for Lily Gladstone. The "Killers of the Flower Moon" actress had been picked by most prognosticators and - as everyone knew - history hung in the balance. Her win would have been the first for a Native American in the nearly century-long history of the Oscars.

It was a difficult to define result. It wasn't quite an upset - Stone's performance, equally favored, was too good to call it that. But it still stung, particularly for Native Americans watching across the country - a community that has watched Hollywood for most of its existence overlook its stories and performers. One thing you couldn't call it, though,

was a loss for Gladstone. "Lily Gladstone has undeniably left an indelible mark, breaking barriers and inspiring countless individuals with her remarkable presence and commitment to storytelling," cheered Blackfoot Confederacy, a Tribal Council for the Blackfoot Confederacy Nations of Kainai-Blood Tribe, Siksika, Peigan-Piikani and Aamskapi Pikuni.
"Her representation is a source of

pride for the Blackfoot Confederacy, The Osage Nation, and all indigenous communities, resonating far beyond the confines of a single ceremony.

Throughout awards season, Gladstone has been a figure of rare grace, speaking eloquently on behalf of her tribe, the Osage, Native American representation and Hollywood history. More than any

# 'Barbie' and 'Oppenheimer' bring audience bump

# Oscars ratings aren't quite blockbuster

LOS ANGELES, March 12, (AP): "Barbenheimer" brought a bump not a boom to Oscars ratings.

An estimated 19.5 million people watched Sunday night's 96th Academy Awards ceremony on ABC. That's the biggest number drawn by the telecast in four years.

But that upward trend comes from an all-time low during the pandemic, and is up just 4% from last year's estimated audience of 18.7 million, according to numbers released Monday by ABC.

The Academy experimented with scheduling this year's show an hour earlier, and for the first time in years had many nominations for huge hit movies that viewers had actually seen - "Barbie" and "Oppenheimer."

The viewership peaked in the final half hour, when the audience saw Ryan Gosling perform "I'm Just Ken" from "Barbie," saw Cillian Murphy win best actor, Christopher Nolan win best director for "Oppenheimer" and Al Pacino give the film the best picture Oscar in an odd presentation.

A major star, Emma Stone, also won best actress in the final stretch in the the night's most competitive race over Lily Gladstone, and near-

Last year's big Oscar winner, "Everything, Everywhere All at Once," was hardly a slouch at the box office, bringing in \$143 million globally. But that's nothing like the "Barbenheimer" juggernaut, with "Oppenheimer" approaching a billion global dollars and "Barbie" surpassing it.

### Ballooning

But they didn't yield the same ballooning numbers for the show that the Academy and ABC might have hoped for.

The Oscars did top the viewership of the most recent versions of other top awards shows, which have gone through similar slumps. Its 19.5 million outdrew the 16.9 million people who watched the Grammys in February, and the Golden Globes and Emmy Awards in January each had far fewer viewers.

For many years, the Academy

many cheering Gladstone's milestone

Awards were often the second most-watched television program of the year behind the Super Bowl. Until 2018, the Oscar telecast had never slipped below 30 million viewers, according to Nielsen records. The high-water mark was the 55 million people who watched Titanic" clean up in 1998.

From the 43.7 million who watched in 2014, viewership declined steadily to 26.5 million in 2018, then went back up to 29.6 million in 2019, and 23.6 million in 2020. The bottom fell out with the pandemic-diminished show in 2021, seen by 9.85 million. It began rebounding in 2022 - the year of the Slap - with 16.6 million.

The movies and their makers aren't entirely to blame. The generational shift to streaming and other video forms has gutted broadcast television viewership, and few live events other than the Super Bowl draw the sort of audiences they once did.

The Oscars led into the sitcom "Abbott Elementary," which had a series high in viewers with a 6.9 million. The episode had an Oscar tie-in, with Bradley Cooper, playing himself, getting roasted in a classroom after a long season of heavy Oscar campaigning.

