KUWAIT CITY, May 12, (KUNA): The Sultan of Oman Haitham bin Tariq and the accompanying delegation will arrive to the State of Kuwait, Monday, on a state visit where he would hold official round of talks with His Highness the Amir Sheikh Mishal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah.

Oman's Ambassador to Kuwait Dr. Saleh Al-Kharousi said the visit of Sultan Haitham bin Tariq to Kuwait stressed the deep-rooted bonds and close collaboration

between the wise leaderships of the two countries. Speaking to KUNA in a statement, Al-Kharousi added the visit would lead to positive results for the two

countries' peoples in all fields. His Highness the Amir Sheikh Mishal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah's visit to the Sultanate of Oman in February had key outcomes, as it was the first visit of His Highness the Amir to Oman since he came to office, the ambassador noted.

His Highness the Amir's visit came to materialize the strong desire and keenness between the two countries' leaderships to support their relations based on deeprooted and commonality, he said.

Al-Kharousi pointed to the directives of the two leaderships for high-level direct coordination between the two sides in multiple fields.

Kuwait takes part in Bahrain meeting

'Current global challenges need joint efforts to boost Arab-Arab cohesion'

MANAMA, May 12, (KUNA): Bahraini Minister of Finance and National Economy Minister Sheikh Salman bin Khalifa Al-Khalifa stated on Sunday that current global challenges require joint efforts to enhance economic and social integration in the region.

This came in a speech by Sheikh Salman bin Khalifa Al-Khalifa during his chairmanship of the opening of the preparatory meetings of the Arab League's Economic and Social Council for the 33rd

Arab Summit, which will be held in Bahrain next Thursday.

The Bahraini Finance Minister praised the efforts of Saudi Arabia during its chairmanship of the previous session of the council and expressed his gratitude to the Secretary-Gen-



eral of the League of Arab States (LĀS), Ahmad Aboul Gheit, and all the members of the General Secretariat for their efforts in preparing for the meeting.

He said that Bahrain's hosting of this meeting comes as an affirmation of the support and follow-up of the Bahraini Crown Prince Salman bin Hamad Al-Khalifa, and everything that would enhance Arab solidarity and the process of construction and development to achieve a prosperous and sustainable future for Arab countries.

He emphasized that the current challenges require joint efforts to enhance economic and social integration in the region through supporting infrastructure, transportation, energy, and food security projects that enhance our economic capabilities.

Sheikh Salman Al-Khalifa was confident that cooperation and enhancement of economic and social integration will achieve the aspirations of future generations towards prosperity and develop-

He added that based on Bahrain's steadfast support for important issues regarding Arab countries, Bahrain underlined the urgent and immediate need for intervention to deliver humanitarian aid to Gaza and the prevention of military expansion operations in order to preserve regional security, peace and stability.

He emphasized the importance of working with other Arab countries and international financial institutions and specialized organizations to overcome the humanitarian situation in Palestine and support peace in the Middle East by granting the Palestinian people their legitimate rights.



Time to clip wings of 'chaos'

What His Highness the Amir did, had to be done after some people went too far and the political game became boring and tiring, and dangerous for the stability of the nation, and even to its very existence, after street groups took control and imposed their bad parliamentary choices on us. Minutes after their victory was announced, they

challenged everyone, without exception, until it became important for leaders to take action to address these challenges and ensure that the democratic process is respected and upheld. It's also crucial for political repre-

sentatives to act responsibly and in the best interests of the people they serve, rather than pursuing personal gain or acting recklessly

We were, and still are, confident in the validity of the option of democratic rule, but the actions, words, and statements of a significant number of representatives demonstrated the extent of the recklessness that we would see, the amount of deception that they would follow, and the extent of the assault that they would reach on the symbols of the state and its stability. They are the ones against whom there are suspicions. All of this is in implementation of the desires of those who move them and aspire to what they are not qualified for, neither practically, nor morally or

administratively Finding a balance between democratic governance and stability can be challenging, but it's essential for the well-being of the country and its citizens. The recent election results and the behavior of certain political actors made everyone loyal to this country feel frightened. It was necessary to stop the danger with historic decisions that serve the public interest, by amending articles in the state's constitution for the good of the nation.

It was impossible to hand over the issue of this amendment and revision to a group led by their personal interests; or those subject to the pressures of the tribe and sect, and the pressures of the "parties" that contributed, materially and morally, to electing them to parliament, and guiding them to achieve their political goals, and on top of that, they are guided by their previous grudges, their previous history, and the way in

which they became citizens, and subsequently legislators, with no other concern than 'either you listen to us and fulfill our demands, or we will put brakes on the wheels of the ruling vehicle' thus obstructing the interests of citizens, paralyzing ministerial decisions, and turning the situation into an unbearable hell.

In such situations, it became necessary for the leadership to take bold steps, including constitutional amendments, to safeguard the public interest and maintain the security and stability of the homeland. While respecting democratic principles, it's crucial for leaders to prioritize the supreme interest of the nation above all else and to prevent destructive elements from obstructing progress and harming the interests of citizens.

Many people, including those who are classified as political and financial analysts, and also some who like to be called intellectuals, promote that the issues that are awaiting decision and decision-making, whether they are economic, social, financial, or urgent administrative appointments, which must have priority over other matters and issues, specifically opening files of forgers and citizenship issues.

This is a flawed and dangerous statement. The majority of those who would be responsible for making reform decisions and issuing legislation in the future are complaining of bad conduct and suspicions of tampering with their identity files, the identity of their relatives, and the national identity as a whole. So how is it permissible to assign these people a role in reforming the state's situation, and a role in making the most dangerous other decisions?

We all hope that the demands of those who are zealous of the interests of the state will be fulfilled, and that we will see all our ambitions for enlightenment and progress become a reality on the ground. I participated in all parliamentary elections, and I was, and still am, a champion and supporter of democracy and civil and political freedoms, but the predicament that some, aspiring and saboteurs, have led us to, has pushed us to strongly welcome the new decisions.

The Constitution, after more than 60 years, was in real need of amendment, and it was impossible to put the task of amendment in the hands of someone who could not be trusted, nor in his qualifications, nor in his loyalty, nor in the truth of his affiliation!

KUWAIT CITY, May 12, (KUNA): Chief of Staff of Kuwait's Armed Forces Air Marshal Bandar Al-Muzain said on Saturday that the Kuwaiti army is the country's "impenetrable defense and deterrent sword" against internal and external challenges.

Al-Muzain made the remarks while touring the 94th Saleh Al-Mohammad Mechanized Brigade, the Army General Staff said in a press release.

During the tour, the army chief listened to a briefing about tasks and duties carried out as part of the brigade's training plans and programs, along with existing cooperation and coordination with other military sectors.

Al-Muzain appreciated the high efficiency, capability and preparedness of the 94th Saleh Al-Mohammad Mechanized Brigade's staff, according to the release.

Cyber security

A delegation of the State of Kuwait discussed at a UN round table prospects of enhancing capacities in the realm of security technology and communication and strengthening cyber security. The Kuwaiti delegation, headed by President of the National Cyber Security Center Mohammad Boakri, took part in the high-level meetings during which the officials discussed with peers from other nations optimum means for enhancing cyber security and stimulating the international community to exert greater efforts at this level.

Boakri, during the round table talks at the UN headquarters, touched on governance and challenges facing the efforts to solidify cyber security in the State of Kuwait. The Kuwaiti delegation included the Deputy Foreign Minister for International Organizations Affairs Mohammad Al-Amiri and the Director of Information Technology at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Abdullah Al-Qadiri.

Strong partnerships

Minister of Foreign Affairs Abdullah Al-Yahya said Kuwait strongly appreciates its partnerships with neighboring and friendly countries, as part of the country's stable policies

towards regional and international events. In a statement to KUNA to Saturday, minister Al-Yahya noted that Kuwait is exerting great efforts to enhance its regional and leadership role in key issues.

The recent visits of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Meshal Al-Ahmad Al-Jaber Al-Sabah to friendly countries is part of Kuwait's deep historic ties with its partners, said the minister. He added that His Highness' visits included talks on key regional and international political topics, mainly the situation in Gaza. During the visits, His Highness Sheikh Meshal also signed several agreements and memorandums of understanding, related to economy and investment, Al-Yahya said.

Ramifications of Palestine crisis

Socioeconomic ramifications of Israeli aggression on Palestine and joint Arab developmental work were discussed during the preparatory socioeconomic council ministerial meeting for the 33rd Arab Summit in Manama. The meeting, taking place on Sunday, was chaired by Bahraini Minister of Finance Sheikh Salman bin Khalifah and attended by Kuwaiti delegation headed by Ambassador to Bahrain Sheikh Thamer Jaber Al-Sabah and Arab League Secretary General Ahmad Abulghiet.

The Ministers discussed agenda submitted by the high officials meeting that was held yesterday Saturday.

On the agenda is a host of proposed topics including; Developments on the Arab Free Trade Area, Arab customs union. youth and peace strategy as well as technical training and education strategy, water security and Arab tourism.

Project on new social contract: dialogue towards safe fair and sustainable future, mechanisms connecting social development establishment to League, and suggestion put for by League's secretariat on Arab vision 2045, are all tabled topics.

Several issues have been proposed by Gulf States including Saudi topics on health sector and cyber security. Bahrain memorandum on financial technology and digitalization, and UAE women economic empowerment suggestion.

New MoE app to help teachers address fingerprint issue KUWAIT CITY, May 12: In a new

development, educational sector sources have announced the launch of a mobile application called, 'Wajud-Tawajud', which allows fingerprint verification. Sources stated that the Informa-

tion Systems Department has fully developed the application, which is compatible with both iOS and Android devices. They affirmed that the ministry will make the application available for verifying the attendance of 'secondary control' staff in the scientific and literary departments, as well as religious studies.

Sources elaborated that the application is installed on mobile phones and works based on geographical location coordinates. It is linked to the

fingerprint attendance system via Bluetooth; thereby, enabling control officials to monitor the attendance of employees, ensure compliance with required work hours and track absenteeism, sources explained.

Sources stressed that the new application will help address the fingerprint issue faced by teachers assigned to do 'control' work, as they often face difficulties returning to their schools to verify their exit fin-

gerprint due to their 'control' duties. Sources revealed the application can be used to verify teachers' fingerprints when they are assigned certain tasks, attend workshops or participate in training sessions. These situations pose obstacles to

fingerprint verification, but the ap-

plication can help overcome the problem, sources added.

Meanwhile, as the end-of-year exams for middle school, grades 10 and 11 students are scheduled to begin next Wednesday, the Ministry of Education's competent authorities are still holding meetings to address preparations for the high school exams, reports Al-Jarida daily quoting senior educational sources.

Sources informed the daily that the ministry's officials took a decision to restrict the rotation of heads and members of the high school exam monitoring committees within their respective educational districts. They explained that external rotation was deemed unnecessary and caused confusion, indicating

that implementing regional rotation during final exams is challenging, particularly when the schools involved are far from the committee members' original schools. This has prompted many teachers to refrain from participating in previous years, sources revealed. Sources confirmed that acting Un-

dersecretary of the Ministry Mansour Al-Daihani has approved the rotation lists for the monitoring committees in secondary schools, as well as the control members' committees and the correction committees in the scientific and literary departments. Sources added the decisions regarding rotation, monitoring, correction and control committees will be issued in the

Workshop on cancer surgery begins

MoH staff to get 'good job' bonus

KUWAIT CITY, May 12: Minister of Health Dr. Ahmad Al-Awadhi has authorized Undersecretary of the ministry Dr. Abdul-Rahman Al-Mutairi to disburse the 2023 excellent job performance bonus to all eligible employees, reports Al-Anba daily.

The minister has approved the following criteria for disbursing the bonus:

■ The employee must have served for a minimum of one calendar year – from Jan 1, 2023 to Dec 31, 2023 – within the ministry.

■ The employee must hold a position under the general salary scale or appointed to a salary level.

■ The employee's actual working period during the calendar year must be distributed over 70 percent of the number of shift days for workers under this system or 180 actual work days for other categories.

■ The actual working period is calculated after excluding periods of interruption; such as suspension from work, secondment, missions, leaves of any kind or duration, official holidays and rest days. Sick leave during hospitalization is included.

■ The employee was not subjected to

disciplinary action in 2023. ■ The employee must not have taken

more than 15 days of sick leave in 2023, excluding hospitalization. According to the Civil Service Commis-

sion (CSC), the excellent job performance bonus for Ministry of Health employees will be as follows:

■ Doctors, consultants and department directors: KD1,500

■ Pharmacists, technicians and supervisors: KD1,300

■ Department heads and nursing staff: Employees and administrators: KD800

Assistant and technical assistant positions: KD400 In other news, Kuwait Cancer Control Center has announced that the 12th

Colorectal Cancer Surgery Workshop started on Sunday. The workshop, which is held in the cen-

ter's Oncology Surgery Department, is under the patronage of the health minister. It will run for five days with the participa-

tion of a select group of international doctors specializing in colorectal cancer surgeries. Oncology surgery consultant at the center

Turkey's support during invasion solidified ties; 'tourists feel safe'

"HIS Highness the Amir Sheikh Mishal Al-Ahmad expressed a strong desire to visit nations that stood by Kuwait during its ordeal of Iraqi occupation. Notably, Turkey's stance, led by the then President Turgut Ozal, was pivotal," columnist Abdul Mohsen Muhammad **Al-Husseini** wrote for **Al-Anba** daily.

"President Ozal firmly aligned Turkey with the international coalition supporting Kuwait's liberation, clos-

ing oil imports from Saddam's regime and opening Turkish military bases to coalition forces.

"This strategic move marked Turkey's commitment to the coalition against Saddam's

gression. "Subsequently, Turkish-Kuwaiti relations flourished, with Kuwait actively contributing to Turkey's economic landscape through various ventures, including the establishment of commercial banks and participation in infrastructure projects such as the construction of Kuwait Airport T2 by Limak Company.

"At a grassroots level, many Kuwaiti citizens developed a preference for Turkey as a tourist destination, with some even investing in properties across Turkish cities.

"This deepening bond between Kuwait and Turkey stems from the sense of security and hospitality Kuwaiti tourists experience during their visits.

"Against this backdrop of amicable ties, the visit of His Highness the Amir Sheikh Mishal Al-Ahmad to Turkey was significant, acknowledging Turkey's steadfast support during Kuwait's liberation.

"Previously, His Highness had visited other nations that played instrumental roles in Kuwait's liberation, such as Saudi Arabia and Egypt.

"These nations, along with the United States, Britain, France, and other coalition members, contributed significantly to Kuwait's liberation. His Highness expressed gratitude to these brotherly and friendly nations, particularly highlighting Turkey and President Turgut Ozal

for their resolute stance.
"In echoing His Highness's sentiments, it is imperative to ensure that the principles upheld at Abdullah Al-Salem Hall serve as a guiding beacon for our children and future generations, providing a noble example to follow."

"It has become clear from the first day of the start of the Zionist war of annihilation on the Gaza Strip, immediately after Operation Al-Aqsa Flood, that Israel has shown determination to expand the scope of this war into a comprehensive war targeting Iran and its agents. It began directly targeting Lebanese Hezbollah sites and Revolutionary Guard targets in Syria and Iraq,' columnist Dr Noura Saleh Al-Majim wrote for Al-Qabas daily.

"The scope of Israeli targeting developed quantitatively and qualitatively, to include intensifying operations against Hezbollah, and expanding the scope of assassinations of Hezbollah and Iranian Revolutionary Guard leaders. The peak of the targeting reached the attack on the Iranian consulate in Syria, which led to the killing of about seven leaders of the Iranian Revolutionary Guard which prompted Iran to respond to Israel directly, but also in a limited manner as a warning to Israel, and to save face as well.

"The question that must be raised here: Why is Israel aggressively seeking war with Iran? Is it also seeking to implicate Washington? In fact, Israel's insistence on war with Iran, specifically after the Al-Aqsa flood, is intertwined with many considerations, all of which drive -- from the perspective of the Zionist entity -- to the inevitability of war

with Iran. "The Tel Aviv government believes that Iran was the instigator and main planner of the Al-Aqsa Flood opera-tion, which put the Zionist entity in a state of defense for survival. Therefore, the consideration of revenge against Iran coupled with the consideration of defending survival is a strong incentive

for war with Iran.
"Perhaps it is the strongest incentive, as the defeat of Iran has become synonymous with the survival and security of Israel, especially since all resistance movements surrounding Israel, which pose a constant security threat to it, are considered by Israel to be supported by

"The Israeli government also believes that the Al-Aqsa flood constituted a golden opportunity to justify war on Iran and eliminate the nightmare of its nuclear program, especially in light of the ambiguity of negotiations to revive the nuclear agreement, which allows Iran to gain time to complete the process of fully enriching uranium and possessing the nuclear bomb.

"From another angle, the war with Iran will gain more legitimacy and continuity for the Netanyahu government, which faces a terrible dilemma as a result of the defeat of the Al-Aqsa flood and the failure to free the hostages held by Hamas.

"There are several fixed facts agreed upon traditionally or historically between Israel and the United States, which is the obligation to defend Israel's security, but in the event of a serious threat to it or exposure to aggression. Hence, it is also agreed upon, even if implicitly, that Israel will not be drawn into a war or major conflict, primarily defensive or deterrent, without Washington's permission. Israel must take into account Washington's interests first and foremost, if it insists on a war that is harmful to America's

"But it is clear that Israel has persisted in harassing Iran, which reached the point of attacking its consulate in Syria -- which is considered a declaration of war in international law -- that Israel has determined to drag Washington into a war with Iran. Israel certainly -- and it knows this -- cannot wage war with Iran alone.

"In principle -- and this is what Israel knows with certainty -- Washington absolutely refuses to engage in a war with Iran, nor even to get involved in any major war in the world, except for the possibility of war with China as a forced option if it annexes Taiwan by force. The irony here is that Iran is also absolutely unwilling to go to war with Washington. Both parties are fully aware of the disastrous repercussions of

"However, Washington now finds itself in very serious dilemmas. It has become difficult to convince Israel to stop the widespread regional escalation, including Israel's intention to storm Ra-

"In other words, Israel, led by its farright governments, has become outside American control in a large and unprecedented manner as well. As a result of this, tensions began two months ago between the two parties that relations had not witnessed before, as Secretary of State (Antony) Blinken visited Israel about 6 times to pressure Israel to stop the escalation. (ÛS President Joe) Biden put pressure on Israel to be satisfied with a limited response to Iran in response to its response.

"This is in addition to the explicit and implicit threat not to support Israel in a war with Iran, and to impose sanctions on Israel if it storms Rafah, and also to impose sanctions on Jewish settlers in the West Bank.

"In conclusion, Israel is striving to involve Washington in a war with Iran, which Washington rejects in its entirety. However, it is in a severe dilemma, as Israel has involved it in this war in a reckless escalation without Washington's permission, of course, and it will be forced to defend based on its eternal commitment to defending Israel.

"In our opinion, to avoid this terrible impasse, Washington must intensify its pressure on Israel through various means, accelerate the end of the war in Gaza, open a dialogue with Iran, and intensify its military presence in the region to deter this war in the first place.'

"Silence of Social Affairs ... Previously, I was surprised by the silence of the Ministry of Social Affairs regarding the violations in the Cooperatives Sector. I did not know the reason, but after attending the General Assembly of Kaifan Cooperative Society, it beca clear that a huge number of ministry officials came to supplement the number of attendees, not to monitor the progress of the General Assembly!" columnist Talal Al-Saeed wrote for Al-Sevassah

"When the discussion raged between the shareholders and the Board of Directors about the dismissal of five Kuwaiti employees from the cooperative on the pretext that they reached 60 years old and that this was the instruction of the ministry, a board member submitted a request to close the discussion and the ministry's representative did not object!

"How can a member of the Board of Directors request that the discussion be closed on a report to which he is a party and the subject of disagreement between shareholders and the board?

"What was worse was that the request was voted on even though it violates the Cooperatives Law. The ministry's representative remained silent. He neither objected nor lifted a finger. So, why was he there at all? He witnessed grave violations against the Cooperatives Law, but he did nothing. I imagine that what happened at the abovementioned General Assembly will happen to the rest of the cooperatives!

"The problem is that the government is still talking about the Kuwaitization of cooperatives to replace expatriate brothers with Kuwaitis, yet the result is that the Kuwaiti is fired and an expatriate brother is appointed in his place. The ministry is just watching. It does not even object to the attempt to 'confiscate' the opinion of the general assem-

blies in favor of the boards of directors! 'When the ministry relaxes its grip and the supervision of the Cooperative Sector on the progress of cooperative societies' work is relaxed, abuses increase, especially since the cooperatives manage millions of Kuwaiti dinars. Everyone knows that the closest path to illicit wealth these days is membership to the cooperatives' boards of directors, up to the point that competition has become more intense than competing for

membership in the National Assembly! "I wish the assistant undersecretary for cooperative affairs, undersecretary or minister would ask for the minutes of the General Assembly held recently, to know the extent of the violations and how they silence mouths, not to mention the partisan mobilization that has become the norm for passing the financial and administrative report despite

the transgressions! "In the end, we ask the minister: How could you allow your Kuwaiti brothers to be fired from their jobs and be replaced by expatriates when your government calls for the Kuwaitization of cooperatives. If you know, then this is a disaster, and if you do not know, the

disaster is greater... Good.' — Compiled by PFX Fernandes

1,950 kg of unfit food disposed off

KUWAIT CITY, May 12: The Public Authority for Food and Nutrition (PAFN) has been exerting tremendous efforts to ensure food security in all food establishments, reports Al-Anba daily. Inspection teams from the authority vis-

ited food establishments in Farwaniya Governorate, where they uncovered six violations; including keeping food materials in unhealthy conditions, opening a food establishment without a health license, workers handling food without health cards and employing workers without health cards.

These violations also led to the disposal of 1,950 kilograms of food found to be unfit for human consumption.

In Hawalli Governorate, inspectors found three violations of food workers without health certificates and three violations of employing workers without health certificates.

Furthermore, two establishments were ordered to close because they opened food facilities without obtaining health licenses from the authority. These establishments were also found to be non-compliant with public hygiene rules and regulations during work.

5 caught gambling

Prostitution in garb of health care at parlors

KUWAIT CITY, May 12: Personnel from the Protection of Public Morals sector of the Criminal Investigation Department have arrested 24 persons across different governorates for indulging in activities contrary to public morals, including engaging in vice and prostitution, reports Al-Jarida daily.

Additionally, several health institutes (massage parlors) found to be in violation were identified and referred to the appropriate authorities for further legal

The Ministry of Interior has urged the public to collaborate with law enforcement officials and promptly report any observed behaviors that contravene the law or offend public morals.

5 caught gambling: As part of ongoing efforts exerted by the security services to maintain security and fight corruption, personnel from the Criminal Security Sector of the Criminal Investigation Department (Farwaniya Governorate Investigation Department), have arrested five people after they were caught gambling red-handed, reports Al-Rai daily.