"Lily Gladstone, you already won," **Peggy Flanagan**, **Minnesota**'s Lieuin the Blackfeet Nation, was the first Indigenous performer to win that award, tenant Governor and a member of the White Earth Band of Ojibwe, wrote for best actress in a drama - just one of the many "firsts" that she achieved leading up to the Oscars. She likewise on X. "You bring all of us into every room you enter. We see ourselves in made history at the Screen Actors Guild you every day - thank you for taking Awards, where she won best female actor in a leading role. Those wins - along with us along on this journey with you. We can dream bigger than we ever thought the devastating empathy and poise of her performance in "Killers of the Flower because of you.

Gladstone's SAG award was a big reason some expected her to win at the Oscars. It's the most predictive awards for acting prizes. All of the other SAG winners - Cillian Murphy, Da'Vine Joy Randolph, Robert Downey Jr. - won Sunday. In the two previous years, the SAG winners have exactly matched those at the Academy Awards. (AP)

But Stone also won at the BAFTAs and at the Globes, where "Poor Things" was slotted into the comedy or musical categories. At the Oscars, it was clear academy voters were more passionate about "Poor Things" than "Killers of the Flower Moon." "Poor Things" took home four awards, second most to "Oppenheimer," while "Killers of the Flower Moon" was shut out. Martin Scorsese could be seen

consoling Gladstone after the ceremony ended. The 81-year-old director knows something about Oscar disappointment. Scorsese, remarkably, has won only one Academy Awards (for directing "The Departed"), and he's sat through numerous ceremonies only to see his much-nominated films - including "Taxi Driver," "Gangs of New York," "The Wolf of Wall Street" and "The Irishman" - leave with nothing. His last two features have gone 0-for-20 at the Academy

Awards, easily a record. (AP)



KUWAIT CITY, March 12: In a recent interview with Dr. Rajesh Rajan, a senior cardiologist and esteemed figure in the field of cardiovascular health, we discussed the recommendations for patients with cardiovascular disease during Ramadan fasting.

During the interview, Dr. Rajan highlighted several important factors and therapies to consider for patients with cardiovascular conditions during Ramadan fasting. Patients are categorized into three risk levels: high risk, moderate risk, and low risk. High and moderate risk patients are advised against fasting, while low risk patients are permitted to fast.

1. Fasting-associated dehydration may lead electrolyte abnormalities, which could be life-threatening in patients with unstable arrhythmias, inherited arrhythmia syndromes (e.g. long QT or Brugada syndrome),

2. Dehydration is a risk factor for

hypotension, potentially causing syncope, especially in elderly patients with impaired baroreflexes. This risk may be exacerbated by dehydration or changes in medication dosing to accommodate fasting.

4. Ramadan fasting has been

shown to decrease blood pressure in individuals using diuretics for hypertension, without complications.

5. Sleep cycle and eating disturbances during Ramadan fasting may increase the incidence of atrial fibril-

6. Medication adjustments should be made cautiously, considering once-daily or long-acting formulations, and avoiding changes in established therapies if possible.

7. Patients with hypertension, coronary artery disease, or recent acute coronary syndrome should have their blood pressure, kidney function, and medications reviewed by healthcare providers before Ramadan fasting.

8. Patients with well-controlled blood pressure and who are compliant with medications are considered low-moderate risk for fasting.

9. Patients within a 6-week period of an acute coronary syndrome or cardiac surgery are advised not to

10. Patients with severe heart failure (LVEF ≤35%) or advanced heart failure are considered high and very high risk for fasting, respectively.

11. Patients with pacemakers are considered low-moderate risk if their device parameters are stable and they have no electrolyte abnormalities.

12. Patients with cardiac resynchronization therapy or implantable cardioverter defibrillators are considered at least high risk for fasting.

13. Pregnant patients with cardiovascular conditions should consult their specialist team regarding Ramadan fasting.

14. Patients with heart failure with reduced ejection fraction (HFrEF) who closely monitored their condition during Ramadan fasting did not experience worsening symptoms. Non-compliance with fluid restrictions and medications increased the risk of worsening symptoms.

15. Patients with Type 2 Diabetes or heart failure on Sodium-glucose cotransporter 2 inhibitors (SGLT2i) should be initiated at a low dose, in the evening, and at least one month before Ramadan for patients observing fasting.