The daily added, the men were arrested in the suburb of Ardhiya.

The cause of the accident is not known.

The daily added, security and forensic personnel went to the site after an unidentified passer-by called the Operations Department of the Ministry of Interior. Initial reports say, the dead man is Egyptian. The corpse

has been referred to Forensics to determine the cause of death.

Deportation for thieves: Personnel from the Criminal Security Sector have arrested two people who appeared in a video clip circulated on some social media sites, stealing electricity ca-

bles, reports Al-Rai daily. The Public Relations and Security Media Department of the Ministry of Interior stated that the necessary legal measures are being taken against the accused, in preparation for their deportation from the country.

4 drug addicts held: The Public Security Sector in the Interior Ministry, represented by the Ahmadi Security Directorate, arrested four people in different locations for the possession of 2,811 psychotropic pills and six bags containing substances suspected to be narcotics and an undisclosed amount believed to be from selling drugs, reports Al-Seyas-These four individuals and the confiscated items were re-

ferred to the concerned authorities for legal action.

This is a continuation of the efforts of the ministry in combating drugs and psychotropic substances, as well as arresting violators and those wanted by law.

Ex-MP's secretary jailed for 5 yrs in false pledges

KUWAIT CITY, May 12: The Court of Cassation upheld the ruling of a lower court to imprison a female citizen who works as a secretary to a former MP for five years with hard labor and fined her KD21,000 for committing fraud.

The defendant deceived citizens and Bedouns by promising to give them Amiri Diwan homes, citizenship, farms, livestock pens and chalets. She falsified the logos of the Amiri Diwan, Council of Ministers and National Assembly, through which she obtained KD 43,000 from the victims.

When the victims filed complaints, it was discovered that she tampered with the logos through the student service shops.

'Syringe' teacher gets bail: The detention renewal judge released on KD50 bail the female Syrian teacher accused of injecting a student with a needle that she obtained from the school clinic to intimidate the students and control the class-The teacher's lawyer, Attorney Abdul Mohsen Al-Qattan, stated that after the issuance of the decision to release his cli-

ent, all accounts on social media sites that abused her will be legally pursued. Al-Qattan explained that his client was in the classroom as a substitute for her colleague. She intended to use the needle to control the unruly students in the classroom, but she did

not inject anyone with it as proven in the results of investiga-

tions, he clarified.

One hurt in 'chabra' fight: Two Lebanese men engaged in a fistfight at Vegetable Market (chabra) in Sulaibiya, and one

of them sustained multiple injuries. According to a security source, the two men had a heated argument, which escalated into a fistfight. One of them got injuries in his hand and other parts of the body. The injured submitted a medical certificate detailing the injuries he sustained, when he filed a case against the perpetrator, the source


Parents can use the application to view their children's academic certificates, check attendance records, download the medical and transfer forms, change the student's account number in the teams program, and access other services.

Council for Planning and Development and the Kuwait Direct Investment Promotion Authority, reports Al-Jarida daily.



UK knife crime rise leads to crackdown

LONDON, May 12, (AP): A familiar horror reached Pooja Kanda first on social media: There had been a sword attack in London. And then Kanda, who was home alone at the time, saw a detail she dreaded and knew all too well.

A man with a sword had killed a 14-year-old boy who was walking to school. Two years ago, her 16-year-old son, Ronan, was killed by two swordwielding schoolmates while walking to a neighbor's to borrow a PlayStation controller.

"It took me back," Kanda, who lives near Birmingham, said about Daniel Anjorin's April 30 killing in an attack in London's Hainault district that also wounded four people. "It's painful to see that this has happened

all over again. In parts of the world that ban or strictly regulate

gun ownership, including Britain and much of the rest of Europe, knives and other types of blades are often the weapons of choice used in crimes. Many end up in the hands of children, as they can be cheap and easy

Although the number of fatal stabbings has mostly held steady in England and Wales over the past 10 years, headline-grabbing attacks and an overall rise in knife crime have stoked anxieties and led to calls for the government

Jumped

"Knife-enabled" crime - in which knives were used to commit crimes or someone was caught illegally possessing one - rose 7% in England and Wales last year," the government said last month, noting some localities were not included. In London, such crimes jumped 20%. The other two UK countries, Scotland and Northern Ireland, keep their own statistics.

With knives so readily available, there's only so much that can be done. Of the 244 fatal stabbings in England and Wales in the 12 months ending with March 2023 - the most recent figures available - 101 were committed with kitchen knives, far surpassing any other type of blade, according to the Office of National Statistics

But the uptick in knife crime and a steady drumbeat of shocking attacks, including those that killed Ronan Kanda, Daniel Anjorin and three people in Notting-

ham last year, has pushed the issue to the forefront.
"It seems like every day something like this is reported in the press," Sanjoy O'Malley-Kumar, whose 19-year-old daughter Grace O'Malley-Kumar was among the Nottingham victims, said on "Good Morn-

ing Britain" after the recent attack in London. In last week's local elections, candidates debated policies such as stop-and-search. Even movie star **Idris Elba** has weighed in.

"I can pick up a phone right now, type in knives and I'll get inundated with adverts for them," the Londonborn star of "The Wire" and "Luther" said during a protest in January.

Fire in Warsaw mall: A fire broke out on Sunday morning in a vast shopping center housing 1,400 shops and service outlets in the Bialoleka district in

Poland's capital. The fire brigade said more than 80% of The Mar ywilska 44 shopping complex was on fire, and 50 teams, including chemical and environmental rescue specialists, were carrying out rescue operations.

A police spokesperson told the news agency PAP there were no injuries reported. Authorities also sent a text message warning Warsaw residents about the fire and telling them to stay home with the windows closed. Footage aired by private broadcaster TVN24 showed thick black smoke rising over the area.

Thousands of civilians flee Ukraine: Thousands more civilians have fled Russia's renewed ground offensive in Ukraine's northeast that has targeted towns and villages with a barrage of artillery and mortar fire, officials said Sunday.

The intense battles have forced at least one Ukrainian unit to withdraw in the Kharkiv region, capitulating more land to Russian forces across less defended settlements in the so-called contested "gray zone" along the Russian border.

By Sunday afternoon, the town of Vovchansk, with a prewar population of 17,000, emerged as a focal point in the battle. Volodymyr Tymoshko, the head of the Kharkiv regional police, said Russian forces were in the outskirts of the town and approaching from three directions. A Russian tank was spotted along a major road leading to the town, Tymoshko said, illustrating Moscow's confidence to deploy heavy weaponry.

Meanwhile, a 10-story apartment block collapsed in the Russian city of Belgorod, near the border, injuring at least 19 people. Russian authorities said the building collapsed following Ukrainian shelling. Ukraine has not commented on the incident.

Lithuanians vote: Lithuanians are casting votes in a presidential election on Sunday at a time when Russian gains on the battlefield in Ukraine are fueling greater fears about Moscow's intentions, particularly

in the strategically important Baltic region. The popular incumbent, Gitanas Nausuda, is favored to win another five-year term in office. But there are eight candidates running in all, making it difficult for him or any other candidate to muster the 50% of the votes needed to win outright on Sunday. In that

case, a runoff will be held on May 26. Polls opened at 7 a.m. and close 8 pm (1700 GMT). Results are expected late Sunday night.

The president's main tasks in Lithuania's political system are overseeing foreign and security policy, and acting as the supreme commander of the armed forces.

Catalans vote: Catalonia is holding a regional election on Sunday whose outcome will reverberate in Spain's national politics.

The ballot will be a test both for the strength of the separatist movement in the wealthy northeastern part of Spain and for the policies of Prime Minister Pedro **Sánchez.** More than 5.7 million voters are eligible to choose lawmakers for the regional parliament based in Barcelona.

Separatists have held the regional government for more than a decade. But polling and a national election in July show that support for secession has shrunk somewhat since former regional president Carles Puigdemont led an illegal - and futile - breakaway bid in 2017.

Canada arrests Indian nat'l: Canadian police have arrested a fourth Indian national related to last year's murder of sikh leader Hardeep Singh Nijjar, local media reported

Saturday.
Amandeep Singh, who had already been in custody in Ontario for unrelated firearms charges, has been charged with first-degree murder and conspiracy to commit murder, Canada's Integrated Homicide Investigation Team announced Saturday afternoon, CTV News reported. The 22-year-old joined three other Indian nationals in their twenties, namely Karan Brar, Kamalpreet Singh and Karanpreet Singh, who are facing the same charges in connection to Nijjar's killing, said the report.
On June 18, 2023, Nijjar was assassinated

outside the Guru Nanak sikh Gurdwara temple in Surrey, Canada's British Columbia. Since then, the sikh community in Canada has been exerting pressure on the Canadian government for a probe.

India has denied the allegations. Canada and India then engaged in tit-for-tat diplomatic expulsions. (Xinhua)

Blaze evacuates thousands: Canadian authorities are urging all remaining residents in the northeastern part of the province of British Columbia to leave immediately, despite improving weather conditions, after thousands have already been evacuated due to a fast-growing wildfire.

The blaze, which started Friday, almost

doubled in size the following day, reaching about 17 square kilometers (4,200 acres). BC Wildfire Service maps showed the fire burning just a few kilometers (miles) west of Fort Nelson's city limits.

Online footage shared by locals showed thick plumes of smoke rising high into the sky with houses in the foreground. In some photos, haze seemed to cover wide areas.

.He said the Parker Lake fire is one of three major wildfires near Fort Nelson, located in the far northeastern corner of British Columbia, about 1,600 kilometers (994 miles) from Vancouver. (AP)

Dems nominate Murphy for third term

Trump blames Biden for criminal charges

WILDWOOD, NJ, May 12, (AP): Sandwiched between his appearances in court, Donald Trump headed on Saturday to the Jersey Shore, where he repeatedly blamed President Joe Biden for the criminal charges he's facing as the presumptive nominees prepare to face off in the November election and called his New York hush money case "a Biden show trial."

Blasting the Democratic president, Trump before a crowd of tens of thousands repeatedly characterized the cases against him as politically motivated and timed to harm his ability to campaign.

"He's not a smart man," Trump said of Biden. "I talk about him differently now because now the gloves are off.'

Trump, the presumptive Republican presidential nominee, drew what his team called a "mega crowd" to a Saturday evening rally in the southern New Jersey resort town of Wildwood, 150 miles (241 kilometers) south of the New York City courthouse where he has been forced to spend most weekdays sitting silently through his felony hush money trial.

Lisa Fagan, spokesperson for the city of Wildwood, told The Associated Press that she estimated a crowd of between 80,000 and 100,000 attendees, based off her own observations on the scene Saturday, having seen "dozens" of other events in the same space.

High-level

Trump was joined on stage by several high-level endorsers including North Dakota Gov Doug Burgum and NFL Hall of Fame linebacker Lawrence Taylor, who is still listed as a registered offender after pleading guilty in New York in 2011 to misdemeanor criminal charges of sexual misconduct.

The beachfront gathering, described by Rep Jeff Van Drew, R-N.J., as the largest political gathering in state history, was designed to serve as a show of force at a critical moment for Trump, who is facing dozens of felony charges in four separate criminal cases with the election less than six months

On Saturday, Trump posited that even those whom he accuses of politically motivated prosecutions didn't bring every case they could have, pointing to the boosts his campaign has sustained with each wave of charges.

"I heard they were going to do a couple of other things and they said from Washington ... 'we're indicting him into the White House,'" Trump said. "They said, 'Don't do it.""