16. Patients with long QT syn-

drome should carefully avoid dehy-

17. Patients with hypertrophic obstructive cardiomyopathy (HOCM) should remain well hydrated to reduce the occurrence of potentially life-threatening symptoms.

To ensure a safe fasting experience, the study recommends:

A. Medical evaluation before Ramadan.

B. Medication management and adjustment. C. Nutritional guidance and main-

taining a balanced diet. D. Engaging in light to moderate

physical activity. E. Regular monitoring of blood pressure, blood sugar levels, and

overall well-being.

### Court upholds town bylaw to ban anyone born in 21st century from buying tobacco

BROOKLINE, Mass., March 12, (AP): A Massachusetts town that adopted an unusual ordinance banning the sale of tobacco to anyone born in the 21st century is being looked at as a possible model for other cities and towns hoping to further clamp down on cigarettes and tobacco products.

The bylaw - the first of its kind in the country - was adopted by Brookline in 2020 and last week was upheld by the state's highest court, opening the door for other communities to adopt similar bans that will, decades from now, eventually bar all future generations

The rule, which bans the sale of tobacco to anyone born on or after Jan. 1, 2000, went into effect in 2021 in the

town of about 60,000 next to Boston. Under a Massachusetts law signed by former Republican Gov. Charlie Baker in 2018, anyone under the age of 21 is already barred from purchasing any tobacco product - including cigarettes, cigars and e-cigarettes - in the state.

Supporters of the Brookline measure point out that state law acknowledges the authority of local communities to enact their own measures to limit the sale of harmful products.

Critics of the Brookline law, including convenience store owners who rely on the sales of tobacco products for a significant portion of their income, disagreed however, arguing that the Brookline law conflicts with the 2018 state law which allows those over the age of 21 to purchase tobacco products - and would establish two sets of adults, one that could buy cigarettes and one that couldn't.

The Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court sided with Brookline, noting that cities and towns "have a lengthy history of regulating tobacco products to curb the well-known, adverse health effects of tobacco use.' "Importantly, state laws and local

ordinances and bylaws can and often do exist side by side," the court added. "This is particularly true of local ordibylaws regulating health, the importance of which we have long acknowledged.'

Peter Brennan, executive director of the New England Convenience Store and Energy Marketers Association, said the group is looking into possibly appealing the decision to the U.S. Supreme Court.

He noted that while the law targets tobacco, the rules for marijuana remain

"It's a question of how else can we demonize this product," Brennan said. "It's about trying to be a trendsetter, tying to be first in the nation.' Jon Hurst, president of the Retail-

ers of Massachusetts Association, also criticized the ruling, saying it could lead to a hodgepodge of rules,

# Bayer Leverkusen closing in on the Bundesliga title

BERLIN, March 12, (AP): Xabi Alonso doesn't yet dare speak of winning the Bundesliga but his team is playing like a champion inexorably closing in on the German title.

Bayer Leverkusen passed its latest test Sunday with a mature performance in a 2-0 win over Wolfsburg, three days after returning from Baku, Azerbaijan, where it came from two goals down to draw 2-2 at Qarabağ in the Europa League.

Leverkusen is unbeaten in 36 games across all competitions this season - a German record.

While capable of big wins like the 3-0 victory over Bayern Munich last month, Leverkusen overcame Wolfsburg with patience for its 21st win in the league.

It kept the team 10 points ahead of 11-time defending champion Bayern with nine rounds remain-

But Alonso is refusing to speak about the title just yet. "April," he replied Sunday when asked when it will be OK to

Bayern. Alonso started his coaching career in Madrid's youth setup before spending three years as a reserve team coach at Sociedad.

Always unhurried, Alonso's ethos has clearly made its way

through to the players.