While Trump seized on his legal woes Saturday, a judge's gag order and the threat of jail - limit Trump's ability to comment publicly on witnesses, jurors and some others connected to the New York trial, which is expected to consume much of the month. The judge in the case already has fined Trump \$9,000 for violating the order and warned that jail could follow if he doesn't comply.

The order doesn't include references to Judge Juan M. Merchan, whom

Trump called "highly conflicted" or District Attorney Alvin Bragg, both of whom Trump said are "doing the bidding for crooked Joe Biden.

Trump's responsibilities as a defendant have limited his ability to win over voters on the campaign trail.

Biden, meanwhile, opened his weekend with a series of fundraising events on the West Coast.

Menendez faces corruption trial: For the second time in a decade, US Sen Bob Menendez faces a corruption trial Monday with his political career and freedom on the line in a criminal case that already has forced him out of one of the most powerful posts in Congress.

The 70-year-old New Jersey Democrat and his wife are accused of accepting bribes from three wealthy businessmen in his home state and performing a variety of favors in return, including meddling in criminal investigations and taking actions benefitting

the governments of Egypt and Qatar. Menendez's lawyers say he stayed within the rules and did nothing illegal. He has optimistically spoken about mounting a reelection campaign the summer if he is acquitted.

But even if he escapes without a conviction, as he did in a previous corruption prosecution in 2017, the damage done to his reputation could make a political comeback next to impossible.

'Chad needs food aid'

Sudan's army fends off attack by group

CAIRO, May 12, (Agencies): Sudan's military and allied armed groups have staved off an attack by a paramilitary group and Arab militias on a major city in the western region of Darfur, officials and residents said

The attack on Friday was the latest by the Arabdominated Rapid Support Forces against el-Fasher, the provincial capital of North Darfur province, where hundreds of thousands of people are sheltering, many of them having fled fighting elsewhere in Darfur.

The RSF, which has been at war with the military for more than a year, has built forces up in recent months to wrestle control of el-Fasher, the last city that is still held by the military in the sprawling Darfur Sudan's conflict began in

April last year when soaring tensions between the leaders of the military and the RSF exploded into open fighting in the capital, Khartoum and elsewhere in the country.

The conflict wrecked the country and pushed its population to the brink of famine. It killed more than 14,000 people and wounded thousands more amid reports of widespread sexual violence and other

atrocities that rights groups say amount to war crimes and crimes against humanity.

Darfur witnessed some of the worst atrocities in the war, with the RSF taking control of many cities and towns across the region. Human Rights Watch said in a report last week that RSF attacks constituted a campaign of ethnic cleansing against the region's non-Arab population.

Clashed

The RSF and their allies launched the attack on el-Fasher's eastern side early Friday and clashed with military forces and other armed groups defending the city, said resident Amany Mohamed. She said the mil-

itary and allied forces have repelled the attack.
"Yesterday was a very difficult day," she said over the phone on Saturday. "There were fierce clashes that lasted for six hours."

Another resident and an activist, Ibtisam al-Doum, fled with her family to a school-turned-shelter on the southern side of the city during heavy fighting on Friday. She said she saw hundreds of people escaping on foot to safer areas.

"The situation is catastrophic. We don't know when this will end," she said, speaking from the Jiser al-Ji-nan shelter. "What's happening is senseless."

The military-led camp and the RSF blamed each other for initiating Friday's fighting.

Local media reported heavy clashes in parts of the city including its power planet. Footage on social media platforms showed army troops and allied forces. dia platforms showed army troops and allied forces celebrating and captured fighters in RSF uniform being paraded in the streets.

Intensifying

"Reports of intensifying clashes in the city are deeply alarming," **Martin Griffiths**, the United Nations' relief chief, wrote on X and called for warning parties to de-escalate. "The people of Darfur need more food, not more fighting," he said.

The International Organization for Migration said the military launched airstrikes Saturday on the RSF positions in the northern and eastern parts of el-Fasher. It said Friday's fighting had forced about 170 households, or about 800 people, from their homes.

The United Nations last month said the RSF had encircled the city and warned an attack would have "devastating consequences" on its 800,000 people.

The RSF and allied Arab militias have launched a series of attacks el-Fasher and its surroundings in recent weeks, taking several villages on the northern

Such attacks "resulted in horrific reports of violence, including sexual violence, children injured and killed, homes set on fire and destruction of critical civilian supplies and infrastructure," Catherine Russell, executive director of UNICEF, said earlier this month.

"The fighting and growing fear of ethnically motivated violence has driven many families to overcrowded displacement camps such as Zamzam camp and informal gathering sites in and around el-Fasher city," she said.

UNITED NATIONS: Host to 500,000 refugees from neighboring Sudan, Chad needs food security and nutrition aid for one-third of its own 18 million population, UN humanitarians said on Friday.

The UN Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (OCHA) said the situation across the nation is being exacerbated by climate change, insecurity and the rise in food and fuel prices.

"Since March, the country is also facing torrential rains and floods in the south," OCHA said, adding that the refugees have significantly strained the humanitarian situation in the east of the country, and attacks by non-state armed groups in the Lake Chad Basin are driving further displacement.

The UN agency said that a UN-backed analysis found that 2.4 million people are currently food insecure in the country, 300,000 of whom are severely food insecure. If no substantive assistance is provided, this number could grow during the lean season to 3.3

HARARE: The United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) has called for an increase in child-centered climate investments to reduce the risk of shocks caused by climate change on children in the country.


With Zimbabwe currently facing the effects of climate-induced El Nino, many children in the country, among other vulnerable groups, are exposed to the impacts of the drought, UNICEF said in a statement

"We are launching a petition to urge government entities, development partners, and the private sector to prioritize children in their climate investments. We are also calling for more funding of climate resilient programs to ensure continued access to health, education, water and sanitation services, nutrition, and child protection services, and for programs to strengthen the resilience of households to deal with the climaterelated emergencies," UNICEF said.

The UN agency noted that Zimbabwe's children have not been spared from the risks posed by climate change-induced events, with the country ranking high risk in the 2021 UNICEF Children's Climate Risk In-

Ecuador shooting kills 8: A shooting attack during a birthday party at a bar in Ecuador on Saturday left eight people dead, police said, as the country experiences an escalating wave of gang-fueled

It was unclear if the attack in the coastal province of Santa Elena was directed at the person whose was holding the celebration.

Local police said the attackers rode up in a taxi and two motorcycles. They opened fire at the bar in the town of Chanduy, 185 miles (300 kilometers) southwest of Quito. Some of the victims were found outside the bar. The victims included five men and

three women and none of the victims had criminal records, police said. Santa Elena has become one of Ecuador's most violent regions, in part because it has three ports. Seaports are often used to smuggle drugs.

Local gangs, which in some cases work with Mexican cartels, have caused homicides to increase significantly in recent years.

Ecuador saw at least 7,600 killings in 2023, up from about 4,400 in 2022. So far this year, there have been about 1,875 homicides in Ecuador. Ecuador's president is **Daniel Noboa**. (AP)

West Java province bus crash kills 11

Flash floods hit Indonesia; fifteen killed

PADANG, Indonesia, May 12, (Agencies): Heavy rains and torrents of cold lava and mud flowing down a volcano's slopes on Indonesia's Sumatra island triggered flash floods that killed at least 15 people and injured several others, officials said Sunday.

Monsoon rains and a major mudslide from a cold lava flow on Mount Marapi caused a river to breach its banks and tear through mountainside villages in Agam and Tanah Datar districts in West Sumatra province just before midnight on Saturday. The floods swept away people and submerged more than 100 houses and buildings, National Disaster Management Agency spokesperson Abdul Muhari said.

Cold lava, also known as lahar, is a mixture of volcanic material and pebbles that flow down a volcano's slopes

By Sunday, rescuers had pulled out 11 bodies in the worst-hit village of Canduang and recovered four other bodies in the neighboring village of Sungai Pua, Muhari said.

The agency said in a statement that least seven villagers were injured by the flash floods, and rescuers were searching for other possible victims. It said 60 people had fled to temporary government shelters.

The disaster came just two months after heavy rains triggered flash floods and a landslide in West Sumatra's Pesisir Selatan and Padang Pariaman districts, killing at least 21 people and

leaving five others missing.

The 2,885-meter (9,465-foot) Mount Marapi erupted late last year killing 23 climbers who were caught by a surprise weekend eruption. The volcano has stayed at the third highest of four alert levels since 2011, indicating above-normal volcanic activity under which climbers and villagers must stay more than 3 kilometers (1.8 miles) from the peak, according to Indonesia's Center for Volcanology and Geological Disaster Mitigation.

Marapi is known for sudden eruptions that are difficult to predict because the source is shallow and near the peak, and its eruptions are not caused by a deep movement of magma, which sets off tremors that register on seismic monitors.

PHNOM PENH, Cambodia, May 12, (AP): The leader of a recently formed Cambodian opposition party has been charged with inciting social disorder, his lawyer said Saturday, in the third major legal action this month targeting critics of the government of Prime Minister Hun Manet,

Sun Chanthy of the Nation Power Party, established late last year, was formally charged Friday by the Phnom Penh Municipal Court and sent to pre-trial detention in the northwestern province of Pursat, according to Choung Chou Ngy. He said his client could be sentenced to six months to two years in prison if convicted, and that on Monday he will seek his release on bail.

Cambodia's government has long been accused of using the judicial system to persecute critics and political opponents. The government insists it promotes the rule of law under an electoral democracy, but political parties seen as mounting strong challenges to the ruling Cambodian People's Party have been dissolved by the courts or had their leaders jailed or harassed.

Furthermore, the Bank launched a series of new and uplifted products and services, of which included the unique cashback credit card proposition and increase in affluent elite and youth segments. Commenting on this success, Al Sumait said, "As we reflect on our accomplishments in Q1 2024, we remain committed to investing in the growth and development of our workforce."

Financial Performance On his part, Soonawalla commented, "Our financial performance shows significant enhancements in profitability, efficiency, asset quality, and strong capital position. We have made a good beginning and, at this stage, remain optimistic about our performance for the remainder of the year.

In terms of operational performance, our operating income has reached KD 51.9 million an increase of 21%, while our Operating Profit of KD 27.8 million has increased by 25%. With regards to asset quality, Non-performing Loan Ratio stood at 1.34%, while the Loan Loss Coverage Ratio was at 462%, reflecting ABK's prudent provisioning quality and strong credit metrics. Furthermore, it currently holds KD 223 million of provisions in excess of IFRS requirements, providing adequate protection against downside

Soonawalla shed light on the fact that the Group continues to improve on its operational efficiency, with a Net Interest Margin of 2.3% and an Operating Profit to average assets ratio of 1.74% reflecting the Group's strong performance and greater emphasis on profitability. Additionally, Return on Average Equity reached 9.6%, a 60% increase compared to the same period

He added that the Group's Total

Interest Income reached KD 116.2 million, marking a substantial increase of KD 20.4 million or 21% compared to the same period in 2023. Soonawalla claimed that this growth can be largely attributed to higher asset levels and a more favorable interest rate environment. During the same period, the Group's interest expense increased by 24% to KD 79.2 million as deposits got repriced at a higher rate in line with interest rate hikes during 2023.

Soonawalla further discussed that the Group's Assets reached KD 6.5 billion, a 7.4% noticeable increase, and its loan portfolio grew by 6% to KD 4.3 billion, reflecting a strong and robust balance sheet. Additionally, Total Deposits amounted to KD 3.9 billion, accounting for 66.1% of Total Liabilities. Meanwhile, the liquidity position remains robust, with a Net Stable Funding Ratio of 113% and a Liquidity Coverage Ratio of 260%, well above regulatory requirements.