He said: "We have a clear idea that when we have control, when we show patience, we play better. And that's when we have better results, better performances. That was the tendency this season, par-

ticularly here at home. "Normally we want to force the initiative. The players know when we want to play fast, when we have to play it short. I don't have a joystick on the bench to decide that. They have to decide, and when I see that the players make good de-

cisions, normally we play better." Alonso's success - Leverkusen was in the relegation zone when he took over in October 2022 - has boosted his appeal at Bayern and Liverpool, who are both in need of a new coach next season, and Madrid, which is no hurry to replace Carlo Ancelotti but knows the day

will come. Leverkusen CEO Fernando Carro is already prepared for Alonso's departure.

"We're happy that he's here, but Xabi Alonso is a puzzle piece. It's not like everything will fall apart when he's not here," Carro said in an interview with online broadcaster DAZN. "We have a top squad, we have a coaching staff, (sporting director) Simon Rolfes... Therefore, most of the people who are responsible for the success are here, independently of Xabi Alon-

Alonso has said he won't let the speculation over his future distract him. It would also be no surprise if he stayed at Leverkusen - he turned Borussia Mönchengladbach down when he was still at Sociedad because he felt he wasn't ready for the move.

Leverkusen has the best defense in the Bundesliga with just 16 goals conceded in 25 games, while only Bayern has scored more - thanks in part to the remarkable Harry Kane who is closing in on Robert Lewandowski's scoring record.

But Alonso's reluctance to talk about potentially winning the Bundesliga title is merited as Leverkusen has endured a number of painful near misses, finishing runner-up in 2011, 2002, 2000, 1999 and 1997.

Leverkusen also lost German Cup and Champions League finals

Only the club's older fans remember the German Cup win in 1993, or the UEFA Cup victory in

Granit Xhaka has played a big part in the team's success since arriving from Arsenal last summer, but the Swiss midfielder also knows what it's like to let victory slip after Manchester City overhauled the Gunners to win the Pre-

MUMBAl: India wicketkeeper Rishabh Pant has recovered from the serious injuries sustained in a car crash and can return to the Indian Premier League this month, India's cricket board said Tuesday.

Pant was involved in a road accident in northern India in December 2022, when the car he was driving overturned and caught fire.

"After undergoing an extensive 14-month rehab and recovery process, following a lifethreatening road mishap on December 30th, 2022, (Pant) has now been declared fit as a wicket-keeper batter for the upcoming (IPL)," the BCCI said on X, formerly known as Twitter. The lucrative IPL season starts on March 22 and Pant could make an eagerly-awaited return for Delhi Capitals, the side he captains, the following day in Mohali against Punjab

The 26-year-old Pant required reconstruction surgery on his right knee following the crash. He had a fractured wrist and ankle, as well as injuries to his head and back.

BCCI secretary Jay Shah said Pant could even be in contention for India's squad for the T20 World Cup in June.

"He is a big asset for us," Shah said. "If he can keep (wicket), he can play the World Cup. Let's see how he does in the IPL. A hard-hitting left hand batter, Pant has

scored five test centuries with a batting average of 43.67, including a century when batting at No. 7 against England in 2018, and a swashbuckling 159 early the following year In the T20 format he has struck three fifties

and has a fast-scoring strike rate of 126.37.

### Ratcliffe's investment in Man U cost club nearly \$44 mln in fees

MANCHESTER, England, March 12, (AP): Jim Ratcliffe's minority investment in Manchester United cost the club \$43.78 million in fees, according to financial figures released Tuesday. United's latest quarterly results also showed current gross debts of nearly \$1 billion.

Ratcliffe, the British billionaire, last month bought a 27.7% stake in the Premier League club - more than a year after American owners the Glazer family invited offers from potential buyers.

United's results stated an "exceptional" item of 9.6 million pounds (\$12.28 million) for "costs incurred in relation to the Group's strategic review and agreed sale" to Ratcliffe.

United said that was on top of a \$31.5 million fee to U.S. investment bank Raine Group, which oversaw the deal.

Ratcliffe paid \$1.3 billion for his minority stake and made an added investment of \$200 million. United has said Ratcliffe intends to invest a further \$100 million by the end of the year.