The Group CFO also discussed the important factors impacting changes in income, margins, and costs, highlighting that the total Operating Income has experienced a notable 21%.

Furthermore, fees and commissions made a significant contribution to earnings, with a noticeable growth of 45%, amounting to KD 11.1 million in Q1 2024. Soonawalla disclosed that the Group's fees and commissions come from a variety of sources across different regions and business sectors, with the majority stemming from core banking operations.

Economic Indicators

In his part, Jawad said, "Global recovery shows elasticity once again, changing by region with a baseline forecast for the world economy to continue growing at the same pace as last year by 3.2% according to the IMF. S&P Global Market Intelligence's forecast of global growth has also been revised upward in comparison to last year, with annual real GDP growth now projected at 2.6%, up from 2.3% at the beginning of the year. This upward revision also reflects slightly higher forecasts for growth in several countries internationally.'

He added that nevertheless, growth in GCC countries remained remarkably resilient, including during challenging political scenarios. This was a result of higher energy prices and strong capital inflows in the region. Jawad pointed out that the GCC also witnessed expansions in the non-oil sector as per PWC, which is estimated to have grown by 4.3% as to date with government investments linked to various economic diversifications taking place across the GCC in 2024.

Moving to Kuwait, the Chief Strategy Officer shared, "IMF fore-casts a slight real GDP reduction of -1.4% this year as a result of OPEC oil production cuts, and faces lower inflationary pressures which are expected to ease to 3.0% this year as per S&P. Projects have also been temporarily halted due to unforeseen changes in the domestic political scene, but is expected to pick up gradually towards the second half of 2024 with a planned project pipeline of KD 6.3 billion.

A Journey of Growth

Transitioning to ABK, this quarter witnessed sizable growth and notable achievements. Jawad stated, "Our dedication remains on path and stable by reaffirmed 'A' ratings from Fitch and 'A2' ratings from Moody's." He was also pleased to report that this growth journey remains successful in line with the ABK2X strategy where some initiatives have been extended to the broader group entities, expanding the impact beyond the initial scope and creating effective synergies between subsidiaries.

Jawad added, "Our ABK2X strategy continues to drive tangible outcomes with growth across our products and customer base. ABK introduced the new Elite Plus segment in January 2024 to expand our offering to the Elite segment and also successfully launched two more card products to the market, the ABK cashback credit card and the Elite Plus credit card. We have received great market feedback, witnessed our highest-ever monthly credit card sales where it and our market share growth of new credit cards more than doubled vs. Q1

Furthermore, ABK's targeted acquisition campaigns resulted in increasing market share among key salaried Kuwaiti segments and expats. By focusing on key segments, it was able to improve its share of the incremental loan market to reach +15% during Q1 2024. Jawad added, "We also launched an upgraded A+ youth segment offering to increase our share of youth.'

Egypt and the UAE

On the international business side, the Egyptian economy experienced a recent flotation of the EGP and a sharp raise of the local interest rate, which is meant to combat inflationary waves and attract foreign investments. These factors will, in turn, result in an improved operating environment for ABK-Egypt.

Shifting to the UAE, Jawad claimed, "We are proud to announce

Central Bank reports decrease in domestic public debt instruments

Credit facilities to residents reach 48.104 bln dinars

KUWAIT CITY, May 12: The Central Bank of Kuwait's recent monthly monetary statistical bulletin for March 2024, as detailed in Al-Shall's weekly economic report, indicates a decrease in the balance of total domestic public debt instruments by 50 million dinars, settling at 210 million dinars compared to the previous year, reports Al-Jarida daily.

This represents around 0.4 percent of the estimated GDP for 2024, valued at approximately 53.199 billion dinars.

Furthermore, the report elaborates on the average interest rates on public debt instruments over varying periods. Local banks continue to handle 100 percent of the total local public debt instruments.

Additionally, the bulletin sheds light on credit facilities to residents provided by local banks, totaling around 48.104 billion dinars by the end of March 2024. Notably, there was a 2.0 percent increase from the previous year.

Regarding Kuwait Finance House (KFH), the report outlines its financial performance for the first quarter of the year. While net profits experienced a slight decline compared to the same period in 2023, the bank's total assets saw a marginal increase to reach 37.023 billion dinars.

However, liabilities witnessed a decrease, indicating a mixed performance in profitability indicators compared to the previous year.

Additionally, the report examines the performance of financial markets, noting a negative trend in April for the majority of markets, attributed partly to geopolitical events and delays in anticipated interest rate adjustments.

The outlook for May remains uncertain, influenced by geopolitical developments and interest rate expectations.

These analyses provide insights into Kuwait's economic landscape, encompassing fiscal indicators, banking performance, and market trends, essential for informed decision-making and strategic planning.

onsumer confidence in the US economy is sinking. A key survey by the University of Michigan shows a sharp drop in sentiment, reaching a six-month low. This is driven by the fact that inflation is picking up again, leading consumers to worry about their spending power. That, along with the fact that consumers believe that prices will keep climbing in the future, dampening their overall economic outlook. This shift in sentiment makes it less likely that the Federal Reserve will cut interest rates anytime soon.

Unemployment Claims

The latest data suggests a slowdown in the US job market. New unemployment claims reached a high not seen in over eight months, at 231,000 for the week ending May 4th. This comes after reports showed the economy added the fewest jobs in six months in April and job openings hit a three-year low in March. These signs of cooling are raising the possibility that the Federal Reserve might cut interest rates twice this year.

Monetary Policy Summary

The Bank of England is hinting at a possible interest rate cut in the near future, despite keeping rates at a 16-year high of 5.25%. This decision comes as inflation shows signs of cooling down, reaching a two-and-ahalf year low of 3.2%. While still above the Bank's 2% target, the downward trend is encouraging. Forecasts by the Bank of England predict inflation dipping below the target in the coming months, although a temporary rise is expected later in the year. However, BoE Governor Andrew Bailey remains cautious, wanting more confirmation that lower inflation is here to stay before taking action. A June rate cut is a possibility, but not yet a certainty. Asia Pacific

RBA Monetary Policy Statement

The Reserve Bank of Australia maintained interest rates at a 12 year high of 4.35% in line with market expectations. The decision comes amid a hotter than expected quarter to March inflation reading, and weak retail sales data. Australian consumers are increasingly pulling back on spending as elevated interest rates squeeze households, however the central bank warned that despite weakness in consumer spending, "The process of returning inflation to target is unlikely to be smooth." Furthermore, the central bank warned that "it will be some time yet before inflation is sustainably in the target range and will remain vigilant to upside risks." However, the Board also adopted a dovish tone by stating that it is "not ruling anything in or out." Despite recent setbacks, the central bank is sticking to its projection that inflation will fall to its target range by the end of 2025. Markets are pricing the RBA to hold interest rates at the current level for the

rest of this year.

BOJ Governor Kazuo Ueda Speaks

Bank of Japan (BoJ) Governor Kazuo Ueda stated on Wednesday that it is "Important for fx moves to reflect fundamentals." Furthermore, he stated that "if risk of weak yen affecting trend inflation significantly is high, we may need to respond with monetary policy" signaling that he is open to further rate hikes and tightening should the situation require it. Additionally, Ueda warned that "sharp, one-sided" yen declines hurt the economy and is undesirable. Despite the warnings, Ueda stated that inflation was "firmly" moving towards the central bank's 2% target. Moreover, he stated that if "inflation undershoots or downside risks heighten, we must maintain current accommodative financial conditions for a longer period." In terms of bond purchases, Ueda stated that the central bank will continue to maintain the size of purchases however acknowledged that they will eventually need to reduce it in the future. The remarks by Ueda failed to convince markets that the central bank will deliver a second-rate hike in the near future and caused the yen to

KUWAIT CITY, April 12: Kuwait Selected GCC IPO Pipeline: Financial Centre "Markaz" released its research report titled "Initial **Public Offerings (IPO) in the GCC** markets", stating that the region has raised total proceeds of USD 931 million through 9 offerings during the first three months of 2024, marking a

year-on-year decline in value by 73% compared to the first quarter of 2023, where issuers raised USD 3.5 billion

through 12 offerings. **Geographical Allocation:**

Markaz's report stated that Saudi Arabia led the region in terms of IPO proceeds during the quarter, raising a total of USD 503 million from 8 offerings constituting 54% of total GCC IPO proceeds. This represented an increase of 594% in the value of Saudi IPOs compared to Q1-2023. In the UAE, IPO proceeds totaled USD 429 million during the period with 1 offering constituting 46% of total GCC IPO proceeds. 

Roger Corman, Hollywood's 'King of the Bs,' dies at 98

LOS ANGELES, May 12, (AP): **Roger Corman**, the "King of the Bs" who helped turn out such low-budget classics as "Little Shop of Horrors" and "Attack of the Crab Monsters" and gave many of Hollywood's most famous actors and directors early breaks, has died. He was 98

Corman died Thursday at his home in Santa Monica, California, according to a statement released Saturday by his wife and daughters.

"He was generous, open-hearted and kind to all those who knew him," the statement said. "When asked how he would like to be remembered, he said, 'I was a filmmaker, just that."

Starting in 1955, Corman helped create hundreds of B-movies as a producer and director, among them "Black Scorpion," "Bucket of Blood" and "Bloody Mama." A remarkable judge of talent, he hired such aspiring filmmakers as Francis Ford Coppola, Ron Howard, James Cameron and Martin Scorsese. In 2009, Corman received an honorary Academy Award.

"There are many constraints connected with working on a low budget, but at the same time there are certain opportunities," Corman said in a 2007 documentary about Val Lewton, the 1940s director of "Cat People" and other underground classics.

"You can gamble a little bit more. You can experiment. You have to find a more creative way to solve a problem or to present a concept,'

The roots of Hollywood's golden age in the 1970s can be found in Corman's films.

Jack Nicholson made his film debut as the title character in a 1958 Corman quickie, "The Cry Baby Killer," and stayed with the company for biker, horror and action films, writing and producing some of them.

Other actors whose careers began in Corman movies included Robert De Niro, Bruce Dern and Ellen Burstyn.

Peter Fonda's appearance in "The Wild Angels" was a precursor to his own landmark biker movie, "Easy Rider," co-starring Nicholson

and fellow Corman alumnus Dennis Hopper. "Boxcar Bertha," starring Barbara Hershey and David Carradine, was an early film by Scorsese.

Corman's B-movie directors were given minuscule budgets and often told to finish their films in as little as five days. When Howard, who would go on to win a best director Oscar for "A Beautiful Mind," pleaded for an extra half day to reshoot a scene in 1977 for "Grand Theft Auto," Corman told him, "Ron, you can come back if you want, but nobody else will be there.'

"Roger Corman was my very first boss, my lifetime mentor and my hero. Roger was one of the greatest visionaries in the history of cinema," Gale Ann Hurd, whose notable producing credits include the "Terminator" film franchise, "The Abyss" and "The Walking Dead" television series, said in a post on X, formerly Twitter.

Initially only drive-ins and specialty theaters would book Corman films, but as teenagers began turning out, national chains gave in. Corman's pictures were open for their time about sex and drugs, such as his 1967 release "The Trip," an explicit story about LSD written by Nicholson and starring Fonda and Hopper.

Meanwhile, he discovered a lucrative sideline releasing prestige for-

eign films in the United States, among them Ingmar Bergman's "Cries and Whispers," Federico Fellini's "Amarcord" and Volker Schlondorff's

"The Tin Drum." The latter two won Oscars for best foreign language film. Corman got his start as a messenger boy for Twentieth Century-Fox, eventually graduating to story analyst. After quitting the business briefly to study English literature for a term at Oxford University, he returned

to Hollywood and launched his career as a movie producer and director. Despite his penny-pinching ways, Corman retained good relations with his directors, boasting that he never fired one because "I wouldn't want to inflict that humiliation.'