### Massa says he's suing F1 and FIA

SAO PAULO, March 12, (AP): Former driver Felipe Massa said he's filed a lawsuit in London against auto racing governing body the FIA, series owner Formula One Management and Bernie Ecclestone to try and claim the 2008 title.

Massa added on Monday he was also seeking a minimum of \$82 million in damages, a document obtained by The Associated Press showed. That amount included prize money he lost and other potential deals he would have obtained as a F1 champion.

Massa has claimed since last year he was the "rightful" 2008 champion due to the incident known as "Crashgate." The 42-year-old Brazilian, who never won the drivers' championship, was runner-up to Lewis Hamilton by one point.

Former Ferrari and Williams driver Massa said in a statement his case would be heard at the King's Bench Division of the High Court.

His decision came after months of preparatory steps that included his lawyers asking auto racing bodies to reply to his public allegations of a breach of contract.

"I always said I was going to fight until the end," Massa said in the statement. "Since the FIA and FOM decided not to do anything, we will seek to right this historical injustice in court. The matter is now for our lawyers and they are fully authorized to do whatever is necessary so justice in sport is served."

His allegations relate to the 2008 Singapore Grand Prix, where Nelson Piquet Jr. crashed deliberately to help then-Renault teammate Fernando Alonso win

the race. The Renault team was eventually punished but the results stood in the 15th race of 18 that year. Massa never got closer to the title.

Last year, former F1 boss Ecclestone said in an interview with website F1 Insider that he learned through the course of 2008 that Piquet Jr. crashed deliberately. He added he chose not to investigate the incident until the season ended, when it was

too late to change the standings. Piquet Jr.'s crash came when Massa was in front in Singapore. A safety car was brought in, which squandered his lead and gave Alonso a clear advantage as he was the only driver who had already made a pit stop to refuel. Massa went on to finish out of the points in 13th place after a calamitous pit stop, while Hamilton finished third in that race.

Massa's filing said he wants "a declaration that the FIA acted in breach of its own regulations in failing to investigate the circumstances of the crash promptly in 2008" and "a declaration that if the FIA had not acted in breach of its own regulations, it would have canceled or adjusted the results of the Singapore Grand Prix with the consequence that Mr Massa would have won the drivers' championship in 2008.

Team director Abdul Rahman Al-Mousa revealed that the delegation will embark on a training camp in Abu Dhabi, the Emirates, starting tomorrow, Thursday, and lasting until March 19. Following the camp, the team will head to Doha, Qatar, in preparation for their encounter with the Qatari team on March 21 as part of the initial group qualifiers. The team is

INDIAN WELLS, March 12, (AP): Luca Nardi used a combination of poise and power to stun his boyhood hero and top-seeded Novak Djokovic with a 6-4, 3-6, 6-3 win on in the third round of the BNP Paribas Open.

Nardi, who's ranked No. 123, closed out his huge upset over the No. 1 player in the rankings with an ace. The 20-year-old from Italy dropped his racket and brought his hands to his face almost in disbelief

before greeting Djokovic at the net. "This is a miracle," Nardi said in an interview after the match on the Tennis Channel. "I'm a 20-years-old guy, 100 in the world, and beating Novak. So,

Setting the tone early with his hardhitting shots, Nardi frustrated Djokovic all evening. There was a moment when Nardi was surprised by an "in" call and casually hit the ball back over the net. It resulted in a winner and led to Djokovic complaining to the official about a potential hindrance.

To think, Nardi was nearly on his way home. He got into the field as a "lucky loser," which is a player who stumbled on the final hurdle in qualifying but made it into the main draw as a replacement for an injured player who pulled out before the first round. In Nardi's case, he stepped in for No. 30 Tomas Martin Etcheverry and received a bye through the opening round.

He went on to become the lowestranked player to beat Djokovic in a Grand Slam or ATP Masters 1000 level event, surpassing No. 122 Kevin Anderson in 2008 in Miami.

Using a combination of aggressiveness and finesse, Nardi had Djokovic, the 24-time Grand Slam singles champion from Serbia he grew up watching, smiling and shaking his head at times in a mixture of surprise and shock.

Nardi was far from intimidated, ei-