Some of his former underlings repaid his kindness years later. Coppola cast him in "The Godfather, Part II," Jonathan Demme included him in "The Silence of the Lambs" and "Philadelphia" and Howard gave him a part in "Apollo 13."

Most of Corman's movies were quickly forgotten by all but die-hard fans. A rare exception was 1960's "Little Shop of Horrors," which starred a bloodthirsty plant that feasted on humans and featured Nicholson in a small but memorable role as a pain-loving dental patient. It inspired a long-lasting stage musical and a 1986 musical adaptation starring Steve Martin, Bill Murray and John Candy.

In 1963, Corman initiated a series of films based on the works of Edgar Allan Poe. The most notable was "The Raven," which teamed Nicholson with veteran horror stars Boris Karloff, Peter Lorre and Basil Rathbone. Directed by Corman on a rare three-week schedule, the horror spoof won good reviews, a rarity for his films. Another Poe adaptation, "House of Usher," was deemed worthy of preservation by the Library of Congress.

CANNES, France, May 12, (AP): The Cannes Film Festival rarely passes without cacophony but this year's edition may be more raucous and uneasy than any edition in recent memory. When the red carpet is rolled out from the Palais

des Festivals on Tuesday, the 77th Cannes will unfurl against a backdrop of war, protest, potential strikes and quickening #MeToo upheaval in France, which for years largely resisted the movement. Festival workers are threatening to strike. The Israel-

Hamas war, acutely felt in France, home to Europe's

largest Jewish and Arab communities, is sure to spark protests. Russia's war in Ukraine remains on the minds of many. Add in the kinds of anxieties that can be expected to percolate at Cannes - the ever-uncertain future of cinema, the rise of artificial intelligence - and this year's festival shouldn't lack for drama. Being prepared for anything has long been a useful

attitude in Cannes. Befitting such tumultuous times, the film lineup is full of intrigue, curiosity and ques-

The Iranian director Mohammad Rasoulof, just days before his latest film, "The Seed of the Sacred Fig," is to debut in competition in Cannes, was sentenced to eight years in prison by the Islamic Revolutionary Court. The film remains on Cannes' schedule.

Arguably the most feverishly awaited entry is Francis Ford Coppola's self-financed opus "Megalopolis." Coppola, is himself no stranger to high-drama at Cannes. An unfinished cut of "Apocalypse Now" won him (in a tie) his second Palme d'Or more than four decades ago.

Even the upcoming U.S. presidential election won't be far off. Premiering in competition is Ali Abbasi's "The Apprentice," starring Sebastian Stan as a young Donald Trump. There will also be new films from Kevin Costner, Paolo Sorrentino, Sean Baker, Yorgos Lanthimos and Andrea Arnold. And for a potentially powder keg Cannes there's also the firebomb of "Furiosa: A Mad Max Saga." The film, a rolling apocalyptic dystopia, returns director George Miller to the festival he first became hooked on as a juror.

"I got addicted it to simply because it's like film camp," says Miller, who became enraptured to the global gathering of cinema at Cannes and the pristine film presentations. "It's kind of optimal cinema, really.

The moment that they said, 'OK, we're happy to show this film here,' I jumped at it.'

Cannes' official opener on Tuesday is "The Second Act," a French comedy by Quentin Dupieux, starring Léa Sevdoux, Louis Garrel and Vincent Lindon, During the opening ceremony, Meryl Streep will be awarded an honorary Palme d'Or. At the closing ceremony, George Lucas will get one, too.

But the spotlight at the start may fall on Judith Godrèche. The French director and actor earlier this year said the filmmakers Benoît Jacquot and Jacques Doillon sexually assaulted her when she was a teenager, allegations that rocked French cinema. Jacquot and Doillon have denied the allegations.

Representation

Though much of the French film industry has previously been reluctant to embrace the #MeToo movement, Godrèche has stoked a wider response. She's spoken passionately about the need for changes at the Cesars, France's equivalent of the Oscars, and before a French Senate commission.

In that same period, Godrèche also made the short film "Moi Aussi" during a Paris gathering of hundreds who wrote her with their own stories of sexual abuse. On Wednesday, it opens Cannes' Un Certain Regard

"I hope that I'm heard in the sense that I'm not interested in being some sort of representation of someone who just wants to go after everyone in this industry, Godrèche said ahead of the festival. "I'm just fighting for some sort of change. It is called a revolution.

It's the latest chapter in how #MeToo has reverberated at the world's largest film gathering, following an 82-woman protest on the steps of the Palais in 2018 and a gender parity pledge in 2019. Cannes has often come under criticism for not inviting more female filmmakers into competition, but the festival is putting its full support behind Godrèche while girding for the possibility of more #MeToo revelations during the festival.

"For me, having these faces, these people - everyone in this movie - gives them this place to be celebrated," said Godrèche. "There's this thing about this place that has so much history. In a way, it mystifies movies forever. Once your film was in Cannes, it was in Cannes. Some of the filmmakers coming to the festival this

year are already firmly lodged in Cannes lore. Paul Schrader was at the festival almost 50 years ago for Martin Scorsese's "Taxi Driver," which he wrote. After a famously divisive response, it won the Palme in 1976.

For the first time since his 1988 drama "Patty Hearst," Schrader is back in what he calls "the main show" - in competition for the Palme d'Or - with "Oh, Canada." The film, adapted from a Russell Banks novel, stars Richard Gere (reteaming with Schrader decades after "American Gigolo") as a dying filmmaker who recounts his life story for a documentary. Jacob Elordi plays him in '70s flashbacks.

After the Cannes lineup was announced, Schrader shared on Facebook an old photo of himself, Coppola and Lucas - all primary figures to what was then called New Hollywood - and the caption "Together again."

Who ultimately goes home with the Palme - the handicapping has already begun - will be decided by a jury led by Greta Gerwig, fresh off the mammoth success of "Barbie." But this year's slate will have a lot to live up to. Last year, three eventual best picture nominees premiered in Cannes: Justine Triet's Palme-winner "Anatomy of a Fall," Jonathan Glazer's "The Zone of Interest" and Martin Scorsese's "Killers of the Flower

What tends to really define a Cannes, though, is emerging filmmakers. Among those likely to make an impression this year is Julien Colonna, the Corsican, Paris-based director and co-writer of "The Kingdom." The film, an Un Certain Regard standout, is a brutal coming of age about a teenager girl (newcomer Ghjuvanna Benedetti) on the run with her father (Saveriu Santucci), a Corsican clan leader.

"We wanted to propose a kind of anti-mob film," Colonna says, referencing the prevalence of "Godfather"inspired gangster dramas. "As a viewer, I'm quite bored of this. I think we need to move to something else and propose a different prism."

"The Kingdom," Colonna's debut feature film, arose out of his own anxieties around the birth of his child six years ago. It's an entirely fictional movie but it has personal roots for Colonna, who was inspired by the memory of a camping trip that he realized years later was "an entirely different matter for my father." He shot the most of the film in Corsica within a few miles of his hometown.

Switzerland's Nemo wins Eurovision '24

MALMO, Sweden, May 12, (AP): Swiss singer **Nemo** won the 68th Eurovision Song Contest early Sunday with "The Code," an operatic pop-rap ode to the singer's journey toward embracing a nongender identity.

Switzerland's contestant beat Croatian rocker Baby Lasagna to the title by winning the most points from a combination of national juries and viewers around the world. Nemo, 24, is the first nonbinary winner of the contest that has long been embraced as a safe haven. Nemo is also the first Swiss winner since 1988,

when Canadian chanteuse Celine Dion competed under the



ference, Nemo expressed pride in accepting the trophy for 'people that are daring to be themselves and people that need to be heard and need to be understood. We need more compassion, we need

more empathy. Nemo's victory in the Swedish city of Malmo followed a turbulent year for the pan-continental pop contest that saw large street protests against the participation of Israel that tipped the feelgood musical celebration into a chaotic pressure cooker overshadowed by the war in Gaza.

Hours before the final, Dutch competitor Joost Klein was expelled from the contest over a backstage altercation that was being investigated by police.

Nemo - full name Nemo Mettler - bested finalists from 24 other countries, who all performed in front of a live audience of thousands and an estimated 180 million viewers around the world. Each contestant had three minutes to meld catchy tunes and eye-popping spectacle into performances capable of winning the hearts of viewers. Musical styles ranged across rock, disco, techno and rap - sometimes a mashup of more

Change

Eurovision organizers ordered a change to the original title of her song, "October Rain" - an apparent reference to the Oct. 7 Hamas attack that killed about 1,200 people in Israel and triggered the war in Gaza.

The show was typically eclectic Eurovision fare, ranging from the pop-zombie folk hybrid of Estonia's 5Miinust x Puuluup to the folk-inflected power pop of Greece's Marina Satti and Armenia's Ladaniva and the goofy 1990s nostalgia of Finland's Windows-95man, who emerged from a giant onstage egg wearing very little clothing.

Britain's Olly Alexander offered upbeat dance track "Dizzy," while Ireland's gothic Bambie Thug summoned a demon onstage and brought a scream coach to Malmo, and Spain's Nebulossa boldly reclaimed a term used as a slur on women in "Zorra.

Nemo had been a favorite going into the contest, alongside Baby Lasagna, whose song "Rim Tim Tagi Dim" is a rollicking rock number that tackles the issue of young Croatians leaving the country in search of a better life.

The contest returned to Sweden, home of last year's winner, Loreen, half a century after ABBA won Eurovision with "Waterloo" - Eurovision's most iconic moment. ABBA did not appear in person in Malmo, though their digital "ABBA-tars" from the "ABBA Voyage" stage show did.

A trio of former Eurovision winners - Charlotte Perrelli, Carola and Conchita Wurst - performed "Waterloo" in tribute.

Though Eurovision's motto is "united by music," this year's event has proven divisive. Protests and dissent overshadowed a competition that has become a campy celebration of Europe's varied - and sometimes baffling - musical tastes and a forum for inclusiveness and diversity.

Thousands of pro-Palestinian demonstrators marched for the second time in a week on Saturday through Sweden's third-largest city, which has a large Muslim population, to demand a boycott of Israel and a cease-fire in the seven-month Gaza war that has killed almost 35,000 Palestinians, according to the health ministry in the Hamas-run territory.

Several hundred gathered outside the Malmo Arena before the final, with some shouting "shame" at arriving music fans, and facing off with police blocking their path. Climate activist Greta Thunberg was among those escorted away by police.

Klein, the Dutch performer, was ejected from the competition after a female member of the production crew made a complaint, competition organizer the European Broadcasting Union said. The 26-year-old Dutch singer and rapper had been a favorite of both

bookmakers and fans with his song "Europapa."

Dutch broadcaster AVROTROS, one of dozens of public broadcasters that collectively fund and broadcast the contest, said that as Klein came offstage after Thursday's semifinal, he was filmed without his consent and in turn made a "threatening movement" toward the camera. The broadcaster said Klein didn't touch the camera or the camera operator, and called his expulsion "disproportionate."

Tensions and nerves were palpable in the hours before the final. Several artists were absent from the Olympics-style artists' entrance at the start of the final dress rehearsal, though all appeared at the final.

FRANCE: In her first Eras Tour concert since the release of "The Tortured Poets Department," Taylor **Swift** shook up her setlist.

At Thursday night's show at the La Défense Arena in Paris, fans were treated to the inclusion of new songs from the record-breaking album released in April.

According to fan videos and news outlets, Swift performed "But Daddy I Love Him," "So High School,"
"Who's Afraid of Little Old Me," "Down Bad," "Fortnight," "The Smallest Man Who Ever Lived" and "I Can Do It with a Broken Heart," all from the new release, dressed in black and white to match her 11th studio album's visuals.

The billion-dollar Eras Tour is meant to be a career retrospective, with Swift performing more than 40 tracks reflecting 17 years of recorded music. "The Tortured Poets Department" was her first brand-new release since the tour's start.

The Paris show included several new costumes, and some edits to make room for the new material. Her "Folklore" and "Evermore" sections were woven into one, Billboard reported.

OMAHA, Neb.: The \$200,100 winning bid for a private lunch with software titan Marc Benioff might appear disappointing at first glance after years of multimilliondollar bids for a private meal with investor Warren Buffett, but the winner also pledged to donate a total of \$1.5 million. to the California homeless charity that benefits from the auction.

The weeklong eBay auction that raises money for the Glide Foundation in San Francisco wrapped up Friday night. This is the first year that a meal with Benioff, who is Salesforce's Chairman and CEO, was the prize after Buffett raised \$53 million for Glide over more than two decades of lunches.

The winner of the Benioff auction chose to remain anonymous much like many of the winners of a steak lunch with Buffett over the years. The 93-year-old Buffett decided to make the 2022 auction his last one as he continued to cut back on his public appearances, but just last weekend Buffett, who leads the Berkshire Hathaway conglomerate, spent all day answering questions from thousands of his shareholders at the company's legendary annual meeting. The final Buffett auction attracted \$19 million. (AP)

DARLINGTON, S.C.: Kyle Larson made one thing clear: He's no Swiftie, even if he did surprise his daughter with a birthday trip to Paris this week to see Taylor Swift in concert.

Group blends cultures in latest album

Grupo Frontera's music has no limits

NEW YORK, May 12, (AP): A lot can happen in two years. Just ask Grupo Frontera, who released their highly anticipated sophomore album, "Jugando Que No Pasa Nada,"

The sextet began as a local band in Texas' Rio Grande Valley, playing events like quinceañeras - a hobby for its members who held very different jobs: wedding photographer, car dealership manager, gate repairer and so on. Then, viral fame arrived in 2022 when their spirited cover of 'No Se Va" by the Colombian poprock band Morat made the rounds on TikTok and later, the Billboard Hot

Eventually, they quit their jobs, and the hits - and accolades - kept coming. They linked up with superstar producer Édgar Barrera, who hails from their corner of Texas and worked on both their albums. Last year, Grupo Frontera released their biggest track to date, "Un x100to," a collaboration with Puerto Rican reggaetón superstar Bad Bunny, peaked at No. 5 on Billboard's all-genre Hot 100. That song earned them a Latin Grammy.

They've sold out arenas and by the time their debut album, "El Comienzo," was released last August, they'd already established themselves one of the most exciting new voices in Latin music.

On the 12-track "Jugando Que No Pasa Nada," they've continued to push boundaries.

"Every album, every song that we release, is like 'Man, we gotta make a song better than the last one," says Julian Peña Jr., the band's percussionist and hype man. "We have a lot of things that we're exploring with, and we know a lot of people are going to like it."

"It's a mixture of modern and old school. So we're, like, in between," he says. "That's why you have a lot of versatility on the album."

Collaboration

That makes for an interesting mix, as does the collaborators they brought forth. Featured are Maluma and Morat - a full circle moment if there ever was one - from Colombia. There's also Christian Nodal from Mexico and a particularly wild cut featuring Nicki Nicole from Argen-

On the club-ready "Desquite" with Nicole, Grupo Frontera found inspiration in late '00s, early '10s music, specifically the Mexican pop DJ group 3BallMTY. Cantu says they wanted to bring back that sound - but "make it fresh with the music we're doing," he says, and with "the lyrics of today."

Thematically, "Jugando Que No Pasa Nada" is a romantic journey: From the kiss-off opener "F---Amor," which Peña Jr. describes as being from the perspective of, well, someone fed up with love - to "Ibiza," which "tells you the story about a guy saying, 'You know what? I al-

A rural Ugandan community is a hot spot for sickle cell disease

Ugandan woman empowers others living with sickle cell

MBALE, Uganda, May 12, (AP): Barbara Nabulo was one of three girls in her family. But when a sister died, her mother wailed at the funeral that she was left with just one and a half daughters.

The half was the ailing Nabulo, who at age 12 grasped her

mother's meaning.
"I hated myself so much," Nabulo said recently, recalling the words that preceded a period of sickness that left her hospitalized and feeding through a tube.

The scene underscores the lifelong challenges for some people with sickle cell disease in rural Uganda, where it remains poorly understood. Even Nabulo, despite her knowledge of how the disease weakens the body, spoke repeatedly of "the germ I was born with."

Sickle cell disease is a group of inherited disorders in which red blood cells - normally round - become hard, sticky and crescent shaped. The misshapen cells clog the flow of blood, which can lead to infections, excruciating pain, organ damage and other complications.

Malaria

The disease, which can stunt physical growth, is more common in malaria-prone regions, notably Africa and India, because carrying the sickle cell trait helps protect against severe malaria. Global estimates of how many people have the disease vary, but some researchers put the number between 6 million and 8 million, with more than 5 million living in sub-Saharan Africa.

The only cure for the pain sickle cell disease can cause is a bone marrow transplant or gene therapies like the one commercially approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration in December. A 12-year-old boy last week became the first person to begin the therapy.

Those options are beyond the reach of most patients in this East African nation where sickle cell disease is not a public health priority despite the burden it places on communities. There isn't a national database of sickle cell patients. Funding for treatment often comes from donor organizations.

In a hilly part of eastern Uganda that's a sickle cell hot spot, the main referral hospital looks after hundreds of patients arriving from nearby villages to collect medication. Many receive doses of hydroxyurea, a drug that can reduce periods of severe pain and other complications, and researchers there are studying its effectiveness in Ugandan children.

Nabulo, now 37, is one of the hospital's patients. But she approaches others like her as a caregiver, too.

After dropping out in primary school, she has emerged in recent years as a counselor to fellow patients, speaking to them about her survival. Encouraged by hospital authorities, she makes weekly visits to the ward that has many children watched over by exhausted-looking parents.

Nabulo tells them she was diagnosed with sickle cell disease at two weeks old, but now she is the mother of three children, including twins. Such a message gives hope to those who feel discouraged or worry that sickle cell disease is a death sentence, said Dr. Julian Abeso, head of pediatrics at Mbale Regional Referral Hospital.

Some men have been known to divorce their wives - or neglect them in search of new partners - when they learn that their children have sickle cell disease. Frequent community deaths from disease complications reinforce perceptions of it as a scourge.

Nabulo and health workers urge openness and the testing of children for sickle cell as early as possible.

Abeso and Nabulo grew close after Nabulo lost her first baby hours after childbirth in 2015. She cried in the doctor's office as she spoke of her wish "to have a relative I can call mine, a descendant who can help me," Abeso recalled.

"At that time, people here were so negative about patients with sickle cell disease having children because the complications would be so many," the doctor said.

Nabulo's second attempt to have a child was difficult, with some time in intensive care. But her baby is now a 7-year-old boy who sometimes accompanies her to the hospital. The twin girls came last year.

Speaking outside the one-room home she shares with her husband and children, Nabulo said many people appreciate her work despite the countless indignities she faces, including unwanted stares from people in the streets who point to the woman with "a big head," one manifestation in her of the disease. Her brothers often behave as if they are ashamed of

Overweight issues

Scientific solutions urged for 'obesity'

BEIJING, May 12, (Xinhua): The 10th China Obesity Science Conference, jointly organized by the Chinese Center for Disease Control and Prevention (China CDC) and several other organizations in Beijing, concluded on Saturday.

The two-day event underscored the seriousness of obesity as an escalating public health concern and the importance of scientific interventions and proper policies to tackle it.

According to a 2020 report by China's National Health Commission (NHC), 34.3 percent of the country's citizens aged 18 and above were overweight and 16.4 percent were obese. Research predicts that the overweight and obesity rate among Chinese adults might reach 65.3 percent by 2030.

Overweight and obesity are regarded as a major obstacle to realizing China's long-term health goals, such as raising the average life expectancy to 79 by 2030, as proposed in the country's Outline of Healthy China 2030.

Speaking at the conference, Guo Yanhong, director of the Health Emergency Response Office of the NHC, said that addressing obesity is a key point in preventing and treating chronic diseases, and stressed the necessity to promote healthier lifestyles.

Guidelines

In February, the NHC released two dietary guidelines aimed at addressing obesity in both adults and children. The guidelines offer advice on food choices for adults, children and adolescents, and provide recipes tailored to various dietary habits across different regions of China and throughout the four seasons.

In March, the China Obesity Federation was established in Beijing with support from researchers, scholars and organizations related to obesity prevention and treatment. According to initiators of the federation, which include the National Clinical Research Center for Digestive Diseases, a key objective is to enhance public awareness and understanding of healthy weight loss.

Ji Linong, director of endocrinology at Beijing University People's Hospital, said China's medical institutions have been innovating their obesity diagnosis and treatment methods. He emphasized the importance of a patient-centered weight management model that integrates plans from doctors across relevant disciplines and scientifically employs various management approaches, including lifestyle adjustments, medication and surgical interventions.

According to Chen Wei, chief physician of the clinical nutrition department at the Beijing-based Peking Union Medical College Hospital, one of China's top-tier medical institutions, his department handles approximately 20,000 medical visits annually for weight loss treatment.

Chen and his team have been researching physiological and triggering factors for weight rebound among individuals who have experienced repeated failures in weight loss attempts. He noted that each patient harbors specific factors contributing to obesity, such as emotional eating, low metabolic rate and insulin resistance.

Based on each individual case, Chen and his colleagues provide customized weight loss plans and ensure patients safely lose weight under medical supervision.

"I go to Nabulo for help because I can't manage the illness affecting my grandchild," Kelemesiya Musuya said. "She can feel pain, and she starts crying, saying, 'It is here and it is rising and it is paining here and here.""

Reassurance

Musuya sometimes seeks reassurance. "She would be asking me, 'Even you, when you are sick, does it hurt in the legs, in the chest, in the head?' I tell her that, yes, it's painful like that." Nebulo said

The lack of formal education is hurtful for Nabulo, who struggles to write her name, and a source of shame for her parents, who repeatedly apologize for letting her drop out while her siblings studied. One brother is now a medical worker who operates a clinic in a town not far away from Nabulo's home

"I am very happy to see her," said her mother, Agatha Nambuya.

She recalled Nabulo's swelling head and limbs as a baby, and how "these children used to die so soon."

But now she knows of others with sickle cell disease who grew to become doctors or whatever they wanted to be. She expressed pride in Nabulo's work as a counselor and said her grandchildren make her feel happy. "At that time," she said, recalling Nabulo as a child, "we didn't know."

Solar storm lights up skies with minimal impact

A powerful solar storm put on an amazing skyward light show across the globe overnight but has caused what appeared to be only minor disruptions to the electric power grid, communications and satellite positioning systems.

The US National Oceanic and

The US National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration said extreme geomagnetic storm conditions continued Saturday, and there were preliminary reports of power grid irregularities, degradation of high-frequency communications and global positioning systems.

But the Federal Emergency Management Agency said that, so far, no FEMA region had reported any

significant impact from the storms. The US Department of Energy said Saturday it is not aware of any impact from the storms on electric customers.

NOAA predicted that strong flares will continue through at least Sunday, and a spokeswoman said via email that the agency's Space Weather Prediction Center had prepared well for the storm.

On Saturday morning SpaceX's

On Saturday morning, SpaceX's Starlink satellite internet service said on its website that service had been degraded and its team was investigating. CEO Elon Musk wrote on the social platform X overnight that its satellites were "under a lot

of pressure, but holding up so far."
Brilliant purple, green, yellow and pink hues of the Northern Lights were reported worldwide, with sightings in Germany, Switzerland, China, England, Spain and elsawhere.

England, Spain and elsewhere.
In the US, Friday's solar storm pushed the lights much farther south than normal. The Miami ofice of the National Weather Service confirmed sightings in the areas of Fort Lauderdale and Fort Myers, Florida. Meteorologist Nick Carr said another forecaster who lives near Fort Lauderdale photographed the lights and was familiar with them because he previously lived in Alaska. (AP)

Munk to serve gourmet meal in stratosphere

Michelin chef taking fine dining to space

COPENHAGEN, May 12, (AP): Ever since humans have journeyed to space, their meals there have proved to be, well, nothing to write home about.

But that could change after a Michelin-starred chef teamed up with the Florida-based startup Space Perspective to take fine-dining to our upper atmosphere in late 2025.

Six guests are set to ascend aboard Spaceship Neptune to the stratosphere, where they will enjoy an immersive dining experience served up by Danish Michelin-starred chef Rasmus Munk.

Munk, 33, will travel with the guests

and serve the meal himself, from a small kitchen. He says his menu will be inspired by the impact of space innovation.

"We went to tall stories through the

"We want to tell stories through the food," Munk says. "We ... want to talk and highlight some of the research that's been done through the last 60

"I think that will make an even stronger impact when you're up there and looking down," added Munk, who will fly with the six ticket buyers.

Spaceship Neptune is more of a balloon than a rocket. The company says its pressurized capsule, attached to a balloon, will lift to an altitude of around 100,000 feet (30,480 meters) above sea level where guests will dine while watching the sun rise over the curvature of the Earth.

Organizers are promising an out-ofthis-world experience for those with an appetite for adventure. But such an astronomic menu comes with a fittingly astronomic price tag - \$495,000 per ticket.

Organizers say the trip will last six

hours and that they are they are still in discussion with potential participants. It's one of the latest offerings by private firms that include Blue Origin,

Virgin Galactic, and SpaceX.

The flight won't technically reach "space" - Spaceship Neptune will ascend to around 19 miles (30 kilometers), well below the Karman line, the boundary separating Earth's atmos-

phere and outer space, which is some 62 miles (100 kilometers) from Earth.

Munk's menu is expected to be a far cry from meals eaten by past and present astronauts.

The first man in space, Soviet cosmonaut Yuri Gagarin, squeezed beef and liver paste into his mouth from an aluminum tube.

Packaged

To save on weight, astronauts aboard the International Space Station usually dine on dishes packaged in rehydratable containers, including soups and casseroles.

There have been some exceptions. In 2006, French master chef Alain Ducasse created special gourmet food that could be used for celebratory meals aboard the ISS. The tinned dishes included typical Mediterranean ingredients, such as olives, tomatoes, quails and swordfish.

Though Munk is mysterious about his menu, he says he's planning to incorporate glow-in-dark stars made from aerogel and jellyfish protein.

"We are also working on an edible piece of space junk from a satellite," he said. "And then, we want to talk about some of the things going on on the planet ... from deforestation to temperatures rising and the garbage in

our seas," he added. Munk's Alchemist restaurant in Copenhagen, the Danish capital, has held two Michelin stars since 2020, and last year was ranked fifth best restaurant in the world.

Palou pulls away from Power to win 2nd straight Indy GP

INDIANAPOLIS, May 12, (AP): Alex Palou won a three-car battle among the leaders on his final pit stop then Will Power into the first turn on the Indianapolis Grand Prix's only restart Saturday before pulling away for his second straight win in the race

The Spaniard beat Australian Will Power to the finish line by 6.6106 seconds. Pole winner Christian Lundgaard, of Denmark, was third, more than eight seconds behind Palou, the defending IndyCar Series champion who moved back into the top spot of the season standings.

Palou led a race-high 39 of 85 laps, earning his first official win of the season and 10th of his career. He also won the exhibition all-star race in March.

Power wound up second despite working with two new Team Penske members because his race strategist and engineer are both serving tworace suspensions this month in the wake of a cheating scandal.

Palou became the first back-toback winner on Indianapolis Motor Speedway's 14-turn, 2.439-mile road course since Power last did it in 2017 and 2018 though he wasn't as dominant as he was in 2023 when he won by nearly 17 seconds.

But it wasn't terribly close, either, as Palou led by wide margins for most of the second half of the race.

Two of Palou's teammates from New Zealand - six-time series champ Scott Dixon and Marcus Armstong - rounded out the top five.

Colton Herta fell from first to third in the points after finishing seventh. The American qualified

Arrow McLaren's race day got off to a rough start when Pato O'Ward's No. 5 Chevrolet suffered an engine problem during the morning warmup.

Smoke started billowing from the rear end of the car and the Mexican driver climbed out of the cockpit before the track's safety team had to extinguish a fire. The crew changed out the engine but O'Ward was not penalized for the change and still started fifth.

Nadal reconsidering his 'status' for French Open

ROME, May 12, (AP): Fifteen days before he is scheduled to play in what will likely be his final French Open, Rafael Nadal is so unsatisfied with his level of tennis that he's still debating whether or not to go to Roland Garros.

Nadal's surgically repaired hip and his 37-year-old legs didn't provide him with the necessary means to be competitive enough on Saturday as ninth-ranked Hubert Hurkacz overwhelmed the 22-time Grand Slam champion on the Spaniard's beloved clay for a 6-1, 6-3 victory in the third round of the Italian Open.

It was Nadal's first match against a top-10 player in 11/2 years and he couldn't have been more disappointed.

"Tough day for me in all ways because I felt more ready than what I showed," Nadal said. "I am little bit more unpredictable today, not playing enough for the last two years. Too many doubts."

In terms of games won - just four - it was the most lopsided loss for Nadal on clay in 21 years, since also winning only four games against Gaston Gaudio in Hamburg in 2003 when he

Now Nadal will need to dig deeper on the practice court if wants to be competitive one last time at the French Open, where he is the record 14-time champion. Roland Garros starts on

Nadal said he had two options for Paris. Nadal is still regaining his fitness after missing nearly all of 2023 with a hip injury that required surgery,

Real celebrate title with fans

MADRID, May 12, (AP): Real Madrid celebrated its Spanish league title with fans on Sunday, meeting with government officials and parading through the streets of the

Madrid clinched its 36th league title last weekend, with four rounds to spare, but it couldn't celebrate the triumph right away because it still had to play the second leg of the semifinals of the Champions League.

Madrid rallied with two late goals by striker Joselu to defeat Bayern Munich 2-1 on Wednesday at the Santiago Bernabeu Stadium, advancing 3-2 on aggregate to the final against Borussia Dortmund on June 1 in London.

"I'm sure that in three weeks we will be back here," Madrid midfielder Toni Kroos said while addressing the crowd on Sunday.

Several thousand fans greeted the squad as it paraded through the city and headed to the club's traditional celebration spot at Cibeles square.

The league trophy was handed to the team during a ceremony at the club's training center.

Madrid usually also celebrates its titles with fans at the Bernabeu, but the stadium was being used for a concert on Sunday.

Madrid won 4-0 at relegated Granada on Saturday, with Granada players keeping the guard of honor tradition of lining up to applaud the champions as they entered the field before kickoff.

Most players and club president Florentino Pérez spoke to the crowd, which chanted some of the team's traditional fighting songs.

"This team overcame a situation that looked irreversible," Pérez said, referring to the series of injuries that affected players early in the season, including serious knee ligament tears by Thibaut Courtois. Éder Militão and David Alaba.

Captain Nacho Fernández led a round of applause to the three in-

jured players. Meanwhile, Madrid's backups eased to 4-0 win at the relegated Granada as Carlo Ancelotti rested most of his top players to avoid costly injures be efore the Champions League final.

St. Pauli promoted back to Bundesliga

HAMBURG, Germany, May 12, (AP): St. Pauli returned to the Bundesliga on Sunday with a 3-1 win over relegated Osnabrück in Germany's second

Oladapo Afolayan scored twice and set up Marcel Hartel for St. Pauli's third goal as the home team moved top of the league with an unassailable sixpoint lead over third-place Fortuna Düsseldorf with one round remaining.

The top two in the division are promoted, while the third-place finisher - now certain to be Düsseldorf - faces a two-leg playoff against the team that finishes third from bottom in the Bundesliga - currently Union Berlin - to see which will play in the top division next season.

The playoffs are scheduled for May 23 and 27.

Holstein Kiel, one point behind St. Pauli, secured its first ever promotion to the Bundes-

St. Pauli was relegated from the Bundesliga in 2011. It will be the first time that the leftwing cult club from Hamburg's red-light district will play in a league above city rival Hamburger SV.

Hamburg, the longest surviving founding member of the Bundesliga, was finally relegated in 2018 after several close shaves. It lost 1-0 at Paderborn on Friday, ensuring it will spend another season in the second division.

Meanwhile, Benedikt Pichler's early goal was enough to earn Bundesliga promotion for Holstein Kiel after drawing at home with Fortuna Düsseldorf 1-1.

Pichler scored in the second minute to ensure Kiel will finish among the top two in Germany's second division for automatic promotion to the top-flight.

"We've rewarded ourselves for a fantastic season," Kiel captain Philipp Sander said. "I don't think I'll sleep tonight."

Kiel supporters stormed the field and set off flares inside the ground after the final whistle, while supporters outside set off fireworks.

Kiel was founded in 1900 and won a German Championship in 1912. In recent years, it was promoted to the third division in 2013, and reached the second division in 2017 for the first time in 36 years.

Kiel will be the 58th club in the Bundesliga since the league's formation in 1963, and the first from the northern state of Schleswig-Holstein.

Düsseldorf was already assured of finishing at least third for the two-leg playoff against the team that finishes third from bottom in the Bundesliga - currently Union Berlin - to see which one will play in the top division next season.

St. Pauli, which hosts relegated Osnabrück on Sunday, is virtually assured of promotion. A draw will be enough on Sunday, though the question of which team finishes second division champion still needs to be answered.

Kiel was on 65 points with one game to play, St. Pauli had 63 with two remaining, and Düsseldorf followed on 60 before its final game.

CLEVELAND, May 12, (AP): Jayson Tatum scored 33 points, Jaylen Brown added 28 and the Boston Celtics looked more like themselves after stumbling at home, beating the Cleveland Cavaliers 106-93 on Saturday night in Game 3 to take a 2-1 lead in the Eastern Conference semifinals.

Kyrie Irving scored 22 points, including a running left-hander in the lane in the final minute to help Dallas hold on, and the Mavericks beat the Oklahoma City Thunder 105-101for a 2-1 lead in the Western Conference semifinals.Luka Doncic also had 22 points to go with 15 rebounds, and P.J. Washington Jr. scored 27, just two shy of his playoff high from Dal-

las' Game 2 victory.

The top-seeded Celtics didn't mess around after dropping Game 2 on their home parquet floor by 24.

That lackluster performance - Boston was favored by double digits - was reminiscent of the first round, when the Celtics lost Game 2 against Miami before winning three in a row to eliminate

Tatum scored on a three-point play and the Celtics opened the second half with 14 straight points to take a 23-point lead.

That was way too much for the Cavs, who overcame a 22-point deficit in the
